Al Asoomi highlights royal directives in speech at Parliamentarians' Session in Bologna

Arab Parliament (AP) Speaker Adel bin Abdulrahman Al Asoomi has highlighted the pioneering role played by His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa in promoting

dialogue among various religions and cultures at all levels.

This came as Al Asoomi addressed the Parliamentarians' Session, organised by the G20 Interfaith Forum in collaboration with the Global Council for Tolerance and Peace (GCTPO) in the Italian city of Bologna.

In his speech, Al Asoomi indicated that the landmark initiatives launched by HM the King in this field have laid global foundations for promoting dialogue and consolidating a culture of tolerance among religions and

The Arab Parliament Speaker added that Arab countries have launched and embraced numerous initiatives in this regard, such as the King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz International Centre

for Interreligious and Intercultural Dialogue (KAICIID), the Document on Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together, signed in the UAE between Al Azhar Al Sharif and the Vatican, and the establishment of the Interfaith Dialogue Centre at the Egyptian Supreme Council for Islamic Affairs.

The session was moderated by Pier Ferdinando CASINI, former president of the Italian Chamber of Deputies and current Chairman of the Italian Group at the Inter-Parliamentary Union.

Verdict set for Asian man accused of 'faking' record

The 37-year-old Asian man who has been accused of faking a medical report that was required from him to transfer his work permit to another employer will learn his fate on Thursday.

According to court files, the defendant was all set to complete his transfer, pending the outcome of the medical report, and the result shuttered his chances as it appeared that he had hepatitis.

The doctor informed him, and requested him to re-do the test in order to confirm the result. However, the defendant tried to turn it around, requesting his friend, who looked almost like him, to undergo the test. His plan went as he wished as his friend did the test and the result showed he was healthy.

The hospital stunned the defendant when he went to collect the result by the request that he had to re-do the test for the third time, as per the

doctor's request. Shocked, the man refused under the pretext that he was fasting.

He immediately left the hospital, and called his friend, urging him to go to the hospital as they wanted to repeat the test.

"I went there, and the cops were waiting for me," the Asian man's friend told prosecutors. He was also charged in connection with this case.

Ministry directorate reviews convicts' requests

The Verdicts Implementation Directorate at the Interior Ministry has reviewed some requests submitted by convicts to benefit from alternative penalties based on the Decree-Law on penalties and alternative measures endorsed in 2017.

The requests are reviewed

per the rules and conditions of the law issued by His Majesty the King, including not posing a threat to public security.

In addition, the convicts must have paid all the financial liabilities handed down against them by a criminal court unless it is impossible for them to pay.

The directorate highlighted

that after reviewing the social, economic and security aspects of the cases, a list would be drafted of eligible candidates.

The list will be referred to the relevant judge to replace imprisonment sentences with various types of alternative penalties appropriate to the individual circumstances of each inmate.
