Marine safety awareness campaign



Bahrain's Coast Guard has launched a marine awareness campaign in cooperation with Bapco Energies as part of ongoing efforts to enhance safety and regulate maritime traffic.

The campaign is being conducted in connection with the ongoing 3D marine survey project in Bahrain's northern waters. It aims to raise awareness among fishermen, boat owners and sea users about safety guidelines and navigation rules in the project areas.

The Coast Guard urged sea users to maintain safe speeds, avoid approaching or tampering with survey equipment, and refrain from fishing or other marine activities within designated work zones.

Kingfish net ban starts Saturday



Bahrain will ban catching kingfish using nets in its territorial waters for two months from August 15 to October 15, the Supreme Council for Environment has announced.

The restriction aims to protect kingfish stocks during the fertilisation and breeding season and support the sustainability of Bahrain's marine resources. Fishing for kingfish using lines will remain permitted during the ban.



Minister of Youth Affairs Rawan bint Najeeb Tawfiqi met with GCC delegations participating in programmes organised by the GCC Youth Empowerment Committee at Youth City 2030.

The minister welcomed the

participants and praised their engagement in the programmes and activities hosted by Youth City 2030, highlighting the opportunities it provides for learning, skills development and the exchange of expertise among GCC youth.

She affirmed Bahrain's commitment to supporting GCC joint action and strengthening cooperation and integration among the GCC countries.

Tawfiqi said the efforts are part of the comprehensive development process led by His

Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, while also highlighting the directives of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Crown Prince and Prime Minister, in supporting greater GCC cooperation.

Slow-Motion Disaster Off Oman

Beaches at Ras Madrasah contaminated more than 200km from the stricken vessel

An oil spill from a tanker that ran aground off Oman's coast has reached the mainland, state media reported, while monsoon winds were obstructing containment efforts, the United Nations' maritime agency said.

Previously found that the ship had been stranded for weeks near Oman's Al-Qibliyyah island after it was damaged by explosions.

The Oman News Agency (ONA) quoted the country's environment authority as saying that monitoring

results showed that some beaches in the Ras Madrasah area were affected by oil pollution.

The Indian Ocean town sits more than 200 kilometres (125 miles) from Al-Qibliyyah.

Meanwhile, a spokesperson for the UN's International Maritime Organization said it was "closely monitoring the oil leakage from the crude oil tanker CAROLINE BEZENGI, which grounded off the coast of Oman on 30 June 2026 and is currently around 22 nautical miles off-

shore of Sharbithat, Oman". They added that "oil is drifting offshore to the northeast of Al-Qibliyyah island with some oil reported to be reaching the mainland," and that "the seasonal monsoon has limited access to the vessel and delayed salvage operations".

Oman on Monday said it was working to contain the spill, which had affected roughly 390 square kilometres (150 square miles), according to the most recent analysis from the country's environment agency.



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NBB Commences University Phase of EVOLVE Following Conclusion of the School Programme

The National Bank of Bahrain (NBB) has concluded the school cohort of the fifth edition of EVOLVE, its summer internship programme, and commenced the next phase for university participants. The transition marks the continuation of the 2026 programme, which began in July.

Students from the AlMabbarrah AlKhalifia Foundation (MKF) and the Royal Humanitarian Foundation also joined in, extending the programme's reach to the youth supported by both charitable organisations.



This group will take part in a similarly structured learning journey, combining technical development with direct exposure to different functions across NBB.

The curriculum covers topics including banking, artificial

intelligence, fintech, entrepreneurship, cybersecurity, first aid, mental health awareness, sign language, team building, and sovereign wealth funds. Sessions are delivered by NBB employees alongside Mada Translation, Marsh, BIBF, Emeritus, Bahrain

Young participants at Youth City 2030 were introduced to Bahrain’s parliamentary system and the legislative and oversight roles of the Shura Council and Council of Representatives during interactive awareness sessions held to mark International Youth Day.

The sessions formed part of programmes aimed at strengthening parliamentary culture among young people, increasing their understanding of legislative work and encouraging active participation in public affairs.

The General Secretariat of the Shura Council organised an interactive session for participants in the first edition of the “Junior Parliamentarian” programme, held in strategic partnership with the Youth Leadership Association and in cooperation with the Ministry of Youth Affairs.

Legal researchers Hawra Ali



and Muneera Al Abbasi delivered a presentation covering the powers and responsibilities of the Shura Council, as well as cooperation between the Shura Council and Council of Representatives and coordination between the legislative and executive authorities.

The session also highlighted the complementary roles of the two chambers and their contribution to Bahrain’s development. Separately, the Secretariat General of the Council of Representatives held an awareness lecture on parliamentary culture as part of Youth City 2030 activities.

Dr Shaikha Al Alaiwi, Executive Legal Researcher at the

Secretariat General, introduced participants to the Council of Representatives, its legislative and oversight powers, parliamentary procedures and the role of parliamentary committees.

The lecture also explained the stages involved in discussing bills and proposals and emphasised the importance of national participation and fostering active citizenship among young people.

The two initiatives reflect the efforts of Bahrain’s parliamentary institutions to promote parliamentary awareness among younger generations and provide them with a better understanding of the country’s legislative process.

Adding Outside Stairs? Check First

Muharraq Municipality says approval depends on property and planning rules

Homeowners planning to add external staircases to their properties have been urged to check the applicable regulations and obtain the required approvals before starting work.

Muharraq Municipality said whether an external staircase can be built depends on the property’s location, boundaries and applicable planning regulations, rather than simply the staircase’s design.

Factors include the distance from property boundaries, required building setbacks, zoning classification, how the staircase connects to the building and facade, as well as technical, structural and safety requirements.

The municipality noted that requirements can vary between properties, meaning neighbouring homes may not necessarily receive the same approval.

Construction, extension and alteration works are subject to Decree-Law No. 13 of 1977 issuing the Building Regulation Law and its amendments, along with applicable planning regulations and building permit requirements.



Homeowners planning an external staircase are advised to:

- Check the regulations applying to the property.
- Confirm that the proposed staircase is permitted at the intended location.
- Complete all required licensing procedures before construction begins.

The municipality stressed that checking the requirements before construction is essential to ensure the work is carried out safely and lawfully.

Employer cleared of trafficking charge

Appeal court upholds three-month sentence over threats used to obtain false wage acknowledgements

An appeals court has acquitted the owner of a transactions processing office of human trafficking charges but upheld his conviction for forcing a foreign employee to sign documents falsely confirming receipt of his wages.

The court sentenced the employer to three months in prison for obtaining the

signatures through threats. The worker alleged that his working hours were extended, his weekly day off was denied, his salary was withheld for three months and he was assigned duties outside his job. He also claimed the employer threatened to cancel his residency and terminate his employment.

The Court of First Instance

had sentenced the defendant to three years in prison, fined him BD2,000 and ordered him to cover the worker’s repatriation costs.

The Court of Appeal overturned that ruling, acquitting him of the trafficking-related charges and convicting him only of obtaining the salary receipt declarations through threats.

Defendant sent to trial over electronic records

The Public Prosecution referred a defendant to the High Criminal Court over two cases involving allegations of falsifying official electronic records by entering false information into the Ministry of Justice, Islamic Affairs and Waqf’s electronic system.

According to the Financial Crimes and Money Laundering Prosecution, the defendant allegedly entered incor-

rect mobile phone numbers when submitting claims for financial dues against 14 people in one case and nine in another.

Investigations found that the same two phone numbers were entered for the individuals and that both numbers belonged to the defendant.

The prosecution said the information was allegedly entered to prevent the affected individuals from receiving

notifications about the claims and responding to them.

Statements from affected individuals and a Ministry employee, along with an examination of the electronic system, supported the findings, including evidence that notification messages were sent to the defendant’s numbers.

The two cases are scheduled to be heard by the High Criminal Court on August 18, 2026.



Two Asians Arrested with Narcotic Substances

General Directorate of Criminal Investigation and Forensic Evidence arrested two Asian nationals, a man and a woman, after finding them in possession of suspected narcotic substances.

The Ministry of Interior said the arrests were made as part of ongoing efforts by the Anti-Narcotics Directorate to combat drug-related

activities and protect the community. Following information received about the case, security personnel conducted search and investigation operations, gathered information and evidence, and identified the suspects. Security personnel subsequently arrested them with the drugs in their possession.

Three Police Officers Earn Master’s Degrees in Security Studies



Chief of Public Security and Chairman of the Scientific Council of the Royal Academy of Police, Lieutenant General Tariq bin Hassan Al Hassan, received Major Ali Abdullah Al Sada, Major Ahmed Khalid Bukamal, and Major Ibrahim Ahmed Al Zoman after they completed their master’s degrees from Naif Arab University for Security Sciences in Saudi Arabia and the Police Academy in Egypt.

During the meeting, Al Hassan congratulated the officers on their academic achievements and praised the subjects addressed in their research.

The studies covered artificial intelligence and its impact on Bahrain’s national security, including challenges and opportunities; the impact of expatriate labour on national security in the Gulf states; the importance and challenges of information integration among

state agencies and its role in maintaining security and stability; and the development of police security services and their contribution to improving security performance in Bahrain.

Al Hassan highlighted the officers’ academic excellence, saying it reflects the Ministry of Interior’s commitment to encouraging its personnel to pursue higher education and develop their specialised knowledge and expertise.

Prosecution vows to enforce Safaqt judgments

The Criminal Enforcement Prosecution has reaffirmed its commitment to enforcing final court judgments and supporting victims in recovering their financial rights within the limits of the law, including those affected by the “Safaqt” case.

The Head of the Criminal Enforcement Prosecution said the Public Prosecution’s role continues after a criminal judgment is issued, covering the enforcement of custodial sentences, fines and court orders concerning the return or confiscation of funds.

He said the Safaqt case demonstrated the prosecution’s

work throughout the judicial process, including investigating the case, questioning defendants, hearing witnesses and victims, tracing and preserving funds, examining related transactions and appointing a director to manage the funds before the case was referred to trial.

The prosecution also followed the case through different stages of litigation and exercised its right to appeal where legal grounds existed until the judgments became final and enforceable.

Following the final judgments, the Criminal Enforcement Prosecution began enforcement procedures, including implementing prison sentences and taking measures concerning fines and

orders to confiscate and return funds.

The prosecution said a civil enforcement file was opened before the Civil Enforcement Court to begin the procedures related to the financial orders.

Victims who have been awarded compensation or whose funds were ordered to be returned may approach the Civil Enforcement Court themselves or through their lawyers to pursue recovery, in accordance with the procedures prescribed by law.

The prosecution also confirmed its readiness to cooperate with lawyers representing affected parties by providing copies of the criminal judgments, subject to applicable legal requirements.

Ithmaar Bank Reports Resilient Half-Year Performance

Ithmaar Bank B.S.C. (Closed), a Bahrain-based Islamic retail bank, reported profits for the first half of 2026 as it announced its financial results for the six-month period ended 30 June 2026.

The announcement, by Ithmaar Bank Chairman His Royal Highness Prince Amr Al Faisal, follows the review and approval of the Board of Directors of the Bank's consolidated financial results.

The results show a net profit attributable to equity holders of the Bank for the three-month period ended 30 June 2026 of BD0.8 million, compared to the net profit of BD1.47 million reported for the same period in 2025. Total net profit for the three-month period ended 30 June 2026 was BD2.7 million, compared to BD3.33 million reported for the same period in 2025. The decrease is primarily attributable to lower benchmark rates impacting spreads generated by the Bank's overseas operations.

The results also show a net

profit attributable to equity holders for the six-month period ended 30 June 2026 of BD2.2 million, compared to a net profit of BD2.80 million reported for the same period in 2025. Total net profit for the six-month period ended 30 June 2026 was BD6.4 million, compared to BD7.10 million reported for the first half of 2025.

“On behalf of Ithmaar

Bank's Board of Directors, I am pleased to report that the Bank continued to deliver stable profitability during the first half of 2026 despite a lower benchmark rate environment and the challenging market conditions,” said HRH Prince Amr. “The results reflect the resilience of the Bank's business model and the continued strength of its core Islamic

BD79.4m in Government Contracts Awarded

BD79.4 million in government contracts was awarded across Bahrain in June, with 121 tenders covering new deals, renewals and change orders, figures published in the Official Gazette show.

Bapco Upstream took the largest share by value, winning four tenders worth BD14.8m. The Electricity and Water Authority issued more awards than any other public body, with 18 contracts worth BD13.9m, while eight public tenders in the oil sector came to almost BD9.98m. The Supreme Council of Health awarded four tenders worth BD748m, while the Urban Planning and Development Authority had one contract valued at BD4.14m.

Gulf Air Group followed with two awards worth BD3.85m. Al Dana Amphitheatre had one tender worth BD3.5m, while the Industry and Commerce Ministry awarded three worth BD3.2m.

The Works Ministry was among the busiest bodies, handing out 13 contracts worth BD2.89m. Two tenders from the Finance and National Economy Ministry came to BD1.9m, while the Information and eGovernment Authority awarded three worth BD1.78m. The National Bureau for Revenue issued one contract worth BD1.49m. Bahrain International Circuit awarded seven tenders worth BD1.39m, and the Bahrain Tourism and Exhibitions Authority five worth BD1.34m. The Housing and Urban Planning Ministry had one award worth BD1.26m, while five tenders from the Municipalities Affairs and Agriculture Ministry came to BD1.16m.

Further down the table, the General Sports Authority awarded a contract worth BD998,100 and Gulf Air three worth BD981,900. Bapco Refining issued two awards worth BD728,200.

The Foreign Affairs Ministry had one tender worth BD374,500. The Social Insurance Organisation awarded four worth BD354,200, while Bapco Gas issued three worth BD350,000.

Two contracts from the Transportation and Telecommunications Ministry came to BD271,000. The General Poultry Company awarded one worth BD256,300 and Bahrain Airport Company one worth BD232,300.

The Bahrain Chamber for Dispute Resolution and Eskan Bank each had a BD198,000 award. The Youth Affairs Ministry issued one worth BD179,300, while the Telecommunications Regulatory Authority had two worth BD167,100.

The Institute of Public Administration awarded a BD150,000 tender and the Labour Market Regulatory Authority two worth BD123,200. At the lower end of the list, the Civil Service Bureau had awards worth BD72,000, the Health Ministry BD67,800, Primary Healthcare Centres BD58,200, Bahrain Polytechnic BD51,800 and the Education Ministry BD49,800.

The Council of Representatives recorded BD39,000, Bahrain Bourse BD17,500, the Interior Ministry BD17,200 and Bahrain Real Estate Investment Company, Edamah, BD10,300.

44 lives lost after ferry capsizes on Zimbabwe's Lake Kariba

At least 44 people drowned after an overcrowded ferry capsized on Zimbabwe's Lake Kariba, police said Wednesday, releasing an updated toll a day after the disaster.

A witness told AFP soon after the government ferry sank in rough weather on Tuesday that bodies could be seen in the water as rescuers tried to reach the vessel.

It was carrying 114 adult passengers, five crew members and an unspecified number of children when it went down, the civil protection unit (CPU) said.

The Rural Infrastructure Development Agency (RIDA) vessel -- which ferries people between the northern town of Kariba and several islands and fishing villages -- had the capacity for 90 people, it said.

The unit said initially that 77 people were rescued and 15 bodies retrieved.

The Zimbabwe Republic Police updated the toll lat-

er Wednesday, saying on X: "The ZRP informs the public that the death toll in the Kariba RIDA boat accident is now 44."

It is one of the worst recorded passenger boat disasters on the lake, which is on the border with Zambia and more than 300 kilometres (185 miles) northeast of the capital, Harare.

It is the world's largest man-made lake by volume.

Two funeral parlours were engaged to collect the bodies, the CPU said, as the search continued for any unaccounted people.

The witness, Maxton Kanhema, told AFP that the boat left in the morning in bad weather and may have been hit by a wave, causing its engines to switch off.

"When we were in the waters, then you could see a distress sign and then boats that were close by responded," Kanhema, who was on a small boat which attended the scene o

Pakistan interior minister in Iran to discuss regional security

Pakistan's interior minister is visiting Iran to discuss regional security, stability and other developments, the Pakistani foreign office said Wednesday, as Islamabad tries to mediate a resolution to the Middle East

war.

Mohsin Naqvi is known to be close to the powerful head of the Pakistani army, Asim Munir. Iranian state news agency IRNA reported late Tuesday that Naqvi met with Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian, Foreign Minis-

ter Abbas Araghchi and Interior Minister Eskandar Momeni.

He is discussing bilateral relations, security, regional security and stability, and constructive engagement amongst the parties in the region and regional developments," Pakistani foreign min-

istry spokesman Tahir Andrabi said in Islamabad.

The Iranian government's website said Naqvi conveyed to Pezeshkian "a message from the Pakistani prime minister and the chief of the army", without specifying its content.

Israel seeking to 'remove Palestine from world's agenda': Erdogan

AFP | Istanbul, Turkey

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan yesterday accused the Israeli government of Benjamin Netanyahu of seeking to "remove Palestine" from the world's agenda.

"The aim of the Netanyahu government is to remove Palestine from the common agenda of humanity by profiting from chaos and new conflicts in the region," Erdogan said at a joint



news conference with his Palestinian counterpart Mahmoud

Abbas.

"No matter what they do, they

will not succeed.

The Palestinian cause will continue to grow in people's hearts as they try to destroy it," he said, vowing Turkey would fight for the establishment of a Palestinian state.

Abbas arrived in Ankara on Tuesday accompanied by his diplomatic advisor Majdi Khalidi, intelligence chief Majed Faraj and senior Palestinian official Ziad Abu Amr.

Skies darken as solar eclipse heads south from Arctic to Spain

One of nature's greatest spectacles -- a rare total solar eclipse -- cast its shadow yesterday, briefly turning day into night in Russia's remote Arctic north and western Iceland before heading towards mainland Europe.

The Moon first blotted out the Sun at the northernmost tip of mainland Russia at about 1700 GMT, leaving only the shimmering glow of its outer corona.

It raced south through parts of Greenland before total darkness fell over Keflavik, some 50 kilometres (30 miles) southwest of Iceland's capital, Reykjavik at 1747 GMT.

Reykjavik has not seen a total solar eclipse since 1433.

It was next due to hit mainland Europe, which has not experienced the dramatic natural phenomenon in 20 years, arcing diagonally in a narrow path from the northwestern Atlantic coast of Spain to the Mediterranean Sea in the south, where it is expected to fade at about 1830 GMT.

Spain has not witnessed a total solar eclipse in more than a century.

"It's the first time and it's the last time, the only time I'm going to see an eclipse," Yenny Guevera, a 50-year-old Peruvian living in France, told AFP excitedly in

Burgos, northwest Spain.

"I like painting and I really

like light," said Mercedes Bua, a 51-year-old engineer awaiting

the eclipse's passage in a park in Colmenar Viejo, some 30 kilometres (19 miles) north of Madrid.

"So I find it interesting to see how it's going to look."

Supplies of special viewing glasses were in high demand, with huge crowds turning out to watch a partial eclipse across Europe, with the event also visible in Canada, the northern United States and northwest Africa.

The partial eclipse began in parts of northern Spain shortly after 1730 GMT, prompting gasps from waiting crowds and applause from South Korean tourists in a field in Lodoso, near Burgos, an AFP reporter said.

"It's starting! It's starting!" said a group of young people in Colmenar Viejo, in the Madrid region. "How wonderful!" said one woman in the crowd.

Spain in total darkness

A large part of Spain switched from daylight into total darkness Wednesday as the Moon covered the Sun, as thousands of spectators across the country looked on.

The total eclipse lasted less than two minutes in Lodoso, near Burgos, to the delight of thousands of people observing the phenomenon using special spectacles for safety, an AFP journalist at the scene said.

Turkish F-16 crashes after pilot ejects safely

An F-16 fighter jet crashed during a training exercise in northwestern Turkey on Wednesday but no-one was hurt, the pilot ejecting to safety, the defence ministry said.

"An F-16 aircraft belonging to our air force was involved in an accident during a training flight in Yalova, and our pilot survived by ejecting," a statement said, pledging a thorough investigation.

Yalova lies southeast of Istanbul on the shores of the Sea of Marmara.

CCTV footage broadcast by IHA news agency showed a plane hurtling through the air at a very low altitude before disappearing behind some trees, sending up a cloud of thick black smoke as it crashed.

According to the private NTV channel, the plane crashed near an air base, with several teams of rescuers dispatched to the scene. It said the pilot

had been taken to hospital.

Six months ago, another Turkish F-16 fighter jet crashed, killing the pilot, shortly after takeoff during an alert-response mission near the Bulgarian border.

In November, Turkey suspended flights by its C-130 cargo planes after one crashed in Georgia while returning from Azerbaijan, killing all 20 on board.



India's Tata Sons chairman says he is stepping down

Tata Sons chairman N. Chandrasekaran said yesterday he would not seek reappointment when his term ends next year, deepening a leadership crisis at India's largest conglomerate.



Tata Sons is the single largest shareholder in firms including IT giant Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) and Tata Motors, which owns British luxury car maker Jaguar Land Rover.

Chandrasekaran, 63, said he had informed the board that

he would step down when his tenure ends early next year, after directors failed to reach a decision on his future.

He said a decision on the new leadership was needed as several major projects were at critical stages.

China's C919 jet makes first international commercial flight

AFP | Beijing, China

China's homegrown C919 jet completed its first international commercial flight on Wednesday, a symbolic step towards Beijing's goal of challenging the decades-long aerospace dominance of Boeing



and Airbus. The narrow-body jet has been billed as a potential competitor to Boeing's 737 or Airbus's A320, though the aircraft has yet to receive approval from American or European regulators.

Beijing hopes the domestically produced plane will reduce China's reliance on foreign

technology and help it gain a foothold in the global market.

The C919 jet, produced by the state-owned Commercial Aircraft Corporation of China (COMAC) and operated by Air China, departed Beijing at 3:17 pm (0717 GMT) on Wednesday.

It landed in Mongolia's capital Ulaanbaatar at 4:58 pm (0858 GMT), according to public flight data.

Trump sued over sale of access to Truth Social posts

Two US media groups yesterday sued President Donald Trump over his move to charge for early access to his often market-moving Truth Social posts.

The lawsuit, filed in New York by The Intercept and Freedom of the Press Foun-

dation, states that the scheme is "extraordinary, corrupt and unconstitutional."

Subscribers to the paid service are supposed to get almost instantaneous access to Trump's messages on Truth Social -- crucial seconds ahead of the general public.

The billionaire US lead-

er often uses the platform to announce huge news, ranging from developments in the Iran war to trade tariffs, all of which can instantly send market values tumbling or soaring.

Early access to the service can cost up to \$100,000 per month, according to yesterday's lawsuit.

Putin threatens retaliatory seizures of European ships

AFP | Moscow, Russia

Russian President Vladimir Putin yesterday threatened to seize ships belonging to European countries in retaliation for plans to sell off cargo seized from Russian "shadow fleet" vessels.

Several European companies have intercepted ships carrying Russian oil in contravention of European sanctions targeting the vital revenue source.

New sanctions passed last month permit EU members to sell the oil or any other cargo seized from the ships.

Moscow has bristled at the moves, with Putin calling it "piracy and banditry".

"We will be forced to respond in kind," the Kremlin chief said while overseeing naval drills in Russia's Far East.

Moscow would act "wherever we ourselves deem necessary and appropriate -- anywhere," he added.

Swedish court documents obtained by AFP earlier in August

showed Stockholm will transfer to Kyiv a seized Russian ship suspected of transporting grain from occupied Ukraine.

Putin was speaking aboard the Russian cruiser Varyag off the island of Sakhalin, where Russia's navy was conducting drills.

The exercises come a week

before joint US-South Korean war games, designed to simulate a possible invasion from North Korea.

Tensions are high in the region amid accusations from Kyiv and Seoul that Pyongyang and Moscow are further intensifying their military cooperation.

More than 30 countries condemn Iran executions

Paris, France

More than 30 nations, including France, the United Kingdom and Canada, on Wednesday condemned Iran's use of capital punishment, saying in a joint statement the Islamic republic was executing protesters to "silence dissent".

The countries, joined by the European Union's top diplomat, "condemn in the strongest terms the ongoing executions of protesters and use of the death

penalty" by Iran.

"The use of capital punishment to silence dissent, intimidate communities, and punish individuals exercising their

human rights can never be justified," the statement said.

"The people of Iran must be free to exercise their rights to freedom of expression and peaceful assembly without fear."

After the initial 26 countries and the EU foreign policy chief Kaja Kallas, "other countries joined this declaration" bringing the number of signatories up to 32, the French foreign ministry told AFP.

Google unveils finder tag, new AI smartphone features



New York, United States

Introducing a finder tag, an upgraded watch that checks for respiratory problems and the latest artificial intelligence superpowers in smartphones, Google unveiled its newest Pixel offerings.

The tech giant has organized a press launch event in New York to present the Pixel Tag, a rival to the AirTag, a tracking device commercialized by Apple since 2021.

The tracking device, which sells for \$29.99 (34.99 euros) can be connected to Android devices and used to locate valuables such as a wallet or luggage.

The new gadget can detect, for example, if keys fall behind a sofa.

"Yeah, it has that level of accuracy," Google product manager Spencer Boone said of such a scenario.

The tech giant is also unveiling Pixel Watch 5, whose functions include monitoring the number of subway stops remaining to destination and pausing an audiobook or

podcast at the exact moment when a listener dozes off.

Earlier Pixel Watch versions could call an ambulance after detecting signs of cardiac trouble. The new version extends this capacity to respiratory problems if someone isn't getting enough oxygen.

The new Pixel 11 incorporates AI advances from Google Gemini and has been "purpose-built to do more for you with less from you," said Google product leader Justin Savich.

The system could automatically respond to a text message asking about when your flight arrives, or place a restaurant reservation based on a conversation. Another function is to translate a jumble of oral commands into a clear and concise text message.

The devices can be ordered starting Wednesday and will be in stores from August 20.

The Pixel 11 smartphone begins at \$899 (999 euros) and is priced up to \$1,899 (1,999 euros). The pixel watch begins at \$399 (419 euros).

Former Chinese premier Zhu Rongji dies aged 97

Former Chinese premier Zhu Rongji, whose market reforms helped drive the country's extraordinary economic rise, died Wednesday at the age of 97.

Zhu became premier in 1998 and swiftly lived up to his reputation as a hard-hitting free marketeer.

Among his best-known reforms were a broad programme to privatise unprofitable state-owned enterprises, the privatisation of urban housing and the promotion of home ownership.

He passed away from illness in Beijing late Wednesday morning "after medical treatment failed to save him", state news agency Xinhua said.

"The life of comrade Zhu Rongji was a life of revolution, a life of struggle, a life of glory," an obituary jointly issued by China's top political bodies said, according to Xinhua.

"It was a life dedicated wholeheartedly to serving the people, one given to the communist cause. His pass-

ing is a major loss for the Party and the country."

Reforms under Zhu sparked a boom in real estate and construction, which would soar to become a quarter of China's economy before a crippling debt crisis struck in 2020.

His leadership was credited with helping China avoid the worst of the 1997 Asian financial crisis, bucking a global trend.

And he led negotiations for China's accession to the World Trade Organization in 2001 -- a move seen as consolidating the country's transformation from an isolated economy under Mao Zedong to the marketplace of the world.

Al Salam Bank Sustains Its Growth Momentum as Net Profit Rises 24% in H1 2026

Al Salam Bank (Bahrain Bourse trading code “SALAM”, Dubai Financial Market trading code “SALAM_BAH”) announced its highest semi-annual net profit for the six-month period ended 30 June 2026. Building on the strong momentum achieved in 2025, this record performance reflects the collective strength of the group’s banking, asset management, and takaful operations, and the continued effectiveness of a strategy built on disciplined execution and long-term value creation.

The group’s financial performance in H1 2026 benefited from proactive deployment into fixed income, prudent asset and liability management, and improved operational efficiency. Operating income rose by 10.6% to USD 329.6 million, up from USD 298.1 million in H1

2025, while net profit attributable to owners of the bank increased by 23.8% to USD 122.8 million, compared to USD 99.1 million in the corresponding period. Correspondingly, earnings per share grew by 25.0% to 3.45 US cents, from 2.76 US cents in H1 2025.

This translated into further improvement across key profitability metrics, with return on average equity (ROAE) improving to 17.5% from 16.9% and return on average assets (ROAA) reaching 1.3%, up from 1.1%, while the consolidated cost-to-income ratio decreased to 44.1% from 45.2%, reflecting the success of group-wide optimization initiatives in driving greater operational efficiency.

Balance sheet growth momentum continued as total assets increased by 6.8% to USD 22.82 billion as of 30 June 2026, up from USD 21.36 billion at year-end 2025. Financing

assets were broadly unchanged at USD 10.79 billion, whereas the Sukuk portfolio grew by 14.1% to USD 5.85 billion, reflecting deliberate portfolio positioning and asset allocation in line with the group’s asset-liability management priorities and prevailing market conditions. Customer deposits rose by 3.2% to USD 15.00 bil-

lion, further strengthening the funding base and evidencing sustained client confidence. Total equity grew by 1.5% to USD 2.02 billion, and equity attributable to owners of the bank increased by 2.0% to USD 1.25 billion. With a consolidated capital adequacy ratio of 23.6% as of 30 June 2026, the group retained strong cap-

ital buffers and continued its prudent approach to capital management.

Commenting on the results, His Excellency Shaikh Khalid bin Mustahail Al Mashani, Chairman of Al Salam Bank, said: “Our ability to deliver consistent and growing profitability in an increasingly complex and volatile operating environment is a direct reflection of the structural resilience we have embedded into the group over the years. The meeting reviewed areas of mutual interest and opportunities to develop joint initiatives and programmes, particularly in the municipal and agricultural sectors.

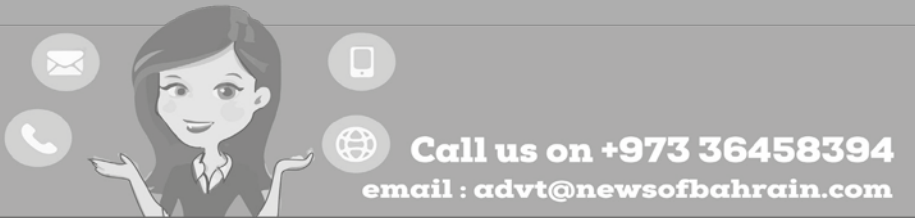
Al Mubarak stressed the ministry’s commitment to supporting agricultural en-

Bahrain chairs GCC justice officials meeting on international cooperation



Bahrain chaired the fourth 2026 meeting of officials responsible for international cooperation and international relations at the justice ministries of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) member states.

The meeting was chaired by Counsellor Dr. Mohammed Ahmed Mujbil, Assistant Undersecretary for State Cases and International Cooperation at Bahrain's Ministry of Justice, Islamic Affairs and Waqf, as part of Bahrain's presidency of the GCC's 46th session.

Bahrain's delegation included Mohammed Jamal Sultan, Director of the Legislative Affairs and International Cooperation Directorate at the Ministry, along with representatives from the international cooperation departments of the GCC justice ministries.

The meeting focused on

strengthening judicial and legal cooperation and coordination among GCC countries, particularly through a policy aimed at enhancing collaboration between their justice ministries.

The policy seeks to improve coordination and facilitate the exchange of expertise, experience, and best practices in judicial and legal affairs.

Participants also discussed Bahrain's initiative to establish electronic connectivity for judicial notices and notifications, aimed at using digital solutions to enhance and streamline judicial cooperation across the GCC.

The meeting further reviewed draft unified rules for combating information technology crimes, supporting greater coordination among GCC countries in addressing emerging cyber-related offences.

Saudi, Egypt Step Up Regional Security Coordination Amid Iranian Attacks



Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Faisal bin Farhan and Egyptian Foreign Minister Badr Abdelatty discussed regional security and efforts to restore stability during a phone call on Tuesday, as Cairo reaffirmed its support for Gulf states amid continued Iranian attacks.

The two ministers reviewed the latest regional developments and efforts to strengthen security and stability, the Saudi Press Agency reported.

The call came as Abdelatty separately met Gulf Cooperation Council Secretary-General Jasem Al-Budaiwi in El-Alamein. The two officials stressed the need to address regional disputes through diplomacy and constructive dialogue.

Abdelatty reaffirmed Egypt's solidarity with GCC member states and condemned Iranian attacks targeting their territories. He stressed that the security of the Gulf states is an integral part of Egypt's national security, according to a GCC statement.

Al-Budaiwi welcomed Egypt's support for the Gulf states and thanked Cairo for its position amid the ongoing attacks. Both officials stressed the importance of supporting regional and international efforts to contain tensions and restore stability.

Egypt has repeatedly con-

demned attacks against Gulf countries while calling for diplomatic efforts to prevent the conflict from spreading further.

Saudi Arabia has also intensified consultations with regional partners. On Monday, Prince Faisal discussed de-escalation efforts with Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan, with both sides stressing the importance of protecting freedom of navigation and the security of waterways in the Arabian Gulf and Red Sea.

Riyadh is also leading a new multinational maritime coalition focused on protecting commercial shipping, supply chains and energy flows across the Red Sea, Bab Al-Mandab Strait and Gulf of Aden.

Saudi Arabia has maintained that diplomacy must remain central to resolving the wider regional crisis while emphasizing its right to defend its territory, citizens and critical infrastructure.

During Tuesday's meeting, Abdelatty and Al-Budaiwi also reviewed Egypt-GCC relations, including the joint cooperation plan for 2024-2028 and initiatives to strengthen economic and investment ties.

The two sides reaffirmed their commitment to expanding cooperation between Egypt and the six GCC states and supporting efforts to restore security and stability across the region.

Hazlewood gets Australia nod ahead of Boland for Bangladesh Test

Australia yesterday opted for Josh Hazlewood ahead of fellow quick Scott Boland for the first Test against Bangladesh in Darwin, while veteran spinner Nathan Lyon returned after a long-term injury.

An injured Hazlewood missed the entire home Ashes series against England in 2025/26, with warhorse Boland playing all five Tests in his place.

But despite the 37-year-old's heroics it was not enough to keep out a fit-again Hazlewood who was reunited for the first time in more than a year with long-time pace partners Pat Cummins and Mitchell Starc.

"They're both pretty class, aren't they?" skipper Cummins told reporters of Hazlewood and Boland in naming Australia's team.

"We were pretty certain we wanted 'Lyono' in the side, so (it came down to) working out what the make-up of the quicks were.

"It's always a pretty tight call. It's one of those ones where there's not much you can say to Scotty other than obviously there's a lot of cricket coming up."

The Test starting Thursday is the first of two against Bangladesh and kicks off a run of potentially 21 in 12 months for the world's top-ranked side, who have not played a red-ball game since January.

Lyon returns after hamstringing surgery curtailed his part in Australia's dominant 4-1 home Ashes win, a series where a back issue restricted Cummins to just one Test.

Under-pressure Cameron Green held his spot and will come in at five with fellow all-rounder Beau Webster also in the side at seven, split by wicketkeeper Alex Carey.

Jake Weatherald will open the batting alongside Travis Head with Marnus Labuschagne at three and Steve Smith at four.

Josh Inglis was the other player from the initial squad not to make the XI.

The clash at Marrara Oval will be only the third Test ever in tropical Darwin and the first since Sri Lanka visited in July 2004.

The series moves to Harrup Park in Mackay next week, which will host its maiden Test.

Roma signs Argentina's Molina from Atletico Madrid

Molina could make his debut when Roma, which is back in the Champions League after a seven-year hiatus, plays Fiorentina in its Serie A opener on August 24.

Defending champ Shelton rolls into Montreal semis

Ben Shelton took another step toward defending his ATP Montreal Masters title with a 6-3, 6-1 quarter-finals hammering of Jakub Mensik for his 10th straight victory in Canada.

World number 10 Shelton, the last top-10 player in the field, was never challenged by the Czech in advancing to a semi-final against fellow American Learner Tien, who ousted Spain's Daniel Merida 6-3, 6-2 in 72 minutes.

"It was a great performance for me, super happy with that and to be in the semis again," Shelton said.

Spanish teen Rafael Jodar booked a semi-final spot in only his fifth ATP Masters 1000 event by holding off France's Arthur Fils 7-6 (7/5), 6-3.

The 19-year-old will face the oldest remaining player when he plays 25-year-old American Brandon Nakashima in a battle for a place in Thursday's final.

Nakashima reached his breakthrough Masters semi in 77 minutes as he imposed his game on Luciano Darderi 6-2, 6-3, setting up three match points with his 11th ace as winning as the Italian missed on a drop shot.

Shelton was on fire in his 72-minute thrashing of Mensik, the American producing 18 winners and only three unforced errors.

Fils, back after injury, saved three match points in the final game before Jodar lanced a winner to the empty court after an hour and three-quarters.

"I played a very high level today against a tough player like Arthur," Jodar said. "I had to give my best to win this match."

Nakashima, who won his fifth quarter-final of the season, credited his serve with the win.

"My serve was super important. It got me out of some tough holes," Nakashima said.

Rybakina ousts Osaka to book Toronto semi-final against Gauff

World number two Elena Rybakina came from a set down to defeat four-time Grand Slam winner Naomi Osaka and reach the WTA Toronto Masters semi-finals, where she will face fourth-ranked Coco Gauff.

Rybakina, the reigning Australian Open champion from Kazakhstan, fired 13 aces in a 4-6, 7-6 (7/5), 6-4 victory.

Grieving Argentine icon Messi **unsure** about playing on 'much longer'

Messi recalls his father's influence throughout his remarkable career and World Cup journey

Argentina superstar and inspiration behind his country's 2022 World Cup victory Lionel Messi said yesterday he has "serious doubts" about continuing to play football for "much longer" after the death of his father Jorge Messi.

"I don't know what I'll do without you, I don't know how to go on. I just played football, and now I have serious doubts about continuing to do so for much longer," Messi, 39, wrote in a message on social media. His father, who was also his agent, died last week aged 68.

In the message, Messi, whose contract with Major League Soccer outfit Inter Miami runs till the end of the 2028 season, reflected on the final months of his father's life, which coincided with the 2026 World Cup.

Jorge Messi's absence from the World Cup in June had already attracted attention.

"You kept asking me to play in one last World Cup, yet just days before it started, your condition took a turn for the worse. It was the first time you wouldn't be there for a tournament," wrote Messi, who returned to the United States on Tuesday night following his father's funeral on Sunday.

"I kept telling you we would reach the final so you could make the trip.

"Every time a match ended I

waited for and missed your message. That's when I realized the situation was really bad.

"We made it to the final, but you couldn't be there. I wanted to win it to bring it to you and show you a new one. I couldn't, my legs just gave out.

"This time I tried to push past my physical limits, but I couldn't. I never felt right," Messi said in his first comments after the 1-0

loss to Spain in the final in New Jersey.

Immediately after the World Cup final defeat against Spain, Messi returned to spend a few days with his family in Rosario, 340 km north of Buenos Aires.

Messi recalled that he noticed his father had not been able to enjoy the World Cup.

"When I arrived, you thought we had lost the final on penalties. We couldn't talk about anything that had happened. You couldn't enjoy any

of it," he said.

"We didn't become champions, but you have no idea how much we enjoyed every match. Once again, you were right: I had to be there and play."

'Father, friend and agent'

Competing in his sixth World Cup, Messi scored eight goals as he steered his country to the final.

After bursting into tears after scoring against Algeria in a group match, Messi had admitted to dealing with "a situation outside of sports".

On Sunday, the eight-time Ballon d'Or winner bid farewell to his father during a private ceremony with close family and a few Argentina teammates in the town of Perez, adjacent to Rosario.

The cause of death was not disclosed, but local media reported that Jorge Messi had been suffering from cancer.

Messi highlighted his father's pivotal role in his life and career: "You were a father, a friend, and an agent. You were always exactly who you needed to be in every moment, and you never put a foot wrong."

Jorge was his first coach who left everything behind to accompany him in 2000 when Barcelona invited the young prodigy, then aged 13, to Catalonia to continue treatment for a growth hormone deficiency while playing for the club's youth teams.

Jorge left behind his job in Argentina, his wife, and his three other children to settle in Spain with Lionel.

His father was later the agent who negotiated contracts on his behalf, from Barcelona to Paris Saint-Germain and Inter Miami.

"You were always like that, right from when I was little. You'd take me to every training session as soon as you got home from work," Messi recalled.

"You never missed a single match. You suffered while watching me play, yet you enjoyed it too -- even though you never lavished me with praise.

"Rest in peace, and watch over us from above just as you did down here. Thank you for everything."

Bangladesh get Das fitness boost for daunting Australia task

Bangladesh captain Najmul Hossain Shanto yesterday declared wicketkeeper Litton Das "100 percent fit" for the first Test against Australia while suggesting the tourists could play two spinners.

Experienced wicketkeeper-batsman Das had been sidelined since June with a left calf injury and was initially ruled out of the opening Test of the two-match series.

But he was a late addition to the squad and is set to line up in Darwin on Thursday in a big boost to a side that lost their only warm-up game by an innings and 38 runs.

"Litton gives us batting depth," Shanto told reporters. "He is consistent. We are hopeful of our batting unit doing well in the Test match."

The series marks Bangladesh's first Test tour of Australia in 23 years, with their last visit in 2003.

They have their work cut out against a full-strength side ranked one in the world and buoyed by the return from injury of bowling heavyweights Pat Cummins, Josh Hazlewood and Nathan Lyon.

While Shanto confirmed the inclusion of Das, he did not confirm the remainder of the starting side, wanting a last look at the wicket before deciding.

Sri Lanka's Kusal Mendis out of India Tests with injury

Sri Lanka wicketkeeper Kusal Mendis has been ruled out of two Tests against India due to injury as selectors named the squad for the home series yesterday.

Wicketkeeper-batter Niroshan Dickwella, who could play his first Test in over three years, makes the 16-member squad in place of Mendis.

The opening match will be played at the Galle International

Stadium from August 15. The second will begin on August 23 at Colombo's Sinhalese Sports Club.

Dickwella, 33, a left-hand batter, has not played a Test since March 2023 after dis-

ciplinary action against him.

Mendis injured his hamstring in a domestic game.

Pathum Nissanka was unavailable for selection as he recovers from a wrist injury.

Man City sign Argentina goalkeeper Rulli from Marseille

Manchester City have signed Argentina international goalkeeper Geronimo Rulli from Marseille on a two-year deal, both clubs announced yesterday.

The 34-year-old will serve as City's number-two goalkeeper behind Italian Gianluigi Donnarumma.

"This is an amazing opportunity for me and one I had to grasp," said Rulli, who returns for a second spell at City having spent the 2016/17 season at the Etihad without making a first team appearance.

"When the chance to join Manchester City comes along you have to go for it.

"Everyone knows what an impressive club this is.

"City's success over a long time has been impressive. Everyone I have spoken to about City said I had to join

them because they are a club with incredibly high standards.

"My job now is to train hard, get to know the players and staff and do everything I can to reach my best level."

Rulli has won eight caps for Argentina and was in the squad that won the 2022 World Cup and 2024 Copa America and reached last month's World Cup final in which they lost to Spain.

He previously played for European clubs including Real Sociedad, Villarreal, Montpellier and Ajax.

He famously scored a penalty in Villarreal's 2021 Europa League final victory over Manchester United, before denying opposite number David de Gea to claim the trophy 11-10 in the shootout.

Bahrain Beat Kuwait for Third Straight Win

Bahrain's U17 volleyball team made it three wins from three without dropping a set after beating Kuwait 3-0 on Wednesday in the second Arab Men's U17 Volleyball Championship in Bahrain. The hosts won 25-14, 35-33, 25-10 at the Isa bin Rashid Volleyball Hall in Riffa, taking their tally to nine sets won and none lost across their opening three matches.

Bahrain took charge early and closed out the first set 25-14, but Kuwait hit back with a far stronger challenge in the second. The set stretched deep beyond 25 points before Bahrain held their nerve to take it 35-33. Kuwait's resistance then faded. Bahrain regained full control in the third and raced to a 25-10 win to seal another straight-sets victory.

Bahrain player Sayed Hassan Al Abbar said the team had imposed itself early before suffering a dip in the second set.

'Thank God for the win, and hard luck to Kuwait,' he said after the match. 'We put them under pressure in the first set and won it by a good margin. We had a drop in the second,

but thankfully we came back at the end.

'In the third set we put pressure on them from the start and won it comfortably. We thank all the players and the staff. We are one team.'

Al Abbar also called on Bahrain supporters to turn out for

the side's remaining matches, saying: 'We hope to see them there.'

Team manager Abdullah Al Mahroos said Bahrain had expected a difficult contest and praised the players for keeping calm when Kuwait threatened to level the match.

'It was a difficult match, like every match, and we expected this kind of scenario,' he said. 'We won the first set by a good margin, but we started the second shakily and they put us under pressure from the first ball. 'We managed to get back into the set and kept our composure.

We kept telling the players to stay focused, and thankfully we were able to finish the match.'

Al Mahroos said the third set showed what Bahrain could do once their focus returned, but warned that lapses could prove costly later in the championship.

'If we want to compete and become champions, we have to keep our concentration and cannot allow ourselves to go cold at any point in a match,' he said.

He added that all 14 players in the squad had been prepared to step in when needed, describing Bahrain as 'one team' rather than a side dependent on a small group of starters.

The result follows Bahrain's 3-0 wins over Jordan and Algeria earlier in the championship and keeps Yousuf Khalifa's side among the leading teams in the six-nation competition.

Bahrain opened their campaign by beating Jordan 25-14, 25-18, 25-9 before seeing off Algeria 25-13, 25-14, 25-19.

Kuwait, meanwhile, came into Wednesday's match after losing 3-0 to Egypt and then falling 3-2 to Saudi Arabia.

The championship brings together Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, Egypt, Kuwait, Jordan and Algeria in a single round-robin phase, with the leading sides moving on to the semi-finals.

Bahrain are due to face Saudi Arabia on Friday before meeting Egypt on Sunday in their final two matches of the opening phase.

Tough Test Awaits Bahrain in Fukuoka

Bahrain have been drawn alongside hosts Japan, Australia and China in Group A of the 2026 Asian Men's Volleyball Cup, which will be held in Fukuoka from September 4 to 13.

The draw hands Bahrain a demanding opening stage, with Japan and Australia among the continent's established sides and China adding further weight to the group.

The tournament will give Bahrain another chance to test themselves against leading Asian opposition after a run of continental appearances that has strengthened their standing in recent years.

The tournament will run for 10 days in Fukuoka, bringing together 12 teams from across Asia.

England captain Root tells players to be 'adults' as he ditches curfew

Joe Root said yesterday there would be no curfew in place during his second spell as England Test captain.

Root will lead the England at his Headingley home ground on August 19 in their series opener against Pakistan for their first Test since former skipper Ben Stokes retired from international cricket and Brendon McCullum was sacked as red-ball coach.

McCullum, who remains in charge of England's white-ball teams, lost his job after a 2-1 home series loss to New Zealand in June, which followed a disastrous Ashes campaign in Australia.

One of the major controversies at the end of the 'Bazball' era was an incident at a London nightclub in June where Stokes and Gus Atkinson were out past a midnight curfew.

The pair missed the second Test against New Zealand at the Oval, with Root taking temporary charge of the team.

England managing director Rob Key established the curfew, which came about after white-ball captain Harry Brook was fined for an altercation with a bouncer in New Zealand last November.

But Root told Sky Sports cricket podcast: "There's not going to be a curfew. I don't think this needs to be a big deal, to be honest.

"My view on curfews is I don't think they work, and if you want guys to take responsibility on the field they've got to be able to feel they can be grown adults off it and make good strong decisions off it.

"That's for us as a team to manage well, and self-police well, for me and 'Flem' (new red-ball coach Stephen Fleming) to manage well in many ways but ultimately you're grown adults, you know what it takes to play for England, you know what your responsibilities are off the field and we need to make sure we don't find ourselves with any little situations off the field."
