Awoman in her twenties exposed her drug lord brother to police officers, which also led to the arrest of six other men involved in peddling drugs, it was revealed.

According to court files, the woman was inhumanely used by her brother to distribute drugs across the Kingdom and she was arrested in a secret operation.

The woman's activities came to light after the anti-drug department in the Ministry of Interior received a tip-off, after which an undercover agent was tasked to nab the woman red-handed.

The officer in plain clothes offered the woman BD50 and she was arrested as soon as she gave the officer drugs.

"My brother was giving me the drugs to sell them to the customers," the woman told police officers, offering to help in getting him arrested

She called the brother and asked him to bring hashish to her under the pretext that a customer had requested to buy it from her.

They met in Hamad Town and police busted him.

His capture led to other drug lords falling in police net.

They, including the woman, were sent for trial before the High Criminal Court over accusations of selling drugs.
