Kuwait Airport Recovery May Take Year

The International Air Transport Association (IATA) has warned that recovery work at Kuwait International Airport could take at least a year following recent strike-related damage, amid rising regional tensions linked to the US-Israel-Iran conflict.

Speaking at the 82nd Annual General Meeting and World Air Transport Summit in Rio de Janeiro, IATA's Regional Vice-President for Africa and the Middle East, Kamil Alawadhi, said early assessments suggest the impact on airport infrastructure is severe.

He said the damage appeared extensive based on available images and video footage, though Kuwaiti authorities are still conducting formal evaluations and have not issued an official repair timeline.

OPEC+ Reviews Global Energy Markets



Dr. Mohammed bin Mubarak Bin Daina, Minister of Oil and Environment and Special Envoy for Climate Affairs, participated in the 41st OPEC and non-OPEC Ministerial Meeting (OPEC+) held via video conference.

The meeting reviewed recent developments in global oil and energy markets and discussed supply, demand trends, market stability, and future outlooks.

Ministers focused on strengthening coordination among producing countries to support balanced and stable global energy markets.

Dr. Bin Daina stressed the importance of continued consultation among oil-producing nations to ensure market stability and reliable energy supplies.

He noted that the meeting also addressed global energy security, geopolitical impacts on markets, and the need to maintain steady supply flows to support economic growth.

“No Room for Political Agendas”

HE the Interior Minister held a meeting with Community Centres(Mattams) officials

As part of the Interior Ministry's ongoing community partnership strategy, Interior Minister General Shaikh Rashid bin Abdullah Al Khalifa chaired the annual meeting with heads and officials of Community Centres (Maatams) across the governorates at the Police Officers Club. Senior officials attended, including the Minister of Justice, Islamic Affairs and Endowments, the Deputy Interior Minister, the Chief of Police, the governors, and the two deputy chairmen of the Islamic Endowments Council — reflecting the significance of coordination ahead of Ashura.

The Minister conveyed the greetings of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Crown Prince and Prime Minister, and their commitment to strengthening community engagement as a cornerstone of governance.

The Minister made clear this is not a routine Ashura season. He addressed two pressing issues: the organisation of Ashura events and the arrest of a network of individuals linked to Wilayat al-Faqih and Iran's Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps.

56 Arrested in Iranian-Backed Network

Authorities arrested 41 key

agents working to spread the ideology of Wilayat al-Faqih, followed by 15 additional field operatives tasked with carrying out inciting instructions on the ground. According to the Public Prosecution, the group committed crimes threatening national security, collected funds without a licence — some of which were transferred to Iran, Iraq and Lebanon to finance terrorist organisations — and some defendants personally benefited from the money collected. Their methods included social infiltration, planting cells, and targeting youth through Maatams, religious lessons, and financial assistance.

The Minister explained that Wilayat al-Faqih shifts followers' political allegiance away from their home country toward Iran's ruling jurist. The arrested network had been secretly working to reshape Shia Islamic jurisprudence in Bahrain, build loyalty to Iran's leadership, and extend Iranian influence under the cover of religion, primarily targeting youth.

He called for heightened awareness to protect the thinking and loyalty of Bahrain's youth and to defeat what he described as a plot to change Bahrain's identity.

Politicisation Will Not Be Tolerated

The Minister praised Maatam leaders for preserving the religious and civilised character of Ashura over the years, strengthening



public safety and social peace. He called on all to comply with laws and regulations.

He was unequivocal: no foreign flags, no slogans tied to regional agendas, and no mourning for the Wali al-Faqih. He reminded attendees that Bahrain's Hussainiya mourning traditions are historically older than the doctrine of Wilayat al-Faqih itself. The state, he affirmed, fully protects legitimate religious practice — but will act against anyone exploiting religious occasions for political purposes.

Maatam Leaders Respond

At the close of the meeting, heads and officials of Community Centres praised His Majesty

the King's support for Ashura and the government's commitment, led by HRH the Crown Prince and Prime Minister. They expressed appreciation for official efforts in ensuring a successful, stable, and cohesive Ashura season.

Global Food Threat

Children under five face nearly three times the risk of illness from unsafe food compared to older children and adults, according to new estimates released by the World Health Organization (WHO).

Although they represent just 9% of the global population, young children account for almost one-third of all foodborne disease cases. The WHO stated that diarrhoeal diseases remain the most dangerous for this age group and are often fatal.

Globally, unsafe food is estimated to cause around 866 million illnesses and 1.5 million deaths each year. Many of these cases are preventable through better sanitation, improved hygiene practices, safer food handling such as pasteurisation, and stronger access to healthcare.

While the overall burden of foodborne disease has declined since 2000, the WHO warned that major regional disparities remain, with Africa and South-East Asia bearing the heaviest impact.

Middle East Conflict Intensifies Further

Iran Fires, Israel Intercepts - But the Threat Is Not Over

The Israeli military intercepted all missiles launched from Iran on Sunday, as the Middle East conflict reached one of its most dangerous flashpoints in months.

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) confirmed its air defence systems successfully tracked and intercepted all incoming threats throughout the day, though it warned that additional waves of attacks had been detected as the situation developed.

Schools across Israel remained closed on Monday following a national security assessment by the Home Front Command, which placed the country under

a restricted operational level. “No educational activities may be conducted,” the command stated, as authorities kept restrictions on public activity in place.

Iran's military central command declared that Israel's strikes on Beirut's southern suburbs had “crossed all red lines.” General Ali Abdollahi, head of the Khatam al-Anbiya command, demanded an immediate halt to Israeli operations in Lebanon and issued a stark warning of “more devastating and regrettable blows” should the conflict expand further.

How Sunday's Spiral Began The escalation had its roots in Beirut. Hezbollah confirmed it launched missiles and drones at two Israeli army barracks on

Sunday morning. Israel responded by striking a militant command centre in Beirut's Dahiyeh district—killing 2 people and wounding 20, according to Lebanon's health ministry.

Iran had long warned that any new attack on Beirut would trigger a “full-scale resumption” of hostilities and insisted that any permanent peace deal must also end Israel's campaign against Hezbollah in Lebanon.

The attack drew sharp condemnation from Tehran's political leadership. Iran's parliament speaker and chief negotiator with

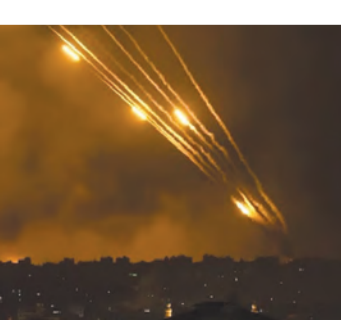

Washington, Mohammad Bagher Ghalibaf, accused the United States of giving a “green light” for the Beirut strike—and went further, declaring that both US and Israeli assets were now “legitimate targets.”

Ancient Tokens Rewrite History

● Excavations led by Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquities

● International archaeological team involved in research

● Findings reveal new details about Dilmun administration and politics

A newly published scientific study has revealed fresh evidence about the administrative and political organisation of the ancient Dilmun civilisation, following the discovery of three inscribed clay tokens during archaeological excavations in Bahrain.

The study, published in the Journal of Near Eastern Studies, analysed artefacts uncovered at archaeological sites across the Kingdom of Bahrain. The excavations were conducted by the Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquities in cooperation with an international team of experts

led by Dr Steffen Terp Laursen, a specialist in Dilmun civilisation.

Researchers said the findings represent a significant archaeological discovery for the Arabian Gulf region, shedding new light on the systems used to manage governance and administration during the Dilmun era.

Shaikh Khalifa bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, President of the Bahrain

Authority for Culture and Antiquities, said the discovery further confirms Bahrain's historical importance as the homeland of the Dilmun civilisation and one of the region's most prominent archaeological centres.

He said Bahrain's archaeological sites continue to produce discoveries that deepen understanding of the Gulf's ancient his-

tory, while also highlighting the importance of preserving heritage sites and supporting scientific research.

Shaikh Khalifa added that cooperation between Bahraini institutions, international archaeological missions and universities has played a key role in advancing research into the civilisation.

Dilmun, regarded as one of the Gulf's earliest civilisations, served as a major cultural and commercial link between Mesopotamia, the Arabian Gulf and other parts of the ancient world.

559 students reach final IB admissions assessment

English proficiency exams held in partnership with the British Council



The Education Minister, Dr Mohamed bin Mubarak Juma, visited several testing centres overseeing English language proficiency exams as part of the final selection stage for students competing for places in the International Baccalaureate (IB) Middle Years Programme in government schools.



The English assessment tests, known as APTIS, are conducted by the Ministry of Education in partnership with the British Council as part of the admissions process for the internationally recognised programme.

During the visit, the minister met students, parents and members of the educational and administrative teams responsible for organising and supervising the examinations.

A total of 559 students advanced to the final stage of the assessment process after more than 3,000 students from in-

termediate schools across Bahrain participated in the initial evaluations.

Following the completion of the assessment and results process, the top 400 students will be selected to form the first intake of the IB Middle Years Programme in Bahrain's public school system.

The initiative forms part of broader efforts by the Ministry of Education to expand internationally accredited learning opportunities within government schools and strengthen students' academic and language skills.

Protect Religious Neutrality

Statement highlights concerns over external influence efforts

Member of Parliament Jameel Mulla Hassan praised remarks made by Bahrain's Interior Minister, General Shaikh Rashid bin Abdullah Al Khalifa, during a meeting with matam heads. Hassan described the remarks as a clear message supporting national unity and protecting religious platforms from political influence.

Speaking in a statement, MP Jameel Mulla Hassan said the minister's comments reflected a responsible national approach aimed at safeguarding Bahrain's social cohesion and preventing the politicisation of religious institutions.

He said the Interior Minis-

ter had been clear in describing the concept of Wilayat al-Faqih as a political project presented within a religious framework, stressing that religious platforms should remain free from political agendas and from loyalties extending beyond national borders.

The MP added that the minister's remarks underscored the importance of loyalty to Bahrain, its leadership and its constitutional institutions, while warning against the use of religion to advance political objectives.

Jameel Mulla Hassan also referred to the minister's disclosure about a recently uncovered network that had allegedly been operating covertly to influence Bahrain's religious and sectarian landscape in favour of external interests.

NIHR Condemns Continued Iranian Attacks

Institution warns of threats to civilians, public safety and regional stability

The National Institution for Human Rights (NIHR) strongly condemned continued Iranian attacks targeting the Kingdom of Bahrain, warning that the incidents pose a serious threat to national security, civilian safety and regional stability.

In a statement issued on Sunday, the institution said it was closely monitoring the developments and described the attacks as a grave violation of Bahrain's sovereignty and territorial integrity.

The NIHR said the attacks endangered the rights and safety of both citizens and residents, particularly the fundamental rights to life, personal security and physical safety, which are

protected under international human rights agreements and conventions.

Referring to an earlier statement on the escalating situation, the institution said the continued attacks and what it called “unjustified escalation” represented a clear breach of international law and the principles of the Charter of the United Nations.

It said the actions violated key international principles, including respect for state sovereignty, non-interference in the internal

affairs of nations and the prohibition of threats or the use of force.

The rights body also warned that the attacks reflected what it described as a dangerous disregard for international obligations designed to protect civilians and preserve regional peace and stability.

According to the NIHR, the continued escalation increases the risk to civilian lives, private property and public facilities, exposing them to potentially serious harm.

The institution stressed that protecting civilians and ensuring their safety was not simply a political or moral responsibility, but a legal obligation under international human rights law and the United Nations Charter.

Renewable energy and environmental laws reviewed

The Public Utilities and Environment Committee of Bahrain's Shura Council completed 12 reports after holding 14 meetings during the fourth session of the sixth legislative term, according to a statement.

Chaired by Dr. Mohammed Ali Hassan Ali, the committee reviewed 11 legislative proposals, including 10 draft laws and one proposed law, covering key areas such as environment, infrastructure, agriculture and regulatory affairs.

As part of its work, the committee held consultations with relevant government bodies and institutions to assess the technical and legislative aspects of the proposals. These discussions, it said, helped strengthen deliberations and support recommendations aligned with the public interest.

Among the key items reviewed were draft amendments to the Real Estate Lease Law, the Advertising Regulation Law, and the Environment Law, as well as legislation related to international trade in endangered



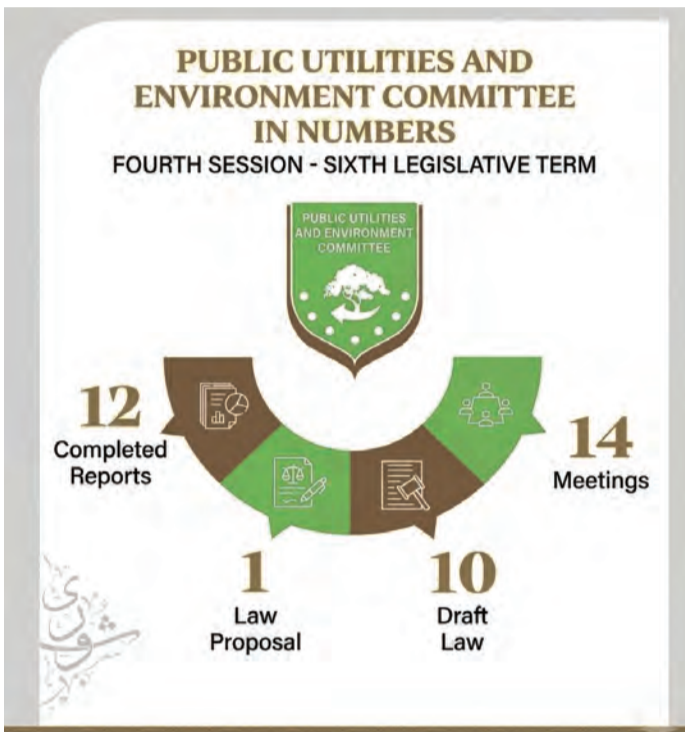

species of wild fauna and flora.

The committee also examined proposals including a GCC-wide unified law on plant genetic resources for food and agriculture, regulations on the possession and trade of dangerous animals, and amendments to the Agricultural Banks Regulation Law. It additionally reviewed amendments to Article 59 of the Real Estate Registration Law referred by the Council of Representatives.

In support of sustainability goals, the committee also discussed an amended proposal for a Renewable Energy Law aimed at strengthening Bahrain's environmental and development agenda.

The Shura Council's Public Utilities and Environment Committee completed 12 reports and reviewed 11 legislative proposals during the fourth session of the sixth legislative term. The proposals covered key areas including environmental protection, renewable energy, real estate regulation and agricultural development.



"Islamiyat" App services migrated to the "MyGov" App

As part of the government mobile applications merger plan, the Information & eGovernment Authority (iGA) announced the complete migration of all services available on the "Islamiyat" app to the unified "MyGov" app, which is available to the public through the Bahrain eGovernment Apps Store via bahrain.bh/apps.

Fish prices stabilise in Bahrain as safi drops to BD4 after ban lift

Fish prices in Bahrain are showing signs of stabilisation nearly a week after the seasonal ban on safi, sheari and andak was lifted, according to a field visit by The Daily Tribune to local fish markets and shops.

Bahraini safi, which had surged to as high as BD5 per kilo on the first day after the ban was lifted, has now eased to BD4 per kilo as supply conditions improve and early demand pressure subsides.

Sheari has also stabilised, now selling at BD3.500 per kilo, after initially fluctuating between BD3.500 and BD4 during the re-opening phase.

The first day of trading after the ban saw limited supply, cautious consumer buying and sharp price increases, with safi reaching between BD4.500 and BD5 per kilo.

However, within six days, prices began to settle, with safi easing to BD4 per kilo, reflecting a gradual return to more balanced market conditions.

Other key seafood prices recorded include hammour at BD6.500 per kilo, seabream at BD3 per kilo, frozen shrimp at BD2.500 per kilo, and maid at BD2 per kilo. Hammour remains the most expensive among the listed varieties, while maid is the lowest.

Market observers say the price movement suggests the seafood market is absorbing the return of local catch after the seasonal restrictions, leading to a more predictable supply pattern.

A worker at Asmak Barbar said prices are now "calmer" compared to the sharp fluctuations seen immediately after fishing resumed, noting that supply is steadily returning to fish stalls.

He added that the coming days will indicate whether prices remain stable or ease further as additional catch enters the market.

MPs Study VAT Relief on Unpaid Invoices

Move aims to ease cash-flow pressure on businesses

Unpaid invoices would no longer leave suppliers owing VAT before they receive their money, under a bill being studied by Parliament's Financial and Economic Affairs Committee.

It would add a new clause stating that the date of supply for goods or services provided to a government body shall be the date on which the supplier receives the payment.

The aim is to deal with a cash-flow problem faced by firms that raise invoices, book VAT liability, and then wait weeks or months for the money to arrive. In Bahrain, VAT can fall due once an invoice is issued, even though the payment itself may follow after one month, two months or far longer.

Mr Ebrahim said the issue was clear in dealings with government bodies, where invoice settlement could take long and uneven periods. 'Government bodies settle invoices after differing and long periods, some stretching to three or six months, and in some cases more than a year,' he said.

The bill would make payment,

rather than the raising of an invoice, the tax point for supplies made to government bodies. Its supporters argue that this would stop firms from having to fund VAT out of their own cash while waiting to be paid.

Mr Ebrahim said the rule now being sought would help bring tax timing into line with the actual receipt of money.

'It creates an added and unjustified financial burden that

limits his ability to meet tax duties on time,' he said.

The explanatory note attached to the bill says the change is meant to deal with a practical problem for suppliers and service providers who work with government bodies. It says the date on which VAT becomes due should match the date on which the supplier receives the actual payment for the goods or services supplied.

Mr Ebrahim said adding the new paragraph to Article 13 would 'achieve tax fairness and support the business environment', because the supplier's tax duty would arise only once the payment from the government body had been received.

The proposal cites Article 15(a) of the Constitution, which states that taxes and public costs are based on social justice and paid under the law.

Ministry of Municipalities and Agriculture, in cooperation with the Southern Governorate, has upgraded its service for depositing security fees for non-commercial camping during the annual winter camping season.

The improved system allows campers to pay and reclaim security deposits for site cleanliness entirely online, aiming to improve service quality, simplify

procedures, and reduce transaction time.

Under the new digital process, the service is fully automated, cutting processing time from up to three working days to an instant procedure. The ministry said the redesign also reduced application steps to a maximum of three and replaced paper forms with electronic submissions.

Applicants can now access the service through the Southern Governorate application under the “Khaym” initiative. Requests are automatically forwarded to the relevant municipal licensing department, which calculates the required deposit. Users can then complete payment through approved electronic payment channels.

The ministry said the upgrade

is part of wider efforts to modernise government services and enhance the user experience through digital transformation.

The Undersecretary for Municipal Affairs at the Ministry of Municipalities and Agriculture, Shaikh Mohammed bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, said the development reflects the government’s commitment to adopting innovative digital solutions that improve efficiency and service quality.

He added that the initiative builds on ongoing efforts to streamline procedures and deliver integrated digital services that meet users’ needs and increase satisfaction.

According to the ministry, more than 1,300 government services have been documented and published as part of a broader reform programme. Around 800 of these services have undergone development and redesign across various sectors, based on public feedback, investor suggestions, and service evaluation reports.

Officials said the wider programme also includes service guides and performance agreements designed to improve efficiency, raise service quality, and support Bahrain’s ongoing digital transformation strategy.

Public Prosecution website redesigned for better user experience

SIM card fraud leads to BHD 2,490 bank theft case

A criminal court in Bahrain is set to issue its ruling later this month in a case involving SIM card fraud scheme that led to the theft of BHD 2,490 from a Gulf businessman’s bank account.

The Criminal High Court has scheduled May 16 to consider an objection filed by a man in his thirties against a default judgment sentencing him to three

years in prison and a fine of BHD 3,000.

According to court documents, the 36-year-old defendant is accused of exploiting a limited power of attorney granted by a 42-year-old Gulf businessman to handle administrative matters related to his company in Bahrain. The authorization did not include any financial powers or permission

to access the victim’s mobile number.

Prosecutors say the defendant used the documents to obtain a replacement SIM card in the victim’s name from a telecommunications company while the businessman was abroad. Although company policy requires the account holder to be present, the request was processed after the defendant presented

the authorization papers.

Once the SIM card was activated, the defendant allegedly received one-time banking verification codes linked to the victim’s accounts. He is accused of using these to access the “Benefit” payment application and carry out two unauthorised transfers totalling BHD 2,490—one to his own account and another to his daughter’s account.

The victim reportedly discovered the issue after his SIM card stopped working while overseas. On returning to Bahrain, he later found that funds were missing from his bank account after being informed of suspicious transactions by his bank.

A telecom employee testified that the defendant had requested the replacement SIM using official documents. A compli-

ance officer also told investigators that system logs confirmed activation and the completion of two transfers using verification codes sent to the same mobile number.

Banking records identified the defendant and his daughter as the recipients of the transferred funds. The case remains under review pending the court’s final ruling.

Man jailed for circulating fake Bahraini dinars

A Bahraini man has been sentenced to five years in prison and fined 500 dinars after the Court of Appeal upheld his conviction for circulating counterfeit Bahraini currency.

The First Criminal Circuit also ordered the confiscation of seized items in the case involving 40 fake Bahraini dinars.

The case first came to light at a small hotel, where the defendant rented a room and paid 20 dinars in cash. After returning 10 dinars as change, the receptionist later became suspicious of one of the banknotes and discovered it was counterfeit,

prompting a police report.

Hours later, a supermarket reported a similar incident, saying the same individual had used a fake 20-dinar note to purchase goods. Authorities launched an investigation and tracked the suspect before arresting him in a police sting operation.

During questioning, the defendant initially claimed he had unknowingly used counterfeit notes received from another person. However, further investigation revealed he later admitted knowing the money was fake and said he used it to pay for services and purchases while receiving genuine change.

A search of the suspect uncovered additional counterfeit notes hidden inside a cigarette pack, strengthening the evidence against him.

A forensic document examiner confirmed that the notes closely resembled genuine currency and could deceive ordinary individuals, but were in fact fake.

The Public Prosecution charged him with possessing and circulating counterfeit currency and unlawfully obtaining goods using fake money. The court ultimately upheld the conviction, imposing the prison sentence, fine, and confiscation order.

Procedural defects void BD 10,000 compensation ruling

A civil dispute between a company and a former employee concluded after Bahrain’s Court of Cassation upheld a ruling that annulled a lower court judgment ordering the employee to pay BD 10,000 to his former employer.

Sitting in chambers, the Court of Cassation ruled the company’s appeal inadmissible, effectively confirming an earlier judgment by the High Civil Court of Appeal. The appellate court had overturned the initial ruling on procedural grounds and found the case could not proceed due to *res judicata*, ordering the company to bear legal costs and fees.

According to the employee’s defence, represented by lawyer Hussain Salem, the client had worked part-time with the com-

pany on a commission-based arrangement and was also entrusted with handling certain legal and financial transactions on behalf of the business.

The company later alleged financial discrepancies and accused the employee of misappropriating funds and assets, including cash and cheques. An

accounting expert report was commissioned, estimating losses at around BD 10,000, which formed the basis of a civil claim that initially resulted in a judgment against the employee.

The defence argued that the employee was not properly notified of the proceedings or the judgment and only became aware of enforcement action approximately one year later, after the appeal deadline had expired.

Lawyers also maintained that the matter had already been addressed in criminal proceedings, where the employee was acquitted of embezzlement. They argued that the criminal ruling carried *res judicata* effect, preventing the civil courts from revisiting the same facts.

Woman Ordered to Pay BD1,889 in Salon Partnership Row

A woman has been ordered to pay BD1,888,930, rather than the over BD13,000 sought against her, after a man claimed he had been drawn into a beauty salon partnership without ever receiving any profit.

Lawyer Sayed Ali Mahfoodh said the High Civil Court ruled that his client owed only the sum

proven through actual transfers, not the full BD13,079 claimed by the man.

The claimant told the court he had been brought into the salon on the understanding that he would be a partner and would share in its earnings. He said the woman had led him to believe she was the sole partner in the business and that she wanted him to join her in running it.

He said he sent her money, but

no partnership or written deal was ever signed. According to his claim, she kept putting off the paperwork, saying the steps needed for the deal were still being completed.

The man said witnesses had seen her receive the money, while signed papers and bank transfers also showed sums paid to her and to the landlord of the premises where the salon was based.

He added that he had received no earnings from the salon and later checked its commercial registration, finding that it did not allow her to carry out work linked to investing other people’s money.

He said he had been misled and cheated, and that the woman later brought in another partner instead of him. A police complaint over alleged fraud remains under inquiry.

The court said witness accounts showed that a 50pc partnership had arisen between the two sides in the salon, before it was brought to an end after disputes between them.

It found that the partnership was tied to a salon that was later expanded, and that the later row between the two sides was rooted in personal differences.

The court said the case papers showed that the claimant had

paid money to the woman for the partnership. It also noted that she had admitted before the court expert and in her defence papers that she owed him money, first saying the amount was BD900 and later BD800.

Her son, who appeared as a defence witness, said sums ranging between BD1,000 and BD1,300 were owed to the claimant in relation to rent for the shop.

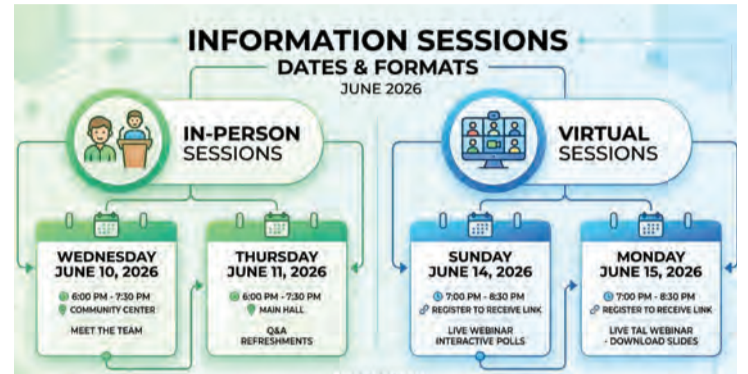

Bahrain Non-Oil Exports Rise 6.7pc to BD4.12bn

Bahrain-made non-oil exports rose 6.7 pc in 2025 to about BD4.12 billion, up from BD3.86bn a year earlier, foreign trade figures show.

The increase added nearly BD257 million to the value of goods shipped abroad, led by aluminium, iron and steel, and other factory-made goods.

Saudi Arabia remained the biggest buyer of Bahraini exports, taking goods worth more than BD963.3m during the year. That was up from BD902.5m in 2024, a rise of about 6.7 pc.

The UAE followed with exports worth about BD401m, against BD365.8m the year before, an increase of more than 9.6 pc. The United States came third at nearly BD389.9m, slightly below BD393.7m in 2024.

The Netherlands bought Bahraini goods worth BD192.6m, while exports to Qatar reached about BD166.4m. Qatar saw one of the biggest rises among Bahrain's larger trade partners, with the value of exports there climbing by about 47 pc from 2024.

BD1.18bn in 2025, up from roughly BD1.03bn a year earlier. The increase was more than 14.6 pc.

Agglomerated iron ores and concentrates came second at about BD616.4m, down from BD666.3m in 2024, a fall of 7.5 pc.

Other leading exports included non-alloy aluminium wire at BD219.6m, bridges and bridge sections of iron or steel at BD177.9m, processed cheese at BD175.7m, unwrought non-alloy aluminium at BD168.2m, and urea at more than BD145.5m.

EU sends emergency aid to Ebola-hit DR Congo region

AFP | Bunia, DR Congo

The EU said yesterday it has flown in 100 tonnes of humanitarian aid -- including medicine, tents and protective gear -- to a hard-to-reach area in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo struggling with an Ebola outbreak.

The DRC declared an epidemic of the haemorrhagic fever on May 15, and the World Health Organization has declared an international health emergency over the outbreak.

The latest WHO toll from the epidemic is 452 cases in DRC and neighbouring Uganda, and 82 deaths. There is no specific vaccine or treatment for the Bundibugyo Ebola strain behind the latest outbreak.

The epidemic's epicentre is in the DRC province of Ituri, which is difficult to access on poorly maintained roads and because of the threat of armed groups that have made the region insecure.

The European Commission said in a statement that a "humanitarian air bridge" to Bunia, the main city in Ituri, it has established with UNICEF flew in the 100 tonnes of aid.

The EU commissioner for crisis management, Hadja Lahbib, on Sunday arrived at Bunia airport and called for humanitarian and health workers in the region to be allowed guaranteed access to people in need.

Pentagon raises threat of Israeli spying to 'critical': US media

The Pentagon has raised its counterintelligence threat level for Israel to its highest level, US media reported on Saturday.

The Pentagon's Defense In-



telligence Agency (DIA) said Israel's "ability to conduct human espionage and technical collection is at a 'critical level,'" NBC News said, citing US officials.

The move came after concerns that Israel had been attempting to spy on top US officials to get information on "the Trump administration's internal deliberations and decision-making on the conflicts in the Middle East," the American

network said. The New York Times cited reports of Israeli efforts to eavesdrop on senior officials, including President Donald Trump's top negotiator, Steve Witkoff, and the Pentagon's top policy official, Elbridge Colby.

The United States and Israel launched joint strikes on Iran on February 28, triggering the war. Since then, Trump and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's relationship appears to be under strain.

Trump unleashed a profanity-laced tirade over the phone at Netanyahu over Israel's threats to bomb the Lebanese capital Beirut, fearing it would undermine talks with Tehran.

Starmer will be 'part of any leadership race

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer will stand if a leadership contest is triggered, a senior minister said Sunday, after media reported Starmer had contacted key backers insisting he would run in any race.

This came after popular northern mayor Any Burnham, who is standing in a key by-election this month, said last week he would participate in any leadership race, although none has yet been triggered.

Starmer "has been absolutely clear -- were there to be a contest -- you need 81 signatures (of MPs)

to launch a contest -- he will be part of that contest," Deputy Prime Minister David Lammy told Sky News on Sunday.

The prime minister would automatically be included in any leadership ballot if he wanted to participate.

The BBC and The Sun newspaper reported Sunday, citing unnamed MPs, that Starmer has been calling key supporters this weekend to say that if there is a contest he would "fight it".

The United States said it shot down a pair of Iranian drones threatening the

threats and sporadic exchanges of fire.

Naqvi said upon his arrival Saturday that he would deliver a "special letter" from Pakistan's army chief to Iran's Ayatollah Mojtaba Khamenei, and a message from the prime minister "regarding the current situation", according to Iranian state television.

In his homily, Pope Leo said Spaniards should not look at religion as "a museum of the past to be visited, but a school of faith from which to draw even today".

Israeli airstrike on police station kills five

Gaza's civil defence service said an Israeli airstrike on a police station killed at least five people yesterday and wounded several, as violence raged unabated across the Palestinian territory.

Israel and Hamas continue to trade accusations of near-daily ceasefire violations, keeping the Gaza Strip locked in bloodshed months after a truce took effect in October.

"We just transported four martyrs and more than 17 wounded following an Israeli airstrike that targeted a police station in the Al-Noss area of

Al-Mawasi district in western Khan Yunis," the civil defence agency, which operates as a rescue force under Hamas, said in a statement.

The Gaza police directorate confirmed that Israeli warplanes struck the police station in Khan Yunis. Nasser Hospital in the area said it received five bodies of people killed in the attack. The Israeli military said it was looking into the reports.

In a separate incident, Israeli naval forces shot dead a fisherman in the early hours of Sunday, Al-Aqsa Hospital in Deir el-Balah said after receiving his body.

Sunday's bloodshed followed a deadly Saturday in which at

least 12 people died across Gaza, including a man the Israeli military identified as a Hamas "terrorist cell commander".



According to the United Nations, the vast majority of Gaza's population—more than 90% at various points during the conflict—has been displaced from their homes, often multiple times, as fighting and evacuation orders shifted across the territory. United Nations

Missing Malaysian hiker's rescue hailed a 'miracle'

The rescue of a Malaysian hiker found alive after two weeks missing in the wilderness was hailed as "a miracle" by a friend on Sunday, as authorities ended a massive search that

gripped the nation.

Indigenous Malaysians found a battered Jaslinda Saludin late Saturday in a forested area near the small town of Tapah, in central Malaysia's Perak state, some way from where she was first reported missing, local

papers said. Jaslinda, 49, described as an experienced hiker, was last seen two weeks ago while undertaking the Trans Spencer Chapman trek, an arduous 34-kilometre (21-mile) slog along the treacherous Titwangsang mountain range.

12 wounded in shooting near US festival, no arrests: police



Washington, United States

A shootout Saturday near a community festival in Toledo, Ohio left at least 12 people wounded by gunfire, with no suspects in custody, police said.

Authorities were combing the area searching for suspects, interviewing witnesses and examining cellphone video after at least two people were believed to have exchanged shots near the Old West End Festival.

"Twelve people were struck with bullets... two of them critical," Toledo Deputy Police Chief Joseph Heffernan told reporters, adding that no suspects were in custody yet.

He said it appeared there were at least two shooters involved, and that they were "probably shooting at each other."

An active search was un-

derway, and authorities were pleading with members of the community to come forward with any information that could help lead them to the shooters.

Police Lieutenant Dan Gerken said the average age of the victims was roughly in the early twenties.

He expressed alarm at the scale of the violence.

"So, 12 people being shot, that's the most -- I've been to a lot of scenes, but this was way over the top," Gerken said.

The Old West End Festival is a popular annual gathering of live music, block parties and home tours in a historic Toledo district. The gathering had a substantial police presence at the time of the shooting, officers said.

Firearms are abundant in the United States and thousands of people across the country die of gunshot wounds each year.

Russian drug suspects arrested in Bali after high-speed car chase

Indonesian authorities arrested two Russian nationals suspected of smuggling drugs into Bali after a high-speed car chase on the popular resort island, an official said yesterday.

The woman, 52, and the 40-year-old man were arrested after trying to smuggle close to eight kilograms (18 pounds) of hashish in a suitcase from Thailand, the National Narcotics Agency (BNN) said in a statement.

"We have seized the evidence, 7.8 kilograms of hashish," BNN chief Suyudi Ario Seto said.

The woman, identified by her initials "KK", arrived in Jakarta's Soekarno-Hatta airport before driving to Bali in a rental vehicle to meet the man at a seaport on Friday.

The agency said the man, identified by his initials "SK", picked up the woman and dropped her, along with the case, at an unidentified location before attempting to flee.

Officials pursued the man and said he had been driving recklessly and hit several pedestrians before being stopped by authorities.

Both were taken into custody on Friday, the agency said without providing further details.

An investigation to determine whether the pair are part of a larger syndicate is underway, BNN said.

Indonesia has some of the world's toughest anti-drug laws, including the death penalty for traffickers, but has maintained a moratorium on executions for several years.

There are dozens of traffickers on death row. Indonesia last carried out the death sentence in 2016, when one Indonesian and three Nigerians convicted of drug offences were executed by firing squad.

Two British men were sentenced in March to nine and 11 years in prison respectively after they were found guilty of smuggling cocaine into Bali.

Trump says **won't unfreeze** Iran assets before deal

US President Donald Trump said in an interview broadcast yesterday that he will not unfreeze Iranian assets before reaching an agreement with Tehran.

Asked whether he would be willing, as part of a potential agreement, to unfreeze Iranian assets or lift certain sanctions against Iran, Trump replied: "No."

"(That) comes after. If they behave, if they do a good job, we start talking," he said in the interview with NBC, recorded Friday.

Iran has demanded that billions in frozen assets be unblocked.

According to a source close to the matter, the US Treasury is considering the possibility that Iran's assets could be tapped to compensate Gulf states for damages caused by Iranian strikes.

Urges more 'surgical' strikes against Hezbollah: NBC

US President Donald Trump called for more "surgical" strikes against Hezbollah in Lebanon and said he is not demanding the conflict be included in a peace deal with Iran, in an interview broadcast Sunday.

"I'd like to see a more surgical attack on Hezbollah. I think it should be more surgical," Trump told NBC's "Meet the Press," according to a transcript of the interview recorded Friday.

"I'd like to see Lebanon have a better life," he added.

Israel carried out strikes yesterday on the southern suburbs of Beirut, a stronghold of the pro-Iranian Hezbollah,

saying it was retaliating for attacks targeting its territory despite a ceasefire that has not stopped the cycle of violence.

Asked whether he was demanding that Lebanon be included in the Iran deal, Trump replied: "No, no."

"Not at all. I'm not demanding," he said. "I think they'd like to see it, but I'm not demanding."

In the interview, Trump also said that Syrian President Ahmed al-Sharaa -- a former jihadist who has forged close ties with the United States -- would "love to help" forge an agreement in the Lebanon

conflict. "We can recommend Syria. Syria's doing a very good job of cleaning up their act. They have a very good leader," he said. "And he would love to help."

Kim's sister sends stark nuclear warning

North Korea's nuclear weapons programme is "the line of no retreat", the powerful sister of leader Kim Jong Un said in a statement carried by state media on Sunday ahead of a visit by Chinese President Xi Jinping.

Pyongyang has long insisted on its right to nuclear weapon and ballistic missile programmes, although they are forbidden under the terms of UN Security Council sanctions. It enshrined its nuclear status in its constitution in 2023.

"The DPRK's status as a nuclear weapons state is the line of no retreat," Kim's sister Kim

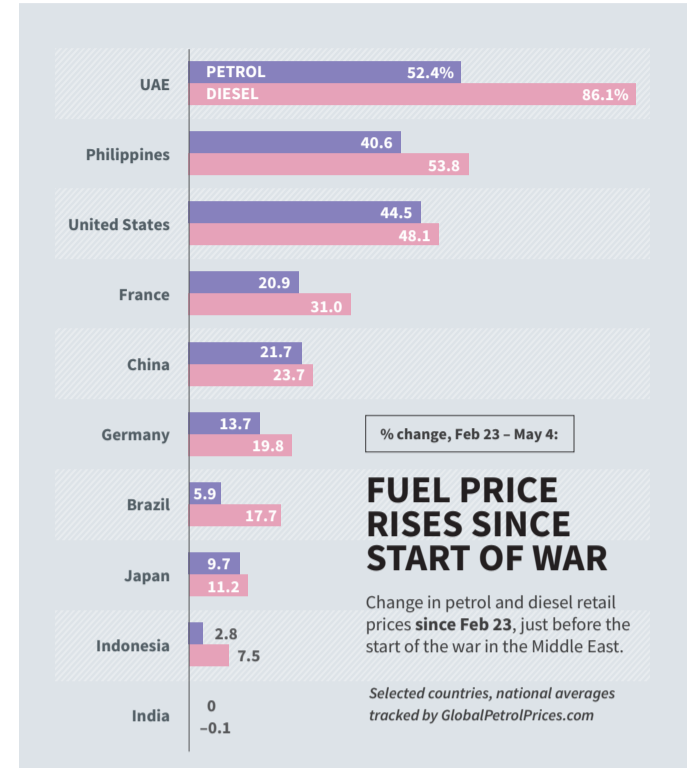

Yo Jong said in the English version of a statement published by North Korea's official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA), using the North's official name.

She also cited reported US weapons sales to South Korea, describing them as the "ceaseless arms buildup of the hostile countries", in justifying Pyongyang's efforts to strengthen its arsenal. Kim Yo Jong is a key player in the North's communications and foreign policy and her statement came on the eve of Xi's visit, which, according to state media, is scheduled to take place on Monday and Tuesday.

OPEC+ increases production quotas for July

OPEC+ ministers decided yesterday to increase oil quotas by a total 188,000 barrels per day for July, in a move analysts said would be unlikely to have an impact on prices sent higher by the Mideast war.

Jorge Leon, analyst at Rystad Energy, said ahead of the expected increase that it "means very little while the Strait of Hormuz remains closed".

He added: "The market is not short of quota announcements; it is short of physical barrels that can actually move. In that sense, the 188,000 barrels per day increase would be more of a policy signal than a real supply boost."

The hiked production output was agreed yesterday in a video meeting of oil ministers from key OPEC+ countries Saudi Arabia, Russia, Iraq, Kuwait, Kazakhstan, Algeria and Oman, a statement from the

organisation said. The increase was similar to ones decided in previous months.

The OPEC+ statement said the latest agreed hike was "to support oil market stability" but that the seven countries also saw an opportunity "to accelerate their compensation" in a time of historically high oil prices.

It added that the ministers "reaffirmed the importance of adopting a cautious approach and retaining full flexibility to increase, pause or reverse the phase out of the voluntary production adjustments, including reversing the previously implemented voluntary adjustments announced in November 2023".

Leon, at Rystad Energy, said that OPEC+ was wary in case the Mideast war changes, and Iran's stranglehold on the Strait of Hormuz eases.

"When the Strait of Hormuz reopens, the market could move very quickly from fear of shortage to fear of surplus," he said.

"Returning OPEC+ supply, a stronger US shale response and weaker demand after a period of very high prices could leave the market with a very large oversupply problem," he said.

Sustainable jet fuel too costly and scarce, airline group warns

AFP | Rio De Janeiro, Brazil

Aviation fuel from non-petroleum sources remains difficult to find and still far too expensive to bring about the de-carbonization of air travel, the world's major airlines said Saturday at a conference in Brazil.

Global production of so-called sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) is expected to reach some 2.4 million tons in 2026, only about 0.8 percent of airline consumption, according to the International Air Transport Association.

"It looks to be another disappointing year for SAF production," Willie Walsh, the director general of IATA, which represents about 370 airlines, said in a statement.

He noted that the sharp rise in fuel prices caused by the ongoing war in the Middle East has not boosted awareness of the supply shortage.

"We have yet to see either

the energy shock, the need to develop energy independence and jobs, or the urgency to mitigate climate change materialize in the incentives needed to create a viable SAF market," Walsh said.

China holds 'special operation' near Taiwan after Japan-Philippines sea border talks

China held a "law enforcement operation" in waters east of Taiwan following recent talks between Japan and the Philippines to draw a boundary there, state media reported on Saturday.

day. Tokyo and Manila said last month they would start formal talks "to delimit the maritime boundary" of an economic zone and continental shelf between them, angering Beijing.

China called the talks "illegal" and has claimed exclusive control over the waters concerned.

On Saturday, Beijing's transport ministry organised maritime police from coastal provinces

Fujian and Guangdong to "conduct a special maritime traffic law enforcement operation in waters east of Taiwan Island", state news agency Xinhua said.

The report did not give details on the operation, including how long it lasted or whether it was still ongoing, and it did not say whether maritime police dispatched ships to the area.

The operation was "a necessary action taken against Japan and the Philippines' unilateral announcement they would start

"negotiations on delimiting a maritime boundary" near Taiwan, Xinhua added.

Taiwan said Wednesday it should be consulted on the Japan-Philippines talks.

Manila and Tokyo's shared grievances over Chinese maritime territorial claims have seen them draw increasingly close in recent years.

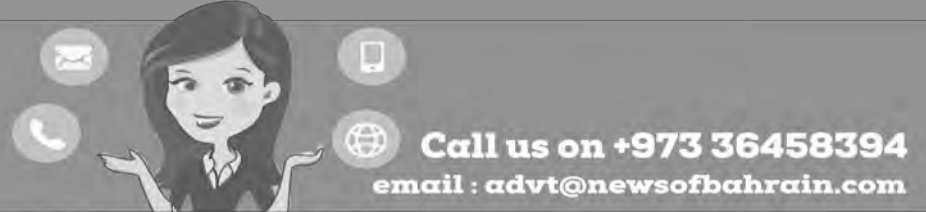

Qatar advances human rights action plan

Discussions focus on aligning policies with legislation and best practices

Consultations on the National Human Rights Action Plan for 2026-2030 continued on Sunday in the capital, as Qatar moves forward with preparations for its next phase of rights-based policy development.

The sessions, organised by the committee responsible for drafting the plan, were held in Doha and attended by the Attorney General, Dr Issa bin Saad Al Jafali Al Nuaimi.

The Office of the Public Prosecution hosted the latest consultation meeting, which was also attended by the Minister of State for International Cooperation, Dr Maryam bint Ali bin Nasser Al Misnad.

The discussions reviewed

topics related to the responsibilities of the Public Prosecution, alongside proposals aimed at shaping the upcoming national plan. Participants examined ways to ensure the framework aligns with domestic legislation, national policies, and international best practices in the field of human rights.

Officials present at the meeting underlined the importance of continued coordination between national institutions. They said such cooperation reflects Qatar's participatory approach to developing and implementing national strategies.

They also highlighted the need to strengthen institutional integration in order to better support and protect human



rights across the country.

At the conclusion of the session, participants reaffirmed that the National Human Rights Action Plan serves as a comprehensive national framework for advancing human

rights protections. They added that the Public Prosecution remains a key partner in national efforts to further develop the human rights system and reinforce the rule of law and justice in the state.

Doha-Cairo coordination on Middle East stability

Focus on Gaza, Lebanon and occupied Palestinian territories

The Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of Qatar, Shaikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim Al Thani, held talks in Cairo with Egypt's Foreign Minister, Badr Abdelatty, focusing on regional diplomacy and efforts to reduce escalating tensions across the Middle East.

During the meeting, both sides reviewed bilateral relations between Qatar and Egypt, and discussed ways to strengthen cooperation in areas of mutual interest. The talks underscored what officials described as a shared commitment to maintaining open channels of communication between the two Arab



states.

A significant part of the discussions centred on ongoing mediation efforts between the United States and Iran, as regional actors continue to seek ways to prevent further escalation in the Gulf.

The two ministers also addressed recent developments in Lebanon, the Gaza Strip, and the occupied Palestinian territories, where tensions remain high amid continued instability and intermittent violence.

According to statements from the meeting, both sides stressed the importance of coordinated diplomatic efforts aimed at de-escalation. They also highlighted the need to support mediation initiatives that could pave the way for more sustainable regional stability.

Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman bin Jassim Al Thani emphasised the importance of all parties engaging constructively with ongoing mediation efforts. He called for renewed dialogue aimed at addressing the underlying causes of the crises, with the objective of reaching long-term agreements that could prevent renewed cycles of escalation.

Qatar urges peaceful resolution to Syrian crisis



Qatar's Minister of State at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs held a phone call with Syria's Foreign Minister, during which they discussed bilateral relations, developments in Syria, and ongoing regional mediation efforts involving the United States and Iran.

Mohammed bin Abdulaziz bin Saleh Al-Khulaifi spoke with Asaad Al-Shai-bani during the call on Saturday, according to an official statement.

The two ministers reviewed relations between Doha and Damascus, and explored ways to strengthen cooperation across different fields. The discussion also covered the

latest political and security developments inside Syria. Both sides reportedly exchanged views on regional dynamics, paying particular attention to efforts aimed at reducing tensions across the wider Middle East.

During the call, the Qatari minister reaffirmed Doha's support for Syria's sovereignty, territorial integrity, and the "aspirations of its people" for stability, development, and prosperity.

He also stressed the importance of continued engagement in diplomatic efforts, urging all parties to respond positively to mediation initiatives currently underway.

Gulf Bloc Stresses Somalia's Security and Sovereignty



The Secretary-General of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) reaffirmed the bloc's support for Somalia's security, stability, sovereignty and territorial integrity during a meeting with the Somali ambassador to Saudi Arabia.

Jassim Mohammed Al-Budaiwi met Mohammed Amin Shaikh Osman, Somalia's ambassador to Saudi Arabia, on Sunday at the GCC General Secretariat headquarters in Riyadh.

The talks focused on strengthening relations between the GCC and Somalia and exploring ways to further develop cooperation in areas of mutual interest.

Both sides also reviewed the latest regional and international

developments and discussed a range of shared concerns.

During the meeting, Mr Al-Budaiwi stressed the GCC's continued commitment to supporting Somalia in efforts aimed at reinforcing its stability and safeguarding its sovereignty. He said such efforts were essential to ensuring a dignified life for the Somali people.

The Somali ambassador, in turn, expressed appreciation for the GCC states' continued support across various sectors and their broader efforts to assist Somalia at multiple levels.

The meeting comes amid ongoing diplomatic engagement between Gulf states and Somalia, reflecting efforts to deepen cooperation and coordination on regional issues.

Bahrain boxers depart for Bosnia camp and tournament

Bahrain's youth and junior national boxing teams have departed for Bosnia and Herzegovina for a 20-day training camp as part of the Bahrain Boxing Federation's efforts to develop the Kingdom's emerging talent.

The camp is a key component of the federation's national team programme. It aims to raise the boxers' technical and competitive standards through international exposure, high-level training and valuable sparring opportunities.

The Bahrainis will conclude the camp by competing in the International Olympic Hopes Boxing Tournament in Sarajevo from June 18 to 21.

The event is among the leading developmental competitions on the international calendar for U15, U17 and U19 boxers. It offers young athletes elite-level experience and serves as an important step towards future Olympic ambitions.

The Olympic Hopes series is part of the international

pathway overseen by World Boxing, the governing body recognised by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) to manage boxing at the Los Angeles 2028 Olympic Games.

A strong field of boxers and national teams from around the world is expected in Sarajevo. The tournament also serves as an important preparation platform for upcoming major youth events, including the European Championships in Budva, Montenegro.

The Bahraini delegation is led by national team head coach and high-performance coach John Conlon. Assistant coach and team manager Mohammed Naseem is also accompanying the squad.

The team travelling to Bosnia and Herzegovina includes Saif Ahmed, Hassan Jamsheer, Ibrahim Amin, James Ingham, Yousif Moosa, Mohammed Moamen, Ali Aman, Jayden Price and Mohammed Attiya.

Also joining the delegation is Maryam Khamis. She will take part in the training camp as part of her development programme but will not compete in the tournament.

Zverev ends wait for Grand Slam title with **French Open** triumph

Alexander Zverev finally secured his maiden Grand Slam title with a dramatic five-set victory over Italy's Flavio Cobolli in the French Open final on Sunday.

The second seed became the first German man to win a major tournament since Boris Becker at the 1996 Australian Open with a 6-1, 4-6, 6-4, 6-7 (5/7), 6-1 victory after four hours and 16 minutes.

"This court is so special to me in so many ways... but now finally, it's a happy end," said Zverev, who suffered a season-ending ankle injury in the 2022 semi-final against Rafael Nadal on Court Philippe Chatrier, where he was also edged out in five sets by Carlos Alcaraz in the 2024 final.

It was Zverev's fourth Grand Slam final and second at Roland Garros after some heartbreaking near misses in his career.

"We've been through losses, we've been losers at times as well in the most important moments," he said during the trophy presentation, turning to his team.

"But at the end of the day, we're Grand Slam champions now, and that's what counts."

Cobolli, the 10th seed, was bidding to become the first Italian man since Adriano Panatta to win the French Open in 50 years.

The 24-year-old had never even played a Slam semi-final before, let alone a final, after his last-four opponent Matteo Arnaldi withdrew from the tournament through illness.

"It's not easy for me to talk right now," said Cobolli after receiving his runner-up trophy from Panatta, before addressing Zverev.

"I'm happy for you, but I'm also sad because I was close and I feel it. So now you've achieved your dream, let me win the next time."

Both players appeared to struggle with nerves at various points in the match, especially Cobolli during an error-strewn first set.

But Zverev's greater experience showed in a deciding set that was far tenser than the scoreline suggested, as he managed to get over the line.

The 29-year-old was handed a golden opportunity to break his Grand Slam duck by the injury-enforced absence of reigning champion Alcaraz and surprise early exits for Jannik Sinner and Novak Djokovic.

The world

number three was not always in control, making 54 unforced errors, but did enough to finally shed the tag of being one of the best players to have never won a major.

Zverev had previously also lost in six Slam quarter-finals and seven semi-finals, alongside his three final defeats.

The most agonising miss of all was his first major final when he blew a two-set lead and failed to serve for the championship against Dominic Thiem at the 2020 US Open.

The now-retired Thiem was watching on from the stands at Roland Garros as Zverev belatedly put the memories of that match to bed six years later.

Cobolli's nervy start

Cobolli made a nervy start and appeared to be struggling to deal with the occasion as the first set quickly got away from him in 39 minutes, making 16 unforced errors.

He managed to settle into the match with three successive holds of serve in the second set and then made his move out of nowhere to break in the seventh game.

Zverev had been completely untroubled on serve previously, but produced a scrappy game featuring two double-faults and a wild forehand on break point before turning to gesticulate angrily towards his coaching staff.

Cobolli started to grow in confidence and served out the set to breathe life into the final.

A higher-quality third set disappeared from Cobolli's grasp in the 10th game, though, as from 30-0 up, he lost four points in a row, including a poor forehand that flew well wide on set point.

The world number 14, who will climb into the top 10 for the first time next week, hit straight back with a break in the opening game of the fourth set.

He could not pull away in the set, though, as both players ended up being broken twice, including Cobolli when he served for it at 5-4.

But the Italian rallied himself to push it into a tie-break, which he took to force a decider with a blistering forehand winner on his second set point.

Following a delay before the start of the final act after Cobolli left the court, Zverev struck first blood with a break in the first game.

Cobolli's hopes were finally all but extinguished when he missed a break-back point and then dropped serve again to slip 3-0 down.

Zverev staved off three more break points in the fourth game and eased to victory from there, falling to the clay in celebration after Cobolli shanked an overhead on his second championship point.

Merchuk, Abramishvili shine on supporting card

Russia's Marina Merchuk scored a major upset over top-ranked women's strawweight contender and hometown heroine Monika Kucinic, earning the biggest win of her career. The two fighters engaged in a back-and-forth striking battle, trading shots at the center of the cage from start to finish. Merchuk's

clean counterpunching proved decisive, as she eked out a split decision on the scorecards.

Second-ranked bantamweight contender Lasha Abramishvili preserved his unbeaten BRAVE CF run with a dominant showing against No. 5-ranked Brice "Lion Kid" Picaud in a 63-kilogram catchweight tilt. BRAVE CF 106 opened with a solid preliminary card featuring five high-octane matchups that set the tone for the evening at Hala Tivoli.

Local favorite Domen "Armbat Hulk" Drnovšek endured a demanding test against Hungary's István "Assassin" Juhász in a 73-kilogram catchweight duel. After three closely contested rounds, Drnovšek's steady output and persistence were enough to earn a hard-fought unanimous decision victory.

Germany's Timon Huss delivered one of the most remarkable finishes at BRAVE CF 106, needing just 50 seconds to stop Slovenia's Domen Vergles in their light heavyweight tiff. A thunderous right cross dropped Vergles early, before Huss closed the contest with follow-up punches on the ground to score a first-round knockout.

In a clash between promotional newcomers, Slovenian

featherweight Edin Ramdedovic recovered from an early storm to defeat Hungary's Sándor Polik. After weathering a strong opening round, Ramdedovic seized control in the second stanza and latched on to a tight guillotine choke for the submission win.

Slovenian standout Maja Drnovšek extended her momentum inside the BRAVE CF cage with another commanding display. Relying on her grappling prowess, Drnovšek wrapped up a first-round arm-triangle choke submission against Poland's Wiktoria Wojciechowska in their women's flyweight bout.

Opening the event, Italy's Leonardo "Leoleo" Medeot produced a well-rounded performance against Slovenian prospect Tilen "RG" Bregant in an amateur middleweight bout. Medeot dictated the tempo across all phases to walk away with a unanimous decision.

Antonelli wins fifth straight in Monaco

Hamilton finish second as crashes, penalties and retirements disrupted the race

- Verstappen engine failure at start
- Norris battery problems end race

Teenager Kimi Antonelli extended his lead in the drivers' world championship with a commanding and nerveless victory for Mercedes ahead of Ferrari's Lewis Hamilton in a protracted, incident-hit Monaco Grand Prix yesterday.

It was the 19-year-old Italian's record fifth consecutive victory this season, making him the first Italian to achieve that feat since Alberto Ascari in 1952. He hoisted his 66 points clear of Hamilton in the title race.

"The car was a peach today," he said after becoming the

youngest winner of Formula One's classic blue riband event.

"An incredible day -- one of those when we had incredible

pace to give me confidence to push."

In a stoppage-strewn race punctuated by crashes, retirements and a series of penalties, Antonelli came home 6.271 seconds clear of seven-time champion Hamilton with Red Bull's Isack Hadjar third ahead of Oscar Piastri of McLaren.

Racing Bulls' Liam Lawson and Arvid Lindblad finished a career-best fifth and sixth respectively, while Sergio Perez in 10th scored the new Cadillac team's first point.

Hamilton equalled Ayrton Senna's record total of eight Monaco podiums.

Four-time champion Max Verstappen of Red Bull suffered an engine failure at the start and retired, as did world champion Lando Norris when his McLaren had battery problems.

Antonelli made a perfect getaway. Behind him, Verstappen had a power failure as he at-



tempted to start.

"What can I do?" asked Verstappen. "Just bring it home," came the Red Bull reply. His problem was diagnosed as engine failure. It was his eighth first-lap retirement.

For Antonelli, the youngest-ever pole sitter in Monaco, his dream start enabled a run in clear air to establish a lead of 5.4 seconds by lap 10.

Norris had a lap one setback when, after squabbling with Piastri for sixth, he was passed by Pierre Gasly on the outside of

St Devote.

In the first round of pit stops, Hamilton was one of several drivers given a five-second penalty for speeding in the pit-lane.

After revelling in his supremacy, Antonelli came in a second time after 37 laps, easily retaining his lead before Norris's problems ended with a call to retire on lap 46.

The young Italian was racing with such ease that race engineer Peter Bonington told him: "Kimi, fastest lap! No, we don't need them."

'No rear brakes'

On lap 60, Lance Stroll smacked the barriers at Antony Noghes to prompt a safety car.

The race re-started on lap 66 and, as Antonelli pulled clear with Hamilton in pursuit, the luckless Leclerc crashed at the same spot. "I'm not taking the blame for that," he said. "It's like I had no rear brakes at all."

Bahrain to host inaugural Water Sports Federation Cup

Bahrain seek alternatives after Syria friendly is called off

The Bahrain Football Association has confirmed the cancellation of the international friendly against Syria that was scheduled for tomorrow in Antalya, Turkey, as part of the national team's overseas training camp.

The fixture was called off due to travel difficulties faced by the Syrian national team delegation, which prevented them from fulfilling the scheduled match during the current FIFA international window.

Following the development, the Bahrain FA has begun assessing available options to ensure the continuation of the training camp programme in Antalya, with the technical staff aiming to fully achieve the objectives set out by head coach Dragan Talajic during the international break.

The squad held a training session in Antalya yesterday, having previously faced the Georgian national side in Tbilisi in a friendly that ended in a 2-0 defeat.

The current preparations form part of Bahrain's build-up to upcoming assignments, most notably the 27th Arabian Gulf Cup scheduled to take place in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, from 23 September to 6 October, as well as continued preparation for the AFC Asian Cup (7 January 2027-5 February 2027).

Al Kuwait fend off Al Najma comeback in Asian Club League

Al Kuwait survived a spirited second-half fightback from Bahrain's Al Najma to secure a 30-26 victory in the 28th Asian Men's Club League Championship yesterday at Saad Al Abdullah Hall in Sabah Al Salem, Kuwait.

The Kuwaiti side appeared in complete control after a dominant opening half, taking a 16-8 lead into the break.

They were led by Victor Iturriza's seven goals, while Filip Kuzmanovski added six. Saif Aladwani and Vladan Lipovina chipped in with five goals apiece, and goalkeeper Ali Safar made 11 saves.

Najma, however, showed the resilience that has established them as one of Asia's premier clubs. Competing under new head coach Abdulrahman Mohamed, who recently succeeded Ali Al Falahi, the Bahrainis responded strongly after the interval and outscored their opponents 18-14 in the second half.

Mujtaba Alzaimaar led Najma's charge with six goals, while Ahmed Fadhul and Hasan Madan each scored four times

from four attempts. Hasan Alsamahiji contributed three goals as the Bahraini club steadily chipped away at the deficit.

Trailing by as many as 10 goals, Najma battled back to within three goals in the closing stages and threatened an unlikely comeback. But timely strikes

from Iturriza and Kuzmanovski helped Al Kuwait maintain their cushion and see out the victory.

The opening half ultimately proved decisive. Al Kuwait raced to a 7-1 lead after 11 minutes as Najma struggled to break down their opponents' compact 6-0 defensive formation. The

hosts extended their advantage to 12-4 midway through the period and never relinquished control despite Najma's improved display after the restart.

The defeat marks a challenging start to the continental campaign for Najma, who are seeking a third Asian club title. The Bahraini giants previously lifted the championship trophy in 2017 and 2023, finished runners-up in 2015 and 2022, and claimed third place in 2001.

Despite the setback, their second-half performance offered encouraging signs ahead of their next fixture as they continue their pursuit of another deep run in Asia's premier club competition.

Only seven squads remain in the event after China's CHA withdrew, meaning all teams are playing a single round-robin in the tournament's preliminary stage.

The Bahraini side will face a quick turnaround when they meet Qatar's Al Duhail today at 4pm at the same venue, in search of their first points of the tournament. They will later take on UAE's Sharjah, Qatar's Al Arabi, Kuwait's Burgan Club, and Saudi Arabia's Khaleej Club.
