HRH Prince Salman directs Bahrain-Qatar ferry services to enhance tourism and cargo connectivity

His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, has directed that ferry services between Bahrain and Qatar be utilised to strengthen cooperation and connectivity through tourist and commercial cargo operations, including the transport of passengers and vehicles.

He also instructed the Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications to continue monitoring the completion of plans for the Bahrain-Qatar Causeway project.

HRH Prince Salman issued the directives while chairing yesterday's weekly Cabinet meeting at Gudaibiya Palace.

The Cabinet welcomed the announcement of the new passenger ferry route between the two neighbouring countries and reviewed a report submitted by the Minister of Transportation and Telecommunications on the development.

Offering a faster and more convenient alternative for both passengers and cargo, the newly announced ferry services aim to enhance travel and trade links between Bahrain and Qatar, as

Evening tragedy

Eight killed and 19 injured in Delhi car blast

A car explosion in the bustling heart of the Indian capital yesterday killed at least eight people and injured another 19, officials said.

Police have not given details on the cause, but said that foren-

sic and anti-terrorism agencies were at the site, near the landmark Red Fort.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi offered his condolences to the families of those killed, and said he had "reviewed the situation" with Home Minister Amit Shah and other officials.

"Condolences to those who have lost their loved ones in the blast in Delhi...may the injured recover at the earliest", Modi said in a statement. "Those affected are being assisted by authorities."

The blast took place in the early evening as people returned

from work, close to a metro station in the crowded Old Delhi quarter of the city.

Ambulances streamed into a nearby public hospital, carrying several injured people.

Citing authorities at the hospital, New Delhi's deputy chief fire officer AK Malik said that

"eight people have died so far and 19 are injured."

The capital's Police Commissioner Satish Golcha told reporters that "a slow-moving vehicle stopped at a red light - an explosion happened in that vehicle, and due to the explosion, nearby vehicles were also damaged."

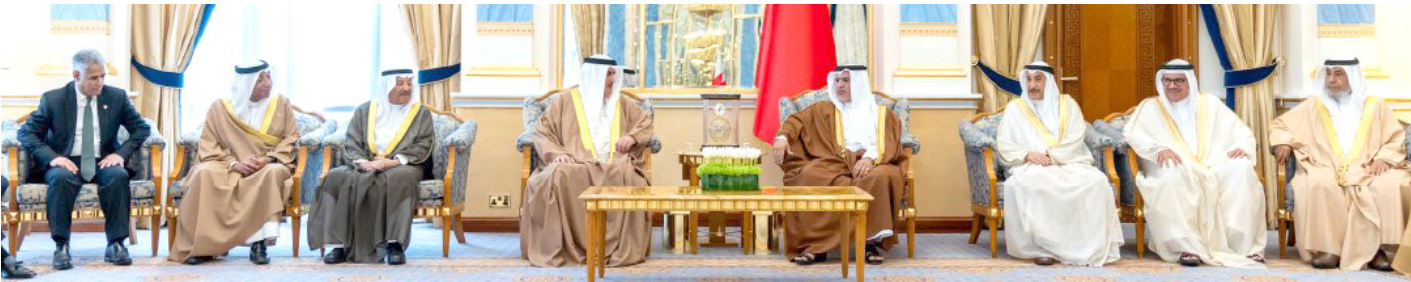

Digital grievances

Labour Ministry introduces new online system to file and resolve unemployment compensation appeals

Acting Labour Minister, His Excellency Yousif Khalaf, has set new rules for lodging and deciding grievances over unemployment compensation and allowances, moving the process fully online. The decision, published in the Official Gazette, requires claimants to file through the Ministry of Labour website within 15 days of learning of the decision they wish to challenge.

The competent body must rule within 15 days of filing. If no reply is issued in that time, the grievance is deemed rejected. An appeal to the competent court is open for 30 days from notification of rejection or deemed rejection. A dedicated committee will handle cases and set its own internal rules for meetings and day-to-day work, including sittings held remotely. Supporting papers Grievances are submitted on the prescribed electronic form and must state the complainant’s full name, personal num-

The committee may call the complainant to a hearing, giving at least three days’ notice, and may hear witnesses when needed.

Organisation or other relevant public bodies, and request any data or documents required to reach a view. A reasoned decision must be issued after the file has been examined, with the outcome sent by email upon issue. The committee will keep an electronic register covering every grievance, with a dedicated page for each case carrying related data, correspondence and decisions, to ensure full record-keeping throughout. The decision repeals earlier paper-based grievance procedures and replaces them with a single electronic system for unemployment-related grievances.

17 illegal workers detained and 52 violators deported

● **LMRA carries out 1,927 inspection campaigns and visits**

Seventeen violating and irregular workers were detained and 52 others deported following inspection campaigns conducted by the Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) from November 2 to 8, 2025. A total of 1,927 inspection visits were carried out during the period, the authority said. Inspection efforts also uncovered a number of violations related to the provisions of several regulatory laws, particularly those governing the Labour Market Regulatory Authority and Residency Laws in the Kingdom of Bahrain. Legal measures were taken in response to the detected breaches.

Commercial establishments

During the same period, 1,899 inspections were conducted across various commercial establishments in all governorates, alongside 28 joint inspection campaigns — including 14 in the Capital Governorate, five in Muharraq, three in the Northern Governorate, and six in the Southern Governorate. Participating government entities included the Ministry of Interior, represented by the Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs (NPRA), the respective Police Directorates in each governorate, the



1,899 inspections were conducted across various commercial establishments in all governorates, alongside 28 joint inspection campaigns.

General Directorate of Verdict Enforcement and Alternative Sentencing, the General Directorate of Crime Detection and Forensic Science, the Ministry of Industry and Commerce, the Bahrain Tourism and Exhibi-

tion Authority, and the Social Insurance Organization. Joint coordination with government agencies will continue to ensure the intensification of inspection campaigns across all governorates.

Violations

These efforts aim to curb violations that undermine the stability and competitiveness of Bahrain’s labour market or threaten the Kingdom’s economic and social security. LMRA also renewed its call for public cooperation in combating illegal labour practices. Members of the community are urged to report violations via the electronic form available on the LMRA website at www.lmra.gov.bh, by calling 17506055, or through the government’s Suggestions and Complaints System (Tawasul).

‘Grace period’ plan

Muharraq Council to test 48-hour warning before imposing fines

Warnings before fines will be tested after councillors sent a 48-hour notice plan for further study yesterday, while also approving urgent works to tackle groundwater under a Samaheej home and a new entrance and exit for the Al Sayh petrol station.

The council asked its committee to set out how the 48-hour grace period would work and requested a meeting with the executive body to examine the plan.

Muharraq Municipal Council member Ahmed Al Moqahwi said residents often learn of penalties without prior notice and urged that a warning come first, with a fine only if people ignore requests to clear sand piles or building materials from outside their homes.

Households

He said fines of BD100 to BD300 weigh on households and called for applying the ‘spirit’ of the law.

Muharraq Municipal Council member Abdulqader Mahmoud said some offences, especially

those tied to cleanliness, could be dealt with more lightly.

He said BD100 is not a small sum for families and asked for a review to identify cases where

Cooperation

The Councillor added that residents would cooperate if given prior notice. On safety, members approved steps to address groundwater seepage at a house in Block 234, Samaheej.

Sixth District representative Fadhil Al Oud said the seepage has damaged the structure, cracked floors and walls and harmed foundations and fittings, creating high humidity and an unhealthy environment that puts residents at risk.

A dedicated entrance and exit will be built for the Al Sayah petrol station serving the Busaiteen ring road.

On primary care, members repeated their call for the Minis-

try of Health to return the medical files of residents in Blocks 203, 205 and 207 to Muharraq Health Centre, as it is nearer.

They noted that patients are now sent to Halat Bu Maher Health Center, which is farther away, and that higher patient numbers from Dair and Arad are adding pressure on the centre.

Families

Many families live next to Muharraq Health Centre yet remain registered at Halat Bu Maher, they said, which is impractical for many older people and children.

The council also reviewed updates on Seventh District requests concerning pooled water and on paving the area in front of Saad bin Muadh Mosque with block paving or asphalt.

Seef Properties B.S.C. (Trading Code: SEEF) has announced its financial results for the nine months ended 30 September 2025, including the results for the third quarter of the year. 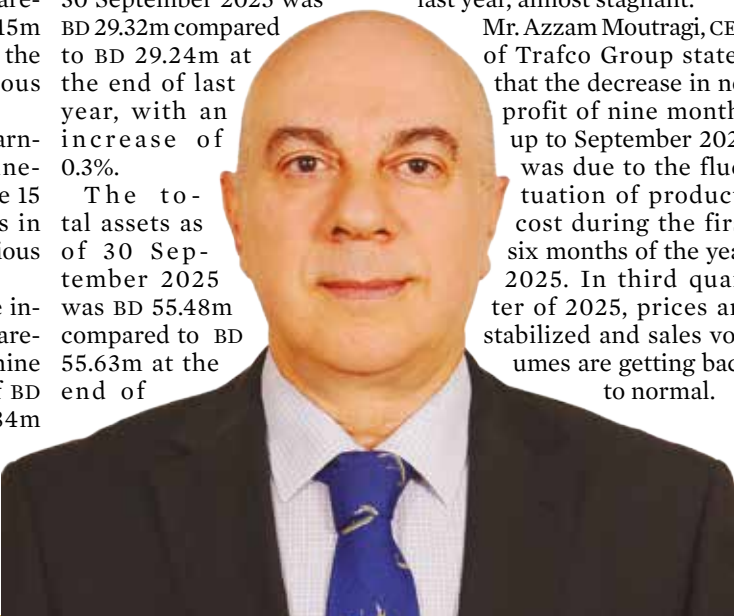

China suspends ‘special port fees’ on US vessels for one year

China said on Monday it would suspend for one year “special port fees” on US vessels “simultaneously” with Washington’s pause on levies targeting Chinese ships, as a fragile trade truce between the superpowers takes shape.

The United States and China have been engaged in a volatile trade and tariff war for months, but agreed to walk back some punitive measures after presidents Xi Jinping and Donald



China said on Wednesday it would extend the suspension of additional tariffs on US goods for one year, keeping them at 10 percent, and suspend some tariffs on soybeans and other US agricultural products.

Trump met in South Korea last month.

Duties on both sides had reached prohibitive triple-digit levels at one point, hampering trade between the world's two largest economies and snarling global supply chains.

The suspension of the port fees, which applied to ships operated by or built in the United States that visited Chinese ports, began at 13:01 (0501 GMT) on Monday, a transport ministry statement said.

The US shipbuilding industry was dominant after World War II but has gradually declined and now accounts for just 0.1 percent of global output.

The sector is now dominated by Asia, with China building nearly half of all ships launched, ahead of South Korea and Japan. Beijing also said separately it would suspend sanctions against US subsidiaries of Hanwha Ocean, one of South Korea's largest shipbuilders.

The year-long suspension of measures against Hanwha, effective from November 10, was linked to the US halting port fees it had levied on Chinese-built and operated ships, China's commerce ministry said in an online statement.

“In light of this (US suspension)... China has decided to suspend the relevant measures” for one year, it said.

China had imposed sanctions on five US subsidiaries of Hanwha in October, accusing them of supporting a US government “Section 301” investigation that found Beijing's dominance of the shipbuilding industry unreasonable. Organisations and individuals in China had been banned from cooperating with Hanwha Shipping LLC, Hanwha Philly Shipyard Inc., Hanwha Ocean USA International LLC, Hanwha Shipping Holdings LLC and HS USA Holdings Corp. A planned probe into whether the Section 301 investigation affected the “security and development interests” of China's shipbuilding industry and supply chain had also been shelved for one year, according to the transport ministry.

Stocks rally on hopes US government shutdown to end

Stock markets charged higher yesterday as investors cheered prospects that the US government shutdown could be nearing an end, after lawmakers reached a deal likely to break the record 40-day impasse.

The prospect of operations resuming in the world's biggest economy helped temper lingering worries about extended tech valuations amid talk of an AI bubble. A group of Democrats in the Senate sided with Republicans in a procedural vote on the deal Sunday evening, clearing the way for a formal debate after reaching a bipartisan agreement to fund operations through January.

A government re-opening could also provide clarity on US inflation and on the soft labour market, which will determine whether the Federal Reserve cuts interest rates again as widely expected next month.

“If all goes well, some federal agencies could reopen as soon as Friday,” said David Morrison, senior analyst at Trade Nation.

He noted that both investors and the Fed have been “flying

blind since the beginning of October, with a near-complete absence of data”.

“Fed Chair Jerome Powell has played down the prospect of another rate cut in December, as it



is far from obvious that inflation has peaked,” Morrison added.

But investors on Monday focused on the US government reopening, after growing increasingly concerned about the

impact of severe disruptions of food benefits to low-income households, and of air travel heading into the Thanksgiving holiday. “Shutdowns haven't typically had a big bearing on the economy or on financial markets. But, this one... looked as though it might start to cause some trouble,” said analysts at Capital Economics.

Rebound after tech worries

Reports that drugmaker Pfizer won a bidding war for the biotech obesity specialist Metsera over the weekend with a \$10 billion offer also bolstered investor optimism.

Wall Street opened higher across the board following turbulent losses last week on fears that AI optimism might have pushed tech stocks such as chip heavyweight Nvidia to unsustainable highs. European indices also rose sharply, following similar gains across Asia, with investors also taking heart

from a further easing of China-US tensions.

The dollar, which steadied versus the euro and the pound, rose against the yen, while oil prices gained slightly after losses last week over concerns of hefty supply amid uncertainty over global demand.

“Risk is back on, and last week's sell-off seems like a distant memory,” said Kathleen Brooks, research director at trading platform XTB.

“There are some risks ahead, but unless we see a meaningful decline in Fed rate cut expectations, or a weak earnings report from (major computer chip-maker) Nvidia next week, then stocks could be poised to rally into year end,” she said.

◆ Nicolas Sarkozy

yesterday was freed from prison, a 20-day experience the former president called a “nightmare”, as a judge ordered his release pending an appeal decision over Libyan funding. Sarkozy was freed from La Sante prison in Paris shortly before 3 pm (1400 GMT) on Monday, a source familiar with the case told AFP. The 70-year-old former president, who maintains his innocence, departed in a car with tinted windows, escorted by police motorcyclists. A lower court in September found the right-wing politician -- who was head of state from 2007 to 2012 -- guilty of seeking to acquire funding from Moamer Kadhafi’s Libya for the campaign that saw him elected, and sentenced him to five years behind bars.

The launch had been due to proceed amid intensifying competition between Blue Origin and Elon Musk’s SpaceX. To relieve airspace congestion during the US federal government shutdown, the Federal Aviation Administration is limiting commercial rocket lift-offs starting Monday. But after scrubbing the launch Blue Origin said late Sunday that, in coordination with the FAA, it was aiming for another attempt as soon as Wednesday within the window of 2:50pm to 4:17pm (1950-2117 GMT).

◆ **She lived** a life of luxury that earned her the nickname “goddess of wealth”, but Chinese businesswoman Zhimin Qian now faces a long jail sentence after police made the UK’s largest-ever cryptocurrency seizure of Bitcoin worth over \$6 billion. The 47-year-old, who used the alias Yadi Zhang, defrauded more than 128,000 victims through a scheme in China from 2014-17 and stored the illegally obtained funds in Bitcoin assets. Qian played a leading role in the scam. After fleeing China in 2018 using false documents, she came to the UK where she attempted to launder the proceeds, according to police and prosecutors. She faces up to 14 years in prison. The Chinese national, who pleaded guilty to acquiring and possessing criminal property on September 29, will be sentenced after a two-day hearing on Monday and Tuesday at London’s Southwark Crown Court. A Malaysian accomplice, Seng Hok Ling, also 47, admitted to money laundering at the same court earlier and is also due to be sentenced.

Rare Patek Philippe watch sells for \$17.6 million



Geneva, Switzerland

A Patek Philippe timepiece that in 2016 became the most expensive wristwatch ever sold at auction fetched an even higher price this weekend, auctioneers Phillips said Sunday.

The watch sold for 14,190,000 Swiss francs (\$17.6 million), surpassing the 11 million francs it fetched nine years ago, or \$11 million at the time.

The Patek Philippe Perpetual Calendar Chronograph Reference 1518, made in 1943, is one of only four known to have been made in stainless steel -- its rarity making it more sought-after than those produced in gold.

Its 2016 world record price for a wristwatch was overtaken in 2017 by Hollywood star Paul Newman’s Rolex Daytona which fetched \$17.8 million.

That was then surpassed in 2019 by a Patek Philippe Grandmaster Chime, which sold for \$31 million.

But the stainless steel 1518’s sale this weekend reaffirmed its status “as one of the most historically significant wristwatches ever made”, the auctioneers said.

Phillips said the sale took just under nine and a half minutes, attracting five bidders, with the watch ultimately selling to a telephone bidder.

Several well-known collectors, dealers and watchmakers were in the room to witness the sale at the Hotel President in Geneva. Launched in 1941, it was the world’s first serially produced perpetual calendar chronograph.

Patek Philippe produced around 280 Ref. 1518 watches, most of them encased in yellow gold, and around a fifth in pink gold.

Trump threatens BBC with **\$1 billion** lawsuit over speech edit

US President Donald Trump has threatened the BBC with a \$1 billion lawsuit over the “defamatory, malicious” editing of a speech he gave just before the 2021 US Capitol riots, according to a letter obtained by AFP.

Trump’s lawyers gave the British broadcaster a deadline of Friday to fully retract the documentary containing the edit, apologize and “appropriately compensate” the president “for the harm caused.”

If the BBC fails to comply “President Trump will be left with no alternative but to enforce his legal and equitable rights... including by filing legal action for no less than \$1,000,000,000

(One Billion Dollars) in damages,” it said.

“The BBC is on notice. PLEASE GOVERN YOURSELF ACCORDINGLY.”

The director general of the BBC announced his resignation Sunday over the row, after accusations that a documentary by its flagship Panorama program last year had edited a speech by Trump in a misleading way.

The BBC said earlier Monday that it would “review” the letter

from Trump’s legal team. It also issued a public apology for the editing.

Trump’s supporters rioted at the US Capitol on January 6, 2021 in a bid to overturn the certification of his 2020 US presidential election defeat by Democrat Joe Biden.

But the letter from his legal team said that the BBC edit gave a “false, defamatory, malicious, disparaging, and inflammatory” impression of what he said in his

speech outside the White House.

“Due to their salacious nature, the fabricated statements that were aired by the BBC have been widely disseminated throughout various digital mediums, which have reached tens of millions of people worldwide,” the letter said.

“Consequently, the BBC has caused President Trump to suffer overwhelming financial and reputational harm.”

A spokesman for Trump’s legal team confirmed that a letter had been sent to the BBC but did not give further details.

“The BBC defamed President Trump by intentionally and deceitfully editing its documentary in order to try and interfere in the presidential election,” the spokesman said in a statement to AFP.

“President Trump will continue to hold accountable those who traffic in lies, deception, and fake news.”

Trump has been accused of launching a number of previous lawsuits to stifle US media, including against broadcaster ABC and CBS, and the New York Times.

UAE ‘probably’ won’t join Gaza stabilisation force

Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates

The United Arab Emirates is not planning to join the international stabilisation force for Gaza because it lacks a clear framework, a senior official said yesterday.

“The UAE does not yet see a clear framework for the stability force, and under such circumstances will probably not participate in such a force,” Emirati presidential advisor Anwar Gargash told the Abu Dhabi Strategic Debate forum.

The US-coordinated international force has been seen as likely to include troops from Egypt, Qatar and Turkey, as well as the UAE.

Last week, US President Donald Trump said he expected the force to be in Gaza “very soon”, as a fragile ceasefire holds.

Russia seizes more villages, says Ukraine cannot win war

Moscow, Russia

Russia said on Monday it was delusional to think Ukraine could win the war, while Moscow’s army said it had captured three more villages on the sprawling front line.

Moscow is trying to press its advantage in manpower and

equipment but territorial gains have been slow and costly.

Both sides are heavily entrenched, almost four years after Russia launched its all-out invasion of Ukraine.

“The Europeans believe that Ukraine can win the war and secure its interests through military means,” Kremlin spokesman

Dmitry Peskov said.

“This is the deepest delusion indulged in by the Kyiv regime. The situation on the front indicates the opposite,” he said in a briefing call with reporters.

The Russian defence ministry said on Monday it had seized the villages of Slodkie and Nove in the Zaporizhzhia region of

Ukraine and Gnativka in the Donetsk region.

Peskov said the war would only end “when Russia achieves the objectives it set at the beginning”. Moscow has said it is fighting to protect Russian speakers in the east of Ukraine, to prevent the NATO military bloc moving eastwards.

Typhoon exposes centuries-old shipwreck off Vietnam port

Severe coastal erosion caused by Typhoon Kalmaegi exposed a centuries-old shipwreck in Vietnam, providing a narrow window to salvage what experts say could be a historically significant find.

Initially discovered in 2023 off the coast of Hoi An, the at least 174-metre (57-foot) vessel -- whose heavy wood-ribbed hull survived hundreds of years of rough seas almost perfectly intact -- was resubmerged before authorities could reclaim it.

Experts have not yet dated the wreck, but preliminary findings suggest it was built between the 14th and 16th centuries -- when UNESCO-listed Hoi An was at the centre of a thriving regional trade in silk, ceramics and spices.

"We are currently preparing to apply for an emergency excavation (permit)," Pham Phu Ngoc, director of the Hoi An Center for the Preservation of World Cultural Heritage, told

AFP on Monday after the wreck resurfaced following the passage of Typhoon Kalmaegi last

week. "The discovery of this ancient ship is clear evidence of Hoi An's significant historical

role in regional trade," he said, adding more of the ship had been exposed this time "which

could provide us with more information".

A team of experts from the Hoi An preservation centre, the University of Social Sciences and Humanities in Ho Chi Minh City and a local museum surveyed the wreck last year.

In addition to the rough age estimate, they found it had been made from "durable and high-strength timber" and reinforced with waterproofing materials to seal its joints.

"The ship's structure suggests that it was capable of long-distance voyages, likely used for maritime trade or naval operations," the Hoi An centre said in an earlier statement.

The relic is at risk of "serious deterioration without immediate conservation actions" given the severe coastal erosion and the ship's frequent exposure to harsh weather conditions, it said.

The wreck was still clearly visible on Monday, with crowds gathered on the beach to view its striking skeletal frame.

Three men survive 40 hours at sea after typhoon

Hanoi, Vietnam

Three men swept far from Vietnam's coast by Typhoon Kalmaegi have been plucked safely from the surf after drifting helplessly for more than 40 hours, a rescuer and the wife of one of the survivors said on Monday.

They were rescued over several hours on Saturday in an operation involving three vessels scouring the waters off Vietnam's central coast, according to a sailor aboard one of the rescue ships.

Kalmaegi crashed into the country's storm-battered middle belt on Thursday, killing at least five people after leaving more than 200 dead in the Philippines.

State media reported the three men went missing Thursday afternoon after one of them, 44-year-old Duong Quang Cuong, jumped into the water after a family dispute.

Le Quang Sanh and Pham Duy Quang rowed out with life jackets in a tiny boat to try to rescue Cuong, but the vessel overturned and all three were carried far from shore, eventually becoming separated.

Quang was first to be rescued on Saturday morning by the Hai Nam 39 vessel south of Ly Son Island, where the men initially

departed, state media said.

The Hai Nam 39 then radioed the port authority for help, which dispatched the An Vinh Express, according to its sailor Hau.

It took two hours for the second rescue ship to reach the area where Quang had been floating in his life jacket, and the crew began a painstaking search of an ocean current running southward from there.

"At first, when we saw Sanh, we didn't realise it was him. We had imagined Sanh wearing a red life jacket because, during the search, we were all looking for red objects to head toward. But he was wearing a black shirt, so we didn't think it was him," Hau said.

Dutch consumer groups to sue BMW over diesel 'cheating'

AFP | The Hague, Netherlands

The Dutch Consumer Association said yesterday it was launching a class-action suit against BMW, alleging the luxury carmaker had falsified emissions data in some 100,000 vehicles sold in The Netherlands.

The Consumentenbond group cited studies it said showed software had been installed in BMW vehicles that lowered nitrogen emissions during testing.

"However, under normal driving conditions, these vehicles exhibit alarmingly high emissions," said the association, which launched the case with another group called Car Claim.

Consumentenbond head San-

dra Molenaar said in a statement: "It's shameful how BMW misled both the inspection bodies and consumers."

"The company must take responsibility for this. We want

BMW to compensate the consumers they misled," added Molenaar.

The case concerns all BMW and MINI diesel cars sold on the Dutch market between January 1, 2009, and September 1, 2019.

Contacted by AFP, a spokesman for BMW said the manufacturer had learned about the lawsuit through the media but that "no such claim has yet been served".

"We therefore do not know the specific allegations that... Car Claim has advanced in its claim," spokesman Andrew Mason told AFP.

The Car Claim group urged BMW to recall any cars affected and refit them, while also compensating current and former drivers of the vehicles.

US mediator Kushner and Netanyahu discuss phase two of Gaza truce

US mediator Jared Kushner and Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu held talks Monday on the second phase of the Gaza ceasefire, as Washington intensified its efforts to ensure the fragile truce endures.

Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, meanwhile, said Israel would enforce the ceasefire in Gaza as well as one in Lebanon with an "iron fist".

The truce in Gaza, in effect for exactly a

month now, has largely halted the war that erupted after Hamas's surprise attack on Israel on October 7, 2023.

During the ongoing first stage, a series of prisoner and hostage exchanges took place over recent weeks.

Kushner, the son-in-law of US President Donald Trump who helped broker the ceasefire, met Netanyahu in Jerusalem on Monday as part of US efforts to stabilise the truce and lay the groundwork for its next phase.

The two discussed some of the most sensitive aspects of phase two of the agreement, Israeli government spokeswoman Shosh Bedrosian told journalists.

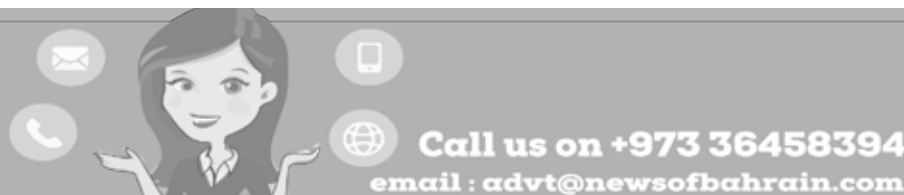

Series leader Lando Norris won for McLaren, his second successive triumph from pole position, to extend his lead over team-mate Oscar Piastri to 24 points and to 49 points over Verstappen with three races and a sprint remaining.

“The race was quite full on and had a lot of action,” said an understated Verstappen. “I had to overtake some cars, coming from the pit lane.

“I think our pace was quite strong over all the stints because

sometimes it's difficult to know fully with traffic and stuff.

“So, to be on the podium from the pit lane, I didn't expect that at all, even with a puncture at the beginning of the race.

“That is why we had to box again so it's an incredible result for us and I'm very happy with that. I'm very proud of everyone within the team as well.

“Yesterday was very tough for us, but we never give up and we always try and improve and find more lap time -- and luckily we found that again today.”

He was reluctant to write off his hopes of mounting a title challenge in the final three Grands Prix, but added: “We've got to be realistic. Over the whole season, we've not been good enough, but we will keep on trying to win races and see what happens.”

Verstappen, who won at Interlagos from 17th on the grid last year, became the eighth driver to claim a podium finish after starting from the pit-lane and the first since seven-time champion Lewis Hamilton in Hungary in 2014.

Piastri rues Sao Paulo penalty

Oscar Piastri remained stoical about his title bid on Sunday after being handed a controversial 10-second penalty that wrecked his hopes of at least a podium finish at the Sao Paulo Grand Prix.

The 24-year-old Australian finished fifth for McLaren and is now 24 points adrift of team-mate Lando Norris, who claimed his second consecutive pole to flag victory, in the drivers' title race.

He was given his penalty after he locked up at Turn One as he attacked second-placed Kimi Antonelli of Mercedes after a Safety Car re-start on lap six.

Piastri made contact with Antonelli's car which in turn banged across Charles Le-

clerc's Ferrari, causing him to lose his front wing and retire from the race.

He emerged in second place close behind Norris, but was unable – despite nine laps in the lead during the pit-stops – to challenge for a top spot because of his penalty.

“I had a very clear opportunity and I went for it,” said Piastri, who had widespread sympathy and support from fellow-drivers including Leclerc.

“The other two drivers on the outside braked quite late. There was obviously a bit of a lock-up into the corner, but that's because I could see Kimi was not going to give me any space.

“I can't disappear, but the decision is what it is.”

Ferrari boss tells Hamilton, Leclerc to drive, not talk

Ferrari president John Elkann issued a plea yesterday to the misfiring team's two drivers, Lewis Hamilton and Charles Leclerc, calling on them to focus on driving, not talking.

Elkann's intervention follows a disastrous weekend for the Formula One giants when both cars failed to finish the Sao Paulo Grand Prix.

The wretched double DNF prompted seven-time world champion Hamilton to reflect on “a nightmare” first season at the Scuderia.

Hamilton was retired by the team after battling for 40 laps in a damaged car following several incidents in the opening laps and a penalty, while Leclerc's race ended on lap six following a collision in which he was an innocent victim.

“It's a nightmare,” said Hamilton at Interlagos.

“I've been living it now for a while and the flip between living the dream of driving for this amazing team and then the nightmare of the results that we've had,” added the former Mercedes driver.

Elkann said he wanted Hamilton and Leclerc to concentrate on the three race weekends remaining of an underwhelming 2025 season.

“It is certainly important that our drivers focus on their driving and talk less,” Elkann said.

Ferrari left Brazil after slipping from second to fourth in the constructors' title race, and will be looking for a change of luck in the next race in Las Vegas.

Muharraaq Snap Winless Run with Late Surge Against Ittihad

Bahrain’s Muharraaq Club finally got off the mark in the 2025–26 FIBA West Asia Super League, edging Saudi Arabia’s Ittihad Club 84–79 in a fascinating contest at the BBA Arena yesterday. The Group A clash saw Muharraaq overcome an early deficit and produce a late flourish to secure their first win after back-to-back losses to Kazma SC and Shabab Al Ahli.

In the closing minutes, Hamilton and Mohammed Ameer

stepped up. With the score tied at 79–all, Hamilton converted a three-point play with 1:21 remaining before feeding Ameer for a decisive underbasket finish with 24.3 seconds left, sealing the win and spoiling Ittihad’s 3–0 bid.

Top performers for Muharraaq included Nick West with 25 points and 8 rebounds, Hamilton’s near triple-double of 20 points, 10 rebounds, and 8 assists, and Kerwin Roach Jr., who added 18 points, 10 assists, 6 rebounds, 5 steals, and a block. “We had some really good fastbreaks and stops when it counted, and that made the difference,” said head coach Peter Schomers.

Muharraaq now look ahead to their next fixtures: they host Kuwait’s Kazma on Bahraini National Day, December 16 at 7:30pm at the BBA Arena, then welcome UAE’s Shabab Al Ahli on January 12 at 7:30pm, aiming to avenge their earlier defeat, before closing the Group A phase against Saudi Arabia’s Ittihad in Jeddah on January 19 at 8pm.

‘Fired-up’ Fritz sees off Musetti in ATP Finals
