"Renault DP World F1 Team is pleased to confirm Fernando Alonso alongside Esteban Ocon in its driver line-up for the 2021 season," Renault said in a statement.

Alonso, who has notched up 32 wins and 97 podiums in 314 Grand Prix starts, will replace ciardo, who is McLaren-bound at the end of this season.

Tottenham's Eric Dier given fourgame ban over fan confrontation

Tottenham's Eric Dier has received a four-match ban and been fined £40,000 (\$50,000 for climbing into the stands to confront a supporter after his side's FA Cup exit to Norwich.

The England international has been sanctioned by the Football Association on a charge of misconduct for the future conduct following a incident, which happened on March 4.
