Russia, Greece and the United States were the top providers of refined petroleum products -- with the US standing out as the sole supplier of JP-8, a jet-fuel blend designed for military aircraft. "The states that have supplied Israel with fuel during this period have done so in full knowledge of its atrocities," said Oil Change

International, which advocates for a global phase-out of fossil fuels. "Their complicity is documented here to hold these states accountable. These states must address their role in the genocide and cease their complicity.'
