# Unified strategy

Shura to review Gulf insurance amendments and plant genetic resources system

The Shura Council meets today to take up two GCC-wide draft laws, one amending the unified insurance scheme for GCC citizens working outside their home country, and another setting a common framework for plant genetic resources for food and agriculture, according to committee reports recommending approval.

The Council is due to debate the Services Committee's report on changes to the Unified System for Insurance Protection Extension to GCC citizens working in another member state.

The draft law aims to widen insurance cover, update how contributions are collected, and strengthen links between civil pension bodies and social insurance authorities across the GCC.

The committee said the changes are aimed, in particular, at activating unemployment insurance, described in the report as a key form of social cover.

Under the proposal, a worker covered by the system would receive temporary financial compensation if they lose their job, in line with the rules and conditions set by the relevant laws.

## Stability

The report said the draft law is framed to support the stability of pension and social insurance systems across GCC states by improving organisational and coordination arrangements tied to cross-border cover.

It points to sharper contribution collection, stronger data exchange and more regular insurance registration as steps that would support the financial position of the relevant bodies and help them keep carrying out their role.

The committee also said the draft text protects the rights of national workers under the unified system and does not reduce any existing insurance rights or benefits set by current legislation, including cover, compensation entitlements and access to those benefits.

## Contributions

On payments, the committee said the proposal would make it easier for employers to pay

contributions by allowing multiple payment channels, taking account of differences in procedures between GCC states and wider use of modern collection methods.

The aim, it said, is to cut paperwork, reduce late payment and improve compliance with due dates.

The report also describes a shift in how insurance data is shared.

Under the current arrangement, employers provide the relevant data to the pension or social insurance body in the state where the employee works, and that body then notifies its counterpart in the employee's home state.

The proposed amendment

would make the employer directly responsible for providing the data to the competent bodies in both the country of employment and the employee's home country.

The committee said the draft also spells out that paying an end-of-service gratuity or other worker compensation does not stop the recovery of rights due under the unified system to the employee or worker, or to the civil pension body or social insurance authority.

The wording is intended to remove confusion over whether labour compensation affects outstanding insurance obligations.

The Council is also expected to review the Public Utilities

and Environment Committee's report on a draft law approving a unified GCC system on plant genetic resources for food and agriculture.

The proposed system would cover the monitoring, classification, assessment, documentation and protection of plant genetic resources, regulate their movement into and out of GCC states, set rules for fair and equal sharing of benefits arising from their use, and encourage related research.

The committee said the draft law forms part of a wider legislative framework aimed at strengthening protection for agricultural and food plant resources, and links it to preserving Bahrain's plant and agricultural heritage.

It also said the system is intended to ensure Bahrain receives a fair share of benefits when those resources are used in research or industry inside or outside the Kingdom.

# UK aircraft carrier group to deter Russian threats

Britain will deploy its aircraft carrier group to the North Atlantic this year in a "powerful show of force" against Russian threats in the Arctic, Prime Minister Keir Starmer said Saturday.

"I can announce today that the UK will deploy our carrier strike group to the North Atlantic and the High North this year, led by HMS Prince of Wales, operating

alongside the US, Canada and other NATO allies in a powerful show of our commitment to Euro-Atlantic security," Starmer told the Munich security conference.

The group will include warships, F-35 jets and helicopters in what has been dubbed "Operation Firecrest," the ministry of defence said in a statement.

It will be a "powerful show of force ... to deter Russian aggres-

sion and protect vital undersea infrastructure".

HMS Prince of Wales is the Royal Navy's largest warship and US aircraft are also expected to operate from its deck.

## Operation

The operation will involve

thousands of personnel from the army, navy and air force, the

ministry statement added.

"The deployment will include

activity under NATO's Arctic Sentry mission, launched this week, strengthening the Alliance's security in a region where melting sea ice is opening new routes and increasing threat from hostile state activity," the ministry said.

France has also announced that it will deploy its aircraft carrier group in the region in 2026.

Starmer told the Munich

conference that Britain must be

"ready to fight".

## Aggression

Leaders must not dither as "Russia has proved its appetite for aggression," he said.

"The road ahead is straight and it is clear. We must build our hard power, because that is the currency of the age," he added.

"We must be able to deter aggression, and, yes, if necessary, we must be ready to fight."

# Smarter health

Artificial Intelligence strengthens primary care but can't replace human touch

**A**rtificial Intelligence is an amplifier of primary healthcare, not its foundation. Primary care must always remain human at its core," said Dr. Yahya Alfarsi, Author and Professor of Epidemiology & Public Health at Sultan Qaboos University, Oman.

He was speaking on artificial intelligence in medicine at the second edition of the Primary Healthcare Conference and Exhibition, which took off last Thursday at the Gulf Hotel in Juffair.

The real goal, he said, is "smart populations" - using technology not to replace humans, but to empower people to make healthier choices while keeping care personal, compassionate, and human-centred.

## Challenges

One of the major challenges is determining what we should do by ourselves, and what should be delegated to robots and AI platforms.

Primary healthcare depends on information before it depends on intervention where

digital tools are excellent in data generation, integration and providing indicators and analytics.

We have wearables today which can record vital signs, track sleep patterns, monitor menstrual cycles, and apps that host wellness sessions and much more, capturing a holistic view of health like never before. They can support care pathways, improve efficiency, and even predict health risks.

But there is one thing AI cannot replace, human judgment, empathy, and connection.

The old adage that "half of a patient's illness is cured the moment a doctor truly listens" remains as true as ever.

While AI bots excel at generating and managing data, the interpretation, dissemination, and action on that information must remain in the hands of primary healthcare professionals, the action place being PHCs.

"If we don't invest in making human-based decisions in primary health care today, mobile health platforms and digital tools could eventually become the "orchestrator" of healthcare. But let's be honest, primary care doesn't live in sensors or screens, it lives in people," said Dr. Yahya Alfarsi.

COVID times taught us this lesson very clearly.

Technology made consulta-

tions easier, even remote but despite that, rates of depression and mental health challenges were on the rise. We realized that human interaction, listening, and empathy cannot be digitized.

## Future

Looking closely at the health needs of GCC countries, non-communicable diseases take the largest share of the burden, followed by newborn and child health, immunization, oral and dental health, maternal care, and nutrition.

But one area remains critically overlooked, mental health.

## Three to serve jail term after sentence reversal

**T**he Deputy Head of the Execution Prosecution at the Public Prosecution announced the cancellation of the alternative sentences granted to three convicted individuals and ordered the enforcement of their original sentence of three months' imprisonment.

The decision came after it was proven that the individuals committed the offense of failing to disclose their financial information in ongoing civil execution cases against them.

This violated legal provisions requiring debtors to disclose their assets to satisfy enforceable court judgments.

The competent court had previously sentenced each of them to three months in prison but replaced the original sentence with an alternative

penalty aimed at repairing the damage, after the convicts initiated financial disclosure as required by law.

However, they later failed to comply with the alternative sentence by refusing to complete the required disclosure, and the given period expired without fulfilling its conditions.

This led to the cancellation of the alternative sentence and the enforcement of the original prison term.

The Deputy Head of the Execution Prosecution also emphasized that the Enforcement Law is designed to balance the rights of creditors and debtors.

It protects the rights of creditors holding enforceable judgments while also allowing debtors to disclose their financial status, including any insolvency, to avoid compulsory enforcement measures.

## Hamala potholes, parking crisis

**H**amala's commercial strip, widely recognised for its concentration of vehicle repair workshops, faces mounting complaints over deteriorating infrastructure, abandoned cars and an acute shortage of parking. Traders warn that liveli-

hoods are at risk.

In what many describe as a funny fact to ignore, the area is known primarily for fixing cars, yet its broken and uneven roads are said to damage them.

Shop owners say deep potholes and unpaved stretches have turned the journey into a risk, particularly for owners of new or high value vehicles.

## Site turned into waste dump

Residents of Diraz Block 544 say that although the scrap vehicles previously stored on the fenced plot have been removed for some time, the long-awaited transformation of the land into a community facility has yet to materialise.

Earlier discussions had raised expectations that once the abandoned and damaged cars were cleared, the site would be repurposed into a project serving the neighbourhood.

Ideas ranged from a vegetable market to a service facility that could benefit nearby homes.

For families living around the area, the removal of the vehicles marked a positive first step towards meaningful change.

### Reality

Today, however, residents say the cleared land has effectively turned into a dumping ground.

Instead of scrapped cars, the plot now contains scattered waste, broken tree branches and discarded materials, leaving the space visually unappealing and environmentally concerning.

Despite being fenced, unpleasant odours are reported to emanate from the site, particularly during warmer hours.

Some residents also wor-

ry about the potential spread of insects and rats, given its close proximity to residential properties.

Families say the current state of the plot does not reflect the area's identity or the aspirations once attached to its redevelopment.

### Expectation

Residents hope the relevant authorities, including the Northern Municipal Council, will provide clarity on the land's future and outline a clear development timeline.

For the community, the matter is not about criticism but about ensuring that a cleared space is finally transformed into something that genuinely serves the people.

He doesn't just write words, he flips them, reversing their letters at lightning speed, as if it's the most natural thing in the world.


### Spot

His talent had already earned him a spot in the Limca Book of Records back in 1992, and on 6th August 2010, it brought him into the pages of the Guinness Book of World Records.

Job calls his skill gnilles, spelling backwards.

With a sharp mind, excellent memory, and an avid reader since childhood, he can spot any spelling mistake in any print instantly.

In 1992, he entered the Limca Book of Records after writing the entire first chapter of the Gospel according to St. John (King James Version) in reverse

in 36 minutes and 24 seconds at Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Ernakulam.

On 12th March 2010, at the Ernakulam Press Club, Job amazed everyone by reversing 50 random words from medicine, law, literature, and science.

He spelled them all backwards aloud in just 1 minute and 40.14 seconds, breaking the previous record of 2 minutes and 20 seconds held by Deborah Prebble from London.

The audience, which included teachers, doctors, and journalists, watched in awe.

Speaking to The Daily Tribune, Job traces his skill back to his teenage years, when he first started journaling.

He discovered a playful way to keep his diary private from curious siblings and parents, writing his entries backwards.

What started as a simple pastime soon became a fascination, and over time, this quirky habit evolved into a remarkable talent, one that now dazzles anyone who witnesses it in action.

### Talent

Growing up, he recalls an

environment that didn't really encourage his talent.

He joined Grade 1 straight, struggled to keep up, and was often bullied or called slow.

Watching his peers read and write English effortlessly, he felt left behind. He switched to an English-medium school at grade 5, where he quickly picked up words, became an avid reader, and developed a strong vocabulary, eventually becoming a gifted reverse speller, able to read and write words backward effortlessly.

◆ **US Secretary of State**

Marco Rubio sought to reassure a nervous Europe yesterday, saying that Washington wanted to recharge the transatlantic alliance so that a strong Europe could help the US on its mission of global "renewal". Speaking at a security conference in Munich after months of turmoil in US-European relations sparked by US President Donald Trump's vows to seize Greenland and his often derisive remarks about US allies, Washington's top diplomat struck a markedly soothing tone. "We do not seek to separate, but to revitalise an old friendship and renew the greatest civilisation in human history," Rubio said, calling for "a reinvigorated alliance." "We want Europe to be strong," Rubio said, adding that the continent and the US "belong together." He echoed Trump administration's oft-stated assertion that immigration posed a threat, saying that "mass migration" was "a crisis which is transforming and destabilising societies all across the West."

**Nobel winner transferred to prison in northern Iran: husband**



The Norwegian Nobel Committee said this week it was "deeply appalled" by reports detailing "physical abuse and ongoing life-threatening mistreatment" of Mohammadi both during her arrest and in detention. Since her arrest, Mohammadi had been held in Mashhad at the detention facility of the intelligence ministry and had only been allowed one phonecall with a brother inside Iran and another to her Iranian lawyer.

◆ **The US military** said yesterday that its forces had struck more than 30 Islamic State group targets in Syria this month, maintaining pressure on the jihadists after a deadly attack on US troops last year. The strikes also came as the United States Central Command (CENTCOM) in recent weeks transferred thousands of IS detainees from Syria to Iraq, after they had been held in prisons run for years by Kurdish-led forces. US forces "conducted 10 strikes against more than 30 ISIS targets in Syria... to sustain relentless military pressure on remnants from the terrorist network," a CENTCOM statement said, using another acronym for IS. The air strikes, carried out between February 3 and February 12, hit IS "infrastructure and weapons storage targets", it said.

The United States has long been the democratic island's most important backer and biggest arms provider, and Taiwan would be heavily reliant on US support in a potential conflict with China.

Speaking at the Munich Security Conference in Germany, Foreign Minister Wang said that in the future, the United States could adopt a China policy that involves "instigating and plotting to split China through Taiwan, crossing China's red line".

"This could very likely lead to a confrontation between China and the United States," he said.

He added that he hoped Washington would pursue a "positive and pragmatic" approach, "but we are also prepared to deal with various

risks".

China claims self-ruled Taiwan as its own territory and has not ruled out the use of force to bring it under its control.

During his Saturday comments, Wang also weighed in on Beijing's current relationship with Tokyo, which has been under heavy strain since Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi took office in October.

"The Japanese people should no longer allow themselves to be manipulated or deceived by those far-right forces, or by those who seek to revive militarism," Wang said.

# Son of last shah calls on Trump to 'help' Iranian people

Trump declined to say who he would want to take over in Iran

**T**he exiled son of Iran's last shah called on US President Donald Trump yesterday to help the Iranian people, a day after the American leader said a change of power would be the "best thing".

US-based Reza Pahlavi, who has not returned to Iran since before the 1979 Islamic revolution that ousted the monarchy, added it was "time to end the Islamic republic" while speaking to reporters at the Munich Security Conference.

The opposition figure has urged Iranians at home and abroad to continue demonstrations against the authorities, calling on them to chant slogans from their homes and rooftops at 8:00 pm on Saturday and Sunday, to coincide with protests in Germany and elsewhere.

Trump had said Friday that a change of government in Iran would be the "best thing that could happen", as he sent a second aircraft carrier to the Middle East to ratchet up military pressure on the Islamic republic.

He had earlier threatened mil-

# Navalny poisoned with dart frog toxin in Russian prison, European states say

**F**ive European states, including Britain, France and Germany, said yesterday that Russian opposition leader Alexei Navalny was killed by a "rare toxin" from a dart frog and that the Russian state was the prime suspect in the death.

Navalny, a staunch critic of Russian President Vladimir Putin, died in an Arctic prison on February 16, 2024, while serving a 19-year prison sentence on charges widely seen as retribution for his opposition.

"The UK, Sweden, France, Germany and The Netherlands are confident that Alexei Navalny was poisoned with a lethal toxin," the countries said in a joint statement released at the Munich Security Conference. It said the results followed "analyses of samples" from his body.

According to the European states, a toxin found in the skin of South American dart frogs known as epibatidine was found on laboratory analyses of samples from his body.

"Russia claimed that Navalny died of natural causes. But given the toxicity of epibatidine and

reported symptoms, poisoning was highly likely the cause of his death", said the statement.

"Navalny died while held in prison, meaning Russia had the means, motive and opportunity to administer this poison to him," the countries said.

Britain's foreign office said separately that "only the Russian state had the means, motive and opportunity to deploy this lethal toxin". It added: "We hold it (Russia) responsible for his death".

Navalny's widow, Yulia Navalnaya, said it was now "science-proven" that the Kremlin opponent had been murdered.

"Two years ago I came on stage here and said that it was Vladimir Putin who killed my husband," Navalnaya said on the sidelines of the conference in Germany.

"I was of course certain that it was a murder... but back then it was just words. But today these words have become sci-

ence-proven facts," Navalnaya added.

Navalnaya last September said that laboratory analysis of smuggled biological samples found he was killed by poisoning.

"Today, beside his widow, the UK is shining a light on the Kremlin's barbaric plot to silence his voice," UK Foreign Secretary Yvette Cooper, who met Navalnaya while attending the Munich conference, said in a statement.

French foreign minister Jean-Noel Barrot paid "tribute" to Navalny after the findings.



Navalny was previously poisoned with the Soviet-era nerve agent Novichok in 2020 while campaigning in Siberia and was flown to Germany on an emergency evacuation flight, where he spent months recovering.




# Zelensky pokes fun at Orbán's 'belly' @ Munich

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky poked fun at Hungarian leader Victor Orbán's "belly" in his address to the Munich Security Conference on Saturday, saying Ukraine's fight against Russia allowed Europe to live freely.

Zelensky, a 48-year-old former comedian, was describing how Europe gains from having Ukrainian forces battling Russian troops in Ukraine.

Ukraine's relations with neighbouring Hungary have been strained by Orbán's support for Russia and have deteri-



orated further in recent weeks as the veteran leader has ramped up attacks on Ukraine ahead of a closely fought parliamentary election in April.

"There can be a sovereign Moldova and a Romania without dictatorship and even one Victor can think about how to grow his belly, not how to grow his army to stop Russian tanks from returning to the streets of Budapest," Zelensky said.

"But look at the price. Look at the price, look at the pain Ukraine has gone through, look at the suffering Ukraine has faced. It's Ukrainians who are holding the European front," he said.

Although Ukraine applied to join the European Union days after Russia invaded, it has been unable to advance accession talks because of Orbán's vetoes.

Unlike other European countries, Hungary has not diversified its imports from Russia since Moscow's assault on Ukraine.

## Bangladesh PM-to-be Rahman thanks those who 'sacrificed for democracy'

Bangladesh's prime minister-in-waiting Tarique Rahman yesterday dedicated his landslide election win to those who "sacrificed for democracy", calling for unity after the first polls since a deadly 2024 uprising.

Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) chief Rahman, 60, the scion of one of the most powerful political dynasties, is set to lead the South Asian nation of 170 million people after sweeping elections on Thursday.

"This victory belongs to Bangladesh, belongs to democracy," he said, in his first speech since the vote. "This victory belongs to people who aspire to and have sacrificed for democracy."

He will take over from an interim government that has steered Bangladesh since the student-led uprising ended the iron-fisted rule of Sheikh Hasina in August 2024.

The success of BNP chief Rahman marks a remarkable turnaround for a man who only returned to Bangladesh in December after 17 years in exile in Britain, far from Dhaka's political storms.

The BNP alliance won 212

seats, compared with 77 for the Jamaat-e-Islami-led alliance, according to the Electoral Commission.

The Election Commission said turnout was 59 percent across 299 constituencies out of 300 in which voting took place.

Only seven women were elected, although a further 50 seats in parliament reserved for women will be named from party lists.

Voters on Thursday also endorsed proposals in a referendum for a sweeping democratic reform charter backed by Yunus, to overhaul what he called a "completely broken"

system of government and to prevent a return to one-party rule.

Those include prime ministerial term limits, a new upper house of parliament, stronger presidential powers and greater judicial independence.

But Rahman said the new government he will lead faces daunting challenges.

"We are about to begin our journey in a situation marked by a fragile economy left behind by an authoritarian regime, weakening constitutional and structural institutions, and destroying law and order," he said.

## Palestinian leader urges removal of all Israeli 'obstacles' on Gaza ceasefire

Palestinian president Mahmud Abbas called yesterday for the removal of "all obstacles" he said Israel has imposed on implementing phase two of the Gaza ceasefire.

"We emphasise the need to

lift all obstacles imposed by the Israeli occupation on the implementation of the provisions related to the second phase of the agreement," Abbas said, in a speech read by his prime minister Mohammed Mustafa at an African Union summit in Ethiopia.

This included the work of a technocratic committee established to oversee the daily governance of Gaza, he added.

Removal of the obstacles was needed to "ensure continuity of services, coordinate humanitarian efforts and enable a swift recovery", the president said.

# Al Rayyan's Dynasty continues with West Asian 4-Peat

Bahrain's Dar Kulaib Endure Heartbreaking Runner-Up Finish

The Kingdom's representatives endured a difficult end to their West Asia campaign yesterday, as Dar Kulaib settled for silver while Al Ahli finished fourth on the closing day of the fourth West Asia Men's Clubs Volleyball Championship in Kuwait. Dar Kulaib's pursuit of a first West Asian title was halted by Qatar's Al Rayyan, who secured a historic fourth consecutive crown with a 3-1 victory, taking the sets 25-22, 25-22, 13-25, 25-18.

The final was closely contested early on, with Dar Kulaib matching the defending champions in the opening two sets before Al Rayyan edged both at crucial moments. The Bahraini side responded impressively in

the third, dominating 25-13 to reduce the deficit and shift momentum. However, Al Rayyan's experience resurfaced in the fourth set as they regained control to close out the match and

complete an unprecedented four-peat. The final point came following a failed serve from Dar Kulaib's captain Mahmood Abdulwahed, sparking jubilant celebrations for the Qatari side.

Al Rayyan's victory also secured them a spot in the upcoming AVC Champions League in Pontianak, Indonesia, this May, reinforcing their regional dominance. They have now won every edition of the championship, beginning with the inaugural tournament in 2023 in Jordan, followed by consecutive undefeated campaigns in 2024 in Oman and 2025 in Bahrain. Their 2026 triumph cements their position as the benchmark of West Asian volleyball.

For Dar Kulaib, the defeat marked a valiant end to an impressive tournament. They topped their group with two

wins and a loss, then advanced past fellow Bahrainis Al Ahli in the semi-finals. Under head coach Ivan Joksimovic, they return home with silver medals, their best achievement in the competition to date. Individual awards highlighted their standout performers: Ali Habib as a top setter, Bilal Abu Naboot as first-best middle hitter, Hassan Al Warqaa as second-best middle hitter, and Enoch Mogeni as best right-side hitter.

Earlier in the day, Al Ahli were beaten 3-0 by Kuwait Club in the bronze-medal match, with set scores of 25-23, 25-20, 25-21. The hosts proved more clinical in key moments, while Al Ahli, competing without a foreign professional, found it difficult to recover from their semi-final loss.

## Suryakumar says India v Pakistan 'not just another game'

"We don't play them often, don't even play them regularly," said the Indian skipper.

"But at the end of the day, we try to keep things simple and try to execute our best game."

"There is pressure, but there is a big opportunity," said Suryakumar.

"According to me, when you play an India-Pakistan game, it's more about the occasion."

The Indian captain would not say whether his players would shake hands after snubbing the Pakistan team in three Asia Cup meetings in Dubai last year.

"I will break the suspense tomorrow," he said.

"Wait for 24 hours, let us play the game which is more important."

India achieved a hard-fought 29-run win against United States in their

first match of their title defence in Mumbai a week ago, before crushing Namibia by 93 runs in Delhi on Thursday.

But Suryakumar played down the hype around Pakistan spinner Usman Tariq and his unique sling-arm bowling action that has an exaggerated pause in the delivery stride.

"We have practised with similar types of bowlers and similar actions so we will try to execute what we are practising in the night sessions," said Suryakumar.

Suryakumar said dashing opener Abhishek Sharma has recovered well from a stomach bug and was likely to play.

Both Pakistan and India have won their opening two Group A matches and the winners will qualify for the Super Eight Stage.

"You've got to keep coming back, keep trying hard, keep practising. Luckily, today's my day."
