'Treasonous'

Four individuals have been arrested and referred to the Public Prosecution after publishing videos expressing sympathy for Iranian aggression, an act considered treasonous against the Kingdom of Bahrain.

Authorities confirmed that the individuals' actions violated national security laws and emphasized that such behavior will be met with strict legal measures to protect the country's sovereignty and public order.

Flour stocks for markets sufficient**Penalties over price manipulation**

The Ministry of Industry and Trade has affirmed the continued availability of government-subsidised flour products in local markets.

It gave assurance that consumer needs are being met and market stability maintained amid the exceptional circumstances facing the region.

In a statement, the Ministry called on all automated and traditional bakeries to uphold their national responsibilities by ensuring the uninterrupted supply of subsidised flour products to consumers without price increases.

It stressed the importance of adhering to the provisions of Resolution No. (125) of 2012, which regulates the handling and distribution of subsidised flour.

Warning

The Ministry warned against any attempts to manipulate prices, withhold products from consumers, or misuse government-subsidised flour, emphasising that such practices constitute legal violations subject to penalties.

It added that monitoring and inspection campaigns will be intensified to ensure full compliance with relevant regulations and decisions, with necessary legal action to be taken against any establishment found in breach.

Crisis response plans reviewed

His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, remotely chaired the 518th Government Executive Committee meeting. The meeting reviewed the proactive plans being implemented, as well as the measures already taken to address the repercussions of the hostile Iranian aggression towards the Kingdom of Bahrain.

Instructions meant to protect people and property

Bahrain has dealt with Iranian aggressions by issuing rolling public statements to keep people informed and guide behaviour during what was described as an exceptional period.

Shura Council member Ali Al Aradi said this in an interview with Bahrain TV.

Al Aradi said the Kingdom was acting with "high responsibility and transparency", using successive updates to reassure citizens

and residents and explain what to do as events unfold.

"The Kingdom of Bahrain, day by day, achieves great successes," he said. "These consecutive statements first provide citizens with the situation as it is, explaining how the situation is being dealt with."

System

He said Bahrain has a national crisis-management system that was activated to handle the current conditions, feeding into decisions on schooling, remote



work and food security.

Al Aradi said the aim was to keep services running and daily life moving.

Duty

Al Aradi said public duty, for citizens and residents alike, is shown by sticking to instructions meant to protect people and property.

"The primary goal is the protection of the citizen and the resident. It also protects your way of life," he said, urging people to take guidance from official channels.

He said the Iranian aggressions breached the United Nations Charter and international law, and he expected a united response from the international community condemning the attacks and backing Gulf Co-operation Council states.

War

"It is not acceptable for a state to thus attack peaceful, stable countries that have not taken any action against Iran, nor have they entered into war against it," he said.

Preparedness

The Ambassador highlighted the remarkable level of preparedness demonstrated by Bahraini authorities, noting that the Kingdom's ability to respond swiftly and effectively is the result of long-term planning and investment.

seeing now is the result of that preparation," he said.

Communication

H.E. Ambassador Long also commended Bahrain's authorities for maintaining clear and effective communication with the public during the crisis.

He noted that the government's efforts to provide timely information and guidance have helped prevent panic and maintain public confidence.

"In moments like this, people tend to panic when they don't have answers. The Bahraini authorities have done an excellent job communicating with the

public and ensuring the situation remains under control," he said.

The Ambassador added that these communication systems, developed over time, are proving highly effective in reassuring residents and managing public sentiment.

Safety

Addressing concerns regarding foreign nationals in Bahrain, the Ambassador confirmed that British citizens in the Kingdom have been advised to register their presence with the embassy and remain in contact with consular services if needed.



Over the years, Bahrain and the UK have worked closely on defense training, strategic planning, and security coordination.

He noted that many British nationals have chosen to remain in Bahrain and follow the guidance of local authorities.

"Sheltering in place and following the advice of the Bahraini authorities is a very viable option. The chances of coming to harm are extremely small, particularly because of the extraordinary job Bahrain's authorities are doing," he said.

While some individuals have left the country via the King Fahd Causeway, the Ambassador emphasised that departures are voluntary and there is currently no need for organized evacuation.

The Ambassador reiterated that the United Kingdom's involvement in the regional situation remains strictly defensive.

He confirmed that the UK is providing defensive support to allies in the region, including through aerial monitoring and counter-drone efforts.

"Our posture is defensive. We are supporting our allies and working to intercept incoming threats where necessary," he said.

He also noted that the UK continues to review additional ways to support regional partners while ensuring stability.

Cooperation

The Ambassador highlighted the long history of security cooperation between the United Kingdom and Bahrain.

Over the years, both nations have worked closely on defense training, strategic planning, and security coordination.

This partnership, he said, has contributed to Bahrain's strong ability to respond effectively during crises.

"Some of the experience and advice shared over the years has been part of our cooperation, but the credit goes to Bahrain," he said.

Stocks, oil climb as war stirs volatility

Global stock markets rose and oil prices crept up further yesterday as the Middle East war entered its sixth day, with energy supplies constrained and investors assessing levels of volatility.

European markets climbed for a second straight day following gains in Asia, where stocks rebounded from three days of declines.

Joshua Mahony, chief market analyst at Scope Markets, said there had been gains across all categories, suggesting that investors were "dip buying", where they purchase stocks after a slump in the hope they will recover value.

Global markets have been thrown into turmoil this week after the United States and Israel began strikes against Iran on Saturday, killing its supreme leader and sparking a wave of retaliatory attacks across the Gulf.

Tehran also effectively shut down the Strait of Hormuz, through which a fifth of the world's crude and considerable supplies of liquefied natural gas travel, sending prices soaring.

Both main oil contracts climbed around two percent yesterday and are up around 14 percent from Friday, stoking the chance of a fresh spike in inflation and dealing a blow to hopes for lower interest rates.

"The geopolitical situation

is clearly moving fast, and oil prices are moving up again," said Jim Reid, managing director at Deutsche Bank.

"That comes as both the US and Iran have made clear they aren't backing down."

Europe's central bankers, meanwhile, played down fears of lasting economic damage but

conceded that a longer conflict could lead to higher inflation.

"Financial stability is not at risk, I can say that very clearly," said Bank of France governor Francois Villeroy de Galhau, adding that the conflict could bring "a bit more inflation and a bit less growth".

Bundesbank President Joa-

chim Nagel suggested that if energy prices remained high it could lead to "higher inflation and weaker economic activity in the euro area".

The war has touched as far afield as the Sri Lankan coast, where a US submarine torpedoed an Iranian warship, and Azerbaijan, which threatened

retaliation after a drone hit an airport.

Concerns about how long the war will go on continued to weigh on markets, with Danish shipping giant Maersk saying it was suspending bookings in the Gulf until further notice.

China, fearing supply shortages, has asked its largest oil refiners to suspend exports of diesel and gasoline, according to a Bloomberg News report.

In Asia, Seoul led gains, with the Kospi soaring 12 percent at one point following an earlier collapse. Tokyo closed up almost two percent and Hong Kong and Shanghai also advanced.

National Australia Bank's Ken Crompton said that oil traders were largely unmoved by US President Donald Trump's pledge to protect ships passing through the Strait of Hormuz, which had provided a small glimmer of support Wednesday.

"The fact is it's just not feasible to reasonably protect all ships in the region," he wrote, pointing out that Houthis in Yemen had carried out multiple attacks on ships in the past.

Iran's Revolutionary Guards claimed "complete control" of the Strait, with reports of additional vessels coming under attack Wednesday.

Energy intelligence firm Kpler said oil tanker transits through the Strait had dropped by 90 percent from last week.

Google to open German centre for 'AI development'

Google will open an AI centre in Berlin yesterday, the latest sign of Europe's deepening reliance on US firms in cutting edge technologies despite the continent's stated aim to catch up with its rivals.

Germany's ministry for digital affairs told AFP the centre will bring together cloud computing and data infrastructure, "AI development" operations as well as a space for cooperation between start-ups and research centres.

Europe is struggling to gain ground in the battle for AI dominance with the United States and China, which are pumping vast sums into the field and producing the most advanced models underpinning the technology.

The Google project is part of a 5.5 billion euro (\$6.4 billion) investment drive into Europe's top economy announced by the US tech titan in November, planned to include a new data centre.

AI giants promise Trump to pay for increased energy needs

Seven US tech giants at the forefront of artificial intelligence committed Wednesday to offset the costs of their increased electricity needs through investments in energy infrastructure.

To develop and use AI, the main players in the sector use data centers, whose chips and servers consume a lot of electricity.

But installed energy capacity is not growing as fast as demand, which has led to a sharp rise in electricity prices in many parts of the United States, a phenomenon that has become a campaign issue in the run-up to the November midterm elections.

The tech companies promised to finance new capacity when a center is built and to cover any costs of upgrading the grid.

Data centers accounted for 4.4 percent of total electricity consumption in the United States in 2023, according to the Department of Energy, which

predicts that the proportion could reach as much as 12.0 percent by 2028.

On Wednesday, the Trump administration announced that Google, Microsoft, Meta, Oracle, xAI, OpenAI, and Amazon had agreed to the five principles of its plans to make the installation of new data centers a benefit to all.

President Donald Trump "is

ensuring that data centers address affordability and benefit ALL American households and businesses," the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy said in a post on X. "Although electricity demand is increasing, Americans won't be footing the bill," it added.

The program also includes initiatives to recruit from local populations and offer training.

Chinese firms slam EU's 'protectionist' 'Made in Europe' plan

A group representing Chinese companies slammed an EU plan to bolster the bloc's industries against fierce competition from China yesterday, labelling it a shift towards protectionism that could affect trade

cooperation between the two giants. Brussels has unveiled new rules for companies trying to access public funds in strategic sectors including cars, green tech and steel, saying the firms must meet minimum thresholds for EU-made parts.

"We express serious concern

and opposition regarding certain provisions of the proposal that may have far-reaching implications for market openness, fair competition, and China-EU economic and trade cooperation," the Chinese Chamber of Commerce to the EU (CCCEU) commented.

War spirals with fresh strikes

Fresh strikes and retaliatory attacks push widening conflict across Middle East and beyond

Israel yesterday launched a fresh wave of strikes on Iran, which stepped up its attacks on Gulf nations, as the Middle East war spread throughout the region and beyond.

A conflict sparked Saturday with US-Israeli attacks on Iran that killed supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei has rapidly escalated, engulfing the region and drawing in global powers, while snarling shipping and energy markets.

The war has touched as far afield as the Sri Lankan coast, where a US submarine torpedoed an Iranian warship, and Azerbaijan, which threatened retaliation after a drone hit an airport.

Azerbaijan warned the attack "will not go unanswered" and vowed "necessary retaliatory measures," raising fears of another country entering the fray.

On another front, Tehran said it had hit Iraq-based Kurdish groups, as the United States reportedly seeks to arm Iranian Kurdish groups to infiltrate Iran. Australia deployed two military aircraft to the theatre while Canada's Prime Minister Mark Carney said he could not rule out his armed forces taking part in hostilities.

The war has also dragged in NATO member Turkey after alliance air defences destroyed a missile launched from Iran heading towards Turkish airspace.

While a Turkish official said the missile appeared to have been aimed at a British base in Cyprus, Turkey summoned the Iranian ambassador over the incident.

Following yesterday's strikes on Tehran, AFP TV images showed blackened vehicles and mangled buildings, with smoke still rising from some.

A 30-year-old Tehran resident told AFP: "We're going through a very important page of our history and I'm not afraid."

'I'm not afraid'

While a Turkish official said the missile appeared to have been aimed at a British base in Cyprus, Turkey summoned the Iranian ambassador over the incident.

Following yesterday's strikes on Tehran, AFP TV images showed blackened vehicles and mangled buildings, with smoke still rising from some.

A 30-year-old Tehran resident told AFP: "We're going through a very important page of our history and I'm not afraid."

"Hope is the only thing that we have right now."

An Iranian state-run foundation said the death toll from US and Israeli strikes on the Islamic republic has risen to 1,230, a toll AFP could not independently verify.

Iranian media reported yesterday that a sports complex, football stadium, municipality building and shop fronts across Tehran were damaged in Israeli and US strikes on the city.

Israel's Defence Minister Israel Katz said his US counterpart

Pete Hegseth had assured him of Washington's firm backing for their joint military campaign against Iran and urged him to continue the operation "to the end".

'Catastrophic'

The war could usher in a "prolonged period of flux" for the global economy, warned International Monetary Fund chief Kristalina Georgieva.

Iran's powerful Revolutionary Guards have claimed the closure of the Strait of Hormuz, the Gulf chokepoint through which a fifth of the world's crude oil flows, with oil tanker transits down 90 percent, according to market intelligence firm Kpler.

A tanker in the waters off Kuwait suffered a "large explosion" that caused an oil spill, the British maritime security agency UK-MTO reported.

According to Iranian state TV, Iran struck a US oil tanker in the Gulf with a missile, an incident that could not immediately be independently confirmed.

Facing energy shortages, South Korea said it was activating a \$68-billion market stabilisation fund, while China reportedly told oil refiners to stop exporting diesel and gasoline.

With flights scrapped and travellers stranded or hastily repatriated, the war is also hammering tourism in a region that has become a prized destination for holidaymakers worldwide.

"My last group of tourists left three days ago, and all the other groups planned for March have been cancelled," said Nazih Rawashdeh, a tour guide near Irbid, in northern Jordan.

"This is the start of the high season here. It's catastrophic," he said.

Italy to send air-defense aid to Gulf countries: PM

Italy will send air-defense assistance to Gulf countries hit by Iranian strikes launched in retaliation for US-Israeli attacks, Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni said yesterday.

Separately, Defense Minister Guido Crosetto told parliament yesterday that Italy would send, along with France, Spain, and the Netherlands, naval assets to defend EU member Cyprus "in coming days."

In an interview with RTL 102.5 radio, Meloni said "Italy, like the UK, France and Germany, intends to send aid to the Gulf countries."

"We are clearly talking about defense, air defense, not just because they are friendly nations but because there are tens of thousands of Italians in that area and around 2,000 Italian soldiers that we must protect," she added.

Israel tells Beirut suburb to evacuate

● Hezbollah stronghold Dahiyeh sees mass exodus

● 72 killed, 437 wounded since Monday

Israel issued an unprecedented evacuation warning yesterday for the entirety of Beirut's southern suburbs, a stronghold of Hezbollah, sending residents in the district of hundreds of thousands of people fleeing in a panic.

Lebanon was dragged into the conflict on Monday, when the Iran-backed armed group Hezbollah attacked Israel to avenge the killing of Iranian supreme leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei in the US-Israeli strikes that launched the war.

Israel responded with air

strikes and sent ground troops into some Lebanese border villages, and told residents of a large area of south Lebanon to leave in anticipation of military operations there.

In a message to the residents of Beirut's southern suburbs, known as Dahiyeh, an Israeli military spokesman said: "Save your lives and evacuate your residences immediately."

Such warnings typically foreshadow large-scale attacks, and massive traffic jams formed on the outskirts of the suburbs, as people fired guns in the air, urging locals to leave as soon as possible.

Earlier in the day, Israel said its forces had hit "several command centres belonging to the Hezbollah terrorist organisation" in south Beirut.

Lebanese authorities say at least 72 people have been killed, 437 wounded and 83,000 displaced from their homes since Monday.

Gulf tensions **escalate**

Western embassy staff shelter as air defences intercept missiles and drones

Some Western embassy staff in Riyadh were told to shelter in place, diplomatic sources said yesterday, with drone debris injuring six people in Abu Dhabi as Iran pressed attacks across the Gulf.

The war in the Middle East has engulfed the otherwise stable Gulf region as Iran retaliates to US and Israeli strikes that killed

its supreme leader, launching strikes at Israel, the wider region and beyond.

At least 13 people have been killed in the Gulf, including seven civilians, since Iran began its attacks on Saturday. Washington said six US servicemen were killed, including four in Kuwait.

In addition to the shelter-in-place order, a witness said the diplomatic quarter in the Saudi capital Riyadh had been closed off.

The witness and diplomats spoke on condition of anonymity to discuss the sensitive security matter.

Authorities in Abu Dhabi responded to falling debris at two sites in an industrial zone after air defences intercepted a drone,

the emirate's media office said.

Six Pakistani and Nepalese nationals were injured, while the UAE later said its air defences detected seven ballistic missiles, intercepting six as one fell inside the country.

Fresh waves of explosions, most from interceptions, also rocked Dubai and Doha yesterday.

In Doha, AFP journalists saw a plume of smoke rising from the Qatari capital and reported loud blasts across the city.

Qatar's defence ministry said its forces intercepted 13 Iranian ballistic missiles yesterday, while one fell in Qatari waters, and four drones were also shot down, with no casualties reported.

Earlier, Qatari authorities said

they were evacuating residents living near Doha's US embassy.

The fresh salvos came hours after Qatari premier Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani lambasted Iran's foreign minister, Abbas Araghchi, during a call.

The Qatari premier accused Iran of seeking to "harm its neighbours and drag them into a war that is not theirs", according to a statement from Qatar's foreign ministry.

In Saudi Arabia, officials said they had intercepted three cruise missiles and several drones.

"Three cruise missiles were intercepted and destroyed outside the city of Al-Kharj," the Saudi defence ministry posted on X.

Son of last shah says Iran clerics' next leader will be illegitimate

The son of the last shah toppled in Iran's 1979 Islamic revolution said yesterday that whoever the clerical government chooses to succeed the late Ayatollah Ali Khamenei will be illegitimate.

Reza Pahlavi, who has positioned himself as an alternative if the Islamic republic falls, said on social media that "victory is near" after Khamenei was killed last weekend as the United States and Israel launched the war.

"Any attempt to appoint a successor for him is pre-destined to fail. Whomever is introduced... will lack legitimacy and will be considered an accomplice to the bloody record of this regime and its criminal leaders," Pahlavi said.

Khamenei was Iran's top leader since 1989, pursuing a hardline policy of repressing dissent at home, developing a contested nuclear program and confronting regional rivals led by Israel.

Mojtaba Khamenei, the son of Khamenei, is among

the contenders to succeed his father.

Pahlavi said it made no difference if the next supreme leader were "Mojtaba or Hassan" -- a reference to another potential contender, Hassan Rouhani, the former president who was considered a moderate within the system and championed diplomacy with the United States.

Pahlavi, who lives in exile in the Washington area, has voiced hope for mass defections. He has said that he wants to be a transitional leader before a referendum is called to establish a secular democracy.

He urged Iranian security forces to "hand over power immediately and without violence."

"Declare your allegiance to the nation's Lion and Sun Revolution, and contribute to Iran's stable and secure transition to a democratically elected national government," he said.

The lion was a symbol of the ousted monarchy while the sun has deep resonance in Iran's pre-Islamic Zoroastrian tradition.

Internet blackout leaves anxious Iranians in the dark

Iran's internet is still "around 1 percent of ordinary levels", monitor Netblocks said yesterday, leaving most Iranians struggling to access independent news or communicate with the outside world.

Iranian authorities shut off internet access on Saturday after Israel and the United States began air strikes, plunging the country into an information blackout.

"Iran's internet blackout has now exceeded 120 hours with connectivity still flatlining around 1 percent of ordinary levels," internet monitor Netblocks said in a message posted on social media platform X yesterday.

Some Iranians are finding brief moments of the day when they are able to connect and send messages, while others have resorted to using illegal Starlink subscriptions, the Elon

Musk-owned satellite-based internet provider.

Calls to Iran from overseas to mobile phones or landlines are near-impossible.

"The internet speed is very slow," a Tehran resident said by message, asking to remain anonymous for security reasons. "You can't call and voice messages don't get delivered. We can just text."

Netblocks said that Iranian telecoms companies were now sending messages to "threaten users who try to connect to the global internet with legal action."

Iran shut off the internet for several weeks during mass nation-wide protests in January and also cut it during a 12-day war with Israel last June.

"The internet situation here is abysmal," a resident in Bukhan in western Iran, who asked not to be named, said

in a message. "It connects and disconnects. The connection is slow so the VPNs don't work."

In normal circumstances, Iranians use VPNs to connect to Western internet services such as Instagram that are banned in Iran.

Others with working internet connections are helping out others.

Shima, a 33-year-old in Tehran, told AFP that she was helping friends by sending news of life in the capital which has been hit by waves of missile and bombing strikes since Saturday.

"I need to call a lot of people, even strangers, on behalf of their families," she said.

On Iran's borders, weary travellers who are fleeing to safety said they had to travel without any internet connection or access to phone navigation services such as Google Maps.

Trump seeks role in picking Iran's leader

The US president compares Iran to Venezuela, where he ousted Maduro

- **Trump Calls Khamenei's son "unacceptable" and "lightweight"**

- **Wants someone to "bring harmony and peace"**

- **Unclear how US could influence clerical selection**

US President Donald Trump yesterday insisted he should have a role in picking Iran's next supreme leader after the killing of Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, whose son he said he found unacceptable.

"Khamenei's son is a lightweight. I have to be involved in the appointment, like with Delcy," Trump told Axios in an interview, drawing a comparison to Venezuela, where interim president Delcy Rodriguez has cooperated with him under threat of violence after the

United States ousted her boss, Nicolas Maduro.

Trump told the news outlet that the United States would likely return to war within five years without a favorable leader in Iran.

"Khamenei's son is unacceptable to me. We want someone that will bring harmony and peace to Iran," Trump was quoted saying by the news outlet.

It was unclear in what way Trump would be able to take a

role in the Islamic republic's selection of a new supreme leader, a decision made by an assembly of senior Shiite Muslim clerics mostly staunchly opposed to the United States. Trump was raised a Presbyterian.



Trump suggested he could work with someone from within Iran's Islamic republic rather than seeking to topple the government, implying a willingness to engage with the regime he has long opposed

But his remarks imply a willingness to work with someone from within the Islamic republic rather than seek to topple the government, which has been a sworn enemy of the United States since the 1979 Islamic revolution toppled the pro-Western shah.

The late shah's son, Reza Pahlavi, has proposed that he return as a transitional figure before Iran drafts a new constitution

as a secular democracy. Pahlavi earlier yesterday said that any new supreme leader within the Islamic republic would be illegitimate.

Ali Khamenei, who ruled Iran since 1989 with hardline policies that included repression at home and confrontation with neighboring countries, was killed Saturday in an Israeli strike as Israel and the United States opened war.

His son, Mojtaba Khamenei, is considered one of the contenders to succeed his father, who was only the second supreme leader after revolutionary leader Ayatollah Ruhollah Khomeini.

In Venezuela, Trump ordered a deadly January 3 attack in which US forces snatched Maduro, a longtime US nemesis.

Rather than backing the opposition long championed by the United States, Trump has said he has been pleased by Rodriguez, who was Maduro's vice president but has cooperated on key US demands, notably on benefiting oil companies.

She is doing so under Trump's threat of violence if she does not do what he wants, particularly on access to natural resources.

More flights take off despite continued fighting

- **More than 100 flights depart UAE as airspace partially reopens**

Fewer commercial flights were cancelled yesterday in the Middle East despite continued military strikes, with more than 100 flights taking off from the United Arab Emirates, according to a specialist data firm.

Airports in the United Arab Emirates and Qatar are major hubs for travel between Europe and Asia, so the closure of the region's airspace quickly left tens of thousands of travellers stranded.

Cirium, a company specialising in aviation sector data, said

87 flights took off yesterday from Dubai's international airport, the world's second-largest airport by passengers, and 15 from Abu Dhabi.

Another 60 flights left Oman's capital Muscat.

However, no flights left the airports in Bahrain, Kuwait and Qatar.

Cirium said that the 43.1 percent of flights across the region were cancelled yesterday.

That is down from 61 percent on Wednesday, and more than 65 percent between Sunday and Tuesday.

Among the aircraft leaving Dubai were the super jumbo A380s flown by flag carrier Emirates.

Other Emirates A380s returned from abroad, including from destinations such as Los Angeles.

"With the limited re-opening

of airspace, Emirates is operating a reduced flight schedule until further notice," the airline said on its website.

It added that customers with earlier bookings were being given priority to reserve new flights.

According to the flight tracking website FlightRadar24, flights departing from the United Arab Emirates were heading south to keep its distance from the Gulf and Iran.

Qatar Airways, whose regular operations are suspended until further notice, said yesterday it would carry out a limited number of repatriation flights for travellers stranded in the region.

It said it would operate flights from Muscat to London, Berlin and Rome, as well as from Riyadh to Frankfurt.

Sri Lanka takes control of Iranian ship fearing new US sub attack

Sri Lanka has offloaded crew and assumed control of it, the South Asian nation's president said Thursday, a day after a deadly US submarine attack on another ship.

President Anura Kumara Dissanayake said in a televised address that his country's navy had offloaded 208 sailors from the IRIS Bushehr, which had requested port entry due to engine trouble.

The Bushehr, like the ship torpedoed off Sri Lanka's southern coast on Wednesday, the IRIS Dena, had recently participated in a naval exercise in eastern India, Dissanayake said.

At least 84 sailors were killed in the torpedo attack, which was the first military strike far outside the Middle East region since the United States and Israel launched their war on Iran.

Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi on Thursday denounced the attack and warned Washington it would "bitterly regret" establishing such a precedent.

Dissanayake said his country was "not taking sides in this conflict".

"But while maintaining our neutrality we are taking action to save lives," he said.

"No person should die in a war like this. Every life is equally precious."

The Bushehr was close to Colombo, the nation's main seaport, but it will not be anchored there due to the risk to merchant shipping, the president said, noting possible increases in insurance rates.


The ship will therefore be taken to the smaller Trincomalee port on the north-eastern side of the island, he said.

Alcaraz unbeaten run under threat from Sinner, Djokovic at Indian Wells

Former champion Carlos Alcaraz aims to extend his perfect start to 2026 at Indian Wells while Jannik Sinner returns to the California desert seeking to fill a gap in his resume with his first title of the year.

The world's top two players headline a stellar men's field for the ATP and WTA Masters 1000 tournament, where Serbian superstar Novak Djokovic is chasing a record sixth title, which would see him break out of a tie with Swiss great Roger Federer for the most in tournament history.

Spain's Alcaraz, 22, made history last month when he lifted the Australian Open title to become the youngest man to complete a career Grand Slam.

He won the Qatar Open to arrive Stateside riding a 12-match winning streak to start the year.

The top seed could face a tricky second-round opener against either former world number three Grigor Dimitrov or in-form left-hander Terence Atmane, with third-seeded Djokovic also looming in his half of the draw.

Sinner will play Czech qualifier Dalibor Svrčina, who beat Australian James Duckworth 6-2, 6-4 as first-round action got underway on Wednesday.

Italy's Matteo Berrettini booked a second-round meeting with fourth-seeded German Alexander Zverev, beating France's Adrian Mannarino 4-6, 7-5, 7-5.

Sinner missed Indian Wells last year serving a suspension for a positive test for banned anabolic steroid clostebol. He returned from that ban to win Wimbledon and the ATP Finals but fell to Djokovic in the Australian Open semi-finals and lost to Jakob Mensik in the quarters at Doha last month.

Although he professed himself satisfied with his season so far, Sinner said Tuesday he was trying to maximize his potential.

"It has been a very hard practice week here for me," he said. "We spent many, many hours of practice."

"(I'm) very happy with how I'm feeling on the court ... In the same time, we also try to improve a couple of things."

"I'm trying to be slightly more aggressive at times on the baseline, and then we see how it goes," added the Italian, who has won all of the other five Masters 1000 hard court tournaments, starting with Toronto in 2023 and adding Miami, Cincinnati and Shanghai in 2024

and Paris last year.

Sabalenka back in action

Women's world number one Aryna Sabalenka is also chasing a first Indian Wells title, having fallen in last year's final to Russian teen Mirra Andreeva and in 2023 to Kazakhstan's Elena Rybakina -- who beat Sabalenka in the Australian Open final to claim a second Grand Slam crown.

Sabalenka, back in action for the first time since that Australian Open disappointment, will open her campaign against Japanese qualifier Himeno Sakatsume, a 6-4, 6-3 winner over US wild card Alycia Parks, with Japanese star Naomi Osaka and hard-hitting American Amanda Anisimova in her quarter.

Third-seeded Rybakina says the desert conditions can pose unique challenges, with big differences between day and night matches and slower courts making for longer rallies.

"It's not easy to get these short points, free points. You need to work for each point," said Rybakina, who is in the same half of the draw as second seeded Iga Swiatek, the Indian Wells winner in 2022 and 2024.

Swiatek says the conditions suit her game, but she has a tough draw that includes a potential quarter-final clash with Andreeva, who upset her in 2023 and adding Miami, Cincinnati and Shanghai in 2024

'She's coming back': Djokovic predicts Serena return

Novak Djokovic is convinced US tennis great Serena Williams will return to competition, and the 24-time Grand Slam champion is itching to see "one of the greatest athletes" back on court.

"I think she's coming back," Djokovic said Wednesday at the ATP/WTA Indian Wells Masters.

"I don't know. I haven't spoken to her, but I guess the sentiment is that she's coming back. Where and how, singles, doubles, we don't know, and if I'm in her position, I would hide it too."

Williams, a 23-time Grand Slam champion, hasn't com-

India reach T20 World Cup final after England fail in epic chase

India defend massive total in dramatic semi-final to keep title defence alive

● **India beat England by seven runs**

● **Samson anchors big total**

India clung on to beat England by seven runs in a thrilling T20 World Cup semi-final in Mumbai yesterday, despite Jacob Bethell's superb 105 that put Harry Brook's side within a whisker of pulling off a record chase.

After Sanju Samson's scintillating 89 laid the platform for India to pile up a massive 253-7, England finished agonisingly short on 246-7 after a brilliant effort masterminded by Bethell.

Phil Salt (5), Brook (7) and Jos Buttler (25) fell early to leave England 64-3.

But Bethell, aided by partnerships of 77 with Will Jacks (35) and 50 with Sam Curran (18), kept England in the hunt.

The left-hander hit seven sixes and eight fours in his 48-ball thrash before his run out in the final over finally allowed India to celebrate in front of 35,000 jubilant fans in Mumbai's Wankhede

stadium.

India will face New Zealand in Sunday's final in Ahmedabad as they attempt to become the first team to retain the trophy and the first to win it on home soil.

"It's an unbelievable feeling, going to Ahmedabad for the final, a special feeling for the

boys," said India captain Suryakumar Yadav, who paid tribute to England.

"They were always in the game, always in the chase. I was very nervous, I'm glad someone didn't check my heart rate," he said, before looking forward to the final.

"In India, going for the title,

there will be pressure, there will be nerves but the boys will be excited as well," Suryakumar added.

England captain Brook praised the way his side went about attacking a daunting target.

"All of our lads should be really proud of the way we played tonight and throughout this

competition," said Brook.

Costly drop

The hosts, having been asked to bat by Brook, earlier flayed England's attack to all parts of the ground, hitting 19 sixes and 18 fours.

Samson, who scored 97 not out in the previous match against the West Indies, signalled his intent with a four and six off Jofra Archer's first over.

But he was given a life on 15 when Brook dropped a simple chance at mid-off off Archer.

It proved a costly mistake as, helped by some ill-disciplined bowling, Samson raced to his half-century off 26 balls with a huge six as Liam Dawson's first

over was pummeled for 19 runs.

"I'll hold my hands up and say that I made a big mistake there, dropping Samson," said Brook.

"As the old saying goes, catches win matches. At the end of the day, it cost us."

Ishan Kishan put on 97 from 48 balls with Samson for the second wicket before the left-hander holed out to Jacks off Adil Rashid in the 10th over to make it 117-2.

Samson powered on until Jacks returned to have him caught by Salt in the deep in the 14th over at which point India were 160-3.

"It feels really great," said Samson after being named player of the match. "I kind of knew that I got some form going from the last game, so I thought I need to continue."

"Even 250 looked chaseable here and England played really well. All credit goes to how they batted and we really had a great semi-final."

Shivam Dube continued the onslaught with 43 off 25 balls with four sixes before being run out by Brook's direct hit.

Hardik Pandya hit 27 off 12 balls late on and Tilak Varma 21 off seven to take India past the 250 mark.

Jacks was the pick of the England bowlers with 2-40 but the wayward Archer was plundered, taking 1-61 off his four overs.

Verstappen says new Red Bull car gave him 'goosebumps'

Four-time world champion Max Verstappen said yesterday he does not know how the opening Grand Prix of the season will play out under sweeping new regulations, but he "got goosebumps" when he first saw the new Red Bull car.

The Dutchman was overwhelmed at pre-season testing in Bahrain by this year's rule changes, which have led to a complete overhaul of chassis and engines for every team.

Drivers will have to better manage their batteries on each lap, a task he called "anti-racing".

But with plenty of data collected he is optimistic ahead of the season-opening race in

Melbourne this weekend.

"It has felt like a long build up to this point and it is exciting to finally get out racing again," said Verstappen, who won six of the last nine Grands Prix in 2025 but narrowly failed to retain his world championship crown.

"In Bahrain, seeing the car with our own power unit getting in so many laps was very impressive."

"We've been driving the car in the simulator for such a long time, so when it was finally time to come back and see the car ready to go, I did get goosebumps."

Red Bull have dispensed with Honda engines and are competing this season for the first time with their own factory-built power units.
