Arab Aviation Condemns Iran



Hussain Ahmed Al Sha'al, Undersecretary for Civil Aviation Affairs, represented Bahrain at the 29th General Assembly of the Arab Civil Aviation Organisation (ACAO), held in Rabat, the Moroccan capital, attended by heads of civil aviation authorities across the Arab world.

Addressing the Assembly, Al Sha'al noted the session is taking place against a backdrop of serious regional developments, including direct threats to the airspace, air traffic, and civil aviation infrastructure of Gulf Cooperation Council states resulting from Iranian aggression. He called for sustained unity among Arab states to safeguard the sector's continuity.

The Assembly elected a new president and members of the ACAO Executive Council, and discussed preparations for the upcoming ICAO Council session and a high-level air transport conference. The session concluded with the Executive Council declaring full solidarity with Gulf states and condemning Iranian attacks targeting regional security, reaffirming commitment to international law and Arab aviation cooperation.

Focus on Strengthening Gulf Partnerships

India's FM Dr. Jaishankar to Visit Bahrain in High-Level Gulf Tour

India's External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar will undertake a multi-nation official visit covering Bahrain, Qatar, Kuwait, Oman, the United States, and Belgium from July 5 to 15. The visit aims to strengthen diplomatic relations, advance strategic cooperation, and expand India's global engagement.

Gulf Partnerships

During the first leg of his visit from July 5 to 10, Jaishankar will travel to Bahrain, Qatar, Kuwait, and Oman. He is expected to hold bilateral meetings with foreign ministers and senior leadership in each country.

The discussions will focus on enhancing India's bilateral

relations with these Gulf nations while exchanging views on key regional developments and issues of mutual interest, including economic cooperation, energy security, and regional stability.

UN Security Council Campaign

Following his Gulf engagements, the External Affairs Minister will travel to New York on July 13, he will officially launch India's campaign for its candidature for the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) term 2028-29.

The launch marks a significant step in India's diplomatic outreach as it seeks broader international support for its bid for a non-permanent seat on the Security Council.



India-EU Trade

Dr. Jaishankar will then proceed to Brussels to participate in the 3rd India-EU Trade and Technology Council meeting, scheduled for July 14-15, 2026.

During the visit, he is expected to engage with European Union and Belgian counterparts to

strengthen cooperation in trade, digital innovation, emerging technologies, and strategic global challenges.

The multi-region visit reflects India's continued efforts to deepen partnerships across the Gulf, North America, and Europe, while advancing its role in global governance and multilateral institutions.

60m-Gallon Hidd Water Plant Planned

Acwa Power submitted the only bid under Bahrain's Independent Water Producer programme

Bahrain is moving ahead with plans for a new drinking water plant in Hidd able to produce up to 60 million imperial gallons a day. The scheme aims to raise the country's water output as demand increases over the coming

years.

Saudi Arabia's Acwa Power was the sole bidder for the Hidd Independent Water Project, Tender Board data showed. The company offered BD0.276 for each cubic metre of water produced. That works out at about 276 fils for every 1,000 litres of desalinated water.

This sum is a water production tariff, not the full cost of building the plant, as the scheme is offered under the independent water producer model rather than as a standard building contract. The plant's net contracted capacity will be 11,364 cubic metres an hour, equal to about 272,000 cubic metres a day, or close to 60 million imperial gallons a day of potable water.

It will be built under a build-own-operate model. The developer will fund, build, own, run and maintain the plant, then sell the water at the agreed tariff

once the bid is assessed and the award steps are completed.

The new plant will use sea-water reverse osmosis, a desalination method designed to cut energy use compared with some older systems. The scheme is part of the Electricity and Water Authority's plans to renew Bahrain's water infrastructure and introduce plants with higher efficiency and lower running needs. It is expected to enter full commercial operation in the second quarter of 2028. Once running, it will add new capacity to Bahrain's water network, serving homes, businesses and industry.

The Electricity and Water Authority had earlier issued an international tender after a pre-qualification stage involving local and overseas companies and consortiums. Acwa Power wlat named as the sole bidder when the tender envelopes were opened.

MSME Day Forum Goes Global with Sarajevo Edition

Forum explores supply chain challenges, economic uncertainty, and innovation pathways

The Bahrain Small and Medium Enterprises Society will host the 14th International MSME Day Forum in Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, on July 6 and 7, marking the first time the event is held outside Bahrain.

The forum is organised in cooperation with the World Union of Small and Medium Enterprises Organizations (UNISMEO) and the Chamber of Economy of Bosnia and Herzegovina, with support from the Government of Bahrain.

Dr. Abdulhassan Hassan Al Dairi, Chairman of the Bahrain Small and Medium Enterprises Society and President of UNISMEO, said the forum's international expansion reflects Bahrain's leading role in advancing the small and medium enterprises (SME) sector globally.

He highlighted that Bahrain began observing MSME Day in 2010, well before the United Nations officially declared June 27 as International MSME Day in 2017. He also noted that the society

approached the UN in 2016 with a proposal to establish a global observance recognising the importance of SMEs worldwide.

This year's forum will be held under the theme "MSMEs in a Green Digital Economy and Global Changes in Supply Chains." Discussions will focus on key challenges facing small businesses, including global economic uncertainty, geopolitical tensions, and supply chain disruptions.

The two-day programme will feature five panel discussions, an opening ceremony, a book launch by a UNISMEO

board member from Nigeria, and the announcement of policy recommendations aimed at strengthening SMEs—particularly micro-enterprises—and improving their resilience in a rapidly evolving global economy.

Mirsad Jašarević, President of the Chamber of Economy of Bosnia and Herzegovina and President of UNISMEO Bosnia, welcomed the partnership with Bahrain, saying the forum will serve as a global platform for exchanging ideas and developing practical solutions to support the sustainable growth of SMEs worldwide.

From palm to plate

Bahrain's rutab season begins

Bahrain's rutab markets are beginning to fill as the summer heat settles in, with early local varieties opening a season that arrives in stages rather than all at once. A tour by The Daily Tribune found active buying at local markets, where consumers chose from the first fresh batches of Bahraini rutab amid prices that varied according to variety, timing and supply.

Vendors said early types such as Mawaji, Tayyar and Ghurra are now available, while popular varieties including Khalas and Khunaizi are expected to arrive in larger quantities later in the season.

Bahraini heritage enthusiast Hasan Al Majed said the rutab season is part of a wider agricultural rhythm tied to the life of the palm tree. He said rutab is not only a taste, but a story of a palm tree



and years of patience.

According to Mr Al Majed, the season in Bahrain usually runs from July through August, although early varieties begin appearing before the peak.

Al Majed explained that the fruit passes through several traditional stages before becoming

dates. It begins with Hababou, a small green fruit, before moving to Sheesa, a longer and thinner early stage. It then reaches Khalal, when ripening begins, followed by Biser, the stage before full softening.

Rutab

Rutab is the best-known stage in Bahrain, he said. At this point, the fruit becomes soft, juicy and sweet, making it one of the most popular seasonal foods. The final stage is Tamr, when the fruit becomes dry or semi-dry and suitable for storage over longer periods. Seller Abdulshahed Al Shamtout said

Bahrain's rutab season does not begin with all varieties appearing together. Mawaji is among the first to open the season, followed by types such as Tayyar, Bajairat, Ghurra, Nasiri and Khudairi.

He said more varieties, including Barhi, Hilali, Shishi, and Salmi, will appear as the season progresses. Al Shamtout said Bahrain has more than 72 local rutab varieties.

They differ in colour, size, taste and ripening time, giving the season both length and va-



riety.

He said the season usually begins in the final part of June and continues until around mid-September, with peak availability from July to mid-August.

Seller Habib Al Baqali said Mawaji began appearing in markets around three weeks ago, followed by Bajairat and Tayyar.

He said Ghurra is currently among the most in-demand varieties, selling for about BD2.5 per kilogramme. Bajairat sells for about BD1.5, while Mawaji ranges between BD1 and BD1.5 per kilogramme.

Al Baqali said Tayyar gets its name from its short season and how quickly it disappears from markets. He added that Bajairat is known as an early ripening variety, recognised by its yellow colour at the start of the season. He said Khalas and Khunaizi remain among the most await-

ed varieties for consumers, but their arrival depends on their natural ripening time.

GCC Visitors Flock to Final Day of Almond Festival

Almonds drew strong interest from GCC visitors on the final day of the three-day Bahrain Almond Festival held in Hoorat A'ali, as families and tourists explored a wide range of fresh produce, home-made products and agricultural displays.

The festival featured fresh Habban almonds alongside almond ice cream, sweets, jams, roasted coffee and Bahraini honey, with steady footfall reported from morning until closing hours.

Local seller Abu Kareem said the current Habban season is at its peak and typically lasts between four to six weeks before the jumbo variety arrives. He noted that despite increasing competition from imported produce, Bahraini almonds continue to maintain strong local demand.

Visitors were presented with several varieties of Habban almonds, including yellow, red-fleshed and mixed types, with prices ranging between BD5 and BD10 depending on quality and size.

Beyond fresh produce, productive families and small businesses showcased almond-based innovations such as mabooj, desserts and ice cream, highlighting growing opportunities for seasonal food entrepreneurship.

The festival also featured almond seedlings, with vendor Sadiq Al Marzooq noting strong interest from GCC visitors keen on cultivating the

trees themselves. He said the seedlings are suited to Gulf climates and added an educational dimension to the event by encouraging agricultural awareness alongside commercial activity.

Organisers and vendors said the turnout reflected a rising appreciation for local agricultural heritage and the potential for expanding value-added products built around Bahrain's seasonal crops.

Global Cycling Activist Set to Revisit Bahrain After 28,000km Ride

cial role to play in tackling climate change, Sharma said lasting change also depends on individual action.

"Planting a tree is something everyone can do," he said. "People can water it, protect it and help it grow. In rural areas, natural compost is enough. When people care for a tree themselves, they feel proud because they know they have contributed."

For Sharma, the journey is about more than cycling across borders. It is about inspiring ordinary people to make small, practical changes that collectively can have a lasting impact on the planet. He hopes to return to Bahrain one day to volunteer in tree-planting campaigns, saying the Kingdom's commitment to afforestation and sustainability makes it a place he would like to support.

After covering more than 28,000 kilometres and planting around 70 trees across Asia and

Africa over the past four and a half years, Sharma says Bahrain stands out for its commitment to afforestation and environmental sustainability. He hopes to return to the Kingdom to volunteer in tree-planting campaigns supporting its net-zero ambitions, saying Bahrain's environmental vision closely aligns with his own mission.

Speaking to The Daily Tribune, about his ambitious goal of cycling through 150 countries to spread awareness about climate change, Sharma said,

"I have a target of visiting 150 countries, but I have completed only 27 so far."

Bahrain was the 18th stop on

Sharma's global journey in 2024. After leaving the Kingdom, he travelled to Oman before cycling across East Africa, visiting Kenya, Tanzania, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi and Malawi.

Challenges

Reflecting on his travels, Sharma said one of the biggest challenges he witnessed was the continued loss of forests and the lack of environmental awareness in many communities.

"In many places, people still depend on timber for energy, and large trees have disappeared," he said. "The bigger issue is that many people still do not understand the relationship between

forests, nature and climate."

Despite the progress he has made, Sharma told TDT that funding remains one of the biggest obstacles to completing his mission, and that he is seeking collaborations with governments and climate action partners.

"Sometimes I cannot find a major sponsor, so it is difficult to manage the expenses," he said.

His next goal is to secure a visa for Canada before continuing his journey through West Africa.

Beyond Borders

Speaking about the current heatwave, Sharma said the effects of climate change are becoming increasingly visible around the

world.

"Even the Himalayas are losing snow, now many areas are bare, and even at the mountain base camps you can find mosquitoes and flies where they were never seen before," he said.

While he believes governments and international organisations have a cru-

tive and procedural development, strengthen reputation and credibility, and build trust with suppliers, partners, and stakeholders.

She further stated that it embodies commitment to governance, transparency, integrity, and sustainability, supporting the Secretariat's direction toward continued administrative excellence in line with international best practices.

Accountant Cleared in BHD 74,000 Embezzlement Case

The Third Lower Criminal Court has acquitted an accounting officer accused of embezzling BHD 74,000 from a well-known restaurant group after finding that the evidence presented was insufficient to support a conviction.

According to the case file, the Public Prosecution charged the defendant, who worked as the group's accounting officer, with embezzling BHD 74,000 in 2025. His duties included receiving and reviewing cash proceeds from the company's branches before they were deposited into the company's bank accounts.

The case began when the company's management noticed discrepancies between reported sales and the amounts deposited into its accounts. When questioned, the defendant denied any irregularities, prompting the company to commission a specialized accounting audit. The audit allegedly revealed a shortage of BHD 74,000, in addition

to BHD 14,000 belonging to another company. The company also stated that the defendant had begun attending work irregularly.

During the trial, the defendant denied all allegations. His lawyers, Taybah Fadhel and Kawthar Mohammed, argued that the case file contained no direct evidence linking their client to the alleged embezzlement. They further challenged the authenticity of documents and signatures attributed to him, highlighted inconsistencies between the complainant's testimony and that of the prosecution's witness, and requested that the accounting report submitted by the complainant be disregarded or that an independent accounting expert be appointed.

In its judgment, the court found the accounting report unreliable, citing numerous inconsistencies and shortcomings. It noted that the report assumed the defendant had committed embezzlement despite the absence of documents proving that



he had received or reviewed the cash before its deposit into the company's bank account. The report also relied, in part, on statements made by the company's drivers.

The court further held that the case file contained no additional evidence sufficient to establish the defendant's guilt. It concluded that the prosecution's evidence was too weak to sustain a conviction, emphasizing that criminal convictions must be based on conclusive proof that leaves no reasonable doubt. As this standard had not been met, the court acquitted the defendant of the embezzlement charge.

Technology, AI, and The New Age of Banking at NBB

In banking, technology rarely gives institutions the luxury of time. A system that feels advanced today can quickly become outdated, and a digital service that meets customer expectations this year may feel slow or limited the next. For Razi Amin, Group Chief Technology Officer at the National Bank of Bahrain (NBB), that pace has shaped the way the Bank thinks about technology investment.

NBB, he explains, treats technology as a continuous commitment. It is not a periodic upgrade or a response to market changes, but a standing strategic priority endorsed at the highest echelons of the institution and reviewed with the understanding that the environment around it is always moving.

"The technology you have today may become obsolete tomorrow," Amin says. "If you delay your investment in technology by even a single day, you risk falling behind global digital transformation."

That sense of urgency warrants a structured approach to transformation. NBB develops a digital strategy approximately every three years, while reviewing it regularly to make sure it remains relevant. The Bank's approach allows it to set direction while leaving enough room to adjust when the market changes, when customer behaviours shift, or when new technologies move faster than expected.

"What may have seemed like the right direction three years ago might no longer be suitable under current circumstances,"

Amin says.

This is the foundation of NBB's technology philosophy. The Bank invests with a view of where technology is heading, then begins building the capabilities before they become industry requirements. For Amin, that is what distinguishes a technology leader from an institution trying to catch up.

"Our technology strategy is not a reaction to events," he says. "It is a forward-looking vision."

The value behind every investment

A forward-looking strategy, however, still needs to prove its value. At NBB, technology investments are measured through clear standards and performance indicators that are monitored continuously. The Bank looks at how technology improves service, how it strengthens operational efficiency, and how well it protects customers in an environment where digital risk is growing.

This last point is particularly critical for Amin. As digital banking becomes more advanced, fraud and cybersecurity threats also become more sophisticated. Technology investment, in this sense, shifts from being just an enabler of faster services or more convenient channels to being more about ensuring customers can use those channels safely.

"A major focus is ensuring we make the right technology investments to safeguard our customers while using our digital services and protect their funds from fraud," he says.

This puts customer protection at the centre of technology performance. A successful investment must improve the

experience, increase efficiency and reinforce trust. These outcomes are assessed against predefined benchmarks, which helps the Bank decide whether an investment continues to deliver what it was intended to deliver.

Constant review matters because technological advancements don't stand still. A solution acquired recently can be overtaken quickly by something more advanced. NBB's answer is to treat evaluation as an ongoing process, with every system and tool tested against the Bank's changing needs and the expectations of its customers.

Reading the signals early

Inside NBB's Technology Division, Amin points to a dedicated team tasked with looking beyond the immediate needs of the Bank. He calls them "out-of-the-box thinkers." Their role is to monitor the market, study emerging trends and identify opportunities early enough for

the Bank to act before those technologies become mainstream.

The aim is simple: avoid waiting until a development becomes unavoidable.

This approach reflects the nature of the Bahraini market. Amin describes it as highly receptive to technology, with customers who are quick to adopt new solutions and expect financial institutions to keep pace. That creates pressure, and it also creates momentum.

"They are constantly demanding the latest technologies," he says. "We do not need to convince customers to adopt new solutions. They already want them."

For a bank, that changes the task where innovation becomes a vehicle to keep up with a customer base that already understands the value of speed, convenience and new functionality. NBB's technology teams are therefore focused on constantly monitoring the market, assessing what is coming, and

deciding how early adoption can be turned into better service.

What AI transforms within the Bank

Few technologies have changed the conversation as quickly as artificial intelligence. Amin does not consider AI as something the Bank can afford to watch from the sidelines. "AI is already here, and it is here to stay," he says.

His view of AI is practical. He sees it as a tool that can help employees become more accurate, productive and efficient. For that reason, NBB is training employees across the entire Group to use AI responsibly and effectively, including those in non-technical roles. The Bank's leadership realises that AI's value in banking is not confined to one function or business unit. It can support faster transactions, improve accuracy, strengthen analytics, and help in understanding customer needs with greater clarity. Amin points to transaction patterns as one example. By studying behaviour intelligently, NBB teams can better infer what customers may need without requiring them to contact the Bank directly.

That capability changes the relationship between technology and service. It allows the Bank to move from responding to customer requests to anticipating where support, guidance or a product may be useful. Used responsibly, AI becomes part of wider organisational efforts to make services quicker and more relevant.

"We need to be smart about how we adapt our ways of working and leverage these tools to our advantage," Amin

says.

From investment to impact

NBB considers technology as a strategic enabler of growth and innovation, and the mindset shared across the Board, Management and employees. The point is to embed it into the Bank's wider strategy, so that every investment contributes to how NBB evolves as an institution.

This is also where the Bank's technology agenda connects to Bahrain's national ambitions towards the progress of its financial sector. As a national bank, NBB's digital development is not only about its own competitiveness, but also about adding more strength and readiness to the banking ecosystem around it.

"At the same time, these efforts contribute to strengthening Bahrain's position as a leading financial centre in the region," Amin says.

That is the broader significance of the strategy he describes. Technology investment at NBB is about preparedness, customer trust, workforce capability and national competitiveness. It is about building the systems, tools and skills the Bank believes will matter next, then ensuring they are already in place when the market reaches that point.

A bank can either wait for technology to become urgent, or it can begin shaping its response before urgency arrives. NBB has chosen the second path with a strategy built on constant evaluation, early adoption, and a belief that technology can make banking more convenient and secure for the people and businesses it serves.

King Charles says US-UK to continue to defend 'shared values' on 250th anniversary

King Charles III yesterday said the US and UK would continue to defend "shared values", in a message to US President Donald Trump and the American people on the country's 250th independence anniversary.

The monarch wrote in a message posted on X that as the two countries "look ahead to the next 250 years, I have no doubt we will continue to defend our shared values", including liberty and the rule of law.

The 77-year-old along with Queen Camilla made a four-day state visit to the US at the end of April. Aimed at healing strained ties between Washington and London, the trip was hailed as a success by British and US media.

The king wrote Saturday that he believed the "connection between our peoples... will only grow stronger with time".

Prince Harry to visit London without wife, children

Prince Harry will visit London without his wife and children as part of a trip to the UK next week, a source close to him told AFP Saturday, after he was reportedly refused police protection for his family.

The prince had previously been expected to make his first family trip back to the UK in four years, but the source close to the Duke of Sussex told AFP that his wife Meghan, son Archie and daughter Lilibet would not accompany him on the London part of the trip.

Arrangements for the rest of the trip were still under consideration, the source said, leaving it unclear whether the whole family would visit but stay outside the capital.

British media reported Harry, 41, would fly in on Monday for a five-day visit marking the one-year countdown towards next year's Invictus Games, launched by the prince in 2014 for wounded veterans.

The prince was also expected to attend engagements with his other charities during the trip.

Millions of Americans celebrated the country's 250th birthday yesterday -- a landmark celebration that comes at a time of deep political division, with a president determined to put his stamp on the festivities.

Washington's traditional fireworks display on the National Mall -- lined with monuments celebrating the nation's Founding Fathers -- has been super-sized, and is being touted as

the biggest ever.

President Donald Trump has added a programme of roaring military flyovers -- and an unusual campaign-style political rally -- for July Fourth, which marks the anniversary of the 1776 signing of the Declaration of Independence.

With temperatures in

the US capital expected to reach 102F (39C) -- and the heat index soaring to 110-115F, the Independence Day parade in Washington was canceled.

Trump, who turned 80 last month, remains undeterred by the sweltering temperatures.

"It's going to be approximately 107 degrees out, and I'm going

to go and I'm going to make a really long speech -- just to show that I can do anything," Trump said in the run-up to the revelry. 'Renewed attack'

Late Friday, Trump visited the iconic Mount Rushmore monument in South Dakota for an address under the gaze of four of his legendary predecessors, etched in granite -- George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln and Theodore Roosevelt.

While he lauded US exceptionalism and praised the country's past leaders, he also said America's identity was under "renewed attack" from domestic "radicals and extremists," saving particular ire for a "resurgence of the communist menace."

On Friday, Trump said there has been an attempt to "beat the American spirit out of us, alienate us from our history" in recent years.

"You do not have to be born here, but you do have to love what we have built," he said.

In London, King Charles III said Britain and the country formed from its former colonies would "continue to defend our shared values."



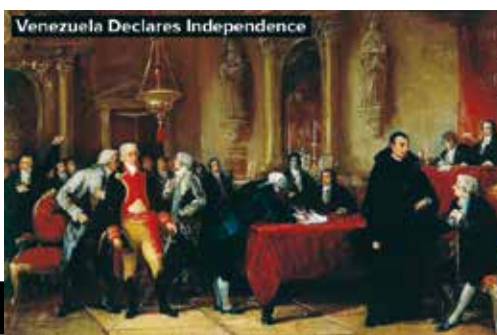

Hundreds of firefighters battle to contain Portugal blaze

Lisbon, Portugal

More than 1,000 firefighters were trying to contain a growing forest fire in northern Portugal yesterday that has burned for several days as the country battles intense heat.

With temperatures expected to reach 44C in some places, the fire that broke out on Wednesday

in the Viseu district has devoured 10,000 hectares (25,000 acres) so far, rescue services said.

Some 1,100 firefighters were battling to contain the blaze, backed by 380 trucks and eight planes and helicopters, they said.

A Spanish military unit was helping the efforts after Portugal asked for European help in

fighting the season's first major wildfire.

Nine people have been injured so far, including two civilians who are in a serious condition.

The government has ordered special measures including barring access to forests and restricting the use of some types of machinery in rural areas.

Russia says Ukraine drones downed over St Petersburg

Russia shot down dozens of Ukrainian drones over Saint Petersburg, authorities said yesterday, with an oil terminal hit and drones falling on a key port as well as a historic palace complex.

The strikes on President Vladimir Putin's home city came after a massive Russian attack on Kyiv killed 30 people this week.

Ukraine has increasingly hit Russian cities far from the border in retaliation for Moscow's daily strikes in the offensive since February 2022.

"The strike hit the area of an oil terminal in the Kirovsk district of the city. The technical consequences have been resolved. There were no casualties," Saint Petersburg governor Alexander Beglov said on social media.

"Air defence forces shot down 72 UAVs, one of which crashed in Peterhof. There were no casualties or damage," he added.

The Peterhof palace is a giant estate of gardens and a palace built in the 18th century under

Russian Tsar Peter I.

Drone debris also fell around the port of Vysotsk, north of Saint Petersburg and near the border with Finland, the Leningrad region governor Alexander Drozdenko said.

"Debris has been reported in the area of the port of Vysotsk. Details are being confirmed," Drozdenko said on social media.

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky claimed the Kronstadt naval base in Saint Petersburg was hit in the strikes.

"Ukraine's defence forces struck port oil infrastructure that generates revenue for Russia's war, and there were also successful strikes on Kronstadt -- an important military target," he said on social media.

Kyiv has upped its attacks inside Russia, hitting targets as far as the Urals, with Putin admitting that Moscow needed to improve its air defences as part of the offensive, which has become Europe's worst conflict since World War II.

'Super typhoon' Bavi heads for US Pacific islands

Residents of Guam and the Northern Marianas boarded up windows and stocked up as a monster weather system upgraded on Saturday to a "super typhoon" -- the equivalent of a category-5 hurricane -- approached the US Pacific territories.

Typhoon Bavi was moving west between the Marshall Islands and the Northern Marianas with sustained winds of 259 kilometers per hour (161 miles per hour) with gusts of 314 kph (195 mph), the Joint Typhoon Warning Center (JTWC) said in its latest update at 7 am Guam time (2100 GMT Friday).

"Current forecast tracks continue to indicate a grim outlook for the Marianas," the US National Weather Service warned. "All residents across Guam and the [Northern Mariana Islands] should plan for and anticipate at least tropical storm conditions."

Just months after a major storm hit, cars in Saipan, in the Northern Marianas, queued at petrol stations on Saturday,

while residents thronged hardware stores to buy plywood and supermarkets for food, bottled water and other essentials.

The storm was expected to weaken very slightly by the time it arrived on Monday over Guam and the Northern Marianas -- which are still recovering from Super Typhoon Sinlaku in April.

Plans for celebrating the United States' 250th anniversary on Saturday have been quickly overtaken by storm preparations.

At the Pacific Islands Club Saipan resort, workers were boarding up windows, securing outdoor furniture and equipment, checking alarm systems and stocking first aid kits.

"Everyone has a role," the resort's sports, entertainment and activities manager Reymark Castro, 35, told AFP.

"From engineering to landscaping to operations, we're all working together to reduce damage and make sure we're ready to respond once the storm passes."

GCC - GLOBAL PEACE ARCHITECT

The June 2026 diplomatic tour by U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio to the Gulf Cooperation Council states underscored the bloc's growing leverage as the indispensable anchor of regional security. Convening in Manama, GCC leaders engaged Washington from a position of strategic strength, ensuring that the provisional U.S.-Iran Memorandum of Understanding cannot be finalized at the expense of Gulf sovereignty, safety, or economic stability.

For the GCC, the potential resumption of hostilities remains a calculated risk managed through firm, conditional diplomacy. While welcoming the initial end to direct conflict, the bloc made it clear that lasting peace depends entirely on verifiable changes in Iranian behavior.

The GCC successfully codified a rigid baseline for any permanent agreement, mandating that Iran must unconditionally halt its ballistic missile proliferation, dismantle its drone networks, and permanently cease funding destabilizing regional proxies in Iraq, Lebanon, and Yemen.

Should Tehran violate these clear parameters or attempt to obscure its nuclear ambitions, the GCC has ensured that all sanctions relief and trade investments under the framework remain fully conditional and reversible. By agreeing with Washington to explicitly acknowledge that regional proxy warfare constitutes a violation of the ceasefire, the GCC has effectively protected its borders from asymmetrical escalation.

Through cohesive and unified diplomacy, the GCC states extracted major concessions that protect their national interests and reinforce their geopolitical authority.

The GCC secured an absolute U.S. veto against Tehran's attempts to impose maritime tolls or fees in the Strait of Hormuz, preserving the unhindered flow of global energy and international maritime law. Furthermore, Gulf leaders forcefully rejected initial proposals hinting at regional contributions to a three hundred billion dollar Iranian reconstruction fund, guaranteeing that Gulf capitals will not foot the bill for Tehran's post-war recovery. Rather than passively accepting a Western-dictated roadmap, the GCC positioned itself as an equal architect of the peace framework, leveraging defense partnerships with global powers to ensure that no regional settlement can ever bypass Gulf consent.

Germany summons Chinese envoy over reported training of Russian troops

Berlin, Germany

The Chinese ambassador in Berlin was summoned for urgent talks over media reports that Russian soldiers were being trained in China, the German foreign ministry said on Friday.

These "deeply disturbing" reports point to support for Russia from Chinese state actors, in particular the Chinese People's Liberation Army, it said. The envoy was summoned on Thursday, it added.

"Anything that enables Russia to continue its war of aggression against Ukraine also represents a threat to our security," the ministry said.

The German government regularly stresses its concern over China's support for Russia.

This was notably the case during Chancellor Friedrich Merz's visit to China in February, the ministry said, adding that it is "addressing this issue in depth with its European partners."

Starmmer warns successor he will have to stay on international stage

Britain's outgoing prime minister Keir Starmer warned his probable successor Andy Burnham in an interview released Saturday that he cannot ignore international

moil and just concentrate on the country's domestic problems.

In his first interview since announcing his resignation on June 22, Starmer said his successor as leader of the ruling Labour party could not spend less time on turbulent international affairs.

So far, former Manchester mayor Burnham is the only candidate to take over the centre-left party. He could be in office by mid-July.

"Whoever's my successor is going to face the same global conflict. We keep saying, and it's true, we're in a more dangerous and volatile world than we've been in for probably most of my lifetime. That's not just a phrase, that's reality," Starmer told the BBC.

Burnham's supporters have said he should put more focus on domestic issues, such as the cost of living, and Burnham said this week that decentralisation of government would be a priority.

But in a social media question-and-answer session Friday, he discussed international topics and said he would "100 percent" give the same sup-

port to Ukraine as Starmer.

Asked by the BBC, Starmer said his successor would not be able to spend less time on diplomacy.

"There's often this discussion -- what's the right balance between dealing with international affairs and dealing with domestic affairs? They're one and the same thing," Starmer said.

"If you're prime minister and you care what bills are going to be like in any household around the country, you have to care about finding a lasting solution to the situation in Ukraine, you have to care about what happens in the Strait of Hormuz."

Starmer said he had "never had any personal animosity" towards Burnham and that he would "do everything I possibly can to make sure" that the next government succeeds.

Starmer, who led Labour to a spectacular win in the 2024 general election, has said he will remain in parliament at least until the next nationwide vote, but told the BBC he would be "keeping my

mouth shut, rather than giving constant advice to

my successor about what they should be doing."

Starmer had vowed to fight any challenge to his leadership, but gave in to intense pressure from his party. "In the end it became an intensely personal decision," he said, one taken with his wife and children at the British prime minister's country retreat.

"We went to Chequers and just spent two days together as a family. And that's when I came to my final decision," he said.

Tens of thousands rally in France against sexual violence

Tens of thousands of people demonstrated in several French cities Saturday to protest against sexual violence, the latest manifestation of outrage that has been sparked by the rape and killing of an 11-year-old girl.

The body of the girl, named as Lyhanna, was found last month after she went missing on May 29 in the southwestern town of Fleurance.

The suspect, a 41-year-old father of a school friend of the victim, had twice before been formally accused of raping a child, but investigations had been dropped or had stalled.

The death has sparked outrage and calls for the resignation of Justice Minister Gerald Darmanin who has refused to step down but apologised for what he called a "huge failure".

On Saturday people marched in Paris shouting slogans such as "Truth emerges from the mouths of children!" and "160,000 children, what are you doing?"

Organisers said 100,000 people were participating in the Paris march and called it a "historic mobilisation against sexual violence".

Lebanese president urges US to 'keep standing' by country

Lebanese President Joseph Aoun on Saturday urged the United States to stand by his country after a recent US-backed framework deal with Israel aiming to permanently end hostilities after the latest Israel-Hezbollah war.

The deal reached in Washington calls for the disarmament of Iran-backed militant group Hezbollah, a gradual Israeli withdrawal from southern Leb-

anon and the deployment of the Lebanese army there, starting with two "pilot" areas.

Hezbollah has rejected the deal, which does not set a timetable for an Israeli withdrawal.

In a congratulatory message to Pres-

Donald Trump marking the United States' 250th anniversary of independence, Aoun urged Washington to "keep always standing beside Lebanon's right and just causes, its institutions, army and people".

Aoun expressed hope that Lebanon could "turn the page on wars... and open a new page of hope, peace and stability".



German defence giant laments 'setback' after warship debacle

The boss of German defence giant Rheinmetall said the group's failure to secure a contract from Berlin to build next-generation warships was a "setback", in an interview published yesterday.

The German government unexpectedly announced last month that it was abandoning the multi-billion-euro project, sending Rheinmetall's shares tumbling around 20 percent as the company had been expected to take on the work.

"The cancellation of the F126 project was a setback for us, and it caught us completely off guard," Rheinmetall boss Armin Papperger told news outlet Der Spiegel.

The project to build the frigates was originally awarded to a Dutch shipyard.

But after years of delays and problems, Berlin was expected to hand the work to Rheinmetall, already a

major supplier of armaments to the German military.

Instead of moving ahead with the F126 project however, the German defence ministry decided to purchase eight smaller warships from German group TKMS.

Papperger also defended Rheinmetall's recent acquisition of shipyard NVL, which was supposed to take on the F126 project.

"Rheinmetall moving into the maritime sector was the right decision, because demand is high, not just from the Germany military," he said.

Germany, like other European countries, is spending huge sums to rebuild its long-neglected armed forces to contend with a hostile Rus-

sia and amid worries about US security commitments to the continent.



France Ebola patient recovers

Paris, France

A doctor who had tested positive for Ebola in the first such case on French territory has recovered and left the hospital, France's health minister said on Saturday.

The doctor tested positive after flying to France on June 23 from the Democratic Republic of Congo, which is fighting a major outbreak of the deadly haemorrhagic fever.

The physician "today left the medical establishment" and returned home, Health Minister Stephanie Rist said in a statement.

The case was the first time France has detected Ebola. In

2014, during an outbreak in west Africa, two patients were transported to France, but they had been diagnosed abroad.

The doctor flew to France on an Air France flight and except for headaches was "almost asymptomatic."

Five other passengers on the flight had been identified as possible contacts and put in isolation as a precaution.

DR Congo's latest Ebola outbreak was declared on May 15 and has since killed at least 438 people among the 1,406 people confirmed to have been infected, according to the latest government figures released on July 2.

Mali hit by new wave of coordinated rebel attacks

Jihadists and their separatist Tuareg allies hit Mali with fresh coordinated attacks Saturday, striking multiple towns and a prison just months after hobbling the country's military junta with a similar wave of assaults.

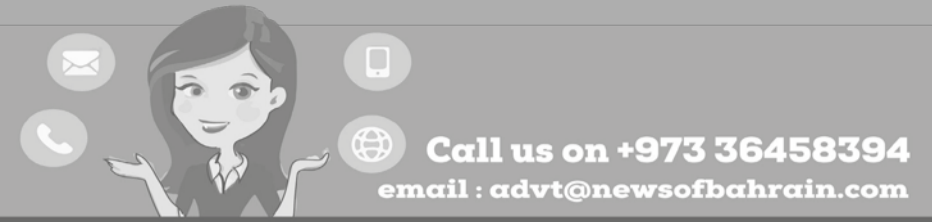
The fighting comes after the Al-Qaeda-linked JNIM jihadists and Tuareg FLA separatists in late April captured the strategic northern town of Kidal and killed Mali's defence

minister.

On Saturday, they carried out their latest offensive in the northern towns of Gao, Anefis and Aguelhok, plus the central town of Sevare and at a prison in Kenieroba near the west African nation's capital.

Since coups in 2020 and 2021, Mali has been led by the military. Its junta leaders had promised to restore calm in the vast desert nation that has been grappling with a security crisis since 2012, but so far have mostly failed to deliver.

Türkiye and Pakistan Aim for \$5 Billion Trade Target



During an official visit to Türkiye, Pakistan's Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif held a bilateral meeting with President Recep Tayyip Erdogan at Vahdettin Palace in Istanbul.

goals against DR Congo, England is in the round of 16.

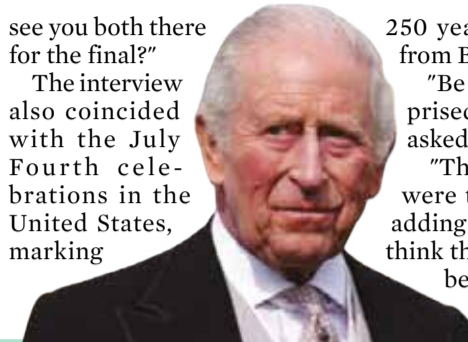
The "Three Lions" are slated to play Mexico at high-altitude Azteca Stadium on Sunday.

Zverev, seeded second, has failed to go beyond the fourth round in his past nine visits to the All England Club.

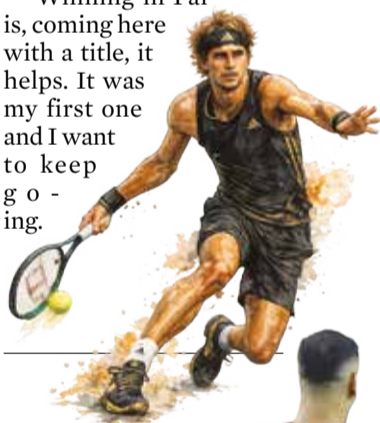
But the 29-year-old German is on course to end that frustrating streak this year.

Colombia overcome Ghana to reach World Cup last 16

Wasteful Colombia saw off toothless Ghana 1-0 on Friday to become the final team to qualify for the World Cup last 16.

The South Americans dominated the game at Arrowhead Stadium and had eight shots on target but ended up with just Jhon Arias's early goal to show for their superiority.

Now they can look forward to a meeting with Switzerland in Vancouver on Tuesday and a chance to reach the quarter-finals.

Ghana midfielder Thomas Partey fizzed a shot just wide in the opening minute but that proved a false dawn for the African nation.

Colombia were forced into an early change when Jhon Cordoba pulled up with an apparent groin injury and was replaced by Luis Suarez.

Minutes later, Ghana were forced into a change of their own when Alidu Seidu came on for the stricken Marvin

Senaya.

Colombia went ahead in the 14th minute after substitute Suarez showed persistence on the right flank and crossed for an unmarked Arias to steer home.

That gave Carlos Queiroz's goal-shy Black Stars, who scored just twice in the group phase, a major headache.

Colombia, roared on by a partisan crowd in Kansas City, continued to dominate, playing fluid, inventive football as they searched for a second goal.

Bayern Munich forward Luis Diaz had a won-

derful chance to double Colombia's lead in the 39th minute but scuffed his shot wide.

Early in first-half stoppage time Ghana goalkeeper Lawrence Ati Zigi produced a superb save from Johan Mojica's downward header.

The half-time numbers made grim reading for Ghana -- not a single shot on target and less than half of Colombia's 319 completed passes -- but they were still in the game.

Colombia made hard work of the second peri-

od, squandering a number of opportunities to finish off their opponents.

Diaz put the ball in the net but was flagged offside before striking another shot straight at Zigi.

As time ticked down, Juan Quintero flashed a powerful shot wide but one goal turned out to be enough against a side that failed to muster a single shot on target.

Diaz, named man of the match, said Colombia were improving game by game, though he admitted they needed to be sharper in front of goal.

"I'm heartbroken to have to withdraw from doubles," the 44-year-old said on Instagram.

Serena, a 23-time Grand Slam singles champion, suffered the injury during her defeat against Australia's Maya Joint in the first round of the Wimbledon singles on Tuesday.

That was her first singles match since the 2022 US Open after four years in retirement.

The sisters, who won the Wimbledon doubles six times, were scheduled to face Solana Siera and Camila Osorio after being given a wild card entry into the event.

The former Liverpool superstar and Egypt captain stepped up third in the shootout for his country and scored a "Pan-

ka" as they beat Australia 4-2 on penalties after the game ended 1-1 in Texas.

Egypt, who won a World Cup knockout game for the first time, face Lionel Messi's Argentina or Cape Verde next.

The 34-year-old Salah was clearly hampered by a hamstring strain, but played the whole 120 minutes and stepped up for his country when they

needed him.

"If somebody was going to do it, it would be me. I am more experienced than others and I wanted to give them confidence," said Salah, who had looked emotional afterwards.

"I decided last minute, I had to do it."

Salah proclaimed "history" for Egypt and told his team-

mates to enjoy it, after the great underachievers of African football finally made their mark on the biggest stage.

Salah could well be at his last World Cup, and said: "I always try to enjoy every moment because it does not come back."

"So I always tell the boys, 'just enjoy the moment', and probably we'll see tonight in

a few minutes how we're going to celebrate outside the bus now."

"But we can't take it for granted because Egypt -- I don't know how many times I've said the word -- but it's never before we qualified in a group stage and never qualified for the next round, so it's just a moment to enjoy." Egypt coach Hossam Hassan had said on Thursday

that he was "not sure" if the talisman would be fit to start.

But Hassan named him in a starting XI that also included Manchester City's Omar Marmoush in attack.

Aside from his penalty in the shootout, Salah has one goal and two assists so far at the tournament in North America and averages a goal every other game for his country.

The championship was played in a single round-robin format, with the top two sides advancing to the final.

Bahrain's title win also came as part of their build-up for the Gulf Championship, which serves as a qualifier for the Asian Cup and is due to be held in Qatar next month.

Bahraini basketball player Aya Kamali has become the youngest player from

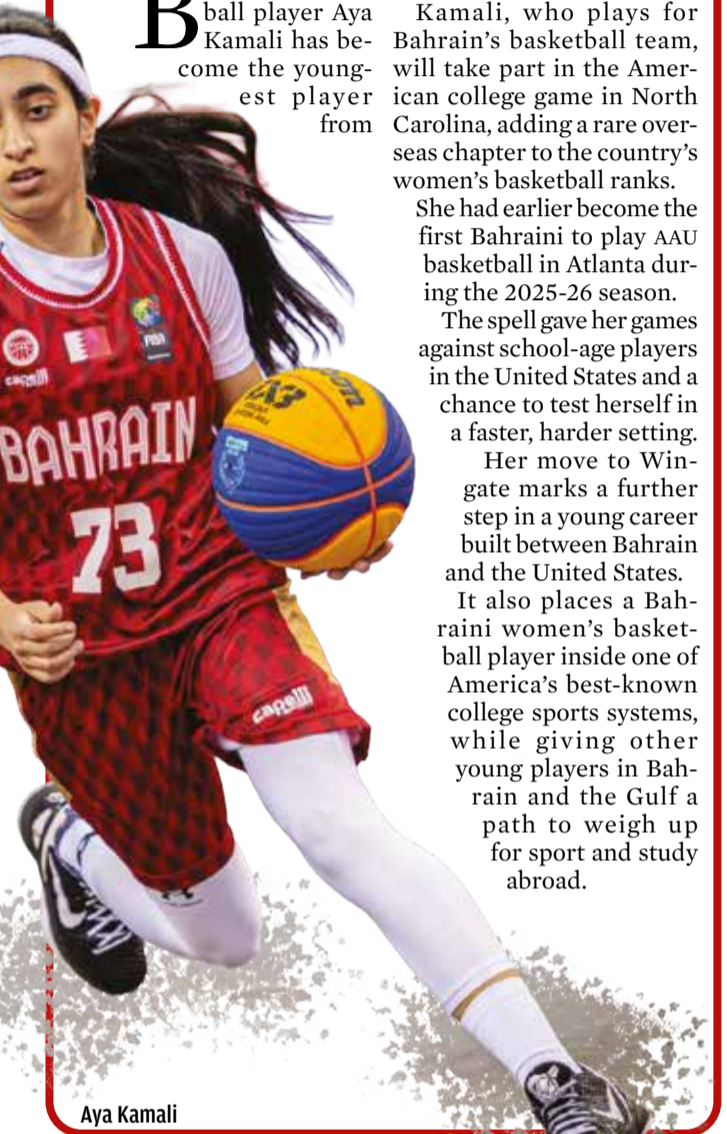
Bahrain to compete in NCAA college basketball in the United States after joining Wingate University.

Recharged Klopp 'ready' for Germany coach talks

Speaking on Magenta TV, for whom he was working as a World Cup pundit, Klopp said: "The timing isn't perfect right now.

"Nevertheless, it's better than it has ever been. By now, I'm more than recharged. So, I'm ready."

Klopp added: "I have an existing contract with Red Bull. I like to honour contracts.

Ruthless Morocco break Canadian hearts

Reach World Cup quarters

Canada became the first of the co-hosts to exit the World Cup as a clinical Morocco won 3-0 to reach the quarter-finals on Saturday in Houston.

The 2022 semi-finalists Morocco will face title favourites France or Paraguay as the business end of the tournament in North America approaches.

After a first half littered with more bookings than shots, midfielder Azzedine Ounahi fired the opener on 50 minutes.

Canada -- playing the biggest game in their footballing history -- pushed for an equaliser, but Ounahi scored his second to finally see off the resistance of Jesse Marsch's men.

Substitute Soufiane Rahimi slipped in the third with the last kick of the match.

It was tough on Canada, who were the better side in the opening period in front of a crowd of 68,777 as they sought to make more history.

They were clear underdogs and their fans were outnumbered by Morocco supporters at the air-conditioned Houston Stadium.

Yet they looked the more confident at the start, Tani Oluwaseyi turning sharply in the box and forcing Morocco's Mon-



real-born goalkeeper Yassine Bounou to save with a stretched-out leg after 10 minutes.

From Canada's fourth corner of the half, defender Alistair Johnston failed to make the most of a free header. Morocco were rattled.

Immediately after the drinks break Rahimi had a go optimistically from distance, registering Morocco's first shot on target with a quarter of the game gone.
