Bahrain greets Indian leaders

Six receive fines for running unlicensed education centres

Six people have been fined between BD1,000 and BD2,000 for running unlicensed educational services, the Lower Criminal Court ruled, according to the Chief of the Ministries and Public Bodies Prosecution.

The case followed referrals from the Education Ministry after field teams visited private institutions across Bahrain.

Inspectors found six centres offering classes without ministry licences.

These centres taught a range of subjects to children aged three to 18. Enrolment at some reached 60.

Inspectors also found that required safety rules for kindergartens had not been met.

Basic preventive steps were missing, safety fittings were poor, and approved child-protection rules were not followed, posing a direct risk to children and staff.

Modern Islamic learning hub



His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, the Crown Prince and Prime Minister, deputised the Deputy Prime Minister, His Excellency Shaikh Khalid bin Abdulla Al Khalifa, to inaugurate the new Abdullah bin Khalid College of Islamic Studies building in Riffa. The new building was constructed on a 4,177-square-metre plot, with a total built up area of 3,567 square metres. The opening ceremony, organised by the Ministry of Education, was attended by H.E. Shaikh Khalid bin Ahmed Al Khalifa, Minister of the Royal Court; H.E. Lieutenant General Dr. Shaikh Mohammed bin Abdullah Al Khalifa, Chairman of the Supreme Council of Health; and H.E. Shaikh Salman bin Khalifa Al Khalifa, Minister of Finance and National Economy.

Security at risk

Arab nations strongly denounce Netanyahu's remarks supporting expanded 'Greater Israel'

Arab nations have slammed comments by Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu apparently expressing support for the idea of an expanded "Greater Israel", calling the remarks a threat to their sovereignty at an especially tense time for the region.

The term "Greater Israel" refers to a biblical interpretation of the nation's territory during the time of King Solomon, encompassing not only the present-day Palestinian territories of Gaza and the occupied West Bank, but also parts of modern Jordan, Lebanon and Syria.

Ultra-nationalist Israelis have called for these territories to be occupied.

Vision

Asked on Tuesday by i24NEWS interviewer Sharon Gal if he subscribed to such a "vision" for a Greater Israel, Netanyahu said "absolutely", adding, "If you ask me what I think, we're there."

He then pivoted to a comment about the founding of Israel and the "great mission" of ensuring its continued existence.

Israel's neighbour Jordan on Wednesday condemned the prime minister's Greater Israel remarks as a "dangerous and

provocative escalation" and "a threat to the sovereignty of states".

A spokesman for its foreign ministry went on to reject what he called Netanyahu's "inflammatory" rhetoric and "delusional claims".

Egypt also said on Wednesday that it had "requested clarification on this matter", characterising it as tantamount to a

"rejection of the option of peace in the region".

Netanyahu's remarks come in the midst of a 22-month war between Israel and the Palestinian group Hamas in the Gaza Strip that has repeatedly spilled over into the wider Middle East and provoked frequent condemnation of Israel from across the Arab world.

Yesterday, Iraq's foreign min-

istry condemned the comments, saying they revealed Israel's "expansionist ambitions" and were "a clear provocation to the sovereignty of countries".

Gaza mediator Qatar also decried Netanyahu's statements calling them "absurd" and "inflammatory".

The allusion to an expanded Israel also comes as far-right members of Netanyahu's cab-

inet demand the conquest of Gaza and annexation of the West Bank, where the government recently approved a rash of new settlements considered illegal under international law.

Saudi Arabia on Wednesday voiced "its total rejection of the ideas and plans for colonisation and expansion adopted by the Israeli occupation authorities", reiterating "the historical and legal right of the Palestinian people to establish their independent state".

Outcry

In February, Netanyahu in a television interview provoked an outcry from Arab countries after he suggested a Palestinian state could be established on Saudi land.

In Tuesday's sit-down, the premier also revived calls to "allow" Palestinians to leave Gaza, telling Israeli broadcaster i24NEWS that "we are not pushing them out, but we are allowing them to leave".

Past calls to resettle Gazans outside of the war-battered territory, including from US President Donald Trump, have sparked fears of displacement among Palestinians and condemnation from the international community.

'Acute food insecurity'

Over 4.4m Somalis face severe hunger amid growing conflict

More than four million people in Somalia face "acute food insecurity", while over 100,000 have been displaced by conflict since June, its disaster

authorities said yesterday.

Somalia is grappling with a resurgence of the extremist militant group Al-Shabaab, alongside clashes between regional forces and the federal army.

The Horn of Africa nation is

among the most vulnerable to climate change, according to the United Nations, and in the last five years has experienced both the worst drought in four decades and once-in-a-century flooding.

The food crisis has surged 29 percent since earlier this year, driven by prolonged drought, conflict and reduced humanitarian assistance, the Somali Disaster Management Agency (SODMA) said.

"Somalia faces a severe food security crisis with an estimated 4.4 million people experiencing acute food insecurity," SODMA said in an X statement.

Court upholds nine-year prison term for fatal Saar crash driver

Nine-year jail term upheld yesterday for the driver in the Saar crash that killed three members of one family, with judges also keeping a BD3,000 fine, a one-year post-release driving-licence suspension, and the seizure of his car and the drugs.

The High Criminal Court, sitting as an appeals court, accepted two appeals in form, one on the fatal traffic case and another on possession of narcotics for personal use.

Rulings

On the merits, it unanimously dismissed both and left the first-instance rulings intact.

Case papers state the defendant drove under the influence of drugs and alcohol, above the

He crossed into the opposite lane in Saar and struck the vic-

tims' vehicle, causing the deaths of a husband, wife and their child, and leaving the other two children with serious injuries.

In a linked file, a warrant issued by the prosecution led to a search of the defendant's home.

Cannabis

Substances found there were confirmed by lab tests to be cannabis (hashish).

At first instance, the courts imposed a total of nine years' imprisonment and a BD3,000 fine, ordered a one-year suspension of the driving licence to begin after the prison term, and ordered the confiscation of the vehicle and the drugs. The defendant appealed.

The High Criminal Court, sitting as an appeals court, heard both files and delivered yesterday's decisions.

An Asian worker will hear his fate on 26 August after being accused of striking his roommate with a meat cleaver during a dispute over work, leaving him with a lasting injury assessed at five per cent.

The First High Criminal Court was told the 32-year-old attacked the man on 7 May, causing a dent in the bone at the centre of his forehead and a visible deformity.

According to prosecutors, the pair were arguing inside their shared accommodation when the defendant, said to be heavily drunk, pulled a cleaver from his clothing and struck the victim once above the right eye.

Medical examination confirmed a permanent impairment to the forehead.

Witnesses backed the victim's account, including another man who lived with them.

The defendant admitted to prosecutors that he had attacked his colleague with a knife but claimed he could not recall the incident because of his state of intoxication.

He repeated the admission when his detention was renewed.

The Coast Guard recorded 179 reports in June: 117 search-and-rescue operations and vessel

breakdowns, 12 maritime accidents and 50 urgent assists at sea.

Civil Defence responded to 1,176 reports, among

them 218 fires and 592 requests for assistance, plus 95 traffic incidents.

Crews also attended 40 reports of fallen trees.

Couple jailed for forcing woman into prostitution

A husband and wife have been jailed for three years in Bahrain and fined BD2,000 each for trafficking a compatriot woman into prostitution.

The First High Criminal Court ordered their permanent deportation after they serve their sentences and required them to cover the cost of returning the victim to her home country.

The case involved a promise of work as a hairdresser in a women's salon.

On arrival in Bahrain, the victim's passport was taken by the male defendant, who said he would keep it safe.

She stayed in the couple's flat, and was then told her work would be prostitution.

Police inquiries led to the couple, who were arrested and referred to the Public Prosecution, then sent to the First High Criminal Court.

The Public Prosecution said the woman came from a low-income family and had sought work to support her elderly mother. The female defendant arranged the job offer and travel.

The investigation began after a report from the Anti-Human Trafficking Division at the General Directorate of Criminal Investigation and Forensic Evidence.

Reviving old charm

New phase underway for BD8.8 million heritage-style villas in historic Muharraq

Dar Al Khaleej Trading and Contracting will start a new phase of the 'Reviving Historic Muharraq' project, building heritage-style villas worth BD8.8 million (BD8,877,750).

The work sits within the 'Al Fareej' scheme and covers new homes, repairs to existing houses, and service upgrades across selected sites.

Plans allow for grouped or stand-alone houses on scattered plots.

Heritage properties will be repaired, with façade works that include demolition and rebuild where needed.

Networks

Infrastructure will be renewed through new networks, the replacement of old lines, and links to main systems.

The package also adds parking areas, a mosque, planting, and site works.

Delivery will be coordinated with public and private bodies and follow agreed safety, health, and social procedures.

Villas of a distinct style are

also included under 'Al Fareej', based on approved detailed designs for acquired plots, cleared villa sites, and other areas in scope.

Bids

Three local companies submitted bids: Almoayyed Contracting at BD15 million; Cebarco Bahrain W.L.L. at BD8.3 million; and Dar Al Khaleej Trading and Contracting.

The wider Muharraq City Development Project, launched under Royal directives from His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa, is one of Bahrain's largest urban renewal schemes.

It covers about 300 housing units — grouped or individual — together with heritage façade works, demolition and rebuilding where required, and modern infrastructure tied to main networks.



Stage

This stage also provides a mosque, parking, and green spaces, alongside health, social, and safety measures delivered with the relevant authorities.

MP Hamad Farooq Al Doy, who represents Muharraq Governorate's Second Constituency, said the first phase is on schedule and noted preparatory steps such as expropriation payments for properties in the project zone.

He listed elements including a new bridge on Shaikh Isa Causeway between Busaiteen and Muharraq, a full refurbishment of Casino Garden, street works within the project's limits, and new parking after the removal of lots near Shaikh Isa Palace.

Mosques

He added that some mosques will be repaired while others will be rebuilt, with work started on Isa bin Ali Mosque and plans to begin

rebuilding Bin Hindi Mosque soon.

Next phases will extend across several neighbourhoods: demolition and rebuilding in Blocks 209 and 203, Firjan Al Shuyoukh, the Station area, Al Amamera, and Bin Hindi.

The first house in Firjan Al Muharraq is due to rise next month following site clearances.

Early phases target around 300 housing units near the palace, with completion of the full programme planned for 2030.

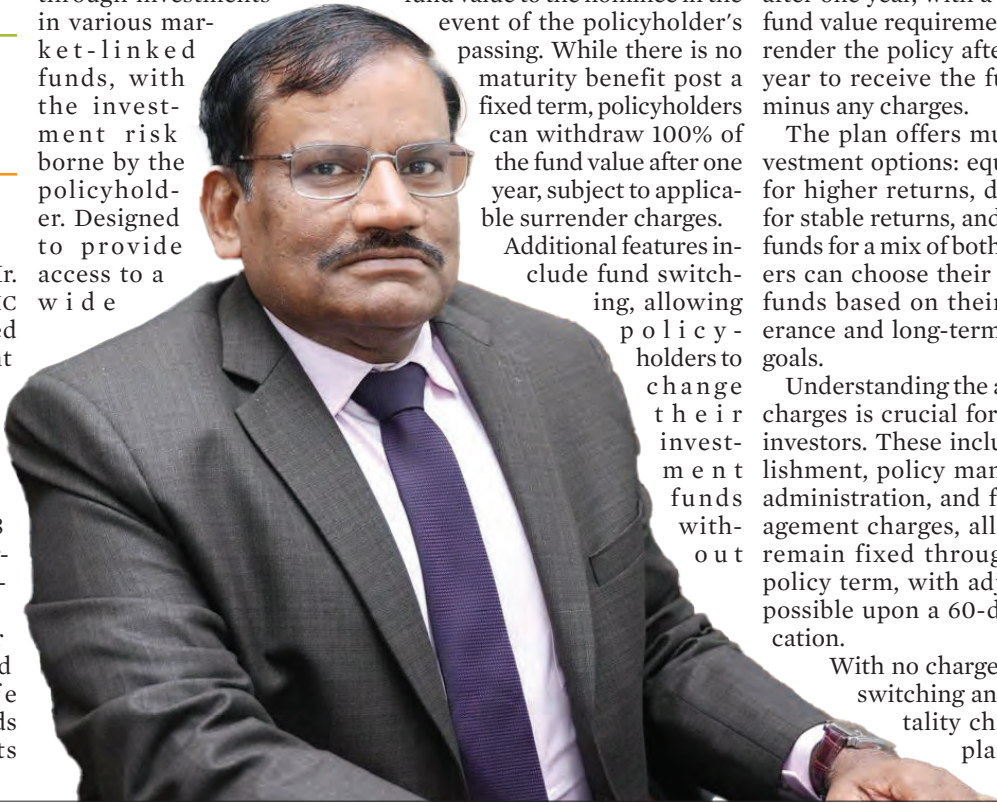

India's Cosmic Leap

A Billion Dreams, Will See Visits to Moon, Mars and Venus

Reaching for the stars is becoming an everyday affair at India's space agency, having visited the Moon and Mars with orbital missions, now eyes are set on a mission to Venus and a sample return from the Moon. Human space flight to fly an Indian citizen on an Indian rocket from Indian soil where the countdown will also be by India, is also taking shape fast.

India's space journey reached new heights with the successful landing of Chandrayaan-3 nearer the Moon's South Pole on August 23, 2023, making India the first country to achieve this feat. This mission demonstrated ISRO's capability in precision lunar landing and roving. The Vikram lander even performed a hop experiment, and the propulsion module was later maneuvered into Earth orbit for extended operations 2.

Building on this momentum, ISRO achieved its 100th rocket launch in January 2025, launching a navigation satellite, showcasing India's indigenous cryogenic engine technology.

The pinnacle came with the July 30, 2025 launch of the nearly \$1.3 billion NASA ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar or NISAR satellite, a joint Indo-US Earth observation mission. Launched aboard India's GSLV F-16, NISAR features dual-frequency SAR payloads from NASA and ISRO, and will mon-

itor climate change, disasters, and agriculture 5. ISRO Chairman Dr. V. Narayanan hailed it as a symbol of India's technological leadership and global collaboration, emphasizing the precision and reliability of India's cryogenic launch systems.

ISS

In a landmark achievement for India's space program, Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla completed a 20-day mission, including 18 days aboard the International Space Station (ISS), as part of the multinational Axiom-4 mission—dubbed Mission Akash Ganga. This marks India's first human spaceflight since Wing Commander Rakesh Sharma in 1984. Prime Minister Modi hailed Shukla's courage and dedication as inspiring a billion dreams.

Launched aboard SpaceX's Falcon 9, Shukla served as mission pilot and conducted seven India-specific experiments. Despite delays, the mission concluded successfully with a splashdown near San Diego. It lays the foundation for India's Gaganyaan mission, targeting a 2027 launch from Indian soil.

India's roadmap doesn't stop at Gaganyaan, Minister Modi outlined a bold vision: establish Indian space station by 2035 and land an Indian on

the moon by 2040. If successful, India will join the elite club of nations—Russia, the United States, and China—with independent indigenous human spaceflight capabilities.

India's lunar legacy is already formidable. India's first foray to the moon with the Chandrayaan-1 mission in 2008 discovered presence of water molecules on the moon, fundamentally altering lunar geological history forever. Chandrayaan-2 provided the first independent images of Apollo mission artefacts left on the lunar surface, and Chandrayaan-3 made global headlines by landing nearer the moon's South Pole—now considered the gold rush zone for lunar exploration.

Cost-effective

With cost-effective yet reliable space missions, India is poised to become a major player in the global space race. The government has already allocated billions of dollars for the human spaceflight program, underscoring its commitment to cosmic exploration.

India's science minister Dr. Jitendra Singh who also looks after the affairs of the Department of Space says 'India's quantum leap in space research with India's space economy standing at \$8 billion has been only possible due to the courageous decision to open up or unlock the space sector from the shackles of the past.' Further highlighting that 'India's space economy is projected to grow beyond \$40 billion by 2040 which is going to be a gigantic jump'.

The future space missions include lunar sample return mission named Chandrayaan-4; a mission to Ve-

nus; the development of the new mighty rocket, as part of this ambitious roadmap, India plans to establish its own space station, the Bhartiya Antariksha Station, by 2035. A precursor to this will be the launch of a space module in 2028. The culmination of this vision is the planned landing of an Indian astronaut on the moon by 2040.

"When we celebrate the 100th year of India's independence, in 2047, an Indian flag will already be flying on the moon" asserts Dr Singh.

In a historic collaboration between the United States and India, the NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar satellite, also known as NISAR, is poised to revolutionise how we observe and understand our planet, it launched successfully on July 30, 2025 from the Satish Dhawan space Center at Sriharikota in southern India. At its core, NISAR is designed to monitor changes in Earth's surface with unprecedented precision, capturing movements as small as a centimetre. This capability is vital for tracking natural hazards such as earthquakes, landslides, volcanic activity, and glacial shifts, as well as human-induced changes like urban expansion, agricultural development, and infrastructure stress.

NISAR

ISRO says the NISAR satellite weighs 2,392 kg, and it will scan the entire globe and provide all-weather, day-and-night data at a 12-day interval and enable a wide range of applications. NISAR satellite that has cost upwards of \$ 1.3 billion to make can detect changes in the Earth's surface, such as ground deformation, ice sheet movement and vegetation dynamics. Further applications include sea and ice classification, ship detection, shoreline monitoring, storm characterisation, changes in soil moisture, mapping and monitoring of surface water resources and disaster response. It has been dubbed a lifesaving satellite. Today over 250 space start-ups are driving innovation and fuelling India's space sector. Among these, Agnikul Cosmos and Skyroot Aerospace made headlines by launching sub-orbital rockets and Pixxel Aerospace makes unique high resolution satellites.

A recent study estimates that for every dollar spent on space, India has reportedly received a return of \$ 2.52. India has end to end capabilities in space, as the country makes its own rockets, satellites and has an enviable space technology applications portfolio. Today India has over fifty operational satellites in space which help power India's burgeoning economy. India's vast space ecosystem touches the lives of every Indian.

INDIAN RUPEE IN THE GULF

For many years the Indian Rupee was the official currency in several areas that were controlled by the British and governed from India; areas such as East Africa, Southern Arabia and the Arabian Gulf including Bahrain, Kuwait, Muscat, Qatar, Oman, and the Trucial States (now UAE). While the Indian rupee was replaced in East Africa by the Rupee of the Government of the East African Protectorate in 1905 (and later by the Florin and then the Shilling of the East African Currency Board) and again by the Shilling of the East African Currency Board in Southern Arabia in 1951, within the states of the Arabian Gulf the Indian rupee was still the official currency in 1959.

The rupees that were circulating in the Arabian Gulf had been bought by the various Gulf states from the Reserve Bank of India and were no liability to the Reserve Bank, as it held the sterling reserves by which the rupees had originally been purchased. However, Indian rupees were being smuggled from India to the states of the Arabian Gulf, where they were readily accepted in exchange for gold, which was in turn smuggled back into India.

While it was legal to own and to trade in gold within India, it was illegal to import or export gold. As the smuggled rupees, used to purchase the gold, were excess to the currency required for circulation within the Gulf states, they were repatriated to India through official channels and exchanged for pounds sterling. This meant that India was paying for the illegal importation of gold through its reserves of foreign exchange. For a while the Reserve Bank held sterling reserves with which the Gulf states had purchased the rupees used for circulation; the smuggled rupees being repatriated were a liability for which no foreign reserves had been allocated.

Smuggling

While smuggling had been a problem for many years, in 1957 and 1958 the problem rose to alarming proportions and took

a large toll on India's reserves of foreign exchange. It was estimated that, in the eight years to 1956, \$US245.7 million worth of rupees were smuggled out of India to the Arabian Gulf, and in 1957 India paid out \$US92.4 million in sterling to banks in the Arabian Gulf. The Indian government, in consultation with the governments of the states in the Arabian Gulf and the Bank of England, decided to address the problem by introducing special currency notes for circulation in the Arabian Gulf. The Arabian Gulf Rupee (XPGR), issued by the Reserve Bank of India, was created for use in the Arabian Gulf to reduce the drain on India's foreign reserves. The Indian Rupee was divisible into 16 Annas, and the Arabian Gulf Rupee was divisible into 100 Naye Paise. These notes were introduced in 1959 and became known as 'External Rupees' or 'Gulf Rupees'. The notes were of like the notes being circulated

in India except that the notes were of different colors; they were payable only at Bombay (rather than 'at any office of issue'); and they carried a special serial number prefix of 'Z' over a number.

Special notes

At the time the 'special' notes were introduced, the Reserve Bank of India realized that, while many notes were being returned from the Gulf States, a great number of Indian rupees were being repatriated from Saudi Arabia as well. The rupees were being taken to Saudi Arabia each year by Haj pilgrims and exchanged for Saudi Arabian riyals. Under arrangements in place with banks in Saudi Arabia, Indian rupees could be repatriated to the Reserve Bank of India in Bombay for conversion into pounds sterling. To ensure that no smuggled rupees could be returned from the Arabian Gulf via the Saudi Arabian

banks, the Reserve Bank of India introduced two special 'Haj notes' at the same time that the Gulf rupees were introduced. Haj Notes were distinct because it was a restricted legal tender in specific Gulf nations accepting the Indian rupee, like the United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Bahrain, Kuwait, and Oman. These notes were not recognized in India. They were also distinguishable by their color and were having Serial no 'HA'. The Indian Haj notes were used only during the first year in which the Gulf rupees were introduced.

Once the Gulf rupees had been put into circulation it would become harder for smugglers to purchase gold in the Gulf states with Indian rupees, which were no longer readily accepted by the banks. This would in turn mean that Indian rupees could be taken to Saudi Arabia in the following years, and the need for special

Haj notes would no longer be necessary.

Two years after the Gulf rupees had been introduced, Kuwait was the first Gulf state to introduce their own currency the Kuwaiti Dinar on 1 April 1961, followed four years later, on 16 October 1965, by Bahrain, the Bahraini Dinar divisible into 1000 Fils.

Paiza & Rupiah

Meanwhile India had devalued its Rupee on June 6, 1966, which had affected the value of the Gulf Rupee, forcing the states using the Gulf Rupee to introduce their own currency.

Shortly after Bahrain had introduced its own currency in 1965, the Reserve Bank of India announced that they were withdrawing the established facilities for the conversion into sterling of Indian coins repatriated from the Gulf states. On October 16, 1965, the Bahraini Dinar (BHD) replaced the Arabian Gulf Rupee at the rate of 1 Bahraini Dinar equal to 10 Arabian Gulf Rupees.

Though the new currency of Gulf States is Dinar or Dirhams, but old timers, hawkers, shop owners, in the by lanes still use the term paiza & Rupiah as local currency lingo. More than Six decades after the Indian Rupee was withdrawn, the Legacy of the Indian Rupee continues in the Gulf, at least in words.

India and the Global South

India's relationship with the Global South has deep roots in shared histories, common struggles, and mutual aspirations for development and self-reliance. As one of the largest and most influential countries in the Global South, India's role has evolved from leading the Non-Aligned Movement to becoming a pivotal player in contemporary South-South cooperation.

This partnership was propelled to a new level when Prime Minister Narendra Modi organised the first Voice of the Global South Summit (VOGSS) on 12-13 January 2023, within two weeks of India taking over the G20 Presidency. This was followed by a second summit later in 2023 and a third in 2024. VOGSS provides a common platform to deliberate on the concerns, interests and priorities of developing countries, exchange ideas, and unite in forging development solutions.

Background

The Global South encompasses developing nations in Latin America, Africa, Asia, and Oceania, often shaped by shared histories of colonisation and economic marginalisation. India's growing economic power, democratic framework, and strategic positioning allow it to advocate for equitable global governance.

Economic cooperation is reflected in trade, investment, and development assistance. India's trade with Africa rose from \$5 billion in 2001



to \$90 billion in 2020, making India Africa's third-largest trading partner. Trade with Latin America reached \$50 billion in 2020, driven by oil imports and exports of pharmaceuticals, automobiles, and engineering goods. Indian investments - over \$50 billion in Africa alone - span telecommunications, pharmaceuticals, agriculture, mining, IT, and renewable energy.

Through the Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) programme, India has provided training, capacity building, and technical assistance to over 160 countries in healthcare, education, agriculture, and IT. Structured engagements like the India-Africa Forum Summit, Forum for India-Pacific Islands Cooperation (FIPIC), and India-CARICOM Summits deepen ties and promote development.

India's leadership in the International Solar Alliance (ISA), launched with France in 2015, mobilises re-

sources for solar adoption in 121 member countries, many from the Global South.

The Voice of the Global South Summit

The first VOGSS in January 2023, held virtually across 10 sessions, focused on priorities and concerns of developing nations, with PM Modi presiding over the inaugural and concluding sessions. Inputs fed directly into G20 deliberations.

The second VOGSS on 17 November 2023 carried the theme Together, For Everyone's Growth, With Everyone's Trust, echoing Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam and Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas. It aimed to share outcomes from India's G20 Presidency, amplify the Global South's voice, and sustain momentum for inclusive global dialogue. Over 100 countries participated in both editions.

The third VOGSS, themed An Em-

powered Global South for a Sustainable Future, expanded discussions on conflicts, food and energy security, climate change, and debt burdens - issues that disproportionately affect developing countries. It drew 173 dignitaries from 123 countries, including 21 heads of state/government, and saw PM Modi propose a Global Development Compact with four elements: trade for development, capacity building for sustainable growth, technology sharing, and project-specific concessional finance and grants.

With representation from over 60% of the world's population, the summit reinforced the Global South's centrality in shaping an inclusive future. A major outcome of India's advocacy was the admission of the African Union as a full G20 member on 9 September 2023.

India's geopolitical engagement with the Global South reflects its strategic interests and aspirations for a multipolar world where developing nations have a strong voice. Through diplomacy, economic cooperation, and partnerships, India strengthens the collective position of the Global South in global affairs.

As the world faces challenges like climate change, economic inequality, and shifting geopolitics, India's role as both leader and partner is becoming increasingly significant. Guided by sustained cooperation, mutual respect, and shared aspirations, India and the Global South are well placed to navigate the opportunities and challenges of the 21st century together.

India and China eye resumption of border trade

India and China are discussing resuming border trade five years after it was halted, foreign ministry officials on both sides have said, as US tariffs disrupt the global trade order.

Past trade between the neighbours across the icy and high-altitude Himalayan border passes was usually small in volume, but any resumption is significant for its symbolism.

The two major economic powers have long competed for strategic influence across South Asia.

However, the two countries, caught in global trade and geopolitical turbulence triggered by US President Donald Trump’s tariff regime, have moved to mend ties. Chinese Foreign Minister

Wang Yi is expected for talks in New Delhi on Monday, according to Indian media, after his counterpart Subrahmanyam Jaishankar visited Beijing in July.

That, as well as agreements to resume direct flights and issue tourist visas, has been seen as an

effort to rebuild a relationship damaged after a deadly 2020 border clash between troops.

“For a long time, China–India border trade cooperation has played an important role in improving the lives of people living along the border,” China’s foreign ministry said in a statement sent to AFP on Thursday.

It said the two sides have “reached a consensus on cross-border exchanges and co-operation, including resumption of border trade”.

New Delhi’s junior foreign minister, Kirti Vardhan Singh, told parliament last week that “India has engaged with the Chinese side to facilitate the resumption of border trade”.

No restart date was given by either side.

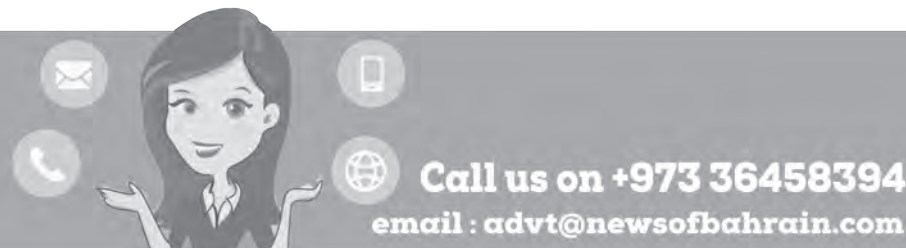

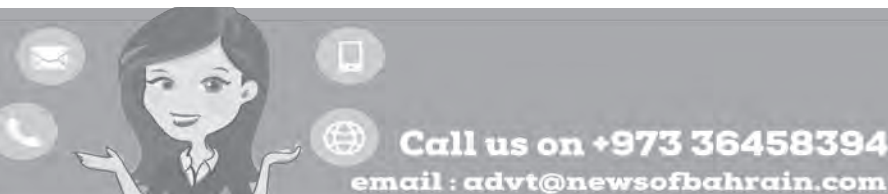

Flood kills 46 in Indian Kashmir mountain village

Second major flooding disaster in India this month as rains trigger devastation

● “Cloudburst” caused disaster

● 150 injured, 50 critical

● Pilgrims’ kitchen swept away

Powerful torrents driven by intense rain smashed into a Himalayan mountain village in India’s Kashmir and killed at least 46 people yesterday, a top disaster management official said.

It is the second major deadly flooding disaster in India this month.

“The news is grim,” Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said in a statement, reporting a

“cloudburst” of intense rain that had hit the Kishtwar district.

Crowds gathered at a Kishtwar hospital while people carried some of the injured on stretchers.

“Death toll has increased to 46,” a top disaster management official Mohammad Irshad told AFP, adding “some people are missing but we can’t say how many.”

Irshad said 150 wounded people were also rescued from the disaster site, “50 of whom are severely injured”. All were sent to nearby hospitals.

Sushil Kumar, a resident of nearby Atholi village, said: “I saw at least 15 dead bodies brought to the local hospital.”

Pankaj Kumar Sharma, district commissioner of Kishtwar, said earlier that “there are chances of more dead bodies being found”.

Pilgrims’ kitchen washed away

Chisoti village, where the disaster hit, is on a Hindu pilgrimage route to Machail Mata shrine.

Officials said a large makeshift kitchen where there were more than 100 pilgrims -- who were not registered with local authorities -- was completely washed away.

Rescue teams were facing difficulty reaching the area and soldiers also joined the effort.

The region’s weather department has issued an alert for more heavy rain and floods, asking residents to remain vigilant.

Roads had already been damaged by days of heavy storms. The area lies more than 200 kilometres (125 miles) by road from the region’s main city Srinagar.

“Every possible assistance will be provided to those in need,” Prime Minister Narendra Modi said.

Floods on August 5 overwhelmed the Himalayan town of Dharali in India’s Uttarakhand state and buried it in mud. The likely death toll from that disaster is more than 70 but has yet to be confirmed.

Sinner, Sabalenka march on in Cincy

Defending champions Sinner and Sabalenka cruise as Alcaraz delivers statement win

Defending champions Jannik Sinner and Aryna Sabalenka led the way into the Cincinnati Open quarter-finals on Wednesday with Carlos Alcaraz hot on their heels with a straight-sets victory of his own. Sinner shrugged off a mid-match weather delay lasting nearly three hours as he advanced 6-4, 7-6 (7/4) over Adrian Mannarino. Sabalenka, taken to three sets in her previous match with Emma Raducanu, regrouped after surrendering a second-set service break to defeat Spain's Jessica Bouzas Maneiro 6-1, 7-5. Alcaraz, the second seed who has reached the finals of his last six tournaments, hammered Italian lucky loser Luca Nardi 6-1, 6-4. After sweeping the opening set in 28 minutes, Alcaraz hit a speed bump, dropping his serve to trail 2-4. He promptly regained the break, then fought through a marathon ninth game that went

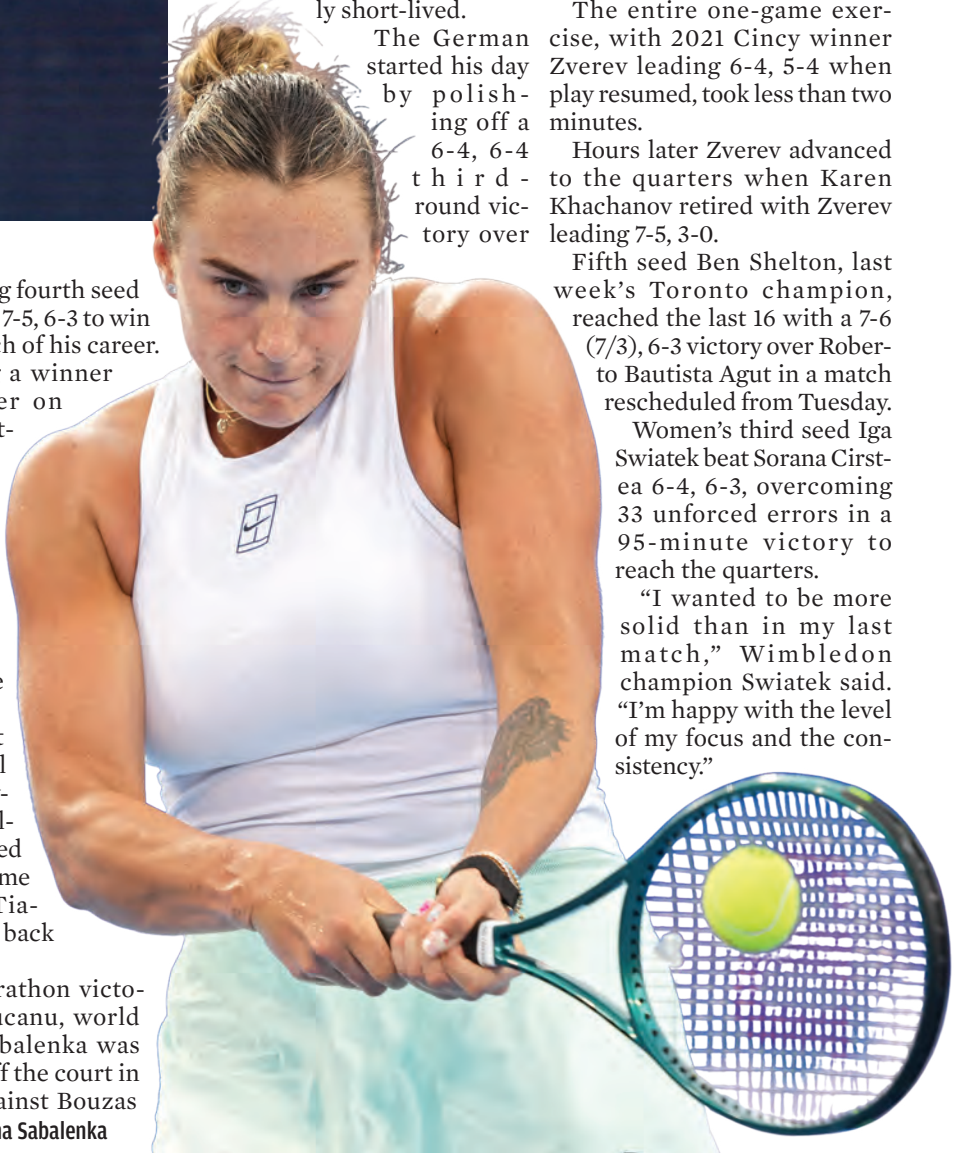
to deuce eight times to take a 5-4 lead, Nardi coughing up a double-fault on break point. Alcaraz double-faulted on his first match point before producing a volley winner to complete the job. "This match was my best so far of the tournament," Alcaraz said. "At the start I wanted to get better each day and I've done that. I'm proud of that and happy with how I moved," added Alcaraz, who next faces ninth-seeded Russian Andrey Rublev. World number one Sinner, playing his first tournament since winning Wimbledon, notched his 24th consecutive hardcourt match victory. The Italian won the first set and they were on serve in the second when they returned after the rain. Frenchman Mannarino's tricky game took a toll as Sinner was broken while trying to serve out the match. The second set went to a tie-

break, with Sinner firing his 11th and 12th aces to clinch victory. "He's a very difficult opponent, different from the other payers," Sinner said. "He can read the opponent well. It was a struggle to close it out but I'm happy to be in the quarter-finals." Sinner next faces Canada's Felix Auger-Aliassime, who beat Benjamin Bonzi of France 6-4, 6-3. French qualifier Terence Atmane sprung the surprise of

the day, shocking fourth seed Taylor Fritz 3-6, 7-5, 6-3 to win the biggest match of his career. After putting a winner into the corner on match point, Atmane sank to his knees and shed a few tears. "I can't believe this, I was shaking," the 136th-ranked Atmane said. "I cannot describe this feeling." He'll fight for a semi-final berth against seventh-seeded Holger Rune, who led 6-4, 3-1 when home hope Frances Tiafoe retired with back trouble. After her marathon victory against Raducanu, world number one Sabalenka was pleased to get off the court in straight sets against Bouzas Maneiro. "The key was to focus and put as much pressure as possible on her serve," said Sabalenka. "I'm glad to win in straight sets, I didn't want to stay for three hours." Sabalenka will face former Wimbledon champion Elena Rybakina, who beat Australian Open champion Madison Keys 6-7 (3/7), 6-4, 6-2. Zverev at the double Third-seeded Alexander Zverev had to take to the court twice on Wednesday to reach the quarters -- although both outings were relatively short-lived. The German started his day by polishing off a 6-4, 6-4 third-round victory over

Tuesday. The entire one-game exercise, with 2021 Cincy winner Zverev leading 6-4, 5-4 when play resumed, took less than two minutes. Hours later Zverev advanced to the quarters when Karen Khachanov retired with Zverev leading 7-5, 3-0. Fifth seed Ben Shelton, last week's Toronto champion, reached the last 16 with a 7-6 (7/3), 6-3 victory over Roberto Bautista Agut in a match rescheduled from Tuesday. Women's third seed Iga Swiatek beat Sorana Cirstea 6-4, 6-3, overcoming 33 unforced errors in a 95-minute victory to reach the quarters. "I wanted to be more solid than in my last match," Wimbledon champion Swiatek said. "I'm happy with the level of my focus and the consistency."

India to bid for Commonwealth Games as part of Olympic push

India says it will bid for the 2030 Commonwealth Games, seen as part of a wider push by the cricket-mad nation to host the 2036 Olympics. "Our preparations will go ahead," Indian Olympic Association (IOA) president PT Usha said after a meeting on Wednesday, according to local media. The capital New Delhi -- which hosted the 2010 Commonwealth Games -- is being considered as host city. Bhubaneswar in the eastern state of Odisha is another option. But Indian media are tipping Ahmedabad, the key city in Prime Minister Narendra Modi's home state of Gujarat. The city is home to a 130,000-seater arena, the world's biggest cricket stadium, named after Modi. It staged the 2023 Cricket World Cup final. India last year submitted a formal letter of intent to the

India has staged World Cups for cricket and the Asian Games twice, and will co-host the Women's World Cup cricket in September. Nigeria and at least two other nations have reportedly expressed interest in hosting the Commonwealth Games, which struggled to find a replacement host for 2026 after the Australian state of Victoria withdrew citing costs.

— the gulf in physicality told. Tunisia were out-rebounded across the board and struggled to match Bahrain's precision in transition.

With an undefeated 4-0 record, including wins against Qatar (90-50), Algeria (80-54), Kuwait (81-57), and Tunisia (93-70), Bahrain face Egypt tonight at 9pm in their final match of the Arab U16 Basketball Championship. They aim to seal their second consecutive title after winning the Gulf Championship in July. It will be Bahrain's toughest test yet, and Egypt's home crowd will be intense, but if Rassem Marzooqi's team sustains this performance, they'll be confident in silencing it.
