

Kuwaitis go to polls **Reuters** | Kuwait

∕uwaitis voted in legis-Klative polls yesterday. More than 300 candidates, including 29 women, are vying for 50 seats in the Gulf's oldest assembly with legislative powers.

Campaigning took place mostly on social media and local TV channels due to COVID-19 restrictions.

The current government is due to resign after the elections.

Sheikh Nawaf al-Ahmad al-Sabah took the reins as emir in September following the death of his brother.

vessel was attacked off Athe coast of war-torn Yemen, a UK-based maritime organisation said yesterday days after an explosion rocked an oil tanker docked at a Saudi port.

The United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations (UKMTO), citing reports from ships in the vicinity, said it was aware of an attack late Friday against a merchant vessel, without giving further details.

It later released a statement the incident was over.
