Indian PM Modi lights 'Diya' to commemorate COVID-19 fight



Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi yesterday lit an earthen lamp or 'Diya' after turning off all lights at his residence for nine minutes. He did this as per his earlier appeal to all Indians to switch off the lights at 9pm local time at their residences and just light a candle, 'Diya', or their cellphone's flashlight to mark the nation's fight against the coronavirus (COVID-19) disease that is spreading across India like wildfire. Photos of the Prime Minister lighting the lamp and leading the nation's fight against COVID-19 were shared from his official account on social networking platform Twitter. Modi himself posted the photos with a Sanskrit 'shloka' as the caption, which when translated to English, roughly means, "Salutations to the light of the Lamp which brings auspiciousness, health, and prosperity and destroys inimical feelings; salutations to the light of the Lamp.'
