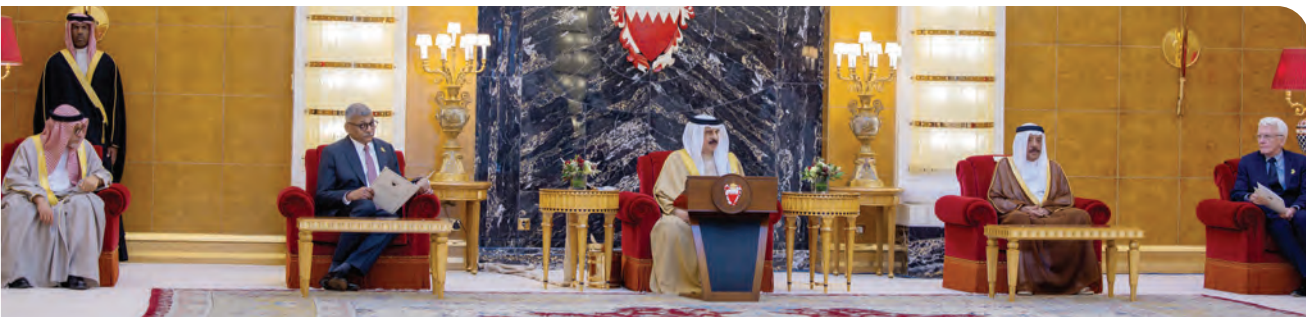

"Every thriving economy rests on a single, invisible foundation – trust. Trust, in turn, rests on justice. And justice is rendered through strong institutions," HRH the Crown Prince and Prime Minister said at the event.

The ceremony marked the official launch of the Bahrain International Commercial Court (BICC) and the introduction of Global Justice Bay, positioning

Bahrain as a hub for dispute resolution and international legal collaboration.

HRH the Crown Prince and Prime Minister highlighted Bahrain's long-standing history as a crossroads of trade.

"For centuries, our islands have been a crossroads of trade – a place where merchants met, ideas converged, and trust was the currency of exchange. This Court is a continuation of that story," he said.

HRH Prince Salman underlined the strategic partnership with Singapore in establishing the Court and praised the collaboration of Chief Justice Sundares Menon and his team.

"Your collaboration has been central to making this day possible. We are deeply grateful for your friendship and your faith in what we are building together," he said.

He outlined the principles guiding the new Court, empha-

sising that justice enables prosperity, independent institutions command trust, and judicial systems must adapt to the modern, interconnected economy.

"Trade does not flow where contracts are uncertain. Investment does not endure where law is unpredictable. And prosperity cannot last where trust is absent," HRH the Crown Prince and Prime Minister said.

Efficiency and transparency

"The Bahrain International Commercial Court has been designed to combine the precision of law with the speed of modern business. It will serve both regional and international enterprises with efficiency and transparency," he added.

HRH Prince Salman also stressed Bahrain's commitment to continued investment in the judiciary and legal education, reform, and international engagement.

HH Shaikh Nasser: Bahrain earns global trust as leading force in digital security

Lieutenant General His Highness Shaikh Nasser bin Hamad Al Khalifa, National Security Advisor, Royal Guard Commander, and Secretary-General of the Supreme Defence Council, reaffirmed Bahrain’s growing role as a regional and international leader in cybersecurity and digital innovation.

AI disruption demands new cyber order

Regional and international cybersecurity leaders convened at the Opening Leadership Panel, Cybersecurity in the Age of AI Disruption, emphasizing the need for collaboration, capacity building, and responsible innovation to safeguard nations from rapidly evolving digital threats.

This collective call for co-operation emerged during the opening of the Arab International Cybersecurity Conference and Exhibition, which kicked off yesterday.

Dr. Ibraheem Alfuraih, Secretary-General of the Arab Cybersecurity Ministers Council, underscored the importance of regional collaboration in combating cyber threats. He highlighted that the Council’s acces-

sion to the UN Cybercrime international body marks a significant milestone in uniting Arab efforts with global partners to enhance digital resilience. Representing the UAE, H.E. Dr. Mohammed Al Kuwaiti, Head of Cybersecurity for the UAE Government, outlined five key pillars essential to building a secure digital ecosystem, Policy and governance, Capacity building, Partnerships, Inno-

vation, Protection and defense.

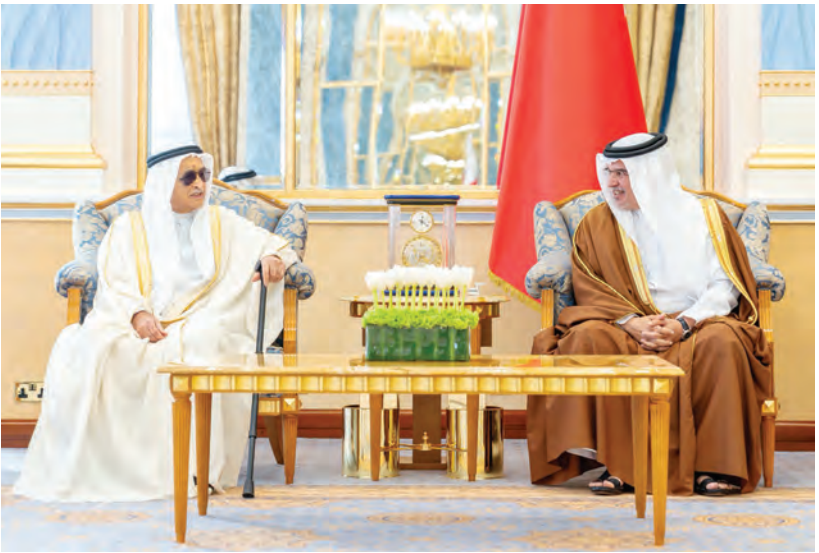

Bahrain Bids Farewell to Power Pioneer

Former minister who helped shape Bahrain's electricity and water network

Former Minister of Electricity and Water, engineer Abdullah bin Mohammed Juma, passed away on Wednesday, leaving behind a rich legacy of national service and technical leadership.

Born and raised in Fereej Al-Fadhel in Manama, Juma attended school in Al Qudai-biya Eastern Primary School before travelling to the UK for college studies in 1966.

After doing a bachelor's degree in electrical engineering, he began his career in 1970 as an engineer in the Electricity Distribution Department of the Ministry of Electricity.

Projects
Among the early projects he helped advance was the extension of electricity to villages and islands across the Kingdom – including Nabih Saleh, which was connected to the national grid through a submarine cable in the 1970s.

Through diligence and technical skill, he rose to become Director of the Distribution Department, then Director of Electricity in the 1980s, and Assistant Undersecretary for Electricity Affairs in the early 1990s.

Appointed Minister of Electricity and Water in 1995, Juma oversaw major expansion plans for power generation stations in Sitra, Riffa and Hidd, strengthening the Kingdom's capacity to meet growing demand.

His tenure coincided with a period of rapid modernisation

that saw Bahrain transition from limited local networks to a comprehensive national system serving every governorate.

Appointment
After leaving ministerial office in 1999, he was appointed to the Shura Council, where he served until 2002.

He later moved to the private sector, founding a company and developing a portfolio of real estate projects that continued his interest in infrastructure and national growth.

Known for his love of photography and nature, Juma was inspired by his uncle, whom he often credited as a formative influence. He was also praised by the late Prime Minister for his work ethic and dedication to public service, a reputation he retained throughout his career.

Bahrain remembers him as a pioneer of its modern electricity and water system – a man whose technical vision and commitment to development helped light the Kingdom for generations to come.

‘Urgent’ reform

Parliament passes BD1,000 income rule and health cover for expat families

Compulsory health cover and a BD1,000 income threshold for sponsoring family members passed Parliament.

The move asks the relevant bodies to require any foreign worker or employer to earn at least BD1,000 a month to bring in, live with or sponsor family members in all cases, and to secure private health insurance for each dependent.

Backers said the higher income bar would ease strain on public services, chiefly health and education, by limiting inflows of lower-income households that lean on subsidised facilities.

MPs propose higher public health fees for expats and visitors

Higher fees for all public health services for non-Bahraini workers and visitors are proposed under an urgent parliamentary motion, with charges to move closer to private-sector rates to improve spending, better aim subsidies and keep the health budget steady.

The motion is submitted by MPs Khalid Buanaq, Ahmed Al Salloom, Zainab AbdulAmeer, Eman Shuwaiter and Hisham Al Awadhi.

They say the state carries a

heavy bill for providing services to non-Bahrainis at nominal prices and call for a review so funds are steered to national priorities and the quality of care for citizens is maintained.

In their explanatory note, the MPs say today's low fees draw residents and visitors to gov-

ernment hospitals instead of private providers, leading to crowding that slows service and weakens performance.

Higher charges, they argue, would ease the load on public facilities and push some demand towards the private sector, giving a better balance in how services are delivered and helping day-to-day operations.

They add that current prices do not match the real cost of treatment.

Pegging fees nearer to market rates would, in their view, support the finances of public hospitals and allow upgrades to health infrastructure for the

benefit of citizens and residents.

Revenue

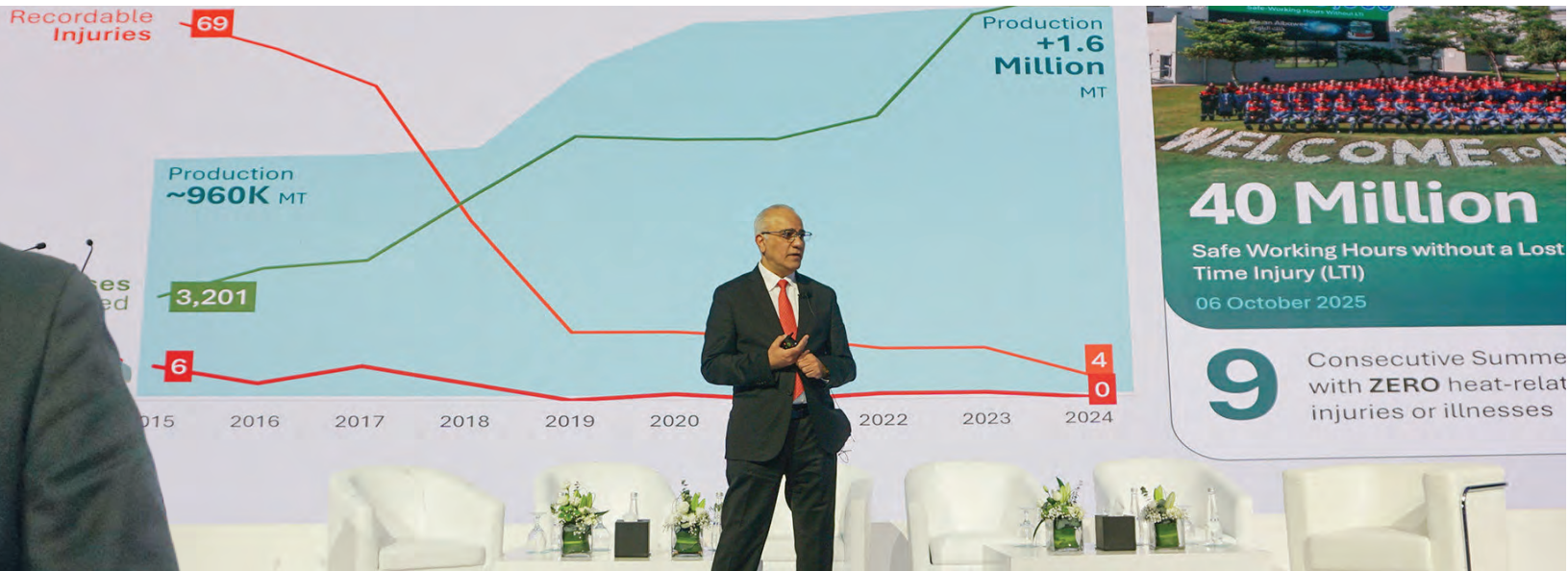
The MPs also say increased revenue would let the Health Ministry shift money towards prevention and priority programmes.

The proposal is marked urgent because of its direct bearing on public spending and the state budget.

The sponsors describe the plan as a balanced step aimed at fair use of health services, keeping standards for Bahrainis while preserving residents' access on prices they consider more realistic.

Alba makes history as first Aluminium smelter to earn BSC 5-star rating

Indonesia’s economic growth slows in third quarter

Indonesia’s economy expanded more slowly in the third quarter following nationwide protests over economic inequality and weakening house-

hold consumption, according to official data released yesterday. Southeast Asia’s largest economy expanded 5.04 percent between July and September, faster than the 4.95 percent growth in the same period last

year, but slightly lower than the 5.12 percent expansion in the second quarter, according to Statistics Indonesia, the country’s statistics agency. Indonesia’s economic growth was primarily supported by

household consumption, which makes up more than half of the country’s economic growth, Statistics Indonesia senior official Mohammad Edy Mahmud told a news conference. However, household consumption growth of

4.89 percent in the third quarter was slower than the same period last year. Finance Minister Purbaya Yudhi Sadewa said Monday he remained optimistic that Indonesia would meet the target of

5.2 percent growth by the end of 2025, despite the impact of the protests. Exports however showed significant growth, expanding 9.91 percent in the third quarter despite the general slowdown.

Hong Kong arrests 80 in one of its biggest crypto frauds

Hong Kong police said Wednesday they have arrested dozens of suspects in connection with one of the city’s largest crypto fraud cases, the HK\$1.6 billion (\$206 million) JPX cryptocurrency exchange scandal.

Police have been investigating JPX since September 2023 after the city’s securities regulator accused the platform of “suspicious” activities and promoting its products without a licence.

Since then, 80 individuals

have been arrested, with 16 already charged over offences including “conspiracy to defraud”, police said Wednesday, adding that the rest remain under investigation.

It was the largest fraud scheme in Hong Kong in recent years, in terms of both the number of victims and the amount of losses incurred, police told a media briefing.

They added it was the first prosecution for fraudulently inducing others to invest in virtual assets since Hong Kong introduced the legislation in 2023. Police described the case

as “very complex” and identified at least 14 individuals as core members.

More than 2,700 reports related to the case have been received by the police, with the total amount involved reaching HK\$1.6 billion (\$206 million).

They had also frozen assets worth more than HK\$200 million from the suspects. Chief Superintendent Ernest Wong said police “will continue our investigation” and “cannot eliminate the chance that we will prosecute or further arrest more people in the future” when asked by AFP.

Germany announces 18 arrests in global fake subscription scams

Frankfurt, Germany

Eighteen suspects have been arrested in a crackdown on three international credit card fraud and money laundering rings, German authorities announced yesterday.

The networks made fraudulent charges for online subscriptions at bogus websites, causing more than 300 million euros (about \$345 million) in damages, according to Germany’s Federal Criminal Police (BKA) and public prosecutors in the western German city of Koblenz.

Some employees at four major German payment providers are accused of collaborating with the fraud rings to facilitate the illegal transactions,

“thereby compromising a portion of the German financial system,” Koblenz prosecutor Harald Kruse told reporters on Wednesday.

The phony websites were professionally designed to appear as pornography, video streaming and dating services, with 19 million subscriptions created.

Fraudulent charges were made on about 4.3 million bank cards from 193 different countries, authorities said.

“I’ve just been told that North Korea is among these countries,” Kruse said to underscore the scope of the fraud. “I didn’t even know they had credit cards there, I must honestly admit.”

Wall Street stocks steady after positive jobs data

● US private sector employment jumped by 42,000 in October

Wall Street stocks steadied on Wednesday after better-than-expected jobs data soothed concerns about the US economy.

However Asia’s main markets fell sharply, as did Wall Street’s tech-heavy Nasdaq Composite index on Tuesday, on fears about AI bubble following a rally that has propelled valuations to record highs.

US private sector employment jumped by 42,000 in October, ADP said, rebounding from a loss of 29,000 jobs in September, nearly double the amount forecasted by economists surveyed by Dow Jones Newswires and The Wall Street Journal.

The ADP figures are likely to attract renewed attention as it is one of few economic indicators released in recent weeks and will feed into investor’s perceptions of whether the US Federal Reserve will cut interest rates again in December.

Wall Street’s main indices opened broadly flat.

The so-called Magnificent Seven tech stocks remained under pressure, with both Amazon and Apple down around 1%.

Briefing.com analyst Patrick O’Hare said real valuation concerns would not be dispelled by a single day of losses, and that it would become clear during Wednesday if investors were still in the “buy-the-dip” philosophy that helped markets reach record highs.

He pointed to semiconductor manufacturer AMD, which looks

to become a major player in AI chips, and which turned in better-than-expected third-quarter results.

“Advanced Micro Devices (AMD) may be the tell on whether that approach will shine yet again or lose some of its luster,” said O’Hare.

Shares in AMD fell by 2.7% at the start of trading.

“If AMD can fight back, chances are other growth stocks will follow,” said O’Hare.

Global stock markets have

soared this year as an eye-watering flood of cash piled into companies linked to artificial intelligence, including US titans Nvidia, Amazon and Apple as well as Asian firms Samsung and Alibaba.

But despite recent strong earnings, traders have started questioning the wisdom of chasing ever-higher prices, with cash mostly funnelled into a handful of big-name companies.

Sentiment was hit also by the US government shutdown, which Wednesday became the longest ever, topping the 35-day record set during President Donald Trump’s first term in office. His administration warned of holiday air-travel chaos and threatened Americans’ benefits in a bid to force a resolution.

A total 1.4 million federal workers, from air-traffic controllers to park wardens, are on enforced leave or working without pay.

“As well as valuation fears, the US is grappling with a nation in shutdown,” noted Emma Wall, chief investment strategist at Hargreaves Lansdown.

“The US is nearing peak travel period, with Thanksgiving later this month. Listed airlines are likely to see share prices fall should flights be cancelled en masse.”

◆ **A right-wing** Israeli government minister urged New York's Jewish residents yesterday to move to Israel following Zohran Mamdani's victory in the city's mayoral election, branding the leftist Democrat a "Hamas supporter". Mamdani, 34, will become the city's first Muslim mayor when he takes office in January. A long-standing supporter of the Palestinian cause, he has also made a point of vocally denouncing antisemitism in recent months -- as well as the Islamophobia he himself has suffered. "The city that once stood as a symbol of global freedom has handed over its keys to a Hamas supporter," Israel's right-wing Minister of Diaspora and Combating Antisemitism Amichai Chikli wrote on X. "New York will never be the same again, especially not for its Jewish community," he added. "I invite the Jews of New York to seriously consider making their new home in the Land of Israel."

◆ US President Donald Trump will host Syrian leader Ahmed al-Sharaa for talks on November 10, the White House announced Tuesday, saying the former jihadist had made "good progress" toward establishing peace in his war-torn country. "I can confirm that that meeting will be taking place here at the White House on Monday and this is part of the president's efforts in diplomacy to meet with anyone around the world in the pursuit of peace," spokeswoman Karoline Leavitt told a briefing. It will be the first-ever White House visit by a Syrian head of state. Leavitt noted that Trump had announced the lifting of US sanctions on Syria during a trip to the region in May, a move which aimed "to give them a real chance at peace." "And I think the administration, we've seen good progress on that front, under their new leadership," she added.

◆ The Colombian survivor of a US attack on a suspected narco submarine in the Caribbean was released without charge after being treated for his injuries, authorities told AFP on Tuesday. On October 18, the 34-year-old was repatriated to Colombia in critical condition after the submarine he was traveling in was bombed. President Donald Trump claimed, without providing proof, that the vessel was loaded with fentanyl and other drugs. Two people onboard were killed and two others -- the Colombian and an Ecuadorian national -- were detained and handed over to their countries. The Colombian survivor was admitted to a Bogota hospital suffering from brain trauma.

Putin says Russia considers resuming nuclear tests after Trump comments

Russian President Vladimir Putin said yesterday that Russia would consider resuming nuclear tests if the United States did so, convening a security council meeting after US President Donald Trump's comments on testing. The statement marks the latest episode of nuclear sabre-rattling between the world's two largest atomic powers, after Putin and Trump failed to find ways to resolve the Ukraine conflict. Putin ordered Russia's defence and foreign ministries, as well as security services, to "gather information on this topic" and make "proposals on the possible start of preparation works for nuclear weapons tests". Russia has not conducted a nuclear test since 1990, the year before the collapse of the USSR. Trump said on social media last week that he had instructed the Pentagon to "start

testing our Nuclear Weapons on an equal basis" with Russia and China. It was unclear whether he was referring to tests involving nuclear warheads or not. During the security council meeting, Putin was responding to Russian Defence Minister Andrei Belousov, who suggested to "begin immediate preparations" for nuclear testing in the Arctic archipelago Novaya Zemlya. The Russian leader has repeatedly said that if Washington carries out a nuclear test Moscow will do the same. In October, Putin oversaw two tests of nuclear-capable weapons, which excluded atomic warheads. Trump has been trying to end fighting between Russia and Ukraine since he returned to the White House in January. Talks have yielded no progress however, and he has shown increasing frustration with Putin, who has rejected multiple calls for a ceasefire.

At least 9 dead after cargo plane crashes near Louisville airport

The death toll from a UPS cargo plane crashing in Louisville has risen to nine with more fatalities feared, Kentucky's governor said yesterday, as search efforts continued and the airport resumed flights. The McDonnell Douglas MD-11 departing for Hawaii crashed at around 5:15 pm (2215 GMT) Tuesday, shortly after taking off from Louisville Muhammad Ali International Airport. It exploded into flames as it

plowed into businesses adjacent to the airport. Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear called the tragedy "heartbreaking" and "unimaginable." "The number of those lost has now risen to at least 9, with the possibility of more," he posted on X. "Right now these families need prayers, love and support." Beshear said in a prior post that 16 different families had reported loved ones unaccounted for. "A significant search and rescue mission was underway overnight, which is continuing this morning," he said. UPS said in a statement that three crew members were on board the aircraft, adding that "we have not confirmed any injuries/casualties." Tuesday's crash reportedly was the deadliest in the global package delivery giant's history. Its main hub, Worldport, is in Louisville, where it employs thousands of people. UPS has halted package sorting operations at their facility.

Video shared by local broadcaster WLKY showed the aircraft's left engine on fire as it tried to lift off. By early Wednesday, Louisville Mayor Craig Greenberg said on X that aviation officials had reopened the runway. A spokesman for the airport, Jonathan Bevin, said the cargo flight "went down three miles (five kilometers) south of the airfield" after taking off. UPS travels to more than 200 countries via nearly 2,000 daily flights, with a fleet of 516 aircraft. It owns 294 of those planes and hires the rest through short-term leases or charters. Aerial footage of the crash site showed a long trail of debris as firefighters blasted water on the flames, with smoke billowing from the area. Beshear said the aircraft hit a petroleum recycling facility "pretty directly." The cause of the crash was under investigation by the Federal Aviation Administration and the National Transportation Safety Board.

The crash comes amid the longest government shutdowns in US history. Earlier Tuesday, Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy warned of "mass chaos" due to a lack of air traffic control staff. "You'll see mass cancellations, and you may see us close certain parts of the airspace, because we just cannot manage it because we don't have the air traffic controllers," Duffy told reporters.

Trump blasts Democrats as government shutdown becomes longest ever

US President Donald Trump accused "kamikaze" Democrats of being prepared to destroy the country as the government shutdown became the longest in history on Wednesday, eclipsing the 35-day record set during the Republican leader's first term. Federal agencies have been grinding to a halt since Congress failed to approve funding past September 30, and the pain has been mounting as welfare programs -- including aid that helps millions of Americans afford gro-

ceries -- hang in the balance. Some 1.4 million federal workers, from air traffic controllers to park wardens, remain on enforced leave or are working without pay. Some courts are using emergency funds to stay open, and warning that operations could slow if the shutdown drags on. "I just got back from Japan," the Republican president told a breakfast meeting with Republican senators at the White House as the shutdown entered its sixth week. "I talked about the kamikaze pilots. I think these guys

are kamikaze," he said, referencing Democrats. "They'll take down the country if they have to." Hours before the shutdown record toppled at midnight, the Trump administration sounded the alarm over turmoil at airports nationwide if the crisis drags further into November, with worsening staff shortages snarling airports and closing down sections of airspace. "So if you bring

us to a week from today, Democrats, you will see mass chaos...you will see mass flight delays," Transportation Secretary Sean Duffy told a news conference in Philadelphia. "You'll see mass cancellations, and you may see us close certain parts of the airspace, because we just cannot manage it because we don't have the air traffic controllers."

Man arrested after groping Mexican president

A man has been arrested for allegedly groping and trying to kiss Mexican President Claudia Sheinbaum as she greeted supporters in the country's capital.

The incident occurred Tuesday as Sheinbaum walked to an event near the presidential palace, shaking hands and taking pictures with people along the way, videos on social media showed.

The man approached Sheinbaum, put his arm around her shoulder, and with the other

hand touched her hip and chest, while attempting to kiss her neck.

A member of the presidential security detail pulled away the man, who appeared to be under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

Despite his behavior, Sheinbaum treated the man politely, agreeing to take a picture with him, then patting him on the back.

Security authorities later reported that the man had been arrested.

The head of Mexico's Ministry of Women -- a department

created by Sheinbaum -- commented on incident.

"We condemn the act that our president experienced today," Minister Citlali Hernandez said in a post on X that also slammed what she called macho attitudes that normalize unwelcome intrusions on women's personal space and bodies.

The events highlight a latent problem in Mexico. Some 70 percent of Mexican women aged 15 and over experience at least one incident of sexual harassment in their lives, according to data from UN Women.

UK police manhunt after new man wrongly freed from jail

British police said yesterday they had launched a manhunt for a prisoner mistakenly released from jail, angering parliamentarians at the latest mix-up committed by the UK's beleaguered prison system.

London's Metropolitan Police force said in a statement it was looking for a 24-year-old Algerian man after he was released in error a week ago.

"Officers are carrying out urgent enquiries in an effort to locate him and return him to custody," a spokesperson said.

Justice Minister David Lammy said he was "appalled" by the mistake.

"My officials have been working through the night to take him back to prison," he said in a statement.

The Met spokesperson said the force was informed Tuesday that the man had been mistakenly let out of Wandsworth prison in southwest London on Wednesday, October 29.

The error deals further embarrassment to Prime Minister Keir Starmer's struggling cen-

tre-left Labour government, which polls show is currently deeply unpopular with the British public.

Just last month, Hadush Kebatu, an Ethiopian asylum seeker convicted of sexually assaulting a teenage girl and a woman, was mistakenly released from prison before being recaptured following a 48-hour manhunt.

The UK government then forcibly deported Kebatu, giving

him £500 (\$661) to leave the country, and launched an independent investigation into his accidental release.

Figures showed 262 people were mistakenly freed from prison between March 2024 and March 2025, up from 115 in the 21 months previously.

Kebatu's arrest earlier this year in Epping, northeast of London, triggered weeks of demonstrations targeting hotels where asylum seekers were believed to be housed.

AFP understands that the Algerian man released last Wednesday is not an asylum seeker.

Starmer, prime minister since July 2024, is coming under fire on multiple fronts over immigration as the hard-right Reform UK party led by firebrand Nigel Farage surges in popularity.

The premier's official spokesman said the latest accidental release was "utterly unacceptable", but suggested the previous Conservative government was partly to blame for leaving behind a "chaotic" and overcrowded prison system.

Between Love and the Ledger!

MPs are the mouthpiece of every society. Across the world — regardless of political systems — they speak known sense and new sense. Yet they're often criticised for exactly what we expect them to do: talk boldly, take risks, and shake up the status quo.

Bahrain is no different. In fact, some of the recent fast-tracked initiatives by Bahraini MPs deserve loud applause. Sign-language interpreters for deaf students, the ratification of the new media law, and the push for dash cameras to enhance children's safety are just a few progressive steps taken with courage and clarity.

Now comes a fresh debate — the family visa rule. The proposed BD 1,000 minimum income requirement for expatriate family sponsorship has been passed, based on the belief that this amount is sufficient to cover the average expatriate's rent, education, medical costs, and basic living expenses.

As someone who has called Bahrain home for over 31 years — longer than I've lived in India — I can say this country is more than just a workplace. It embraces you. The love, respect, and fairness that Bahrain extends to its expatriate community are rare anywhere else in the world.

The happiness index here is high, not because Bahrain is the easiest place to make money, but because it's the best place to live peacefully and happily. There's no discrimination, no racial divide, and no second-class treatment. I've travelled widely, but few nations treat expatriates with such warmth and dignity.

Still, does the new BD 1,000 rule truly help the economy? If an employee earning BD 900 can't bring his family, he won't necessarily leave — he'll simply downsize. That means fewer tenants for real estate owners, less grocery shopping, smaller school enrollments, and reduced spending. In short, less money stays in Bahrain and more is remitted abroad.

Consider also the mid-income worker who wants his family nearby. A rule that separates them could lower morale and productivity. Replace such people with lower-skilled workers, and the economy may lose more than it gains.

Meanwhile, mandatory health insurance is a wise and overdue reform. Perhaps it could first apply to those sponsoring families — helping them manage unexpected health expenses while easing the broader transition.

Policy, after all, works best when it balances national interest with human compassion. Bahrain's success story rests on coexistence and mutual respect. Let's not fix what isn't broken — let's fine-tune it, sensibly, and with the same Bahraini spirit that makes this island a pleasant home.

Why Do So Many Drive With Full Beams On?

Anyone who regularly drives around Bahrain after dark will recognise this problem instantly - dazzling headlights blazing in their face, even on well-lit streets. Far too many drivers keep their full beams on as though every road were a desert highway with no one else around. It's frustrating, uncomfortable, and at times, genuinely dangerous.

What's puzzling is that this behaviour isn't confined to remote areas or unlit highways. It happens on city roads, in neighbourhoods, and even at traffic lights. Those few seconds of glare can blind oncoming drivers, distort their sense of distance, and in some cases, cause near misses. Night driving already demands extra focus; add an unexpected flash of high beams, and concentration quickly turns to stress.

Some of this may come down to lack of awareness - many motorists simply don't realise how bright their headlights are, especially with the newer LED and xenon bulbs that cut through the night like searchlights. Others, however, seem indifferent to how their lights affect others. Either way, this is not a small issue. It's one that touches every driver, every evening, across the Kingdom.

Perhaps it's time to treat the problem with the seriousness it deserves. Authorities and driving schools could launch campaigns reminding drivers when to dim their lights and why it matters. Police could also issue gentle warnings or fines where needed. It would not take much effort - just a reminder that courtesy on the road is as vital as obeying a traffic signal.

Driving safely isn't only about speed limits or seatbelts. It's also about awareness, empathy, and a bit of patience. A brief flick of the switch to low beam when another vehicle approaches might not seem much, but it's one of the simplest acts of road respect we can show.

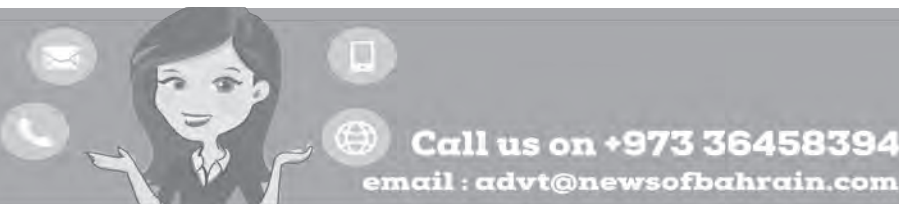

Bahrain Super Cup tips off tonight

Muharraq and Manama Renew Rivalry in Basketball's Season Opener

Bahrain's basketball spotlight turns to Um Al Hassam this evening as Muharraq and Manama face off in the 2025 Bahrain Super Cup, the traditional curtain-raiser to the new national season. Tip-off is set for 7pm at the Bahrain Basketball Association (BBA) Arena, where fans are expected to pack the stands for a matchup that has long defined the local game.

The Super Cup, held annually to mark the start of the campaign, brings together the champions of the Zain Bahrain

Basketball League and the previous season's Khalifa bin Salman Cup finalists. Muharraq enter the contest in familiar territory as double title-holders, having defeated Manama to claim both trophies in a dominant 2024-25 campaign. That success adds extra edge to tonight's encounter, with Manama eager to respond and set the tone early.

The matchup also reignites one of Bahraini basketball's great rivalries — a fixture steeped in history and competitive balance. Since the Super Cup's inception in 2009, the two clubs have taken turns at the top, with momentum shifting between them.

Manama enjoyed a sustained run of success from 2013 to 2018 before Muharraq reclaimed the crown in 2019. The competition has since become the symbolic launchpad of the season, often offering a glimpse of which side might seize the initiative in the months ahead. Both teams enter with fresh storylines. Peter Schomers' Muharraq are coming off a tough loss to Shabab Al Ahli in the 2025-26 FIBA West Asia Super League and remain winless in the competition, giving them extra incentive to make a statement in tonight's Super Cup match. Manama, meanwhile, have brought back

Salman Ramadan as head coach and will rely on a mix of seasoned campaigners, including Ahmed Salman, Mohammed BuAli, Hassan Nooroz, Sabah Hussein and Ali Jaber, along with young players expected to make their mark this season.

The atmosphere tonight is expected to be electric. The BBA has announced that spectators will be allowed to enjoy food and drinks inside the arena for the first time in several years, a move warmly welcomed by fans. The excitement mirrors the sense of renewal surrounding the season, as both clubs look to stake their claim in front
