## Light fog, milder weather ahead

Parts of the Kingdom of Bahrain may experience a slight drop in horizontal visibility during the late-night and early-morning hours today and tomorrow due to light fog formation.

The Meteorological Directorate at the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications said weather conditions are expected to gradually improve starting Saturday, October 11, as winds shift to northwesterly, ranging from moderate to brisk.

The northwesterly winds are forecast to persist for several days, contributing to a noticeable drop in humidity levels.

This change marks the beginning of a transition toward milder weather, improving comfort levels and reducing the impact of the high humidity that prevailed in recent weeks.

Woman jailed

The Fifth High Criminal Appeals Court has begun hearing the case of a Bahraini woman sentenced to life imprisonment and six men each jailed for one year, all convicted in a major drug trafficking and abuse case.

The 30-year-old woman, previously released from the Reformation and Rehabilitation Centre in 2024 after serving a drug-related sentence, reportedly returned to the same illegal trade.

Investigators said she turned her apartment into a den for drug users, selling narcotics to visitors or throwing packets out of her window to customers waiting outside.

Dr. Al Zayani urges nations to choose bridges over barriers in the pursuit of regional stability

# World economy not doing as bad as feared: IMF chief

The global economy is doing better than expected, even as it faces prolonged uncertainty and underwhelming medium-term growth prospects, the head of the IMF said Wednesday.

The world economy is doing "better than feared, but worse than we need," International Monetary Fund Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva told reporters in Washington, according to prepared remarks.

She added that the Fund now expects global growth to slow "only slightly this year and next," propped up by better-than-expected conditions in the United States, and among some other advanced, emerging market and developing countries.

Georgieva's remarks came ahead of next week's gathering of finance ministers and central bank governors at the World Bank and the IMF in Washington.

Trade is once again likely to dominate the agenda at the annual meetings, following US President Donald Trump's decision earlier this year to unleash sweeping tariffs against many countries. "All signs point to a world economy that has generally withstood acute strains from multiple shocks," Georgieva said, pointing to "improved policy fundamentals," the adaptability of the private sector, lower-than-expected tariffs, and supportive financial conditions.

"The world has avoided a tit-for-tat slide into trade war -- so far," she added.

She noted that the US tariff rate has fallen from 23% in April to 17.5 percent today, a figure that nevertheless remains "far above" the rest of the world.

Against this backdrop, the Fund still expects global growth to remain at roughly three percent over the medium term, in line with previous forecasts -- below the 3.7 percent, on average, seen before the Covid-19 pandemic.

# Gold tops \$4,000 for first time on political, economic worries

Gold topped \$4,000 an ounce for the first time yesterday as investors flocked to the safe investment on worries over the US government shutdown, France’s political crisis and global economic uncertainty.

US and European stock markets mostly rose while Asian equities fell as investors also kept tabs on the AI investment boom and the prospect of further US interest rate cuts this year.

Gold, considered a safe investment in times of uncertainty, reached an all-time high above \$4,040 an ounce Wednesday. Silver was also close to a record high.

“Gold is continuing to glitter, and it is a gift that keeps on giving,” said Fawad Razaqzada, market analyst at City Index and Forex.com.

“Markets hate uncertainty, and right now, it’s in no short supply -- although stocks haven’t exactly sold off,” he added.

“Instead, it is gold that continues to benefit from haven flows while stock markets continue to find buyers on the dips too,” he added.

## US political deadlock

Parts of the US government began to close last week after Democrats and President Donald Trump failed to break a deadlock over spending.

The closure has added to the sense of unease among investors. The release of key economic data, including on jobs, has been postponed -- muddying the waters for the Federal Reserve as it relies on

the figures to decide on its rate plans.

Steve Clayton, head of equity funds at Hargreaves Lansdown, noted that the price of gold had doubled over the last two years.

While France’s political upheaval has contributed to the gold rush, the Paris stock market was up in afternoon deals on Wednesday.

President Emmanuel Macron is facing the worst domestic crisis of his mandate, with the clock ticking down to a Wednesday evening deadline for a working government to be formed.

Frankfurt’s DAX was also higher following mixed economic news.

The German government raised its growth forecast for 2025 from zero to 0.2% growth, and its 2026 projection from one to 1.3%.

Earlier, however, official data showed a sharp decline in industrial production in August, particularly in the automotive sector.

The euro fell further against the dollar.

In New York, the tech-heavy Nasdaq and the S&P 500 rebounded in early trading after falling the previous day, partly over a report that software firm Oracle’s cloud computing profit margin was much lower than expected. The Dow fell.

“Traders seem to consider the shutdown no more than a mild inconvenience due to the postponement of certain economic data releases,” said David Morrison, analyst at Trade Nation.

### ◆ US President Donald

Trump on Wednesday called for jailing the mayor of Chicago and governor of Illinois in an escalation of his extraordinary attacks on political opponents. "Chicago Mayor should be in jail for failing to protect Ice Officers! Governor Pritzker also!" Trump posted on his social media platform. The Republican was referring to Democratic leaders in Illinois who oppose his order for Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agents to conduct aggressive raids in Chicago. Trump's government has targeted Democratic-run cities around the nation for raids on migrants, often conducted by masked, plainclothes agents. The crackdown fulfills a key promise made by Trump in his election victory last year, where he described the United States as under attack by waves of foreign "criminals."

### ◆ Israeli far-right minister visits Al-Aqsa compound in Jerusalem

"Lennart Monterlos is free," said Foreign Minister Jean-Noel Barrot, with sources close to the case saying the young man would travel to France on Thursday. Monterlos was arrested on June 16 in the southern city of Bandar Abbas, on the third day of the brief war between Iran and Israel. The sports and travel enthusiast had been cycling alone across Iran on a Europe-to-Asia bike trip.

## Thousands stranded as record floods submerge Vietnam streets

**R**ecord floods submerged streets and inundated homes in Vietnam on Wednesday, leaving tens of thousands of people stranded, with at least eight killed this week.

Floodwaters reached the tops of cars and rooftops in areas of Thai Nguyen city, about 80 kilometres (50 miles) north of the capital Hanoi, with many left stuck at home and others forced to flee.

The environment ministry said eight people were killed in flash floods and landslides in Vietnam's mountainous north since Monday, and five others were missing.

"I have never witnessed such a terrible flood since I was born 60 years ago," Nguyen Van Nguyen told AFP from his three-storey house in Thai Nguyen province.

"There has never been flooding here in my street but now my ground floor is all submerged."

The military said it had mo-

bilised 30,000 personnel and thousands of boats to join rescue and relief efforts.

It used three helicopters to drop more than four tonnes of water, instant noodles, dry cake, milk and lifejackets to people in flooded parts of Lang Son province.

From late Tuesday to Wednesday, the country recorded the highest flood levels on three rivers in the north in nearly 40 years, state media reported.

The high-water mark of Trung river in Lang Son, bordering China, was forecast to peak at nearly two metres (6.5 feet) above the record, Vietnam state television said.

The Bang and Thuong rivers also surpassed levels not seen since 1986.

By Wednesday morning, the weather bureau said the Cau river, running across Thai Nguyen city, was more than a metre higher than the previous record level -- when Typhoon Yagi devastated the country in September last year.

# US envoys arrive at truce talks as Egypt, Hamas voice 'optimism'

**T**op US negotiators joined discussions yesterday aimed at bringing the Gaza war to an end, with the negotiations' Egyptian host saying he had received "encouraging" signs so far.

Egyptian President Abdel Fattah al-Sisi hailed the support of US President Donald Trump, whose 20-point peace proposal forms the basis of the talks, while Hamas, too, expressed "optimism" over the indirect discussions with its foe Israel.

Both warring sides have responded positively to Trump's plan, which calls for a ceasefire, the release of all the hostages held in Gaza, Hamas's disarmament and a gradual Israeli withdrawal from the territory.

Egyptian state-linked media aired footage of Trump's Middle East envoy Steve Witkoff and son-in-law Jared Kushner pulling up to the talks in Sharm El-Sheikh on Wednesday.

Sisi said the word he had received since their arrival in the city the night before was "very encouraging", adding the US envoys came "with a strong will, a strong message, and a strong mandate from President Trump to end the war in this round of negotiations".

Sisi also invited Trump himself to travel to Egypt for a signing ceremony if a deal were reached.

At the Oval Office on Tuesday, Trump told reporters "there's a possibility that we could have peace in the Middle East" if Hamas and Israel did agree on a ceasefire.

## Israeli forces intercept new Gaza-bound aid flotilla

**I**sraeli forces yesterday intercepted a new Gaza-bound aid flotilla, days after thwarting another maritime convoy that had tried to break an Israeli blockade on the war-battered Palestinian territory.

The Global Sumud Flotilla first reported that three of its vessels had been "attacked and illegally intercepted by the Israeli military" in the early morning, 220 kilometres (about 140 miles) off the coast of Gaza.

It later said all nine of the flotilla's vessels had been intercepted, including the Conscience, adding it was carrying more than 90 journalists, doctors and activists.

"Another futile attempt to breach the legal naval blockade

and enter a combat zone ended in nothing. The vessels and the passengers are transferred to an Israeli port," its foreign ministry said on social media.

"The passengers are expected to be deported promptly," it added.

The pro-Palestinian activist group Freedom Flotilla Coalition said the boats were carrying "vital aid worth over \$110,000... in medicines, respiratory equipment, and nutritional supplies that were destined for Gaza's starving hospitals".

Turkey's foreign ministry accused Israel of carrying out an "act of piracy", describing the intervention against the flotilla as "an attack on civil activists, including Turkish citizens and members of parliament".

tion of the ceasefire, and a spirit of optimism prevails".

The militant group submitted

a list of Palestinian prisoners it wants released from Israeli jails in the first phase of the truce "in

accordance with the agreed-upon criteria and numbers", Nunu added.

In exchange, Hamas is set to free 47 hostages, both alive and dead, who were seized in its October 7, 2023 attack on Israel that sparked the war.

Qatari Prime Minister Sheikh Mohammed bin Abdulrahman Al Thani and Turkish intelligence chief Ibrahim Kalin are also expected at the talks on Wednesday, while Hamas said it would be joined by delegations from Islamic Jihad -- which has also held some of the hostages in Gaza -- as well as the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine.

The negotiations were taking place under the shadow of the second anniversary of the 2023 Hamas attack, which resulted in the deaths of 1,219 people, mostly civilians, according to an AFP tally based on official Israeli figures.

### Prisoners

Key to the negotiations will be the names of the Palestinian prisoners Hamas will push for.

According to Egyptian state-linked media, high-profile inmate Marwan Barghouti -- from Hamas's rival, the Fatah movement -- is among those the group wants to see released.

He has been imprisoned since 2002, and was sentenced to life behind bars in 2004 on murder charges.

More broadly, Hamas's top negotiator, Khalil al-Hayya, said the Islamist group wants "guarantees from President Trump and the sponsor countries that the war will end once and for all".

A Palestinian source close to the Hamas negotiating team said Tuesday's session included Hamas discussing "the initial maps presented by the Israeli side regarding the withdrawal of troops as well as the mechanism and timetable for the hostage-prisoner exchange".

# British PM Starmer hails India opportunities after **trade deal**

India will slash tariffs on imports of British goods

● Britain will

British Prime Minister Keir  
Starmer touted “unpar-  
alleled” opportunities  
opening up in India as he made  
his inaugural visit to the country  
yesterday, seeking to promote a  
trade deal signed this summer.

Indian Prime Minister Nar-  
endra Modi welcomed Starmer  
and what he called “the larg-  
est ever trade delegation from  
the UK”, saying in a statement  
that he hoped to bolster their  
“shared vision of a stronger, mu-  
tually prosperous future”.

The two-day visit comes after  
the countries signed a major  
trade accord in London in July.

“With India set to be the  
third-biggest economy in the  
world by 2028, and trade with  
them about to become quicker  
and cheaper, the opportunities  
waiting to be seized are unpar-  
alleled,” Starmer said.

Starmer, whose 125-member  
delegation includes business  
leaders like British Airways  
chief executive Sean Doyle,  
called the recent trade deal the  
“biggest” India had ever struck.

“I’ve asked the team to imple-  
ment it as quickly as humanly  
possible... but I think it’s al-  
ready changing the mood music,  
frankly,” he told the delegation.

“I think the opportunities are  
already opening up, the con-  
tact has already increased, trade  
with India went up hugely in the  
last 12 months, and climbing.”

and coaches.

The Premier League is one  
of the UK’s most successful cul-  
tural exports, and generates \$13  
billion of value to the economy,  
supporting over 100,000 jobs.

More football fans in India  
now watch the Premier League  
(71 million) than the entire pop-

ulation of the UK.

“I’m hugely proud of our na-  
tional sport -- it brings com-  
munities together and changes  
lives,” he said.

However, Starmer ruled out  
expanding visa access for Indian  
professionals despite pressure.

“That isn’t part of the plan,”  
he told reporters en route to  
Mumbai.

“We’re here now to take ad-  
vantage of the free trade agree-  
ment that we’ve already struck.  
We’ve got to implement it.”

Rights groups have urged  
Starmer to raise the case of  
Scottish Sikh blogger Jagtar  
Singh Johal, detained in In-  
dia since 2017 over an alleged  
plot to kill right-wing Hindu  
leaders.

He has not been convicted,  
and one of the nine charges  
against him was dismissed in  
March.

Starmer is due to meet Modi  
today, and to address a fintech  
conference in Mumbai along-  
side him.

# Trio wins **chemistry Nobel** for new form of **molecular architecture**

● **Metal-organic frameworks, can be used to harvest water from desert air, capture carbon dioxide, store toxic gases or catalyse chemical reactions.**

Three scientists won the Nobel Prize for Chemistry yesterday for their work developing metal-organic frameworks (MOFs), whose multiple uses include capturing carbon dioxide and harvesting water from desert air.

The jury noted that thanks to the trio's discoveries, chemists had been able to build tens of thousands of different MOFs.

"Some of these may contribute to solving some of humankind's greatest challenges," it added.

It listed applications such as "separating PFAS from water, breaking down traces of pharmaceuticals in the environment, capturing carbon dioxide or harvesting water from desert air".

To explain the scale of their achievement, Hans Ellegren, secretary general of the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences, told reporters: "Imagine that the tools of chemistry could be used to create entirely new materials with unheard of properties."

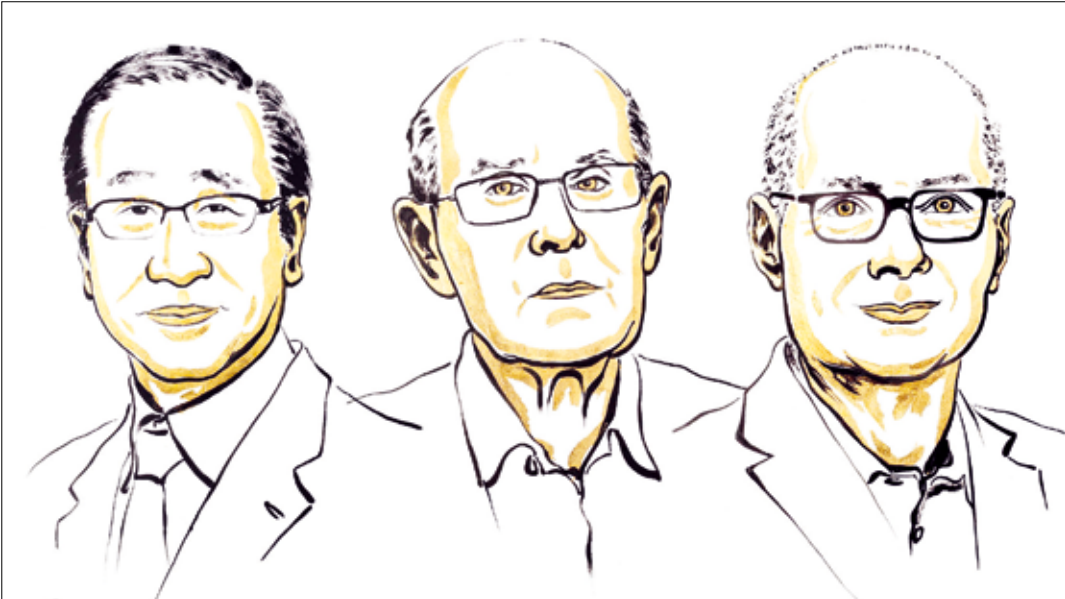

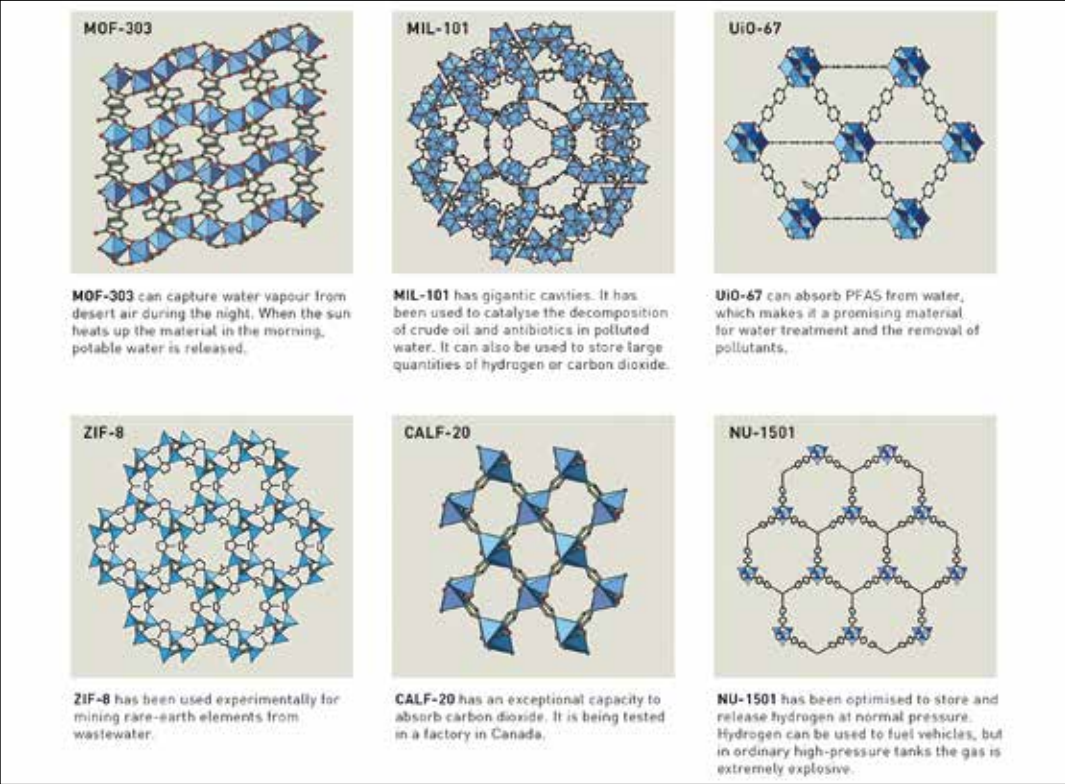
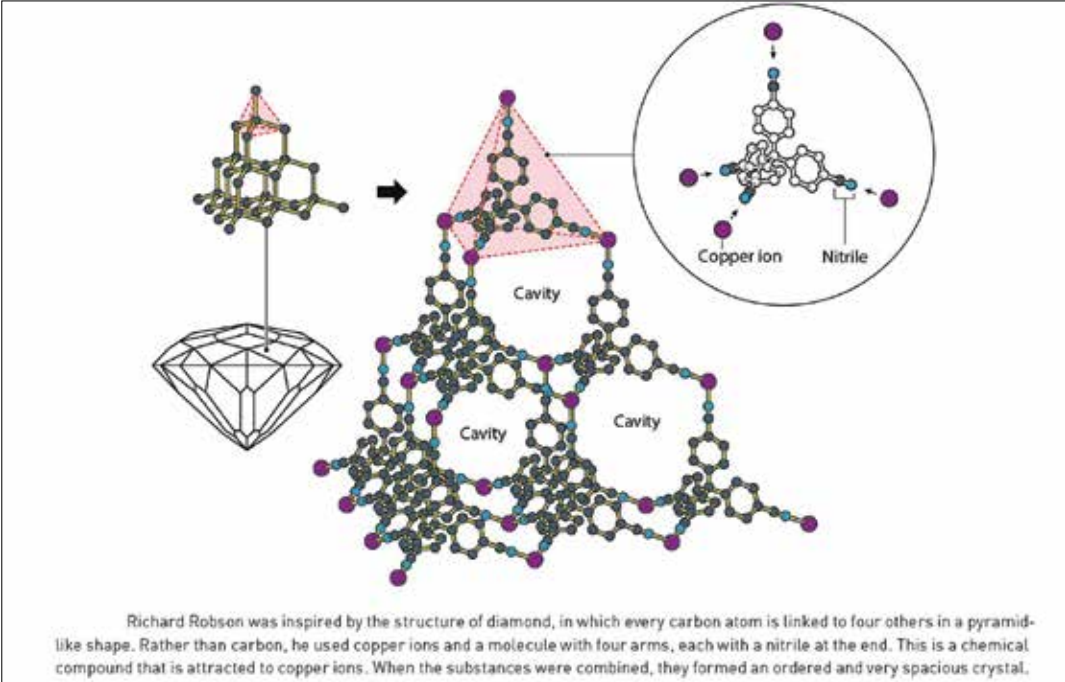
"When they were combined, they bonded to form a well-ordered, spacious crystal," the jury said. "It was like a diamond filled with innumerable cavities."

Robson, a professor at the University of Melbourne, realised the potential of his discovery but the molecular construction was unstable.

It was Kitagawa, a professor at Kyoto University, and Yaghi, a professor at the University of

California, Berkeley, who provided a "firm foundation" for the building method.

Between 1992 and 2003, work-

ing separately, they made a series of revolutionary discoveries.

Kitagawa "showed that gases can flow in and out of the con-

structions and predicted that MOFs could be made flexible," said the jury.

Yaghi created "a very stable

MOF" and showed that it could be modified using rational design, giving it new and desirable properties," it added.

Yaghi's humble beginnings "I'm deeply honoured and delighted that my long-standing research has been recognised," Kitagawa said as he was interviewed by phone during the prize announcement news conference.

In an interview with the Nobel Foundation, Yaghi said he was "astonished, delighted, overwhelmed" at the news he had won the award.

He was in an airport switching flights when the Academy called him to announce the news.

Born into a family of refugees in Amman, Jordan, Yaghi did not start out in ideal conditions to pursue an academic career.

"I grew up in a very humble home. And, you know, we were a dozen of us in one small room, sharing it with the cattle that we used to raise," he said.

He said he thought his father had only finished sixth grade and that his mother could neither read nor write.

For Yaghi, school provided a refuge, the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences said in its statement.

He had first discovered molecular structures in a book when he was 10 and had snuck into the usually locked school library, it added.

He moved to the US to study at the age of 15.

"So it's quite a journey," he mused -- and science had allowed him to make it, he added.

"Science is the greatest equalising force in the world," Yaghi said.

### A diploma, a medal and a cheque

The chemistry prize follows the physics prize, which on Tuesday honoured Briton John Clarke, Frenchman Michel Devoret and American John Martinis for work putting quantum mechanics into action. Their research enabled the development of all kinds of digital technology.

On Monday, the Nobel Prize for Medicine went to Mary Brunkow and Fred Ramsdell, of the United States, and Japan's Shimon Sakaguchi for research

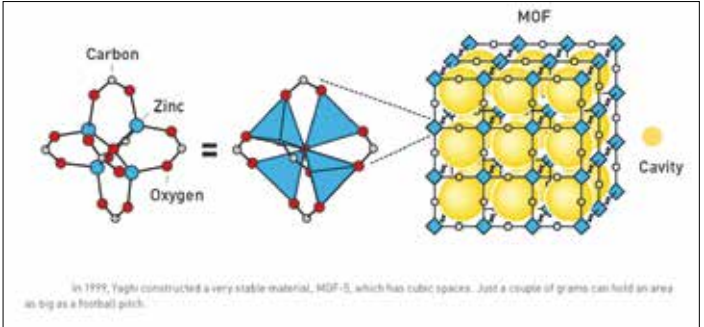
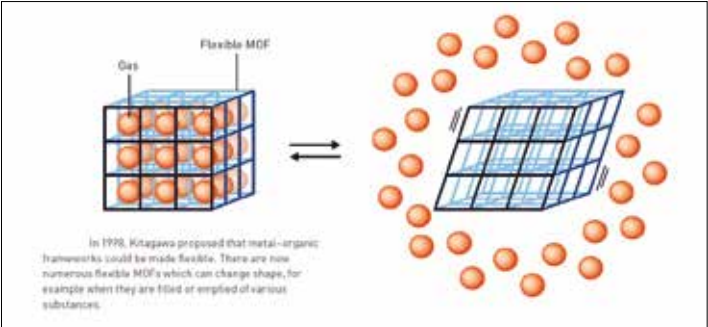
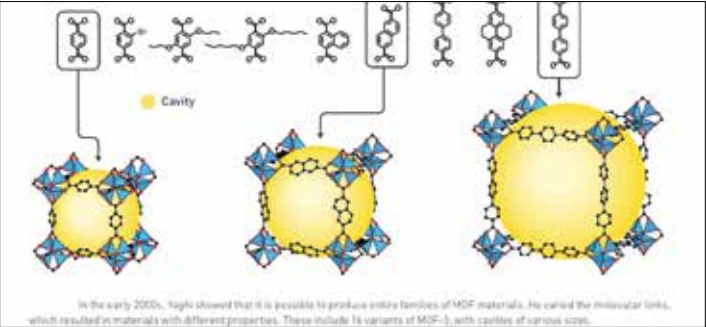
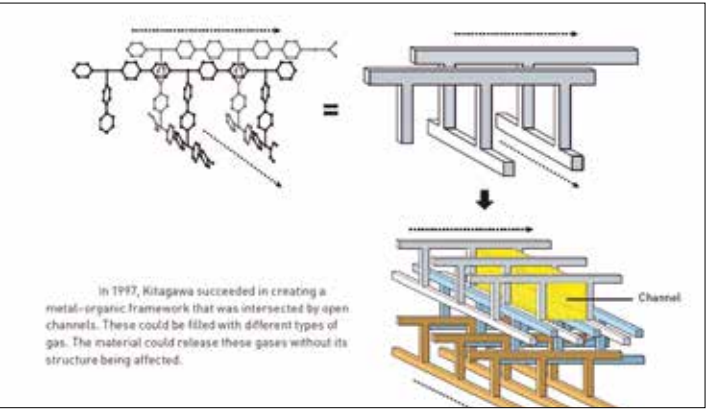
into the human immune system. The Nobel literature prize will be announced on Thursday, followed by the Nobel Peace Prize on Friday.

Gerrard brands failed England generation ‘egotistical losers’

Former England and Liver-pool captain Steven Gerrard believes ego and club rivalry prevented the Three Lions from winning international tournaments during his time as a player.

Branded a “golden genera-tion”, Gerrard was part of an immensely talented squad that failed to get beyond the quar-ter-finals of a major tournament under a number of different managers.

The 45-year-old, who won 114 international caps, led Liverpool to the Champions

League in 2005.

Manchester United’s crop of England stars, including the likes of Rio Ferdinand, Paul Scholes and Wayne Rooney and the Chelsea contingent of Ash-ley Cole, John Terry and Frank Lampard also enjoyed Premier League and Champions League success at club level.

But Gerrard said those club divisions prevented England from gelling as a team.

“We were all egotistical losers,” Gerrard told the Rio Ferdinand Presents podcast, highlighting the camaraderie that now exists between the same players in their punditry careers.

“So why didn’t we connect when we were 20, 21, 22, 23? Was it ego? Was it rivalry?”

“It was down to the culture within England. We weren’t friendly or connected. We weren’t a team. We never at any stage became a real good, strong team.”

Australia’s Alex de Minaur Acruised through to the Shanghai Masters quarter-fi-nals yesterday, ousting Portu-gal’s Nuno Borges 7-5, 6-2.

De Minaur is chasing his second title of the year and is, after Novak Djokovic, the high-est ranked player left standing after a string of high-profile exits.

The first set heated up when the world number seven need-ed five break points in the 11th game against Borges, convert-ing the last with a backhand for a decisive advantage.

De Minaur carried the mo-mentum into the second set, breaking in the first and third games.

“The first set was a very tight set, we both were kind of trying to figure each other out,” said the 26-year-old De

Minaur.

“In the second set, I came out firing and I played some aggressive tennis... but still, it was very physical out there.”

De Minaur remained cau-tious about his title chances, despite the elimination of so many top seeds, including number two seed Jannik Sin-ner and third-ranked Alexan-der Zverev.

“In our side of the draw, there’s a lot of quality players, so it’s still going to be a battle,” he said.

Another top-10 player fell yesterday as Italy’s Lorenzo Musetti lost to Canada’s Felix Auger-Aliassime 6-4, 6-2.

Thirteenth-ranked Au-ger-Aliassime looked sharp throughout, breaking in the fifth game.

He went on to dominate the second set, breaking Musetti, the world number nine, in the fifth and seventh games.

Injured Huijsen replaced by Laporte in Spain squad

R-eal Madrid defender Dean Huijsen withdrew from the Spain squad for upcoming 2026 World Cup qualifiers on Wednesday because of a calf injury and was replaced by Ay-meric Laporte.

“Huijsen arrived with symp-toms of muscular fatigue at the Spain national team camp on Monday night,” said the Spanish football federation in a statement.

“On Tuesday he did not

Real Madrid said Huijsen has suffered a “calf muscle injury in his left leg”, without specifying an expected recovery date.

Spanish media reported he is likely to return in 10-12 days, putting in doubt Huijsen being fit for Madrid’s La Liga game at Getafe on October 19.

The 20-year-old centre-back joined Real from Premier League club Bournemouth this summer and made his Spain debut in March in the Nations League.

## Root backs England to end Ashes drought in Australia

Joe Root insists England can end their 10-year long Ashes drought as they bid to finally “bring the urn home” from their tour to Australia later this year.

England have not won the Ashes since 2015 and their last Test series triumph in Australia came back in 2010-11.

England were held to a 2-2 draw by Australia on home turf in the most recent series in 2023, while their last three trips Down Under have ended in 4-0, 4-0 and 5-0 thrashings.

But despite their struggles in Australia, Root is convinced Ben Stokes’ side are set to shine against their arch rivals.

“It does feel like a long time and it’d be nice to put that right and bring the urn home. I just see it as a great opportunity for the group,” Root said.

“There’s no other way to look at it, really. It’s a beautiful country, it’s a great place to go and play cricket.

“Just soak it all in and expect a little bit of ‘abuse’ or ‘banter’. It could be six weeks that live long in the memory if we get it right.”

Root is yet to win a single match in Australia in 14 attempts and, despite boasting 39 career hundreds, is still waiting to notch his first in the country.

Australian pundits have highlighted Root’s shortcomings in the Ashes, setting the stage for more sledging from fans when the series starts in Perth on November 21.

“At the end of the day this tour is not about me,” Root said.

“They are going to say what they want to say anyway, so why bother worrying about it?

“When we look back in five years’ time no-one is going to remember what Matthew Hayden said to me, or Greg Blewett, or Mark Waugh, whoever it is.

“If I am scoring runs and scoring heavily it gives us a great opportunity to win a series out in Australia and that is the main focus.”

The fitness of the rival captains has been a major talking point.

Australia skipper Pat Cummins is reportedly set to miss the first Test and potentially the whole series with a back injury that has kept him sidelined since July.

Stokes was back to his best against India in the drawn Test series this summer until a shoulder injury ruled him out of the last match at The Oval.

of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa.

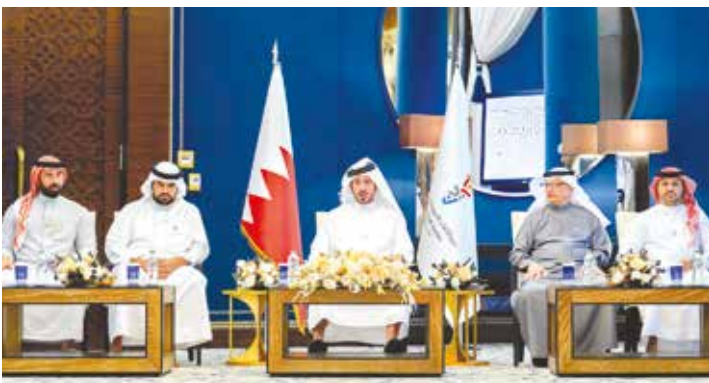

# Tracing the evolution of Asian Youth Games

Third edition returns in under a fortnight with Bahrain as host

● 26 sports, 259 events scheduled

● Over 4,300 athletes, 45 countries

● Qualifier for 2026 Dakar Olympics

After more than a decade-long pause, the Asian Youth Games return from October 22 to 31, with Bahrain hosting over 4,300 athletes from 45 National Olympic Committees. The opening ceremony at Exhibition World Bahrain will be the first indoor inauguration in the Games’ history. Selected events, including boys’ futsal, handball, and volleyball, will begin on October 19, ahead of the official opening, followed by girls’ futsal, kabbadi, teqball, and beach volleyball on October 21.

The 2025 programme features 26 sports, combining traditional events such as athletics, swimming, and badminton with newer disciplines including E-sports, jiu-jitsu, teqball, Muay Thai, camel racing, and Kurash, which makes its debut. Other sports include volleyball, futsal, handball, judo, mixed martial arts, table tennis, taekwondo, wrestling, boxing, triathlon, weightlifting, Pencak Silat, equestrian events, and cycling. The Games will award medals across 259 events.

### Origins and Growth

The Asian Youth Games began in 2009 in Singapore, bringing together 1,237 athletes from 43 countries across nine sports.

Organized by the Olympic Council of Asia, the Games were created as part of Singapore’s preparation to host the 2010 Summer Youth Olympics and aimed to give young athletes early exposure to international competition in a structured environment.

The second edition, held in Nanjing in 2013, expanded significantly, with 2,404 athletes

from 45 countries competing in 16 sports across 122 events. China topped the medal table with 71 golds, followed by South Korea and Thailand. Planned editions in Hambantota (2017) and Shantou (2021) were cancelled due to logistical and global challenges, pausing the event for more than a decade.

Originally awarded to Tashkent, Uzbekistan, the 2025

Games were reassigned to Bahrain after Uzbekistan withdrew in December 2024 due to delays in infrastructure construction. Now, under the royal patronage of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, Bahrain has prepared 23 venues and unveiled official medals for 505 gold, 503 silver, and 669 bronze awards.

The executive committee of the Third Asian Youth Games officially approved the medals during a press conference in late August. The gold, silver, and bronze medals feature the Games’ emblem at their center, surrounded by stylized motifs representing the word “Bahrain”. A total of 1,677 medals across 24 sports will be up for grabs, making the Games a crucial stepping stone toward the 2026 Youth Olympic Games in Dakar.
