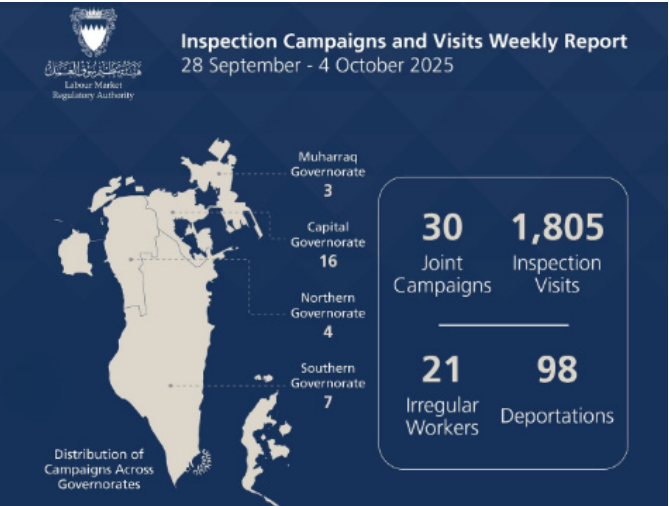


21 illegal workers detained and 98 violators deported

The Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) announced that 21 violating and irregular workers were detained and 98 violators deported following 1,835 inspection campaigns and visits conducted across the Kingdom between September 28 and October 4, 2025.

The inspection campaigns and visits also resulted in monitoring a number of violations related to the provisions of a number of regulating laws, especially the Labour Market Regulatory Authority and the Residency Laws in the Kingdom of Bahrain, noting that legal measures were taken regarding the observed violations.

It pointed out that 1,805 inspection visits were carried out on various shops in all governorates, in addition to 30 joint inspection campaigns, 16 campaigns in the Capital Governorate, 3 campaigns in the Muharraq Governorate, 4 campaigns in the Northern Governorate and 7 campaigns in the Southern Governorate.

The government entities that participated in the campaigns are the Ministry of Interior, represented by the Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs (NPRA), the Governorate's respective Police Directorate and the General Directorate of Verdict Enforcement and Alternative Sentencing, as well as the Social Insurance Organization and the Bahrain Tourism and Exhibitions Authority.

The panel served as an interactive dialogue platform that

brought together a group of social influencers in the Bahraini community and a wide segment of youth to discuss the concept of influence, the role of young people in practicing it responsibly, and to share practical experiences that enrich this aspect.

Academic dimension

During the session, Dr. Fatima Marhoon discussed the academic dimension of influence and the importance of cognitive awareness in shaping a leadership personality.

Mr. Mohammed Al-Sayed shared his media experience, focusing on the challenges posed

by digital openness and the need to consciously manage and direct tools of influence.

Meanwhile, Ms. Fatima Al-Khaja highlighted her experience in youth and humanitarian work, emphasizing the importance of volunteer initiatives in promoting positive values and transforming challenges into opportunities.

Pivotal topics

The discussion then moved to pivotal topics, including the achievements and experiences of the speakers, the main challenges young people may face in their various paths and how to overcome them, as well as

the importance of distinguishing between meaningful and non-meaningful content amid the impact of social media, and the search for effective tools that ensure a sustainable and positive presence in society.

At the conclusion of the panel, the speakers affirmed that true influence requires a deep commitment to values and credibility, noting that Bahraini youth with their awareness and ambition constitute a key pillar in building a brighter future, and that investing in their capabilities is an investment in the sustainability of national development and identity.
