Parliament bans hiring of expat workers in private sector where more than 30 unemployed locals are available

Plan to ensure qualified citizens get job priority

arliament yesterday approved an urgent proposal to ban the hiring of non-Bahrainis in private-sector jobs where more than 30 unemployed Bahrainis are available, referring the decision to the government in the same sitting.

The proposal requires the Ministry of Labour and the relevant bodies to enforce the restriction and to create a mechanism for identifying job titles that meet the threshold.

According to the text, the ban applies to roles where the number of unemployed Bahrainis exceeds 30, while authorities must also monitor occupations available. once that figure passes 50.
