Or the cruelty of hostages being told their families are dead as a form of psychological torture? Or a mother holding a chocolate bar, asking her newly released son to take a bite? I could go on, but how could I possibly sit and write all the stories of all the injustice people are facing?

Even after a ceasefire was announced, the truth is still being hidden, censored, and deleted. Instagram accounts are being targeted, and the few ways journalists have to share the truth and expose injustices are constantly under attack. Saleh's Instagram account was deleted the same day he was killed, even in death, his voice had to be silenced.

I think about my own privilege. The only reason I am not there is because my great-grandfather fled. That one decision is the only thing that separates me from my people in Gaza. Like many Palestinians, my father still keeps the key to his grandfather's home. For us, the key is not just a piece of metal, it is a promise that we will re-

We carry the key, and they carry the rubble. I scroll through videos of Gaza from the comfort of my own home with an unbearable feeling of guilt and hopelessness. This is Qahr.

It is a feeling shared by every exiled Palestinian. Even though we may never have set foot on our land, it lives within us. Our connection to the soil runs deep, through memory, through blood, through the keys that hang on our walls. And no matter how many homes are destroyed, they will never erase the belief that

one day we will return. Until then, we resist, resist, and resist.

aza's civil defence agency said Israeli forces killed six Palestinians in separate incidents yesterday, while the military reported its troops had opened fire on suspects who approached their positions.

Mahmud Bassal, spokesman for the civil defence agency, which operates as a rescue force under Hamas, said five people were killed as they inspected their homes in the Shujaiya district of Gaza City.

"Israeli quadcopter drones opened fire on civilians inspecting their homes in Shujaiya,' Bassal said.

The Israeli military said its troops fired after "several suspects were identified crossing the yellow line and approaching IDF troops operating in the northern Gaza Strip".

"Attempts were made to distance the suspects," the statement said.

"The suspects did not comply and continued approaching the troops, who opened fire to remove the threat."

Under a ceasefire deal agreed with Hamas, Israeli forces have pulled back to a so-called "yellow line", behind which troops still hold roughly half of Gaza.

Hamas forces back on Gaza streets as truce

Hamas security forces were tightening their grip on Gaza's ruined cities yesterday even as global support mounted for a US-backed deal that would see them disarmed.When bus loads of prisoners freed from Israeli jails arrived in Gaza on Monday, fighters from Hamas's Ezzedine al-Qassam Brigades provided crowd control.

In the north of the territory, as Israeli forces withdrew from Gaza City, the Hamas government's black-masked armed police resumed street patrols.Meanwhile, a Hamas security unit has been conducting operations against armed clans and gangs, some alleged to have Israeli backing."Intense clashes broke out -- and are still ongoing at the moment -- as part of efforts to eliminate collaborators," said witness Yahya, who asked not to be named in full for fear of retribution.
