ahrain's investigation discovered that Future Bank had hidden payments from established methods of regulatory scrutiny through a measure called "wire stripping". Wire stripping refers to the falsification or removal of material identifying information from SWIFT messages in order to conceal the involvement of specific Iranian parties and banks in the underlying payment. Concealing this information often causes banks in other countries to violate their own regulatory obligations.

In some cases, Future Bank induced other foreign banks to engage in the illicit practice. In total, Future Bank "wire stripped" at least 5,051 payments with a total value of more than \$5 billion.
