Ukraine to get huge supply of **NATO** weapons

NATO Secretary General Mark Rutte said yesterday that Ukraine will get a huge supply of weapons to boost its war effort against Russia under a new arms supply deal struck with the

"It will mean that Ukraine gets its hands on really massive numbers of military equipment, both for air defense, but also missiles, ammunition," he told reporters at a White House meeting with President Donald Trump.

Trump said the supply amounted to "billions of dollars" worth of munitions and weapons, including Patriot anti-missile systems.

President Volodymyr Zelensky met yesterday with US special envoy Keith Kellogg in Kyiv and discussed air defence and sanctions on Russia during a "productive" conversation, the Ukrainian leader said.

Israel strikes kill 22 in Gaza
