## Enthusiasts


The fan-engagement activity attracted scores of darts enthusiasts, who got to take pictures with their favourite players and have memorabilia signed.

## Agricultural waste burning risks lives, health and crops

● Interior Ministry issues health, safety warning

Personnel were deployed to 864 areas by the General Directorate of Civil Defence to extinguish fires caused by the burning of agricultural waste.

Speaking on the Interior Ministry's Al Aman social media programme, Hidd Police Station Head Colonel Dr. Osama Bahar highlighted the environmental, health and safety risks linked to the practice.

Col. Dr. Bahar said many people had previously believed that burning agricultural waste in Bahrain and elsewhere supported agricultural development.

#### Studies

However, he explained that studies had proven otherwise, noting that the practice reduced soil quality by up to 25 per cent, forcing farmers to spend additional funds on fertilisers and vitamins to restore land fertility and support healthy plant growth.

Seven million people worldwide have been affected by severe illnesses and deaths caused by exposure to microscopic particles known as

PM2.5, released through the burning of agricultural waste, Col. Dr. Osama Bahar warned, adding that the process emitted black carbon that posed serious health risks.

He further stressed that fires caused by agricultural waste burning were not confined to waste alone, but often spread to crops farmers were trying to protect.

In some cases, the flames extended to outbuildings and even residential houses located on farms.

#### Fires

He noted that while farmers may have intended to manage waste responsibly, the fires frequently became uncontrollable, resulting in the loss of crops and essential structures.

Col. Dr. Bahar concluded by urging farmers to adopt safer alternatives, emphasising that recycling agricultural waste was a more secure solution than risking the loss of crops or homes.

"The use and recycling of agricultural waste is a safer solution, instead of risking the loss of crops or homes," he said.

# Digital theft

## Nurse accused of taking BD25,000 from disabled man using phone

A nurse accused of draining BD25,000.750 from the bank account of a disabled Bahraini man by using his mobile phone has appeared before the High Criminal Court.

The court heard she allegedly moved the cash from his account to her own phone, then sent it on to an account in her Asian home country.

Prosecutors said BD3,500 was later paid back after the transfers were spotted, leaving the rest unpaid.

#### Hearing

High Criminal Court adjourned hearing the case to 20 January so the defendant can be brought from custody and her lawyer can present a defence.

The Public Prosecution claims the defendant used the

victim's electronic signature, using his money transfer app as a verification code tied to the account without legal right and money transfer service linked to his bank account, to carry out the transfers.

The case came to light after the victim's son checked his fa-

ther's bank activity and found large transfers made between September and October 2025, the court was told.

#### Money

The money, totalling BD25,000.750, went to the account of the worker employed as his father's nurse.

Prosecutors said the defendant admitted taking the man's phone without his knowledge, sending the money in instalments to her account in Bahrain and then transferring the full amount abroad.

A report from the transfer service, submitted to the court, said the transactions were carried out using the victim's phone, that the device linked to the transfers belonged to the defendant, and that the one-time codes needed to finish the transfers were sent to her own number.

## Man jailed after using stolen cards to buy luxury car

The High Criminal Court has sentenced an Arab national to three years in prison and fined him BD3,000 after convicting him of using stolen foreign-issued bank cards.

The court also ordered his permanent deportation following the conviction, which stemmed from an attempt to purchase a luxury vehicle from a car dealership in the kingdom.

The defendant attempted to complete part of the vehicle's payment using stolen bank cards through an electronic payment link.

# Spring revival

Plan approved to restore Ain Al Raha natural water sources after years of neglect

A revival plan for the neglect-hit ancient Ain Al Raha spring on Sitra won approval from the Capital Trustees Board yesterday, with the file sent to the competent bodies to take it forward.

The proposal was put forward by council member Mohammed Al Abbas, who said the spring was among Bahrain's oldest natural water sources and had suffered from neglect and environmental damage.

"Ain Al Raha is one of the oldest and most important natural springs in Bahrain," Al Abbas told the council. "Due to neglect and environmental factors, the spring has become threatened with disappearance."

The scheme centres on restoring the spring itself, starting with clearing the basin and removing built-up sediment, then strengthening its walls using materials meant to preserve its archaeological character.

## Study

It also calls for a study into restoring natural water flow, or creating an interim option that mirrors the spring's earlier form.

Around the site, the proposal sets out plans for a heritage park with walking paths, shaded seating and rest areas, and planting to recreate the spring's older setting, when it was surrounded by palm trees.

The plan also calls for low lighting suited to the site's historic character, CCTV cameras to deter vandalism, and a low heritage-style fence to mark the

spring's boundary and protect it without spoiling the view.

## Workshops

An information centre is proposed to display photographs and documents on Ain Al Raha and other old springs in Sitra and across Bahrain, with the option of school workshops on the country's water heritage.

Al Abbas said the project was meant to serve residents and visitors, and could support small local ventures linked to the site, such as heritage crafts, a traditional café and guided tours.

"This project represents an important step to revive Ain Al Raha and protect Bahrain's

natural and historical heritage," he said.

Support facilities in the proposal include public toilets near the site, parking designed not to harm the surrounding environment, and the option of small heritage kiosks selling local goods.

The Board has discussed the site before.

## Plot

In December 2017, it approved reclassifying the plot at Ain Al Raha, recorded as Property No. 06019307 in Sitra's Block 603, to recreational zoning in preparation for a public park.

The decision was then referred on an urgent basis to the

Urban Planning and Development Authority.

In a response relayed in July 2018, the authority said the plot fell within "unplanned areas" under the approved maps at the time, while a detailed plan for the wider area was being prepared to adjust land status and create a fuller road network.

## Services

It added that the location of Ain Al Raha had been preserved and that services were being provided to support it as a future public park within the plan under study.

Under the current classification maps, the site is listed within an archaeological area.

## Three Asians held over 'dead drop' drug case

### High Criminal Court hearing set for Sunday

Three Asian men accused of running a drug 'dead drop' scheme in Bahrain are due before the High Criminal Court next Sunday, with the court ordering they remain in custody.

Prosecutors say the case began during a security sweep aimed at people in breach of residency rules.

An officer stopped the first defendant and asked for his ID.

He replied that it was at his home, so the officer went with him to the address.

### Abnormal state

Inside, police found two other men, the second and third defendants, who were said to be in an abnormal state.

An officer also saw a wrap on the floor believed to contain narcotics.

Searches then followed, first of the men, then of the home itself.

Investigators say they seized wraps and capsules containing suspected drugs, along with bags holding other narcotic substances.

They also found A4 sheets soaked with drug material,

and an accounts notebook thought to be used to record drug quantities and sales.

### Admission

The first and second defendants admitted during prosecution questioning that they possessed the drugs for both trafficking and personal use, according to the file.

The first defendant told investigators the second and third worked with him to distribute narcotics through a dead drop system.

A forensic extraction of the third defendant's phone is said to show locations marked with signs and symbols, alongside references to bottles containing liquid substances and capsules containing a white powder.

### Notebook

A handwriting and document expert concluded the seized notebook was used in the sale and preparation of narcotics, and that it was written by the first defendant.

The Public Prosecution alleges the three were part of an organised network that brings drugs into Bahrain, divides them into smaller quantities, and distributes them using dead drops for Asian nationals living abroad in return for money.

## Third District logged 346 complaints up to December 2025

### 132 raised through 'Tawasul'

Paperwork piled up in the Capital Governorate's Third District over a two-year span, with 346 complaints and proposals filed from 1 January 2024 until December 2025, a report presented to the Capital Trustees Board said.

Residents lodged the largest

share, at 141 submissions, followed by 132 raised through the National System for Suggestions and Complaints, known as 'Tawasul'.

The Board also covered 24 site visits and 36 requests submitted by board members, along with 10 submissions from civil society bodies and three from MPs representing the Capital area.

The report said the district covers 17 residential blocks across Sanabis, Daih, Jidhafs, Karbabad, Seef District, Al Qal'ah and Nurana.

It also includes five public parks: Sanabis Park, Karbabad

Park, Daih Park, Seef Park and Jidhafs Park.

Most cases were routed to

works-related bodies.

Works Affairs received 56 per cent of submissions, while 37 per cent went to the Ministry of Municipalities Affairs and

Agriculture and 1 per cent to the General Directorate of Traffic, according to the report.

A breakdown of requests sent

to the Ministry of Works showed 114 submissions in total.

Road and pavement maintenance led the list with 44 requests, followed by 40 tied to sewerage.

Another 16 involved traffic signs, eight concerned speed humps, four asked for new or planned parking spaces, and two sought the installation of poles and barriers.

On outcomes, the report said 42 per cent of requests had been completed, 38 per cent had received replies, and 20 per cent remained under review.

## EU olive oil import checks rare or 'non-existent': watchdog

Inadequate controls on imports are a recurring grievance of European farmers

Olive oil imported into the EU is rarely, if ever, checked for potentially harmful substances, auditors said Wednesday, reinforcing European farmers' concerns as Brussels pushes for new trade deals.

An olive oil superpower, the European Union has "robust" rules to ensure the stuff drizzled on salads, pasta and other foods is of good quality -- but they are not always fully applied, according to an EU watchdog.

A new report by the European Court of Auditors (ECA) found import controls for pesticides and other contaminants were "either non-existent or sporadic" in the countries it analysed.

"Improving checks, traceabil-

ity, and legal clarity is essential to protect not only consumers but also the reputation of European olive oil," said Joelle Elvinger, the member in charge of the audit. Inadequate controls on agricultural imports are a recurring grievance of European farmers opposing new trade deals like the pact Brussels is to sign with South American bloc Mercosur Saturday.

Farmers complain that such accords expose them to unfair competition from less-regulated overseas competitors who use pesticides and other substances banned in the EU.

"This further confirms the preoccupation of the EU farming in terms of lack of sufficient controls to guarantee reciprocity in standard," pan-European

agriculture lobby group Co-pa-Cogeca told AFP, commenting on the report's findings.

The 27-nation EU is the world's top producer, exporter, and consumer of olive oil.

As such, it imports the equivalent of just around nine percent of its annual production of the Mediterranean diet staple.

Tunisia is by far the largest exporter to the bloc, followed by Turkey, Mercosur member Argentina and Morocco.

Focusing on leading oil producers Greece, Spain and Italy as well as Belgium -- home to the large port of Antwerp, a key import hub -- the ECA report found that none did a good job of checking imports.

For example, no olive oil con-


signments were checked at Italy's main entry points in 2023 and 2024, and Spain analysed only three samples for pesticide residues between 2018 and 2023. Pesticide checks on oil made in the EU were instead "well established", but controls for other contaminants were "inconsistent", the report said.

The European Commission has promised to step up checks on agricultural imports and to block imports of food treated with several EU-banned pesticides, as it sought to allay farmers' concerns over the Mercosur deal.

Egyptian Foreign Minister Badr Abdelatty said Wednesday that all the members of a 15-person Palestinian technocratic committee meant to administer post-war Gaza had been agreed upon by all parties.

Hamas officials said earlier in the day that the group had opened talks with Egyptian mediators in Cairo on the committee, which forms part of the US-brokered truce plan for the Palestinian territory.

"We hope that following this agreement, the committee will be announced soon... and will then be deployed to the Gaza Strip to manage daily life and essential services," Abdelatty said.

The Cairo meeting aimed to address the formation of the committee and its operational mechanisms, a senior Hamas

official had previously told AFP on condition of anonymity.

Separately, the Hamas delegation was to also hold talks in Cairo with leaders of other Palestinian factions on "political, national and field developments" and the state of the Gaza ceasefire, the official added.

Hamas has repeatedly said it does not seek a role in any future governing authority in the Palestinian territory, and would limit its role to monitoring governance to ensure stability and facilitate reconstruction.

Talks with Egyptian mediators will also focus on the withdrawal of Israeli forces from Gaza, the reopening of the Rafah crossing, the entry of aid currently stockpiled on the Egyptian side of the border, and preparations for launching the second phase of the ceasefire plan, the official said.

## Oil prices extend gains on Iran unrest

London, United Kingdom

Oil prices rose further Wednesday on the political instability in major crude producer Iran, which also helped push safe-haven gold to a new record high while weighing on the dollar.

Wall Street's main stock indices fell at the start of trading despite US retail sales posting a higher-than-expected 0.6% cent increase in November and several major US banks beating earnings expectation.

"Things are looking a little softer at the moment, reflecting a heightened sense of uncertainty in the air," said Briefing.com analyst Patrick O'Hare.

"Some of that uncertainty revolves around the path of monetary policy after this morning's economic data worked against the notion of needing to cut rates again soon," he noted.

Recent data has indicated the US economy continues to hum, the labour market has not seen a major degradation and inflation is holding at a moderate level above the US Federal Reserve's target.

The Fed has tipped it would probably wait to make further cuts in interest rates, and most investors expect it will likely hold off for several months.

◆ **Egypt's public** prosecutors on Wednesday ordered the education minister to stand trial over accusations he failed to follow a court ruling, a lawyer on the case told AFP. The case dates back to 2013, more than a decade before Mohamed Abdellatif was appointed minister, and involves a school in the Upper Egyptian city of Minya that the education ministry had been renting, said Amr Abdel Salam, a lawyer representing the school's owners. He said Egyptian courts had ruled the building must be returned to its owners, but successive governments allegedly kept delaying execution of the order. In December, a formal warning was sent to Abdellatif but he refused to carry it out, the lawyer said. "This forced the school owners to take legal action against him," he added. If found guilty, the minister could be jailed, removed from office and ordered to pay one million Egyptian pounds (\$21,000) in compensation, Abdel Salam said.

◆ **Canada's** Carney arrives in China for state visit

◆ **Canadian Prime** Minister Mark Carney arrived in Beijing on Wednesday for a state visit, Chinese state broadcaster CCTV said. Carney, who is expected to meet President Xi Jinping for talks on Friday, is the first Canadian leader to visit China in eight years. The two leaders met on the sidelines of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation summit in South Korea in October, which Carney described as a "turning point" in the two nations' strained relationship. Carney's predecessor Justin Trudeau visited China in December 2017. But ties withered in 2018 after the arrest of a senior executive from Chinese tech giant Huawei on a US warrant in Vancouver and China's retaliatory detention of two Canadians on espionage charges.

◆ **President Donald Trump** said Tuesday that the United States would react strongly if authorities in Iran started hanging people in their crackdown on a popular uprising against the government. "We will take very strong action if they do such a thing," he told CBS News in an interview, when asked about hangings potentially beginning on Wednesday. "When they start killing thousands of people -- and now you're telling me about hanging. We'll see how that's going to work out for them," Trump said in a video clip released online. The interview took place as Trump was in the northern US state of Michigan to visit a manufacturing plant and deliver a speech on the economy. In his speech, Trump reiterated a message he had posted earlier on social media, that "help is on its way" for the Iranian protesters. He also said it was unclear what the death toll in Iran actually was.

### Visa-free transit announced for Indians travelling to and from UK

Indians will soon be able to travel to & from the UK via Germany, in a significant development for Lufthansa, Air India and desi globetrotters. Germany has announced visa-free transit for Indians during Chancellor Friedrich Merz's official visit to India. Travel agents and airlines are now awaiting the date from this will be implemented.

Once effective, desi travellers will be able to travel between India and the UK via Germany on Lufthansa. Also, Air India will be able to code share with Lufthansa to & from the UK and increase passenger numbers on its German flights.

"Announcement of visa free transit for Indian passport holders for transiting through Germany," govt said in a statement on the 27 outcomes of the Chancellor's India visit. Once implemented, this move will partially undo the impact on Indian (and many other foreign) travellers caused by Brexit six years ago.

At the time of Brexit to "hurt" each others' airlines, the UK and EU mandated a transit visa will be required for travelling to one via the other. Which means, an Indian going from Delhi to London via Frankfurt will require a transit Schengen visa to get on the connecting flight. Similarly, an Indian travelling from Mumbai to Munich via London will re-



quire a transit UK visa to take the connecting flight.

The UK is a huge market for Lufthansa and Air India. Once implemented, this development will again enable Lufthansa to fly travellers (both flying it and code share ones on Air India) from India via its hubs in Germany to the UK. There are also some other visa-free destinations also which Indians can now travel to & from by transiting from Germany, like those in the Caribbean.

Transit visa requirements must be kept in mind while booking tickets. There have been numerous cases when people booked via some unscrupulous agents or online travel agencies (OTAs) by just seeing the lowest price. For instance, travelling from India to Canada on an American carrier (for just transiting via the US) means the passengers must have a US visa.

Similarly, going from India to the US via Canada means a transit visa for the latter is required. Ditto for those travelling from India to the UK via Schengen states and the Schengen States via the UK. Soon Germany will be an exception for the UK.

# Trump calls Greenland 'vital' for US as Danish FM braces for Vance talks

Trump says US control of Greenland 'vital' for air defense

● Greenland's leader said the island prefers to remain part of Denmark

● Frederiksen has warned that an attack on a NATO ally would end the alliance

● United States says needs Greenland due to the threat of a takeover by Russia or China

US President Donald Trump insisted yesterday the US needs to take control of Greenland, with NATO's support, just hours before crunch talks about the Arctic island with top Danish, Greenlandic and US officials.

Just hours before the meeting with US Vice President JD Vance was due to start, Trump said that US control of Greenland -- an autonomous territory belonging to NATO ally Denmark -- was "vital" for his planned Golden Dome air and missile defense system.

"NATO becomes far more formidable and effective with Greenland in the hands of the UNITED STATES. Anything less than that is unacceptable," he wrote on social media.

He said NATO "should be leading the way" in building the multi-layer missile defense system.

"IF WE DON'T, RUSSIA OR CHINA WILL, AND THAT IS NOT GOING TO HAPPEN!" Trump wrote.

Just prior, Danish Defence Minister Troels Lund Poulsen had sought to ease US concerns about security in Greenland, telling AFP Denmark was boosting its military presence there and was in talks with allies on an increased NATO presence in the Arctic.

Trump has repeatedly threatened to take over the vast, strategic and sparsely populated Arctic island, and he has sounded emboldened since ordering a deadly January 3 attack in Venezuela that removed its president.

Danish Foreign Minister Lars Lokke Rasmussen and his Greenlandic counterpart were to hold talks later Wednesday in Washington with US Secretary of State Marco Rubio and Vice President JD Vance.

Lokke said he was hoping to "clear up certain misunderstandings." But it remains to be seen if the Trump administration also sees a misunderstanding and if it wants to climb down.

Trump, when asked Tuesday about Greenland's leader saying that the island prefers to remain part of Denmark, said: "Well that's their problem."

"Don't know anything about him, but that's going to be a big problem for him," Trump said.

### Denmark increases military presence in Greenland 'from today': defence ministry

Denmark will beef up its military presence in Greenland "from today", the defence ministry said Wednesday, just before high-stakes talks were to start in Washington over US President Donald Trump's threats to take over the Arctic island.

"The Danish armed forces are, from today, deploying capabilities and units related to ... exercise activities. In the period ahead, this will result in an increased military presence in and around Greenland, comprising aircraft, vessels and soldiers, including from NATO allies," the ministry said in a statement.

# 2025 was third hottest year on record: climate monitors

UN chief Antonio Guterres warned in October that breaching 1.5C was “inevitable”

The planet logged its third hottest year on record in 2025, extending a run of unprecedented heat, with no relief expected in 2026, global climate monitors said Wednesday.


The last 11 years have now been the warmest ever recorded, with 2024 topping the podium and 2023 in second place, according to the EU's Copernicus Climate Change Service and Berkeley Earth, a California-based non-profit research organisation.

For the first time, global temperatures exceeded 1.5C relative to pre-industrial times on average over the last three years, Copernicus said in its annual report.

The warming spike observed from 2023-2025 has been extreme, and suggests an acceleration in the rate of the Earth's

warming,” Berkeley Earth said in a separate report.

The landmark 2015 Paris Agreement commits the world to limiting warming to well below 2C and pursuing efforts to hold it at 1.5C -- a long-term target scientists say would help avoid the worst consequences of climate change.

UN chief Antonio Guterres warned in October that breaching 1.5C was “inevitable” but the world could limit this period

of overshoot by cutting greenhouse gas emissions as quickly as possible.

Copernicus said the 1.5C limit “could be reached by the end of this decade -- over a decade earlier than predicted”.

But efforts to contain global warming were dealt another setback last week as President Donald Trump said he would pull the United States -- the world's second-biggest polluter after China -- out of the bedrock UN

climate treaty.

Temperatures were 1.47C above pre-industrial times in 2025 -- just a fraction cooler than in 2023 -- following 1.6C in 2024, according to Copernicus.

The World Meteorological Organization, the UN's weather and climate agency, said two of eight datasets it analysed showed 2025 was the second warmest year, but the other six datasets ranked it third.

The WMO put the 2023-2025

average at 1.48C but with a margin of uncertainty of plus-minus 0.13C.

Despite the cooling La Niña weather phenomenon, 2025 “was still one of the warmest years on record globally because of the accumulation of heat-trapping greenhouse gases in our atmosphere”, WMO Secretary-General Celeste Saulo said in a statement.

Some 770 million people experienced record-warm annual conditions where they live, while no record-cold annual average was logged anywhere, according to Berkeley Earth.

The Antarctic experienced its warmest year on record while it was the second hottest in the Arctic, Copernicus said.

An AFP analysis of Copernicus data last month found that Central Asia, the Sahel region and northern Europe experienced their hottest year on record in 2025.

## 2026: Fourth-warmest?

Berkeley and Copernicus both warned that 2026 would not break the trend.

If the warming El Niño weather phenomenon appears this year, “this could make 2026 another record-breaking year”, Carlo Buontempo, director of the Copernicus Climate Change Service, told AFP.

“Temperatures are going up. So we are bound to see new records. Whether it will be 2026,

2027, 2028 doesn't matter too much. The direction of travel is very, very clear,” Buontempo said.

Berkeley Earth said it expected this year to be similar to 2025, “with the most likely outcome being approximately the fourth-warmest year since 1850”.

## Emissions fight

The reports come as efforts to cut greenhouse gas emissions -- the main driver of climate change -- are stalling in developing countries.

Emissions rose in the United States last year, snapping a two-year streak of declines, as bitter winters and the AI boom fuelled demand for energy, the Rhodium Group think tank said Tuesday.

The pace of reductions of greenhouse gas emissions slowed in Germany and France.

“While greenhouse gas emissions remain the dominant driver of global warming, the magnitude of this recent spike suggests additional factors have amplified recent warming beyond what we would expect from greenhouse gases and natural variability alone,” said Berkeley Earth chief scientist Robert Rohde.

The organisation said international rules cutting sulphur in ship fuel since 2020 may have actually added to warming by reducing sulphur dioxide emissions, which form aerosols that reflect sunlight away from Earth.

# Scientist wins ‘Environment Nobel’ for shedding light on hidden fungal networks



Beneath the surface of forests, grasslands and farms across the world, vast fungal webs form underground trading systems to exchange nutrients with plant roots, acting as critical climate regulators as they draw down 13 billion tons of carbon annually.

Yet until recently, these “mycorrhizal networks” were greatly underestimated: seen as merely helpful companions to plants rather than one of Earth’s vital circulatory systems.

American evolutionary biologist Toby Kiers has now been awarded the Tyler Prize for Environmental Achievement -- sometimes called the “Nobel for the environment” -- for her work bringing this underground world into focus.

By charting the global distribution of mycorrhizal fungi in a worldwide Underground Atlas launched last year, Kiers and her colleagues have helped illuminate below-ground biodiversity -- insights that can guide conservation efforts to protect these vast carbon stores.

“I just think about all the ways that soil is used in a negative way -- you know, terms like ‘dirtbag’,” the 49-year-old University Research Chair at Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam told AFP in an interview. “Whereas a bag of dirt contains a galaxy!”

## Biological marketplace

Kiers began studying fungi at 19, after writing a grant proposal that won her a place on a scientific expedition to Panama’s rainforests, “and I started asking questions about what was happening under these massive trees in this very diverse jungle.”

She still vividly recalls the first time she peered through a microscope and saw an arbuscule -- the mycorrhizal fungi’s tiny tree-like structure that penetrates plant cells and serves as the site of nutrient exchange -- which she described as “so beautiful.”

In 2011, Kiers published a landmark paper in Science

showing that mycorrhizal fungi behave like shrewd traders in a “biological marketplace,” making decisions based on supply and demand.

With filaments thinner than hair, fungi deliver phosphorus and nitrogen to plants in exchange for sugars and fats derived from carbon.

Using lab experiments her team demonstrated that fungi actively move phosphorus from areas of abundance to areas of scarcity -- and secure more carbon in return by exploiting those imbalances. Plants, in other words, are willing to pay a higher “price” for what they lack.

The fungi can even hoard resources to drive up demand, displaying behavior that echoes the tactics of Wall Street traders.

The fact that all this happens without a brain or central nervous system raises a deeper question: how fungi process information at all -- and whether electrical signals moving through their networks hold the answer.

## Debt of gratitude

More recently, Kiers and her

colleagues have pushed the field further with two *Nature* papers that make this hidden world newly visible.

One unveiled a robotic imaging system that lets scientists watch fungal networks grow, branch and redirect resources in real time; the other mapped where different species are found across the globe.

That global analysis delivered a sobering result: most hotspots of underground fungal diversity lie outside ecologically protected areas.

With fungi largely overlooked by conservation frameworks, Kiers co-founded the Society for the Protection of Underground Networks (SPUN) to map fungal biodiversity -- and argue for its protection.

To coincide with the prize, which comes with a \$250,000 award, SPUN is this week launching an “Underground Advocates” program to train scientists in the legal tools they need to protect fungal biodiversity.

Her aim, she says, is to get people to flip how people think about life on Earth -- from the

surface down.

“Life as we know it exists because of fungi,” she said, explaining that the algal ancestors of modern land plants lacked complex roots, and that a partnership with fungi enabled them to colonize terrestrial environments.

# Sinner in way as Alcaraz targets career Grand Slam in Australia

● Carlos Alcaraz seeks first Australian Open win

● Jannik Sinner aims for third straight title

● Victory would complete Alcaraz's career Grand Slam

● Djokovic pursues record 25th major title

Carlos Alcaraz is targeting a career Grand Slam at the Australian Open but winning the only major to elude him will be no easy feat with great rival Jannik Sinner standing in his way.

Spain's Alcaraz already has six major titles under his belt aged just 22, but success on the Melbourne Park hard courts is a glaring hole in his resume.

He has not made it past the quarter-finals in four trips to Australia, losing at that stage in 2025 to Novak Djokovic and Alexander Zverev the year before.

"It's my first goal to be honest," Alcaraz said of Australia after winning the US Open last year, his second Slam title of 2025 after defending his crown at Roland Garros.

Alcaraz faces a significant roadblock in Italy's Sinner, the two-time defending champion who is chasing his own slice of history.

If the 24-year-old makes it three in a row in Melbourne he would join Djokovic as the only men in the Open era to do so. The Serbian legend has done the three-peat twice during his 10 titles at Melbourne Park.

"I feel like a better player than last year," warned Sinner after

completing his 2025 campaign with 58 wins and just six defeats.

"A lot of wins and not many losses. And in the losses I had, I tried to see the positive thing and tried to use it to evolve me as a player."

Sinner came from two sets down to defeat Daniil Medvedev in the 2024 Australian Open final before seeing off Zverev in straight sets a year ago.

## Djokovic record hunt

While Sinner is the defending champion, Alcaraz leads 10-6 in their head-to-head record and bumped Sinner from the season-ending world number one spot.

They met in a light-hearted exhibition match in South Korea last weekend, the pair's only warm-up for Melbourne, with Alcaraz coming out on top.

Such is the dominance of "Sincaraz", as they are being called, they have shared the last eight Grand Slam titles, picking up four each since Djokovic won his 24th major at the 2023 US Open.

The Serb is back again at his most successful hunting ground, but there are questions over his fitness and form with the 38-year-old pulling out of this week's Adelaide International.

Still chasing a record 25th major crown, Djokovic could be at

his last Australian Open and will be desperate to win there again.

Djokovic made the semis at all four majors last year but went no further, admitting "I can do only as much as I can do".

World number three Zverev, along with Lorenzo Musetti, Alex de Minaur and Felix Auger-Aliassime, ranked five, six and seven respectively, will be looking to crash the party and win a first major.

Three-time losing finalist Medvedev is a dark horse after winning the lead-up Brisbane International, while American Learner Tien spearheads the new guard fresh from lifting the ATP Next Gen title.

Jakub Mensik and Joao Fonseca are also among the young talents looking to make a mark, while Alexander Bublik will fancy going deep after winning the Hong Kong Open and breaking into the top 10.

## Roma sunk by late Torino winner in Italian Cup

Roma crashed out of the Italian Cup on Tuesday as they lost 3-2 at home to Torino despite a goal from 16-year-old prodigy Antonio Arena.

Trailing 2-1 going into the final 10 minutes, Gian Piero Gasperini decided to bring on the Australian-born centre forward who has represented Italy in underage football since last year.

On his debut for Roma, Arena sent the Stadio Olimpico wild as his first touch of the ball was to head in a leveller for the hosts.

But Roman joy was short-lived as Emirhan Ilkhan netted a 90th-minute winner for Torino.

Earlier, a Che Adams brace either side of a strike by Mario Hermoso had given Torino the advantage.

Torino will face Serie A leaders Inter Milan in the next round.

# Semenyo an instant hit as Man City close on League Cup final

Antoine Semenyo made himself an instant Manchester City hero as Pep Guardiola's men took a giant stride towards the League Cup final with a 2-0 win at Newcastle.

The Ghana international, who joined from Bournemouth for £65 million (\$87 million) last week, opened the scoring and also had a second goal controversially ruled out.

But Rayan Cherki delivered what could be the knockout blow to the holders in the 98th minute.

The Magpies ended a 70-year wait for a domestic trophy by winning the League Cup last season, but will need a heroic fightback to reach Wembley when the sides meet again for the second leg of the semi-final on February 4.

Semenyo also scored on his debut on Saturday in a 10-1 demolition of Exeter in the FA Cup.

In previous years he would have been cup-tied after featuring for Bournemouth earlier in the competition.

Newcastle boss Eddie Howe made clear his dissatisfaction before the game with a rule change this season that allows

players to play for two clubs in the one campaign and City took full advantage.

Guardiola showed his desire to reach the final for the first time since 2021 as Erling Haaland made a first League Cup start in three years in a strong City selection just days before they visit Manchester United in the Premier League.

But that was the closest either side came in a cagey first half. City goalkeeper James Trafford had been a long-term target for Newcastle prior to his return to the Etihad from Burnley in July.

The England under-21 international has had to play second fiddle to Gianluigi Donnarumma for most of the season but proved his worth with a stunning save to claw away Wissa's looping header early in the second half.

Seconds later, Bruno Guimaraes blasted against the post as Newcastle pressed for the opening.

But they were caught with a sucker punch at the other end when Jeremy Doku sped towards the by-line and his cross was turned by Bernardo Silva into the path of Semenyo to prod home from close range.

# Sabalenka favourite at Australian Open but faces Swiatek, US threats

Top-ranked Aryna Sabalenka is favourite to win a third Australian Open in four years but faces strong competition from a United States contingent led by Coco Gauff and defending champion Madison Keys.

World number two Iga Swiatek is another big threat while two-time Melbourne champion Naomi Osaka will hope to be in the mix when the first Grand Slam of the year begins on Sunday.

Keys stunned title-holder Sabalenka 12 months ago in a classic three-set final to win her first major title aged 29.

But she failed to kick on from there, not winning another tournament all year, and the world number nine will have a target on her back as the title holder.

Three other Americans are ranked inside the world's top 10: Gauff (third), Amanda Anisimova (fourth) and Jessica Pegula (sixth).

The 21-year-old Gauff last year beat Sabalenka at the French Open for her second major crown, but her best performance

on the Melbourne Park hard-courts was making the semi-finals in 2024.

Speaking at the mixed-teams United Cup, where she launched her 2026 campaign, Gauff said she spent the off-season "just overall becoming better and more comfortable with my

game".

Her serve has been her biggest failing and she suffered a surprise defeat to Spain's Jessica Bouzas Maneiro at the United Cup, but recovered to defeat Swiatek 6-4, 6-2 in a statement victory. It was Gauff's fourth win in a row over Swiatek.

The 24-year-old Anisimova has emerged as a serious threat after enjoying the best year of her career in 2025, reaching the finals of Wimbledon and the US Open, and winning 1000 titles in Beijing and Qatar.

She also made the season-ending WTA Finals for the first time,

going down to Sabalenka in three sets in a high-octane semi-final.

"She always pushes me to play my best tennis," said Sabalenka.

Like Pegula, a first major title remains elusive for Anisimova despite going close.

Swiatek, Sabalenka's long-term rival for the top ranking, is overdue something special in Melbourne.

The Pole is a six-time Grand Slam champion and the Australian Open is the only major she has yet to win.

She matched her best Melbourne performance by reaching last year's semi-finals, and did so in rampant style, only to lose to an inspired Keys.

"At a Grand Slam you have to really play great for two weeks, not have any bad days, be consistent," the 24-year-old said at the United Cup.

Japan's former world number one Osaka would be a popular winner if she were to add to her 2019 and 2021 Melbourne triumphs.

Now ranked 16th, the 28-year-old must rank as an outsider, capable of conjuring up her best tennis in flashes but unable to

do it consistently and stay fit for

long stretches.

World number five Elena Rybakina, the Moscow-born Kazakh, is another to watch.

## Imperious Sabalenka

It is hard to look beyond Sabalenka.

Having been stunned by the unfancied Keys, the Belarusian suffered more Grand Slam heartbreak in the French Open final against Gauff.

She then went down to Anisimova in the Wimbledon last four, before roaring back to get revenge over the American and retain her US Open title.

The Australian Open champion in 2023 and 2024, Sabalenka will be in an unfamiliar role when she goes into the tournament as runner-up from 12 months ago.

"Honestly, there is no difference," the hard-hitting Sabalenka said in Brisbane this month, where she won the title for a second successive year in an ominous statement of intent.

"Every time, if I'm defending champion, if I lost first round last year, the goal is always the same -- to bring my best tennis and to improve my game."

## Al Khaldiya Strengthen Hold On Title



## Mitchell century powers New Zealand to historic chase in India

Daryl Mitchell produced a commanding unbeaten century as New Zealand pulled off their highest successful run chase in India, beating the hosts by seven wickets in the second one-day international in Rajkot yesterday to level the three-match series 1-1.

New Zealand's reply had wobbled early as India's fast bowlers reduced them to 46 for 2 before Mitchell and Will Young turned the contest around with a decisive 162-run stand for the third wicket.

Young made a composed 87 off 98 balls, giving Mitchell the platform to attack India's spin-

ners, particularly Kuldeep Yadav, as the pitch quickened under the evening lights and New Zealand ended an eight-match losing streak against India in one-day internationals.
