ahrain yesterday welcomed the maritime deal signed by Egypt and Greece as "an important and successful" decision opening up new horizons of economic cooperation.

Bahrain's Foreign Affairs Ministry said the deal, which demarcates an exclusive economic zone for oil and gas drilling rights, is in line with the rules of International Law and the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS).

The deal signed on Thursday by Egypt and Greece designates an exclusive economic zone in the eastern Mediterranean between the two countries, an area containing promising oil and gas reserves.
