## **US and several Arab** states urge 'swift adoption' of UN **Gaza resolution**

The United States and several Arab and Muslim-majority nations including Egypt, Saudi Arabia and Turkey called yesterday for the UN Security Council to quickly adopt a US resolution endorsing Donald Trump's peace plan for Gaza.

"The United States, Qatar, Egypt, the United Arab Emirates, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, Indonesia, Pakistan, Jordan, and Türkiye express our joint support for the Security Council Resolution currently under consideration," the countries said in a joint statement, adding they were seeking the measure's "swift adoption."



### Modi celebrates as party set for big win in state vote

Tndian Prime Minister **⊥**Narendra Modi yesterday hailed a "resounding" victory for his party and its allies in a key local election in the state of Bihar.

The election commission said partial results and projections suggested a solid majority for Modi's Hindu nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and its allies in the state assembly. Modi called the win a "victory of good governance".
