

Apple to build \$1 bln campus in Texas

pple announced yester- \mathbf{A} day it will build a \$1 billion campus in Texas as part of a nationwide expansion.

The facility will be less than a mile from the tech giant's existing facility in Austin and initially accommodate 5,000 additional employees, with room to grow to 15,000.

As it stands, 6,200 people now work for Apple in the Texan capital -- the largest cluster outside its headquarters in Cupertino, California. Employees at the new campus will work in fields including engineering, R&D, operations, finance, sales and customer support, Apple said in a statement. Apple also said it plans to boost its employee base in regions across the United States over the next three years.


