Saudi, Qatar sign high-speed railway deal

Saudi Arabia and Qatar yesterday signed a deal to construct a high-speed rail connecting the Gulf countries' capitals, marking the latest sign of improved ties between the two nations.

According to a statement in the official Saudi press, the "high-speed electric passenger railway" would connect Riyadh and Doha.

The Saudi cities of Al-Hofuf and Dammam are also expected to be on the network.

The train would reach speeds exceeding 300 kilometres per hour (186 mph) and the trip would take roughly two hours between the two capitals.

Powerful quake rattles Japan

A major earthquake rocked Japan's northern coast yesterday, with the country's meteorological agency recording several tsunami waves and local media reporting injuries.

The magnitude 7.6 quake - which struck off Misawa on Japan's Pacific coast - reportedly forced residents to flee their homes and left thousands of people without power.

The Japan Meteorological Agency issued a tsunami warning, with one wave hitting a port in the northern region of Aomori, where Misawa is located.

European allies support Zelensky

Ukraine's European allies put on a show of support for President Volodymyr Zelensky yesterday as they expressed scepticism about parts of the US proposal to end the war with Russia.

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer hosted Zelensky, French President Emmanuel Macron and German Chancellor Friedrich Merz at his Downing Street residence in London.

US President Donald Trump accused Zelensky of "ignoring" his proposal to end the war.

Stepmother to face trial for trafficking girl into prostitution

A woman accused of trafficking her under-18 stepdaughter into prostitution will appear before the High Criminal Court on 14 December, with prosecutors saying she brought the girl to Bahrain and lived off the money she earned.

The defendant remains in custody ahead of the hearing.

The case began after a report to the Anti-Trafficking in Persons Directorate alleged the girl was being exploited in prostitution.

Investigators concluded that the defendant arranged clients through social media and the internet and targeted men of different nationalities.

**Arrival**

The victim told investigators she arrived in Bahrain with the defendant, her Asian stepmother.

They stayed in a hotel for about five days before moving to another.

She said the defendant then began bringing men to meet her for prostitution, and that she was made to collect the payments and hand them over.

# Corruption fight


The event, held at the Public Health Directorate, is part of the ministry’s ongoing efforts to promote health awareness and strengthen a culture of prevention.

## Highlighting community, regional and international partnership

● **International Anti-Corruption Day set for today**

Legislative committees marked International Anti-Corruption Day, observed annually on December 9, by emphasising Bahrain's ongoing efforts to strengthen integrity, enhance transparency, and combat corruption in all its forms.

These efforts are carried out under the leadership of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, with the follow-up of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister.

The Shura Council's Financial and Economic Affairs Committee, chaired by Khalid Hussain Al Musallam, highlighted the government's integrated framework of legislation and oversight mechanisms that reinforce financial and administrative integrity.

The committee noted the role of the General Directorate of Anti-Corruption, Economic and Electronic Security in combating financial and economic crimes, enforcing the law, applying modern technologies to detect violations, and building institutional partnerships to safeguard public funds and strengthen confidence in regulatory and security bodies.

The Council's Financial and Economic Affairs Committee stressed that advanced legislation and effective oversight procedures have boosted institutional efficiency and accountability.

# Traffic ease

Muharraq Municipal Council revives BD12m bridge and coastline upgrade plans

A proposed bridge between Muharraq and Arad, expected to cost about BD12 million, was returned to the agenda by the Muharraq Municipal Council yesterday.

The council also approved a recommendation to proceed with feasibility work for upgrading the Al Dair and Samaheej coastline.

Deputy chairman Saleh Bu-Hazza said the bridge would help ease movement between the two areas and reduce congestion on Muharraq's roads during peak hours.

### Plans

He said engineering designs and technical plans should be prepared so the project can be presented to the relevant bodies.

The idea, he added, has been raised for years, with traffic growth adding weight to calls to move it forward.

On the coastal scheme, the Council approved the Services and Public Utilities Committee's recommendation after reviewing earlier updates stating that financial and technical feasibility studies are being prepared in coordination with the Ministry of Finance, ahead of presenting the project through

the Government Investment Platform.

### Aim

The aim is to set aside public waterfront spaces for leisure, support domestic tourism and attract investment tied to the development of coastal areas.

Members also discussed a request to allocate a park on a vacant plot in Arad to provide space for families within residential neighbourhoods, and considered setting aside an adjacent plot for car parks to serve residents and ease local

congestion.

Council member Ahmed Al Moqahwi called for better use of vacant land for parks and parking.

### Control

He also urged closer control of leasing agricultural plots near housing, saying some had been turned into livestock pens.

Al Moqahwi said violations had been recorded and referred to the competent authorities.

In East Hidd, council member Mohammed Al Moqahwi called for new access points and streets, especially in Block 118 on Road 20, to reduce traffic queues linked to population growth following housing projects and new apartment buildings.

### Routes

He said the limited number of current entry and exit routes has led to clear congestion during peak periods.

The councillor also called for an added access point to support emergency vehicles, including police, ambulance and Civil Defence.

Al Moqahwi further urged maintenance and resurfacing of Road 20 in the Bu Shahin neighbourhood, citing heavy daily truck traffic and the need to improve drainage and road quality in line with the area's growing needs.

## 25 illegal workers detained, 57 deported

● **LMRA conducts 1,352 inspection campaigns, visits**

Twenty-five violating and irregular workers were detained and 57 others deported following 1,352 inspection campaigns conducted between November 30 and December 6, the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) announced.

Inspection teams also monitored several breaches of regulatory laws, particularly those related to the Labour Market Regulatory Authority and Residence Laws in the Kingdom of Bahrain.

Legal measures were taken against all recorded violations.

### Shops

A total of 1,321 inspection visits were carried out across shops in all governorates, along with 31 joint inspection campaigns.

These included 17 campaigns in the Capital Governorate, four in Muharraq, four in the Northern Governorate and six in the Southern Gov-

ernorate.

Participating government entities included the Ministry of Interior, represented by the Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs (NPRA), the respective Police Directorates in each governorate, and the General Directorate of Crime Detection and Forensic Science.

Other participating bodies were the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, the Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture, the Bahrain Tourism & Exhibitions Authority (BTEA) and the Social Insurance Organisation (SIO).

### Coordination

Joint coordination with government agencies will continue, with efforts intensified to conduct inspection campaigns across all governorates and address practices that undermine labour market stability or impact the Kingdom's economic and social security.

The authority also renewed its call for public support in reporting illegal labour practices through the electronic form on [www.lmra.gov.bh](http://www.lmra.gov.bh), the call centre at 17506055, or the government's Suggestions and Complaints System (Tawasul).

### LMRA-stc partnerships



His Excellency Nibras Talib, CEO of the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA), has emphasised the authority's commitment to strengthening partnerships with the private sector to maintain Bahrain's role in the labour market and protect workers' rights. Also Chairman of the National Committee for Combatting Trafficking in Persons, Talib met with Khalid Al Osaimi, CEO of stc Bahrain and Chairman of stc Pay Bahrain. The LMRA official commended stc Pay for aligning its digital wallet services.

# Saudi Arabia, Qatar sign high-speed rail deal to link kingdoms

Saudi Arabia and Qatar yesterday signed a deal to construct a high-speed rail connecting the Gulf kingdoms' capitals, marking the latest sign of improved ties between the two countries that were once deeply at odds.

According to a statement in the official Saudi press, the "high-speed electric passenger railway" would connect Riyadh

and Doha.

The Saudi cities of Al-Hofuf and Dammam are also expected to be on the network.

The train would reach speeds exceeding 300 kilometres per hour (186 mph) and the trip would take roughly two hours between the two capitals.

A direct flight between the cities clocks in at around 90 minutes.

The project, set to be completed in six years, ex-



pects to serve 10 million passengers per year, the statement said.

The agreement was signed by Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman and Qatar's Emir Sheikh Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani during the latter's visit to Riyadh.

The deal is just the latest in a series of moves marking the dramatic improvement in ties between the Gulf kingdoms in recent years.

# Trump says to sign order blocking AI regulation by states

President Donald Trump said yesterday he will attempt to strip states of the right to regulate the surging AI industry, arguing centralized rulemaking is vital to maintain US dominance.

"There must be only One Rule-book if we are going to continue to lead in AI," he posted on his Truth Social platform, announcing an executive order that would seek to prevent state-level regulation.

Trump has made a major play to position the United States at the head of the global race to build and control AI tools pre-

dicted to transform everything from the way the economy works to military technology.

However, the White House is running up against deep skepticism in Congress and within his own MAGA movement, where many voices are wary of the technology's potential economic and social harms.

They point to polls that show increasing concern about AI, especially among young people who are nervous about getting or keeping a job.

Figures within his own MAGA movement, such as strategy guru Steve Bannon, complain of Trump's closer ties to Big

Tech that put the president out of touch with his political base.

The announcement that he will sign an executive order centralizing AI regulation comes after Congress has twice refused to vote for allowing the overriding of state-level laws on AI.

"We are beating ALL COUNTRIES at this point in the race, but that won't last long if we are going to have 50 States, many of them bad actors, involved in RULES and the APPROVAL PROCESS," Trump wrote in his post.

"THERE CAN BE NO DOUBT ABOUT THIS! AI WILL BE DESTROYED IN ITS INFANCY! I will be doing a ONE RULE Executive

Order this week."

The order is likely to stir more political opposition and legal challenges even if no details are yet known about what it would say.

A draft order seen by The Hill last month would have created a task force dedicated to challenging state AI laws and restricted certain broadband funding for states with

AI laws deemed overly burdensome.

The idea to stop states going their own way has been advanced by Trump's AI and Crypto Czar David Sacks, a Silicon Valley insider, with the support of AI's biggest players, including OpenAI boss Sam Altman and Nvidia CEO Jensen Huang.

"State by state AI regula-

tion would drag this industry to a halt, and it would create a national security concern as we need to make sure that United States advances AI technology as quickly as possible," Huang told reporters during a visit to US Congress last week.

Industry bosses complain that there are more than 1,000 AI-related bills currently moving through state legislatures.

"How do you cope with those varied regulations (and) compete with countries like China, which are moving fast in this technology?" Google CEO Sundar Pichai told "Fox News Sunday."





**Pegasus Airlines to acquire Czech carrier Smartwings**

Turkish low-cost carrier Pegasus Airlines on Monday said it had agreed to buy the Czech airline Smartwings in a bid to strengthen its presence in Europe.

In a statement, Pegasus said the 154-million-euro agreement (\$180 million), which still needs the green light of regulators, would see the Czech Republic's largest carrier retaining its own name.

"Together, we aim to spread our wings across Europe with two distinctive brands, Smartwings and Pegasus Airlines," the Turkish carrier said.

**BNP Paribas sells AG Insurance stake for \$2.2 bn**

French banking group BNP Paribas said yesterday that it has sold a 25 percent stake in AG Insurance to Belgian insurance giant Ageas for 1.9 billion euros (\$2.2 billion). The deal gives Ageas complete control of AG Insurance which is Belgium's leading insurer.

Ageas was previously known as Fortis, which was bailed out by Belgium following the 2007-2008 global financial crisis. Fortis sold off its retail banking operations in Belgium to BNP Paribas, which became known as BNP Paribas Fortis.

BNP Paribas Fortis held the 25 percent stake in AG Insurance.

As part of the deal, BNP Paribas will increase its 15 percent stake in Ageas to 22 percent, at a cost of 1.1 billion euros.

**Paramount counters Netflix with hostile bid for Warner Bros**

Paramount launched an all-cash tender offer yesterday to acquire Warn-

er Bros. Discovery for \$30 per share, challenging a previously announced deal between WBD and Netflix.

The hostile offer sets up a furious battle between Paramount -- whose owner Larry Ellison is an ally of Donald Trump -- and streaming behemoth Netflix to buy one of Hollywood's most storied studios.

Netflix shocked the industry last week by announcing it had sealed an agreement to buy the Warner Bros. studio, drawing bitter reactions from voices in Hollywood worried about the future of their industry.

Trump weighed in on Sunday, saying Netflix's effort to acquire Warner Bros. "could be a problem" as it would be left with a huge market share of the film and TV industry.

"We're really here to finish what we started," David Ellison, chairman and CEO of

Paramount, told CNBC as his company made a sixth offer for Warner Bros since the bidding war began.

Unlike Netflix's offer, Paramount's latest bid includes cable channels such as CNN, TNT, TBS and Discovery.

It would put the properties under the ownership of a company with close ties to the Trump administration.

The offer values the entertainment giant at \$108.4 billion and represents a 139% premium over WBD's September stock price of \$12.54, when the bidding war began.

Paramount in a statement called Netflix's bid, which values Warner Bros. studios at nearly \$83 billion, "inferior and uncertain."

"WBD shareholders deserve an opportunity to consider our superior all-cash offer," Ellison said. Over the decades, Warn-

er Brothers has produced film classics including "Casablanca" and "Citizen Kane," as well as more recent blockbuster shows including "The Sopranos," "Game of Thrones" and the "Harry Potter" movies.

Paramount argued its deal provides greater regulatory certainty than the Netflix transaction, which it said would give Netflix a 43% share of global streaming subscribers and face "protracted regulatory challenges across the world."

The combined company would unite Paramount's portfolio -- including Paramount Pictures, CBS, Nickelodeon and Paramount+ -- with WBD's assets including HBO Max and major sports rights.

Paramount said the merger would generate over \$6 billion in cost savings while maintaining theatrical releases and increased content spending.

**Meta buys AI wearables startup Limitless**

Meta on Friday confirmed it is buying Limitless, a US startup that makes a wearable pendant that records and summarizes conversations and meetings with the help of artificial intelligence.

Financial details of the deal to acquire the five-year-old Denver-based firm were not disclosed.

"We're excited that Limitless will be joining Meta to help accelerate our work to build AI-enabled wearables," a Meta spokesperson said in response to an AFP inquiry. Meta Chief Executive Mark Zuckerberg has made AI a priority at the tech giant with a stated aim of achieving "superintelligence."

AI is being used to enhance Meta apps including Facebook and Instagram, and to ramp up capabilities of smartglasses it makes in partnership with Essilor-Luxottica.

**BM says buying data management firm Confluent for \$11 bn**

IBM announced yesterday that it will purchase US data management company Confluent for \$11 billion, seeking to expand its footprint into the increasingly important field of real-time data for AI. The acquisition will combine IBM's AI and cloud computing capabilities with Confluent's real-time data streaming platform, which helps businesses connect and process data across different systems.

**'Not black or white': Teens worldwide react to Australia social media ban**

Australia's landmark move to ban under-16s from social media will be closely watched by other countries, which could follow suit with similar laws.

AFP spoke to teenagers and adults around the world about the Australian ban, which comes in on Wednesday. Here are some of their reactions:

**Mumbai: 'Nothing is black or white'**

At the seafront in India's Mumbai, 19-year-old Pratigya Jena scrolls with her friends through Instagram videos of a posing influencer and a camel at a beach.

Social media "should be partially banned because according to me nothing is either black or white", the student said. "Gen Z are very active, they are doing really well on social media. And doing great things, especially young entrepreneurs," Jena said.

At the same time, children watching adult content online "has a very bad

effect".

At a Mumbai park, cricket coach Pratik Bhurke, 38, said Australia's move would encourage children to spend time outdoors and could have "great benefits" in India too.

**Berlin: 'Help to detox'**

In the chilly German capital, Luna Drewes, 13, is watching selfie-style TikTok clips posted by other young people.

"Actually a good thing

in some ways because social media often portrays a certain image of how people should look, like girls have to be thin," she said of the ban.

Another teenager, Enno Caro Brandes, said: "I'm 15 so for me the ban would definitely come into effect. I can't really imagine giving it up completely.

"A ban is a bit extreme, but it could definitely help to do a detox."

**Doha: 'Really stupid'**

An AI baby singing and answering interview questions are among the videos served up to Firdha Razak, 16, as she scrolls in her room.

Razak is not in favour of a ban. "It's really stupid, honestly," although "there's not really much we can do as 16-year-olds" if governments decide to act, she said.

The families of many people in Qatar live abroad, so "it's going to be so much harder to talk to them".

A 16-year-old in Doha, Youssef Walid, 16, said bans like Australia's were "a bit harsh" and hard to enforce.

"We can use VPN. We can easily bypass the security

and easily make new accounts," he said.

Lagos: 'We were born with it' At a Nigerian high school, Michelle Okinedo is revising for exams, checking over her hand-written notes. In the classroom -- where phones are banned -- students in uniform sit at separate desks.

"I see where the (Australian) government is coming from. Students nowadays, they are really distracted," Okinedo said. Even so, "we were born with it", the 15-year-old added. "And I don't think it's something I want to stop."

Her mother, 50-year-old event planner Hannah Okinedo, agrees with a social media ban for under-16s, saying most parents "don't have time to monitor their children all day".

**Mexico City: 'Express yourself'**

Young Mexico City resident Aranza Gomez, 11, has had a smartphone with access to social media for one year.

Without it, "I would honestly feel sad. I wouldn't really have a good way to spend my time," she said.

Santiago Ramirez Rojas, 16, is sitting on a bench in the

Tabacalera district, scrolling through posts containing news about Argentina and tour dates for a musician.

"Social media today is very important for expressing yourself, no matter how old you are," said Rojas.

But "there are many kidnappings that begin online" and "younger kids, around 10 or 12, are much more vulnerable".

**Sydney: 'Not going to have any impact'**

In Australia one family has diverging ideas on how the law will go.

"I don't think the government really knows what they're doing and I don't think it's going to have any impact on children of Australia," said 15-year-old Layton Lewis.

But his mother Emily Lewis hopes it will help children "have better, more authentic relationships".

"They'll make proper plans, like we used to, to meet up with their friends face-to-face and have proper conversations as opposed to these illusive friendships online," she said.





News in brief

◆ **The United States, Israel** and Qatar held a trilateral meeting in New York Sunday, a senior White House official told AFP, months after Israeli jets conducted an airstrike in Doha, unsuccessfully targeting Hamas leadership. The White House official confirmed that the meeting had taken place but did not provide any further details. Two sources told US news outlet Axios it was “the highest level meeting between the countries since the deal to end the war in Gaza, for which Qatar served as a key mediator.” Axios also reported White House envoy Steve Witkoff hosted the meeting, with Mossad spy chief David Barnea representing Israel and an unnamed senior Qatari official in attendance. On Saturday, Qatar and Egypt both called for the withdrawal of Israeli troops and the deployment of an international stabilization force to fully implement the fragile agreement to end the conflict in Gaza.



Israel, Qatar and US hold trilateral meeting in New York

◆ **US President Donald Trump** commented Sunday on Netflix's effort to acquire storied Hollywood studio Warner Bros., saying the streaming giant already has “a very large market share” and “it could be a problem.” “I’ll be involved in that decision,” Trump said upon arriving at the Kennedy Center Honors awards ceremony, referring to the decision facing federal regulators weighing the nearly \$83 billion deal that has raised antitrust concerns and ire among Hollywood’s elite. Trump also lavished praise on Netflix co-CEO Ted Sarandos, who recently visited the White House, saying “he’s done one of the greatest jobs in the history of movies.”

◆ **European Council** president Antonio Costa yesterday rejected any attempt by the United States to meddle in Europe’s politics, after Washington published a new security strategy sharply criticising the continent’s policies. “What we cannot accept is the threat to interfere in European politics,” Costa told a conference in Brussels. The new US National Security Strategy, released last week, saw President Donald Trump lambast Europe as an over-regulated, censorious continent lacking in “self-confidence” and facing “civilizational erasure” due to immigration. The strategy made clear that the United States under Trump would aggressively pursue similar objectives in Europe, in line with the agendas of far-right parties. It said the administration would be “cultivating resistance to Europe’s current trajectory within European nations.” “The United States cannot replace European citizens in choosing which parties are good and which are bad,” Costa said. “The United States cannot replace Europe in what’s its vision is of freedom of expression.”

France to return smuggled dinosaur skeleton to Mongolia

France was to hand over a 70 million-year-old dinosaur skeleton to Mongolia Monday which was looted from the Gobi desert and seized by French customs. The “extremely rare” fossil of a *Tarbosaurus bataar*, considered to be the Asian cousin of the fearsome *Tyrannosaurus rex*, was seized by French officials in 2015. Public Accounts Minister Amelie de Montchalin was to hand it and around 30 other items including dinosaur eggs over later Monday. They had been looted from the Gobi Desert before passing through South Korea and were confiscated by customs

during a seizure in the central town of Gannat in February 2015. “This is an entire *Tarbosaurus*, estimated at around 700,000 euros when it was seized, but since then the market has exploded, so we could say it is worth two to three times that amount today,” Sophie Hocquerelle, communications manager for French customs, told France 2 television on Sunday. She described the find as “an exceptional discovery”. *Tarbosaurus bataar* lived during the Cretaceous period and disappeared some 65 million years ago. There have been no specimens of *T. bataar* reported outside of Asia.

Tens of thousands celebrate as Syria marks one year since Assad’s ouster

The war killed more than half a million people

● **Sharaa’s Islamist-led alliance took Damascus on December 8 after nearly 14 years of war**

Tens of thousands took to the streets across Syria yesterday to celebrate a year since the toppling of long-time ruler Bashar al-Assad, with President Ahmed al-Sharaa urging people to unite to rebuild the country. Sharaa’s Islamist-led alliance launched a lightning offensive in late November last year and took Damascus on December 8 after nearly 14 years of war, ending more than five decades of Assad family rule. Military personnel marched in Damascus as helicopters flew overhead with Sharaa and several ministers in attendance, state media reported. Parades and large celebrations were also held in other major cities including Aleppo. Sharaa is expected to speak later Monday. The war, which erupted in 2011 with the then-government’s brutal crackdown on democracy protests, killed more than half a million people and displaced millions from their homes. Jubilant crowds thronged the streets of the capital, many people waving Syrian flags, AFP correspondents said, after mosques in the Old City began the day broadcasting celebratory prayers at dawn. “What happened over

the past year seems like a miracle,” said Iyad Burghol, 44, a doctor, noting major developments including President Donald Trump’s embrace of Sharaa, a former jihadist who once had a US bounty on his head. After years of war and economic crisis, people need basics like electricity “but the most important thing to me is civil peace”, Burghol told AFP. Sharaa has made progress abroad like restoring Syria’s international standing and winning sanctions relief, but he faces ma-

jor challenges at home including gaining people’s trust, guaranteeing security, rebuilding institutions and keeping his fractured country united. “The current phase requires the unification of efforts by all citizens to build a strong Syria, consolidate its stability, safeguard its sovereignty, and achieve a future befitting the sacrifices of its people,” Sharaa said following dawn prayers at Damascus’s famous Umayyad Mosque. He was wearing military garb

as he did when he entered the capital a year ago.

Magnitude 7.6 quake strikes off Japan, triggering tsunami warning

A major earthquake rocked Japan’s northern coast yesterday, with the country’s meteorological agency recording two 40-centimetre tsunami waves and local media reporting injuries. The United States Geological Survey said the magnitude 7.6 quake struck at 1415 GMT off Misawa on Japan’s Pacific coast, at a depth of 53 kilometres (33 miles). The Japan Meteorological Agency issued a tsunami warning, with a first wave hitting a port in the northern region of Aomori, where Misawa is located, at 11:43 (1443 GMT). At 11:50 pm, another wave reached the town of Urakawa town in the Hokkaido region, the agency said. Both waves measured 40 centimetres (16 inches), it added. Public broadcaster NHK cited a hotel employee in the city of Hachinohe in Aomori as saying there had been some injuries, with live footage showing shattered glass fragments scattered

across roads. The quake was also felt in the northern hub of Sapporo, where alarms rang on smartphones to alert residents. A reporter for NHK in Hokkaido described a horizontal shaking of around 30 seconds that made him unable to keep standing as the earthquake struck.

The meteorological agency earlier warned a tsunami of up to three metres (10 feet) was expected to hit Japan’s Pacific coast. Japan sits on top of four major tectonic plates along the western edge of the Pacific “Ring of Fire” and is one of the world’s most

tectonically active countries. The archipelago, home to around 125 million people, experiences around 1,500 jolts every year. The vast majority are mild, although the damage they cause varies according to their location and depth below the Earth’s surface.

# Indonesia suffers food, medical shortages as Asia flood tolls rise

Tropical storms and monsoon rains have pummelled Southeast and South Asia

Regions hit by floods that killed hundreds in Indonesia were suffering from food and medical shortages, authorities said, as elephants pitched in yesterday to

help clear up debris.

Tropical storms and monsoon rains have pummelled Southeast and South Asia this month, triggering landslides and flash floods from the rainforests of Indonesia's western Sumatra island to highland plantations in Sri Lanka.

"Everything is lacking, especially medical personnel. We are short on doctors," Muzakir Manaf, the governor of Indonesia's Aceh province, told reporters late Sunday.

Indonesia's national disaster mitigation agency (BNPB) said 961 people in Aceh, North Sumatra and West Sumatra had been killed, while 293 were missing. More than a million

people were displaced, the agency said.

Sri Lanka's military meanwhile deployed thousands of extra troops to aid recovery efforts after a devastating cyclone caused a wave of destruction and killed 635 people.

In Pidie Jaya, a district in Indonesia's Aceh badly affected by the floods, four elephants from a nearby training centre picked up large pieces of rubble with their trunks and helped shift stuck vehicles.

"We brought four elephants to clear the debris from the houses of the communities that were swept away by the flood," Hadi Sofyan, the head of a local conservation agency, told AFP.

"Our target is to clean the debris near the residents' houses so they can access their homes," he said, adding the elephants would be used for the rest of the week. The downpours and subsequent landslides throughout western Indonesia have injured at least 5,000 people and devastated infrastructure, including schools and hospitals.

In the city of Banda Aceh, long queues formed for drinking water and fuel, and prices of basic commodities such as eggs were skyrocketing, an AFP correspondent said.

Costs to rebuild after the disaster could run up to 51.82 trillion rupiah (\$3.1 billion), the BNPB said late Sunday.

## Trump says 'a little bit disappointed' Zelensky has not read peace proposal

US President Donald Trump on Sunday said he felt "a little bit disappointed" with Ukrainian counterpart Volodymyr Zelensky for not engaging with a plan to end the war with Russia.

"So we've been speaking to President Putin and we've been speaking to Ukrainian leaders -- including Zelensky, President Zelensky -- and I have to say that I'm a little bit disappointed that President Zelensky hasn't yet read the proposal, that was as of a few hours ago," Trump told reporters when asked on the red carpet for the Kennedy Center Honors.

Days of negotiations between US and Ukrainian officials, including Zelensky, ended Saturday without an apparent breakthrough, though Zelensky committed to conducting further talks toward "real peace."

The talks came after US envoys Steve Witkoff and Jared Kushner met Russian President Vladimir Putin at the Kremlin, with Moscow rejecting parts of the US proposal.

The US plan has been through several drafts since it first emerged last month, amid criticism it was too soft on Russia, which invaded Ukraine in February 2022.



## WHO says 114 killed in strikes on Sudan kindergarten, hospital

The World Health Organization said yesterday that 114 people, including 63 children, were killed in "senseless" strikes on a hospital and kindergarten in Sudan's South Kordofan state last week.

Local official Essam al-Din al-Sayed, head of the Kalogi administrative unit, told AFP that Thursday's paramilitary drone attack on the army-held town hit "first a kindergarten, then a

hospital and a third time as people tried to rescue the children".

Since April 2023, Sudan's regular army and the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces have been locked in a conflict that has killed tens of thousands and displaced nearly 12 million.

Following their late-October capture of El-Fasher -- the army's last stronghold in western Sudan -- the RSF have pushed eastward into the oil-rich Kordofan region, divided into three states.

## Indian star acquitted in high-profile rape, abduction case

An Indian court yesterday acquitted a film star of criminal charges over accusations he was involved in a high-profile case of the rape and abduction of an actress.

Several others were convicted the same day in relation to the case, which rocked South India's Malayalam-language Mollywood film industry in 2017 and led to an investigation of allegations of rampant sexual harassment in a sector dominated by powerful men.

Gopalakrishnan Padmanabhan, the Kerala-based Mollywood actor better known by his stage name Dileep, was arrested in 2017 for allegedly orchestrating the assault, though he denied the charges.

He was imprisoned for three months before being released on bail.

Judge Honey M. Varghese announced the verdict in a trial court in southern Kerala state on Monday, acquitting Dileep while convicting six others of rape, conspiracy, abduction and other offences, Live Law legal news media outlet reported.

"The real conspiracy was against me," Dileep, 58, told reporters after the verdict in comments broadcast by local media.

The survivor, whose name has been withheld under Indian law, can challenge the verdict in a higher court.

The actress was travelling in a car to dub for a film when she was kidnapped and assaulted, according to local media reports.

## Four Nepalis among 25 killed in India's Goa club fire

Four Nepali citizens were among the 25 people killed in a fire at an Indian nightclub in the tourist resort region of Goa, officials said yesterday, a day after the blaze.

"Deeply saddened by the Goa fire tragedy in which 25 people lost their lives yesterday, including four Nepali nationals," Nepal's ambassador Shankar P. Sharma said in a statement.

The rest of the dead were Indian citizens, mainly the nightclub's staff, as well as holidaymakers from New Delhi.

The blaze broke out at a club in Arpora in the north of the coastal state, with officials reporting that "electrical firecrackers" had sparked the blaze.



# World stocks tread water with eyes on Fed

Global stock markets were steady on Monday as investors took few risks ahead of this week's Federal Reserve meeting, which may yield clues to the direction of interest rates in coming months. A surprise bid by Paramount for Warner Bros. Discovery brought the tech sector to life, however, as it could trigger a bidding war against Netflix. A monetary easing at Wednesday's Fed meeting is fully priced into stock prices, analysts said, but investors will scour the central bank's statement and news conference for insights into how many rate reductions might be on the cards next year, against a backdrop of stubborn inflationary pressures. "A rate cut (Wednesday)

Frankfurt outperformed other European markets after German industrial production unexpectedly jumped in October -- another sign that Europe's crisis-wracked top economy may be turning a corner. In New York, Warner Bros Discovery shares jumped by over seven% on the Nasdaq after Paramount countered last week's Netflix bid for the company with an all-cash offer worth \$108.4 billion. Netflix stock slumped more than 2%, while Paramount rose by close to 2%. Analysts had predicted last week that a Netflix/Warner linkup could amount to a major threat to Paramount's streaming business.

## Deal agreed to save Frankfurt's euro sculpture

Frankfurt, Germany euro -- giving the rest. EUF will officially take over ownership of the sculpture, by German artist Ottmar Hoerl, and ensure its upkeep. In true European style, the sculpture's future had been guaranteed after "years of discussions", she added. The cash will be used to cover costs such as maintenance and insurance of the work, which sits in Willy-Brandt-Platz in downtown Frankfurt. The upkeep is not cheap. Replacing one of the sculpture's stars -- some of which have in the past been kicked to pieces by vandals -- can cost up to 15,000 euros, according to officials. The sculpture had already come close to disappearing in 2014 -- as the eurozone was recovering from a debt crisis -- when the ECB decamped from its old building on Willy-Brandt-Platz to a new site in the east of Frankfurt. Its last major refurbishment, the addition of more than 2,000 LED bulbs, dates back to 2015. It was unveiled in 2001, shortly before euro notes and coins came into circulation on 1 January 2002. But the future of the work -- a giant blue euro symbol surrounded by 12 yellow stars -- looked uncertain as maintenance costs mounted and potential sponsors drifted away. But a deal struck between the ECB, city authorities and pro-EU group Europa Union Frankfurt (EUF) will ensure the work is preserved, city official Eileen O'Sullivan announced. The agreement provides for a 50,000 (\$58,000) annual budget, with city authorities contributing 30,000 euros and the ECB -- the central bank for the 20 countries that use the

## AI tools help choose best embryos for IVF

Artificial intelligence tools can now help choose the most promising embryos for in vitro fertilisation (IVF), although experts have warned of some ethical concerns. Procedures such as IVF allow millions of children to be born across the world each year to parents who have otherwise struggled to conceive. However the success rate of the procedure, which involves creating an embryo by fertilising an egg with sperm in the lab, can vary widely and declines with age. Now, almost 50 years after the first IVF child was born, "artificial intelligence is here to help us select better embryos



or at least help determine their potential for implantation", Nathalie Massin, the head of the clinical unit of an IVF centre at

the American Hospital of Paris, told AFP. The facility in the French capital carries out more than 2,300 IVF procedures every year. It is equipped with an embryo-scope, which works as a time-lapse camera that continuously films the development of the embryos. The data recorded by the camera -- such as the shape, symmetry and cell division of the embryo -- had previously only been used to a limited extent. But tools using AI such as machine learning have been shown to help doctors select the embryos that have the best chance of being successfully implanted or frozen for later.

## EU approves Mars takeover of Pringles maker Kellanova

The European Union yesterday approved Mars's multi-billion-dollar acquisition of snack food business Kellanova, saying an antitrust probe found the transaction would not raise competition concerns. The European Commission, the EU's antitrust regulator, had launched an investigation in June over concerns that the transaction would lead to higher prices for consumers. But this concluded that Mars, the maker of M&M's and Snickers, would not benefit from much stronger bargaining power with retailers as a consequence of the purchase. "We looked very carefully at this deal to make sure that Mars would not gain extra power over retailers, power that could lead to for example higher prices



for shops and, ultimately, for consumers," European Union competition chief Teresa Ribera said. "Our review found no evidence that this risk exists, so we have decided to approve the acquisition." The commission argued this was due to the fact that Kellanova's products, which include Pringles and Pop-Tarts, have a long shelf life and are usually "the object of impulsive and in-

frequent purchases". And snack-buyers were unlikely to start shopping at a different store if the two firms' products were to become unavailable at their local supermarket. The deal was approved unconditionally. Mars's \$35.9 billion all-cash purchase of US-based Kellanova was announced in August last year. Mars, which is also headquartered in the United States, said at the time the acquisition would bring two new billion-dollar brands, Pringles and Cheez-It, into its snacks portfolio. The US Federal Trade Commission meanwhile had approved the merger earlier this year saying it posed no violation of antitrust law in the United States.

## Meta to allow European users to share less data: EU

Meta will allow European users of Facebook and Instagram to share less data and see fewer personalised ads after it was fined for breaking EU digital rules, Brussels said yesterday. The European commission said the US tech giant undertook to make the option available from January to settle a legal dispute over its "pay or consent" system that saw it hit with a 200-million-euro (\$233 million) fine. "Meta will give users the effective choice between: consenting to share all their data and seeing fully personalised advertising, and opting to share less personal data for an

experience with more limited personalised advertising," the commission said. It was the "first time" that such a choice was offered on Meta's social networks, the body that acts as the 27-nation bloc's digital and antitrust regulator said. The move followed talks with the company, which was found in breach of digital competition rules over its "pay for privacy" system earlier this year. Under the system, which has been vehemently criticised by rights groups, users have to pay to avoid data collection, or agree to share their data with Facebook and Instagram to keep using the platforms for free.

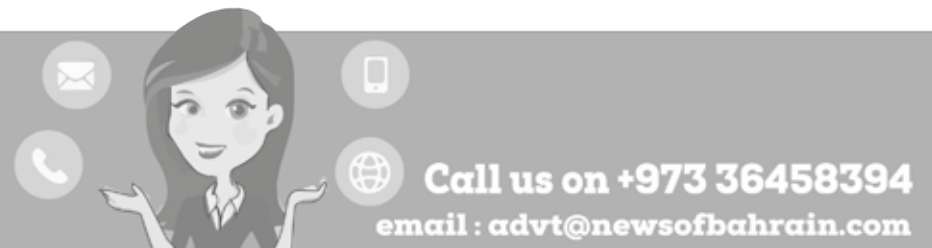

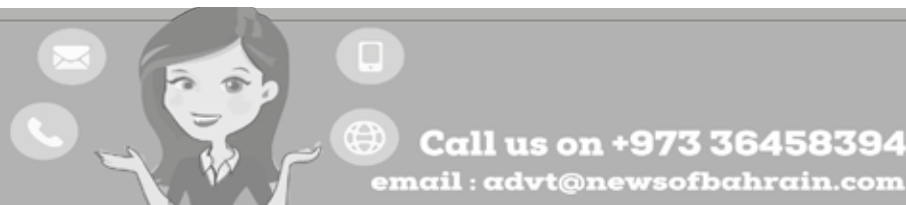

# Atlas Lions, Green Falcons Through to Last Eight

Arab Cup quarter-finals begin to take shape

● Morocco reach Arab Cup quarters despite missing stars, beating Saudi 1-0 as Oman and Comoros exit.

The FIFA Arab Cup continued last night with Group B action in Doha, where Morocco and Saudi Arabia secured quarter-final berths while Oman and Comoros were eliminated. Notably, Morocco fielded a squad without their star players as they focus on the upcoming Africa Cup of Nations later this month, whereas Saudi Arabia's team included their key stars under coach Herve Renard, who previously managed Morocco.

At Lusail Stadium, the Atlas Lions beat the Green Falcons 1-0 to finish as group leaders. The breakthrough came in the 10th minute after a well-timed press forced a mistake from Abdulla AlOmari. Karim El Berkaoui intercepted the loose pass, moved the ball to Tarik Tissoudali on the flank, and continued his run into the box. Tissoudali's return ball found him perfectly, and El Berkaoui tucked away his second goal of the tournament, giving Moroc-

co the lead they needed.

Saudi Arabia, already through after back-to-back wins, had a chance to equalize in the 68th minute when Amine Zouhrouh conceded a penalty, but Abdullah Al Hamdan failed to convert, allowing Morocco to maintain control and top the group.

Meanwhile at Stadium 974, Oman recorded a 2-1 win over Comoros, though it was not enough to change their fate. In the 30th minute, Comoros goalkeeper Ali Ahmada misjudged a risky dribble, allowing Issam Al Sabahi to force the ball over the line. Al Sabahi added a second in the 43rd minute, heading in a beautiful delivery from Ali Al Busaidi after his own clever movement inside the box. Comoros pulled one back in the 68th minute as Dine Hamidou Ali spun past two defenders and curled a right-footed shot into Ibrahim Al Mukhani's corner, but his solo effort proved insufficient.

Today's fixtures will complete the quarter-final lineup: Egypt face already-qualified Jordan at Al Bayt Stadium, UAE meet Kuwait with both still able to qualify, Algeria play Iraq for Group D supremacy, and Bahrain take on Sudan in a dead-rubber. Teams already through include Palestine, Syria, Morocco, Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Iraq, and Algeria.

## Milan's New Olympic Ice-Hockey Arena Draws Scrutiny Over Rink Dimensions

Preparations for the 2026 Milano Cortina Winter Olympics have encountered fresh scrutiny as the newly built Santiagiulia Arena, set to host the tournament's ice-hockey events, faces criticism over its dimensions and safety standards. The facility, located in Milan's Santa Giulia district, is reportedly shorter than the standard National Hockey League (NHL) rink length, prompting questions from athletes, coaches and international observers.

While NHL rinks typically measure 200 feet in length, the Santiagiulia Arena's playing surface falls short of that benchmark. Critics argue that a reduced rink size may affect the pace of play, alter tactical dynamics, and raise potential safety concerns—particularly in high-intensity Olympic competition, where speed and physical contact are central to the sport.

Organisers, however, have defended the venue, emphasising that the rink fully complies with the specifications set by the International Ice Hockey Federation (IIHF), the governing body for Olympic competition. IIHF regulations permit variations in rink dimensions, and officials maintain that the arena meets all required standards for player safety and competitive fairness.

## Inter's Thuram braced for fightback from crisis-hit Liverpool

Inter Milan striker Marcus Thuram insisted yesterday that the Italian side always rise to the occasion in the Champions League as he anticipates a fightback from crisis-hit Liverpool.

The English giants are struggling in ninth place in the Premier League with only four wins in their last 15 matches and a crisis sparked by Mohamed Salah's criticism.

The Egyptian has scored 48 goals in the Champions League across his career, but has been left out of manager Arne Slot's squad for the match at the San Siro following his public airing of grievances after Liverpool's 3-3 draw at Leeds on Saturday.

"The truth is that a champion, when doubts arise, wants to show what they're really capable of," Thuram told a pre-match press conference.

## Resilient Australia 'adapt on the go' to close in on Ashes glory

● Steve Smith praises team's adaptability

Australia's ability to adapt and rise in key moments has thrust them to the cusp of retaining the Ashes, with Steve Smith saying it is a process they have fine-tuned.

The hosts are firmly in the box seat against a ragged England after winning the first two Tests at Perth and Brisbane, both by eight wickets.

They head to Adelaide for the third encounter beginning on December 17 planning more of the same to secure the five-Test series for the fourth consecutive time on home soil.

The wily Smith, who captained the side in both Tests while Pat Cummins recovered from a back injury, said Australia's experience had come to the fore during crunch periods so far.

"We've identified (those) moments in the game and made the most of them," he told reporters.

"I think that's one thing this team's done for the last four years.

"We play 'live'. We adapt on the go, instead of getting back in

the sheds and going: 'We should have done this'.

"Sometimes it's just playing the long game. I think we've just adapted so well the last couple of years, and played in real time, I suppose."

In contrast, England stumbled when it mattered most, leading skipper Ben Stokes to question their mentality under pressure.

England are now faced with having to win a near-impossible three Tests in a row.

And they have not won a Test on Australian soil since the 2010-11 series, losing 15 and drawing two.

"When we are on top, we are great, and when behind the game we are also very good, but when the moment is neck-and-neck, we are not coming out on top on enough occasions,"

he said.

Marnus Labuschagne pointed to the patient 75-run stand between man-of-the-match Mitchell Starc (77) and Scott Boland (21 not out) for the ninth wicket at the Gabba that helped propel Australia to 511.

It ensured a 177-run first innings lead and while England clawed past the deficit, they could only set Australia 65 to win.

"I look back on this game and I look at the partnership between Starc and Scott. I look at those moments to get us in the situation where we had the night session (to bowl) on our terms," he said.

"We're in a really nice spot where we're just really process-driven, focused on what we need to do to be ready and

once again being ready for those big moments in the game."

Australia face some selection dilemmas for Adelaide, notably whether to recall veteran opener Usman Khawaja who missed the first two Tests with back issues.

In his absence, Travis Head -- whose home ground is Adelaide -- and Jake Weatherald looked good at the top.

Cummins seems certain to return with Brendan Doggett likely to make way, while chief selector George Bailey has said veteran off-spinner Nathan Lyon will play.

Lyon was dropped for the day-night Brisbane Test with Australia opting for an all-pace attack.

His replacement Michael Neser took 5-42 in England's second innings, but faces missing out.



# Norris proud to win his own way

## Rooney says Salah ‘destroying his Liverpool legacy’

Mohamed Salah is “absolutely destroying his Liverpool legacy” following an extraordinary outburst at manager Arne Slot, according to Wayne Rooney.

The Egypt forward said on Saturday he felt like he had been “thrown under the bus” by Liverpool and that he no longer had a relationship with Slot after he was left on the bench for the third consecutive game in a 3-3 draw at Leeds and not even introduced as a substitute.

After next weekend’s home match against Brighton, Salah is set to depart for the Africa Cup of Nations and hinted that could be his final appearance in a Liverpool shirt should he be selected.

Salah, however, did take part in Liverpool’s scheduled training session yesterday ahead of Tuesday’s Champions League tie at Inter Milan.

Former Manchester United and England striker Rooney believes Slot must now demonstrate he is in charge at Anfield by leaving Salah out completely from the trip to Italy.
