Mohammed Ali Al Qaed, Chief Executive of the Information & eGovernment Authority (iGA) and Chairman of the programme's evaluation committee, attended the visit.

The Unified Customs Clearance Centre, one of the first customs service centres to join the Government Service Centres Evaluation Programme launched in 2017, achieved 100% compliance with the programme's standards. The centre also earned the Silver Shield in 2019 and the Gold Shield every year from 2020 to 2024, highlighting its continued excellence in government service delivery.

LMRA Digital Services Expanded



The Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) launched an instant digital service allowing labour supply agencies to automatically cancel their licences once their commercial registration is cancelled through the Si-jilat system. The new service removes paperwork requirements and reduces processing time, supporting Bahrain's wider digital transformation efforts to provide faster and more efficient government services.

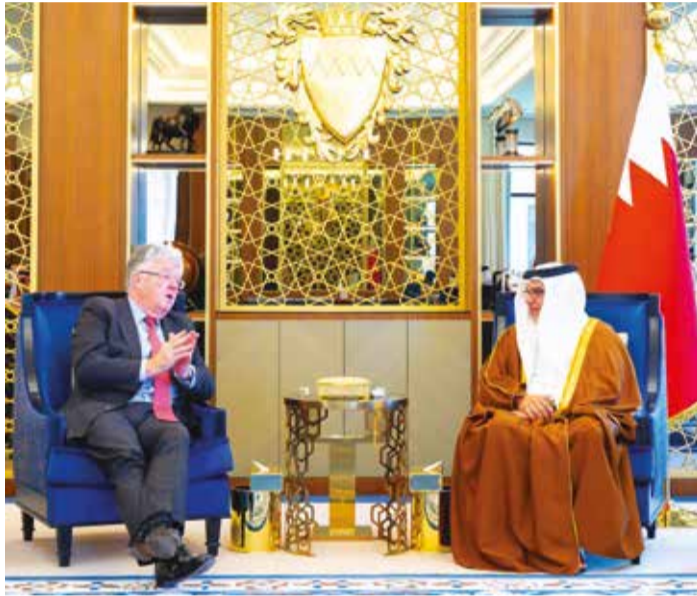

Three Tankers Hit Near Hormuz

Oil surges, equities stumble amid renewed shipping threats and tech sector jitters

Oil prices jumped more than two percent after three tankers were struck by projectiles or drones near the Strait of Hormuz within 24 hours, reigniting fears over global energy supplies. The British maritime security agency UK-MTO confirmed the attacks, raising doubts about the durability of the US-Iran ceasefire.

Investor confidence in artificial intelligence stocks took a fresh hit. The Nasdaq Composite shed over one percent in New York, while the Dow briefly touched



an all-time high before turning negative. European markets in Frankfurt and Paris also closed lower.

Seoul led Asian losses as Samsung shares plunged more than six percent, despite the chipmaker reporting an 1,800-percent surge in second-quarter operating profit. Analysts warned that in richly valued markets, strong earnings alone are no longer sufficient—investors now demand clear guidance and lasting pricing power.

Markets also awaited the Federal Reserve meeting minutes for clues on future interest rates.

Wrong Transfer, Right Trouble

Keeping mistaken money is a crime in Bahrain

A person who pockets a mistaken Money transfer can be jailed for up to two years, a lawyer has said.

Jassim Al Issa told The Daily Tribune that money sent to the wrong account does not become the property of the person who receives it.

The rule is clear, he said. The cash still belongs to its owner and must be returned once the error is known.

Mobile payment options offered by different apps have become one of Bahrain's most used payment tools, letting people move money in seconds by phone. But a wrong number, a wrong account, or a similar name can send cash to a stranger.

Lawyer Al Issa said the law draws a line between innocent receipt and unlawful taking. Merely receiving money by mistake is not a crime. Keeping it after knowing it is not yours can be. He said Article 396 of Bahrain's Penal Code covers anyone who takes, with intent to own, money that came into their hands by error or force majeure.

The penalty can reach two years in jail, a fine of up to BD200, or both, if the court finds the offence has been made out.

Lawyer Al Issa said the recipient need not have caused the mistake. It is enough that they know the money belongs to someone else and still refuse to return it. An error that begins with an innocent transfer can then end as a criminal case. The sender can also bring a civil claim to recover the sum and seek damages if they suffered loss because the money was held from them, he said.

Lawyer Al Issa urged anyone who sends money to the wrong account to keep proof of the transfer, contact the recipient or the bank, and go to the proper authorities if the money is not returned.

Those who receive money by mistake should leave it untouched and return it, or ask the bank to deal with it.

Hamad Town dog problem triggers ministry action

Field operations launched at archaeological sites after residents raise repeated alarms

The Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture launched field operations against stray dogs gathering at archaeological burial mounds in Hamad Town, following repeated complaints channelled through the Northern Municipal Council.

Northern Municipal Council member Abdulla Mubarak Bilal Al Qobaisi flagged the issue after residents reported dog gatherings inside Block 1207's ancient cemeteries, particularly between the fourth and seventh roundabouts — a concern sharpest after dark.

Swift action The ministry referred the complaint to its contracted animal-control company, which verified and mapped the affected sites before beginning targeted removal.

Officials outlined a broader strategy: a new 30-month contract covering capture, sterilisation and temporary shelter at Hafira, plus incoming legislation to register pets by microchip.

Delegation explores world-class firefighter preparation methods and technology

The visit followed high-level meetings with NYC Fire Commissioner Lillian Bonsignore and provided the Bahraini delegation with a first-hand view of one of the world's most advanced firefighting training institutions. During the tour, Lieutenant General Al Hassan and accompanying officials explored the Academy's specialised training facilities and gained insight into the methods and standards used to prepare firefighters.

The delegation was briefed on the Academy's advanced equipment and modern training systems designed to support realistic, scenario-based exercises covering a wide range of emergency situations. The visit highlighted the facility's simulation environments, which recreate real-life challenges including structural fires, hazardous material incidents, high-rise evacuations, and mass casualty scenarios.

Two Women Indicted for Trafficking

Victim says she was lured to Bahrain, stripped of her passport and exploited

Two Asian women have been referred to the High Criminal Court on charges of human trafficking, with the first hearing scheduled for July 20, following an investigation by the Public Prosecution.

The case began after a woman reported that she had been recruited to work in Bahrain but, upon arrival, had her passport

confiscated and was allegedly forced into illegal activities.

The victim was placed in a shelter run by the National Committee to Combat Human Trafficking while prosecutors gathered evidence, including judicial assistance from the first defendant's home country, before referring both women to trial.

Verdict Awaits in Car Fraud Case

22-year-old accused of forging documents and selling a vehicle without the owner's consent

The First Major Criminal Court has scheduled July 28 to issue its verdict in the case of a 22-year-old man accused of forging official documents to transfer ownership of two vehicles before selling one of them.

According to prosecutors, the defendant allegedly forged the owner's signature on vehicle transfer forms submitted to the General Directorate of Traffic and misappropriated

vehicles entrusted to him under a power of attorney.

During the latest hearing, the defence sought the defendant's acquittal, while his brother submitted a notarised waiver from the victim. The case stems from a complaint by a Gulf-based businessman who claimed the defendant unlawfully transferred ownership of his vehicles after being entrusted with registering and insuring them in Bahrain.

Egyptian Faces Trial Over Pregabalin Smuggling

Court to deliver verdict on July 28 as defendant remains in custody

The First High Criminal Court set July 28 to deliver its verdict in the case of a 40-year-old Egyptian man accused of importing and possessing the psychotropic substance Pregabalin with the intent to traffic. The court also ordered that the defendant remain in custody.

According to the Public Prosecution, customs officers at Bahrain International Airport intercepted the suspect on February 10, 2026, after discovering 355 Pregabalin pills hidden

inside a dietary supplement container in his luggage and another container concealed in his trouser pocket.

Investigators said the defendant admitted bringing the pills into Bahrain to sell to a friend for BD250. Laboratory analysis confirmed the seized pills contained the psychotropic substance Pregabalin. Authorities said investigations indicated the pills had been purchased abroad for resale in Bahrain, although the intended buyer was not identified.

Guard Tied, Warehouse Looted

Court to deliver judgment on July 28 over armed warehouse robbery

The First High Criminal Court set July 28 to deliver its verdict in the case of three Asian men accused of robbing a construction materials warehouse after assaulting and restraining a security guard.

Prosecutors said the suspects, aided by unidentified accomplices, attacked the guard at the company's Ras Zuwaid premises in February, tied him to a chair,

stole his mobile phone, and then broke into the warehouse to take electrical cables and other items.

Police later recovered around 700 kilograms of stolen electrical cables after tracing the suspects through a scrap dealer. Three men were arrested while a fourth escaped. Investigators also found that the bus allegedly used in the crime had altered licence plates to avoid detection.

Cargo Flight From Sharjah Disappears Near Karachi

A Pakistan-registered K2 Airways Boeing 737 cargo aircraft disappeared from radar on Tuesday night after reporting a navigational system malfunction while flying from Sharjah to Karachi, prompting authorities to launch a large-scale search and rescue operation.



proximately 155 nautical miles west of Karachi.

According to the Pakistan Airports Authority (PAA), the cargo flight reported a navigational system problem at 9:18pm Pakistan Standard Time (PST) as it approached Pakistani airspace. The Karachi Area Control Centre (ACC) immediately provided navigational assistance to the aircraft.

Following the incident, the Rescue Coordination Centre was activated and a coordinated search and rescue operation was launched at sea with the participation of multiple agencies to locate the missing aircraft.

Three minutes later, at 9:21pm PST, air traffic controllers observed the aircraft making a rapid descent and an abrupt change in heading on radar. Shortly afterwards, both radar contact and radio communication were lost ap-

proximately 155 nautical miles west of Karachi. Officials said the aircraft was carrying five crew members. Their condition remains unknown.

Authorities said search operations are ongoing, while the reported navigational system malfunction and the subsequent loss of contact are under investigation.

Israel, Lebanon to hold talks in Rome in mid-July

Israeli and Lebanese ambassadors are due to hold direct talks in Rome this month, Italy's foreign ministry said yesterday, after several rounds of discussions in Washington aimed at de-escalation.

"We welcome with pleasure the announcement that the next round of talks between Israel and Lebanon mediated by the US will take place in Rome," Foreign Minister Antonio Tajani said on X.

A ministry spokesman said the talks would take place at the ambassador level on July 15 and 16.

This round of talks will be the sixth since spring between the two neighbours, which do not have diplomatic relations and are technically in a state of war.

The two countries and the United States signed a framework agreement last month aimed at "lasting peace", five days after the entry into force of a fragile ceasefire in the fighting between the Israeli army and the pro-Iranian Hezbollah that has been going on since March 2.

'We will consider' selling F-35s to Turkey

US President Donald Trump said yesterday that Washington would consider selling F-35 fighter jets to Turkey after booting it out of the programme in 2019 over Ankara's purchase of a Russian system.



"That's a decision we're going to make... it's a great plane, the best plane by far and it's certainly something we will consider," Trump said, sitting next to Turkish counterpart Recep Tayyip Erdogan after landing in Ankara for a NATO summit.

CAATSA sanctions, Trump said: "We're going to be taking the sanctions off."

"We don't want to sanction friends," he added.

Sitting next to him, Erdogan said he was confident Trump would resolve the issue and end the dispute.

Turkey has long sought to resolve the question of its readmittance to the F-35 programme and the lifting of US sanctions that have soured ties and hampered Turkish defence projects, and has asked if he would lift the

"Mr. Trump has also personally given us his word on this matter," he said through a translator.

"On this issue, Mr. Trump always stands by his word. Here again, God willing, I believe a favourable decision on the F-35s will emerge from this leaders' summit."

Indonesia, India ink long-range missile deal

India will supply Indonesia with long-range missiles, an Indian official said yesterday as their leaders agreed to deepen ties in defence, critical minerals and other areas.

President Prabowo Subianto is hosting Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Jakarta during a three-day state visit, with a deal on the BrahMos missile system topping the agenda.

An agreement for "cooperation on BrahMos System" was struck during the visit, Indian foreign ministry spokesman Randhir Jaiswal said in a post on X.

The two countries also reached an agreement on air-to-air missile cooperation that "enhances technology collaboration and defence capabilities", he said.

Details on the deal were not

disclosed, and an Indonesian defence ministry spokesman did not respond to a request for

comment. "Today, we reached an agreement to enhance defence ex-

changes, disaster management, and industrial cooperation," Modi told reporters.

The coast guards of the two countries will also work together on maritime safety and security in the Indian Ocean, Modi said.

Asia's two biggest democracies also agreed to work together on critical minerals -- which Indonesia produces in abundance -- and steel.

Prabowo said Indonesia and India viewed economic cooperation as "one of the main pillars" of bilateral relations.

They also welcomed efforts to restore the Prambanan temple, a UNESCO World Heritage Site in Yogyakarta.

Modi is set to visit Australia and New Zealand after concluding his Indonesia visit, according to Indian foreign ministry.

Trump berates NATO, praises Erdogan as summit starts

US President Donald Trump praised his "chemistry" with Turkish leader Recep Tayyip Erdogan as he arrived in Ankara for a NATO summit yesterday, while hitting out at European allies for their response to his war in Iran.

Trump was greeted personally by Erdogan on the tarmac as he descended from Air Force One, before being escorted through the empty streets of the Turkish capital by a guard of riders on white horses.

The summit comes at a fraught time for the 77-year-old transatlantic alliance, as Trump has lashed out at allies and Washington steps back from Europe.

"I was very disappointed with NATO," Trump said, sitting next to Erdogan at the Turkish leader's vast presidential palace.

"Frankly, if it (the summit) weren't held in Turkey, where my friend happens to be a very strong leader, a very strong person, it's possible that I wouldn't have attended."

'Testing'

The US president was clearly still smarting over the restrictions some allies placed on US forces using bases at the start of the Iran conflict.

"I was testing to see whether or not they'd be there, because

US President Donald Trump appeared to have turned the page on a diplomatic row with Italy's Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni Tuesday as he landed in Ankara for a key NATO summit.

"I think she's a nice person, actually," he said at a joint press conference with President Recep Tayyip Erdogan.

"We had a bad relationship, folks. It

became a little bad because she refused to help us... She refused to get involved with the Hormuz Strait," he said, reiterating his disappointment over Europe's reluctance to play a role in the US-Israeli war on Iran.



"I like her, I think she's a nice person actually, but I think she made a mistake.. she just wasn't there for us and I wasn't happy about that," he said.

I've long said that we helped them," he said.

"Italy turned us down, and Germany turned us down, and France turned us down."

Trump also risked reopening another old wound with NATO when he reiterated his stance that Greenland "should be controlled by the United States, not by Denmark".

NATO chief Mark Rutte has insisted European countries are "delivering" by bolstering military budgets and moving to take more responsibility for the defence of their continent in the face of Russia.

Zelensky makes pitch

Trump spoke to Russian President Vladimir Putin ahead of the NATO gathering and is expected to meet Ukraine's Volodymyr Zelensky on the summit sidelines on Wednesday.

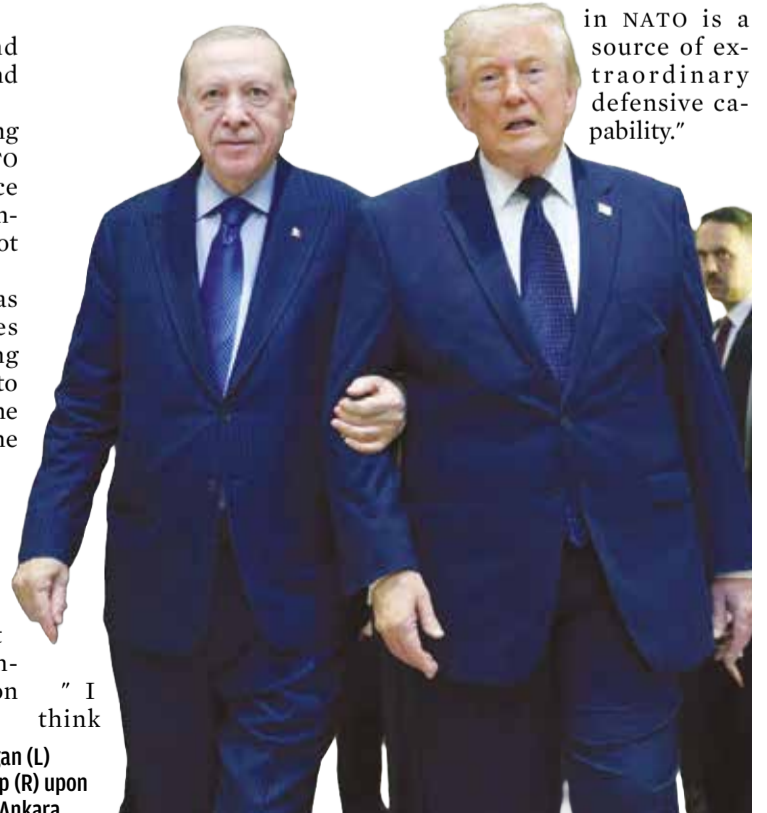

Fireworks made Washington world's most polluted city

Washington was briefly the most polluted major city in the world, according to IQAir data, after a massive Independence Day fireworks show touted by the Trump administration as "awesome."

Pyrotechnico, the company hired by the White House's Freedom 250 organization, had set a goal of breaking a world record by launching 850,000 fireworks, though experts had warned that setting off so many in just 40 minutes could pose serious health risks.

Washington's pollution monitors began registering spikes around 8pm on Saturday, signaling local fireworks displays. But levels of fine particulate matter rose dramatically during the main show, leaving people watching downwind with an obscured view as smoke came billowing their way.

Fine particle pollution -- defined as smoke and particles 2.5 micrometers in diameter that can penetrate deep into the lungs, causing acute injury but also long-term disease -- peaked at over 200 micrograms per cubic meter at one monitoring site, city-collected data reviewed by AFP showed.

The Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) 24-hour standard caps exposure at 35 micrograms per cubic meter.

"Code Purple" alerts, denoting air quality considered very

unhealthy for everyone, not just at-risk groups, blanketed much of the city as well as the wider region, including neighboring Virginia and Maryland.

And according to data compiled by Swiss company IQAir, which relies on a variety of public and private sources, Washington was the world's most polluted major city between around 3am to 5am on Sunday July 5. It is currently in 41st position, with Jakarta, Kinshasa and Addis Ababa occupying the first three spots.



This year's El Nino set to become record-breaker

The current El Nino weather phenomenon is expected to break records for its overall strength, a top expert said Tuesday, as regions face the risk of droughts, floods and other extremes linked to the event.

This year's El Nino is unlike anything seen in more than three decades of tracking the phenomenon, with forecast

models pointing to an "extreme" event, said Tim Stockdale, an El Nino expert at the European Centre for Medium-Range Weather Forecasts (ECMWF), an intergovernmental organisation.

"I think it's absolutely true to say we've never had a forecast of an El Nino that was so strong and so consistent across (forecast) models," he said in a media briefing.

Stockdale said it would be "a very, very big surprise"

if the event failed to be a record-breaker.

"I would expect it to break records," he said, while cautioning: "but no guarantees."

While El Nino usually peaks between November and February, the resulting spike in temperatures typically comes later.

Combined with human-induced climate change, the last El Nino contributed to making 2023 the second-hottest year on record and 2024 the all-time high.

France to give Syria 50 mn euros stolen by Assad uncle

French President Emmanuel Macron said yesterday on a visit to Syria that Paris will return more than 50 million euros (\$57 million) stolen by the family of former ruler Bashar al-Assad to the country.

The two countries signed several agreements focusing on development and reconstruction after more than a decade of civil war.

France had confiscated the money from Rifaat al-Assad, the ousted leader's uncle.

Macron told a joint press

conference with Syrian counterpart Ahmed al-Sharaa that "more than 50 million euros from the seizure of ill-gotten gains by the family of the former dictator... will be returned to the Syrian people to finance concrete development projects in the territory".

South Korean law targeting false online information takes effect

AFP | Seoul, South Korea

South Korea began enforcing Tuesday a revised law targeting false information posted online, toughening penalties for repeat offenders despite concerns over the impact on free speech.

The law, which requires major platforms to set up new response systems, comes as concern grows in the country over digital misinformation, including high-profile cases involving celebrities.

But opposition politicians,

civic groups and media experts warn it could chill free speech and open the door to government-influenced censorship.

Now users who intentionally spread illegal false or manipulated information could be ordered to pay up to five times the actual cost of damages.

And repeat offenders whose content has been ruled illegal by courts face fines of up to one billion won (\$655,000).

Bomb attacks wound 18 in Damascus as Macron visits

Two explosions shook Damascus on Tuesday near a hotel where French President Emmanuel Macron was staying, wounding at least 18 people, during the French leader's landmark visit to Syria.

The president was not inside the hotel when the blasts hit, having already left for Syria's presidential palace, where an AFP team saw him arrive for a meeting with counterpart Ahmed al-Sharaa.

AFP journalists heard at least one blast echo through Damascus before seeing a plume of smoke rising near the Four Seasons Hotel, with security forces closing a road and ambulances rushing to the scene.

Syria's interior ministry said one bomb had been placed inside a car parked on the side of a road, while the second was planted in a garbage container.

It said they exploded "while preparations were

underway" to dismantle them.

The blasts wounded 18 people, including four police officers, Syrian state media said.

The French president, the first Western European leader to visit Syria since the fall of longtime ruler Bashar al-Assad in 2024, would continue his trip, France's Elysee Palace said.

"I saw three traffic police officers injured on the ground, before the area was evacuated and the roads leading to it were closed," Hamam Hammoud, a 37-year-old employee at a money exchange company, told AFP.

The blasts came moments before Syrian state television announced Macron's arrival at the palace.

Macron is meeting with Sharaa to discuss post-war reconstruction of Syria and reiterate his call for "unity" and "plurality", having also met with civil society representatives.

Macron says Syria must not be destabilised

Damascus, Syria

French President Emmanuel Macron warned on Tuesday that Syria must not be destabilised after twin bomb attacks near the Damascus hotel where he spent the night, during a landmark state visit to a country emerging from years of civil war.

In a joint press conference with his Syrian counterpart, Macron said we

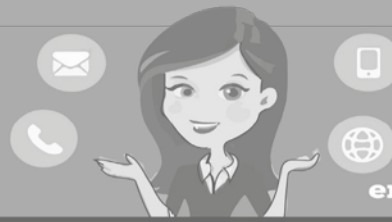

Arab champions return home

Bahrain's U18 basketball squad lands to hero's welcome

Bahrain's under-18 basketball team received a rousing reception at Bahrain International Airport yesterday, arriving home as Arab champions after clinching the title in Sfax, Tunisia.

The Bahrain Olympic Committee organised the welcome, with Basketball Association vice-president Nader Al Awadhi and secretary-general Abed Al Ansari among officials greeting

the squad with flowers.

"Discipline. Fight. Consistency."

The team's run through the tournament earned praise for their composure under pressure before lifting the Arab crown.

Bahrain sealed the title with an 85-73 final victory over Egypt at Al Raed Al Bejaoui Hall—defending champions turned back-to-back kings, winning the Arab under-18 championship for the second consecutive year.



Paris FC confirm Rosenior taking over as coach

Paris FC yesterday announced that Liam Rosenior was taking over as coach.

"The English manager has signed a contract with the club until June 2028 and will take up his post on Thursday 9 July, when team training resumes," said a club statement.

Rosenior replaces Antoine Kombouare, who joined the Parisian side, owned by the LVMH luxury group, in February and steered them clear of the relegation battle to finish 11th, with notable wins over Monaco and champions Paris Saint-Germain.

"Following this season and after discussions between all parties involved, it was decided to bring this collaboration to an end in order to open a new chapter in the club's history," said the club statement. It will be Rosenior's third club in under a year. He was

sacked as Chelsea manager after less than four months in charge in April after leaving Strasbourg, where his free-flowing game lifted the club into the top third of Ligue 1.

"Aged 41, Liam Rosenior already has a wealth of experience at the highest level," said Paris FC. "He has quickly established himself as one of the most promising coaches of his generation."

Antoine Arnault, representative of the Arnault family which owns the club, expressed his enthusiasm for Rosenior.

"My family and I are delighted to welcome Liam to our club and to see him return to our league here in France. I have always been impressed by his philosophy of play and by what he has built with his teams, which often consist of young players," Arnault said.

Traeen takes yellow, Pedersen wins Tour de France 4th stage

Norwegian Torstein Traeen claimed the coveted race leader's yellow jersey as Denmark's Mads Pedersen won the fourth stage of the Tour de France yesterday.

Traeen stripped reigning champion Tadej Pogacar of the jersey just two days after Norway stunned five-time winners Brazil at the World Cup thanks to a brace from Erling Haaland.

Pedersen, who was world champion in 2019, stormed to victory in a sprint finish ahead of Lidl-Trek team-mate Quinn Simmons in second with Spaniard Raul Garcia taking third at the end of the 182km stage from Carcassonne to Foix in scorching temperatures which topped 40C at one point.

It was Pedersen's third stage victory at the Tour following one each in 2022 and 2023 and was enough to see him take the green points jersey.

Traeen, who had started the day just over five minutes behind reigning champion Tadej Pogacar in the race lead, was part of an initial 34-man breakaway which formed around 25km

into the stage. That had been whittled down to 10 over the day's final climb and Traeen came home in eighth. With the peloton finishing 13

minutes after the stage winner, Traeen now leads the yellow jersey standings by 28 seconds from American Sean Quinn, a fellow breakaway companion who finished ninth on the stage.

Pedersen's Lidl-Trek team-mate Mathias Vacek, who finished the stage 10th, is now third overall at 3min 50sec and now leads the young rider's white jersey competition.

Pogacar dropped to fourth at 7min 53sec, on the same time as his arch rival Jonas Vingegaard in fifth.

For Traeen, 30, it will be the second time he has led a Grand Tour, having worn the leader's red jersey at last year's Vuelta a Espana for four days.

He is the third Norwegian to wear the Tour's yellow jersey after Thor Hushovd, who is now Traeen's Uno-X Mobility team manager, did so in 2004, 2006 and 2011, and Alexander Kristoff, who held it for one day in 2020.

Martinez ends Portugal tenure with World Cup exit

Roberto Martinez confirmed that he was standing down as coach following Portugal's World Cup last-16 exit to Spain.

The 52-year-old Spaniard saw his side lose 1-0 to a late Mikel Merino goal at the home of the Dallas Cowboys.

The 52-year-old, who was consistently criticised for sticking with ageing captain Cristiano Ronaldo no matter what, had been in charge since 2023.

Before that he was manager of Belgium, following tenures

in British football with Swansea, Wigan and Everton.

Martinez, whose departure was expected with his contract ending, said: "It is true that it was my last game with the Portugal national team."

"Thank you to the Portuguese people because it was an incredible period, a pride which I can't describe.

"All that strength, energy we had from all the fans, from all the Portuguese people was incredible.

"Thank you for this and I take with me a memory for life."



Belgium dump **US** out of World Cup after Balogun row

Benched stars prove no obstacle as clinical Belgium march into the quarter-finals

Belgium dumped the United States out of their own World Cup, as Charles De Ketelaere's brace secured a 4-1 win that was eclipsed by the bitter row over Folarin Balogun's ban.

Victory means the Belgians face Spain in the quarter-finals, while the US follow co-hosts Canada and Mexico out of the tournament with elimination in the round of 16 after a thoroughly flat performance.

All attention pre-game had been on Balogun's place in the US starting lineup, after US President Donald Trump asked FIFA to review the striker's one-game suspension for a red card, and the governing body controversially obliged.

But Belgium's XI had a few sur-

prises of its own, with Kevin De Bruyne and Jeremy Doku among the heavyweights benched. And coach Rudi Garcia's gambit proved inspired, with De Ketelaere grabbing an early goal to puncture the feel-good vibes in Seattle.

Malik Tillman grabbed one back from a free kick, but De Ketelaere swiftly restored Belgium's lead. A catastrophic piece of goalkeeping by Matt Freese and a late Romelu Lukaku goal left the Americans dead and buried.

FIFA's move to suspend Balogun's ban after he was sent off in the previous round against Bosnia and Herzegovina has been slammed by football fans, pundits and players around the world, but there were no such misgivings among the Seattle crowd.

A colossal roar greeted the stadium announcement of Balogun's name in the starting XI, vastly dwarfing the cheers even for US talisman Christian Pulisic.

The "USA" thunderclap then echoed around the stadium, utterly drowning out a small corner of chanting Belgium fans in the opening minutes.

But the American party was

swiftly silenced. The majority of 67,000 fans fell silent in the ninth minute as De Ketelaere scored, easily tapping home from close range after Nicolas Raskin's cross evaded some lax defending.

It was the first time the Americans had conceded the opener all World Cup. With the atmosphere deflated, no immediate fightback was visible on the pitch either. The midfield was outgunned and the defense looked nervous.

On the half-hour mark, Balogun drew a foul on the edge of the area and whipped the crowd back to life. He waved his arms frantically as Malik Tillman -- fresh from scoring a free kick against Bosnia -- lined up the ball.

Tillman's shot deflected off the Belgian wall and span into the net, and the stadium shook.

Dream over

But the joy was again short-lived. In the 33rd minute, De Ketelaere leapt up to meet Leandro Trossard's cross and comfortably out-jumped an off-balance Tim Ream to score his second.

The US inched back into the game as the first half closed out, with Balogun blasting over from a long Tillman throw, then nar-

Belgium boosted by furore: Tielemans

Belgium captain Yuri Tielemans revealed his team had been fired up by the uproar surrounding Folarin Balogun.

Tielemans said Belgium's players had held a team meeting after Balogun's shock FIFA reprieve and had vowed to make a statement against the World Cup co-hosts.

"Let's be honest: we held a

meeting when we heard the news," Tielemans said of the Balogun controversy.

"We told ourselves we needed to do our talking on the pitch. That's what we did today. I'm very proud of the team," the Aston Villa midfielder told Belgium's RTBF broadcaster.

Tielemans' teammates echoed their captain's words.

Americans resumed play with more intensity, pushing higher up the pitch.

But self-inflicted disaster struck in the 57th minute. Freese came out to collect a Belgium long ball, turned to evade the charging De Ketelaere, but then hesitated with his pass.

De Ketelaere jabbed the ball to Hans Vanaken, who made no mistake with an open goal from long range.

Pulisic limped off with an injury minutes later, and with him went the US dreams of reaching a first World Cup quarter-final since 2002.

His replacement, Sebastian Berhalter, flashed an ambitious shot narrowly wide in the 79th minute, and Balogun had a close-range effort saved soon after.

But Chris Richards handed the ball to Lukaku in stoppage time, and the veteran striker did not hesitate to seal the rout.

Close to tears and on his own as Ronaldo's dream ends

Cristiano Ronaldo laboured through his last World Cup match Monday as the dream of winning the biggest prize of all ended in a 1-0 defeat to Spain and left him fighting back tears.

The 41-year-old Portugal captain and one of the best players of all time says he will now go away and think about what comes next.

He has won it all in a trophy-laden career at some of Europe's biggest clubs, and tasted European glory with his country.

But among his bulging trophy cabinet there will be no World Cup winners medal, and he was largely ineffectual as he huffed and puffed through a disappointing last-16 clash in Texas.

Cristiano Ronaldo



"That's football, that's the life of a footballer," he said, struggling to raise his voice above the crushing disappointment. "Sometimes you win, sometimes you lose, and you have to move on."

Ronaldo, the leading scorer in the history of men's international football, said he would leave the World Cup stage "with a clear conscience".

"The truth is, the biggest title I won with the national team was in 2016 (Euros), which for me is just as significant as a World Cup, honestly," he said.

Ronaldo's best World Cup will always remain the semi-finals 20 years ago.

His display in a disappointing

game summed up what the veteran talisman has become in recent years -- a shadow of the player that one struck fear into opponents.

He had three attempts at goal and was a peripheral figure playing through the centre of an ineffectual Portugal attack.

He scored three times at the tournament in North America in his World Cup farewell -- twice in a 5-0 thrashing of Uzbekistan and a penalty against Croatia in the last 32.

Ronaldo did not register a single assist at the tournament and at one point against Spain threw his hands up in the air as a teammate's pass went astray.

He left the pitch at the home

of the Dallas Cowboys on his own.

Billionaire footballer

Ronaldo went from growing up in a poor family on the island of Madeira, with an alcoholic father, to become a global superstar.

His eternal thirst for records coupled with a relentless drive for self-improvement and tireless devotion to his art sustained him into his 40s.

Off the field he is a phenomenon too -- the first billionaire footballer, boasting 671 million followers on Instagram and his "Siuuu!" celebration mimicked by star-struck children the world over.

But there was to be no Hollywood-style World Cup happy ending for the attacker, who played first for Sporting Lisbon, before becoming a global icon at Manchester United.

After six years and Champions League glory there he lit up the Bernabeu with Real Madrid, where he conquered Europe four more times.

Then came Juventus, a stint back at United, and now the figurehead of Saudi Arabia's bid for footballing respectability at Al Nassr.

His many accolades and prizes

also include five Ballon d'Ors.

In recent years the narrative around Ronaldo has shifted. With his powers on the wane and lacking the mesmerising turn of foot and pace that were once his hallmark, he moved from the wings to a more traditional number nine role.

Ronaldo and Portugal coach Roberto Martinez have been accused of dragging his international career out beyond its sell-by date.

Martinez made two double changes late on as they chased the game against Spain, but Ronaldo remained on the pitch regardless.

Speaking on the eve of the match, Ronaldo insisted: "I am not going to be more Cristiano Ronaldo or less because I win the World Cup."

Argentina produced epic World Cup fightback to beat Egypt

Argentina staged a stunning comeback from 2-0 down to avoid a shocking exit at the hands of Egypt, prolonging Lionel Messi's World Cup career with a 3-2 win to reach the quarter-finals.

The holders looked down and out when goals from Yasser Ibrahim and Mostafa Ziko, either side of Messi having a penalty saved, put the Pharaohs in sight of a historic victory in Atlanta.

However, Cristian Romero's header sparked the comeback as Argentina struck three times in the final 11 minutes plus stoppage time.

Messi smashed home the equaliser to score for a ninth consecutive World Cup game and retake the lead for the Golden Boot with eight this tournament.

Enzo Fernandez completed the turnaround with a superb header two minutes into stoppage time.

At the end, Messi shed tears of joy as he embraced his teammates.

Egypt were left furious after several controversial calls went against them, including a disallowed goal early in the second half, and a member of their coaching staff was red-carded in the aftermath of the winning goal.

But despite a second almighty

scare against African opposition, Argentina will face either Colombia or Switzerland in the last eight on Saturday.

Lionel Scaloni attempted to refresh a side that looked exhausted in the closing stages of a 3-2 win over Cape Verde in the last 32 on Friday.

Nicolas Tagliafico, Leandro Paredes and Julian Alvarez came in from the team that started in Miami, but Argentina got off to another slow start.

Marwan Attia's deep cross to the back post was powered home by Yasser.

Argentina had the chance to

level five minutes later when Tagliafico was fouled by Haissem Hassan inside the box.

However, there was another chapter to Messi's penalty spot misery at World Cups.

The eight-time Ballon d'Or's strike was tentative and Mostafa Shobeir flew to his left to save, meaning Messi has now missed four of his eight non-shootout penalties at World Cups. He also became the first player to miss two in a single tournament, having also failed to hit the target against Austria in the group stages.

The penalty save was just the

start of Shobeir's inspired afternoon.

Alexis Mac Allister's powerful header from point-blank range was next to be parried by the Al Ahly stopper.

Shobeir then produced one of the saves of the tournament to prevent Alvarez's shot from finding the bottom corner.

Egypt thought they had doubled their lead on the hour mark after a brilliant counter-attack.

Mohamed Salah played in Mostafa Ziko, who dinked the ball perfectly over the onrushing Emi Martinez.

However, Egyptian celebra-

tions were cut short by a hugely controversial VAR intervention for a foul on Lisandro Martinez, just outside the Egypt box, at the start of the build-up to the goal.

The decision finally fired up the majority Argentine crowd, but they were silenced once more moments later by another blistering Egyptian break.

Salah again led the charge before feeding Hassan and his cross was swept in by Zico.

Argentina looked like a beaten side with Messi among those whose head was bowed during the second-half drinks break.

Yet Romero's header -- that Shoubir just failed to keep out -- sparked a remarkable revival as the defending champions hauled themselves off the canvas.

Moments later a dazzling run by Messi teed up Lautaro Martinez, who headed just wide and Messi was to have his moment of redemption seven minutes from time.

Gonzalo Montiel fed the ball back for his captain to strike sweetly on the half volley.

Shoubir again got a touch but couldn't get it out as the ball cannoned in off the bar for Messi's 21st World Cup goal.

Then Fernandez's bullet header from Lautaro Martinez's cross completed the fightback and Argentina's relief was on full display after the final whistle.

Serena wants to play again before US Open, says coach

Serena Williams wants to play singles tournaments before the US Open, unlike her preparation for Wimbledon, the American legend's coach Rennae Stubbs said yesterday.

Williams, 44, played two doubles matches in preparation for her comeback to singles tennis at the All England Club, but lost in the first round last week.

The 23-time Grand Slam champion then had to withdraw from the doubles with sister Venus due to a knee injury suffered in the defeat by Australian Maya Joint.

"I'll leave it to her to discuss her medical stuff and how she's feeling but I know that for her trying to play, certainly something before the US Open will be something she would like to do," Stubbs told reporters at Wimbledon.

"She doesn't want to go and do what she did here, which was just play singles, at the US Open, but at the same time it's going to depend on physically how she's doing."

Sinner eyes Djokovic showdown after moving into Wimbledon semis

Jannik Sinner is on course for a blockbuster Wimbledon showdown with Novak Djokovic after the defending champion ended German veteran Jan-Lennard Struff's fairytale run in the quarter-finals.

Sinner won 7-5, 7-6 (7/4), 6-3 on Court One and will face Djokovic in the last four if the seven-time Wimbledon champion beats Canadian Felix Auger-Aliassime later on Tuesday.

In the women's tournament, Coco Gauff and Karolina Muchova reached their first Wimbledon semi-finals.

With Wimbledon basking in sweltering temperatures this week, world number one Sinner had to answer some uncomfortable questions about his ability to withstand the heat.

The 24-year-old Italian wilted in the recent French Open when the mercury reached boiling point, sparking a stunning second-round defeat against Juan Manuel Cerundolo, who battled back from two sets and 5-1 down to beat Sinner.

Bidding to win Wimbledon for the second successive year, Sinner lived up to his claim that he would cope with the London heatwave against Struff -- at 36 the oldest man to become a first-time quarter-finalist at the majors in the Open era.

The four-time Grand Slam champion wasn't at his best, but

his booming serve kept world number 74 Struff at bay as he reached his 10th Grand Slam semi-final and third at Wimbledon.

"It was a huge test today. I felt comfortable on the physical side, a good step forwards," Sinner said.

"We worked a lot after Paris trying to understand what went wrong and prepared in the best possible way."

Djokovic hopes to equal Roger Federer's record of eight Wim-

bledon singles titles by winning a record 25th major.

That would make him the oldest man to win a Grand Slam in the Open era.

Victory for the 39-year-old Serb against third seeded Auger-Aliassime would take Djokovic into a record-extending 15th Wimbledon semi-final and 55th at the Grand Slams.

He would also reach the Wimbledon last four for an eighth consecutive time, setting a new record for the longest streak of

men's singles semi-final appearances at the All England Club.

Gauff in uncharted territory

The all-American encounter on Centre Court went Gauff's way as the seventh seed beat fellow American Jessica Pegula 4-6, 6-3, 6-3.

Gauff -- a two-time major champion -- was appearing in the last eight at the All England Club for the first time.

The 22-year-old made a sluggish start as fourth seeded Peg-

the youngest player to reach the Wimbledon main draw aged 15 and then stunned Venus Williams on her debut, Gauff is two wins away from an even more impressive feat at the All England Club.

She is into the semi-finals of a Grand Slam for the first time since winning her most recent major at the French Open last year.

She is the youngest player to appear in all four Grand Slam semi-finals since Maria Sharapova in 2007.

"Considering I hadn't won a match in two years on grass before this tournament, I'm really happy with how I played today," Gauff said.

In the last four, Gauff faces Czech 10th seed Muchova, who beat Japanese star Naomi Osaka 7-6 (7/4), 6-4.
