Bahrain will witness a total lunar eclipse on the evening of Sunday, September 7, 2025, lasting for more than five hours.

The event will begin at 6:27pm when the moon enters Earth's penumbral shadow.

The visible stages start at 7:26pm, with the moon moving into Earth's darker shadow.

## Traffic accident on Al Fateh Street

A traffic accident on Al Fateh Street, in the direction of Mina Salman, caused heavy congestion yesterday.

The General Traffic Directorate immediately deployed teams to the site to manage the situation, facilitate vehicle movement, and restore normal traffic flow.

Motorists were urged to drive cautiously and follow traffic instructions to ensure their safety and that of other road users.

## 16 killed, five hurt in Portugal funicular crash

Portuguese authorities yesterday said the Lisbon funicular disaster had killed 16 people and left five seriously injured, lowering the previous death toll by one.

Portugal's Prime Minister Luis Montenegro said in giving the new toll that the accident on Wednesday evening was "one of the biggest tragedies in our recent history".

The civil protection service said only one person had died late Wednesday after being taken to hospital, having previously reported two.

A prosecution service spokesman said five Portuguese, two Koreans and a Swiss national had been identified among the dead. Probe in underway.

AFP | Gaza City

The Israeli military yesterday said it controls 40 percent of Gaza City, the largest urban centre in the Palestinian territory which it is preparing to conquer after nearly two years of devastating war.

Israel has intensified in recent days its bombardments of the area of Gaza City, in the territory's north, ahead of the planned offensive, despite mounting international pressure to halt the campaign.

### Casualties

Gaza's civil defence agency said Israeli strikes yesterday killed more than 30 people in the city, out of at least 64 Palestinians killed across the Gaza Strip.

As concern grows over the dire humanitarian conditions for Gaza's population of more than two million, one of the European Union's top officials called the war a "genocide" - a term strongly rejected by Israel, but which several governments and numerous rights groups have adopted.

In a televised briefing, Israeli military spokesman Brigadier

General Effie Defrin said that "we hold 40 percent of the territory of Gaza City", adding that the offensive "will continue to expand and intensify in the coming days".

### Pressure

Defrin vowed to "increase the

pressure" on Palestinian group Hamas, whose October 2023 attack on Israel sparked the war, "until it is defeated".

With the vast majority of Gazans already displaced at least once during the war, a senior Israeli military official told journalists on Wednesday that

authorities expected the new offensive to push an estimated one million Palestinians south, away from Gaza City.

The United Nations last month declared a famine in and around Gaza City, where it estimates nearly one million people live.

Concern grows over the dire humanitarian conditions for Gaza's population of more than two million.

### Air strike

Civil defence spokesman Mahmud Bassal said that an Israeli air strike yesterday hit a tent sheltering a displaced Palestinian family in Gaza City, killing five people including three children.

In Tel al-Hawa, the neighbourhood where the strike reported by the civil defence took place, AFP footage showed Palestinians outside damaged tents, clearing up scattered belongings.

## Trump tells Europe

## 'Put economic pressure on China over Ukraine'

US President Donald Trump urged European countries yesterday to put economic pressure on China because of its support for Russia's invasion of Ukraine, the White House said.

Speaking by video conference with European leaders gathered in Paris, Trump also said "Europe must stop purchasing Russian oil that is funding the war," a senior White House official told AFP on condition of anonymity.

Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky, who also took part in the meeting, said earlier that Trump is "very dissatisfied" with European purchases of Russian oil, saying the buyers were Hungary and Slovakia. Zelensky also said he discussed sanctions on Russia

and protecting Ukraine's airspace in the call that he and European leaders held with Trump. Trump, whose efforts to mediate between Russia and Ukraine have failed to produce a breakthrough, has been tightlipped on what his next move will be as he seeks an end to the war.

The US has already decided to impose sanctions on India as punishment for buying Russian oil. Trump so far has not done this with China, which imports a lot of Russian oil and is holding trade talks with Washington. Trump has been talking tough of late about China, however.

On Tuesday, he accused Chinese President Xi Jinping of conspiring against the US with Russian President Vladimir Putin and North Korean leader Kim Jong Un.

## August transactions for small vessels down 13.8%

Transactions at the Small Vessels Registration Office fell 13.8 per cent to 1,542 in August 2025, led by 664 licences and 224 boat registrations. The month also logged 41 personal watercraft registrations and 121 number plates. Inspectors carried out 257 technical checks. There were 83 changes to certificate and licence data, 142 ownership transfers and 10 deregistrations, according to the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications.

The 13.8 per cent fall is measured against July 2024, when 1,788 transactions were recorded.

### Total

In August 2024 the office handled the same total, made up of 246 boat registrations, 741 sailing licences, 94 personal watercraft registrations, 168 number plates, 240 technical inspections, 94 data amendments, six deregistrations, 189 ownership transfers and 10 re-

placements for lost certificates and licences.

Its work covers registering, renewing, cancelling and transferring ownership certificates for pleasure boats, fishing boats and personal watercraft, issuing and renewing navigation licences, and carrying out technical inspections to ensure compliance with safety and security rules.

### Bahrain to chair 2026 session

Gulf labour ministers have put workplace safety and the transition to green jobs firmly on their agenda during a high-level meeting in Kuwait this week.

The 11th meeting of the Committee of Labour Ministers of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) brought together ministers from across the region between September 2 and 4, with Bahrain represented by His Excellency Yusuf bin Abdulhussein Khalaf, Minister of Legal Affairs and Acting Minister of Labour.

### Safety framework

Ministers endorsed initiatives and projects under the Gulf Framework for Occupational Safety and Health, while also forming a working group to map out how labour ministry issues can be factored into national climate change plans. The discussions included exploring the possibility of drafting a guiding framework for a just

transition and green jobs.

Alongside these moves, the meeting reviewed the results of the committee's 2025–2029 strategy, discussed how to expand private-sector employment opportunities for citizens across GCC states, and exchanged experiences from successful national workforce training programmes. The issue of irregular migrant labour in member countries also came under review.

### Bahrain spotlight

It was announced that the Kingdom of Bahrain will take over the chairmanship of the 12th committee meeting in October 2026, giving Manama a central role in shaping future GCC labour policy.

On the sidelines of the gathering, three Bahraini companies were singled out for honours. Naseej and Zain Bahrain were recognised for excellence in localisation and workforce empowerment, while Green Anova was awarded as the best small project in the Kingdom.

### Regional cooperation

The meeting underscored how Gulf states are not only collaborating to improve job localisation and address irregular labour, but are also beginning to align their employment agendas with climate goals, safety standards, and long-term workforce sustainability.

# High Court resolves fishing boat dispute

Oath refusal settled a long-running dispute over a fishing boat, with the High Administrative Court ruling that it be registered to the plaintiff.

The court heard that the plaintiff, represented by lawyer Jassim Al Isa, paid for a fishing licence, later bought and renamed the vessel, and stood as guarantor for a bank loan used to buy gear for it.

The quarrel followed a “khul” divorce, after which the first defendant presented himself as owner and revoked a power of attorney that had allowed the plaintiff to run and dispose of the boat.

### Signature

Earlier in the case, a report from the evidence directorate found the signature on the licence-assignment deed was forged.

The court set that signature aside and moved to the merits. It then ordered the first de-

plaintiff is the true owner and ordered the authorities to transfer title.

### Items

A separate bid to gain access to kit stored in a warehouse was ruled inadmissible because the items were not set out clearly.

The plaintiff must pay costs and BD20 in counsel's fees.

“After the forgery finding and the refusal to take the decisive oath, the court ordered registration of the boat in my client's name,” said Al Isa.

As the 2025-2026 school year begins, Bahrain has placed children's safety firmly on the national agenda. The Public Prosecution, in cooperation with the Ministry of Interior and the Institute of Judicial and Legal Studies, has concluded a training program for Ma'an Police personnel aimed at strengthening protection for children both inside and outside classrooms.

**Strategic initiative**  
The program focused on combating blackmail, tackling

sexual exploitation of children, and addressing school bullying. Training also emphasized equipping teachers and parents to respond to psychological and behavioral issues, alongside social and psychological counseling methods that target children and their families.

**Building capacity**  
Specialist lectures were delivered by Public Prosecution members and social research-

ers, with the aim of enabling officers to carry new knowledge into schools and communities. By reinforcing these capacities at multiple levels, the initiative seeks to create a safe learning environment and preserve the social fabric.

**Culture of prevention**  
Officials described the training as part of ongoing efforts to enhance professional performance in handling childhood-related cases. The

program represents a strategic step toward building an integrated system concerned with prevention, early response, and instilling a culture of protective awareness among different segments of society. The Public Prosecution stressed that this kind of training is essential to ensuring that Bahrain's institutions work together to protect children and build resilience in the community.

## New traffic light in Busaiteen



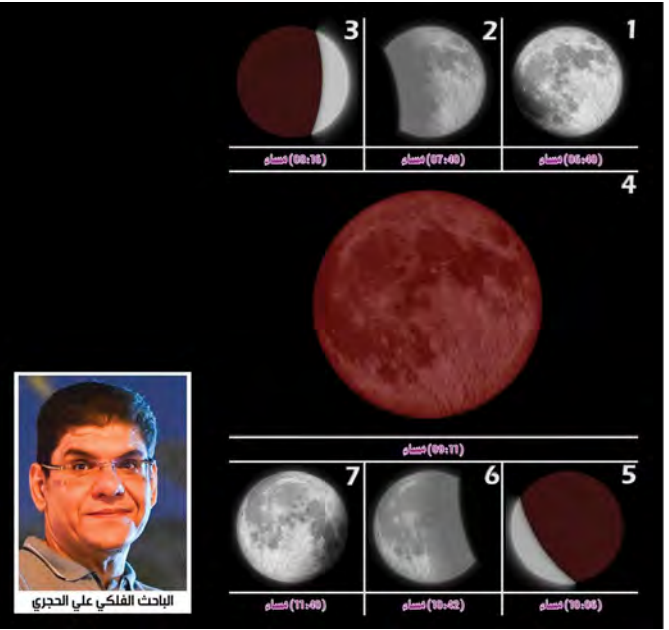

## Bahrain to see total lunar eclipse

Bahrain will be able to witness a total lunar eclipse on the evening of Sunday, September 7, 2025, lasting for more than five hours, according to local astronomer Ali Al-Hajri.

The event will begin at 6:27pm when the moon enters Earth's penumbral shadow.

**Visible stages**  
The visible stages start at 7:26pm, with the moon moving into Earth's darker shadow. The eclipse will reach totality at 8:30pm, peak at 9:11pm, and gradually fade until 10:56pm, before ending completely at 11:56 PM. Al-Hajri explained that the eclipse occurs as the moon passes through Earth's shad-

ow, which is about 8,165 kilometers wide — more than twice the moon's diameter.

**Shadow**  
The moon will travel through this shadow at a speed of nearly 25 kilometers per minute. Based on his calculations covering the 21st century, Bahrain will witness 154 lunar eclipses between 2000 and 2100. These include 26 total eclipses visible in full, 18 full partial eclipses, and 29 full penumbral eclipses, among others. The astronomer also highlighted the religious significance of the phenomenon, noting that the eclipse prayer (Salat al-Khusuf) is a confirmed Sunnah in Islam.



Trump’s pick for US Fed governor vows to uphold independence

Donald Trump’s pick to join the Federal Reserve’s board of governors pledged yesterday to uphold US central bank independence if confirmed, as the institution faces growing political pressure from the president to slash interest rates.

“The Federal Open Market Committee is an independent group with a monumental task, and I intend to preserve that independence,” Stephen Miran, who chairs the White House Council of Economic Advisors, told senators at his confirmation hearing.

Miran added in opening remarks that the most important job of the central bank is to prevent depressions and hyperinflation.

“Independence of monetary policy is a critical element for its success,” he said. He added that his opinions and decisions will be driven by his analysis of the macroeconomy.

Trump nominated Miran to the Fed’s board to finish out the term of Adriana Kugler, an appointee of former president Joe Biden who announced her resignation recently.

US trade gap widest in 4 months as **imports surged** ahead of tariffs

The US trade deficit expanded more than expected in July to its widest in four months, government data showed Thursday, on a surge in imports before a fresh wave of President Donald Trump’s tariffs kicked in.

The overall US trade deficit jumped 32.5% to \$78.3 billion in July, the Department of Commerce said.

This came on the back of a 5.9-percent rise in imports to \$358.8 billion, while exports edged up just 0.3% to \$280.5 billion.

“While imports bounced back in July, more than half of the increase was due to gold as trade policy and safe-haven demand brought about a resurgence in trade,” said Matthew Martin, senior economist at Oxford Economics, in a statement.

“Excluding gold, imports rose



by a more modest 3.3%, while exports fell 0.1%,” Martin added.

Analysts at Pantheon Macroeconomics expected a growing trade gap in connection with “another wave of pre-tariff stockpiling,” they said in a recent report.

Trump slapped a 10% tariff on almost all US trading partners in April, but twice postponed a plan for these duties to rise to varying higher levels for dozens of economies.

The steeper levels, hitting key partners like the European Union, Japan and India, finally took effect in early August.

Even so, analysts believe businesses that boosted imports to get ahead of tariff hikes are running down on existing inventory, meaning that they will likely have to make new purchases at higher business costs.

For now, the impact of Trump’s tariffs on US inflation appears limited.

A Briefing.com consensus forecast had expected a smaller deficit figure of \$64.2 billion.

Demand for capital goods linked to artificial intelligence and data centers is boosting imports, Martin said in a note.

Among sectors, imports of industrial supplies and consumer


goods both jumped, the Commerce Department report said.

The US goods deficit with China widened \$5.3 billion to \$14.7 billion in July, the report added.

“Unsurprisingly, given the level of tariffs, China has been the hardest hit of all trading partners,” Martin said.

Goods from the world’s second biggest economy face an additional 30% tariff this year, with several other Asian economies seeing lower levels.

Trump’s tariffs have roiled supply chains this year, with imports already surging in March ahead of the US leader’s wide-ranging global duties in April.

Amazon’s Starlink rival lands first major airline deal

JetBlue Airways will become the first airline to use Amazon’s Project Kuiper satellite network to power its in-flight Wi-Fi service, the companies announced Wednesday, as the online retail giant tries to challenge the dominance of Elon Musk’s Starlink.

The partnership will see JetBlue implement Project Kuiper’s low orbit satellite technology on select aircraft beginning in 2027, enhancing the US airline’s existing service with faster speeds and lower latency than traditional satellite systems.

Amazon has launched more than 100 Kuiper satellites via four rocket launches in recent months and plans to begin delivering service to initial customers later this year before expanding coverage.

The company recently signed a separate agreement with European aircraft manufacturer Airbus to integrate Project Kuiper connectivity into its aircraft catalog.

SpaceX launched the first batch of Starlink satellites in 2019 and in February said it had more than 6,750 operational units, serving over five million customers worldwide -- making it by far the sector’s dominant force.

◆ **Health authorities** in the Democratic Republic of Congo have declared a new outbreak of the Ebola virus, which has killed 15 people since the end of August, the health minister said yesterday. The new outbreak is in central Kasai province, Samuel Roger Kamba told reporters in the capital Kinshasa. The last outbreak of Ebola in the vast central African nation was three years ago and killed six people. Twenty-eight suspected cases have been recorded, according to provisional figures, with the first case reported on August 20 in a 34-year-old pregnant woman who was admitted to hospital. "It's the 16th outbreak recorded in our country," Kamba said. First identified in 1976 and thought to have crossed over from bats, Ebola is a deadly viral disease spread through direct contact with bodily fluids, causing severe bleeding and organ failure.

**Drone strike near Syria's Aleppo airport kills two: security official**

◆ **A Syrian security** official said a drone strike near Aleppo airport yesterday killed two people, with state media reporting the attack but without saying who may be behind it. An AFP correspondent saw a vaporised car near the airport in Syria's north, with shrapnel scattered around it. Official news agency SANA reported that "a drone targeted a civilian car on the road to Aleppo International Airport". Citing the health ministry, it added that at least one person was killed. Ali al-Youssef, an official with the interior ministry's security forces, told AFP that "two people who were in the car" were killed.

◆ **Russia yesterday** expelled an Estonian diplomat in a tit-for-tat move, after the NATO country ejected one of Moscow's envoys for interfering in its internal affairs. Relations between Tallinn and its large eastern neighbour have been souring over two decades, but worsened after Russia sent troops into Ukraine in 2022. "A diplomatic corps member of the Estonian Embassy in Moscow is being expelled from Russia," the Russian Foreign Ministry said in a statement. It said this was in direct response to Tallinn's "groundless" expulsion of a Russian diplomat in August. Estonia said the Russian diplomat it expelled had been "directly and actively involved in undermining the constitutional order and legal system of Estonia". Ukraine's allies accuse Russia of carrying out sabotage attacks and influencing public opinion in attempts to undermine their support for Kyiv. Estonia, a Baltic country that declared its independence from the Soviet Union in 1991, is among the staunchest supporters of Ukraine.

**Afghanistan quake deadliest in decades, killing over 2,200**

The death toll from the powerful earthquake that struck eastern Afghanistan at the weekend rose sharply to more than 2,200 yesterday, according to a new toll, making it the deadliest in decades to hit the country.

The vast majority of those killed in the magnitude-6.0 earthquake that jolted the mountainous region bordering Pakistan late Sunday were in Kunar province, where 2,205 people died and 3,640 were injured, according to a Taliban government toll.

Another 12 people were killed and hundreds injured in the neighbouring provinces of Nangarhar and Laghman. The toll had been expected

to rise as volunteers and rescuers were still pulling bodies from the rubble. "Hundreds of bodies have been recovered from destroyed houses during search and rescue operations," deputy government spokesman Hamdullah Fitrat said, announcing the new toll, adding that "rescue efforts are still ongoing". Limited access to the hardest hit areas of mountainous Kunar province has delayed rescue and relief efforts, with rockfalls from repeated aftershocks obstructing already precarious roads etched onto the side of cliffs. Various countries have flown in aid, and on Thursday China pledged around \$7 million of emergency relief, such as tents, blankets and food.

**Europe pledges postwar 'reassurance force' for Ukraine**

Over two dozen countries have pledged to take part in a force to be deployed in Ukraine after any peace accord with Russia, aiming to deter Moscow from ever again attacking its neighbour, French President Emmanuel Macron announced yesterday.

A "reassurance force" for Ukraine is a key pillar of the security guarantees a coalition of mainly European countries want to offer to Ukraine if the war ends via a peace deal or a ceasefire.

However there is also growing concern that Russian President Vladimir Putin is currently showing no interest in a peace accord, with alarm intensifying after his high-profile visit to Beijing this week.

European leaders spoke to US President Donald Trump via video conference after the summit in Paris of the so-called coalition of the willing, hosted by Macron and attended by Ukraine's President Volodymyr Zelensky. Some European leaders at-

**Trump 'very dissatisfied' with EU countries buying Russian oil: Zelensky**

Donald Trump on Thursday voiced frustration with EU countries that still buy Russian oil, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said, after the US president spoke to him and European leaders during a summit on Ukraine.

"President Trump is very dissatisfied that Russia's oil is being purchased by Europe. Among others, there are two countries, we know that these are Hungary and Slovakia," Zelensky told reporters in Paris following the summit. The European Union im-

posed a ban on most oil imports from Russia in 2022 over its invasion of Ukraine.

It however made an exception for imports to Slovakia and Hungary to give the landlocked central European countries time to find alternative oil supplies.

Ukraine has targeted Russia's Druzhba oil pipeline, which carries Russian oil to Slovakia and Hungary, throughout the conflict.

Both nations have asked the European Commission -- the EU's executive arm -- to act against Ukraine's "repeated attacks" on the pipeline.

tended in person and others, like UK premier Keir Starmer, remotely.

The meeting is a new push led by Macron to show that Europe can act independently of Washington after Trump upended US foreign policy and launched direct talks with Putin after returning to the White House.

The United States was represented by Trump's special envoy Steve Witkoff, who also met with Zelensky separately.

**'First concrete step'**

Europe has been under pressure to step up its response over three and a half years after Russia launched its full-scale invasion in February 2022.

"We have today 26 countries who have formally committed -- some others have not yet taken a position -- to deploy as a 'reassurance force' troops in Ukraine, or be present on the ground, in the sea, or in the air," Macron told reporters alongside Zelensky.

Zelensky hailed the move. "I think that today, for the first time in a long time, this is the first such serious concrete step," he said.

Macron added: "This force does not seek to wage any war on Russia. It is a force to guarantee peace."

The troops would not be deployed "on the front line" but aim to "prevent any new major aggression", the French president said.

**S.Sudan denies Gaza relocation plan, says no US deal**

South Sudan will not accept Palestinians from Gaza, its government said Thursday, telling reporters there was also no deal with Washington to take more third-nation deportees.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has said that he would permit Gazans to emigrate voluntarily, and that his government was talking to a number of potential host countries.

Among them was reportedly South Sudan, which in August welcomed Israel's deputy foreign minister Sharren Haskel, calling it "the highest-level engagement from an Israeli official to South Sudan thus far".

But the desperately poor country, which is itself struggling with a worrying uptick of violence, has repeatedly denied reports it would take Palestinians.

**Xi tells Kim North Korea's importance to China 'will not change'**

President Xi Jinping reassured Kim Jong Un of North Korea's enduring importance to China yesterday, saying Beijing's position "will not change" as the two leaders met for talks.

Kim has been on a rare foreign visit to China, his most important ally, joining Russia's Vladimir Putin alongside Xi at a massive military parade commemorating the 80th anniversary of the end of World War II.

Kim and Xi held talks on Thursday evening at Beijing's Great Hall of the People, where the Chinese president said his country attached "great importance to the traditional friendship" with North Korea.

Beijing is "willing to maintain, consolidate and develop" bilateral ties, Xi said according to state news agency Xinhua.

"No matter how the international situation changes, this position will not change," Xi was quoted as saying.

China's relationship with North Korea was forged in the bloodshed of the Korean War in the 1950s, and Beijing is a vital source of diplomatic, economic and political support for the isolated nuclear state.

But Pyongyang has been moving closer to Russia recently -- the two countries signed a mutual defence agreement last year, and North Korean soldiers are fighting in the Ukraine war.

Xi told Kim on Thursday that China was willing to "enhance high-level exchanges and strategic communication with the DPRK... deepen mutual understanding and friendship, strengthen interactions at all levels, and carry out practical cooperation in various fields", Xinhua said, using the acronym

for North Korea.

The two countries should also strengthen coordination on international affairs and "safeguard their common interests", it added.

Kim echoed Xi's sentiments on their unchanging friendship, Xinhua said, and pledged support for China on issues such as Taiwan. The two men had tea and dinner together, it added.

Kim's armoured train was seen leaving Beijing shortly after the meeting ended, South Korean news agency Yonhap reported.

# Gaza civil defence says Israeli fire kills 44

Gaza's civil defence agency said Israeli forces killed at least 44 people yesterday, including 25 in Gaza City where the military has increased bombardments ahead of a planned offensive.

Nearly two years into the devastating conflict, Israel has built up its forces in recent days, with troops operating on the outskirts of Gaza City, the Palestinian territory's largest urban centre.

The United Nations estimates that nearly one million people live in and around Gaza City in the territory's north, where it has declared famine.

A senior Israeli military official told journalists on Wednesday that authorities expected the new offensive to capture Gaza City to lead to mass displacement, estimating that a million Palestinians would flee south.

Civil defence spokesman Mahmud Bassal said that an Israeli air strike on Thursday hit a tent sheltering a displaced Palestinian family in Gaza City, killing five people including three children.

Contacted by AFP, the Israeli military requested timeframes and coordinates to comment on specific incidents.

In Tel al-Hawa, the neighbourhood in Gaza City's west where the strike reported by

the civil defence took place, AFP footage showed Palestinians outside damaged tents, clearing up scattered belongings.

A pair of blood-stained pink slippers lay amongst the debris.

Israa al-Basous, who lives there, recounted seeing the tent next to hers on fire.

"My children and I were sleeping in the tent when we heard the sound of bombing. Shrapnel fell on us, and my four children started screaming," she told AFP.

At Gaza City's Al-Shifa Hospital, where the dead and wounded were being received, bodies wrapped in white shrouds lay on the floor of the hospital's morgue.

One woman stroked the head of her dead son as his body lay outside on a stretcher.

"Who are you leaving me to, son? Why? Why?" she wept.

Further south, in the Nuseirat refugee camp, the civil defence said an Israeli air strike killed seven people including three children.

AFP footage from Nuseirat showed Palestinian man Yousef Suleiman with his granddaughter, walking through a bombed-out shelter where tattered scraps of material hung from tent poles.

Suleiman said the pre-dawn strike killed his nephew, the nephew's wife and their two children.

"The entire tent was de-

stroyed, along with everyone inside," he said.

Media restrictions in Gaza and difficulties in accessing many areas mean AFP is unable to independently verify the tolls and details provided by the civil defence agency or the Israeli military.

The war in Gaza was sparked by Hamas's October 2023 attack on Israel, which resulted in the deaths of 1,219 people, mostly civilians, according to an AFP tally based on Israeli figures.

Israel's retaliatory offensive has killed at least 64,231 Palestinians, most of them civilians, according to figures from the health ministry in Hamas-run Gaza that the United Nations considers reliable.

## White House quietly drops WTO, ILO from foreign aid cut list

The World Trade Organization and the International Labour Organization told AFP on Thursday that they no longer figured among entities targeted in the White House's latest round of foreign aid cuts.

US President Donald Trump's Republican administration announced last Friday that it was cancelling \$4.9 billion of congressionally-approved foreign aid, sparking outrage among



Democrats. In a memo detailing the cuts, the administration said it was "committed to getting America's fiscal house in order by cutting government spending that is woke, weaponised, and wasteful".

Trump, who has already ef-

fectively dismantled USAID -- the world's largest humanitarian aid agency -- since taking office again in January, listed a number of international organisations among the targeted entities.

The list originally included \$107 million in cuts to ILO funding and another \$29 million in slashed funding to the WTO.

But by Wednesday, the WTO had disappeared from the list, and on Thursday the ILO had also vanished.

## Sudan rescuers pull 370 bodies from Darfur landslide

Khartoum, Sudan

Rescuers have recovered 370 bodies from a landslide that wiped out a remote mountain village in Sudan's Darfur region, a local civilian leader said yesterday.

The disaster struck the village of Tarasin, located high in the Jebel Marra range, on Sunday following one of the worst downpours of Sudan's

rainy season, which peaks in August.

Up to 1,000 people may have been killed, according to the United Nations, but the full scale of the disaster in the isolated mountain region is unknown.

Footage released by the group on Thursday shows residents and rescuers gathered at a makeshift burial site, praying for the victims laid to rest.

## Norway experiments with electric plane in **real-life test**

An electric plane took to the skies between the Norwegian airports Stavanger and Bergen on Thursday, simulating a cargo flight for the first time in real-life conditions, Norwegian airlines operator Avinor announced.

The small aircraft -- an Alia built by US aircraft manufacturer Beta -- flew the 160 kilometres (100 miles) in a test run by the Norwegian affiliate of the transport company Bristow.

The flight took 55 minutes and simulated a cargo flight

route in southeastern Norway. "This is the first time an electric plane has taken the trade route between Stavanger and Bergen," one of Avinor's directors, Karianne Helland Strand, told AFP.

"Everything went very well," she added.

Avinor is the state-owned company that operates airports and air traffic control in Norway.

The test flight -- using vis-

uals rather than instruments is part of an evaluation of how well it could be integrated into air traffic and infrastructure on the ground.

The Norwegian regulatory authorities are closely linked to the tests to ensure that electric flights can launch commercially as soon as the technology is ready, which is expected between 2028 and 2030.

The test period

began in August and will last until January 2026.

"It's like the first real world test," pilot Jeremy Degagne told AFP.

The plane's battery life allows journeys of up to 400 kilometres -- enough for a return flight between Stavanger and Bergen.

"I don't have range anxiety because we plan to fly the aircraft within the limitations of the aircraft," said Degagne.

"In your electric car you might be like, oh I think I can make it 10 more kilometres to that charging station," he continued.

"And in the context of aviation, you wouldn't do that. We have the same limitations of energy as a normal aircraft does for fuel."

A pioneer of electric cars and boats, Norway is hoping to make a similar name for itself in the aviation industry by experimenting with low- or

zero-emission air travel.

The sector is one of the most difficult to decarbonise and is currently responsible for almost three percent of global carbon dioxide emissions.



The Beta Technologies ALIA is available in two models: the VTOL variant A250 and the conventional (runway-based) CTOL variant CX300. The A250 is equipped with four rotors for vertical takeoff and plus a single pusher propeller for forward flight, while the CX300 forgoes vertical capabilities and operates like a traditional fixed-wing aircraft

# Bahrain breaks 12-year quarter-final drought

Beats Philippines; Historic U16 Asia Cup Breakthrough Lines Up Bahrain Against China

Bahrain's U16 national team made history yesterday morning at the M Bank Arena in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, beating the Philippines 79-66 in the Qualification to Quarter-Finals of the FIBA U16 Asia Cup. The win sends Bahrain into the last eight for the first time since 2013, capping a dramatic turnaround after their rocky start to the tournament. The Gulf champions had opened their campaign with a 141-47 loss to Australia, but bounced back with a dramatic 70-68 win over Lebanon and a 111-80 rout of India to finish second in Group A. Yesterday's win over the Philippines added another milestone, ending a 12-year absence from the quarter-final stage.

### Breaking Away After Halftime

Playing without key forward Somto Patrick, sidelined with an injury, Bahrain needed others to step up. Hussain Fuad, Mohamed Abdulla, and Ali Husain Mohamed carried the scoring load early, keeping their side just ahead 42-37 at halftime.

The third quarter proved decisive. Hassan Abdulkadir shook off a slow start, scoring seven of his 15 points in the frame while grabbing key rebounds. Bahrain strung together back-to-back offensive runs, weathering a three-pointer from Jhustin Hallare that briefly lifted the Filipinos, and built a double-digit cushion they would not relinquish.

### The Final Four

The 79-66 result means Bahrain advance to today's quarter-finals, where they face three-time champions China at 11:30 AM. Elsewhere, Korea crushed Kazakhstan 96-42 to set up a meeting with Australia at 6:30 AM, while Chinese Taipei defeated Lebanon 97-90 and will meet Japan at 2 PM. Iran overwhelmed Malaysia 102-62 and now face New Zealand in the quarters at 9 AM.

For Bahrain, this run is already their best Asia Cup showing in over a decade, but with confidence building and Abdulkadir in form, the opportunity to push even further is now within reach.

## Marzougui Orchestrates Bahrain Victory Without Patrick

Bahrain brushed the Filipinos aside (79-66) in Ulaanbaatar, showing patient offensive execution and an efficient use of their bench. From tip-off, the Bahrainis leveraged fast breaks and controlled spacing in the paint to build and sustain a lead, despite the Philippines' bursts of offensive aggression. Rebounds, steals, and consistent free-throw conversion proved decisive in extending their advantage.



Q1: Tight Opening Exchange

The game began with the

Philippines winning the opening jump ball. Bahrain quickly responded with points from Ali Mohamed and Mohamed Adel, combining perimeter shooting with post plays. The first quarter saw multiple lead changes, with Bahrain capitalizing late through a floating jump shot by Ali Mohamed to end Q1 22-21.

Bahrain's early success stemmed from disciplined defensive positioning, forcing turnovers and contesting shots, while the Philippines relied on fast breaks and three-point attempts. By the quarter's end, Bahrain held a slim edge, having executed their transition offense effectively.

### Q2: Bahrain Establishes Control

Bahrain extended their lead with a mix of mid-range jumpers, free throws, and strong interior play from Hassan Abdulkadir. Hussain Fuad's timely three-pointer, assisted by Ali Husain Mohamed, punctuated a 7-0 scoring run that swung momentum firmly in Bahrain's favor.

The Philippines attempted to stay within reach through layups and perimeter shooting, but Bahrain's defensive rotations limited open looks and forced contested shots. By halftime, Bahrain led 42-37, reflecting advantages in bench contributions (36 points), rebounds (53-49), and free-throw efficiency (64.3% vs 37.5%).

### Q3: Sustaining Pressure

After the break, Bahrain maintained offensive fluidity and defensive intensity. Hassan Abdulkadir dominated the paint with scoring and rebounds, while Mohamed Adel and Ali Mohamed created opportunities on the perimeter.

Despite an 8-0 scoring run by the Philippines at one point, Bahrain countered with quick transition points and converted turnovers into fast-break opportunities. By the end of Q3, Bahrain extended the lead to 62-50, having controlled rebounds (36 defensive boards) and minimized high-percentage shots for the Philippines in the paint.

### Q4: Closing Out the Game

In the final quarter, the Philippines tried to mount a rally, cutting the deficit to single digits with timely baskets from Travis Gabriel Pascual and Prince Cariño. Bahrain's response combined strong defensive stands, offensive rebounds, and bench scoring from Ali Khalil Habib.

Key free throws by Hussain Fuad and Hassan Abdulkadir sealed the win. Bahrain's execution under pressure ensured they maintained control to finish 79-66.

# Sinner powers into US Open semis

Anisimova gains Swiatek revenge

R

eigning champion Jannik Sinner marched into the US Open quarter-finals Wednesday as Amanda Anisimova avenged her Wimbledon thrashing by Iga Swiatek to set up a last-four clash with Naomi Osaka.

World number one Sinner swept aside 10th seed Musetti 6-1, 6-4, 6-2 in the first all-Italian men's quarter-final in Grand Slam history.

"It was a great performance, very solid. I started the match very well," said Sinner, who faces Canadian 25th seed Felix Auger-Aliassime in the semi-finals on Friday.

Auger-Aliassime has won two of three previous meetings but Sinner thrashed him for the loss of just two games in Cincinnati last month.

"Every player who is in the semis of a Grand Slam can say they're playing their best tennis," added Sinner.

The 24-year-old Sinner also tied Nicola Pietrangeli for the most Grand Slams win by an Italian man with his 86th victory.

Auger-Aliassime overcame Alex de Minaur in a four-set battle lasting over four hours to reach his second US

Open semi-final.

The 25-year-old Auger-Aliassime is back in the last four of a Grand Slam for the first time since the 2021 US Open after beating eighth seed De Minaur 4-6, 7-6 (9/7), 7-5, 7-6 (7/4).

"Some days you won't feel your best but I was willing to dig really deep and do everything I can," said Auger-Aliassime.

"It feels amazing. Four years ago, it feels like more. It was a tough couple of years but it feels even better now to be in the semi-finals."

Australia's De Minaur, 26, has now lost all six of his Grand Slam quarter-finals.

"Right now I'm looking at this like a wasted opportunity," De Minaur said.

run of my life here," said Anisimova, the American eighth seed.

"The first day I got here I was like 'OK, let's try and get through one round... This has been such a dream. To come back from Wimbledon like that is really special to me."

Six-time major winner Swiatek entered the US Open as the bookmakers' favourite, after she followed up her maiden Wimbledon title with victory at the Cincinnati Open WTA 1000 event.

Swiatek broke in the first game of the match but Anisimova hit back immediately and snatched the opening set when her rival ballooned a forehand long.

Anisimova again had to rally after falling behind early in the set. She broke back for 2-2 and then moved a game from victory as Swiatek coughed up a costly double fault.

Swiatek saved two match points but a net cord in Anisimova's favour sealed the win and a sense of redemption for the 24-year-old.

"Today is definitely the most meaningful victory I've had in my life," said Anisimova.

Swiatek accepted she didn't play well enough.

"I kind of have to let it go and just focus on the next one," said Swiatek.

Osaka beat Czech 11th seed Karolina Muchova 6-4, 7-6 (7/3) to extend her deepest run at a Grand Slam since returning to tennis after the birth of her daughter in 2023.

The Japanese star hit 30 winners in a smooth performance reminiscent of the player who lifted the trophy here in 2018 and 2020.

"It's been a while since I've been in this position," said Osaka, who has gone on to win the tournament every time she has reached the last four of a major.

"You play the best players in the world towards the end of a Slam. We're all hoping to achieve the same thing. It's kind of like boxing, but with a tennis ball," said Osaka, the 23rd seed.

However, she has lost both previous matches with Anisimova -- at the Australian Open and Roland Garros in 2022.

# Egypt Comeback Seals Bahrain's U20 Gulf Cup Exit

Youngster's denied despite Abdulla Ahmed's goalkeeping heroics

ahrain's U20 team saw their Gulf Cup journey come to an end yesterday following a 2-1 loss to Egypt in Abha, Saudi Arabia. After a promising 4-2 win over Oman in their second match, hopes were high that Ali Amer's side could progress to the semi-finals of the AGCFF Gulf Cup U20 2025. Instead, it is Oman and Iraq who advance from Group B to the last four, with the semi-finals set for Sunday, September 7.

Bahrain started brightly, controlling possession and testing Egypt's defense. Goalkeeper Abdulla Ahmed, continuing his fine form in the tournament, saved a penalty to prevent the Egyptians from taking the lead. He also produced a series of acrobatic stops, including a spectacular long-range save and a sharp half-volley parry, keeping Bahrain in the game.

Bahrain took the lead in the 71st minute as Mubarak Fawaz launched a brilliant counter-attack from midfield and Bahrain's youngest player Khalid AlHasooni tapped in off the post. Egypt responded with two quick goals in the final ten minutes. The first, scored by Abdin Ahmed in the 80th minute, came from a looping header delivered from a dead-ball free-kick. The second, by Kabaka, stemmed

from a Bahrain cross into the Egyptian box that was cleared, leaving Egypt with a three-on-one break against Abdulla Ahmed. The ball was squared and tapped into the net, overturning the deficit and eliminating Bahrain from the tournament.

Earlier in the tournament, Bahrain had opened with a 1-0 defeat to Iraq but bounced back impressively in their second game. Ali Mehran starred in the 4-2 win over Oman, scoring twice, while Ahmed Al Mursi and Yahya Adel also found the net.

The Bahrain squad, selected by head coach Ali Amer, included Yahya Adel, Faisal Rashid, Ebrahim Ali, Ali Hussain, Hadi Ghazi, Mohammed Bahzad, Amjad Jaafar, Ali Mehran, Abdulla Osama, Mubarak Fawaz, Mohammed Salah, Khaled Mohammed, Abdulrahman Bassam, Mohammed Adel, Ebrahim Al Muraissi, Hussain Al Haiki, Khaled Al Khalidi, Adam Fareed, Ahmed Nasser, and Khaled Ahmed. Goalkeepers Abdulla Ahmed, Hassan Ali, and Isa Al Thawadi were also part of the roster.

Bahrain's campaign may have ended earlier than they would have liked, but there were positives to take -- not least Mehran's match-winning display against Oman and Abdulla Ahmed's assured goalkeeping throughout the tournament.

# Mbappe calls for players to get more time off

F

rance captain Kylian Mbappe said Thursday that top footballers do not necessarily play too many matches but do need more time off in a crowded schedule which offers little time for a break.

"It is not only a matter of the number of games, but more about recovery. We just need a bit more rest, time off for our bodies to regenerate and recover from the number of matches we have to play," Mbappe told reporters in Poland, where France begin their 2026 World Cup qualifying campaign against Ukraine on Friday.

Mbappe played 59 matches last season in his first campaign with Real Madrid, from making his debut in the UEFA Super Cup on

August 14 last year to the Club World Cup semi-final defeat by Paris Saint-Germain on July 9.

He also made six appearances for France in that time, and was back in action for Real in La Liga as this season started on August 19.

If France qualify for the World Cup, it could be mid-July next

year before he gets any significant time off again.

"Do we play too much? No, my thinking has evolved," Mbappe insisted.

"I did think that, but I don't anymore, because I can understand that the people watching on their sofa think we earn a lot of money and so we should play."

Mbappe, who scored 44 goals for the Spanish giants last season, admitted that the introduction of the Club World Cup had hugely in-

creased the demands on players.

"We were only just getting to the quarter-finals while teams were already starting to play friendly matches. They had started the 2025/26 season while it was still 2024/25 for us," he said.

"I watch a lot of matches but I can't remember seeing a player -- even the greatest of all time -- play 60 matches in a season and always be at their best."

He added: "It is a matter which needs to be looked into, because everyone will come out as a winner. People will see games of a higher quality."

After playing Ukraine, France entertain Iceland in Paris next Tuesday. They will also face Azerbaijan in qualifying Group D, the winners of which will qualify directly for the World Cup.
