Salah penalty puts Liverpool seven points clear again with a 1-0 victory at Brighton

iverpool bounced back from two consecutive defeats to remain on course for a first league title in 29 years, but were made to wait before breaking down an obdurate Brighton thanks to Mohamed Salah's 50th-minute penalty in a 1-0 win yesterday.

Victory reestablished Jurgen Klopp's side's seven-point lead over Manchester City at the top of the table, which was reduced to four when the champions inflicted Liverpool's only Premier League defeat of the campaign to breathe new life into the title race nine days ago.

The Reds were far from their fluent best on England's south coast, but ground out a vital win to settle any nerves caused by that defeat thanks to a 13th clean sheet in 22 league games this

Klopp made wholesale changes for Monday's FA Cup elimination to Wolves to underline his priorities for this season and regulars, including Salah.

Iraq sank Yemen and Iran beat Vietnam as the neighbours and arch-rivals powered into the Asian Cup round of 16 title drought since last winning yesterday ahead of their highly anticipated group decider next week.

Teenager Mohanad Ali's early solo strike kick-started Iraq's 3-0 victory in Sharjah, while Sardar Azmoun struck both goals in Iran's 2-0 win in Abu Dhabi.

Iraq and Iran will meet in Dubai on Wednesday to de-
