#### Sentence upheld in murder case

The First High Appellate Court has upheld the verdict issued against a youth for attacking a 31-year-old Asian over a traffic dispute in Khamis.

A Lower Court had earlier handed down 22 years imprisonment to the youth in the case. The victim suffered permanent disabilities in the attack, according to prosecutors. The accused was charged with attacking the Asian apart from illegally possessing weapon.

A medical report confirmed the disabilities suffered by the victim in the attack after receiving blows at the hands of the accused.
