# Jail term upheld for motorist in fatal red-light crash

Appeal Court issues six-month sentence

n appeal court has upheld An appear court and a six-month jail term and a one-year driving licence suspension for a motorist who ran a red light and hit a pedestrian who was walking while pulling his bicycle, leading to the man's death.

The High Criminal Court of Appeal confirmed the sentence on the basis that the appellant failed to take due care stepped off the kerb, crossed and entered a junction against a red signal.
