His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, yesterday issued Edict (69) of 2025 appointing a director at the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, based on a proposal by the Minister of Industry and Commerce.

Hashim Shubbar Hilal Al Wadaei shall be appointed Director of the Business Services Directorate at the Ministry of Industry and Commerce.

The Minister of Industry and Commerce shall implement the provisions of this edict, which shall take effect from the date of its issuance and be published in the Official Gazette.

HRH Prince Salman also issued Edict (68) of 2025, appointing a Director at the Electricity and Water Authority, based on a proposal by the Minister of Electricity and Water Affairs.

Fatima Mohammed Abdulrahman Al Khan is appointed as Director of the Communications Directorate at the Electricity and Water Authority.

Smart traffic camera trial set for December

Smart traffic cameras will begin a trial run in December, with 500 units planned across Bahrain and between 200 and 300 expected to be live by the first quarter of 2026.

The devices will carry detection systems able to record a range of traffic offences to raise compliance and road safety.

The plan was outlined in Parliament by Rashid Bu-Najma, Undersecretary for Legislative Authority Affairs at the Interior Ministry.

Bahrain reaffirms steadfast support for regional security, stability and cooperation

His Excellency Lieutenant General Shaikh Rashid bin Abdullah Al Khalifa, Minister of Interior, reaffirmed the Kingdom of Bahrain's steadfast support for measures that bolster security and stability.

He also stressed the need to deepen cooperation and integration among friendly states to achieve regional security and international peace.

Speaking at the sixth meeting of Interior Ministers of the International Security Alliance in Abu Dhabi, H.E. Shaikh Rashid underlined the group's operational successes and its impact on combating organised and transnational crime.

"This alliance has proven its effectiveness in combating organised and transnational crime," he said, adding: "The joint operations have reflected the advanced level of security awareness and high readiness of the member states."

He pointed to recent achievements, noting that "the thwarting of attempts to smuggle massive quantities of narcotics is the fruit of robust coordination and effective integration among participating security agencies."

Peace

Reiterating Bahrain's position, the Minister declared: "We reaffirm the Kingdom of Bahrain's unwavering position in support-

He also paid tribute to the UAE's leadership of the Alliance: "We highly value the leading role played by our sister nation, the United Arab Emirates, in leading the International Security Alliance and its distinguished initiatives to strengthen joint security efforts."

H.E. Shaikh Rashid said the Alliance's recent field exercise in Bahrain demonstrated readiness and professionalism, praising the UAE's support and personal involvement.

"I extend my sincere thanks to His Highness Sheikh Saif bin Zayed Al Nahyan for his keenness and personal attendance at the exercise, which was characterised by realism in preparation, planning and implementation," he said.

At the close of the meeting, participating ministers confirmed their continued com-

Joint statement

MPs restore 3% pension rise

Parliament yesterday approved a bill to amend the Social Insurance Law of 1976, restoring annual pension rises on a graduated scale and shortening the averaging period for pension calculations to the last two years of pay.

The amendments also include cutting employees' contribution rates from seven to six per cent and allowing working women to retire at 55 instead of 60.

The bill brings back yearly rises for all pensions across five bands, from five per cent for pensions of BD500 and under down to one per cent for pensions above BD4,000.

It also recasts how both the pension and the lump-sum indemnity are calculated so that each is based on the average of the last two years of contributions.

Further clauses keep the employer's share at 12 per cent and retain the cap that any supplementary pension converted from an indemnity cannot lift the total above 90 per cent of the averaged wage.

Pause

The government urged a pause for a new actuarial study,

He said he had hoped for closer coordination with the Government and the Shura Council on restoring the three per cent yearly rise, describing the measure as a shared demand among retirees and one supported by all MPs.

MP Jalal Kadhem urged an urgent plan to reinstate the three per cent annual rise and steady the pension funds, proposing a BD200 million one-off transfer from the Unemployment Insurance Fund and better use of fund land and other assets.

warning that lowering contributions, shortening the averaging period and reintroducing annual increases without identified funding could strain the scheme and the general budget.

They cited an actuarial gap of BD14.4 billion and said differing retirement ages would unwind recent equal treatment between men and women.

The Social Insurance Organisation (SIO) told MPs the annual rise had been deferred, not cancelled, for want of a surplus.

Increase

It put the cost of a three per cent increase at about BD22 million a year for roughly 108,000 retirees whose combined pensions total BD737 million, and said paying one year of increases would cost around BD26 million.

Speaking for the SIO yesterday, chief executive Sahar Al Manai said the authority's financial statements are posted on its website and that the 2022 reforms followed detailed actuarial and financial studies showing the funds would face major strain under the previous rules.

change

She said any major change now would affect future liabilities and that the 2022 framework should be given time to bed in before its benefits are judged, adding that the SIO reviews fund performance regularly and stands ready to study parliamentary proposals that are grounded in up-to-date actuarial data.

Backing the bill, MP Hassan Ibrahim said fairness required

restoring the annual rise while keeping the funds sound through a clear actuarial study.

He urged reprioritising public spending to free BD22 million a year for a three per cent rise to protect retirees' purchasing power.

"Retirees, doctors, lawyers, teachers, soldiers, mothers and fathers, gave this country their years," he said. "We should return the favour with a decent, steady life by reinstating the yearly increase, while making sure it is sustainable."

He supported the clause cutting the insured person's contribution to six per cent with employers at twelve and asked the committee to publish a full financial model on fund longevity and investment returns.

MP Mohammed Al Ahmed also backed the bill but pressed for a funding route, saying the chamber's economic adviser had recommended redirecting the Unemployment Insurance surplus to the pension funds until they regain balance.

Halt

He said thousands had been hurt by the halt to the yearly rise and that many retirees on BD350-500 pensions were struggling with living costs.

Kadhem criticised what he described as weak investment and management practice at the funds and called for a restructure to include civil-society and private-sector experts, with the Finance Ministry exercising direct oversight.

He added that the 2022 move to stop the rise came from the Government and passed the previous Parliament, and pressed for closer scrutiny of future Government bills that affect pensions.

Parliament backs dash cam awareness drive



Motorists urged to install equipment

Dash cams moved up the agenda yesterday, as Parliament approved an awareness drive urging motorists to install them.

No permit is required, but privacy rules still bind.

Tabled by MP Maryam Al Dhaen, the motion asks the government, through the relevant authority, to run a campaign encouraging drivers to fit dashboard cameras.

Legal bar

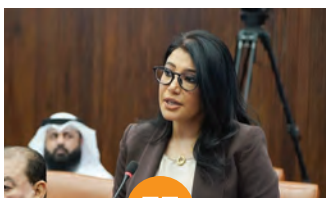
Interior Ministry representatives told MPs there is no legal bar on installing dash cams or filming the road, provided filming does not breach people's privacy and footage is not posted on social media.

Drivers do not need prior approval from the General Directorate of Traffic, and the ministry said the first phase should centre on awareness and encouragement.

During the debate, Maryam Al Dhaen said dash cams would help when crashes occur without witnesses or roadside cameras.

She noted that some units have motion detection that can alert drivers to movement inside a vehicle, citing recent concerns about children left on buses.

She added that basic models sell for about BD20, with higher-spec units around BD50.

"It gives security services usable evidence when a driver denies causing a crash," he told the chamber.

The Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee had earlier recommended the proposal, citing clear public-interest grounds.

Cost concern

MPs push to halt BD110 dumpster charges 'burdening' restaurants

An urgent motion seeks to stop municipalities charging restaurants BD110 and above each month for placing dumpsters on the street beside their premises, arguing the levies add weight to running costs in today's economy.

The proposal asks for the fees to be halted and for the service and its pricing to be reviewed so different trades are treated fairly without cutting the municipal role in street cleanliness.

It is sponsored by Dr Mahdi Al Shuwaikh, First Deputy Speaker Abdulnabi Salman, Eman Shuwaiter, Hisham Al Ashiri and Second Deputy Speaker Ahmed Qarata.

Waste collection

Dr Al Shuwaikh said waste collection is a basic municipal



service set up to protect health and keep residential and commercial areas presentable.

He noted that some outlets, particularly restaurants, have been charged more than BD110 a month for a nearby dumpster.

Backers say fixed charges tied to a core service strain smaller eateries and risk forcing some to close.

Balance

The text sets out a balance: keep streets clean while easing a flat cost that, they argue, bears little relation to outlet size or takings.

They add that leaving the fees in place is likely to feed through to menu prices, raising everyday costs for customers.

Fighting cross-border crime

The Minister also praised Bahrain's experience in developing advanced border systems that facilitate passenger and cargo movement while ensuring the highest levels of safety and security. "Our nation's achievements in integrating modern technologies demonstrate the effectiveness of combining innovation with strong operational protocols," he said.

News in brief

◆ The United Nations

yesterday suspended operations at a key border crossing between Afghanistan and Iran because of new Taliban government restrictions on Afghan women workers, a UN official said. Indrika Ratwatte, the UN humanitarian coordinator in Afghanistan, did not detail the restrictions but warned they were creating “immediate operational challenges” and posed “additional risks for returning people, particularly women and girls”. Islam Qala is the main crossing point for Afghans expelled from Iran, more than 60 percent of whom are women and children, according to the UN official. “The UN and humanitarian partners have today suspended operations at the Islam Qala border between Afghanistan and Iran, following the introduction of additional restrictions preventing female national UN and partner staff from operating at the border,” said Ratwatte. “Without female staff, we cannot collectively serve returning women and children under conditions of dignity and respect,” Ratwatte added.

Channel crossing

◆ **Nine men** accused of running a migrant-smuggling ring linked to a 2023 Channel capsizing that killed seven people went on trial in Paris on Tuesday, in the latest case targeting such networks between France and the UK. Two Iraqis, six Afghans, and one Sudanese national are facing varying charges, notably involuntary manslaughter and criminal conspiracy for illegal immigration. A tenth man from Sudan was a minor at the time of the tragedy and is being referred to a juvenile court. Eight of the accused, aged 23 to 45, appeared in court on Tuesday wearing headphones to follow a translation of the proceedings, which opened with the names of the 65 people aboard the overloaded boat.

Claudia Sheinbaum on Tuesday downplayed the likelihood of US military action against cartels on Mexican soil, following a report that Washington is considering deploying troops south of the border. “That won’t happen,” Sheinbaum told reporters in response to an NBC News report that President Donald Trump’s administration is planning ground operations against her country’s powerful cartels. “Furthermore, we do not agree” with any intervention, the left-wing Sheinbaum added. Trump has accused Mexico of not doing enough to halt the flow of drugs into the United States. In addition to designating several Mexican cartels as “terrorist” organizations, he offered in April to send troops to Mexico to fight drug cartels, a proposal that Sheinbaum rejected.

Indian Sikh pilgrims enter Pakistan,
first major crossing since May conflict

Pakistan yesterday welcomed jubilant Sikh pilgrims from India, the first major crossing since deadly clashes in May closed the land border between the nuclear-armed neighbours.

More than 2,100 pilgrims were granted visas to attend a 10-day festival marking 556 years since the birth of Guru Nanak, founder of the Sikh faith, Pakistan’s High Commission in New Delhi said last week.

Islamabad and New Delhi engaged in the worst fighting since 1999 in May, with more than 70 people killed.

The Wagah-Attari border -- the only active land crossing between the two countries -- was closed to general traffic

following the violence.

AFP journalists saw hundreds of pilgrims streaming their way through the border with their luggage in tow.

They were received by Pakistani officials, who presented them with flowers and showered them with rose petals. Many wore garlands and chanted joyfully after crossing. “We have nothing to do with the war,” pilgrim Parvinder Kaur told AFP.

“We often watched videos of the shrines and dreamed of coming here, and now, we are finally here for the first time.”

Another said the welcome was overwhelming. “It doesn’t feel like we are in another country. It feels like we are among our own people,” said Valeti Singh.

Europe could struggle to mobilise troops,
arms in case of **war with Russia**: study

Europe could struggle to mobilise enough troops or quickly produce enough weapons in case of a direct confrontation with Russia, a new report warned Tuesday.

The French Institute of International Relations (IFRI), a top think tank, highlighted Europe’s weaknesses in the event of a high-intensity conflict with Russia, which the authors describe as “a long-term threat”.

Europe needed to demonstrate political will and “a coherent defence economic strategy,” said the “Europe-Russia: Balance of Power Review” report.

“We need... to identify our strengths and weaknesses,” IFRI director Thomas Gomart told AFP, pointing to “critical military gaps”.

“European countries have the necessary potential, that is the economic resources, mili-

tary capabilities, and technological know-how to stand up to Russia by 2030, provided -- and this is obviously the most important word -- that they demonstrate political will,” he added.

EU countries have upped military spending in a bid to contain a menacing Russia since Vladimir Putin launched a full-scale invasion of Ukraine in February 2022.

Although Europe enjoys an advantage over Russia in aerospace and at sea, its land forces suffer

from “critical shortfalls in depth and ammunition stockpiles”, the report said, also pointing to Moscow’s experience in mobilising troops in the nearly four-year war against Ukraine.

“There are reasons to doubt the political, strategic and operational availability of a number of European troops in the case of a confrontation scenario, given the political fragmentation and serious readiness issues,” the report said.

“As of 2025, 20 out of 30 Euro-

pean NATO or EU members have professional ground forces of fewer than 15,000 troops,” said the study, produced with the support of a steering committee of European think-tank directors.

“Apart from a few frontline states that could mobilise reserves and national guards on their soil, the others would be unable to generate more than a couple of battalions to be sent away from their borders,” the study added.

The bulk of large unit formations would rest on the shoulders of “maybe six countries,” including France, Britain and Germany.

Europe has also struggled to translate increased military spending into a “tangible industrial surge”, the report said, pointing to the missile sector as an example.

Average annual orders placed with European defence firms have usually been in the low hundreds for offensive weapons, and in the low thousands for air and missile defence interceptors, it said.

“Such orders paint a dire picture of European missile production capacity,” the report added.

“It is vastly inferior to what a military confrontation with Russia would require.”

Sudan defence minister says army to keep fighting

Sudan’s defence minister said on Tuesday that the army would press on with fighting the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces after the country’s security and defence council met to discuss a US proposal for a ceasefire.

“We thank the Trump administration for its efforts and proposals to achieve peace,” Hassan Kabroun said in a speech broadcast on state television, adding that “preparations for the Sudanese people’s battle are ongoing.”

“Our preparations for war are a legitimate national right,” he said, following the council meeting in Khartoum. No details of the US

truce proposal have been made public. The war, which has killed tens of thousands of people and displaced millions more over the past two years, has spread to new areas of Sudan in recent days, sparking fears of an even greater humanitarian catastrophe.

After mediating in other conflicts in Africa and the Middle East in recent months, the US administration under Donald Trump is now pushing for a ceasefire in Sudan.

The army-aligned authorities had rejected an earlier truce proposal under which both they and the paramilitaries they are fighting would be excluded from a transitional political process.

US government shutdown ties record for longest in history

The US government shutdown entered its 35th day yesterday, matching a record set during President Donald Trump’s first term, as lawmakers voiced hope over progress behind the scenes to end the dispute.

The federal closure appears almost certain to become the longest in history, with no major breakthroughs expected before it goes into its sixth week at midnight -- although there were fragile signs in Congress that an off-ramp is closer than ever.

Senate Majority Leader John Thune set the buoyant mood music on Monday when he told reporters he felt “optimistic” that newly energized talks between warring Republicans and Dem-

ocrats could end in a deal before next week.

The government has been grinding to a halt since Congress failed to pass a bill to keep federal departments and agencies funded past the end of the last financial

year on September 30.

“I’ll be honest with you, I don’t think any of us expected that it would drag on this long. We didn’t believe, we couldn’t have imagined,” House Speaker Mike Johnson told a news conference

arranged to mark the six-week milestone.

Typhoon flooding kills over 40, strands thousands in central Philippines

Entire towns on the island of Cebu have been inundated

● In Cebu province alone, 39 people have been confirmed dead

More than 40 people have been killed and hundreds of thousands displaced as rains driven by Typhoon Kalmaegi flooded swathes of the central Philippines yesterday.

Entire towns on the island of Cebu have been inundated, while cars, trucks and even massive shipping containers could be seen swept along by muddy floodwaters in videos verified by AFP.

In Cebu province alone, 39 people have been confirmed dead, provincial information officer Ainjeliz Orong told AFP, a figure she said did not include fatalities in provincial capital Cebu City, which are tallied separately.

At least five deaths have been recorded in other provinces, including an elderly resident who drowned in an upper floor of their home in Leyte province and a man struck by a falling tree in Bohol.

In the 24 hours before Kalmaegi's landfall, the area around Cebu City was deluged with 183 millimetres (seven inches) of rain, well over its 131-millimetre monthly average, weather specialist Charmagne Varilla told AFP.

"The situation in Cebu is really unprecedented," provincial governor Pamela Baricuatro told

reporters on Tuesday.

"We were expecting the winds

to be the dangerous part, but...

the water is what's truly put-

ting our people at risk," she

said. "The floodwaters are just

devastating." Local disaster official Ethel Minoza told AFP the bodies of two children had been recovered in Cebu City, where rescuers were still attempting to reach residents trapped by floodwaters.

Don del Rosario, 28, was among those in Cebu City who sought refuge on an upper floor as the storm raged.

"The water rose so fast," he said. "By 4:00 am, it was already uncontrollable -- people couldn't get out (of their houses)."

"I've been here for 28 years, and this is by far the worst we've experienced."

Scientists warn that storms are becoming more powerful due to human-driven climate change. Warmer oceans allow typhoons to strengthen rapidly, and a warmer atmosphere holds more moisture, meaning heavier rainfall.

Hundreds still living in tent cities after a 6.9-magnitude quake rocked the island in late September were "forcibly evacuated for their own safety", Cebu information officer Rhon Ramos told AFP by phone.

In total, nearly 400,000 people were pre-emptively moved from the typhoon's path, civil defence deputy administrator Rafaelito Alejandro said at a Tuesday news briefing.

Military helicopter crash

On Tuesday afternoon, the Philippine military confirmed that a helicopter, one of four deployed to assist typhoon relief efforts, had crashed on northern Mindanao island.

The Super Huey helicopter went down while en route to the coastal city of Butuan "in support of relief operations" related to the powerful storm, Eastern Mindanao Command said in a statement, adding search and recovery operations were underway.

King Tut's collection displayed for first time at Egypt's grand museum

Thousands of visitors streamed through the Grand Egyptian Museum on Tuesday as almost the entire collection of King Tutankhamun's treasures -- over 4,500 artefacts -- was displayed together for the first time since the young pharaoh's tomb was discovered in 1922.

Curated and conserved over nearly two decades, the collection was unveiled to the public two days after the museum's lavish opening ceremony on Saturday.

In a vast, dimly lit main hall spanning four levels, visitors gazed at chariots, household items, jewelled ornaments and, at the centre, Tutankhamun's iconic golden mask.

The mask sits surrounded by personal belongings, gilded

tools, family heirlooms and funerary statues.

An adjacent room showcases two small mummified princess-

es -- Tutankhamun's daughters

who died before birth -- also on

public display for the first time.

Tutankhamun died aged 18

or 19 between 1323 and 1324 BC,

with genetic and radiological

studies suggesting malaria com-

combined with a bone disorder as his

cause of death.

He was mummified and buried in Luxor's Valley of the Kings inside three nested coffins, the smallest weighing 110kg, all placed within four gilded shrines like matryoshka dolls.

While the coffins are now at the museum, the mummy remains in Luxor.

Visitors can also see the Khufu Sun Boat, described as the oldest and largest wooden artefact in human history, while a second solar boat is being restored.

These 4,600-year-old funerary boats, made of cedar and acacia, were intended to transport the king into the afterlife.

The first, measuring 43.5 meters, was discovered in 1954 at the base of the Great Pyramid; the second will soon be displayed behind glass in a live restoration lab.

Islamic finance offers a USD 5.5 trillion opportunity to unlock new markets and capital

Corporate knowledge gap is “an increasingly expensive opportunity cost”

Islamic banking has evolved from a niche offering to a mainstream financial segment, spanning more than 80 countries and assets exceeding USD 5 trillion. 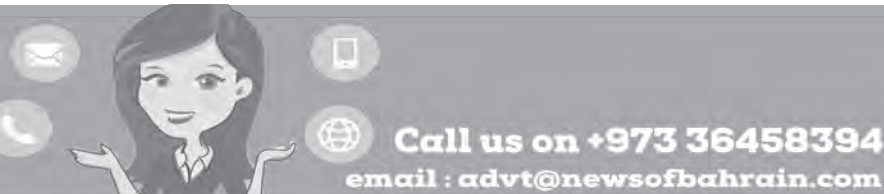

Al Qadsia, coached by Tunisian Nabil Maâloul, maintained a disciplined shape and restricted Sitra's forward movement for much of the match, but both sides created few clear chances as the game remained evenly balanced throughout.

Sitra will resume their Gulf Club campaign next year, facing Iraq's Zakho on February 17 before concluding their group stage against Al Ain on February 20.

Jobe Bellingham finding his feet as Dortmund head to City

Younger Bellingham hits stride ahead of his Champions League return to England against Manchester City

Borussia Dortmund midfielder Jobe Bellingham is gradually making his mark after a slow start ahead of his return to England to face Manchester City on Wednesday.

Jobe joined Dortmund in the summer aged 19 for a reported fee of 30.5 million euros (\$35 million) from Sunderland, among the most expensive transfers in Dortmund's history.

Jobe followed in the footsteps of his brother Jude, who moved to the Westfalenstadion five years earlier, aged 17.

Jude became one of the most sought-after players at Dortmund and is now a true superstar after moving to Real Madrid in 2023.

While Jobe has returned to England to play for the under-21s side he captains, Wednesday's match will be his first on English soil for his new club.

Like City, Dortmund sit in the top eight, having won two and drawn one of their three Champions League games so far.

'Anxieties'

The younger Bellingham understood a move to Dortmund would provoke comparisons with Jude, but felt the club offered the best place for him to develop.

Like he did at Sunderland, the

younger Bellingham has 'Jobe' on his jersey rather than his last name, due to his famous brother.

On arriving in Dortmund, Jobe admitted in pre-season comparisons with his older brother were on his mind.

"It's something you do think about. You have these anxieties, especially me as I'm only young," he told reporters, adding "I'm not perfect. I do think about these things."

With Jude's exploits in black and yellow fresh in the mind, Jobe took longer than many expected to find his feet in Germany.

A decent Club World Cup showing -- Jobe started three games, scoring a goal and assisting another before missing a showdown with his brother due to a yellow card suspension -- was followed by a more difficult time when the season started.

Jobe was hooked at half-time in his opening Bunn

desliga game. Jobe's father and agent Mark confronted Dortmund sporting director Sebastian Kehl in the player tunnel after the match.

The incident forced Dortmund to publicly reiterate "the active area is and remains reserved for players, coaches and management, not families and advisors."

Jobe started his next league match but was then benched, only picking up minutes in the dying stages of matches and failing to record any goals or assists during his brief cameos.

In mid-October at Bayern Munich, Jobe made a high-profile error, failing to clear the ball off the goal-line, allowing Michael Olise to score what would eventually be the winner.



Trott to leave as Afghanistan coach after T20 World Cup

Former England batsman Jonathan Trott will leave as Afghanistan coach after the T20 World Cup in February-March, the country's cricket board has said.

The South Africa-born 44-year-old, who has been in charge since 2022, took the Afghans to the T20 World Cup semi-finals last year.

It was their first time in the last four of a World Cup and Trott oversaw Afghanistan's rise as a white-ball team who could challenge the best.

"It has been a privilege to work with the Afghanistan national team and to witness their passion, resilience and hunger to achieve greatness," said Trott.

Run-machine Labuschagne in form of his life ahead of Ashes

Australia's Marnus Labuschagne slammed a fifth century in eight innings, firing an ominous warning shot ahead of the Ashes with some of the richest form of his life.

The Queensland captain was dropped ahead of Australia's

But he has come roaring back, hitting 101 from 111 balls against New South Wales in a one-day game at Sydney on Monday.

It was the 31-year-old's third hundred this season in the 50-over format, to go with two in

the red-ball Sheffield Shield.

"The only one I can think of is probably 2019 at Glamorgan as a period of time," Labuschagne told reporters when asked if this period was his best ever run of form.

"But probably not across both formats.

"With both formats I feel like

my batting is in a really nice place, just trusting my skills and trusting myself out there ... It's all coming together."

Labuschagne's stunning run makes him an almost certain starter in the first Test against England at Perth on November 21, but at what position he bats remains to be seen.

Bahrain eye repeat success at Islamic Games

Bahrain officially begins its campaign at the sixth Islamic Solidarity Games today, as the kingdom's athletes take the field in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia. The official opening ceremony is scheduled for Friday evening at Al Janadriyah Racecourse, where all nations will take part in the traditional parade of athletes. The Games continue until November 21, giving competitors a chance to chase medals and experience the camaraderie and cultural exchange that de-

fine this multi-nation event.

The first group of Bahrain's delegation arrived in Riyadh over the weekend, including the senior men's volleyball team, who were the first athletes to begin preparations. The rest of the delegation is set to arrive in the coming days, ensuring all athletes are ready for their respective competitions. After

landing, the volleyball team settled into the athletes' village at Princess Nourah bint Abdulrahman University, the central hub for participants. Their campaign begins today against Iran at 4pm at the Boulevard Arena, which will host all volleyball matches. They will then face Saudi Arabia on Saturday, Türkiye on Monday, Chad on Tuesday, and

The 12-man volleyball roster includes: Mahmood Ali AlAfya, Hussain Mansour Abdullah, Mohammed Saleh Annan, Ali Ebrahim Khamis, Nasser Saleh Anan, Mahmood Abdulwahid Ahmed, Sayed Hashim Isa Ali, Mahmood Abdulhussein Salman, Mohammed Jassim Abdullah, Hassan Ali AlWaraqaa, Abbas Mohammed AlKhabbaz, and Ayman Ahmed Haroona. They are supported by team manager Saved Ali Hajdar, assistant

coaches Mishal Mohammed Al Turki and Yves Marcel, fitness trainer Mohammed Mansoor, and statistician Anis Al Shayeb. Head coach Arnaud Josserand leads the squad's preparations.

With the volleyball squad ready and the Games now underway, Bahrain will be looking to build on its strong performance at the previous edition in 2022 in Konya, Türkiye. The delegation won 23 medals, including nine gold, seven silver, and seven bronze, finishing eighth overall. The kingdom's athletes now aim to continue that momentum and make a mark across multiple disciplines in Rivadh.
