Projecting unified leadership, HRH Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister of Bahrain, yesterday held talks with Saudi Arabia's Foreign Minister, His Highness Prince Faisal bin Farhan Al Saud, at Gudaibiya Palace, reaffirming a renewed focus on the Saudi-Bahraini Coordination Council as the engine for multi sector cooperation.

HRH Prince Salman opened the meeting by emphasizing the “longstanding and enduring” nature of the Bahrain-Saudi partnership, backed by the leadership of HM King Hamad

and King Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques. His Royal Highness extended appreciation for the ongoing support of His Royal Highness Prince Mohammed bin Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister of Saudi Arabia, particularly in advancing joint

initiatives through the Coordination Council. The meeting elevated the Council's role, with HRH Prince Salman stressing its importance in strengthening co-operation across key economic sectors, creating new opportunities that will help both kingdoms realize shared aspirations.

HH Prince Faisal bin Farhan, in response, conveyed greetings from King Salman and Crown Prince Mohammed, and praised Bahrain's commitment to deepening bilateral ties. He expressed hope for continued growth, prosperity and collaboration between the two nations.

Talks also addressed regional and international developments, with special emphasis placed on Saudi Arabia's role in bolstering regional security, driving development, and safeguarding Arab and Islamic interests.

Accompanying HRH Prince Salman at the meeting were HH Shaikh Isa bin Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa; HH Shaikh Mohammed bin Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa; HE Shaikh Salman bin Khalifa Al Khalifa, Minister of Finance and National Economy; along with senior officials.

## Bahrain and Saudi review joint cooperation progress

Council approves new initiatives

The Executive Committee of the Bahraini-Saudi Coordination Council met yesterday in the presence of delegations from both countries, reviewing joint performance, approving next-year timelines and endorsing new initiatives to deepen bilateral integration.

Chaired under the auspices of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, and his Saudi counter-

part HRH Prince Mohammed bin Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud, the meeting reaffirmed the two kingdoms' long-standing ties and mapped steps to expand cooperation across trade, investment and development projects.

Bahrain's delegation included

His Excellency Dr. Abdullatif bin Rashid Al Zayani, Minister of Foreign Affairs; H.E. Shaikh Salman bin Khalifa Al Khalifa, Minister of Finance and National Economy; and H.E. Hamad bin Faisal Al Malki, Minister of Cabinet Affairs.



Representing Saudi Arabia was His Highness Prince Faisal bin Farhan bin Abdullah Al Saud, Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom. Dr. Al Zayani welcomed Prince Faisal and described the session as “a continuation of the blessed journey of the Bahraini-Saudi Coordination Council,” praising the sustained royal support that has

driven recent progress.

He hailed the meeting as proof of both countries' “mutual desire and serious commitment to continue enhancing bilateral cooperation, coordination and integration at all levels.”

Prince Faisal stressed the council's institutional role in translating political will into concrete outcomes.

“The Coordination Council and its sub-committees have proven their effectiveness by institutionalizing and developing joint action to deepen cooperation and enhance integration between the two countries,” he said, noting that recent gains reflect leaders' ambitions to elevate ties and serve common interests.
