Bahrain third in **Arab world for** cheapest internet

 ${f B}$ ahrain placed third in the Arab world and 27th worldwide in CEOWORLD Magazine's 2025 internet price ranking, with data averaging \$0.57 per megabyte.

Oatar leads the Arab list, seventh globally, at \$0.13 per megabyte. The UAE comes next regionally, 17th worldwide, at \$0.32.

Saudi Arabia follows Bahrain in fourth place across the Arab states and 35th globally at \$0.73, with Kuwait fifth regionally and 45th worldwide at \$1.09.

Oman ranks sixth in the Arab bracket and 58th worldwide at \$1.27. Egypt stands seventh and 92nd at \$1.97.

Algeria takes eighth and 103rd at \$2.11, and Libya ninth and 105th at \$2.14.

The table continues with Iraq 10th in the region and 114th worldwide at \$2.33; Lebanon 11th and 115th at \$2.35; Tunisia 12th and 116th at \$2.36.
