Arab Coalition strikes kill 150 Houthis, destroy 22 military vehicles in Yemen

The Arab Coalition carried out targeted military strikes against the Iran-backed Houthi militia in the Yemeni city of Marib, killing 250 "terrorists" and destroying 22 military vehicles, the coalition said in a statement carried by the official Saudi Press Agency (SPA) yesterday.

The attack took place over 24 hours and involved 36 different targets, SPA added.

Simultaneously, the Arab Coalition also held military operations on 12 targets in the Yemeni town of al-Bayda, eliminating "80 terrorist elements" and seven military vehicles.

Yemen's Iran-backed Houthis launched dozens of cross-border attacks on Saudi Arabia throughout 2021.

The Arab Coalition has been carrying out attacks against legitimate military Houthi targets in Yemen in recent months, warning civilians to not approach or gather around the targeted sites beforehand.

Airport customs seize 10 kg of Shabu, arrest suspects

Customs officers at the Bahrain International Airport announced foiling attempts to smuggle narcotic substances weighing 10 kilograms.

The head of the Muharraq Governorate Prosecution said Public Prosecution received two reports from the Anti-Narcotics Department on attempts to smuggle Shabu into the Kingdom. Officers said they found the contraband goods from hidden spaces in travel bags.

The Public Prosecution opened an investigation soon after receiving the report. Officials interrogated the suspects in both cases and ordered their pre-trial detention, pending further investigation.

The prosecution also ordered specialists to examine the seized substances. Investigations are ongoing. They will present a final report before sending the suspects to trial.

War clouds are looming large over Ukraine with them suffering a massive cyberattack yesterday that also warned Ukraini-

ans to "be afraid and expect the worst".

"Ukrainian! All your personal data was uploaded to the public network. All data on the computer is destroyed, it is impossible to restore it," said a message visible on hacked government websites, written in Ukrainian, Russian and Polish.

"All information about you has become public, be afraid

and expect the worst. This is for your past, present and future."

Ukraine's foreign ministry spokesperson said it was too early to say who could be behind the attack but Russia had been behind similar strikes in the past.

The United States said it feared Russia was preparing a pretext to invade Ukraine if diplomacy fails to meet its ob-

jectives.

Moscow dismissed such warnings, though it has amassed more than 100,000 troops on its neighbour's frontiers and on Friday released pictures of more of its forces on the move.

The attack came hours after talks wrapped up with no breakthrough between Russia and Western states, which fear Moscow could launch a new attack on a country it invaded in 2014.

"The drumbeat of war is sounding loud," Michael Carpenter, US Ambassador to the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE), said at the close of talks on Thursday.

Russia denies plans to attack Ukraine but says it could take unspecified military action unless demands are met, including a promise by the NATO alliance never to admit Kyiv.

Iran releases animated video of killing Trump

A robot calling in a drone strike that appears to assassinate former US President Donald Trump is highlighted on the webpage of Iran's supreme leader

The animated video was part of a contest to mark the January 3, 2020 killing of former Islamic Revolutionary Guards Corps (IRGC) commander Qas-



sem Soleimani, who was slain in an American drone strike in Baghdad.

The video, posted Wednesday on the website of Khamenei's office, appears to show Trump, on the golf course at his Mar-a-Lago, Florida, being targeted in a drone strike.

It was shared by many on social media.

The video mirrored a propaganda poster last year also

showing Trump on a golf course, calling for revenge for Soleimani's slaying.

Earlier this month, Iran's extremist President Ebrahim Raisi demanded Trump be "prosecuted and killed."

"If not, I'm telling all American leaders, don't doubt that the hand of revenge will come out of the sleeves of ummah," Raisi said, referring to the worldwide community of Muslims.

US warns Russia could be prepping for war

Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov said on Friday Russia hoped security talks with the United States would resume, but this would depend on Washington's response to Moscow's proposals.

"We categorically will not accept the appearance of NATO right on our borders, especially so given the current course of the Ukrainian leadership," he said.

Asked what Moscow meant by threatening this week to take "military-technical action" if talks fail, Lavrov said: "Measures to deploy military hardware, that is obvious. When we take decisions with military hardware we understand what we mean and what we are preparing for."

Russian Defence Ministry footage released by RIA news agency showed armoured vehicles and other military hardware being loaded onto trains in Russia's far east, in what Moscow called an inspection drill to practice deploying over a long distance.

Rely only on accurate information: Al Derazi tells rights organisations

The National Institution for Human Rights stressed the importance of foreign human rights organisations in obtaining accurate information to avoid disseminating information contrary to the truth.

Ali Ahmed Alderazi, the Chairperson, National Institution for Human Rights, said: "Anyone who wants to know the facts on the ground should derive them from their sources." Alderazi explained that health care is one of the constitutionally guaranteed rights for everyone without exception. The National Institution

for Human Rights periodically conducts visits to reform and rehabilitation centres to check the quality of health services provided to inmates.

Bahrain, he said, had more than one institution for human rights to perform these tasks. "These include the Prisoners and Detainees Rights Commission and the Ombudsman at the Ministry of Interior."

Al-Darazi pointed out Bahrain has not arrested anyone for exercising peaceful political activity. "Article 23 of the constitution guarantees the freedom of expression, which includes the right of assembly and organising rallies."

Essam Khalaf, the Minister of Works, Municipalities Affairs and Urban Planning, yesterday held a field visit to review the progress and feedback of various development and service projects ongoing in the Capital Governorate.

The projects are being developed based on approvals from the government headed by His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister.

The minister stressed the government's keenness to collect feedback from officials and people to develop the facilities with the highest standards and make maximum use of the available resources.

He explained that work is un-

derway within the ministry's strategy to implement several development projects in the capital governorate, including the Umm Al-Hassam walkway.

Umm Al-Hassam walkway

Umm Al-Hassam walkway project, the minister said, achieved 98% completion and is expecting completion in the first quarter of this year.

The minister also pointed out that the project includes

solar-powered lighting to save energy and reduce the cost of maintenance and operation.

"We also installed shaded chairs and seating as well as planted evergreen trees to increase the green area."

He added: "The focus was on planting environmentally friendly trees."

Prince Saud Al-Faisal Walkway

On the third phase of the Prince Saud Al-Faisal Walkway,

the minister said that works had begun and would hopefully complete in the first quarter of this year.

"The project includes tracks for walking, running and cycling, green spaces, tourist and recreational facilities, restaurants and services."

The project extends between Juffair and King Faisal Corniche over 14 kilometers.

He further stressed that the development of Prince Saud Al-Faisal Walkway (Phase III) would kick-start the urban development of the Manama waterfront.

"This project aims to improve the appearance of the landscape and increase the green spaces in the area to reduce pollution and use the empty spaces of the road as safe walkways and bike paths."

The minister said the current walkway has a length of 1.7 kilometers and a width of 4.5 meters. The total area estimated for the use of bicycles and pedestrians is 7,600 square meters, which will be re-allocated for walking.

The minister explained that the effort is to link projects having waterfronts, central parks and public roads to walkways that serve citizens and residents to practice sports.

"The ministry is keen to launch walkway projects in all

governorates of the Kingdom."

Road development in Juffair

Essam Khalaf said the ministry is to launch projects for road development, sewage network, and landscaping at Block 324 in Juffair. The project calls for developing sidewalks, bicycle paths, parking lots, landscape, rainwater and sewage networks and street lights.

Lighting poles

Works Ministry, the minister said, had also completed two projects to increase the number of lighting poles in Complex 373 in Bou Ghazal, which included the installation of 65 lighting poles and replacing 60 lighting units with an LED system.

"The ministry also completed a lighting project in Complex 324 in Al-Fateh, which included installing 30 new lighting poles and replacing 89 lighting units with LEDs."



MoH updates booster protocols: Fourth dose after three Sinopharm jabs

Health Ministry announced updating the booster dose protocol for vaccinated and recovered individuals.

Sinopharm -fourth dose

Accordingly, those who received three doses of Sinopharm will get the second booster dose (fourth dose) three months after the first booster shot. Jabs will be either Pfizer-BioNTech or Sinopharm.

Citizens and residents who are vac-

inated, recovered and received two doses of Sinopharm should obtain their first booster dose three months after the second dose. However, those 40 years and over, or under 40 years and suffering from obesity, immunodeficiency diseases or chronic diseases should get the third dose a month after the second. Those between 12 and 17 years can get their booster six months after the second dose.

Covishield-AstraZeneca, Pfizer, and Sputnik

Those who had received two doses of the "Covishield-AstraZeneca, Pfizer-BioNTech, and Sputnik vaccines and above 18 years of age can receive the first booster dose three months after the second dose.

The Ministry also allows those who are "recovered" and received two doses to get their booster dose six months from the date of infection and the passage of the specified time from the second or first booster dose. They can obtain a booster dose of Sinopharm, Pfizer, or Sputnik.

Health Ministry yesterday announced closing a restaurant administratively in the Capital Governorate for violating Yellow level COVID-19 precautionary measures on Thursday evening.

The closure came during inspection visits carried out by the ministry in cooperation with the Ministry of Interior, the Ministry of Industry,

Commerce and Tourism, and the Bahrain Tourism and Exhibitions Authority.

Officials visited 183 restaurants and cafes and booked 16 for not adhering to COVID-19 measures.

The officials also visited 43 men's salons, of which 22 salons are facing legal actions for COVID-19 violations. Of the 13 women's salons inspected, three are facing actions.

US tells Lebanon not to fear sanctions over energy supply plans, PM's office says

The US ambassador to Lebanon told the Lebanese government it should not fear a US sanctions law over its plans to receive energy supplies from the region, the office of Lebanese Prime Minister Najib Mikati said yesterday.

Lebanon, which is grappling with a deep financial crisis, is seeking to import energy from

fellow Arab states to ease an acute power shortage. However, supplies would have to transit Syria, which is subject to a US sanctions law.

US Ambassador Dorothy Shea handed Mikati a letter from the US Treasury Department "to answer some of the concerns the Lebanese authorities had regarding regional energy agreements that the United States

helped facilitate between Lebanon, Jordan and Egypt," the statement from the prime minister's office said.

Biden seeks to reshape Fed with historically diverse slate of nominees

US President Joe Biden yesterday nominated former Federal Reserve Governor Sarah Bloom Raskin for the Fed's key regulatory post and economists Lisa Cook and Philip Jefferson to serve on its board in what would represent a landmark demographic overhaul of the world's most powerful central bank.

The appointments - which appear likely to face some opposition from Republicans in the Senate - would fill out the ranks of a seven-member panel that wields tremendous influence over the world's largest economy, and would make the Fed's top leadership the most diverse by race and gender in its 108-year history. Both Cook and Jefferson are Black.

Biden's picks for the Fed followed his decision to nominate Jerome Powell for a second term as head of the central bank and elevate Governor Lael Brainard to the vice chair position and presents him an opportunity to leave a lasting imprint on a body that sets economic policies - particularly about interest rates - that reverberate worldwide.

The appointments were announced as Biden's own plans for a post-pandemic economy have run into an unexpected spike in inflation and partisan squabbling in Congress - a factor that may also come into play during the nominees' confirmation process.

"This group will bring much needed expertise, judgment and leadership to the Federal Reserve while at the same time bringing a diversity of thought

and perspective never seen before on the Board of Governors," Biden said in a statement. "They will continue the important work of steering us on a path to a strong, sustainable recovery, while making sure that price increases do not become entrenched over the long term."

Facebook, Google CEOs aware of formal advertising market deal -- court filing

Chief executives of Alphabet Inc's Google and Facebook were aware of a deal to carve up part of the online advertising market, according to an amended antitrust complaint filed by Texas and 15 other states against Google.

The deal with Facebook, which Google dubbed "Jedi Blue," was "signed off" by Google Chief Executive Sundar Pichai while Facebook CEO Mark Zuckerberg was on an email thread discussing it, they said in their third amended complaint.

Google said the complaint's assertion "isn't accurate," and that the complaint itself is "full

of inaccuracies."

"We intend to file a motion to dismiss next week," a Google spokesperson said.

Facebook, which has since become Meta Platforms Inc, said in a statement that the deal was not exclusive to Google, and that other agreements have increased competition for ad

placements. It said it was better for advertisers "while fairly compensating publishers."

Facebook has not been named as a defendant in the lawsuit.

The deal was allegedly struck as part of Google's effort to counter header bidding, which publishers wanted to use to make more money from advertising placed on their websites, the filing said.

"Google quickly realized that this innovation substantially threatened its exchange's ability to demand a very large - 19 to 22 percent - cut on all advertising transactions," the filing said.

Its efforts to kill header bidding included striking a deal with Facebook, which had sup-

ported header bidding, the filing said.

"Ultimately, Google and Facebook struck a deal executed at the highest levels," the complaint said. "Following the agreement, Facebook curtailed its involvement with header bidding in return for Google giving Facebook information, speed, and other advantages."

As part of the agreement, the two online platforms agreed on how often Facebook would win the publishers' auctions, the filing said.

Google had other tactics also, such as using at least three programs to manipulate ad auctions to coerce advertisers and publishers into using Google's tools, the filing said.

Musk says Tesla to accept dogecoin for merchandise

Tesla Inc will accept meme-based cryptocurrency dogecoin as payment for its merchandise such as the "Giga Texas" belt buckle and mini models of electric vehicles, Chief Executive Officer Elon Musk said in a tweet yesterday.

The move, which sent dogecoin prices 14% higher, comes a month after Musk said Tesla would test out the digital token as a payment option.

Musk, a vocal proponent of cryptocurrencies, has heavily influenced prices of dogecoin and bitcoin, and at one point had said the company would accept bitcoin for purchasing its cars before axing plans.

Tesla's merchandise, which also include the recently launched "Cyberwhistle" and

"Cyberquad for Kids", are a hit with its fans, and usually sell out within a few hours of listing.

"Some have noted that goods for doge are selling out even faster than for dollars. This news is a

good illustration of crypto's continued penetration of corporate culture," said Alex Kuptsikevich, senior financial analyst at FxPro.

Musk's tweets on dogecoin, including the one where he called

it the "people's crypto", have turned the once-obscure digital currency, which began as a social media joke, into a speculator's dream.

The token's price surged by

about 4,000% in 2021.

Tesla disclosed last year it had bought \$1.5 billion worth of bitcoin, and Musk has also said he owns some bitcoin and dogecoin.



Tesla's much-awaited Cybertruck will begin production in the first quarter of 2023, pushing back its plan to start production in late 2022.

Tesla is facing intense competition as legacy automakers such as Ford Motor Co as well as startups including Rivian Automotive are set to launch their electric cars this year.

Bomb found at Delhi flower market ◆ Indian bomb disposal experts cordoned off a busy flower market in the capital New Delhi yesterday after finding an improvised explosive device left in an abandoned bag, police said. Delhi Police commissioner said the bag was left behind by a customer who visited a shop to buy flowers at the Ghazipur wholesale flower market. Media reports said police carried out a controlled explosion.

WHO adds new drugs to COVID treatments amid Omicron surge ◆ The World Health Organization (WHO) has added two more drugs to its guidelines for recommended treatments for COVID-19, as the more infectious Omicron variant of the coronavirus triggers an unprecedented surge in cases around the world. The drug baricitinib, which is also used to treat rheumatoid arthritis, is "strongly recommended" for patients with severe or critical COVID-19, in combination with corticosteroids, the UN agency's panel of international experts said in the guidelines which were published by the British Medical Journal yesterday.

Turkey, Armenia talk normalising ties after decades of animosity ◆ Envoys from Turkey and Armenia will hold the first round of talks aimed at normalising ties in Moscow, in a move Armenia expects will lead to the establishment of diplomatic relations and reopening borders after decades of animosity. Turkey and Armenia have had no diplomatic or commercial ties for 30 years and the talks are the first attempt to restore links since a 2009 peace accord. That deal was never ratified and ties have remained tense.

Russia adds two close Navalny allies to list of 'terrorists and extremists' ◆ Russia's state financial monitoring agency added jailed Kremlin critic Alexei Navalny's allies Leonid Volkov and Ivan Zhdanov to its list of "terrorists and extremists", the Interfax news agency reported. Both Volkov and Zhdanov are outside Russia. Moscow banned Navalny's political network as "extremist" last year during a sweeping crackdown.

Two killed, 10 injured in Kuwait refinery fire ◆ Two people were killed and 10 others injured after a fire broke out yesterday at a gas liquefaction unit in Kuwait's largest refinery, the plant's operator said. The blaze "erupted during maintenance work" on the unit at Mina al-Ahmadi refinery, 40 kilometres (25 miles) south of Kuwait City, state-owned Kuwait National Petroleum Company (KNPC) announced on Twitter. Having initially said that 10 people were injured, it later updated its casualty toll, saying two workers "of Asian nationality" had been found dead at the site.

UK PM Johnson's staff partied as queen mourned death of husband

- Johnson's staff partied on night before Philip's funeral
- Former spokesman apologies for the party

British Prime Minister Boris Johnson's staff partied in Downing Street last year as Queen Elizabeth mourned her husband, a time when mixing indoors was banned for people from different households.

Johnson is facing the gravest crisis of his premiership after revelations about a series of gatherings in Downing Street during COVID lockdowns, some at times when ordinary people were unable to bid farewell in person to dying relatives.

Johnson, who won a landslide election victory in 2019, on Wednesday apologised for a "bring your own booze" gathering at his official residence during Britain's first coronavirus lockdown. He admitted he attended.

The Telegraph said there were two other drinks parties held inside Downing Street on April 16, 2021 when social gatherings indoors and outdoors were limited. Johnson was at his Chequers country residence that day, the paper said.

The next day, Queen Elizabeth bade farewell to Philip, 99. Dressed in black and in a white trimmed black face mask, the 95-year-old Elizabeth stood alone, head bowed as her husband of 73 years was lowered into the Royal Vault of St George's Chapel.

Such was the revelry in Downing Street, the Telegraph said, that staff went to nearby supermarket to buy a suitcase

of alcohol, used a laptop to play music and a swing used by the prime minister's young son was broken.

Opponents have called for Johnson to resign, casting the 57-year-old prime minister as a charlatan who demanded the British people follow some of the most onerous rules in peacetime history while his own staff partied.

A small but growing number in his own Conservative Party have echoed those calls, fearing it will do lasting damage to its electoral prospects.

Johnson has given a variety of explanations of the parties, ranging from denials that any rules were broken, to understanding the anger at apparent

hypocrisy at the heart of the British state.

Apologies

One of the April 2021 parties in Downing Street was a leaving event for James Slack, a former director of communications, who yesterday said he wanted to "apologise unreservedly for the anger and hurt caused".

Slack said in a statement to PA Media that the gathering "should not have happened at the time that it did."

British police said on Thursday they would not investigate gatherings held in Johnson's residence during a coronavirus lockdown unless an internal government inquiry finds evidence of potential criminal offences.

Asked about the reports of parties the day before Philip's funeral, security minister Damian Hinds said he was shocked.

"I was shocked to read it," Hinds told Sky News. "We will have to see what comes out further in the investigation."

"This was a particularly sombre time for our whole country."

North Korea launches action over US sanctions

- Launch comes as Pyongyang accused United States of intentionally escalating situation by calling for tougher sanctions

North Korea fired at least two ballistic missiles yesterday, the third test in two weeks, just hours after criticising a US push for new sanctions over the previous launches as a "provocation" and warning of a strong reaction.

South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff said it had detected what it presumed were two short-range ballistic missiles (SRBMs) launched eastward from North Pyongan Province on the west coast of North Korea.

Japan's coast guard also reported that the North fired what could be a ballistic missile. The missiles appeared to have landed in the sea outside Japan's exclusive economic zone, broadcaster NHK reported, citing an unnamed Japanese defence ministry official.

The US military's Indo-Pacific Command said while it assessed that the launch does not pose an immediate threat to the United States or its allies, it highlights the "destabilizing impact of the (North Korea's) illicit weapons program."

The launch would be the third since New Year's day, an unusually high pace of missile tests. The previous two were of "hypersonic missiles," North Korean state media reported, capable of high speeds and manoeuvring after

China says UK spy claims result of watching 'too many 007 movies'

China yesterday dismissed a rare public warning by British security services that a suspected Chinese agent was trying to influence lawmakers, saying it was the result of watching "too many 007 movies".

British authorities said Thursday that a London-based solicitor "knowingly engaged in political interference activities" inside parliament, citing Britain's counter-intelligence and domestic spy agency MI5.

Christine Lee had reportedly worked on behalf of the Chinese Communist Party to gain influence through donations, the office of House of Commons Speaker Lindsay Hoyle said.

China's foreign ministry denied engaging in "interference activities", blasting the accusations as "alarmist remarks based on some individuals' subjective assumptions".

North Korea defended the missile tests as its legitimate right to

self-defence and said the United States was intentionally escalating the situation by imposing new sanctions, state media reported earlier yesterday, citing the foreign ministry.

North Korea's recent development of a "new-type weapon" was just part of its efforts to modernize its national defence capability, and did not target any specific country or harm the security of neighbouring countries, the foreign ministry said in a statement on the KCNA state news agency.

The statement warned of an unspecified "stronger and certain reaction" if the United States adopts a confrontational stance.

'Profoundly destabilising'

The administration of US President Joe Biden on Wednesday imposed its first sanctions over North Korea's weapons programs following a series of North Korean missile launches.

It also called on the United Nations Security Council to take action against several North Korean individuals and entities accused of violating security council res-

olutions that ban North Korea's missile and nuclear weapons development.

US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said the United States had made clear it had no hostile intent toward North Korea and was willing to engage in talks without preconditions, but that the tests were "profoundly destabilising."

The North Korean foreign ministry said that while Washington may talk of diplomacy and dialogue, its actions show "it is still engrossed in its policy for isolating and stifling" North Korea.

"The US is intentionally escalating the situation even with the activation of independent sanctions, not content with referring the DPRK's just activity to the UN Security Council," the statement said.

Kim Dong-yup pointed to remarks last year by North Korean leader Kim Jong Un that Pyongyang will approach Washington "on the principle of answering force with toughness, and good faith in kind".

"A eye for eye, tooth for a tooth," Kim Dong-yup said. "North Korea might be saying they'll go their own way without being intimidated."

Elephants dying from eating plastic waste in Sri Lankan dump

Conservationists and veterinarians are warning that plastic waste in an open landfill in eastern Sri Lanka is killing elephants in the region, after two more were found dead over the weekend.

Around 20 elephants have died over the last eight years after consuming plastic trash in the dump in Pallakkadu village in Ampara district, about 210 kilometers (130 miles) east of the capital, Colombo.

Examinations of the dead animals showed they had swallowed large amounts of nondegradable plastic that is found in the garbage dump, wildlife veterinarian Nihal Pushpakumara said.

"Polythene, food wrappers, plastic, other non-digestibles and water were the only things we could see in the post mortems. The normal food that elephants eat and digest was not evident," he said.

Elephants are revered in Sri Lanka but are also endangered. Their numbers have dwindled from about 14,000 in the 19th century to 6,000 in 2011, according to the country's first elephant census.

They are increasingly vul-

nerable because of the loss and degradation of their natural habitat. Many venture closer to human settlements in search of food, and some are killed by poachers or farmers angry over damage to their crops.

Hungry elephants seek out the waste in the landfill, consuming plastic as well as sharp objects that damage their digestive systems, Pushpakumara said.

"The elephants then stop eating and become too weak to keep their heavy frames upright. When that happens, they can't consume food or water, which quickens their death," he said.

present in the court in Kottayam, a southern Indian city. Supporters cheered and chanted "Praise the Lord" as he left the court.

The prosecution, representing the nun, will appeal the verdict, said lawyer Sandhya Raju.

Police charged Mulakkal with rape, illegal confinement and intimidation of the nun. She said she went to police only after complaining repeatedly to church authorities. Eventually, a group of fellow nuns launched unprecedented public protests to demand Mulakkal's arrest in 2018. He was detained but released on bail after a few weeks.

Ethiopia lashes out at WHO chief for Tigray war remarks

Tedros -- the highest-profile Tigrayan abroad -- this week described conditions in the Ethiopian region as "hell" and said the government was preventing medicines and other life-saving aid from reaching locals.

Addis Ababa said his comments threatened the World Health Organization's integrity.

Bald ambitions: South Korea politician pledges funding for hair loss

People with hair loss in South Korea should have their treatments covered by the state to prevent "discrimination", the ruling party's presidential candidate pledged yesterday, in what critics called a bald bid to pull ahead in neck-and-neck polls.

Democratic Party candidate Lee Jae-myung said he will expand government health insurance to cover treatments, potentially including expensive hair transplants, if he wins in the March presidential election.

"I will expand universal health insurance to hair loss treatment drugs... and will also consider covering hair transplant for serious cases of hair loss," he said in a Facebook post that garnered hundreds of likes in minutes.

Lee, a human rights lawyer turned politician, said people with hair loss issues face "daily discriminatory encounters... across age and gender groups."

In a short, tongue-in-cheek

video posted online yesterday, Lee, who does not appear to have hair loss issues, is seen sweeping a hand over his neat black mane while promising to keep hair on every voter's head.

Many Koreans are using ineffective and potentially harmful over-the-counter remedies because expensive "cosmetic" hair loss treatments are currently excluded from insurance coverage, Lee said, explaining his new campaign pledge.

The issue affects up to one in five South Koreans, his campaign said, without giving de-

tails on how much they expected fulfilling the promise to cost the state.

The offer -- which was first mooted last week -- has prompted widespread public debate, with many voters coming out in favour.

"Hair loss is a disease. I fully endorse his pledge," one supporter wrote on Daum, the country's second-largest online portal.

But some critics have decried the "populist" move as a potential drain on the health service. "Should we cover Viagra prescriptions as well? It's not your money after all," a critic wrote on Daum.





Loeb was ranked fourth in the final 164 km stage from Bisha to Jeddah, which was enough to claim second place overall behind winner Nasser Al Attiyah, who claimed the world's most demanding rally in first place 27 minutes 46 seconds ahead of Loeb.

With the stage win going to South African Henk Lategan, Loeb's BRX teammates Orlando Terranova and Dani Oliveras cruised to sixth place on the day to record a fourth-place outright finish, the Argentine driver's best Dakar result to date.

Nani Roma and Alex Haro also brought their Prodrive Hunter home to make BRX the first top Dakar team to complete the rally with a full comple-
