**M**ohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the United Arab Emirates, received S. Jaishankar on Sunday for high-level talks focused on strengthening bilateral relations and addressing regional developments.

During the meeting, FM Jaishankar conveyed greetings from India's PM Narendra Modi, along with his wishes for the continued security and prosperity of the United Arab Emirates. Shaikh Mohamed reciprocated the gesture, extending his greetings to Modi and expressing hopes for further progress and prosperity for India and its people.

The discussions centered on enhancing cooperation under the Comprehensive Strategic Partnership and the Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement between the



United Arab Emirates and India. Both sides explored ways to advance collaboration in line with shared development goals and mutual interests.

Regional issues were also high on the agenda, with both leaders reviewing developments in the Middle East and their implications for global security, maritime routes, en-

ergy supplies, and economic stability.

The talks further addressed recent attacks targeting civilians and infrastructure in the UAE and other countries in the region. These actions were described as violations of sovereignty and international law. Jaishankar reaffirmed India's solidarity with the UAE and its
