"He fell from the 11th floor and landed onto one of the lower floors," the source said adding: "Unfortunately, the fall was too steep for him to survive."



The Remote Code Execution (RCE) vulnerability (Carlo affecting the popular messaging platform WhatsApp was discov-The Remote Code Execution (RCE) vulnerability (CVE-2019-3568) ered earlier this month.

According to the recent advisory published by Facebook, a buffer overflow vulnerability in WhatsApp VOIP stack allowed remote code execution via a specially crafted series of SRTCP packets sent to a target phone number.

"It can be exploited by calling a vulnerable device via the WhatsApp calling feature, which remotely installs the surveillance software on

"It should be noted that the calls did not have to be answered and often disappeared from the call logs. WhatsApp deployed a server-side fix on Friday last week and issued a patch for end-users on Monday alongside Facebook's advisory."

Users are advised to upgrade to the latest version of WhatsApp as soon as possible.
