

Interior Minister attends RAP graduation ceremony

Interior Minister, General Shaikh Rashid bin Abdullah Al Khalifa, yesterday attended the graduation ceremony of the fifth batch of master's degree students of the Royal Academy of Police (RAP).

New conditions for transferring Bahraini 'sea fishing' licence set

Works, Municipalities Affairs and Urban Planning Minister Essam bin Abdulla Khalaf has issued a decision setting new controls for the transfer of a Bahraini fishing licence from one person to another from the second-degree relatives of the licensee.

The conditions stipulate that the person requested to transfer the licence must meet the conditions for obtaining it in accordance with the provisions of the Bahrain Fishing, Exploitation and Protection Law, that the licence to be transferred is valid, and that the licensee should not have any violation related to the licence referred to the Public Prosecution, the courts or any official body.

The new decision also stipulates that the marine fishing licence shall be transferred to

another person if it is proven that the licensee is unable to practise sea fishing due to illness or physical or mental disability, according to a decision or a medical certificate approved by the competent medical authorities, and that the licensee is over 60 years of age.

The decision also includes the permissibility of transferring the fishing licence in the event of the death of the licensee with the approval of the Maritime Control Department to one of the heirs who meets the conditions for obtaining the licence.

Planting 110,000 seasonal flowers

The Northern Region Municipality has planted 60,000 seasonal flower seedlings of various types as part of its plans and programmes to beautify streets and public places, as well as increase green spaces.

Flowers such as zinnias and marigolds were planted on Shaikh Hamad Street in Hamad Town.

Some 50,000 different types of flowers, such as petunias, were also planted in Hamad City and Budaiya Street.

The Director General of the Northern Region Municipality, Engineer Lamia Al Fadala, said that the municipality launched its production of the season flowers in the Hamad Town nursery.

It includes 40,000 marigolds and 20,000 zinnias.

Main sewage water carrier project underway in Hidd Industrial Area

Work has started to construct the main sewage water carrier in Hidd Industrial Area.

The project includes the construction of a main sewage conveyor line with a total length of 3.3 kilometres, of which 1.1 km will be implemented using the Open Cut method.

The remaining 2.3 kms will be excavation using Micro Tunneling machines, and three pumping stations will be re-established.

The project will contribute to reducing the cost of operation and maintenance of the old pumping stations.

It will also raise the capacity of the sewage network, from 2,300 cubic metres per day to approximately 24,000 cubic metres per day, to serve the current and future industrial facilities in the region, he added.

The final wastewater will be carried out at the Muharraq treatment plant to make the most of its capacity.

The project falls within the national strategic plan set by the ministry for the wastewater sector as a basis for planning,

developing and expanding networks and treatment systems in Bahrain with the rapid urban development, with the aim of achieving sustainable development for this sector and providing the best services to all regions.
