**Labour Minister tells MPs parallel Bahrainisation scheme 'raised compliance to 52 per cent'**

## Ensuring quality jobs for qualified Bahraini workers

Labour Minister, His Excellency Yousef Khalaf, told MPs yesterday that the "parallel Bahrainisation" scheme had lifted compliance with Bahrainisation ratios from 38 per cent before the parallel fee was introduced to 52 per cent now, a rise he put at about 14 per cent.

Replying during the sitting to MP Mohammed Salman Al Ahmed, H.E. Khalaf said the ministry had supplied figures up to October 2025 and could send updated numbers once the year's data were closed.

Asked about the value of the system, and whether the Ministry of Labour and the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) review it, he said the scheme was reviewed like other government systems, with checks on its efficiency, its use-

fulness, and its role in meeting the aims it was created for.

## Figures

He said the figures since the system began in May 2016 backed a positive verdict.

The main aim, he told MPs, was to strengthen the preference for Bahrainis in the labour market and to treat Bahrainis as the first choice for jobs.

He said the scheme sat alongside other initiatives, tools and policies being studied and put into place for the same aim.

## Work

In the same sitting, responding to MP Hassan Ebrahim, Khalaf spoke about work carried out since a directive by His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, to ensure three job opportunities were offered to each jobseeker registered with the ministry by the end of 2025.

H.E. Khalaf said reducing the number of jobseekers to zero was something the ministry hoped for, but that hiring was a running process because new entrants kept joining the labour

market as others found work.

He said that, during the period linked to the directive, the Cabinet on Monday announced the employment of 4,746 people, while 4,485 new jobseekers registered with the ministry over the same stretch of time.

## Claims

H.E. Khalaf dismissed claims that the ministry forced employers to list vacancies, saying it increased outreach and asked for help but did not compel it.

Some employers offered jobs of their own will, he said, while a ministry marketing team worked to feed vacancies into the national employment platform.

He added that the ministry had no way to force cooperation when an employer did not wish to take part.

The Minister also said measures had been taken to deal with disputes over jobseekers being recorded as refusing work.

## Refuser

He said employers could no longer register a jobseeker as a refuser, and the power once held by an employment adviser to mark a jobseeker as "non-cooperative" had also been removed.

H.E. Khalaf said jobseekers had the right to appeal any decision issued by the ministry, including suspending unemployment benefit, ending entitlement, or recording someone as refusing an opportunity.

An appeals committee heard such cases, he said, and statistics showed many people who appealed provided evidence and had their cases decided by the committee on an impartial basis.

As 2026 sharpens the realities of a multipolar world shaped by rapid technological change and climate pressures, the United Kingdom argues that diplomacy and a renewed commitment to rules-based cooperation are becoming more critical than ever to global stability. In conversation with Mahir Haneef, His Excellency Mr. Alastair Long, British Ambassador to Bahrain, outlines why responsible use of technology, sustained investment in human skills, and respect for international rules are essential to ensuring progress remains inclusive, sustainable, and shared.

The world is changing rapidly. I would cite three changes in particular. First, the most rapid advancement ever seen of in both technological development and access to that technology. Second, the continuing climatic changes to our planet with their destructive consequences. Third, the emergence of a multi-polar world. All three invite humanity to embrace the opportunity that they might present - tech enablement of inclusive and sustainable growth and prosperity - but come with major risks and challenges. Navigating these and trying to pick the pathways for human progress is the role of diplomacy.

In the UK - a top ten global economy, the global financial centre, and global leader in green transition - we would welcome a distributed global economy in which wealth, prosperity and opportunity is more evenly shared, but we continue to underline the essential need for a rules-based system to underpin that. It is no secret that this is under threat. People, mistakenly in my view, blame the institutions and rules devel-

oped in the post war years, criticising the UN, WTO, Geneva Conventions etc. But those institutions are only as good as their members, treaties only effective if implemented. Were they to be removed we would need to reinvent them. They should be our guarantee that we never repeat the dark episodes of the past. They should enable every UN nation, regardless of size or strength, to live free of fear and thrive. A world in which growth and prosperity is more evenly spread and shared is within reach. The progress in eliminating poverty in the last few decades has been remarkable. But in 2026 we need to recommit to the rules.

My top tip (risky as this is) for 2026 is don't expect A.I. to take over but do start using it or you will be left behind. I expect it not to curtail human attainment but let us rise to new levels of endeavour, creativity, and collaboration. But we shouldn't lose the old skills. Perhaps it shows my age, but I still feel we need to invest in literacy, numeracy, and the arts. Not least for our mental wellbeing.

# Unified system

## Parliament passes GCC land transport law to increase volume of trade exchange

Parliament approved Decree-Law No. 35 of 2025 yesterday, bringing Bahrain into the GCC's unified system for international land transport and laying down how it will work in the Kingdom.

MP Ahmed Al Salloom backed the move in the chamber, saying: "We certainly support the decree-law, out of our desire for the Kingdom of Bahrain to meet its regional obligations and to put into effect what the GCC Supreme Council approved at its 43rd session, by adopting the unified system for international land transport as a mandatory framework."

He pressed for clearer detail on what it could deliver for commerce, telling ministers: "I would like to understand more about what opportunities this system will add in order to increase the volume of trade exchange."

Jobs

He also asked if it could "create job opportunities for citizens through the transport of goods and people between GCC states."

MP Jalal Kadhem said the change would reach beyond paperwork and into household incomes.

"The unified land transport law between GCC states affects

and for rules that stop abuse on the ground.

The decree-law approves the Unified System (Law) for International Land Transport between GCC states, adopted by the GCC Supreme Council at its 43rd session.

**Referral**

A parliamentary committee reviewing the referral said the decree-law was sound under the Constitution and recommended it be passed.

The six-article decree-law adopts the attached unified system and defines the "competent authority" as the government body to be named by decree.

For the system's purposes, it sets the Bahraini dinar at ten Saudi riyals.

It also sets a way to appeal decisions issued under the system, its executive regulations, and decisions made under them.

**Notification**

Any affected party has 30 days from notification to file a grievance with the competent authority, either by registered letter with acknowledgement of receipt or by electronic means.

A decision must be issued within 30 days; if the grievance is rejected, reasons must be given, and if there is no reply it is treated as refused.

A further 30 days is allowed to challenge the refusal before the competent court.

## Committee to look into employment vacancies and unemployment allowance

The Council of Representatives has formed a parliamentary investigation committee to examine employment vacancies listed in the Ministry of Labour's records, as well as the procedures for closing job-seeker files and suspending the unemployment allowance.

The decision was approved during the Council's 12th ordinary session of the fourth annual term of the sixth legislative chapter, held on Tuesday, 30 December 2025.

The committee will be chaired by MP Jalila Alawi Al-Sayed, with MP Mahmoud Mirza Fardan serving as Deputy Chair.

Members include MPs Abdulwahid Abdulaziz Qarata, Munir Ibrahim Sarour, and Mohsen Ali Al-Asbol.

Mandate

The committee's mandate focuses on verifying the number of job vacancies recorded by the Ministry of Labour and the procedures taken to fill them.

It will also examine the Ministry's mechanisms for closing job-seeker files and the processes governing the suspension of the unemployment allowance.

Public employee,

The High Criminal Court has begun hearing a bribery case involving a public employee and a businessman accused of exchanging money to speed up official transactions during 2023.

The court has adjourned the case to 12 January to allow the defence to review the case files.

According to the Public Prosecution, the first defendant allegedly accepted a bribe in return for abusing his position to facilitate procedures outside his official authority.

Transactions

Prosecutors said the second defendant, a businessman, is accused of offering and paying the bribe, amounting to BD2,800, in exchange for accelerating transactions.

The prosecution added that investigations found the employee continued to intervene in transactions despite being transferred from his post, citing his prior role and connections.

# Rider restrictions

Parliament backs proposal to bar delivery motorbikes from main roads

Parliament voted yesterday to refer a proposal to the government for review that would ban delivery motorbikes from Bahrain's main roads, backing the measure even after a committee advised against it.

The proposal was submitted by MPs Bader Al Tameemi, Abdulwahid Qarata, Ali Al Doseri, Hamad Al Doy and Abdulla Al Rumaihi.

It calls on the government to stop delivery riders using main routes and to curb traffic breaches linked to the sector.

Evidence

During the sitting, Al Tameemi pointed to impound figures as evidence of the scale of the issue.

"If we speak according to official statistics, more than 1,000 delivery motorbikes were impounded over four years, an average of 250 a year, which means there is a real problem on main roads and secondary roads," he said.

He also cited a recent example from Shaikh Khalifa bin Salman Highway while travelling from Riffa towards Manama.

"This road has five lanes and a delivery rider was in the far-left lane where the lane speed is 120 kilometres an hour, which poses a real danger," he said.

Rejection

The Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee had recommended rejecting the proposal, arguing that many areas cannot be reached without

using main roads.

It said diverting delivery bikes would push pressure onto internal and secondary roads, adding to congestion, and could lead riders and companies to switch to cars for deliveries, increasing vehicle numbers.

MP Mohammed Al Olaiwi said he shared concerns about delivery bikes but questioned the practicality of a ban on main routes.

"The proposal is very important, but preventing delivery riders from main roads is unrealistic because they will move to internal roads," he said.

Penalties

The lawmaker called instead for tougher penalties and a li-

censing system that limits the number of riders per company.

The Ministry of Interior, through the General Directo-

rate of Traffic, set out similar reservations in its comments on the proposal.

It said Bahrain's road network

is built as an interconnected system linking main and secondary roads, junctions and different areas, and argued that a ban would be difficult to apply and would not improve traffic flow.

The directorate said it was already carrying out intensified enforcement against delivery riders who breach the Traffic Law, including impounding motorbikes. It reported that 1,005 delivery motorbikes were impounded from 2022 through February 2025.

It also said it was close to finishing a project to supply 500 smart cameras to record traffic offences and track unsafe driving behaviour, with the aim of strengthening monitoring and improving road safety.

Measures

The committee's rapporteur, MP Dr Maryam Al Dhaen, said the committee remained against the proposal and urged a focus on other measures.

"The solution to the delivery bike problem is to find alternative solutions such as using cars more, or drones," she said.

She also raised a health concern tied to delivery times, warning: "If cooked food is delayed for more than 50 minutes to an hour in delivery, it may spoil, and if that process is delayed it can turn into toxic substances, including salmonella, which can cause food poisoning."

MP Abdulla Al Rumaihi supported the proposal during the sitting, telling MPs his car had been involved in a serious crash linked to a delivery motorbike.

# 33,000 daily bus trips cited as case for two-line Bahrain Metro

Thirty-three thousand bus trips a day is the baseline on Bahrain's public transport network, the Minister of Transportation and Telecommunications, His Excellency Dr Shaikh Abdulla bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, told MPs yesterday.

He also restated plans for a two-line Bahrain Metro running from Bahrain International Airport to Seef and from Juffair to the Educational Area in Isa Town.

"The Bahrain Metro project is still going ahead, God willing, and it is one of the most important projects for the ministry," H.E. Dr Shaikh Abdulla said during the sitting, describing the scheme as central to expanding mass transit.

He linked the case for a metro to current demand on buses, telling Parliament: "The daily trips are 33,000 on normal days, 50,000 at weekends, and in some events 75,000."

MP Lulwa Al Rumaihi, responding to the minister's written answer on the latest updates,

The minister said recent work has focused on confirming the two routes and choosing station sites that serve key residential and commercial areas.

He added that reaching the stations has been treated as a main part of the technical work, carried out with the Ministry of Housing, alongside plans to strengthen feeder services so passengers can get to the metro stops.

H.E. Dr Shaikh Abdulla told MPs the ministry is also working through the remaining steps needed on the two corridors, including land matters and moving services that obstruct preparation of the routes, and asked Parliament to keep backing the project.

welcomed the detail on the first phase and pressed for the next stage to follow without a long wait.

"We hope there will be a second phase, without a long gap after the first, covering all

Under the first phase, the

ministry has presented two main routes with 20 stations in total.

Two interchange stations are planned to link the lines, one at BFH and the other at the Central Market in Manama.



# Key unified platform

## Parliament proposes national online portal on services for people with disabilities

A unified national online platform for people with disabilities has been proposed in Parliament under an urgent request to link services and employment support to the main state bodies involved.

The proposal calls for one on-line portal where people with disabilities can apply for services, track progress and follow up their requests.

It would be linked, within each body's remit, to the Ministry of Labour, the Civil Service Bureau (CSB) and the Ministry of Social Development, and co-ordinated with other relevant bodies, including the health and education authorities and the

Information and eGovernment Authority (iGA).

### Proposal

MP Jaleela Alawi submitted the proposal with MPs Mamdouh Al Saleh, Abdulwahid Qarata, Lulwa Al Rumaihi and Muneer Seroor.

“The idea of the proposal can be summed up as calling for the establishment of a unified national platform concerned with services for persons with disabilities, as well as their employment and rehabilitation,” Alawi said.

She said it should be “a single digital “window” for requesting services and tracking them”, so people are not sent between offices and websites to get basic support.

The proposal says the plat-



form would serve as a national source of information on services for people with disabilities in Bahrain.

It would also handle job search services, including registration

as a jobseeker, matching candidates with suitable vacancies and tracking openings in both the public and private sectors, through links with the Ministry of Labour and the Civil Service

complaints and grievances.

### Obligations

The MPs pointed to Bahrain's obligations under international disability rights agreements, including the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, which Bahrain ratified under Law No. 22 of 2011.

In explaining why it was submitted as urgent, the proposal says the lack of a single platform limits the ability to make data-backed decisions on the needs of people with disabilities, including employment and rehabilitation, and slows access to work because there is no unified pathway linking jobseekers with disabilities to the Ministry of Labour and the Civil Service Bureau.

# Manufacturing output could reach BD632m this year

Bahrain's manufacturing output could reach about BD632 million in 2026, according to estimates published in the Trading Economics database, alongside a wider growth rate for the economy of close to 3 per cent next year.

Trading Economics' published estimates, based on global sta-

tistical and economic analysis, point to moderate growth in factory activity in 2026 if supportive policies continue and the industrial investment climate improves.

The platform's research-based projections link the expected pace of growth to expanding non-oil activity and continued investment in aluminium, petrochemicals and higher value-added manufacturing, with ongoing

work on industrial infrastructure.

Separate official data show the non-oil economy remains the main driver.

### GDP

Figures from the Ministry of Finance and National Economy and the Information and eGovernment Authority (iGA) put real GDP growth at about 2.5 per cent in the second quarter of

2025 compared with the same period in 2024, with non-oil activity up by around 3.5 per cent at constant prices.

In its second-quarter 2025 economic report, the government said non-oil activities accounted for more than 85 per cent of total GDP, in a sign of continued progress in widening the economic base and reducing reliance on oil as a key source of growth.

Within the non-oil econo-

my, manufacturing remained a major part of output.

### Output

At constant prices, manufacturing output was about BD543.70 million in the second quarter of 2025, compared with roughly BD535.21 million in the first quarter of the same year, according to the data.

Sector figures indicate manufacturing contributes roughly a fifth of GDP, supporting non-oil

growth and jobs.

The figures sit alongside policy steps aimed at backing local industry in recent years, including customs exemptions for key raw materials used by industrial units, work to support industrial value chains, and efforts to expand the use of technology and digital systems.

### Exports

The direction also matches the National Industrial Strategy for 2022–2026, which focuses on raising industrial exports, increasing value added, improving the competitiveness of locally made products, and creating higher-quality jobs in higher-value manufacturing.

The data and estimates come against a backdrop of cost pressures and competition affecting manufacturing at points during 2025, though the overall impact is described as limited compared with some service sectors.

# Parliament votes to add public bodies' surpluses to state budget

## Bill moves to Shura for review

Parliament yesterday passed a draft law that would pull year-end budget surpluses from all public authorities and public institutions into the state budget.

The law also requires that at least half of the net profits due to the state from Mumtalakat and Bapco Energies be included, despite government calls urging MPs to reconsider.

In its amended form, the draft says “the surpluses of the budgets of all public authorities and public institutions” must be included in the state budget, with no carve-outs.

It also says the budget must include “a percentage of not



less than 50%” of the net profits accruing to the state from Mumtalakat Holding Company and Bapco Energies, after the statutory reserve has been set aside.

MP Zainab AbdulAmeer argued in the chamber that the change would tie state-owned company returns more clearly to public finances.

“We are living through an unusual time,” she said, linking the debate to calls for reforms and pressure tied to credit ratings.

“The Bahraini today is the one paying the bill for public debt.”

She also questioned why state-owned firms, could lean on public funds when they hit trouble but keep profits at arm's length from the budget in better years.

### Proposal

The government urged MPs to reconsider, saying much of what the proposal sought was already covered by existing law and practice.

It also warned that pulling all public bodies' surpluses into the state budget could add costs if the budget became responsible for the spending, losses, or debts of bodies that now run under their own financial systems.

After passage in the Council of Representatives, the bill now moves to the next stages, including review in the Shura Council, before it can be ratified and published.



# Commute costs

Urgent call to raise civil service transport allowance for government employees

An urgent request to raise transport allowances for government employees has been submitted to Parliament after MPs said recent fuel price rises have pushed up the daily cost of getting to work.

The proposal, lodged under the urgent track, was signed by Mohammed Janahi, Ahmed Sabah Salloom, Hanan Fardan, First Deputy Speaker AbdulNabi Salman and Ahmed Abdulwahid Qarata.

## Gap

“Fuel costs have risen while the allowance has stayed still, and staff are covering that gap from their own pockets,” Janahi said.

The MPs argue the allowance no longer matches real commuting costs for many staff who rely on private cars.

They drew attention in par-

ticular to Jayyid fuel, which they said has risen by about 57 per cent, adding to daily spending for employees travelling to and from their workplaces.

The memo says the current allowance has lost buying power and no longer covers even basic travel costs for a wide group of government workers.

## Costs

“We are asking for a rise that brings the allowance closer to real travel costs, especially for those who have no choice but to drive to work each day,” Janahi said.

The MPs asked for the request to be treated as urgent on the

grounds that the impact of higher fuel prices is being felt now, day after day, without a suitable way to make up the added burden through the existing allowance.

# A strategic partnership for cybersecurity modernisation

● Transition towards quantum-safe economy

The The National Cyber Security Center of the Kingdom of Bahrain and SandboxAQ, a global leader in AI-driven cybersecurity and cryptographic management, yesterday announced a landmark partnership, aimed at establishing a nationwide cybersecurity modernisation framework.

The partnership marks one of the world's first large-scale commitments to transitioning towards a quantum-safe economy.

As a founding member of the UNICC AI Hub on Post-Quantum Cryptography (PQC), SandboxAQ will support Bahrain in securing sovereign data, critical infrastructure and sensitive government and private-sector systems against rapidly evolving cyber, cryptographic, and quantum computing threats.

The announcement comes as governments worldwide

prepare for “Q-Day”, the point when cryptographically relevant quantum computers (CRQCs) will be capable of breaking today's widely used encryption.

While experts now estimate CRQCs to be feasible by as early as 2029, the threat is already present through “harvest-now, decrypt-later” attacks, where adversaries steal encrypted data today with plans to decrypt it once quantum capabilities mature.

For governments, this includes classified communications and diplomatic cables.

# Oil prices gain as equities extend record run higher

Oil prices climbed and stock markets hit new heights Tuesday as investors tracked developments surrounding crude-rich Venezuela as well as the outlook for the global economy.

The United Nations voiced deep concern over the dramatic US operation in Venezuela, warning that it clearly "undermined a fundamental principle of international law".

"States must not threaten or use force against the territorial integrity or political independence of any state," Ravina Shamdasani, spokeswoman for the UN rights office, told reporters in Geneva.

Oil prices have experienced choppy trading since the surprise US raid Saturday on Caracas that saw Venezuelan president Nicolas Maduro and his wife taken to New York.

would be hamstrung by several issues including its creaking infrastructure, low prices and political uncertainty.

"With the country pumping less than 1% of the world's oil after years of underinvestment, any major near-term disruption looks more bark than bite," Matt Britzman, senior equity analyst at Hargreaves Lansdown, said Tuesday.

Brushing off geopolitical concerns, some major stock mar-

kets have begun the new year with all-time highs, having already smashed records in 2025.

Seoul rose more than 1% Tuesday to top 4,500 points for the first time, helped by another strong rally in chip giant SK hynix.

That came after the Dow ended at a record high Monday on Wall Street, boosted by a rally of technology titans Amazon and Meta.

London's benchmark FTSE

100 index reached a new high Tuesday above 10,000 points, with investors expecting more cuts to British interest rates to bolster growth in 2026.

"Global equities are likely to keep looking through the geopolitical shock unless it threatens the broader supply chain or tightens financial conditions, because geopolitics has become a persistent feature rather than a surprise," said Charu Chanana, chief investment strategist at Saxo Markets.

"Equities can continue grinding higher if earnings expectations, liquidity, and rate expectations remain supportive, especially in tech," she added.

Shares in Nvidia climbed 1.1% after the world's most valuable company unveiled its latest AI platform the previous evening.

Wall Street opened mixed, with the Dow dipping from its record close, but quickly stabilising.

Traders are awaiting key US jobs data due Friday for clues on the outlook for interest rates.

The Federal Reserve is expected to keep cutting American borrowing costs this year, but how many times remains unclear.

## US Fed governor Miran says rates should fall over 1%-point in 2026

US Federal Reserve Governor Stephen Miran said yesterday he saw the need for a significant drop in interest rates in 2026, advocating for a larger decline than the central bank has so far signaled.

"The unemployment rate has been very gradually and slowly creeping up," Miran said in an interview with Fox Business, arguing that despite some policymakers' worries about inflation, underlying levels are close to the Fed's long-term two-percent target.

"I think we've got to cut more than 100 basis points this year," he added.

Miran was appointed by President Donald Trump last year for a term lasting until late January, as the US leader publicly excoriated the Fed for not cutting rates more rapidly.

Since taking office in September, Miran has dissented in all three of the Fed's policy meetings to push for larger rate reductions than his peers on the rate-setting committee.

The Fed voted to lower the benchmark lending rate by a quarter percentage point at each of these gatherings, bringing rates to a range be-

tween 3.50 percent and 3.75 percent. Miran voted for a bigger half-percentage-point cut at each instance.

The central bank is widely expected to hold rates steady at its next gathering in late January, however, as it digests a slate of delayed economic data after a government shut-down last year.

Miran argued on Tuesday that "policy is clearly restrictive and holding the economy back."

While officials have been lowering rates to shore up the world's biggest economy as the employment market weakens, some see the need to hold back on reductions to rein in inflation.

Chicago Fed President Austan Goolsbee, who joined Kansas City Fed President Jeffrey Schmid in pushing to keep rates unchanged in December, warned last month that progress in cooling price hikes had stalled as firms and households grapple with Trump's new tariffs.

While inflation from Trump's sweeping tariff hikes could be one-off, Goolsbee cautioned that higher prices may still prove more long-lasting than expected.

The Fed has a dual mandate of balancing maximum employment and price stability as it mulls the path of interest rates.

On Tuesday, Miran added that he did not put himself forward for the Fed Chair job, with current chief Jerome Powell's term ending in May.

# US would lead Ukraine ceasefire monitoring

Back multinational force: draft statement

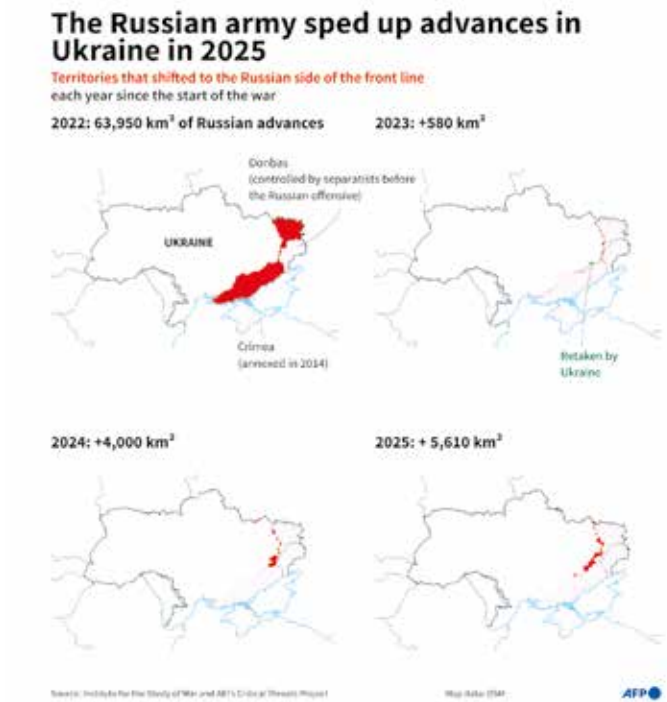

The United States would lead a “ceasefire monitoring and verification mechanism” with European participation if a peace deal is agreed in the Russia-Ukraine war, Kyiv’s allies said in a draft statement seen by AFP ahead of a Paris summit yesterday.

Washington would also commit to “support” a European-led multinational force -- deployed in Ukraine after any ceasefire -- “in case of” a new attack by Russia, it added.

President Emmanuel Macron is hosting a meeting of the so-called Coalition of the Willing allies of Ukraine on Tuesday, including European leaders, Ukrainian President Volodymyr



Zelensky and American envoys. The meeting is focused on the security guarantees Ukraine requires in the event of a ceasefire to deter further Russian aggression.

“There will be a continuous, reliable ceasefire monitoring system. This will be led by the US with international participation,” the draft statement said.

The multinational force to be deployed after a ceasefire would provide “reassurance measures in the air, at sea and on land” for Ukraine and ensure the “regeneration of the armed forces of Ukraine,” it added.

“These elements will be European-led,” it said.

There would be US participation in the force “including US capabilities such as intelligence and logistics,” and “a US commitment to support the force in case of attack” by Russia, it said.

The draft statement said there would be “binding commitments to support Ukraine in the case of a future armed attack by Russia in order to restore peace.”

These commitments “may include the use of military capabilities, intelligence and logistical support, diplomatic initiatives, adoption of additional sanctions,” it said.

## Maduro lawyer previously defended WikiLeaks’ Julian Assange

The lawyer defending deposed Venezuelan leader Nicolas Maduro is a veteran trial attorney who previously represented WikiLeaks founder Julian Assange.

Barry Pollack, 61, appeared beside Maduro during his arraignment in a New York courtroom on Monday on drug trafficking and other charges.

Maduro pleaded not guilty and it will be up to Pollack to try to convince a federal jury to render that verdict when the case eventually goes to trial.

The next hearing has been set for March 17.

A graduate of Georgetown University law school, Pollack is a partner in Harris St. Laurent & Wechsler LLP, a boutique New York law firm, and a former president of the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers.

Law firm research guide Chambers USA describes him as a “thorough and deep-thinking lawyer” who

“lives, breathes and sleeps trials, and has such a natural way in front of juries.”

In 2024, Pollack secured the release of Assange from a British prison after negotiating a plea deal with the US Justice Department that saw the Australian plead guilty to violating the Espionage Act by unlawfully disclosing national defense material.

In another high-profile case, Pollack obtained the acquittal of a former Enron accountant who was facing criminal fraud charges stemming from the collapse of the energy giant.

Another prominent case involved a New York man who was wrongfully convicted of murdering his parents when he was a teenager and spent 17 years in prison.

Pollack managed to get the charges dismissed and secured his freedom.

Pollack gave a hint of his defense strategy during Monday’s brief arraignment of Maduro before District Judge Alvin Hellerstein, questioning the “legality of his abduction” by the US military.

## TV makers tout AI upgrades at CES, as smartphone threat looms

Century after Scottish inventor John Logie Baird demonstrated the first mechanical television system, TVs face mounting competition from a much more recent invention: smartphones.

But with a suite of new models boasting massive screens, richer imagery and artificial intelligence enhancements -- on display this week at the Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas -- manufacturers don’t plan on TVs being relegated to the dustbin of history.

The proportion of daily viewing on TV sets declined from 61 percent at the start of 2017 to 48 percent late last year, according to market tracker Ampere Analysis. Smartphone viewing, meanwhile, nearly doubled over that same period to 21 percent.

“This is the battle between big screens, which are traditionally for older people who grew up around televisions, and younger people who have either a phone, tablet, or laptop on which they’re doing their consumption,” said Patrick Horner, leader of TV research at Omdia.

He said that in China, seen as a trendsetter in the global market, young consumers are shunning large-screen televisions in favor of smartphones or tablets.

Around the world, television ownership is constant or declining, with average selling prices also holding steady or dropping, according to Horner.

One way for TV makers to protect or increase revenue when unit sales don’t rise is to get people to buy ever larger and smarter screens, at a higher price.

### TVs get personal

Those massive screens once again starred at CES, with producers touting AI to personalize experiences and sharpen picture quality.

Also in the spotlight was “Micro RGB” technology that dramatically ramps up picture quality using ultra-precise control of colors in LED displays.

Samsung Electronics, the top TV seller for 20 consecutive

years, unveiled what it billed as the world’s first 130-inch Micro RGB TV and spoke of packing AI into its products.

“We will embed AI across every area, every product, and every service,” Samsung device experience division chief executive TM Roh said during a media event.

Hisense, LG, Samsung, Sony, and TCL were also at CES.

AI is being used to improve

picture and sound quality, as well as help people find shows they want or ask questions about what they’re seeing.

“I am really curious to see if most brands at CES can actually prove their new AI devices live up to their claims,” said Forrester principal analyst Thomas Husson.

### Amazon vs Walmart

Behind the scenes, e-commerce titans Amazon and Walmart are shaping the future of television as they vie for dominance -- not in selling TVs, but in advertising and e-commerce.

“This is really a knockdown, drag-out fight between Amazon.com and Walmart,” Horner told AFP.

Walmart closed a \$2.3 billion deal to buy TV maker Vizio in late 2024, as a strategic response to Amazon boosting sales through advertising on its Fire smart TVs and devices, often through its Prime Video streaming service.

“Amazon was putting advertisements on television programming for things that Amazon sold,” Horner said. “So now Walmart is going to be putting advertisements on your television for things that Walmart sells.”

And the profit margin on selling ads dwarfs the markup on selling TV hardware.

Walmart is expected to sell more than a million of its “Onn” brand TVs monthly and use an operating system it acquired with Vizio to pump advertising to viewers.

“Televisions are no longer about making profit from TV hardware,” Horner said. “They’re an ad delivery device being inserted into your living room to boost e-commerce sales.”

## 92-year-old US judge presiding over Maduro case

Alvin Hellerstein, the 92-year-old US judge handling the case against deposed Venezuelan leader Nicolas Maduro, has presided over a number of notable trials during his decades on the bench.

Maduro and his wife, Cilia Flores, made their first appearance in Hellerstein’s Manhattan courtroom on Monday, pleading not guilty to narco-terrorism and other charges.

Maduro was indicted in 2020 in a sprawling drug trafficking case that has been before Hellerstein for nearly 15 years and has already seen the conviction of Venezuela’s former intelligence chief, Hugo Armando Carvajal.

A graduate of Columbia University law school, Hellerstein served as a lawyer in the US Army from 1957 to 1960 before entering private practice.

He was nominated by former president Bill Clinton in 1998 to be a district court judge for the Southern District of New York.

During his lengthy career, Hellerstein has presided over several civil cases stemming from the September 11, 2001 Al-Qaeda attacks on New York and Washington.

He has also tangled at times with Donald Trump, rejecting



a request by the president to have his New York hush money case moved to federal court.

Hellerstein also blocked the Trump administration last year from deporting alleged Venezuelan gang members without a court hearing.

In September, he sentenced tech start-up highflier Charlie Javice to more than seven years in prison after she was convicted of defrauding JPMorgan Chase on a \$175 million deal.

In another high-profile fraud case, Hellerstein sentenced Bill Hwang, the founder of US investment firm Archegos Capital Management, to 18 years in prison.

He also presided over the trial last year in which a jury found French banking giant BNP Paribas’s work in Sudan had helped prop up the regime of former ruler Omar al-Bashir, awarding \$20.75 million in damages to three plaintiffs from Sudan.



News in brief

◆ The Israeli army said

Monday it was introducing a new technological system to enforce movement restrictions in the occupied West Bank for both Israelis and Palestinians, in a move Israeli media said aims to rein in surging settler violence. The decision allows security forces “to install a technological monitoring device on individuals subject to an administrative order restricting their movement within the (West Bank),” the army said in a statement. The system would allow for monitoring of “violations of these restriction orders accordingly,” it added.

The measure was adopted after a request by head of the domestic Shin Bet security agency David Zini in response to rising violence by Israeli settlers against Palestinians in the West Bank, Israel's Channel 12 reported. The monitoring devices used will be electronic bracelets, according to the Israeli broadcaster.

◆ Malaysia ex-PM Mahathir's hip injury 'serious but not dangerous': daughter

Tuesday after he fell at his home, aide Sufi Yusoff told AFP. “It is serious, but it's not dangerous. For his age, everything is relative... he's fine,” his daughter Marina Mahathir was quoted as saying by national news agency Bernama.

◆ The UK government yesterday called on Elon Musk's social network X to take urgent action over its AI tool Grok being used to create fake sexually explicit images of children. “What we have been seeing online in recent days has been absolutely appalling, and unacceptable in decent society,” Technology Secretary Liz Kendall said in a statement. “X needs to deal with this urgently,” she added. Grok is facing a growing international backlash for allowing users to generate sexualised deepfakes of women and minors through its so-called spicy mode setting. The European Commission announced on Monday that it was “very seriously” reviewing complaints about the tool. The UK's media watchdog Ofcom also said it was looking into X and xAI, which created Grok. Kendall said Ofcom “has my full backing to take any enforcement action it deems necessary”. Under Britain's Online Safety Act which came into force in July, websites, social media and video-sharing platforms hosting potentially harmful content have been required to implement strict age verification through tools such as facial imagery or credit card checks.

Climate-driven tree deaths speeding up in Australia: study

Australia's forests are losing trees more rapidly as the climate warms, a new study examining decades of data said Tuesday, warning the trend was likely a “widespread phenomenon”.

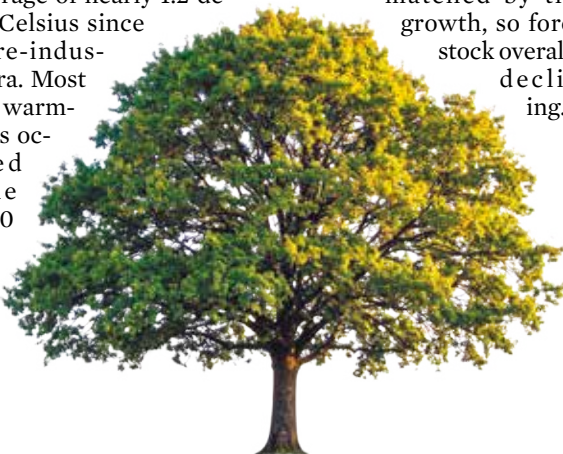
The research used forest inventory data from 2,700 plots across the country, ranging from cool moist forests to dry savanna.

It excluded areas affected by logging, clearance or fires to examine how “background tree mortality” has changed in recent decades.

“What we found is that the mortality rate has consistently increased over time, in all of the different forest types,” said Belinda Medlyn, a professor at Western Sydney University's Hawkesbury Institute for the Environment.

“And this increase is very likely caused by the increase in temperature,” she told AFP.

The world has warmed by an average of nearly 1.2 degrees Celsius since the pre-industrial era. Most of this warming has occurred in the last 50 years.



The rate at which trees die off in a forest can vary in response to different types of disturbances, or as forests grow thicker and there is greater competition for resources.

But the research, published in the Nature Plants journal, excluded areas affected by fires or clearing, and also examined the stand basal area -- the sum of the cross-sectional areas of all trees in an area.

“The (mortality) trend over time remains even after we correct for basal area,” explained Medlyn, who led the research.

The scale of the increase varied across the four different biomes surveyed, with the sharpest rise in tropical savannas.

There, the number of trees dying on average increased by 3.2 percent a year, from close to 15 per 1,000 in 1996, to nearly double that number by 2017.

The research found that the deaths were not being matched by tree growth, so forest stock overall is declining.

Ousted Venezuelan president Nicolas Maduro pleaded not guilty to drug trafficking and other charges at a defiant appearance in a New York court Monday, two days after being snatched by US forces in a stunning raid on his home in Caracas.

Maduro, 63, told a federal judge in Manhattan “I'm innocent. I'm not guilty.”

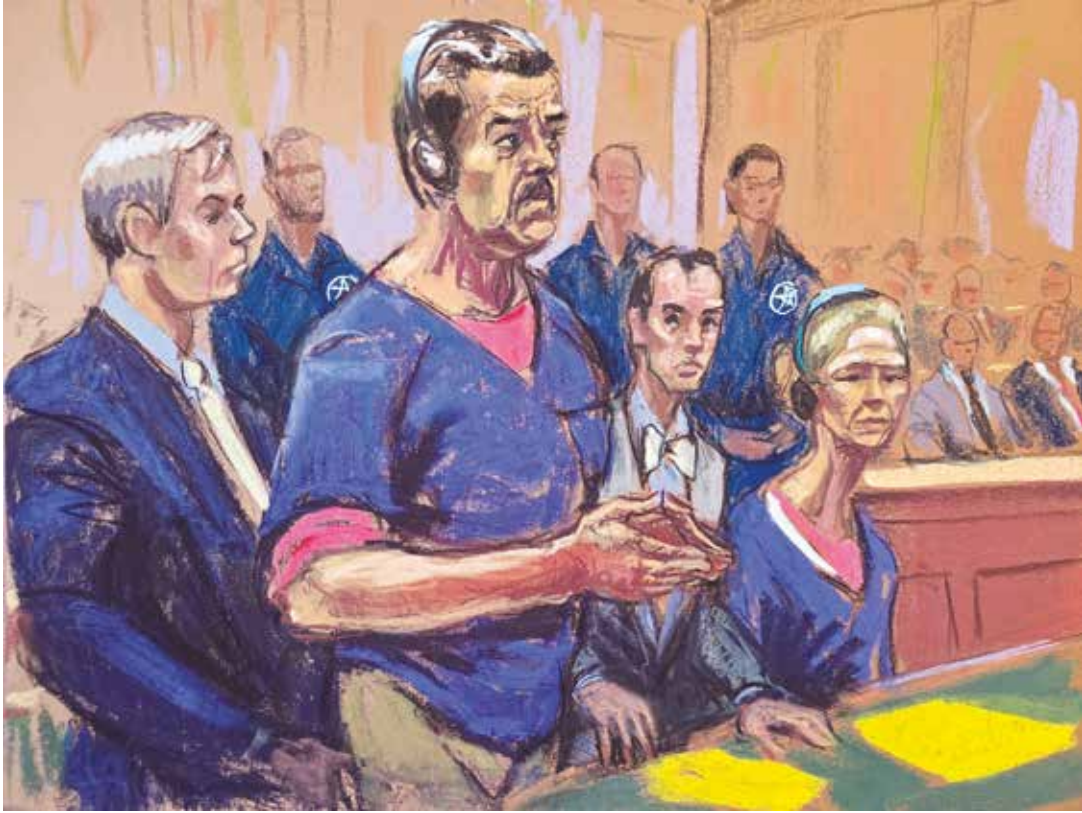
Smiling as he entered the courtroom and wearing an orange shirt with beige trousers, Maduro spoke softly.

“I'm president of the Republic of Venezuela and I'm here kidnapped since January 3, Saturday,” Maduro told the court, speaking in Spanish through an interpreter. “I was captured at my home in Caracas, Venezuela.”

Maduro's wife Cilia Flores likewise pleaded not guilty. The judge ordered both to remain behind bars and set a new hearing date of March 17.



Maduro became president in 2013, taking over from his equally hardline socialist predecessor Hugo Chavez. The United States and European Union say he stayed in power by rigging elections -- most recently in 2024 -- and imprisoning opponents, while overseeing rampant corruption.

55 Cuban, Venezuelan troops killed during US capture of Maduro: official tolls

Caracas, Venezuela

Fifty-five Cuban and Venezuelan military personnel were killed during the US raid to seize Venezuelan leader Nicolas Maduro, according to tolls published Tuesday by the two Latin American allies. During his 12 volatile years in power, Maduro -- like his predecessor Hugo Chavez -- employed specialized Cuban soldiers for his protection. Venezuela's Defence Minister Vladimir Padrino Lopez said on Sunday that Maduro's presidential guard was largely wiped out “in cold blood” by US troops who bombarded the

capital and seized him from his home.

Cuba published the names of 32 members of its military who died in the nighttime assault that led to Maduro's capture in Caracas on January 3.

They included three senior officers from the Cuban interior ministry.

The Venezuelan military published online a list of 23 of its personnel who were also killed, including five admirals.

In the face of pressure from Washington, the leftist governments in Cuba and Venezuela maintain close ties in military cooperation, health and education.

The presidential couple were forcibly taken by US commandos in the early hours of Saturday in airstrikes on the Venezuelan capital backed by warplanes and a heavy naval deployment. Thousands of people marched

through Caracas in support of Maduro as his former deputy, Delcy Rodriguez, was sworn in as interim president.

Venezuela opposition leader Maria Corina Machado slammed Rodriguez, saying she was “rejected” by the Venezuelan people

and calling her “one of the main architects of torture, persecution, corruption, narcotrafficking.”

Speaking from an undisclosed location to broadcaster Sean Hannity on Fox News in her first public comments since the weekend, Machado added that she plans to return to Venezuela “as soon as possible” after leaving under cover last month to accept her Nobel Peace Prize.

After the raid, Trump declared that the United States was “in charge” in Venezuela and intends to take control of the country's huge but decrepit oil industry.

The 79-year-old president also dismissed the idea of Caracas having new elections in the next month.

“We have to fix the country first. You can't have an election. There's no way the people could even vote,” Trump told broadcaster NBC News in an interview aired Monday.

However, US House Speaker and Trump ally Mike Johnson said he thinks an election “should happen in short order” in Venezuela.

Cuba, Greenland next?

Trump, who has shocked many Americans with his unprecedented moves to accumulate domestic power, also now appears increasingly emboldened in foreign policy.

On Sunday, he said communist Cuba was “ready to fall” and he repeated that Greenland, which is part of US ally Denmark, should be controlled by the United States.

Brian Finucane, of the International Crisis Group, told AFP that Trump “seems to be disregarding international law altogether” in Venezuela and added that US domestic law also appeared to have been broken.

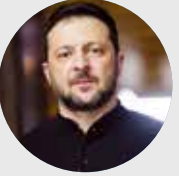

# US operation in Venezuela undermined international law: UN

“Undermined a fundamental principle of international law”

● US commandos forcibly seized Venezuelan president Nicolas Maduro

US air strikes on Venezuela and the seizing of the country's leader on the weekend clearly “undermined a fundamental principle of international law”, the United Nations said yesterday.

“States must not threaten or use force against the territorial integrity or political independence of any state,” Ravina Shamdasani, spokeswoman for the UN rights office, told reporters in Geneva.

“And this is what we are seeing,” she said, calling on the international community to “come together with one voice... to make clear that this is an action that in contravention of the international law that was set up by member states”.

US commandos backed by warplanes, the navy and air strikes, forcibly seized Venezuelan president Nicolas Maduro and his wife Cilia Flores in the early hours of Saturday.

Shamdasani said the UN rights office had spent years reporting on the “continued deterioration” in Venezuela.

‘Unacceptable’

But she dismissed US justifications for its actions, saying accountability for rights violations “cannot be achieved by unilateral military intervention in violation of international law”.

“Using human rights argu-

## Red Crescent says Israeli army gunfire wounds five in West Bank

The Palestinian Red Crescent said the Israeli military shot and wounded five people yesterday at a university campus in the occupied West Bank.

The reason for the intervention at Bir Zeit University near Ramallah was unknown. Contacted by AFP, the military said it was “looking into the matter”.

Military vehicles entered the campus late in the morning, according to several witnesses who spoke to AFP and whose accounts were confirmed by university president Talal Shahwan.

Videos posted to social media showed the intervention, while AFP journalists saw several military vehicles leave the campus, escorted by Israeli soldiers on foot.

The university's communications department told AFP that students had thrown stones at the army, adding that all of the wounded were students.

The Red Crescent said 11 people were wounded in total, including five from live ammunition, four through gas inhalation and two as a result of falls.

An AFP journalist saw ambu-

lances take away several people.

“Unfortunately, the university has been a recurring target, but this time the brutality crossed all limits,” Shahwan told a news conference.

The Israeli army had previously entered the campus several times. Palestinians consider the university to be one of the best in the territories.

## Yemen separatists set for Riyadh talks after fighting: official

Alzubidi will also “discuss the southern dialogue sponsored by Riyadh”, the official said.



# European leaders back Denmark after Trump claims on Greenland

Washington’s military intervention in Venezuela has reignited fears

A group of European leaders yesterday underlined their support for Denmark after US President Donald Trump again voiced designs on its autonomous Arctic territory of Greenland.

The leaders of France, Britain, Germany, Italy, Poland and

Spain as well as Denmark said that sovereignty, territorial integrity and the inviolability of borders were “universal principles, and we will not stop defending them”.

Washington’s military intervention in Venezuela has reignited fears about Trump’s designs on Greenland, which has untapped rare earth deposits and could be a vital player as polar ice melts, opening up new shipping routes.

Greenland is on the shortest route for missiles between Russia and the United States, and Washington already has a military base there.

With the situation in Venezuela more pressing, Trump quipped on Sunday that “we’ll worry about Greenland in about two months”.

The European leaders’ joint statement said: “Arctic security remains a key priority for Europe and it is critical for international and transatlantic security. “NATO has made clear that the Arctic region is a priority and European allies are stepping up. “We and many other allies have increased our presence, activities and investments, to keep the Arctic safe and to deter adversaries.”

They stressed that Denmark -- including Greenland -- was part of NATO.

“Security in the Arctic must therefore be achieved collectively, in conjunction with NATO allies including the United States, by upholding the principles of the UN Charter, including sovereignty, territorial integrity and the inviolability of borders,”

the leaders said.

“These are universal principles, and we will not stop defending them.”

The statement was signed by British Prime Minister Keir Starmer, Danish Prime Minister Mette Frederiksen, French President Emmanuel Macron, German Chancellor Friedrich Merz, Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, Polish Prime Minister Donald Tusk and Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sanchez.

They added that the US was “an essential partner in this endeavour”.

“Greenland belongs to its people. It is for Denmark and Greenland, and them only, to decide on matters concerning Denmark and Greenland,” they said.

## US Capitol riot anniversary exposes a country still divided

Washington on Tuesday marks five years since a mob overran the US Capitol, with rioters pardoned by Donald Trump retracing their steps as Democrats revive hearings to hold the president accountable.

The anniversary of a day that reshaped American politics is expected to reflect a country still unable to agree on who was responsible, or what justice should look like.

“Five years ago today, a violent mob brutally attacked the US Capitol on January 6. Their mission was to overturn a free and fair election. We will never allow extremists to whitewash their treachery,” top House Democrat Hakeem Jeffries posted on X.

On January 6 2021, thousands of Trump supporters gathered in Washington after the president urged them to protest Congress’s certification of his election defeat to Joe

Biden.

Several thousand breached the Capitol grounds, overwhelming police lines and wounding more than 140 officers, smashing windows and doors, ransacking offices and forcing lawmakers into hiding as the electoral count was halted for hours.

Inside the Capitol on Tuesday, House Democrats are convening an unofficial hearing featuring police, former lawmakers and civilians who experienced the violence firsthand.

Many involved in the original

investigation say the aim is not to relitigate the past but to prevent it from being erased -- particularly after Trump returned to office and pardoned nearly all defendants charged in connection with the attack.

**Normalizing political violence**

A new Democratic report documents dozens of pardoned rioters later charged with new crimes, and they warn that the clemency risks normalizing political violence.

Outside the building Trump supporters, including figures linked to the far-right Proud Boys, are staging a midday march retracing the route taken by rioters in 2021.

The march is being promoted by the group’s former leader Enrique Tarrio, who was serving a 22-year sentence for seditious conspiracy before Trump pardoned him.

Organizers say the march will honor those who died, including Trump rioter Ashli Babbitt, and protest what they describe as excessive force by police and politically motivated prosecutions, insisting the event will be

peaceful.

The competing events mirror a broader political dispute, with Democrats saying Trump incited the attack to overturn the election. Republicans reject that view, instead citing security failures and criticizing the Justice Department.

Republican leaders have dismissed Tuesday’s hearing as partisan and have shown little appetite for formal commemoration.

House Speaker Mike Johnson, an unswerving Trump ally, has yet to install a plaque honoring Capitol Police officers who defended the building that day, despite a federal law requiring it.

And Republican investigator Barry Loudermilk has argued that January 6 has been used to advance a political narrative against Trump and his allies.

The anniversary also arrives against the backdrop of unresolved legal and historical questions.

Former special counsel Jack Smith has said the attack would not have occurred without Trump, but abandoned the federal case after Trump’s reelection, in line with Justice Department policy barring prosecution of a sitting president.

Trump was impeached by the House over the riot in 2021 and acquitted by the Senate.



## Taiwan launches search for fighter jet pilot

Taiwan’s Air Force said Tuesday it has launched a search for a pilot believed to have ejected from a F-16 fighter jet over the sea during a routine training mission.

The single-seat aircraft took off at 6:17 pm local time (1017 GMT) from Hualien Air Base in eastern Taiwan, the Air Force said in a statement.

“At 7:29 pm, the pilot was suspected to have ejected about 10 nautical miles east of Fengbin Township in Hualien County,” the statement said.

“The Air Force immediately established an emergency response centre and launched a search operation.”

Premier Cho Jung-tai has called for Taiwan’s coastguard and nearby fishing vessels to assist in the search and rescue efforts, Cabinet spokeswoman Michelle Lee said in a state-

ment.

Taiwan has ordered 66 US F-16V -- a fourth-generation multi-role fighter -- that is a significantly upgraded version of Taiwan’s ageing F-16 A/B jets.

Taiwan completed upgrades of 141 older F-16s to the V standard in late 2023.

The aircraft were due to be delivered in 2026 but Taiwan’s Defence Minister Wellington Koo said recently that would be “challenging”.

Taiwan’s military is under pressure from China, which claims the democratic island is part of its territory and has threatened to use force to annex it.

China has in recent years ramped up incursions by fighter jets and warships around the island -- actions that military experts dub as grey-zone tactics that serve to exhaust the island’s armed forces.

## Israeli FM in Somaliland weeks after official recognition

Israel’s foreign minister arrived in Somaliland yesterday in the first high-profile visit by an Israeli official since the country recognised the breakaway region in the Horn of Africa, the Somaliland presidency said.

Israel announced last month it was officially recognising Somaliland, a first for the self-proclaimed republic that in 1991 declared it had unilaterally separated from Somalia.

“A delegation led by the Israeli Foreign Minister Gideon Saar landed at the Hargeisa town, he was received at the airport by senior government officials. He had meetings with the Somaliland top officials,” the presidency said in a statement.

Israel’s recognition of the breakaway region drew widespread criticism from Africa and Muslim-majority countries, which described the move as an attack on Somali sovereignty.

The European Union has also insisted that Somalia’s sovereignty should be respected.

Somali President Hassan Sheikh Mohamud condemned the decision as a “threat” to the stability in the Horn of Africa.

In an interview with Al Jazeera, he said Somaliland had accepted three conditions from Israel: the resettlement of Palestinians, the establishment of a military base on the Gulf of Aden, and joining the Abraham Accords to normalise ties with Israel.

But Somaliland’s foreign

ministry denied the first two conditions.

The breakaway region has been diplomatically isolated since its unilateral declaration of independence, even if it has generally experienced greater stability than Somalia, where Al-Shabaab Islamic militants periodically mount attacks in the capital Mogadishu.

Regional analysts believe that a rapprochement with Somaliland would provide Israel with better access to the Red Sea, enabling it to hit Houthi rebels in Yemen.

Its location alongside one of the world’s busiest shipping lanes has made it a key partner for foreign countries.

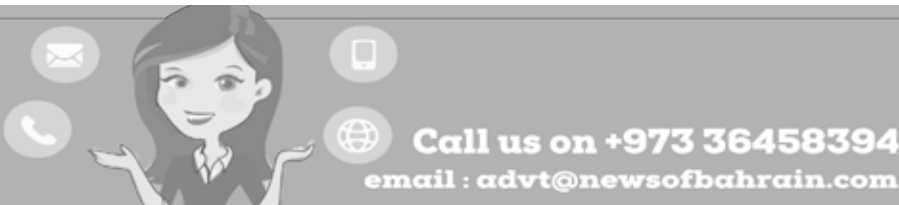

# Dias sidelined with Gvardiol as Man City face defensive crisis

Manchester City will be without Ruben Dias for up to six weeks and fellow defender Josko Gvardiol for "a long time", manager Pep Guardiola said yesterday.

Nick Kyrgios urged Novak Djokovic to stay in tennis "as long as possible" after the Serbian great yesterday pulled out of his only lead-up tournament to the Australian Open, saying he was "not quite physically ready".

The 38-year-old was planning to use the Adelaide International from January 12 as a springboard to the opening Grand Slam at Melbourne Park a week later where he is targeting an 11th title and elusive 25th major crown.

"To all my fans in Adelaide, unfortunately I'm not quite physically ready to compete in the Adelaide International next week," Djokovic said on Instagram.

"It's personally very disappointing to me, as I have such great memories of winning the title there two years ago. I was really excited about returning as it truly felt like playing at home."

"My focus is now on my preparation for the Australian Open and I look forward to arriving in Melbourne soon and seeing all the tennis fans in Australia."

The world number four has not played a tour match since he defeated Lorenzo Musetti in the Athens final in early November and has become very selective about when and where he plays.

Australian showman Kyrgios, who lost his comeback match at the Brisbane International this week after a long injury layoff, urged everyone involved in tennis to appreciate Djokovic while he was still playing.

"There's obviously something there that he wants to achieve, whether it's another Grand

Beshara further explained the requirements for the efficient and orderly passage of fans to and from BIC for both pre-season testing and the grand prix weekend. Beshara also gave a detailed overview of the new plans that are to be implemented for this year’s F1 events.

F1 pre-season testing will be the first chance for fans to wit-

ness the next generation of F1 cars in action ahead of the 2026 campaign. It will be the sixth consecutive year that Sakhir has been selected as the venue for the tests.

# Chelsea appoint Rosenior as manager

Chelsea officially confirm the appointment of the 41-year-old English manager

- Rosenior leaves Strasbourg for role
- Has only three years’ managerial experience
- Chelsea’s fourth permanent boss since 2022

Liam Rosenior was confirmed yesterday as Chelsea’s new head coach on a six-and-a-half-year deal, saying the opportunity to succeed Enzo Maresca at Stamford Bridge was too good to turn down.

The 41-year-old Strasbourg boss told a press conference earlier in the day at the Ligue 1 club that he had “verbally agreed” on the move.

Chelsea officially announced that Rosenior, who will take charge of his first match in the FA Cup at the weekend, had signed a deal until 2032.

“I am extremely humbled and honoured to be appointed head coach of Chelsea Football Club,” he said in a statement on the Premier League team’s website.

“This is a club with a unique spirit and a proud history of winning trophies.”

“My job is to protect that identity and create a team that reflects these values in every game we play as we continue winning trophies.”

Rosenior has just three years’

experience as a manager, with Hull City and French club Strasbourg, and has never coached in the Premier League.

But he had been widely touted as the frontrunner to succeed Maresca since the Italian left Chelsea last week.

Strasbourg are part of the Todd Boehly and Clearlake Capital-owned BlueCo multi-club ownership group that also controls Chelsea.

Rosenior is Chelsea’s fourth permanent managerial appointment since BlueCo took control of the club previously owned by Roman Abramovich in 2022.

The club said the English-

man had shown “he can build teams with a clear way of playing while setting the highest standards with players on and off the pitch”.

“While there will continue to be a focus on player development, the club’s expectations and ambitions remain high,” Chelsea added.

Rosenior said he had wanted to announce the news himself in Strasbourg because of his deep feelings for the French club.

The former defender, whose father, Leroy Rosenior, was also a player and a manager, told reporters the chance to manage Chelsea was “an opportunity I

cannot turn down”.

### ‘World-class club’

“I’m so excited about the future. I cannot lie. My whole life I’ve worked to be a coach,” he said.

“To be presented with this opportunity to manage a world-class football club is something I’ve always dreamed of.

“With that is a mixed emotion of sadness of what I’m leaving behind.”

Chelsea interim manager Calum McFarlane told reporters that he would remain in charge for Wednesday’s Premier League match against Fulham.

McFarlane said he had spoken briefly to the club’s new boss.

“He’s obviously really excited about taking the role,” he said. “It’s a brief conversation, so my understanding is he’s going to be at Cobham (Chelsea’s training ground) later on today.”

Rosenior played in the Premier League and the second-tier Championship in England. His clubs included Fulham, Reading and Hull.

He had a variety of coaching roles at Derby, which included 12 matches as caretaker manager at the start of the 2022/23 season.

Later in 2022 Rosenior took over as manager of Championship team Hull.

He was sacked after 18 months and in July 2024 was appointed by Strasbourg, who he guided to seventh place in Ligue 1 last season.

McFarlane said Rosenior’s teams played “aggressive, front-foot football” and that his appointment would inspire Eng-

lish managers. Since the formation of the Premier League in 1992, not a single English manager has won the title.

“I’m sure all young English coaches from an academy background will be in some way, regardless of who you support, rooting for Liam,” said McFarlane.

“So it is really inspirational for young academy English coaches.”

Maresca left Chelsea abruptly on New Year’s Day following a deterioration in his relationship with club bosses, just months after winning the UEFA Conference League and Club World Cup.

Chelsea are fifth in the Premier League, 17 points behind Arsenal, with just one win in their past eight league games.
