# Noise nightmare

Arad residents seek relief over dawn roadworks and blocked access

eighbours in Block 244, Arad, say months of roadworks on Roads 4403 and 4402 have brought daily noise and blocked access, with crews starting as early as 5 am, including weekends and public holidays.

The works to lay rainwater drains and sewer lines have, they say, dragged on and shut routes to homes and garages.

Residents report the din of heavy machinery from before dawn, which they say has been hard on older people and children, and on those who need rest before work.
