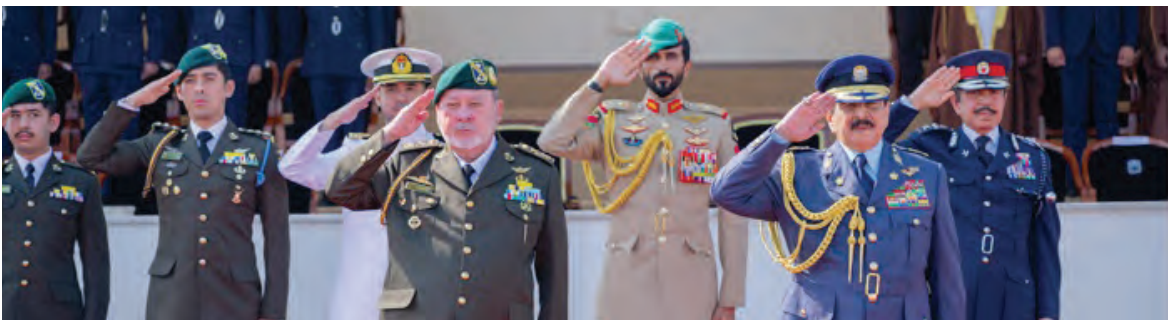
## Royal leadership greets Cambodia

# Cyber sanctions

A proposal before Parliament's Services Committee would police 'vulgar content' online, setting prison terms of up to three years, fines of up to BD10,000, and takedown orders that internet firms must carry out within 24 hours.

The draft covers all electronic content published or passed around in Bahrain, and any ma-

terial outside the country that affects Bahraini society, whatever the platform or publisher.

It would ban the publication, broadcast, reposting, or circulation of vulgar material by electronic means. The competent authority could issue immediate orders to block or delete offending content.

Service providers would be bound to act within the 24-hour window.

A specialist technical commit-

tee would watch for breaches and file reports to the authority for legal action.

Penalties would range from three months to three years in prison and fines between BD1,000 and BD10,000, or both.

The punishment would be doubled if the content targets minors, or if it is pushed on public electronic platforms.

According to the explanatory memorandum from MP Hanan Fardan, the plan answers the

spread of vulgar and indecent online material that harms social values and moral security.

The note says current rules are scattered across existing laws and do not give a full set of tools for this field, so a dedicated statute is needed with clear offences, firm penalties, and workable steps to enforce them, with a focus on young people and children.

The memorandum adds that rapid growth in digital links and

platforms has made it easy to share a wide range of material, some of which strains long-held religious, social, and cultural values in Bahrain.

It says lawmakers should keep pace through a new, full legal frame to curb the harm from vulgar and indecent content.

While the Penal Code and the Cybercrime Law carry general provisions, they do not address all forms of electronic vulgar content.

# Key issues on agenda

Shura Council to discuss Royal Address reply, OIC anti-corruption pact and rent bill

The Shura Council meets today with an agenda topped by the committee's draft reply to the Royal Address given by His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa at the opening of the fourth session of both chambers.

The Council will consider the draft reply prepared by the committee chaired by Jamal Fakhro, First Deputy Chairman. Members are Dr Jehad Abdullah Al Fadhel, Second Deputy Chair; Dr Anwar Al-Sadah; Dr Abdulaziz Abul; Fouad Al Hajji; Lina Habib; Dr Mohammed Ali Hassan Ali; Dr Mohammed Ali Al Khuzai; Nancy Dinah Khedouri; Hala Ramzi; Dr Hani Al Saati; and Mr Hisham Al Qassab.

Also before the Council is the Foreign Affairs, Defence and National Security Committee's report on a bill to ratify the Makkah Convention of the member states of the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation on cooperation in anti-corruption law enforcement.

### Cooperation

The convention aims to build closer cooperation between law-enforcement bodies through rapid exchange of information and enquiries.

It is intended to prevent, detect, investigate and prosecute offences covered by the convention, to recover



proceeds and assets, and to strengthen the criminal justice system.

The committee recommends approval.

### Ratification

It says ratification shows that Bahrain aims to tackle corruption, a key challenge for societies and states, and would support efforts to develop the national legal framework in line with the Constitution and current laws and with Bahrain's Vision.

The report adds that the convention expands technical help, training, and the exchange of expertise among OIC member states.

This, it says, would raise the skills and capacity of national bodies tasked with fighting corruption.

The committee further states

that the convention shows that Bahrain's position in joint Islamic work fits with related global treaties the Kingdom has already joined, showing that Bahrain intends to strengthen regional and international cooperation to fight corruption and to promote openness and integrity.

The Council will also review the Public Utilities and Environment Committee's report on a bill to amend parts of the

Property Rent Law.

Citing the memorandum of the Legislation and Legal Opinion Commission, the report says the bill seeks to put into effect constitutional protection of property, set out the relationship between owners and tenants, balance rights and duties, set how rights are recovered and duties carried out, and limit any extension of expired leases to one year, whatever the original term.

## ‘Respect institution’

Action sought after laughter and interruptions in Parliament

MP Basema Mubarak has Masked Council of Representatives Speaker Ahmed bin Salman Al Musallam to act against what she called improper conduct during sittings, warning it harms Parliament's standing and its image with the public.

In an official letter, she urged the Speaker to apply the chamber's standing orders firmly to deter behaviour she described as out of line with the decorum expected in formal deliberations.

She said the recent laughter and unjustified interruptions that met her intervention on traffic accidents and pensioners' issues under the dome of Parliament insulted the People's House and the voters who entrusted their representatives.

### Responsibility

"The national responsibility we all bear requires us to respect the constitutional institution we represent and to adhere to the highest standards of decorum and discipline during formal deliberations," she

wrote, adding that any transgression or mocking conduct breaks rules of parliamentary behaviour and the principle of respect for the Constitution.

MP Mubarak said the chamber should consider suitable organisational steps or internal questioning to prevent a repeat, arguing that firm standards protect Parliament's role as a national institution, speak for Bahrainis and strengthen public confidence in its work.

She concluded that Parliament is "a national forum that should be a model of discipline and respect, and any behaviour that diminishes its dignity or that of its members does not represent the values of Bahraini society or its long parliamentary history."

# Smoking curb, traffic ease

Freeze on new shisha cafe licences sought for Capital’s Second Constituency

● Parliament set to discuss plan

Licences for new shisha cafés in the Capital’s Second Constituency face a freeze, with Parliament to debate the plan on Tuesday to curb smoking and ease King Faisal

Highway congestion. The motion asks the relevant authorities to stop issuing new permits in the constituency, set firmer conditions to prevent breaches and impose penalties where violations are proven.

It also calls on the government to prepare, as soon as possible, a detailed study to reset the licensing process and to broaden local trade beyond cafés.

### Pause

Backers point to a dense cluster of shisha outlets and argue for a pause while the review is carried out.

They also cite heavy traffic on King Faisal Highway and the need to spread investment across different lines of business.

The Ministry of Health says licensing is already governed by

### Health rules

Decision No. 2 of 2011 sets the health rules for places that serve tobacco and, in Article 5, bans shisha in internet cafés, residential areas, parks and public gardens, sports clubs and shopping malls.

Any issue or suspension of licences must follow these rules. The Bahrain Anti-Smoking Society supports the move.

It says the step matches national public-health aims and World Health Organization measures, noting Bahrain’s fourth-place standing in WHO reports among countries apply-

ing the Framework Convention on Tobacco Control and the target to cut current tobacco use by 30 per cent by 2025.

### Approach

It also points to the WHO declaration of Manama as a Healthy City and urges extending the approach to other governorates within a plan to move towards a smoke-free Bahrain. After review, the public utilities and environment committee recommended approval by consensus of members present, citing clear public-interest grounds.

The motion was tabled by MPs Second Deputy Speaker Ahmed Qarata, Hisham Al Awadhi, Jameel Mulla Hassan, Mohammed Al Olaiwi and Mohammed Al Refai.

## Three-year jail term upheld for knifepoint robbery

The Criminal Appeals Court has upheld a three-year prison term for a young repeat offender who robbed a lift technician at knifepoint in a residential block, taking his mobile phone and car key.

Shortly after 1pm, the technician was servicing the lift on the third floor. He left a bag with personal items outside the car.

A masked man approached and asked why he was there.

The technician finished the job, went to the ground floor and left the bag upstairs.

### Contents

When he returned, the bag was open and its contents disturbed.

The man was still there, holding the technician’s perfume bottle.

He produced a small folding knife, demanded the phone and the car key, told the tech-

nician to raise his hands and reached into his pockets to take them.

### Passcode

He then asked for the passcode. The technician, afraid, gave it.

The assailant opened the photo gallery, WhatsApp and email, told the technician to face the wall and fled down the stairs with the phone, perfume and key.

The victim called police from a second handset. Officers arrived, searched with him, and identified and arrested the suspect.

### Statement

He was found with the knife, the stolen phone and perfume, and a toy pistol. His statement was taken at the security directorate.

Checks showed prior convictions.

Judges left the three-year sentence in place.

## Gulf national held over obscene online posts

An individual has filed a report claiming he had been verbally abused on social media.

The head of the Cybercrime Prosecution announced that the Public Prosecution received the report through the Cybercrime Department of the General Directorate for Combating Corruption, Economic and Electronic Security at the Interior Ministry.

The complaint alleged that

the suspect used obscene language and shared content that violated public morals.

Investigations revealed that the posts were made by a Gulf national known for repeatedly sharing material that breaches public order and decency.

The Public Prosecution took over the case, reviewed the published content, and ordered the suspect’s arrest.

### Confession

During interrogation, the accused confessed in detail, ad-

mitting that his social media account — followed by thousands — was used to post such content to gain popularity.

The Public Prosecution ordered his pretrial detention pending further investigation and the confiscation of his mobile phone for technical examination.

The head of the Cybercrime Prosecution stressed that legal action will be taken against anyone who misuses social media platforms to spread content violating public morals.

# Court dismisses ‘fake’ worker’s injury claim

A civil court has thrown out a worker’s injury claim after he failed to prove it. Judges found the file held no medical proof of injury or disability, despite giving the claimant time and a clear path to secure an expert report through the competent medical commissions. The case was brought against a maintenance and mechanical works company, with the Social Insurance Organisation named as second defendant. Before the court heard the case, the claimant asked to be



referred to the medical commissions to set a disability percentage and sought an interim payment of BD2,200 from both defendants. the first defendant as an operations worker and, about seven months later, was in an accident that left him with a permanent disability. He claimed material and moral loss and turned to the court for compensation.

Lawyer Eman Hassan, for the company, said the court ran the case over several hearings and appointed the medical commission to examine the claimant and report back so that any compensation could be assessed.

**Deposit** The court noted that settled Court of Cassation guidance treats expert work sought by a trial court as an essential means of proof within the court’s discretion. With no deposit paid, no medical examination and no technical evidence to support the claim, the court dismissed the case.

### Strategic recommendations

The Bahrain International Public Health Conference concluded its sessions with broad participation from experts, specialists, and researchers from Bahrain and abroad. Over two days, the conference featured more than 50 scientific lectures and workshops addressing recent developments in public health, preventive care, and modern healthcare technologies. Dr. Samia Bahram, Assistant Undersecretary for Public Health and Conference Chairperson, said the conference served as a scientific platform for exchanging expertise, discussing current health challenges, and developing recommendations that form a roadmap to advance national and regional health system preparedness and resilience.

She noted that the conference issued several strategic recommendations focused on enhancing regional and international cooperation to address health challenges, investing in digital transformation and artificial intelligence to advance healthcare services, and prioritising the prevention of non-communicable diseases and mental health within primary healthcare systems. The recommendations also highlighted adopting the “One Health” approach linking human, animal, and environmental health, strengthening national workforce training through sustainable programmes, and promoting partnerships, innovation, and community engagement in research, health education, and national initiatives.

## Government hospitals mark World Radiography Day

He highlighted ongoing efforts to reduce MRI waiting lists and improve access to diagnostic services, enhancing efficiency and patient care. Dr. Jalila Al Sayed Adnan, Head of the Radiology Department at SMC, said the department is implementing upgrades to streamline operations, halve waiting times for ultrasound and MRI scans, and improve service quality through workflow restructuring and development projects. She said the improvements reflect greater coordination among medical, technical, and administrative teams, leading to faster and higher-quality diagnostic services.

◆ **Freight carriers UPS and FedEx** said they have grounded their fleets of MD-11 cargo planes, after one of them was involved in a deadly crash in Kentucky this week. A McDonnell Douglas MD-11 aircraft operated by UPS exploded into flames when it crashed shortly after departing on Tuesday from the airport in the US city of Louisville, killing at least 14 people. A three-person crew was aboard. Both carriers said they were acting on a recommendation from the plane's manufacturer to halt use of these planes. McDonnell Douglas originally made the MD-11 but was acquired by Boeing in 1997. "Out of an abundance of caution and in the interest of safety, we have made the decision to temporarily ground our MD-11 fleet," UPS said Friday. "The grounding is effective immediately. We made this decision proactively at the recommendation of the aircraft manufacturer," the courier added. It said around nine percent of UPS's fleet are MD-11s.

◆ **Indonesia probes student after nearly 100 hurt in school blasts**

◆ **Indonesian authorities** said Saturday they were investigating a student over their alleged involvement in explosions that wounded nearly 100 people at a school in the capital Jakarta. The blasts hit a school mosque in North Jakarta just as people were gathering for Friday prayers, sparking panic among worshippers. The national police chief said investigators had gathered "several pieces of evidence" as part of their probe. "There's writing, and there is also evidence of powder that could potentially have caused an explosion," Listyo Sigit Prabowo said in comments broadcast by Kompas TV. Authorities so far have identified one suspect, a student who was wounded in the explosions, but Listyo did not rule out the involvement of others. Investigators are also examining the suspect's family and social media, the police chief added.

◆ **President Donald Trump** said no US officials would attend the G20 summit in South Africa, reviving debunked claims of white Afrikaners being systematically "killed and slaughtered" in the country. Trump had announced in September that Vice President JD Vance would travel to the meeting later this month instead of him, but has now said that US representatives will skip it entirely. "It is a total disgrace that the G20 will be held in South Africa," Trump said on his Truth Social network. "No U.S. Government Official will attend as long as these Human Rights abuses continue." Trump said that Afrikaners -- descendants of the first European settlers of South Africa -- "are being killed and slaughtered, and their land and farms are being illegally confiscated."

Medical all-clear after anti-Trump package opened at US base

Seven people briefly felt ill after a suspicious package was opened on Thursday at the military base near the US capital that is home to Air Force One, the presidential jet, a base spokesperson said Friday. The package contained "negative sentiments" towards President Donald Trump but there were "no specific threats towards the president or other government officials," the spokesperson for Joint Base Andrews said in a statement. "Emergency responders evacuated the building and connecting building and established a cordon around the area," the statement said. "Seven individuals felt ill and

were assessed by the JB Andrews medical team and were released." The spokesperson said testing was conducted for contaminants but "no powder or hazardous materials were found and there is no active threat." US media had reported previously that the package contained a white powder. Joint Base Andrews in Maryland is a short drive from Washington and is used by senior US government officials. Trump landed at the facility as recently as Wednesday on an Air Force One flight returning him from a business forum in Florida. According to CNN, the package was opened in a building that houses the Air National Guard Readiness Center on the sprawling base.

Israel identifies **latest hostage** body, as families await five more

Israel identified yesterday the latest hostage remains sent back from Gaza by Hamas, leaving only five more bodies to be returned under the US-brokered truce that halted the two-year war.

The Israeli military identified the body handed over on Friday as that of volunteer ambulance driver Lior Rudaeff, who was killed in the October 7, 2023 Hamas attack that triggered the Gaza war.

The Israeli-Argentinian was 61 at the time of the bloody cross-border attack and one of five armed civilians killed while trying to defend his community, the Nir Yitzhak kibbutz.

His death was confirmed by Israeli authorities in May 2024 and his name was put on the list of 20 living and 28 dead former hostages that Hamas agreed to return under the terms of the

October ceasefire.

Five more bodies remain to be returned: four seized in the October 7 attack -- three Israelis and one Thai -- as well as the remains of a soldier who died in combat in 2014 during a previous Gaza conflict.

The Hostages and Missing Families Forum, a campaign group representing the Israeli families caught up in the crisis, welcomed Rudaeff's homecoming.

"Lior's return provides some measure of comfort to a family

that has lived with agonising uncertainty and doubt for over two years," it said. "We will not rest until the last hostage is brought home."

The first phase of the Gaza ceasefire deal brokered last month by US President Donald Trump paved the way for a hostage and prisoner exchange.

**Mostly civilians**

Hamas's October 2023 attack resulted in the deaths of 1,221 people on the Israeli side, mostly civilians, according to an AFP tal-

ly based on official Israeli figures.

The Israeli military's retaliatory campaign has since killed 69,169 Palestinians, again mostly civilians, according to Gaza's health ministry.

The ministry, whose figures are considered reliable by the UN, does not specify the number of fighters killed within this total.

According to the Israeli army, 479 soldiers have been killed in the campaign in Gaza since the start of the ground offensive at the end of October 2023.

Five Indian nationals kidnapped in Mali  
Dakar, Senegal

Gunmen have kidnapped five Indian nationals in Mali, their company and a security source said Friday, as the west African country reels from mounting unrest and jihadist violence.

The workers were kidnapped Thursday by gunmen near Kobri, in western Mali, the security source told AFP on condition of anonymity, saying they were employed by a company that is working on electrification projects.

"We confirm the kidnapping of five Indian nationals," a company representative told AFP.

"The other Indians working for the company have been evacuated to Bamako," the capital, he added.

No group has claimed the kidnappings so far.

Mali, currently ruled by a military junta, has been struggling to contain surging unrest blamed on criminal groups and jihadists linked to Al-Qaeda and the Islamic State group.

Qatar denies report it targeted accuser of ICC chief prosecutor

Qatar condemned on Friday what it called unfounded allegations by "bad actors" after The Guardian reported the country had attempted to discredit a woman who accused the ICC's chief prosecutor of sexual misconduct.

Karim Khan is currently on leave pending an investigation into the allegations.

The British lawyer gained prominence after he successfully requested an International Criminal Court arrest warrant against Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu for alleged war crimes in Gaza.

In an article published on Thursday, The Guardian alleged that his accuser was targeted by private intelligence agencies at the request of Qatar.

The objective of the secret operation was to collect information which could discredit her, in particular by uncovering links to Israel, the paper reported.

The Qatar media office on Friday denounced the report as "unfounded allegations".

"These claims are part of a

coordinated campaign led by certain bad actors" it said in a statement, adding it was being targeted for its mediation role in the Gaza war.

It said the reports were based on "falsified information".

The ICC's oversight body announced last year that it had requested an external investigation into allegations of "alleged misconduct" by Khan, without providing further details.

According to various media

reports, Khan was accused of inappropriate sexual behaviour towards a member of his office. He has denied the allegations.

Last year, Khan asked the ICC to issue arrest warrants for Netanyahu, his former defence minister Yoav Gallant, and three senior Hamas officials.

All three of the Hamas leaders were later killed. The warrants against Netanyahu and Gallant were granted and remain outstanding.

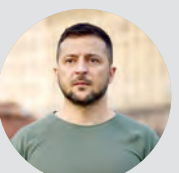

# Taliban govt says Pakistan ceasefire to hold, despite talks failing

The two sides met on Thursday in Turkey to finalise a truce

Afghanistan's Taliban government said yesterday its ceasefire with Pakistan would remain even though their latest talks failed, blaming Islamabad's "irresponsible and uncooperative" approach.

The two sides met on Thursday in Turkey to finalise a truce agreed on October 19 in Qatar, following deadly clashes between the South Asian neighbours.

Both have remained tight-lipped on the content of the discussions, which are known only to have addressed long-standing security issues.

"During the discussions, the Pakistani side attempted to shift all responsibility for its security to the Afghan government, while showing no willingness to take responsibility for either Afghanistan's security or its own," Taliban government spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid wrote on social media.

"The irresponsible and uncooperative attitude of the Pakistani delegation has not yielded any results," he said.

At a news conference later on, Mujahid stressed that the ceasefire "will hold".

"There is no issue with the ceasefire previously agreed upon with Pakistan, it will hold," he said.

Neither Islamabad nor mediators immediately commented on the announcement that the talks had failed.

Pakistan's Information Minister Attaullah Tarar had previously hinted that negotiations

in Turkey were falling through, saying that the onus lay on Afghanistan to fulfil pledges to clamp down on terrorism, "which so far they have failed".

"Pakistan shall continue to exercise all options necessary to safeguard the security of its people and its sovereignty," he wrote.



Relations between the one-time allies, who share a 2,600-kilometre (1,600-mile) frontier, have soured in recent years over Islamabad's accusations that Afghanistan harbours militant groups which stage attacks in Pakistan. The Taliban government has consistently denied the allegations.

## N. Korea warns of more 'offensive action' after latest missile launch

North Korea's defence minister warned yesterday of more "offensive action", as Washington and Seoul criticised Pyongyang's latest ballistic missile launch.

North Korea's missile launch on Friday came just over a week after US President Donald Trump -- on a tour of the region -- expressed interest in meeting with North Korean leader Kim Jong Un.

Pyongyang did not respond to the offer.

Pyongyang's defence minister No Kwang Chol said Washing-

## NMS students discover the future of technology at Bahrain Polytechnic

Forty Grade XII Computer Science students from New Millennium School, Bahrain, visited Bahrain Polytechnic on 27TH October 2025 as part of their educational tour focusing on Artificial Intelligence, Robotics, and Automotive Engineering.

The visit provided hands-on exposure to machine learning, data prediction techniques, Raspberry Pi applications, and robotics programming under the guidance of Polytechnic experts and top robotics competition winners. Students were introduced to the Raspberry Pi, a compact computer system widely used in AI and IoT (Internet of Things) applications. Through live demonstrations, they observed how algorithms



are trained to detect and classify objects, and how the Raspberry Pi serves as a processing unit to execute AI models efficiently.

In the Robotics and Programming Workshop, students were divided into groups and provided with robot kits.

Under expert guidance, they wrote code to control the robots’ movements and responses, gaining hands-on experience in automation and logical programming. Each robot was equipped with ultrasonic sensors for obstacle detection using sound waves, and light

sensors programmed to recognize specific light frequencies and intensities. This practical session helped students understand real-time programming, sensor integration, and the fundamentals of robotic control systems.

During the Automotive En-

gineering session, instructors used a detailed car engine model to explain the mechanisms, components, and functioning of an internal combustion engine. Students observed how various engine parts interact to produce power and motion, linking classroom theories of physics

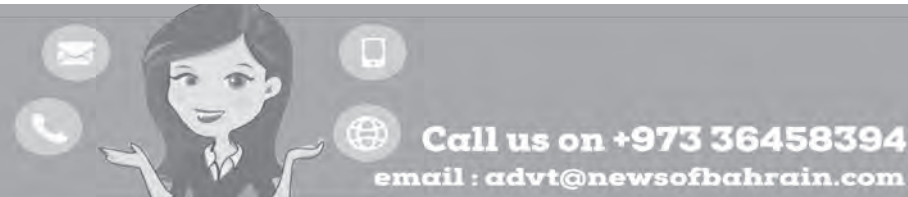

# Nikolic defeats fan favourite Kooheji

Stage set for a potential massive superfight

Manama

The historic BRAVE CF 100 event in Isa Town, Bahrain may have concluded, but the aftershocks are still being felt across the MMA world. What unfolded inside Khalifa Sports City was not just a night of milestone achievements, but it yielded the birth of BRAVE CF's next potential superfight.

From media day to the press conference, Muhammad 'The Punisher' Mokaev made his intentions unmistakably clear. If Borislav Nikolic successfully retained his BRAVE CF Bantamweight World Championship at BRAVE CF 100, the undefeated flyweight prospect would have his sights set on him next. But first, Mokaev had his own mountain to climb - attain the vacant BRAVE CF Flyweight World Championship.

In classic Mokaev fashion, the undefeated ph-

nom delivered another masterclass, stopping Gerard 'The Animal' Burns via second-round TKO

to capture the 125-lb gold. The victory not only extended his unblemished streak to 38 straight wins but also officially made him the inaugural BRAVE CF Flyweight World Champion.

In his post-fight interview, Mokaev made it known that, while he holds immense respect for his Team KHK teammate Hamza Kooheji, he'd be keeping a very close eye on the main event between Kooheji and Nikolic.

"I don't want to fight my teammate, but if his opponent wins, I want to fight for the bantamweight title next!" Mokaev declared.

As fate would have it, Borislav Nikolic did more than just retain his title - he made a statement. The Serbian champion dominated a tough and resilient Kooheji, defending his BRAVE CF Bantamweight crown in emphatic fashion. And then, things got interesting.

As Nikolic celebrated amid a mixed chorus of cheers and jeers from the Bahraini crowd, Mokaev appeared caged, with his new title on his arm. The two champions met face-to-face inside the cage, each draped in gold, and each exuding championship aura.

In that moment, the seeds were

planted for what could easily become one of the sport's biggest fights in 2026: a champion versus champion showdown between Mokaev and Nikolic.

Nikolic, ever the proud warrior, didn't shy away from the idea - but with one condition. Nikolic laid out his proposal stating, "We can fight anytime, anywhere. But if it's in an octagon, it needs to be paid. This is a business - I fight to feed my family. If the organization wants to pay, I'll fight in Serbia." Mokaev made it clear that he has no issue with that, stating, "Brother, I'll take care of your payment. Don't worry. Shahid, give him good money - and we're ready. I'm ready to become a double champ!"

The two champions then went forehead-to-forehead in a tense staredown, with the crowd erupting around them. Both running on adrenaline from their respective victories, neither man flinched nor backed down.

It was pure electricity and the kind of moment that reminds the world why BRAVE Combat Federation continues to be the home of global MMA's most exciting stories.

If this clash comes to fruition in 2026, it won't just be a title fight. It will be a collision of legacies and a battle between two men standing at the peak of their divisions, fighting for history.

BRAVE CF 100 delivered history, and it might have just planted the seeds for a new era in the entire sport.

They watched from the edge of their seats to-night as Toyota’s triumphant #7 trio took the chequered flag just ahead of their teammates Sebastien Buemi, Brendon Hartley, and Ryo Hirakawa in their #8 GR010 Hybrid.

Waving the chequered flag at the end of this year’s Bapco Energies 8 Hours of Bahrain was former racing driver and four-time 24 Hours of Le Mans winner, Frenchman Yannick Dalmas.

Taking the win in the WEC’s LMGT3 category were Akkodis ASP Team’s #87 trio of Petru Umbrurescu, Clemens Schmid,



and Jose Maria Lopez, who shared the duties in their Lexus RC F LMGT3. Following the race, the winners in the Hypercar category were awarded their respective

trophies by Bapco Energies Group CEO Mark J Thomas, while the LMGT3 class winners were presented their accolades by BIC Board Member Tariq Jaleel Alsaffar.

At the end of the Le Mans-inspired spectacle, four WEC titles were decided in Bahrain.

Ferrari won the FIA Hypercar World Endurance Manufacturers’ Championship, while Ferrari AF Corse’s #51 crew of Alessandro Pier Guidi, Antonio Giovinazzi, and James Calado clinched the FIA Hypercar World Endurance Drivers’ Championship.

Manthey 1st Phorm claimed the FIA Endurance Trophy for LMGT3 Teams, and their #92 crew of Riccardo Pera, Richard Lietz, and Ryan Hardwick lifted the FIA Endurance Trophy for LMGT3 Drivers.

Also champions were AF Corse’s #83 crew of Robert Kubica, Yifei Yi, and Philip Hanson. They had already secured the FIA World Cup for Hypercar Teams heading into the final round.

Toyota got off to a strong start, leading the field into turn one with both their Hypercars rolling into action from the front row. Their #7 crew held on to the advantage after the first two hours, but then Aston Martin Thor Team’s #009 Valkyrie powered ahead mid-race. Heading into the concluding two hours, the pole-sitters were back in charge, and they held on until the end.

De Vries was in the #7 GR010 Hybrid to end the race, and he led Buemi in the #8 Toyota by 19.378 seconds.

Finishing third overall and taking the final step on the Hypercar podium were Ferrari AF Corse’s #50 crew of Antonio Fuoco, Miguel Molina, and Nicklas Nielsen, who were 26.342 seconds behind in their Ferrari 499P contender. Ferrari AF Corse’s #51 trio came fourth 26.504s back, and AF Corse’s #83 Hypercar were fifth 39.729s from the victors, both also in Ferrari 499Ps.

In the LMGT3 category, the Akkodis ASP Team #87 won just 0.786s ahead of Iron Lynx’s #61 Mercedes-AMG GT3 driven by Martin Berry, Lin Hohenius, and Maxime Martin.

Heart of Racing Team’s #27 trio of Ian James, Zacharie Robichon, and Mattia Drudi were third 1.837s adrift in their Aston Martin Vantage AMR LMGT3. Completing the top five in class were newly crowned champions Manthey 1st Phorms’ #92 crew, who finished 14.205s from Akkodis in their Porsche 911 GT3 R LMGT3, and Vista AF Corse’s #21 trio of Francois Heriau, Simon Mann, and Alessio Rovera, who were 16.311s from the victors in their Ferrari 296 LMGT3.

This year’s Bapco Energies 8 Hours of Bahrain was the 14th WEC race to be held at BIC. It featured a stacked 36-car field.
