Elizabeth Olsen confirms 'WandaVision' will not be getting a second season

American actor Elizabeth Olsen has weighed in on the future of the popular series 'WandaVision', and sadly, fans shouldn't expect there to be a second season.

As per People magazine, the actor confirmed the news during a recent conversation she had with actor Kaley Cuoco for Variety's 'Actor on Actor' session.

When asked by the 'Big Bang Theory' alum about whether the

popular show will come back, Olsen said "no" and added, "It's definitely a limited series."

Clarifying her comments, the 'Ingrid Goes West' star further said, "I mean, I'm saying that. I don't know. I mean, with Marvel, you can never say no. People die, people come back to life."

Olsen then explained that she "would be shocked" if the series were to get renewed.

"The thing that I did learn through [my Facebook Watch series] Sorry for Your Loss and

WandaVision is I love doing television," she explained.

The actor added, "I do miss, I think, the four-five week experience of making a film and that just feels so exciting and like camp for a little bit. But I think this six-month experience of really hard work with the same people [on a show], it's exhausting [and] it just feels really good."

"WandaVision" premiered on Disney+ in January and received an overwhelming response from both fans and critics alike.

The nine-episode series follows Wanda Maximoff (Olsen) and Vision (Paul Bettany) as they begin to suspect that something is awry in their idyllic suburban neighbourhood.

Along with Olsen and Bettany, Kathryn Hahn (Agatha Harkness), Teyonah Paris (Monica Rambeau), Randall Park (Jimmy Woo), Kat Dennings (Darcy Lewis) and Evan Peters (Ralph Bohner) are also in the cast.

Singer Selena Gomez has revealed that she finds touring hard because it leaves her lacking in self-love.

Talking about the crystal-embellished bodysuit she wore to open her 2016 'Revival' gigs, Gomez said: "I'm not going to lie, Britney Spears inspired it from 'Toxic'. I wanted to find a moment where that could kind of have its place. Still have the outfit! Do I put it on and try to sing? Sometimes."

She stressed as a female it is harder to tour because of the pressure of multiple looks, reports femalefirst.co.uk.

"It's so hard to tour, and when you're a female, because you have all of this pressure to add multiple looks throughout the show. You want it to pop but you have to make it comfortable for yourself and realistic to dance in or to perform in," the singer added.

She said: "Tour is hard and it's very difficult for me because I tend to just get into a place where I'm not filling myself up with self-love, so how am I going to give it to all these people? But every moment of it, if you put me on a stage right now, it is the best feeling in the whole world."

Bill Skarsgard in talks to join Keanu Reeves-starrer 'John Wick 4'

Actor Bill Skarsgard is in talks to star in the upcoming 'John Wick' film.

As per The Hollywood Reporter, the fourth installment in the Lionsgate franchise will see actor Keanu Reeves return as a formerly retired hitman who finds himself stripped of the protection from a shadowy international assassins guild.

Chad Stahelski is returning to helm the upcoming project from a script by Shay Hatten and Michael Finch.

If finalised for the role, Skarsgard will join Reeves, Donnie Yen, and Japanese-British pop star Rina Sawayama in the fourth chapter.

The plan is to film the fourth and fifth 'John Wick' installments back-to-back. 'John Wick 4' is now scheduled for a Memorial Day weekend release on May 27, 2022, after being pushed back a year from May 21, 2021, due to the pandemic.

'John Wick: Chapter 4' will be produced by Basil Iwanyk, Erica Lee, and





Stahelski. Reeves will serve as an executive producer along with Louise Rosner.

The movie will start production later this year with filming on locations in France, Germany, and Japan. The first three movies have generated over USD 579 million worldwide.

Skarsgard is best known for playing Pennywise the Dancing Clown in the hit horror film 'It' and its 2019 follow-up.

The actor will next star in 'Naked Singularity', co-starring John Boyega and Olivia Cooke, and period adventure thriller 'Emperor'.

Jennifer Lopez excited for 'a fresh start' and is moving to LA from Miami amid Ben Affleck romance

According to multiple reports, Jennifer Lopez is looking to move from Miami to Los Angeles after splitting from Alex Rodriguez and rekindling her romance with L.A.-based actor Ben Affleck.

A source told E! News that Lopez, 51, "is packing up her Miami rental" with plans to move west with her 13-year-old twins, Max and Emme, who she shares with ex-husband Marc Anthony.

"She will be between L.A. and the Hamptons this summer, but L.A. will be her base," the insider explained. "She is looking at schools for her kids in the fall."

The move would put the "Hustlers" star closer to Affleck, 48, which she's looking

forward to.

"She is excited about a fresh start and pursuing things with Ben," said the source. "They will be at their L.A. home soon."

It seems that the happy couple has been planning an exciting season, as a source previously told People magazine that they've been "discussing summer plans," as they "want to spend as much time together as possible."

"They also want to take a trip," added the insider, who also

noted that the "Dance Again" singer "is incredibly happy" to have resumed her romance with the "Justice League" star.

"They are both acting very comfortable in their relationship," they said.

Fox News has reached out to Lopez's reps for comment.

Of course, a move to Los Angeles could make work easier for Lopez, who recently signed a multi-year first-look deal with Netflix.

Through the deal, she and her producing partner Elaine Goldsmith-Thomas will be developing feature films, TV series, and unscripted content. Benny Medina is also a partner in the deal.

Ben Pugh, Charlie Morrison and Erica Steinberg will produce 'The Weekend Away' for 42 as part of their overall deal with Netflix. Kari Hatfield of 24 is executive producing the film.

A prolific author, Alderson has published 20 books

throughout her career such as the best-selling young adult novels 'Hunting Lila', 'Losing Lila', 'The Sound' and 'Out of Control'. Her other works include the mind-bending thrillers 'In Her Eyes', 'Friends Like These' and 'The Stalker'.

Netflix's 'The Weekend Away' will mark Meester's first film role in some time. Her recent feature credits include the 2019 crime drama 'Semper Fi' and the 2014 indie drama 'By the Gun'.
