A renewed push for 60-day truce

Concerns grow as Netanyahu floats 'allowing' Palestinians out of Gaza

Israel's Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu yesterday revived calls to "allow" Palestinians to leave the Gaza Strip, as the military prepares a broader offensive in the territory.

Past calls to resettle Gazans outside of the war-battered territory, including from US President Donald Trump, have sparked concern among Palestinians and condemnation from the international community.

Netanyahu defended his war policies in a rare interview with Israeli media, broadcast shortly after Egypt said Gaza mediators were leading a renewed push to secure a 60-day truce.

The premier told Israeli broadcaster i24NEWS that "we are not pushing them out, but we are allowing them to leave".

Opportunity

"Give them the opportunity to leave, first of all, combat zones, and generally to leave the territory, if they want," he said, citing refugee outflows during wars in Syria, Ukraine and Afghanistan.

In the Gaza Strip, Israel for years has tightly controlled the borders and barred many from leaving.

"We will allow this, first of all within Gaza during the fighting, and we will certainly allow them to leave Gaza as well," Netanyahu said.

For Palestinians, any effort to push them force them off their land would recall the "Nakba", or catastrophe - the mass displacement of Palestinians dur-

ing Israel's creation in 1948.

Netanyahu has endorsed Trump's suggestion earlier this year to expel Gaza's more than two million people to Egypt and Jordan, while far-right Israeli ministers have called for their "voluntary" departure.

Diplomacy

Israel's plans to expand its offensive into Gaza City come as diplomacy aimed at securing an elusive ceasefire and hostage release deal in the 22-month-old war has stalled for weeks, after the latest round of negotiations broke down in July.

Egypt's Foreign Minister Badr Abdelatty announced that Cairo

was "working very hard now in full cooperation with the Qataris and Americans", aiming for "a ceasefire for 60 days, with the release of some hostages and some Palestinian detainees, and the flow of humanitarian and medical assistance to Gaza without restrictions, without conditions".

Two Palestinian sources told AFP that a senior Hamas delegation was due to meet Egyptian officials for talks today.

Proposal

One of the Palestinian sources earlier told AFP that the mediators were working "to formulate a new comprehensive cease-

fire agreement proposal" that would include the release of all remaining hostages in Gaza "in one batch".

Netanyahu said in his interview he would oppose the staggered release of hostages, and instead would "want to return all of them as part of an end to the war - but under our conditions".

Mediation efforts led by Qatar, Egypt and the US have failed to secure a breakthrough since a short-lived truce earlier this year.

News of the potential truce talks came as Gaza's civil defence agency said Israel has intensified its air strikes on Gaza

City in recent days, following the security cabinet's decision to expand the war there.

Air raids

Netanyahu's government has not provided an exact timetable on when forces may enter the area, but civil defence spokesman Mahmud Bassal said yesterday that air raids had already begun increasing over the past three days.

"The Israeli occupation is intensifying its bombardment" using "bombs, drones, and also highly explosive munitions that cause massive destruction", he said.

Bassal said that Israeli strikes across the territory, including on Gaza City, killed at least 33 people yesterday. The bombardment has been extremely intense for the past two days.

Bahrain Makes Asian Youth Games History in October

- First indoor opening ceremony
- EWB to host 11 sports

Bahrain will make sporting history this October by hosting the Asian Youth Games' first-ever indoor opening ceremony, under a new agreement between Exhibition World Bah-

rain (EWB) and the Games' Executive Committee.

The deal, signed yesterday at EWB's Sakhir venue, ensures the facility will stage the indoor ceremony and 11 of the 24 sports on the programme when the Games come to the Kingdom for the first time from October 22 to 31. The event will be held under the patronage of His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa.

The signing was attended by Her Excellency Sara Ahmed Buhiji, CEO of the Bahrain Tourism and Exhibitions Authority (BTEA) and Chairperson of EWB;

and His Excellency Faris Al Kooheji, Secretary General of the Bahrain Olympic Committee. The agreement was signed by Mr. Yousef Duaij, Chairman of the Executive Committee of the third Asian Youth Games, and Mr. Alan Pryor, General Manager of EWB.

Buhiji said the Games would welcome thousands of young athletes from across Asia to compete at the highest level, describing EWB's facilities and location as "an ideal stage for showcasing the spirit of sportsmanship, unity, and excellence". She said

hosting the Games would "solidify our position as a world-class venue for international sporting events and an ideal venue for indoor championships".

Al Kooheji said the partnership reflected the integration of efforts between national institutions to enhance the Kingdom's image as a host for major events. "We take pride in this distinguished national landmark, offering world-class infrastructure that will deliver an exceptional experience for both athletes and spectators alike," he added.

Makeup Parcel Masks Menace

Customs bust foils global traffickers

- Parcel hid over 1kg marijuana
- Makeup shipment from U.S.
- Offender jailed, fined, deported

Bahrain’s customs and law enforcement officers have intercepted a drug trafficking attempt concealed in an unlikely package, a make-up shipment from the United States, leading to the dismantling of a key link in an international smuggling network. The court sentenced an Asian man working as a delivery agent for a well-known company to 15 years in prison, a BD5,000 fine, confiscation of the seized items, and deportation. His arrest followed the seizure of a suspicious parcel at Bahrain Airport on April 5, 2025. Inside, officials found three bags of marijuana weighing 1.016 kg, hidden among clothes. Laboratory analysis confirmed the substance was marijuana.

Organised network

Investigations revealed the man’s role in an organised criminal network that smuggled

gled drugs through postal shipments. His responsibility was to receive parcels and deliver them to other members in exchange for payment. Authorities also discovered a video on his phone showing a cigar next to a bag containing a green substance, further linking him to the illicit trade.

Firm deterrent

The case underscores Bahrain’s readiness to act swiftly against narcotics trafficking, no matter how elaborate the concealment method.

Court Jails Belly Dancers’ Abusers

Entertainment sector exploitation exposed

- Trio found guilty
- Belly dancers forced into labor
- Harsh penalties imposed

The First High Criminal Court has handed down a landmark ruling in a human trafficking case involving two young Arab women brought to Bahrain to work as belly dancers, sentencing three defendants to prison, imposing fines, and ordering their deportation after serving their terms. The court sentenced the first defendant, an Arab businesswoman, to three years in prison and a fine of BD2,000, while the second and third defendants, both Asians, received one year each and identical fines. All three were ordered to cover the victims’ repatriation costs and will be permanently deported upon release. According to the Public Prosecution, the defendants traf-

ficked the two belly dancers by receiving, transporting, and sheltering them in circumstances where their consent was not valid, exploiting them in forced labour. They were made to work long hours without pay or days off, in unsuitable conditions, and forced to entertain customers under threat and close monitoring.

Victims’ ordeal

Testimonies revealed the victims, aged 21 and 22, had been recruited to work at a nightclub owned by the first defendant.

Upon arrival, their passports were confiscated, and they were subjected to excessive work hours, salary deductions for makeup, and forced consumption of alcohol. They were locked in a hotel room by the second and third defendants, following instructions from the first defendant. A third witness, an Arab man in the entertainment industry, confirmed he had brought the belly dancers to Bahrain at the businesswoman’s request. He later learned they were working without pay and being mistreat-

ed, prompting him to advise one victim to file a police complaint.

Strong stance

An Interior Ministry officer testified that investigations showed the victims were denied their wages and tips, fined for requesting time off, and physically prevented from leaving. The case highlights the judiciary’s commitment to punishing offenders and protecting vulnerable workers and sends a clear deterrent message to exploiters.

Coast Guard seizes illegal shrimp boat

- Four caught using banned ‘koffa’ nets

The Coast Guard patrols seized a boat carrying four Asian individuals in possession of a quantity of shrimp caught using banned bottom trawling nets (“koffa”) in the Khor Fasht area. It was part of ongoing efforts to combat maritime violations and ensure that sailors and fishermen comply with laws and regulations. The Coast Guard stated that the necessary legal procedures were taken against the violators in preparation for referring the

case to the Public Prosecution. The Coast Guard urged seagoers to comply with the instructions of maritime patrols when requested to stop for inspection, to adhere to decisions banning fishing and the use of illegal tools, and to follow procedures on reducing overfishing, illegal, and unregulated fishing.

Clogs cause chaos

Works Ministry issues stern warning against fats and oils in drains

More than 5,000 sewerage reports were logged in Bahrain in the first half of 2025, as the Ministry of Works warned that fats and oils from restaurants and garages are clogging drains and causing overflows.

Engineer Abdulnabi Hassan Al Koofi, Director of the Sanitary Engineering Operations and Maintenance Directorate, said 5,056 reports were handled on receipt.

The Capital Governorate recorded 1,835, the Northern 1,289, Muharraq 1,065 and the Southern 867.

Cases

He linked many cases to areas with large numbers of food outlets and vehicle workshops.

Food scraps and cooking fats poured into drains harden and stick to pipe walls, building up until lines block and sewage overflows.

The same occurs when lubricants from garages run into sewer lines.

Hotline

Reports reach the Sanitary Engineering Operations and Maintenance Directorate via the sewerage emergency hotline and the National Suggestions and Complaints System (Tawasul).

Teams take details, inspect foul-sewer manholes and stormwater inlets where needed, and carry out remedial work.

The ministry works with the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Industry, Commerce and

Tourism, the municipal councils and the Capital Municipality to require restaurants, shops and garages to fit grease and oil traps and to dispose of waste correctly.

Coordination with the Commercial Registration directorate and municipal councils holds non-compliant outlets to account, and judicial enforcement campaigns have been stepped up to limit oil dumping.

Complaints

Al Koofi urged the public

to file complaints through the eGovernment portal (www.bahrain.bh), the Ministry of Works website (www.works.gov.bh) and Tawasul, or by calling the control and reporting centre on 80001810.

A mobile service is also available for viewing ministry services and information.

He added that the sanitary engineering sector is expanding networks across the governorates to meet demand and improve service reliability for citizens and residents.

Bahrain Kuwait Insurance Company (BKIC) B.S.C. (trading code in Bahrain Bourse “BKIC” and in Boursa Kuwait “BKIKWT”) announced its consolidated financial results for the six months ended 30th June 2025.

Three months ended 30th June 2025

The consolidated financial results showed a net profit after tax attributable to shareholders of BD 1.089 million, compared to BD 1.258 million for the same period last year, representing a 13% decrease. This variance is due to the first-time implementation of the 15% Domestic Minimum Top-up Tax in Bahrain and Kuwait, which came into effect in January 2025 for multinational companies and was not reflected last year. However, the Company recorded growth of 2% in profit attributable to shareholders before tax. Earnings per

share for the quarter reached 7 fils, marking a decrease of 1 fils compared to the same period in 2024. The total comprehensive income attributable to the shareholders increased by 52% and reached BD 1.122 million in Q2-2025 compared to BD 0.736 million in Q2-2024.

The Company reported insurance revenue of BD 27.719 million for the second quarter of the current year, compared to BD 29.317 million in the same period last year. The insurance service result stood at BD 1.076 million in comparison to BD 1.206 million in the same period last year, impacted by an increase in claims and the Company's continued prudent approach to strengthening reserves. Mean-

while, total investment income saw a robust growth of 81%, rising from BD 0.862 million in the second quarter of last year to BD 1.558 million this year.

Six months

The consolidated net profit after tax attributable to shareholders stood at BD 2.685 million for the half-year ended 30th June 2025, compared to BD 2.938 million in the corresponding period of 2024, representing a decrease of 8% following the first-time implementation of the new 15% Domestic Minimum Top-up Tax. However, the Company reported a 1.4% increase in profit attributable to shareholders before tax for the current period compared to the

same period last year, reflecting continued operational strength. Earnings per share for the period were 18 fils, compared to 20 fils in the same period last year. Meanwhile, total comprehensive income attributable to shareholders increased significantly by 29%, reaching BD 2.892 million versus BD 2.243 million in the prior-year period.

The Company recorded a 5% growth in gross written premiums, reaching BD 56.562 million during the first half of the year, compared to BD 53.695 million in the same period of 2024, reflecting continued business expansion and strong market presence. However, there was a marginal decline of 1.6% in Insurance revenue from BD 56.658 million in last year to BD 55.751 million in current year. The Insurance service results reduced from BD 2.204 million in the First half of last year to BD 2.025 million in the first half of the current year primarily due to an increase in reported claims mainly from the Motor Portfolio. In contrast, total investment income delivered strong growth of 26%, rising to BD 3.142 million from BD 2.495 million in the same period last year.

The total shareholders' equity as at end of June 2025 was BD

43.959 million compared to BD 44.901 million as at end of last year, representing a decrease of 2% mainly due to allocation towards increased shareholders' dividends payouts. The total assets by the end of June 2025 reached BD 186.652 million compared to BD 186.017 million as at end of last year, representing a marginal increase of 0.3%. The net Insurance contract liabilities increased from BD 64.433 million at the end of the last year to BD 67.145 million at the end of the current period.

Board of Directors' Comments

All members of the Board expressed their satisfaction: “Not only is the Board pleased with the results for the first six months of 2025, but all evidence suggests that, whilst monitoring the key strategic projects, the Company is progressing in a very robust, sound, and prudent manner.”


Notably, the 2025 results would be impacted with the Domestic Minimum Top-up Tax for the first time after its implementation at 1/1/2025. Therefore, the Board calls upon all shareholders to also consider the “Pre-Tax Profits” when comparing the Company's results against previous years or against other peers in the mar-

ketplace.

Chief Executive Officer's Comments

BKIC's CEO Dr. Abdulla Sultan stands firm in assessing the 1st half of 2025 consolidated results as satisfactory albeit the significant increase in both Motor claims frequency and severity in 2025, a trend mainly driven by claims inflation. Notwithstanding, the Company has thus far obtained the necessary approvals to implement a stringent plan to ensure enhanced customer service whilst maintaining the overall profitability in the Motor portfolio.

Dr. Sultan commented with great prominence: “The Company is very pleased to announce that its parent GIG Kuwait has obtained an AM Best issuer Credit Rating upgrade to A+.” And in conclusion, he also remained resolute and passionate in his words of praise: “On this occasion, I would like to thank all teams at BKIC Bahrain, BKIC Kuwait, and our subsidiary for their unfaltering efforts throughout the first half of 2025. The teams remain determined and consistently continue to demonstrate their outstanding dedication, hardwork, and commitment to the Company.”

National Bank of Bahrain B.S.C. (NBB) has reported a 2% increase in its net profit attributable to shareholders reaching BHD 19.4 million (USD 51.5 million) for the second quarter ended 30 June 2025, compared to BHD 19.1 million (USD 50.7 million) in the same period of 2024.

The increase is supported by the Group's diversified revenue streams including fee-based income which registered a 45% growth, gains from client-related activities and lower provisioning requirements. Earnings per share increased to 9 fils (USD 2 cents) for the second quarter of 2025 compared with 8 fils (2 cents) in the same period of 2024. Total comprehensive income attributable to NBB's shareholders for the quarter decreased by 28% to BHD 13.9 million (USD 36.9 million) compared to BHD 19.4 million (USD 51.5 million) in the same period 2024. The decrease is attributable to the

negative mark-to-market movements of the equity and bond portfolios. **Year-to-date** NBB has reported a 2% increase in its net profit attributable to the shareholders for the six months ended 30 June 2025, recording BHD 47.5 million (USD 126.0 million) compared to BHD 46.6 million (USD 123.6 million) for the same period of 2024. The increase was driven by higher operating income supported by stable operating expenses. Earnings per share remained at 21 fils (USD 6 cents) compared with the same period in 2024. Total comprehensive in-

come attributable to NBB's shareholders for the period decreased by 33% to BHD 34.3 million (USD 91.0 million) compared with 51.4 million (USD 136.3 million) in 2024. The decrease is attributable to the negative mark-to-market movements of the equity and bond portfolios.

Balance sheet

The Group's total equity attributable to shareholders decreased by 4% as of 30 June 2025 to BHD 560.4 million (USD 1,486.5 million) compared to BHD 583.8 million (USD 1,548.5 million) reported as of 31 December 2024. The change is mainly a reflection of the Group's proactive distribution of value to its shareholders following the approval and declaration of BHD 56.4 million in year-end cash dividends for 2024, while maintaining a robust capital position. The Group's total assets increased by 8% during the period to BHD 5,967.7 million (USD 15,829.4 million) compared to BHD 5,522.2 million (USD 14,647.7 million) recorded on 31 December 2024.

Interim dividends

Following the Group's strong performance, the Board of Directors proposed an interim cash dividend amounting to BHD 22.6 million which represents 10% of share nominal value, equivalent to 10 fils per share. The payment is subject to regulatory approval.

Commentary

On the occasion, Mrs. Hala Yateem, Chairperson of NBB said, "NBB has maintained a strong financial performance in the first half of 2025, registering an attributable net profit of BHD 47.5 million, an increase of 2% compared to the same period last year, and a record result for the first six months of any year. This growth was underpinned by a robust balance sheet, with total assets up 8% from the year-end level. Following this sustained positive trajectory, the Board has approved an interim cash dividend of 10%, underscoring our ability to deliver consistent returns to shareholders. Our return on average equity of 16.9% further highlights the Group's financial resilience. Beyond the financial metrics, we remain focused on supporting the national developmental agenda through

continued investments in community-focused and ESG-driven initiatives. Our progress so far reflects the strength of our current market position as we move into the second half of the year." Usman Ahmed, Group Chief Executive Officer of NBB commented, "Our operating profit for the first six months of 2025 reached BHD 53.6 million, representing a 4% increase over the same period last year. A growth of 8% in total assets and 5% in customer deposits indicates the strength of our balance sheet and the continued trust of our clients. These results additionally showcase how we continue to enhance our service quality and broaden our social contributions with work that has garnered industry acclaim. During the second quarter of the year, NBB received the Euromoney Awards for Excellence for 'Best Bank in Bahrain', 'Best Bank for ESG', and 'Best Bank for Corporate Responsibility' for our standout financial performance, digital transformation initiatives and customer-centricity. We were also named the 'Best Retail Bank - Bahrain' and 'Best Payment Ecosystem Integration for Corporates' at MEED's MENA Banking Excellence Awards.

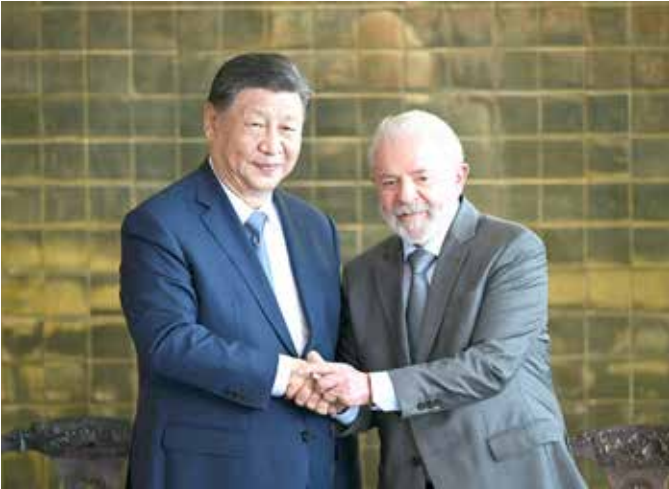

Xi says China, Brazil can model 'self-reliance' for Global South

Beijing, China

China's President Xi Jinping told his Brazilian counterpart Tuesday the two countries could set an example of "self-reliance" for emerging powers, as trade and geopolitical challenges mount. The two leaders have both sought in recent months to present their countries as staunch defenders of the multilateral trading system -- in stark contrast with US President Donald Trump's tariff onslaught. Xi's call with Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva on Tuesday came just hours after Trump announced another 90-day pause to blistering tariffs on China. It also followed indications from Lula last week he planned to speak with the leaders of India and China to consider a coordinated response to US trade measures. Xi told Lula that ties between China and Brazil are

now at an all-time high, according to state news agency Xinhua. He said China would "work with Brazil to set an example of unity and self-reliance among major countries in the Global South" and "jointly build a more just world and more sustainable planet", according to Xinhua. Xi added that "all countries should unite and firmly oppose unilateralism and protectionism", Xinhua reported -- a thinly veiled reference to US tariffs. A statement by the Brazilian presidency said the phone call lasted about an hour, during which time Lula and Xi discussed a range of topics including the war in Ukraine and combatting climate change. "Both agreed on the role of the G20 and BRICS in defending multilateralism", the statement said, referring to the Group of Twenty major economies and a bloc of emerging powers.

Council of Europe cautions on weapon sales to Israel

The Council of Europe urged its member states on Tuesday to halt deliveries of weapons to Israel if they could be used for human rights violations. Michael O'Flaherty, the Council's commissioner for human rights, said member states should do "their utmost to prevent and address violations of international human rights" in the conflict. "This includes applying existing legal standards to ensure that arms transfers are not authorised where there is a risk that they may be used to commit human rights violations," he said, in a statement. It was also "essential to intensify efforts to provide relief to those affected by the conflict, by supporting efforts to ensure unhindered access for humanitarian assistance and by pressing for the immediate release of hostages", O'Flaherty said. The call by the Council -- a human rights organisation representing 46 states -- comes shortly after Germany said it would halt delivery to Israel of some weapons that could be used in Gaza as part of Israeli plans to take control of Gaza City. O'Flaherty said the Council had taken note of this and other government initiatives, and also of contributions by some national human rights structures in raising awareness.

News in brief

◆ **Electricity supply** returned to all Iraq's provinces on Tuesday, a government official told AFP, expecting the grid's full recovery within a day after a nationwide power outage. Electricity shortages are a frequent complaint in Iraq, suffering from endemic corruption and dilapidated public infrastructure. Most households rely on private generators, acquired to compensate for daily power cuts to public electricity. On Monday, the electricity ministry said that "a record rise in temperatures" coupled with a surge in demand resulted in the shutdown of transmission lines, which then led to a total outage. A senior ministry official, speaking on condition of anonymity, told AFP yesterday that "since midnight, all provinces have seen the return" of power supply.

◆ **France yesterday** condemned "the heavy toll paid by local journalists" in Gaza and called on the Israeli authorities to guarantee "safe and unhindered access" for international media. On Sunday, five Al Jazeera journalists were killed in an Israeli strike on their tent in Gaza City. Among the victims was Anas al-Sharif, a prominent Al Jazeera correspondent aged 28. A freelance reporter was also killed in the strike that targeted the Al Jazeera team. Condemning the strike, the French foreign ministry said that the journalists were targeted while "carrying out their reporting duties". Israel confirmed it had targeted Sharif, whom it labelled a "terrorist" affiliated with Hamas, saying he "posed as a journalist".

France urges Israel to grant journalists 'safe' access to Gaza

◆ **At least nine** Pakistani soldiers were killed when dozens of militants staged an attack in the country's restive southwestern Balochistan province, government officials said yesterday. The attack on Monday happened the same day the US State Department listed the Baloch Liberation Army (BLA) as a foreign terrorist organisation after a string of deadly assaults claimed by the group. A senior government official of Washuk district, where the assault took place, said dozens of militants attacked a police station and a border force compound. "The army was attacked by terrorists on their way to respond. The terrorists killed nine soldiers," he told AFP on condition of anonymity as he was not authorised to speak to the media. "There were around 40 to 50 terrorists on motorbikes who attacked government buildings and ransacked them," said a senior official from the province's interior department who asked not to be named, confirming to AFP that nine soldiers were killed.

Scientists find 74-million-year-old mammal fossil in Chile

Scientists have discovered the fossil of a tiny mouse-sized mammal that lived in the time of the dinosaurs in Chilean Patagonia. "Yeutherium pressor" weighed between 30 and 40 grams (about one ounce) and lived in the Upper Cretaceous period, about 74 million years ago.

It is the smallest mammal ever found in this region of South America, dating back to the era when it was part of a continental land mass known as Gondwana.

The fossil consists of "a small piece of jaw with a molar and the crown and roots of two other molars," said Hans Puschel, who led the team of scientists from the University of Chile and Chile's Millennium Nucleus research center on early mammals.

The discovery was published this month in the British scientific journal Proceedings of the Royal Society B.

Researchers found the fossil in the

Rio de las Las Chinas Valley in Chile's Magallanes region, about 3,000 kilometers (1,864 miles) south of Santiago.

Despite its similarity to a small rodent, "Yeutherium pressor" was a mammal that must have laid eggs, like the platypus, or carried its young in a pouch like kangaroos or opossums.

The shape of its teeth suggests that it probably had a diet of relatively hard vegetables.

Just like the dinosaurs with whom it co-existed, the tiny mammal abruptly went extinct at the end of the Cretaceous period, about 66 million years ago.

New row between Israel defence minister and military chief

Tensions have been simmering between the chief of staff and Netanyahu

Israel's defence minister yesterday reprimanded the country's military chief over appointments made without his approval, as



tensions simmered between the military and the executive ahead of a planned expansion of the war in Gaza.

A statement from the defence minister Israel Katz's ministry said that deliberations conducted by chief of staff Lieutenant General Eyal Zamir on military appointments "took place... without prior coordination or agreement" with the minister.

The statement added that this was "in violation of accepted procedure" and that Katz

therefore "does not intend to discuss or approve any of the appointments or names that were published."

In an army statement published shortly afterwards, Zamir responded that he was "the sole authority authorised to appoint officers from the rank of colonel upwards".

"The chief of staff makes the appointment decisions -- after which the appointment is brought to the minister for approval," the statement added.

Tensions have been simmering for two weeks between the chief of staff and Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's government over the next steps in the military operation in Gaza, aimed at freeing the remaining hostages and defeating Hamas.

Israeli media reported that Zamir was opposed to a plan ap-

proved by the security cabinet on Friday to take control of all of densely populated Gaza City.

Israeli media reported that Zamir favoured encircling Gaza's largest city, rather than conquering it.

The Israeli army controls around 75 percent of the Palestinian territory which has been devastated by 22 months of war.

Zamir, who was appointed in March after his predecessor was dismissed, said last week that he would continue expressing the military's position "without fear, in a pragmatic, independent, and professional manner".

Katz meanwhile said that the army chief could "express his views", but that the military would ultimately have to "execute" any government decisions on Gaza.

Over 50,000 migrants cross Channel since UK PM elected: figures

More than 50,000 people have made the perilous Channel crossing to the UK in small boats since Keir Starmer became prime minister last July, official figures showed on Tuesday.

Starmer came to power promising to "smash the gangs" of people smugglers operating the boats, but 474 more people made the crossing on Monday, bringing the total to 50,271 since he came to power on July 5, 2024.

The issue of cross-Channel migration has become a major headache for

Starmer's year-old Labour government, as support for the upstart anti-immigrant Reform UK party soars.

More than 27,000 migrants have made the Channel crossing in rudimentary vessels this year alone.

Kemi Badenoch, leader of the Conservative Party that was defeated last year, on Tuesday said that she would "quickly" stop the crossings if she was in power.

"Stopping people from coming here in the first place -- if they

think they're going to be sent to Rwanda and not get here, get a free hotel, get benefits, then they won't come here," she said.

London and Paris last month unveiled a "pilot" programme to return to France some of the migrants arriving in the UK on small boats, with the first detentions made last week.

Starmer called the deal "groundbreaking" and capable of stemming the record numbers of people who have embarked on the journey so

far this year.

Although Starmer did not say how many people might be returned to France, media reports suggest it could initially total around 50 people a week.

Reform UK leader Nigel Farage called the deal "a humiliation for Brexit Britain".

US woman found guilty of UK murder plot

An American woman was on Tuesday found guilty at a UK court of participating in a 2019 plot to murder a British man caught up in a bitter feud between families.

After a years-long police hunt, Aimee Betro, 45, was extradited earlier this year from Armenia where she was living, to face trial in the central English city of Birmingham.

Prosecutors told the court Betro had covered her face in a niqab as she climbed out of a car in September 2019 and tried to shoot Sikander Ali at point-blank range.

But the handgun jammed and Ali fled in his car which was parked outside his home.

Prosecutors said Betro was part of a plot with co-conspirators Mohammed Aslam, 56, and his 31-year-old son, Mohammed Nabil Nazir.

Betro had met Nazir on an online dating site, and told the jury she was in love with him.

Both men were jailed last year for their roles in the "violent" feud which erupted after they were injured in a brawl at Ali's father's clothing store in July 2018.

"Betro tried to kill a man in a Birmingham street at point-blank range. It is sheer luck that he managed to get away unscathed," said prosecutor Hannah Sidaway.

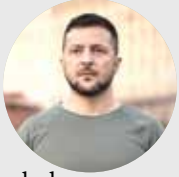

Israel prepares for Gaza City battle

In a dense urban landscape, with likely thousands of Hamas fighters lying in wait, taking Gaza City will be a difficult and costly slog for the Israeli army, security experts say.

On Sunday, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu laid out his vision of victory in Gaza following 22 months of war --- with the military ordered to attack the last remaining Hamas strongholds in Gaza City and the central camps further south.

With a pre-war population of some 760,000, according to official figures, Gaza City was the biggest of any municipal area in the Palestinian territories.

But following the unprecedented Hamas attack on Israel in 2023 that sparked the war, its population has only swelled, with thousands of displaced people fleeing intensive military operations to the north.

'Death trap'

Amir Avivi, a former Israeli general and head of the Israeli Defense and Security Forum think tank, described the city as the "heart of Hamas's rule

in Gaza".

"Gaza City has always been the centre of government and also has the strongest brigade of Hamas," he said.

The first challenge for Israeli troops relates to Netanyahu's call for the evacuation of civilians -- how such a feat will be carried out remains unclear.

Unlike the rest of the Strip, where most of the population has been displaced at least once, around 300,000 residents of Gaza City have not moved since the outbreak of the conflict, according to Avivi.

Israel has already tried to push civilians further south to so-called humanitarian zones established by the military, but there is likely little space to accommodate more arrivals.

"You cannot put another one million people over there. It will be a horrible humanitarian crisis," said Michael Milshtein, an Israeli former military intelligence officer.

According to Avivi, humanitarian aid would be mainly distributed south of Gaza City in order to encourage residents to move toward future distribution sites managed by the US- and Israel-backed Gaza Humanitarian Foundation (GHF).

Up from just four currently, the GHF plans to operate 16 sites.

However, Gaza's civil defence agency says Israeli troops are firing at and killing civilians daily around the sites.

Human Rights Watch has called them a "death trap", while the UN and other groups have lashed out at what they call a militarisation of aid.

'Stalingrad'

According to Michael Milshtein, who heads the Pales-

tinian Studies Program at Tel Aviv University, Hamas's military wing could have as many as 10,000 to 15,000 fighters in Gaza City, many of them freshly recruited.

"It's very easy to convince a 17, 18, 19-year-old Palestinian to be a part of Al-Qassam Brigades," Milshtein told AFP, referring to Hamas's armed wing as he cited a lack of opportunities for much Gaza's population.

"While (Israel's army) prepares itself, Hamas also prepares itself for the coming warfare, if it takes place," he added, predicting that the battle could end up being "very similar to Stalingrad."

The Israeli army will encounter obstacles including a vast network of tunnels where Israeli hostages are likely being held, along with weapons depots, hiding places and combat posts.

Other obstacles could include improvised explosive devices (IEDs) and the use of civilians as human shields in a dense urban maze of narrow alleys and tall buildings, according to press reports.

"It's almost impossible to go in there without creating both hostage casualties and a large humanitarian disaster," said Mairav Zonszein of the International Crisis Group.

The material destruction, she added, will be enormous.

"They will simply destroy everything, and then nothing will be left," she said.

Despite rumoured disagreements over the plan by the chief of the army Eyal Zamir, the general said his forces "will be able to conquer Gaza City, just as it did in Khan Yunis and Rafah in the south," according to a statement on Monday.

Hamas delegation expected in Cairo to discuss Gaza truce efforts

A senior Hamas delegation was due in Cairo for talks with Egyptian officials on efforts by mediators to secure an elusive ceasefire in Gaza, two Palestinian sources told AFP yesterday.

Together with Qatar and the United States, Egypt has been involved in mediation between Israel and Palestinian militant group Hamas that has failed to secure a breakthrough since a short-lived truce earlier this

year. Upon Egypt's invitation, the Hamas delegation led by the group's chief negotiator Khalil al-Hayya "is expected to arrive in Cairo today (Tuesday) or tomorrow morning", the source told AFP, requesting anonymity to discuss the sensitive negotiations.

The source said the delegation was scheduled to meet Egyptian officials on Wednesday to "discuss the latest developments" in "ceasefire negotiations and prisoner exchange" that would include the release of hostages held in Gaza.

EU, UK and Japan urge action against 'famine unfolding' in Gaza

The European Union, Britain and Japan yesterday called for urgent action to stop "famine" in the Gaza Strip.

"The humanitarian suffering in Gaza has reached unimaginable levels. Famine is unfolding before our eyes," a joint statement signed by the EU's top diplomat and foreign ministers from 24 countries, including Canada and Australia.

"Urgent action is needed now to halt and reverse starvation," they said.

The ministers and EU foreign policy chief Kaja Kallas also demanded Israel "provide authorisation for all international NGO aid shipments and to unblock essential humanitarian actors from operating".

Seventeen European Union countries signed the statement, including France, the Netherlands and usually pro-Palestinian countries such as Ireland and Spain.

Notably absent was Germany, Israel's staunch supporter in the EU, despite its drastic move to halt the export of mil-

itary equipment to Israel last week.

Israel has until recently enjoyed broad support across the political spectrum in Germany, a country still seeking to atone for the World War II murder of more than six million Jews.

The EU struck a deal last month to increase aid access to Gaza but senior officials have said the agreement has not been implemented fully.

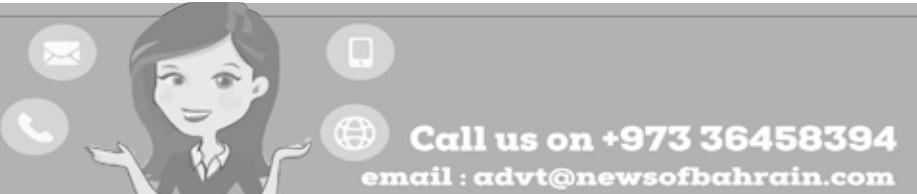

Egypt says working with Qatar, US to revive 60-day truce plan

Egypt, Qatar and the United States have played a key role in mediating talks

Egypt said yesterday it was working with fellow Gaza mediators Qatar and the United States to broker a 60-day ceasefire as part of a renewed push to end the Israel-Hamas war.

Egypt, Qatar and the United States have played a key role in mediating talks between Israel and Hamas since the Palestinian militant group's October 7, 2023 attack triggered the ongoing war.

"We are working very hard

now in full cooperation with the Qataris and Americans," Egyptian Foreign Minister Badr Abdelatty told reporters during a press conference in Cairo.

"The main objective is to go back to the original proposal -- to have a ceasefire for 60 days, with the release of some hostages and some Palestinian detainees, and the flow of humanitarian and medical assistance to Gaza without restrictions, without conditions."

"We are talking with Hamas, with the Israelis and pushing for a deal" based on a recent US

plan, Abdelatty said.

A Palestinian source familiar with the negotiations earlier told AFP that "mediators are working to formulate a new comprehensive ceasefire agreement proposal" that would include the release of all remaining hostages in Gaza "in one batch".

Last month, more than two weeks of negotiations in Doha failed to secure a breakthrough in talks for a ceasefire and the release of hostages.

Hamas negotiators eventually withdrew days after the United

States and Israel pulled their own delegations.

US Middle East envoy Steve Witkoff blamed Hamas for the failure, saying Washington would "consider alternative options" after no agreement was reached.

A previous short-lived truce earlier this year collapsed and did not lead to a lasting agreement.

A senior Hamas delegation was expected in Cairo for talks with Egyptian officials, two Palestinian sources told AFP on Tuesday.

Toll of India Himalayan flood likely to be at least 70

Indian officials say at least 68 people are unaccounted for a week after a deadly wall of icy water swept away a Himalayan town and buried it in mud.

On top of four people reported to have been killed, it takes the likely overall toll of the August 5 disaster to more than 70 dead.

Videos broadcast by survivors showed a terrifying surge of muddy water sweeping away multi-storey apartment blocks.

Disaster officials said Tuesday that they were searching for corpses in the wreckage of the tourist town of Dharali in Uttarakhand state.

Gambhir Singh Chauhan, from the National Disaster Response Force, said sniffer dogs had identified several sites indicating there was a body but when "when digging started, water came out from below".

Chauhan said teams were also using ground penetrating radar in the grim search.

More than 100 people were initially reported as missing.

US, Jordan offer Syria support in upholding Sweida ceasefire

Syrian and Jordanian foreign ministers and a US envoy agreed on Tuesday to form a working group to help Damascus uphold a ceasefire in Sweida province, rocked by recent sectarian clashes.

In a joint statement issued after a meeting in Amman, Jordan and the United States said they "agreed to respond to the Syrian government's request to establish a trilateral working group (Syrian-Jordanian-American) to support the Syrian government's efforts to consolidate the ceasefire" in Sweida and "resolve the crisis" there.

They also agreed to hold another meeting in the coming weeks.

US, China extend tariff truce for 90 days

China and the United States delayed higher tariffs on each other’s imports for 90 days, hours before a trade truce between the world’s two largest economies was due to expire yesterday.

US President Donald Trump signed an executive order on Monday that will “extend the Tariff Suspension on China for another 90 days,” according to a post on his Truth Social platform.

The White House said its halt on steeper tariffs will be in place until November 10.

China also said it would continue suspending its earlier tariff hike for 90 days, starting August 12, while retaining a 10-percent duty, according to a joint statement.

While the United States and China slapped escalating tariffs on each other’s products this year, bringing them to prohibitive triple-digit levels and snarling trade, both countries in May agreed to temporarily lower them.

As part of their truce that month, fresh US tariffs targeting China were reduced to 30 percent and the corresponding level from China was cut to 10 percent.

Those rates will now hold until November -- or whenever a deal is cut before then.

In the executive order posted Monday to its website, the White House reiterated its position that there are “large and persistent annual US goods trade deficits” and they “constitute an unusual and extraordinary threat to the na-



tional security and economy of the United States.”

The order acknowledged Washington’s ongoing discussions with Beijing “to address the lack of trade reciprocity in our economic relationship” and noted that China has continued to “take significant steps toward remedying” the US complaints.

Beijing, meanwhile, said it would “take or maintain necessary measures to suspend or remove non-tariff countermeasures against the United States,” as agreed in Geneva in May.

Trump-Xi summit?

In Shanghai, China’s commercial capital, residents welcomed the extended trade truce on Tuesday.

“I feel that negotiations will definitely steer the two countries toward a better direction,” said Zhang Xuan, a 25-year-old postgraduate student.

Lin Peng, a commercial property leasing agent, told AFP he felt there would be more negotiations between the two nations as Trump is a “businessman” and an escalated trade war would “hurt his own interests too.”

“Beijing will be happy to keep the US-China negotiation going, but it is unlikely to make con-

cessions,” warned William Yang, an analyst at the International Crisis Group.

He believes China sees its leverage over rare earth exports as strong, and that Beijing will likely use it to pressure Washington.

US-China Business Council president Sean Stein said the extension was “critical to give the two governments time to negotiate an agreement,” providing much-needed certainty for companies to make plans.

Since Trump took office in January, China’s tariffs have essentially boomeranged, from the initially modest 10 percent hike in February, followed by repeated surges as Beijing and Washington clashed, until it hit a high of 145 percent in April.

Now the tariff has been pulled back to 30 percent, a negotiated truce rate.

A trade deal would “pave the way for a Trump-Xi summit this fall,” said Asia Society Policy Institute senior vice president Wendy Cutler.

But Cutler, herself a former US trade official, said: “This will be far from a walk in the park.”

Even as both countries reached a pact to cool tensions after high level talks in Geneva in May, the de-escalation has

been shaky. Key economic officials convened in London in June as disagreements emerged and US officials accused their counterparts of violating the pact. Policymakers met again in Stockholm last month.

‘Reciprocal’ tariffs

Trump said in a social media post Sunday that he hoped China will “quickly quadruple its soybean orders,” adding this would be a way to balance trade with the United States.

China’s exports reached record highs in 2024, and Beijing reported that their exports exceeded expectations in June, climbing 5.8 percent year-on-year, as the world’s number-two economy works to sustain growth.

Since returning to the presidency, Trump has separately slapped a 10 percent “reciprocal” tariff on almost all trading partners, aimed at addressing trade practices Washington has deemed unfair.

This surged to varying steeper levels last Thursday for dozens of economies.

Major partners like the European Union, Japan and South Korea now see a 15 percent US duty on many products, while the level went as high as 41 percent for Syria.

Bob Odenkirk "turned grey bright away" after suffering a heart attack on the set of Better Call Saul. The 62-year-old actor has recalled how he was lucky that co-stars Ray Campbell and Patrick Fabian were nearby after he suffered a medical emergency during filming for the Breaking Bad spin-off in 2021 as he likely would have died had the incident happened in his trailer. Bob told Conan O'Brien Needs a Friend: "It was during Covid shooting, so we were separate from the crew. "And luckily, I didn't go to my trailer. If I'd gone to my trailer, I wouldn't be here, because they don't bother you (in the trailer)." Odenkirk recalled how Campbell and Fabian's screams for help were initially mistaken as laughter at first due to the social distancing provisions in place on the set. He said: "It

took a few seconds to realise people were screaming." Bob was grateful to the show's medical officer Rosa Estrada as she "immediately" began CPR after learning that no defibrillator would be available for 15 minutes. The Nobody actor later had two stents put in his coronary arteries after suffering the widow-maker heart attack but has no memory of the time he spent in hospital.

Liverpool spend big to hold off Arsenal, Man City in Premier League title fight

Big summer spending raises hopes for a dramatic and unpredictable season ahead

- **Liverpool** spend £260m on reinforcements
- **Arsenal** target Gyokeres to end drought
- **City** rebuild after trophyless season
- **Chelsea** emerge as dark horses
- **United** overhaul attack after poor season

Liverpool have splashed out to defend their Premier League title as champions but face stiff competition from an Arsenal side desperate to shake off their tag as nearly men and a rejuvenated Manchester City.

After storming to a record-equalling 20th English top-flight title in Arne Slot's first season in charge, Liverpool have looked to build from a position of strength during a summer marked by tragedy.

Portuguese forward Diogo Jota was killed in a car accident alongside his brother last month, plunging the club into mourning.

Tributes to Jota will continue throughout the season with "Forever 20" -- his shirt number, which the club have now retired -- printed on Liverpool's jerseys.

The Reds have already spent £260 million (\$350 million) on Florian Wirtz, Hugo Ekitike, Milos Kerkez and Jeremie Frimpong.

However, after the departures of Luis Diaz and Darwin Nunez, they are not yet done in strengthening their forward

line and are expected to launch a fresh bid for Alexander Isak, with Newcastle demanding a British transfer record fee for the Swedish striker.

Liverpool's rivals will hope Wirtz and Ekitike take time to adapt to the rigours of the

P r e -

mier League after shining in Germany's Bundesliga, while there are defensive doubts for Slot's men to answer.

The Dutch coach said his side need to defend better after leaky performances in pre-season were followed by defeat in the Community Shield to Crystal Palace on Sunday after twice blowing the lead.

Can Gyokeres fire?

After finishing second for the past three seasons, Arsenal are longing for their first title in 22 years and have backed Mikel Arteta with another near £200 million investment in the transfer market.

Spanish international Martin Zubimendi will be the new anchor of the midfield, while the signings of Christian Norgaard, Cristhian Mosquera, Noni Madueke and Kepa Arrizabalaga add depth to the squad.

But Arsenal's season is likely to be defined by whether Viktor Gyokeres proves to be the answer to their need for a prolific striker.

The Swede struck 97 times in 102 games during two years at Sporting Lisbon, but the Arsenal forward Viktor Gyokeres takes part in a training session

27-year-old failed to make a breakthrough in the Premier League during his previous experience in England.

After coming up short at Brighton, Gyokeres scored 41 goals in 121 games in England's second tier with Coventry and Swansea.

"He's a player that, when you leave him with the space one against one, he's going to destroy you," said Arteta of his new striker.

City were dethroned last season after an unprecedented run of four consecutive titles as the wheels came off for Pep Guardiola's men without Ballon d'Or winner Rodri.

The Spaniard has been ruled out till September due to a setback in his return from a serious knee injury, but City have refreshed their squad with the additions of Rayan Ait-Nouri, Tijjani Reijnders and Rayan Cherki.

After a first trophyless season since 2016/17, City expect to be back in the fight for the title.

World champions Chelsea

Chelsea were the last side other than City and Liverpool

to lift the title back in 2017 and showed they are a coming force once more by winning the Club World Cup in the US last month.

The Blues finished fourth, 15 points behind Liverpool last season, but their transfer policy of investing heavily in scores of young prospects is beginning to bear fruit.

Joao Pedro made an instant impact with three goals in three games at the Club World Cup after a £55 million move from Brighton and could solve Chelsea's need for a world class goalscorer.

Manchester United have transformed their forward line with the signings of Benjamin Sesko, Matheus Cunha and Bryan Mbeumo after finishing 15th last season.

Beating United in the Europa League final was not enough for Ange Postecoglou to keep his job as Tottenham manager and former Brentford boss Thomas Frank has taken over in north London.

Promoted trio Leeds, Sunderland and Burnley are aiming to avoid a worrying trend for the competitive balance.

For the past two seasons all three promoted clubs have gone straight back down as the gap between the riches of the Premier League and the second tier continues to grow.

Last Liverpool goal had special meaning for Jota

Diogo Jota revealed the emotional meaning behind his last Liverpool goal in a touching interview before his death in a car crash.

Jota and his brother Andre Silva died when their Lamborghini went off the road in the accident in northern Spain on July 3.

The Portugal forward was on his way back to England to start pre-season training after helping Liverpool win the Premier League title last term.

Jota's final goal for Liverpool was the vital winner in the Merseyside derby against Everton at

Anfield in April.

Speaking in an interview just weeks before his death, Jota admitted he felt proud to be able to contribute to Arne Slot's team by scoring in such an important game.

"It was a very tough season for me but I was always there fighting and I could help the team that day and I'm proud of what I could still do," he said in the documentary titled "Champions 24-25: The Inside Story".

Jota, 28, spent five years with Liverpool after joining from Wolves in 2020.

He won the Premier League, FA Cup and League Cup during his time at Anfield.

"It is something I could not even dream as a kid, I wanted to play in the Premier League but I could never imagine to win it," Jota said in the documentary about his Liverpool success.

"Pictures that will be shown forever. It is a remarkable achievement for a small guy that came from Gondomar, where I had this dream."

Liverpool have posthumously retired his number 20 shirt and the club have announced that Jota will be remembered with a permanent sculpture outside Anfield, while a mural of the star already adorns the wall of a building near the stadium.

Jannik Sinner ignored power failure interruptions and a blaring alarm to defeat Gabriel Diallo 6-2, 7-6 (8/6) on Monday's day of distractions at the ATP and WTA Cincinnati Open.

The top seeded defending champion got down to business against a Canadian ranked 35th who was plagued by eight first-set double-faults and 49 unforced errors in the match as he faced the best in the world.

Sinner recovered smoothly from an early break down and had his hands full on his

"I can take lessons from this," Raducanu said. "With work and practice I think I can hold my level higher for longer."

Brevis smashes record ton as South Africa level T20 series

Dewald Brevis belted South Africa's highest Twenty20 individual score with a blistering 125 not out from 56 balls as the tourists stayed alive in the three-match series after a 53-run victory over Australia in Darwin yesterday.

Australia's decision to bowl backfired as South Africa powered to a massive 218-7 on the back of Brevis' maiden century in international cricket.

The 22-year-old rescued South Africa from a shaky 57-3 and dominated a 126-run partnership with Tristan Stubbs (31). "I'm extremely grateful, just happy to be out here on the winning side," said Brevis, who surpassed Faf du Plessis' 119 against the West Indies in 2015.

Playing just his ninth T20 international, Brevis smashed eight sixes to leave Australia's powerful batting line-up with an uphill task.

Australia's daunting chase was made more difficult after the

Brevis received a life on 56 when substitute fielder Matthew Kuhnemann fumbled on the boundary off the bowling of an increasingly frustrated Maxwell.

Brevis made Australia pay and in a flash he was saluting the crowd after reaching his century with a boundary off his 41st delivery.

Maxwell and quick Ben Dwarshuis picked up two wickets apiece in an unusually ragged effort in the field for Australia, whose nine-match T20 win streak ended.

The series-decider will be played in the Queensland city of Cairns on Saturday.

Palace blast UEFA's 'meaningless' sporting merit

- UEFA demotes Palace to Conference League
- CAS rejects appeal on ownership conflict
- Forest take Europa League spot instead

Premier League side Crystal Palace said yesterday that sporting merit had been "rendered meaningless" by UEFA's decision to demote them from the Europa League.

The FA Cup winners have been forced to play in this season's Conference League after European football's governing body UEFA ruled in July that American businessman John Textor had control or influence at both Palace and French club Lyon.

Palace tried to have the punishment overturned, but on Monday the Lausanne-based Court of Arbitration for Sport announced the Premier League club had lost their appeal.

Nottingham Forest are set to take Palace's spot in the Europa League.

Palace chairman Steve Parish had already been vocal in his criticism after the initial demotion and, with their fate sealed, the south London club again blasted the decision.

"At a time when we should be celebrating our victory in the Community Shield at Wembley, the decision by UEFA and followed by the Court of Arbitration for Sport shows that sporting merit is rendered meaningless," Palace said in a statement.

"When we won the FA Cup against Manchester City on

that momentous day in May, our manager and players earned the right to play Europa League football.

"We have been denied that opportunity. It appears that certain clubs, organisations and individuals have a unique privilege and power.

"This growing and unhealthy influence has shattered the hopes and dreams of Crystal Palace supporters, and does not bode well for aspirational teams all over Europe competing to progress when rules and sanctions are unevenly applied in the most flagrant way."

UEFA regulations state that where one or more clubs are found to have shared ownership, they cannot play in the same competition, and Lyon held on to the Europa League spot by virtue of their higher league position.

Palace missed a March 1 UEFA

deadline for team in multi-club groups to change their ownership structure.

Textor has since sold his shares to New York Jets owner Woody Johnson, a takeover

completed in late July.

"Multi-club structures hide behind the charade of a 'blind trust' while clubs such as ours, who have no connection to another club whatsoever, are prevented from playing in the same competition," the Palace statement added.

"To compound the injustice, clubs that appear to have huge informal arrangements with each other are also allowed to participate and even possibly play against each other.

Palace added that the process was "designed to severely restrict and, in our case, make it almost impossible to receive a fair hearing".

Palace beat Premier League champions Liverpool in the Community Shield at the weekend, winning a penalty shootout after the match finished 2-2 in 90 minutes.

PSG sign Ukrainian defender Illia Zabarnyi from Bournemouth

- £57m transfer from Bournemouth

European champions Paris Saint-Germain said yesterday they have signed Ukrainian centre-back Illia Zabarnyi from Premier League club Bournemouth.

British media reports said the deal was worth around £57 million (\$76.7 million, 66 million euros).

"Paris Saint-Germain are excited to welcome Illia Zabarnyi," PSG said in a statement, adding he would be the first Ukrainian ever to play for the club.

The arrival of Zabarnyi, 22, could jeopardise the place of Brazilian stalwart Marquinhos in the starting lineup.

Zabarnyi had an impressive 2024-2025 season in England when Bournemouth finished ninth and the club's supporters voted him their player of the season in the previous campaign.

Bournemouth have now sold three of their first-choice defensive lineup from last season after Milos Kerkez moved to Premier League champions Liverpool and Dean

Huijsen was transferred to Real Madrid.

Qatar-owned PSG, who thrashed Inter Milan 5-0 to win the Champions League for the first time in May, also signed highly-rated Lille goalkeeper Lucas Chevalier last Saturday, a move that appears to herald the possible departure of Gianluigi Donnarumma.

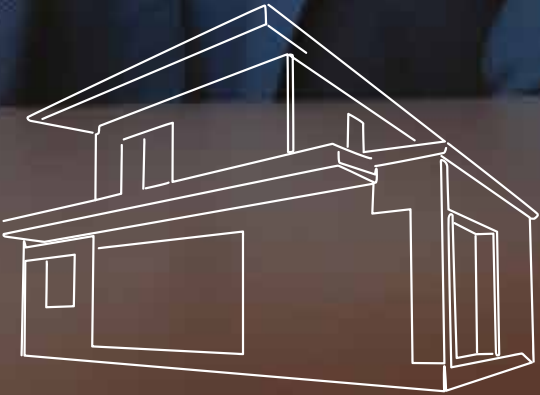
