Both sides delivered decisive performances, proving that in knockout football, anything can happen.

At Khalifa International Stadium, Morocco edged Syria 1-0 in a match they largely controlled. Under head coach Tarik Sektioui, the Atlas Lions dictated possession and rhythm, while Jose Fernandez's Syria defended deep and relied on counterattacks. The first major flashpoint came in the 26th minute when Syria appealed for a penalty after Mahmoud Al Aswad went down under a shove from Marwane Saadane. Extra time saw Saudi pour forward relentlessly, and in the 115th minute Al Dawsari delivered a perfect cross that Mohamed Kanno headed home from close range to break Palestinian hearts and finally reward Saudi's pressure.


