Mandatory DNA tests proposed for children of unknown parentage

andatory DNA tests for children of unknown parentage are before Parliament, with a central DNA database proposed to help match children to their biological parents and restore access to basic documents and services.

The measure would require testing as soon as a child is found, under the supervision of state bodies, and the results would be compared with rerelated cases.

The plan has been filed as a recommendatory proposal by MP Hassan Ebrahim and has been sent to the specialised committee.

Views

Relevant ministries are expected to submit their views before the Council considers the matter for a vote.

Under the text, the Ministries of Interior, Social Development and Health would design and children of unknown parentage and establish a central registry to store results.

The proposal states that this may, in some instances, confirm identity and family ties and, in turn, unlock legal, social and human rights linked to name and status.
