the Parliament has a substantial role to play in the nation’s progress. “While 58pc of participants said that their MPs did not care much about the voters, 42pc responded otherwise. The disapproval and approval percentages were 55pc and 45pc respectively for the municipal council members.”

The survey also found that 62pc of the citizens expressed their satisfaction over the performance of the previous councils. The voters consider employment as the most serious topic during the upcoming elections, according to the opinion poll. This was followed by infrastructure development.

The opinion poll highlighted that the major qualities the voters would seek in their representatives were honesty, competence, education and decent background. Most of the respondents were optimistic about the future parliament and municipal councils.
