

Jordan, Japan Welcome US-Iran Ceasefire



Ayman Safadi, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs of Jordan, held talks with Toshimitsu Motegi of Japan on Wednesday, focusing on rising regional tensions and efforts to reinforce stability.

The discussion covered recent developments across the Middle East, with both sides exploring ways to deepen bilateral cooperation while coordinating international efforts aimed at restoring calm.

The ministers welcomed the ceasefire agreement between the United States and Iran, describing it as a positive step toward easing tensions. Safadi stressed that upcoming negotiations should lead to a comprehensive agreement that guarantees security, upholds international law, and addresses the underlying causes of conflict.

Attention was also given to the deteriorating situation in Lebanon, where Safadi called for an immediate end to Israeli military actions and reiterated support for the Lebanese government's authority across its territory.

On the situation in the Gaza Strip, both ministers underscored the importance of maintaining stability and fully implementing ceasefire terms. Safadi also raised concerns over developments in the West Bank, warning that ongoing measures such as settlement expansion and land annexation risk undermining prospects for peace.

He emphasized the urgency of a coordinated international response to halt further escalation and revive meaningful peace efforts.

Saudi FM receives EU foreign policy chief



HRH Prince Faisal bin Farhan, Saudi Arabia's Minister of Foreign Affairs, received the High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy and Vice-President of the European Commission, Kaja Kallas.

The meeting took place as part of ongoing diplomatic engagement between Saudi

Arabia and the European Union, aimed at strengthening cooperation and coordination on regional and international issues of mutual interest.

During the reception, both sides discussed regional developments and broader efforts to enhance dialogue and strategic partnership between Riyadh and Brussels.

Bahrain Condemns Iranian Attacks on Saudi Energy Facilities

- Threat to regional stability

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Bahrain has strongly condemned and denounced the "sinful" Iranian attacks that targeted energy, petrochemical facilities, and critical infrastructure in the Eastern Province of Saudi Arabia.

The ministry stated that these repeated hostile actions represent a continuation of a pattern targeting civilian and economic facilities across the Gulf Cooperation Council region, describing them as a serious escalation that threatens regional peace and stability.

It further stressed that such attacks constitute a clear violation of principles of good neighbourliness, international law, and international humanitarian law.

Reaffirming Bahrain's position, the ministry expressed full



solidarity with Saudi Arabia and its complete support for all measures taken to safeguard its sovereignty, security, and

stability.

The statement also urged the international community to take firm and decisive action to halt these hostile and unjustified attacks against regional states and their peaceful populations, in line with United Nations Security Council Resolution UN

Security Council Resolution 2817 and the UN Human Rights Council Resolution 38/61.

It added that such measures are essential to ensuring the security of global energy supplies, protecting vital installations, and strengthening regional and international peace and security.

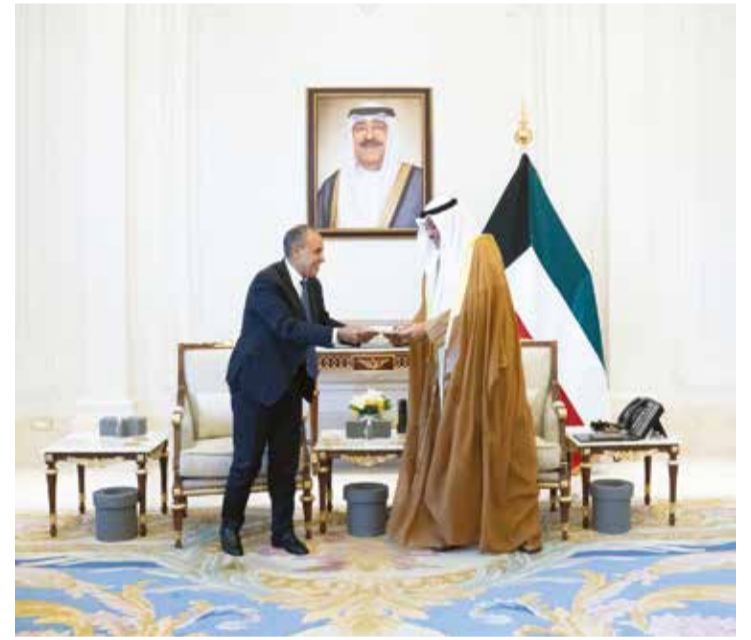
Egyptian president sends message to Kuwait's Amir
