Pope visit is like a 'dream come true'

Bishop Hinder commends Bahrain as 'model for peaceful co-existence' of different faiths

Bahrain is a model for the peaceful coexistence of the many different faiths who live and work side by side, thanks to the Kingdom's religious freedom and openness to a pluralistic world.

This was according to a leading bishop in an interview with the Crux, well-known for its coverage of the Vatican and the Catholic Church.

"For many of the Catholics in Bahrain, who have been eagerly awaiting this visit since the King of Bahrain personally invited the Pope, this is like a dream come true," Bishop Paul Hinder, the Apostolic Administrator for the Vicariate Apostolic of Northern Arabia, said ahead of the historic visit by Pope Francis to Bahrain upon an invitation from His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa.

Highlighting Bahrain's unique religious composition and tolerance, Bishop Hinder noted: "The Kingdom has been very



welcoming to the expatriate Christian community and provides a climate of openness and tolerance for people of different beliefs to practise their faith. "Bahrain is a vibrant community with a rich cultural mix – a model for peaceful co-existence of the many different faiths who live and work side by side in the island nation."

Some 477 pilot whales have died after stranding themselves on two remote New Zealand beaches over recent days, officials say.

Electoral slogans fill air as hopefuls woo voters

Civic, social and economic issues become topics of electoral debate

From electricity and water bills to unemployment and traffic jams, all civic issues are finding a place in the electoral slogans raised by the candidates as they attempt to woo the voters since the filing of nominations.

Woman candidates have added "empowerment of women" as well to the agenda.

Manal Ibrahim, who is contesting from the eighth constituency of Southern Governorate Municipal Council, said she intends the democratic empowerment of Bahraini women by contesting in polls. "The Southern Governorate Municipal Council has maximum male members and I want to make a difference by contesting in polls."

Among the 561 candidates contesting in 40 parliamentary and 30 municipal council seats, 107 are women, creating a mile-

stone in the empowerment of women within the democratic process.

Candidate Ibrahim Al Naffi has an electoral agenda that calls for setting up more colleges catering to Bahraini students. He wants these colleges to be affiliated to the University of Bahrain and should offer courses related to agriculture and petroleum engineering.

Candidate Ahmed Al Salloum

is ambitious in legislating laws that exclusively reserve many jobs for Bahrainis. He also seeks more projects under the public housing schemes apart from suggesting amendments to the Commercial Registration laws.

Former Parliament member Ali Yaqoub Al Mugla said he is running for the polls to work on behalf of the citizens supporting their needs. He also wants to contribute towards His Majes-

ty's welfare projects that are vital to the progress of the Kingdom.

Meanwhile, many poll hopefuls are waiting to hear on their appeals after their nominations were rejected by the electoral committee over criminal accusations, address issues, absence of name in the voters' list as well as lack of Arabic proficiency.

Among the prominent citizens whose candidacies were rejected was Hassan Rajab and Hamid Samir, who filed the nomination to represent the Second Electoral Constituency of the Capital Governorate.

Former lawmaker Ali Shamout's candidature was as well rejected. Saeed Al Sammak, who filed the nomination to represent the Sixth Electoral Constituency in the Capital Governorate, also had his candidature rejected while Isa Rabie's (Eighth Elec-

toral Constituency) nomination was subjected to rejection by the electoral authorities.

Speaking to members of the media earlier, Issa Sami Al Mannai, the Undersecretary for Justice and Islamic Affairs within the Ministry of Justice, Islamic Affairs and Endowments, said potential candidates can file appeals through the national portal bahrain.bh.

"The electronic appeals service that can be found in the electoral website will be available round the clock during this specific period and the ministry has issued a set of guidelines for the process."

According to the law, any potential candidate has the right to appeal the decision by the electoral supervisory committee before higher judicial authorities and a decision will be taken by the higher judicial authority

within seven days of filing the appeal.

The committees must issue their final decisions by October 15, which can be challenged in court no later than October 18, and the court rulings must be issued by October 25.

The final list of candidates will be announced on October 26. The Kingdom will head to the polls on November 12 with a run-off fixed on November 19.

The upcoming visit of 'Vicar of Christ' to the Kingdom is in line with the Vatican's and Pope Francis' aim to seek a 'war-free Middle East', Union of Catholic Asian News reported.

"The Supreme Pontiff was supposed to visit Bahrain as early as 2014 after the first meet-

ing at the Vatican between Pope Francis and King Hamad.

"But the United Arab Emirates visit came first. The Pope signed the Declaration for Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together along with Shaikh Ahmed Al Tayeb in Abu Dhabi on Feb 4, 2019. His Majesty King Hamad has endorsed the Document on Human Fraternity as a major milestone to foster religious harmony," the report said.

The report also praises the Kingdom for "being the greatest nation of tolerance in the whole region and world".

Pope Francis will travel to the Kingdom for a three-day visit in November – an occasion that is expected to attract tens of thousands of Catholics and other followers.

The pontiff, 85, will visit the Arabian Gulf's largest Roman Catholic Church in Awali.

This will be the second visit by the head of the church to the Arabian Gulf after Pope Francis's historic visit to the UAE in 2019.

23 face trial in BD75 million money laundering case

The High Criminal Court has begun hearing a money laundering case worth BD75 million which involves 23 defendants who obtained a BD500 million loan from one of the Gulf countries.

They conducted money laundering operations on the amount

after defrauding the bank and evading installment payments. Among the eight defendants are four British, a Turkish, an American, two Bahrainis, and an Asian, in addition to 15 companies which the suspects used to legalise the money. The defendants were able to get a \$500 million bank loan

while they were in one of the Gulf countries.

They were successful in obtaining the loan after submitting papers and documents claiming their fields of business and investments. They made several transfers of money to various countries abroad and conducted suspicious commercial opera-

tions on the money to conceal the source of the funds and claim their authenticity.

According to investigations, they got the loan and transported \$75 million to Bahrain under the guise of investment, through the acquisition of real estate and land, as well as the formation of multiple fictional firms.

The two Bahrainis, who are brothers, attempted to disguise the source of the money to help the other defendants.

Meanwhile, the court decided to postpone the next session until October 18, 2022 to allow the defendants' lawyers to review the papers of the case and respond.

BD441,000 fine for 20 convicted of trading in work permits

The Labour Market Regulatory Authority (LMRA) declared the issuance of judicial convictions against 20 defendants in cases related to the issuance of work permits for expatriate workers without need for them and trading in work permits.

The total fines amounted to BD441,000, while the investi-

gation is still ongoing across a range of other cases based on the Authority's commitment to implement the directives of His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, to address illegal practices that would affect the competitiveness, fairness, and flexibility of the Bahrain labour market.

The LMRA confirmed that these

convictions were achieved by the efforts of the concerned parties in the Authority, in cooperation with the relevant government agencies in the Ministry of Interior and the General Directorate of Investigations and Criminal Evidence, in addition to the Public Prosecution and the judiciary. LMRA Chief Executive Officer Nouf Abdulrahman Jamsheer stressed the importance of in-

terdepartmental cooperation with various government agencies to address such practices, which have repercussions on the individual and society; and to reinforce strict regulations in authorising the issuance of commercial registrations in the name of quick profits, which will later reflect negatively on the business owners and ultimately on the Bahraini society.

LMRA calls on all expatriate workers to verify legal status

must obtain an official work permit from an employer in the Kingdom before arrival.

It stressed that the law prohibits an expatriate from illegally engaging in employment on a visit visa, and violators will be prosecuted through fines and deportation.

The LMRA stressed the need for expatriate workers to complete all legal procedures related to the work permit, including providing the Authority with biometric data within one month upon entering the Kingdom for the first time.

It also noted the need for expatriates with working permits to work at places indicated in the permit, or in other branches of the same employer that engage in the same activity.

"Bahrain is built on generations of Islamic traditions which are rooted firmly in its culture and tribal heritage. These traditions have been passed down from generation to generation and form the cornerstone of everyday life for Bahraini families," a university source said.

"Bahrainis are friendly people who show tolerance and an open-minded approach to visitors and the residents in their country; but Bahraini culture and values should always be respected.

"The culture and laws in Bahrain are designed to ensure that everyone is respectful of each other regardless of their faith and nationality.

"Holding hands for married couples is tolerated but any public indecency is considered an offence. Open displays of affection are generally not tolerated.

"Bahrainis and residents alike should avoid conduct and behaviour which might be perceived as breaching these norms as it may lead to the authority to take actions against such act," the source added.

Meta's new Quest Pro headset makes debut

Meta Platforms (META.O) unveiled its Quest Pro virtual and mixed reality headset on Tuesday, marking a milestone for Chief Executive Mark Zuckerberg's break into the higher-end market for extended reality computing devices.

The headset will hit shelves on Oct. 25 at a price of \$1,500.

The Quest Pro features several upgrades over Meta's existing Quest 2 headset, which overwhelmingly dominates the consumer virtual reality market.

Most strikingly, it has outward-facing cameras that capture a sort of 3D live-stream of the physical environment around a wearer, enabling mixed reality novelties like the ability to hang a virtual painting on a real-world wall or have a virtual ball bounce off a real table.

The Quest 2, by contrast, offers a more rudimentary grayscale version of this technology, called passthrough.

The Quest Pro feels lighter and slimmer than its predecessors, with thin pancake lenses and a relocated battery that sits at the back of the headset, distributing its weight more evenly while reducing overall bulk.

For fully immersive virtual reality, Meta has added tracking sensors to the Quest Pro that can replicate users' eye movements and facial expressions, creating a sense that avatars are making eye contact.



OPEC cuts 2022, 2023 oil demand growth view as economy slows

● Cuts 2022 demand growth to 2.64 million bpd from 3.1 mln bpd

● Still sees demand topping pre-pandemic level in 2023

● OPEC September output rises 146,000 bpd, led by Saudi


OPEC yesterday cut its 2022 forecast for growth in world oil demand for a fourth time since April and also trimmed next year's figure, citing slowing economies, the resurgence of China's COVID-19 containment measures and high inflation.

Oil demand will increase by 2.64 million barrels per day (bpd) or 2.7% in 2022, the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) said in a monthly report, down 460,000 bpd from the previous forecast.

"The world economy has entered into a time of heightened uncertainty and rising challenges, amid ongoing high inflation levels, monetary tightening by major central banks, high sovereign debt levels in many regions as well as ongoing supply issues," OPEC said in the report.

The lower demand outlook gives additional context for last week's move by OPEC and its allies, known as OPEC+, to make their largest cut in output since 2020 to support the market. The United States criticized the decision.

Oil prices, which have been weakening in response to fears about the economy, turned lower after the report was released, trading below \$94 a barrel.

SUPPLY RISE

OPEC+ has for most of this year been ramping up oil output to unwind record cuts put in place in 2020 after the pandemic slashed demand.

The group's decision for September 2022 called for a 100,000 bpd increase in its output target, of which about 64,000 bpd was meant to come from the 10 participating OPEC countries.

The report showed OPEC output rose by 146,000 bpd to 29.77 million bpd in September, led by Saudi Arabia and Nigeria.

Still, OPEC is pumping far less than called for by the OPEC+ agreement due to under-investment in oilfields by some members.

OPEC expects world demand for its crude to average 29.4 million bpd next year, down 300,000 bpd from last month and implying a surplus of 370,000 bpd should output continue at September's rate and other things remain equal.

Still, the OPEC+ output cut agreed last week runs for all of 2023 and is much larger, at 2 million bpd.

Apple, Samsung to upgrade phone software for Indian 5G rollout by Dec

Apple Inc (AAPL.O) and Samsung Electronics (005930.KS) are among companies who will upgrade software for their 5G-enabled phones in India by December as authorities press mobile phone manufacturers to adopt the high-speed network.

Apple said it would push software upgrades to recent models, including the iPhone 14, 13, 12 and iPhone SE, which, industry sources say, do not yet support the network.

"We are working with our carrier partners in India to bring the best 5G experience to iPhone users as soon as network validation and testing for quality and performance is completed," Apple said in a statement yesterday.

"5G will be enabled via a software update and will start rolling out to iPhone users in December."

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched 5G services on Oct. 1 amid much fanfare, with leading telecom operator Reliance Jio saying it would make the service available in four cities, while rival Bharti Airtel (BRTI.NS) targeted eight cities. A Samsung India spokesperson said the company would roll out updates across all its 5G devices by mid-November.

◆ **Russia's president said**

Europe was to blame for its energy crisis with policies that starved the oil and gas industry of investment and said price caps would make it worse, as EU states tried to forge a deal on ways to contain soaring energy costs. Worries about the security of energy supplies were heightened on Wednesday when a leak in Poland on the Druzhba pipeline from Russia reduced the flow of oil to Germany. Poland said the leak was probably caused by an accident but it came as European Union nations are seeking to wean themselves off a reliance on Russian energy in response to the invasion of Ukraine in February. The Nord Stream gas link to Germany is now out of action after a leak last month that both Russia and the West have blamed on sabotage, without identifying who was behind it.

◆ **Desperate to avoid military** call-up to fight in Ukraine, more than 20 Russians have sailed in yachts down the North Pacific coast to South Korea, but most were refused entry, a South Korean lawmaker said yesterday. There has been an exodus of conscription-age men from Russia since President Vladimir

Putin ordered a partial mobilisation on Sept. 21, but most fled by road, rail and air to Europe and neighbouring former Soviet Union countries, like Georgia, Azerbaijan and Kazakhstan. Arriving aboard four yachts, 23 Russians have reached South Korea since late September, but authorities have granted entry to only two, lawmaker An Ho-young said, citing

coast guard data. The others "were rejected because their purposes were unclear and they did not have sufficient documents," the lawmaker said in a statement.

◆ **A major exhibition** of impressionist art opened yesterday at the Louvre Abu Dhabi, featuring works from masters such as Cezanne, Degas, Manet, Monet, Pissarro and Renoir. Billed as one of the most significant exhibitions on the 19th century art movement ever held outside France, it features

more than 150 works on loan from the Musee d'Orsay in Paris. Claude Monet's "Women in the Garden" is among the masterpieces on show from the movement characterised by rapid dabs and brushstrokes that explore the transient effects of light and colour. "Impressionism: Pathways to Modernity", to run until February 5, marks five years since the opening of the art museum in the capital of the United Arab Emirates.

◆ **A cargo ship traffic** jam stretched as far as the eye could see off Istanbul, where a key deal to get Ukraine grain to market has translated into major hold-ups. Dozens of vessels were waiting Tuesday to clear the meticulous inspection process required under the Turkey and UN-backed accord aimed at easing fears of a global food crisis. Some vessels spend days at anchor for a procedure that officials said they were trying to speed up, amid growing desperation among some crews to get through. On board the Barbados-flagged black-and-white Nord Wind ship, the relief was palpable when a team of inspectors arrived.

Putin moots gas hub in Turkey with Nord Stream supplies

President Vladimir Putin said yesterday that Russia could redirect supplies intended for the damaged Nord Stream pipelines to the Black Sea to create a European gas hub in Turkey, or even use the one intact part of Nord Stream 2 to supply the EU.

An investigation is underway into explosions last month that ruptured the Russian-built Nord Stream 1 and Nord Stream 2 pipelines on the bed of the Baltic Sea.

Putin said it was possible to repair the pipelines and that Russia and Europe should decide their fate.

"We could move the lost volumes from the Nord Streams along the bottom of the Baltic Sea to the Black Sea region and thus make the main routes for the supply of our fuel, our natural gas to Europe through Turkey, creating the largest gas hub for Europe in Turkey," he told an energy conference in Moscow.

"That is, of course, if our partners are interested in this. And economic feasibility, of course."

The problem is that European Union countries are trying to end their reliance on Russian oil and gas after Putin sent troops into Ukraine as part of what he calls a special military operation.

Turkish Energy Minister Fatih Donmez, speaking at the same conference in Moscow, said the idea was new to him but should be discussed.



Saudi foreign minister says efforts to extend the truce in Yemen still stand

Saudi Arabia's foreign minister said that the efforts to extend the truce in Yemen still stand, Al Arabiya TV reported yesterday, after an initial UN-brokered pact between a Saudi-led coalition and the Houthi movement expired early this month.

The kingdom, the coalition and the Riyadh-backed Yemeni government are "keen on extending the truce," the Saudi-owned TV quoted Foreign Minister Prince Faisal bin Farhan Al Saud as saying.

The United Nations is pressing for an extended and expanded truce that would build on the two-month one that expired on Oct. 2 after being rolled over twice, and which has brought the longest stretch of relative calm in the seven-year conflict.

Biden vows consequences for Saudi Arabia after OPEC+ decision

President Joe Biden pledged on Tuesday "there will be consequences" for US relations with Saudi Arabia after OPEC+ announced last week that it would cut its oil production target over US objections.

His announcement came a day after Democratic Senator Bob Menendez, chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, said the United States must immediately freeze all cooperation with Saudi Arabia, including arms sales.

Biden, in an interview with CNN's Jake Tapper, would not discuss what options he was considering.

White House press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre said a policy review would be conducted but gave no timeline for action or information on who would lead the re-evaluation. The United States will be watching the situation closely "over the coming weeks and months", she said.

Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Faisal bin Farhan said the OPEC+

with Yemeni parties, according to the State Department.

Chinese 'flying car' makes first public flight in Dubai

A "flying car" built by Chinese electronic vehicle maker Xpeng Inc (9868.HK) made its first public flight in the United Arab Emirates, as the company works towards launching the electric aircraft on international markets.

The X2 is a two-seater electric vertical take-off and landing (eVTOL) aircraft that is lifted by eight propellers - two at each corner of the vehicle.

Monday's unmanned, 90-minute test flight in Dubai was described by its manufacturer as an "important base for the next generation of flying cars."

"We are making step-by-step (moves) to the international market," said Minguan Qiu, general manager of Xpeng Aerohot. "First we selected Dubai city because Dubai is the most innovative city in the world."



Iranians keep up protests over Mahsa Amini death despite growing death toll

Iranians kept up anti-government protests yesterday despite an increasingly deadly state crackdown, social media reports showed, as Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei dismissed the demonstrations as "scattered riots" planned by Iran's enemies.

Protests ignited by the death of 22-year-old Mahsa Amini while in the custody of Iran's

morality police on Sept. 16 have turned into one of the boldest challenges to the clerical leadership since the 1979 revolution. A crowd of at least 100 people

blocked a road in central Tehran, shouting "by cannon, tank or firecracker, mullahs must get lost", one video showed. Another video showed dozens of

riot police deployed in a Tehran street where a fire was burning. Tear gas was fired during a protest outside the lawyers association in Tehran, where

demonstrators who appeared to number in the dozens had chanted "women, life freedom", videos posted on social media showed.

Reuters could not independently verify the videos.

In an apparently coordinated effort, activist groups called for protesters to gather from early afternoon, breaking the pattern of nighttime demonstrations that have prevailed since unrest began sweeping Iran nearly four weeks ago.

While observers do not believe the protests are close to toppling the government - the authorities withstood six months of protests in 2009 over a disputed election - the unrest has underlined pent-up frustrations over freedoms and rights.

The widely followed 1500tasvir Twitter account shared what it described as a video showing morality police in Tehran arresting a woman over her hijab. A woman could be heard shouting "leave her alone!"

The Norway-based Iran Human Rights organisation said the death toll had increased to at least 201 civilians during the

unrest, including 23 minors. Its previous report, on Oct. 8, put the death toll at 185 people. The authorities have said around 20 members of the security forces have been killed. Iran has accused its enemies including the United States of fomenting the unrest.

US firm supplied networking tech to maker of Russian missiles

Since Russia annexed Crimea in 2014, American companies have been prohibited from dealing with MMZ Avangard, a state-owned firm that makes missiles for one of Russia's most sophisticated weapons, the S-400 air-defense system.

In a measure of Western concern about the S-400, the United States ejected Turkey, a NATO member, from a joint fighter jet program in 2019 after Ankara took delivery of the Russian sys-

tem. But even as the United States was taking actions to blunt MMZ Avangard's business, a publicly traded American technology company, Extreme Networks (EXTR.O), was providing MMZ Avangard with computer networking equipment for its office IT systems, according to emails and other business records seen by Reuters, as well as interviews with people familiar with the matter.

In a statement to Reuters, Extreme said that based on information provided by the news agency it believed equipment "may have" been sold to MMZ Avangard using a surrogate buy-

er. Extreme said the equipment was sold without its knowledge. It added, without providing evidence, that an intermediary in Russia was "complicit" in supplying its products via a front company to "bad actors." Extreme said it is reporting its findings of these potential sales to US authorities.

Ukraine has accused Russia of deploying missiles made by MMZ Avangard against ground targets since Russia launched what it terms its "special operation" on Feb. 24. Ukrainian authorities said MMZ Avangard missiles killed at least thirty civilians in a gruesome attack against a convoy on the edge of the southern city of Zaporizhzhia last month.

Extreme said in its statement that the allegations were brought by a disgruntled employee. An investigation by the firm had found nothing to corroborate any of the claims until Reuters brought "new facts" to the com-

pany's attention this month. The company said it ceased operations in Russia in March, adding that it subsequently launched a process to dismiss the disgruntled employee for poor performance. It said it has no records of sales involving Russian warships.

Extreme, which trades on the NASDAQ exchange and is headquartered in Morrisville, North Carolina, has earned a solid reputation in the United States and is an official partner of the National Football League. The NFL declined to comment for this article.

A Reuters investigation in August found that while the United States and allies banned high-tech exports to Russia to try to cripple its defense industry, and many tech companies announced that they had halted exports to Russia, the flow of Western brand-name computer parts to Russian clients hasn't stopped.

This account of how Extreme supplied MMZ Avangard and at least two other Russian military companies is based on interviews with three people familiar with the shipments as well as a review by Reuters of documents spanning five years to 2021. The documents include sales records and email exchanges between Extreme employees, customers and distributors. The shipments are reported here for the first time.

The US Department of Commerce, which administers export restrictions, declined to comment for this story.



Ronaldo to reject improper conduct charge: Ten Hag

Video footage showed Ronaldo appearing to knock a young boy's mobile phone to the ground after United's 1-0 defeat at Goodison Park on April 9.

The 37-year-old was cautioned by Merseyside Police and the FA last month charged Ronaldo over the incident. United manager Ten Hag



has spoken to Ronaldo and said the Portugal striker will contest the FA charge.

"We talked about that and he will not accept it," Ten Hag told reporters.

The incident with the Everton fan occurred when Ronaldo was making his way towards the tunnel and the former Real Madrid and Juventus star later issued an apology for his actions.
