Djokovic reaches record 14th Wimbledon semi

ovak Djokovic won a testing battle against Flavio Cobolli on Wednesday to reach a record 14th men's Wimbledon semi-final, which will be a blockbuster clash against world number one Jannik Sinner.

The Serb, chasing a historic 25th Grand Slam singles crown, was given the royal seal of approval by Britain's Queen Camilla before his 6-7 (6/8), 6-2,7-5, 6-4 win on Centre Court.

The seven-time champion was pushed hard by the Italian 22nd seed but ultimately had too much for the 23-yearold, who had never previously been beyond the third round of a major.

Djokovic said Wimbledon was the "most special tournament" in the sport as he was cheered by the crowd.

"And of course, it means the world to me that I'm still able at 38 to play the final stages of Wimbledon," he said.

"Thank you for cheering for my age. I really appreciate it. It's beautiful. Makes me feel

very young. "And I guess another thing that makes me feel very young is competing with youngsters, you know, like Cobolli today -- he's who knows how many years younger than me." The sixth

Djokovic slipped and fell awkwardly when serving for the match, grimacing in pain, but got up to finish the job.

He played down the incident in his on-court interview.

"I had a nasty slip, but that's what happens when you play on

the grass," he said. "It did come at an awkward moment, but somehow I managed to find a good serve and close it out. Obviously, I'm going to visit this subject now with my physio and hopefully I'll be well in two days."
