AI-Powered Construction Inspection Platform

Arab Interior Ministers Council Condemns Attacks

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HRH Crown Prince Signals Strong Ties with Saudi and UK

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His Royal Highness Prince Salman bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Crown Prince and Prime Minister, held diplomatic meetings with the ambassadors of Saudi Arabia and the United Kingdom, underscoring the Kingdom's active foreign engagement.

HRH Prince Salman received Saudi Ambassador Naif bin Bandar Al-Sudairi at Gudaibiya Pal-

ace. Both sides highlighted the continued growth of bilateral relations under the leadership of King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and Saudi King Salman bin Abdulaziz.

The Crown Prince praised the efforts of Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman in advancing ties, reaffirming Bahrain's commitment to deeper cooperation and coordination for shared development goals. Regional security, peace and sta-

bility were also discussed, with Saudi Arabia's role alongside its allies acknowledged.

Farewell to Outgoing UK Ambassador

HRH also met outgoing British Ambassador Alastair Long, commending his contributions to strengthening Bahrain-UK relations during his tenure.

The Crown Prince reaffirmed the depth of the two nations'

longstanding partnership, citing the Comprehensive Security Integration and Prosperity Agreement (C-SIPA) as a cornerstone of bilateral cooperation. He also recognised the UK's role in countering Iranian aggression and supporting regional stability.

Both meetings were attended by senior Bahraini officials including the Minister of Finance, Minister of Cabinet Affairs and the Minister of the Prime Minister's Court.

Threats Neutralised Safely



The Bahrain Defence Force (BDF) General Command stated that Iran continues its hostile actions through unlawful missile and drone attacks targeting civilians and private property in the Kingdom of Bahrain.

The BDF confirmed that its air defence systems successfully intercepted and destroyed several Iranian aerial attacks on Wednesday morning, July 15, as its units maintained a high level of combat readiness and defensive preparedness.

The General Command urged citizens and residents to avoid approaching or handling any suspicious objects or debris from the attacks and to immediately report them

Record-Speed Housing Deal Marks New Era for Bahrain's Land Programme

Ministerial Committee for Development Projects and Infrastructure held its 311th meeting, chaired by Deputy Prime Minister Shaikh Khalid bin Abdulla Al Khalifa.

The committee strongly condemned ongoing Iranian attacks on Bahraini territory, calling them a flagrant violation of the Kingdom's sovereignty and a breach of international law. The committee cited UN Security Council Resolution 2817 (2026), adopted in March, which condemned Iran's attacks against Bahrain and other Gulf states, demanding their immediate cessation. The panel warned that continued strikes on civilian infrastructure and vital facilities endanger citizens and residents alike

The committee expressed appreciation to the Bahrain Defence Force, the National Guard, the Ministry of Interior, and all military, security, and civ-

il authorities for their role in protecting the Kingdom's sovereignty.

Muharraq Project Progress

On the development front, the committee noted that 247 property acquisitions have been completed during the first phase of the Muharraq Development Project, carried out by the Ministry of Municipalities

Affairs and Agriculture in coordination with the Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning.

The committee also congratulated the Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning and Eskan Bank on completing Bahrain's first social housing financing transaction for an off-plan unit under the Government Land Development Programme—achieved in record time.



Preserve Historic Identity



Minister of Works Eng. Manama: Minister of Works Eng. Ibrahim bin Hassan Al Hawaj inspected ongoing development projects in Muharraq, reaffirming Bahrain's commitment to preserving the city's historic and cultural identity while advancing modern infrastructure.

The minister reviewed the progress of government projects implemented under the Muharraq development plan, which aims to protect the city's heritage character while improving services and urban facilities for residents and visitors.

Al Hawaj said the projects represent a balance between infrastructure development and preserving Muharraq's traditional architectural character, strengthening its position as one of Bahrain's key historic and cultural destinations.

Minister holds bilateral meetings on HLPF 2026 sidelines

Minister of Sustainable Development and Chief Executive of the Economic Development Board, Noor bint Ali Alkhulaif, held a series of bilateral meetings on the sidelines of the UN High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF 2026) in New York.

The meetings took place as Bahrain presented its Third Voluntary National Review (VNR), outlining the Kingdom's progress toward achieving the Sustainable Development Goals



Minister Alkhulaif met with Saudi Arabia's Minister of Economy and Planning Faisal bin Fadel Alibrahim, Egypt's Minister of Planning Dr. Ahmed Rostom,

and Lebanon's Minister of Information Dr. Paul Morcos. Talks focused on strengthening bilateral ties and sharing expertise in sustainable development.

The minister congratulated Saudi Arabia and Egypt on presenting their own VNRs, praising their national achievements under the 2030 Agenda.

Alkhulaif also met with UN Under-Secretary-General for Economic and Social Affairs Li Junhua, exploring opportunities to deepen cooperation with international bodies.

Shops Told to Display Prices and Replace Faulty Goods

Shops must give buyers safe, fault-free goods, display prices clearly and tell the truth about what they are selling, Bahrain's Ministry of Industry and Commerce has warned.

In public messages issued under the slogan, 'Know Your Rights. Fulfil Your Responsibility', the ministry said shoppers must be given clear and accurate details about a product's condition, features and price before they buy it.

During sales, traders must show both the old price and the reduced price so customers can see the size of the discount.

The ministry said faulty goods must be repaired during the warranty period in line with Bahrain's consumer rules. Buyers can also seek a repair, replacement or refund when an item is defective or does not match the description given by the seller.

Traders must bear the cost of moving faulty goods for repair. In some cases, customers can also receive a replacement item free of charge while repairs are carried out.

The ministry said shoppers also have duties. They should



inspect goods before signing a delivery note, compare prices across shops and keep receipts and warranty papers.

Consumers were also told to check that sales, prize draws and other promotional campaigns have been licensed, and to read labels, prices and product details before paying.

Complaints can be filed with the Consumer Protection Directorate and should be backed by documents such as receipts, warranties and contracts.

Consumer Protection Law provides for fines of up to BD10,000 for some breaches, while deliberate false advertising can lead to imprisonment. Repeat offenders can also face business closures and, in some cases, removal from the Commercial Register.

The ministry said the campaign was aimed at improving consumer awareness, encouraging fair trading and building trust between buyers and sellers.

Shura Secretariat Honours University Students

Programme aims to bridge academic learning with professional workplace skills

The General Secretariat of the Shura Council honoured a group of university students who successfully completed a practical training programme across various departments and sections of the Secretariat.

The initiative is part of the Council's efforts to strengthen cooperation with higher education institutions and provide training opportunities that help develop the skills of young Bahraini talents and prepare them for future careers.

Counsellor Ali Abdullah Al Aradi, Assistant Secretary-General for Resources and Digital Systems, said the Secretariat continues to prioritise practical training programmes in line with the directives of Shura Council Chairman His Excellency Ali bin Saleh Al Saleh and Secretary-General Her Excellency Kareema Mohammed Al Abbasi.

He highlighted that the programme provides students with an integrated professional environment where they can apply their academic knowledge, gain



workplace experience and enhance their skills.

Al Aradi said university students are important partners in

national development, praising their creativity, new ideas and modern perspectives that contribute to institutional growth.

Bahrain and France Review Financial, Investment Cooperation

Finance and National Economy Minister Shaikh Salman bin Khalifa Al Khalifa met with French Ambassador to Bahrain Éric Giraud-Telme to discuss ways to further strengthen bilateral cooperation, particularly in the financial, economic and investment sectors.

interest, including the latest regional and international developments, while exploring opportunities to expand cooperation in financial and economic sectors.

Flyover push to unlock Salman City congestion

Councillor flags Budaiya junction as one of area's Severe bottlenecks

Northern Municipal Council member has called for a new bridge to tackle chronic congestion at the main entrance to Salman City.

Third Constituency councillor Mohammed Saad Al Doseri is pushing for a flyover directly linking Janabiya Highway and Salman City at the Budaiya-Janabiya intersection—one of the Northern Governorate's busiest junctions.

The proposed structure would allow vehicles to bypass traffic signals during peak hours, cutting journey times and easing pressure on surrounding roads. Al Doseri said Salman City's rapid population growth demands proactive infrastructure investment. He confirmed he



had already submitted a formal proposal to authorities.

"Investment in infrastructure is a fundamental step towards accommodating future growth and meeting citizens' needs," he said.

He cited rising vehicle numbers, urban expansion across the Northern Governorate, and the need for better connectivity between Salman City and neighbouring areas as key reasons for the project.

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Doctors Warn Over Gulf Nicotine Pouch Rise

Flavoured sachets hooking young users and raising heart risks, physicians warn

Nicotine pouches are growing rapidly across the Gulf, with doctors cautioning that the small flavoured sachets carry serious health risks despite containing no tobacco or smoke.

The pouches are tucked beneath the lip, releasing nicotine through the gum into the bloodstream over about 30 minutes. While physicians consider them less harmful than cigarettes for smokers who quit tobacco entirely, they say the pouches are neither safe nor a proven quitting aid.

Dr. Kadhem Al Halwachi, head of the smoking cessation clinic at Manama Medical Centre, warned that some pouches

deliver more nicotine than a standard cigarette. Repeated use can damage gums and teeth, raise blood pressure, accelerate the heartbeat and affect cholesterol levels.

“There is no health benefit,” he said, adding that long-term effects remain unknown because the products are still relatively new.

Dr Wafa Ajur, vice-president of the Bahrain Cancer Society,

said pouches sit below vapes and cigarettes on the harm scale as no aerosol is inhaled, but risks around addiction, oral health and cardiovascular effects remain significant. She urged smokers seeking to quit to use licensed nicotine-replacement therapies instead.

The World Health Organisation has flagged sweet flavours and social media marketing as key concerns. A 2026 Saudi study found nearly half of pouch users were aged 18 to 24. Nicotine exposure during adolescence can impair brain development and raise long-term addiction risk.

Industry forecasts value the GCC market at \$1.1 billion, with 19.5 per cent annual growth projected through 2030.

Know When To Call Police

MyGov App Ideal for Non-Urgent Police Reports, Public Urged to Call 999 in Emergencies

● The MyGov app allows residents to submit a range of police reports securely online.

● Emergencies, assaults and thefts requiring scene inspections should be reported directly to the nearest police station or security centre.

● Prompt reporting helps police preserve evidence and respond more effectively.

The Interior Ministry is encouraging residents to use the MyGov app for non-urgent police reports while reminding the public that emergencies and incidents requiring an immediate police response should be reported directly to the police.

Speaking on the Interior Ministry's Al Aman social media programme, Hidd Police Station Head Colonel Dr Osama Bahar said the MyGov app provides an innovative, secure and user-friendly platform that enables people to access police services electronically.

He explained that while the app is suitable for many report types, situations requiring urgent assistance or an immediate police presence should always

be reported by phone so that patrols can be dispatched without delay.

Colonel Dr Bahar noted that incidents requiring officers to verify the scene or collect evidence also need direct communication with the relevant security centre.

“If the report involves an assault, the victim needs to meet an officer for a detailed exam-

ination and to complete the necessary procedures,” he said.

He added that in cases of theft or robbery, officers need to inspect the scene and collect physical evidence promptly to ensure nothing that could support the investigation is lost.

He urged the public to contact the nearest police station or relevant security centre as quickly as possible in such situations instead of relying solely on electronic reporting.

The MyGov app, however, remains an effective option for reporting non-urgent cases, including lost property, financial claims with criminal aspects, defamation, insults, theft reports that do not require immediate intervention, and electronic fraud, provided users submit the necessary supporting evidence.

Interior ministry encourages residents to download the MyGov app and register to benefit from its digital services, while reminding them to choose the reporting method best suited to the nature and urgency of each incident.

Flower Prices Rise by Up to 25%

Flower prices in Bahrain have risen by as much as 25 pc after higher air freight bills pushed up the cost of imports from Africa.

Traders said the rise had been driven by dearer aviation fuel and changes in cargo charges, although some wholesale prices have begun to fall as flight routes return to normal.

Hassan Attiya, a flower importer, said most bouquets were now selling for between BD7 and BD10, compared with BD3 to BD5 before the rise.

He said a batch of 25 roses that once cost BD4.5 at source had climbed to BD8.5 before falling back to about BD5.

All imported flowers arrive by air, he said, with Bahrain and other Gulf markets buying each week from Kenya, Ethiopia, Colombia, Thailand, Sri Lanka, the Netherlands and Ecuador. Some Gulf buyers also route certain varieties through airports in Riyadh.

African growers remain the

main source for the trade, while flowers from the Netherlands and Ecuador cost about 40 pc more.

Attiya said packaging costs

had also soared. Polystyrene boxes used by florists had risen from BD4 to BD22 after disruption linked to the closure of the Strait of Hormuz. The boxes had first climbed to BD11 before doubling again.

The cheapest rose now sells for about 350 fils, including tax, up from 200 fils. Some high-end shops charge between 500 fils and BD1 for a single stem, depending on the wrapping and presentation.

Prices are based mainly on the number of flowers, stem length and size rather than colour. Roses dyed blue or black can cost more because of the added treatment.

Attiya said rose prices in producing countries ranged from 12 to 36 fils a stem.

Imported flowers are checked by the veterinary authorities before they are released for sale to ensure they are free from disease, bacteria and viruses.

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Warns against misusing public open spaces

Residents reminded that unauthorised building, storage or fencing on public land is a legal violation

Muharraq Municipality has reminded residents that public open spaces located within or near residential areas are part of public property designated for public benefit, and may not be occupied, used, exploited or built upon without first obtaining the required permit in accordance with the law.

In a public awareness notice, the municipality said such spaces are regulated under Legislative Decree No. (2) of 1996 Concerning the Occupation of Public Roads, which governs their use in a way that safeguards everyone's right to benefit from them and helps maintain the orderly character of residential areas.

The municipality listed a number of common violations observed in public open spaces, including incorporating them



into the boundaries of private properties, building storage facilities or extensions attached to residential properties, and constructing corrugated-metal rooms or other temporary structures. Other violations include

storing construction materials, equipment or personal belongings, installing fences, barriers or gates, and any other use that conflicts with the space's intended purpose or restricts others from benefiting from it.

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Public spaces without a permit is a violation of the law and unauthorised structures will be removed, with legal action against offenders.

The municipality described the preservation of public open spaces as a shared responsibility, noting that it reflects compliance with regulations, safeguards everyone's right to benefit from these spaces, helps maintain the urban appearance of residential areas, enhances quality of life, and promotes the optimal use of public property in line with its designated purpose.

Court Hears Terror Organisation Case Involving 17 Defendants

The High Criminal Court has begun hearing the case of 17 defendants accused of joining a terrorist organisation allegedly linked to the ideology of Wilayat al-Faqih, which prosecutors say sought to undermine Bahrain's constitutional system and national unity.

According to the Advocate General and Head of the Terror Crimes Prosecution, the defendants include 15 individuals in custody and two fugi-

tives. Prosecutors allege the group aimed to spread its ideology through places of worship, incite rebellion against the state, promote terrorist activities, and collect funds to support its operations.

The court heard the case in the presence of defence lawyers and adjourned proceedings until July 22, 2026, to allow the defence to review the case files. The court also authorised lawyers to visit their clients in custody.

Woman Sentenced to Jail for Publishing Sectarian Expressions

The Head of the Electronic Crimes Prosecution stated that the Lower Criminal Court sentenced a woman to one month in prison and ordered the confiscation of her mobile phone after convicting her of publicly assaulting one of the recognised religious sects and showing contempt for its religious rituals.

The details of the case date back to the Public Prosecution receiving a report from the Electronic Crimes Directorate stating that, through monitoring operations carried out by the Directorate on social media platforms, a comment posted

on Instagram was detected containing sectarian expressions capable of inciting strife. Investigations identified the user of the account.

The Public Prosecution immediately initiated its investigation upon receiving the report. The defendant was questioned and admitted that she owned the account and had written the comment that was the subject of the report. Accordingly, the Public Prosecution ordered that she be referred to the competent court while in custody, where the court issued the aforementioned judgment convicting and sentencing her.

Iranian Man Faces Trial Over Forged Documents and Pension Benefits

High Criminal Court has begun the trial of a 72-year-old Iranian driver accused of forging official documents and using them to obtain government records and retirement benefits over several decades.

Prosecutors say the defendant falsified personal information, including his name, date

of birth and legal status, to obtain official documents such as a birth certificate, identity records, driving licences and a work card. He is also accused of receiving pension and end-of-service benefits reserved for Bahraini nationals after being registered under the social insurance system from 1983 until his retirement in

2015.

Investigators said the accused entered Bahrain in 1979 on an Iranian passport before allegedly forging a Bahraini birth certificate to secure official documents and benefits. The Public Prosecution said the defendant admitted during questioning that he altered the birth certificate to obtain priv-

ileges available to Bahrainis. Authorities said social insurance contributions paid on his behalf totalled BD46,845.270, while he has continued receiving retirement pension payments since 2015. The court adjourned the case until July 21 to appoint a defence lawyer and ordered that the defendant remain in custody.

Silver Bar Prices Plunge BD1,000 in Bahrain

Silver bar prices in Bahrain have crashed by almost BD1,000 a kilogram in four months, leaving buyers nursing losses and draining demand from a market that had drawn a rush of small investors. A one-kilogram bar that sold for about BD1,700 at the peak now costs roughly BD792, traders said, after global prices fell and confidence in the metal gave way to caution.

The plunge has failed to bring buyers back. Many are instead holding off, wary that prices could fall further after one of the sharpest swings seen in the local silver trade in recent months.

Jaafar bin Jaafar, of Bin Jaa-

far Jewellery, said demand had dropped despite the lower price.

'The price of a kilogram reached about BD1,700 during the rise, while today it is around BD792,' he said. 'That is a fall of close to BD1,000 in no longer than four months.'

He said traders had expected the lower price to draw people back into the market, but the speed of the fall had shaken buyers.

Silver is also prone to steeper moves than gold, he said. A fall in gold can bring a much larger slide in silver, adding to fears among investors who bought near the top.

Sayed Mahmood Jalal, of Dilmun Bars, said demand for silver bars had fallen as prices moved back towards the levels seen before the rally.



Buying had surged while prices were climbing, with investors rushing to secure bars in the belief that the rise would carry on. The fall has since led many to doubt the case for holding silver as a short-term investment.

Some investors have begun selling their bars, although sales remain limited, Mr Jalal said. Others are holding on in the

hope of a recovery.

A number of buyers still regard the fall as a normal market correction and believe silver has room to rise over the longer term.

Ali Hassan, who bought silver during the rally, said his first bar cost about BD400. Several of his friends entered later and paid as much as BD1,300.

Mail Delivery Now in One Day

New digital service allows customers to choose delivery time and collection method via SMS



Bahrain has upgraded its mail delivery service, reducing processing time from three working days to just one as part of its ongoing digital transformation efforts.

The Ministry of Transportation and Telecommunications said customers will now receive an interactive SMS when their local or international mail arrives, allowing them to instantly select their preferred collection method and delivery time. The enhanced service covers express, registered, ordinary mail and parcels.

The ministry said the upgrade also simplifies collection procedures, improves the user experience, modernises supporting systems and standardises service information across all platforms. The changes have reduced the service level agreement by 25%, helping deliver faster and

more efficient postal services.

Undersecretary for Land Transport and Postal Affairs, Fatima Abdulla Al Dhaen said the initiative reflects the ministry's commitment to innovative digital solutions, streamlined government services and improved customer experience. She added that the move supports Bahrain's wider digital transformation agenda by automating processes and reducing the time and effort required from users.

Hamad Town Pothole Repairs Delayed for Two Months, Councillor Says

A municipal councillor says relevant authorities have failed to repair a dangerous pothole and road subsidence on Road 554 in Hamad Town for over two months.

Abdullah Mubarak Al Qubaisi, representing the Ninth Constituency on the Northern Municipal Council, stated that the ministry's only response had been placing a temporary metal plate and warning barrier at the site in Complex 1205. This action forced traffic into a single lane and caused persistent congestion.

'Is it reasonable for a single pothole to go unrepaired for two full months?' he said, calling the situation an emergency threat-



ening residents, pedestrians, and passing vehicles.

Al Qubaisi said an inspection found a broken sewage pipe beneath the road, warning the damage could worsen rapidly. He first filed a report on 13 May, followed by phone calls to officials and an urgent reminder on 2 July — all with no meaningful response.

He called on the ministry to deploy emergency teams immediately to begin pipe replacement and repaving without further delay.

Second Phase Targets 12 Illegal Structures in Al Ramli

Northern Municipality has launched the second phase of its campaign to remove unlicensed structures in Al Ramli, Complex 716, targeting 12 sites along Sheikh Zayed Street as part of efforts to implement the area's approved development plan.

Northern Municipality Director General Eng. Mohammed Al Sehli said the first phase saw the removal of 47 out of 61 illegal structures along Sheikh Khalifa bin Salman Street and Sheikh Zayed Street. Inspections uncovered a range of unauthorised uses, including car scrapyards, warehouses, livestock pens, workshops, company offices, informal labour accommodation, construction material storage sites, and waste dumps.

Al Sehli said the campaign is being carried out under the



Ministry of Housing and Urban Planning's Resolution No. 1054 of 2024 after completing all legal procedures, including site surveys, issuing notices, and allowing violators time to vacate. He added that the municipality will continue the removals in coordination with relevant authorities until all violations are cleared and the area is ready for future urban development projects.

Trump threatens to hit Iran power plants next week if no deal

The United States launched a wave of strikes against Iran yesterday, after it reimposed a naval blockade in a return to war between the two foes.

Iran's Revolutionary Guards said they targeted the US Fifth Fleet in Bahrain, where the military said it had intercepted attacks against civilian targets, while Jordan's armed forces said they had downed three missiles from the Islamic republic.

US President Donald Trump, meanwhile, threatened to widen strikes next week to hit power plants and bridges unless Tehran returns to the negotiating table.

"Next week it gets really bad for them," he told Fox News. Despite a return to hostilities, mediated talks between the two sides have not formally ended.

US outlines objectives

Days after the return to war, US Central Command (CENTCOM) said it launched "a wave of strikes... designed to further degrade military capabilities Iranian forces have used to attack commercial shipping in the Strait of Hormuz."

Iranian state media reported explosions near the port city of Bandar Abbas, on the island of Qeshm and on Bandar Imam Khomeini. It later said fresh US strikes hit the southern port city of Bushehr, home to the country's only civilian nuclear plant.

Trump scraps levy

Trump meanwhile said he was scrapping a planned levy on ships passing through the Strait of Hormuz that he announced Monday, replacing the fee with trade deals with Gulf allies.

"I have decided to replace the 20% United States Reimbursement Fee with Trade and Investment Deals that the various Gulf States will be making into the United States," Trump said in a post on his Truth Social network.

90-MINUTE STRIKES

- The US military said it had staged 90 minutes of strikes that "further degraded Iran's ability to attack commercial shipping in the Strait of Hormuz" where the United States is imposing a blockade.

IRANIANS KILLED

- "US fighter aircraft, drones, and naval vessels launched precision munitions against Iranian missile and drone sites, naval capabilities, and coastal defence systems during the seven-hour wave to further degrade Iran's ability to threaten commercial shipping and civilian crews," CENTCOM said.

IRAN HANGS PROTESTER

- Iran's judiciary said Mohammad Amini Dehaghani had been hanged after he was found guilty of taking part in anti-government protests at the start of the year.
- The judiciary's press agency called him "a collaborator with the enemy".

BRITON'S TERM EXTENDED

- Iran has added two years to a 10-year jail term being served by British man Craig Foreman for talking to the media, his son said.
- Foreman, who was accused of spying, and his wife Lindsay were detained while in Iran during a round-the-world motorbike trip in 2025.

BAHRAIN INTERCEPTS BARRAGE

- Bahrain's military said it had intercepted aerial attacks from Iran.
- The military accused Iran of "criminal attacks" on civilians and said in a statement it had "succeeded in intercepting and destroying a number of the treacherous Iranian aerial attacks this morning".

SAILOR'S BODY FOUND

Iran said Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi travelled to Qatar yesterday to pay tribute to its deceased former emir, days after the Islamic republic launched salvos at the gas-rich emirate.

Araghchi is scheduled to "meet with Qatari authorities and offer his condolences", the foreign ministry said in a statement, following the death on Sunday of Sheikh Hamad bin Khalifa Al Thani, who ruled the Gulf state from 1995 to 2013.

Qatar, which hosts the largest American base in the Middle East, said it was targeted by an Iranian attack on Sunday.

Body of Indian sailor missing after Oman ship attack found

The body of an Indian sailor who went missing after his ship was attacked off the coast of Oman has been recovered, a seafarers' union official said yesterday.

Heramb Karmarkar, a 30-year-old marine engineer from the western Indian city of Pune, had been missing since Sunday's attack on the Cypriot-flagged GFS Galaxy.

"I got a call Tuesday evening from the company the ship belonged to informing me that Heramb Karmarkar's body has been found by the Omani coast guard," Manoj Yadav, of the Forward Seamen's Union of India, told AFP.

"This was almost 60 hours after we first received news that he was missing."

The other 23 crew members -- including 10 Indian nationals -- were rescued Sunday.

The US Central Command said the ship had been disabled by fire and damage to its engine room, accusing Tehran of attacking it.

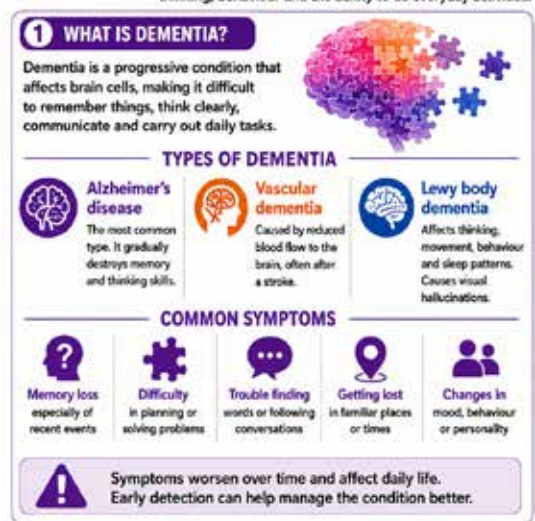
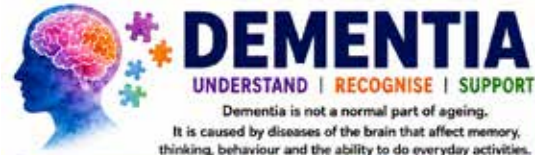

Up to 45% of dementia cases could be prevented or delayed: WHO

Up to 45 percent of dementia risk could be prevented or delayed, the World Health Organization said yesterday, citing modifiable risk factors such as tobacco and air pollution.

Dementia is the seventh leading cause of death and a major cause of disability and dependency among older people globally.

Dementia is caused by brain diseases and affects memory, thinking and the ability to function.

"While there is no cure for dementia, up to 45 percent of the risks can be attributed to modifiable risk factors such as tobacco, alcohol use, social isolation, physical inactivity, air pollution and noncommunicable diseases (NCDs), including high blood pressure and diabetes," the WHO said in a statement.

More than 57 million people live with dementia worldwide and nearly 10 million people get diagnosed every year, it said.

Alzheimer disease is the most common form of de-

mentia and is estimated to account for 60 to 70 percent of cases.

The UN health agency issued its first dementia recommendations in 2019, but said the evidence base had grown significantly since. The guidelines aim to promote early awareness and intervention in a bid to reduce the burden of dementia in the coming decades, it said.

Although more common after age 65, the condition is not an inevitable part of ageing, the WHO insisted.

Lebanon, Israel conclude talks

Lebanon and Israel completed a new round of Washington-mediated negotiations in Rome yesterday, agreeing to implement the "pilot zones" in southern Lebanon agreed under a recent framework deal, a US official said.

"Talks concluded after two days of productive and positive

discussions," the official said, adding that the participants "agreed on the structure and guidelines for the pilot zone process, to be finalised and implemented in the coming days".

The US-brokered negotiations took place in the Italian capital over the framework agreement sealed last month after five rounds of talks in

Washington, with Lebanese negotiators hoping for progress on an Israeli withdrawal from southern Lebanon.

The deal seeks an end to the war in Lebanon, disarmament of Hezbollah, the deployment of Lebanese troops in the south and for Israeli forces to steadily withdraw from the country, starting with two "pilot zones".

Bangladesh seizes \$6.2 bn in assets tied to ousted PM Hasina

Bangladesh has confiscated assets worth 760 billion taka (about \$6.2 billion) linked to ousted prime minister Sheikh Hasina, her family and 10 business groups, authorities said yesterday.

Since Hasina was toppled in a student-led mass uprising in 2024 and fled to India, authorities have investigated the former prime minister's wealth and looked into her relatives and major business groups accused of benefiting during her

15-year, iron-fisted rule.

The Bangladesh Financial Intelligence Unit said it had seized assets worth 570 billion taka in Bangladesh and another 190 billion taka overseas.

The agency's chief Ikh-tiar Mohammad Mamun told reporters while

presenting the annual summary of its activities that authorities had opened 98 cases as part of the investigations into Hasina and those associated with her.

"We are still working to recover the money laundered overseas," Mamun said. "We hope to share positive developments by the end of this year".



Starmer bids UK MPs 'goodbye'

Outgoing UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer yesterday pledged his "wholehearted support" to his successor as he prepares to hand over to premier-in-waiting Andy Burnham.

Facing his last weekly grilling from MPs in parliament, Starmer said he wanted to see the next leader of his centre-left Labour party succeed.

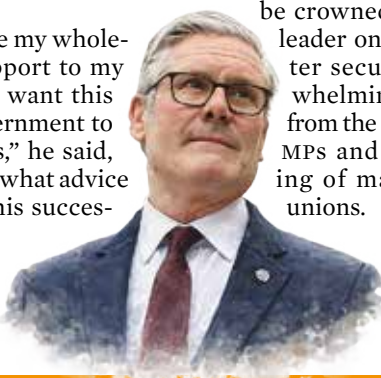
"I will give my wholehearted support to my successor. I want this Labour government to be a success," he said, when asked what advice he had for his successor.

"I want our country to be a success. I

shall give my support privately if asked for, not publicly when not asked for."

Starmer announced his resignation last month, bowing to months of pressure to step down after a series of scandals, missteps and policy U-turns. They blighted his two-year tenure, after he led his party to victory in 2024 elections following 14 years in opposition.

Burnham is expected to be crowned Labour's leader on Friday after securing overwhelming support from the party's 403 MPs and the backing of major trade unions.



Biden announces memoir, says cancer treatment 'going really well'

Former US president Joe Biden yesterday announced the forthcoming publication of a memoir on his time in the White House, and said that his cancer treatment was going "really well."

In May 2025, just four months after he left office as the oldest sitting president, Biden revealed that he had been diagnosed with an aggressive form of prostate cancer that had spread to his bones.

He subsequently began radi-

ation therapy.

"Since I left the presidency, I've had a lot of people ask me, 'Joe, what have you been doing?'" the 83-year-old said in a video on his X account.

"I've been spending a lot of time with my family. I'm dealing with a cancer diagnosis, and I've been getting treatment, and it's been going really well," he said, thanking his well-wishers.

He said his upcoming presidential memoir, "Promise Me, America," would be about the "challenges we faced as a nation, about the decisions I made, and why I made them."

India approves \$13 billion semiconductor plan

India approved a new semiconductor programme on Wednesday, offering more than \$13 billion in financial assistance to accelerate local chip production, as it seeks to become a global electronics powerhouse.

India's Union Cabinet approved the "Semicon 2.0" initiative, expanding on a drive launched five years ago to reduce reliance on imports and attract investment in one of the world's most strategically important industries.

It comes as countries race to secure semiconductor supply chains following pandemic-era disruptions and growing geopolitical tensions that exposed vulnerabilities in global chip production.

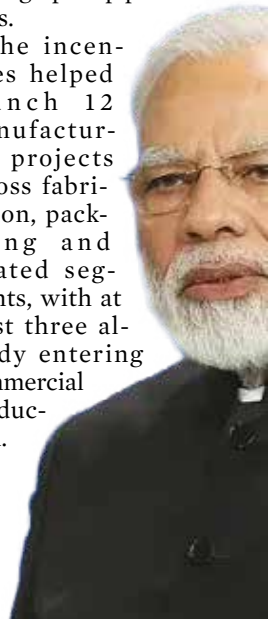
The programme will focus on strengthening the local semiconductor ecosystem, encouraging domestic production of key materials and attracting global manufacturers to establish fabrication plants in India.

The plan recognised the need for "sustained and long-

term support" to the industry and aimed to place India "on the semiconductor map of the world", the cabinet said in a statement, without providing more details on how the money will be used.

An earlier semiconductor incentive scheme "Semicon 1.0", which was unveiled in 2021, offered support covering up to half the cost of setting up chip projects.

The incentives helped launch 12 manufacturing projects across fabrication, packaging and related segments, with at least three already entering commercial production.

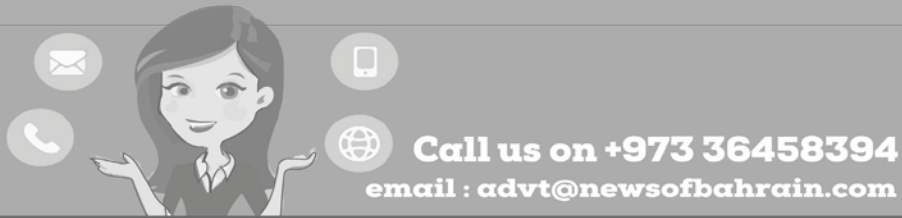

GCC Condemns Iranian Attacks on Bahrain, Kuwait and Jordan

Secretary-General calls for international action against “unprecedented escalation”

The Gulf Cooperation Council strongly condemned what it described as treacherous Iranian attacks targeting Bahrain, Kuwait and Jordan, including strikes on critical infrastructure that left several Kuwaiti military personnel injured.

GCC Secretary-General Jasem Mohamed Al-Budaiwi said the attacks represent an unprecedented escalation and a blatant violation of international norms, warning that Iran is deliberately pushing the region toward greater instability and chaos.

Al-Budaiwi stressed that targeting critical infrastructure



not only threatens the affected states but endangers the security of the entire region, calling on the international community to take practical and deterrent steps to halt repeated Iranian aggression and hold those responsible accountable.

Dubai Humanitarian Sends Fourth Relief Airlift to Uganda



Dubai Humanitarian has dispatched its fourth relief shipment to Uganda to support ongoing efforts to contain the Ebola outbreak in the region, following the directives of His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai.

The latest shipment arrived in Entebbe aboard a Dubai Royal Air Wing aircraft, carrying 72.5 metric tonnes of emergency humanitarian supplies for communities in Uganda and neighbouring areas affected by the outbreak.

The relief cargo was provided by the World Food Programme's United Nations Humanitarian Response Depot (WFP/UNHRD) and UNICEF, using pre-positioned emergency stocks stored at Dubai Humanitarian warehouses.

The shipment included essential supplies such as water purification tablets, mobile storage units, generators for Ebola treatment facilities, tarpaulins for temporary shelter, data loggers to monitor temperature-sensitive vaccines

and medicines, and hygiene equipment to support infection prevention measures.

Giuseppe Saba, CEO and Board Member of Dubai Humanitarian, said the continued airlifts demonstrate the effectiveness of coordinated humanitarian action.

“Four airlifts in, this operation shows what steady leadership and clear vision can achieve,” Saba said, highlighting the UAE and Dubai's commitment to ensuring humanitarian partners can quickly deliver assistance during emergencies.

He added that the supplies' true impact comes when they reach frontline workers and affected communities, supporting medical teams and families during times of crisis.

The latest mission adds to Dubai Humanitarian's extensive emergency operations in 2026. Since the beginning of the year, the organisation has facilitated nine air and land shipments delivering more than 450 metric tonnes of aid to support crises in Gaza, Lebanon, Mozambique and Afghanistan.

UAE Hits 63% Progress on UN Sustainability Goals

Country presents third national review, pledges deeper commitment to global agenda



The United Arab Emirates has reported progress on 63 percent of its national Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) indicators, presenting its third Voluntary National Review at the United Nations.

The UAE affirmed that sustainable development is now embedded across government planning, decision-making, and

policy evaluation.

The country renewed its commitment to the 2030 Sustainable Development Agenda and launched the “SDGs 2045” initiative to shape the global development agenda beyond 2030.

The UAE also announced it will co-host the UN Water Conference 2026 in Abu Dhabi this December, in partnership with Senegal.

Bahrain are in Group A with hosts China, Saudi Arabia, Oman, Chinese Taipei and Hong Kong. The top four sides will move into the quarter-finals.

They face Saudi Arabia next, before matches against Hong Kong and Oman, and then close



the group stage against China.

Thirteen teams are taking part in the tournament, which runs from July 15 to 27 and doubles as a qualifier for the 2027 IHF Men's Junior World Championship in North Macedonia.

The four semi-finalists will earn places at the world finals.

Bahrain are coached by Hussam Madan, with former na-

tional team player Jaffar Abdulqader as his assistant. Senior international Salman Al Shuwaikh is part of the 18-man squad.

Bahrain won the Asian junior crown in 1998, took silver in 1994 and 2022, and bronze in 2018 and 2024. They reached the podium at each of the past three editions.

Cricket World Cup revamp could see extra India-Pakistan clash

The International Cricket Council (ICC) announced yesterday a revamped format for the men's 2027 one-day international World Cup that could lead to an additional fixture between arch-rivals India and Pakistan.

While next year's edition in southern Africa remains a 14-team competition, the three lowest-ranked qualifiers will now take part in a preliminary round with just one of them progressing to a 12-strong main group stage.

That will now feature just two pools of six, with a new 'super seven' stage replacing the previous 'super six' round-robin.

The restructure comes after concerns were expressed about the prospect of too many dead rubbers, which in turn would lead to sparse crowds at venues, and the number of foregone

conclusions at the recent T20 World Cup.

Significantly, there will be no quarter-finals with the 50-over tournament denied the further jeopardy and interest that comes with an extra round of clear-cut knockout matches.

The ICC, however, insisted in a statement that the new ODI World Cup structure "creates greater context, competitiveness and consequence during the event."

An additional team in the round-robin phase also in-

creases the prospects of an extra match between India and Pakistan.

The passion for cricket in the sub-continent, which in turn generates huge broadcast rights and commercial revenues for the ICC, makes a match between India and Pakistan the most lucrative in the sport.

Another change approved at the ICC's recent annual board meeting in Edinburgh will see the next men's T20 World Cup in 2028 remain a 20-team competition, but with 10 sides qualifying from the group stage rather than eight.

The two best performing teams in the 'Super 10' will automatically secure a semi-final spot, with a new eliminator stage to decide their opponents.

In a separate announcement, the ICC said it had approved an \$12.82 million loan to Cricket West Indies "to support the member board".

Riffa stay top after Bahrain draw

Riffa held on to the top spot in Bahrain's General Bowling League after a gripping 4-4 draw with Bahrain Club in the pick of the fourth-round fixtures.

The result kept Riffa at the summit despite being pushed throughout by Bahrain in a closely fought contest between two evenly matched sides.

Bahrain's Khalid Sameer posted a total of 616, while Fawaz Abdulla Majdami led Riffa with 635, the highest score by a player from either side.

Al Hala recorded the biggest

win of the round, sweeping Al Ettifaq 8-0 after producing a team total of 2,103 pins against 1,949.

Umm Al Hassam beat Buisaiteen 6-2, finishing with 2,088 pins to their opponents' 1,992. Mohammed Muhannad Al Ansari topped the scoring with 626.

Sanad also secured a 6-2 victory over Isa Town in the closest contest of the round. Sanad edged the pin count by just seven, scoring 1,824 against Isa Town's 1,817.

The fourth-round results left the race for the leading places closely fought as the league moves through its early stages.

Belgian great Meunier signs for Premier League side Sunderland

Veteran Belgian defender Thomas Meunier said he was "hugely excited" to "begin a new chapter" after he signed for Premier League side Sunderland on a free transfer yesterday.

The 34-year-old -- one of Belgium's 'golden generation' whose last hurrah was a World Cup quarter-final exit to Spain -- signed a two-year contract.

The 83-times capped Meunier, who has played club football at the top level in his homeland, Germany, Turkey and France, had been at Ligue 1 side Lille.

"I am hugely excited and honoured to join Sunderland," said Meunier in a statement on the Sunderland website.

"I'm very happy to be here

and to begin this new chapter in my career.

"The Premier League is one of the most competitive and ex-

citing leagues in the world, and it's a challenge I've wanted to experience.

"When I spoke with the club, I

was impressed by the ambition, the project and the desire to keep moving forward.

"Competing in Europe (the Europa League) was also a big factor in my decision because, as a player, you always want to test yourself against the best teams and compete for trophies."

Meunier, who won three Ligue 1 titles with Paris Saint-Germain during his spell there from 2016-2020, "brings a wealth of experience, leadership and professionalism", said Sunderland's director of football Florent Ghisolfi.

"Thomas is a player who understands what it takes to compete for success, and we're confident his mentality and character will have a positive influence on the squad," added Ghisolfi.



Messi's Argentina stun England in comeback to reach World Cup final

Lautaro Martinez scored a 92nd minute winner as Lionel Messi inspired World Cup holders Argentina to a stunning comeback, beating England 2-1 and setting up a final with European champions Spain.

England had been on course to reach their first World Cup final since 1966 after Anthony Gordon fired them into the lead 10 minutes after half-time in the semi-final in front of 68,239 fans in Atlanta.

But the great rivalry between these nations has produced several memorable contests on the World Cup stage over the years and this will be remembered as the stuff of legends in Argentina as the South Americans denied England with two late sucker punches.

Messi set up Enzo Fernandez to fire in an 85th-minute equaliser and then, with extra time looming, crossed for substitute Lautaro Martinez to head in the winner in the second minute of stoppage time.

It was perhaps not quite up there with Diego Maradona's legendary display in putting England to the sword in 1986, but the goals this time brought Argentina back from the dead and kept alive their hopes of winning back-to-back World Cups.

No team has retained the tro-

phy since Brazil in 1962, and now Messi will become just the second player after Brazilian great Cafu to appear in three World Cup finals.

The game will take place at the MetLife Stadium on Sunday in New Jersey, as the first 48-team World Cup boils down to a confrontation between the reigning champions of Europe and South America.

Messi had waited until the age of 39 to get the

chance to play against England, and now he will face Spain for the first time in a competitive game. His career appeared to be complete when he dragged Argentina to glory in 2022 in Qatar, but he is

clearly not done yet.

England, though, will have huge regrets as they head to Miami to play France in Saturday's third-place play-off, a game neither team will want to contest.

The prospect of a first World Cup final appearance since their sole triumph 60 years ago was a momentous one, and they were so close, but will live to re-

gret sitting back after Gordon's opener.

The key men for Thomas Tuchel's side during this campaign—Jude Bellingham and captain Harry Kane—failed to deliver on this occasion, and England's players slumped to the turf at full time.

Lautaro winner

Given the deep-rooted rivalry between these nations, this was always likely to be a game with an edge and there was a tangible feeling of tension in the Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Argentina's players were clearly fired up, partly by a determination to hold onto their World Cup crown but also by a sense of what this fixture means.

That translated into a niggly contest pockmarked by fouls in the first half, including Elliot Anderson being booked for scything down Messi.

There were no real chances to speak of in the first half, but England struck in the 55th minute.

Kane was involved in the build-up as the ball eventually came to Morgan Rogers on the right, and he whipped in a low cross towards the back post where Gordon stole in front of Nahuel Molina to score.

But this was the stadium where Argentina produced a stunning comeback from 2-0 down to beat Egypt in the last 16, and they were not done.

They threw everything at their opponents, as Jordan Pickford made a great save from a Nico Gonzalez header, and Alexis Mac Allister was then denied by the post in the 76th minute.

Fernandez was denied from range by Pickford, but moments later he equalised, controlling a Messi pass on the edge of the area and letting fly past the goal-keeper.

Argentina smelled blood, and Mac Allister again hit the post before England failed to clear and Lautaro Martinez headed in the winner from an exquisite Messi cross to spark chaotic scenes of celebration and leave England completely deflated.

'Immense disappointment': Mbappe rues end of dream

Kylian Mbappe rued the end of France's World Cup dream, blaming tactical and technical blunders for his side's defeat.

Mbappe had emerged as one of the stars of the tournament during France's run to the last four, rattling in eight goals at the tip of a free-scoring attack that delighted fans worldwide.

But the 27-year-old French captain's dreams of a third straight World Cup final appearance ended abruptly as Spain outplayed Les Bleus.

Mbappe told French broadcaster M6 that the loss had been a "huge disappointment" for the French squad.

"I don't think we played the match we wanted to play -- whether tactically, technically, or in terms of our overall performance level," Mbappe said.

And when you don't do what you're supposed to do in a World Cup semi-final,



you don't win," the Real Madrid star added.

"Our goal was to press them high up the pitch to prevent them from settling into that slow, controlled rhythm -- because when it comes to controlling the game, they are better than us. We failed to do that."

Mbappe pinpointed the crux of the problem in midfield, where France's duo of Adrien Rabiot and Aurelien Tchouameni rapidly found themselves over-run by Spain's triumvirate of Rodri, Dani Olmo and Fabian Ruiz.

"We kept finding ourselves outnumbered 3-on-2 in midfield," Mbappe said. "And against Spain, that's a real problem... When you put it all together, the result is a defeat. It's a huge disappointment."

Waerenskjold wins fastest ever Tour de France stage

Norwegian Soren Waerenskjold launched a long-range sprint to claim victory at the Tour de France yesterday in the fastest stage in the race's history.

Dutchman Olav Kooij took second ahead of Belgian Jasper Philipsen at the end of the 161km 11th stage from Vichy to Nevers.

At an average speed of 50.91kph, it was the fastest ever road stage in the 113 editions of the Tour.

Once again, there was a fairly disjointed sprint finish with none of the teams able to organise a sprint train to set up their fast man.

Kooij's lead-out rider Cees Bol launched off the front as the main sprinters hesitated, but Waerenskjold was the first to chase after the Dutchman.

He instantly put several bike lengths of daylight between himself and the rest and although both Kooij and Philipsen caught him by the line, they did not have enough strength to edge past Waerenskjold.

It was the second Tour stage

victory for the Norwegian Uno-X Mobility team, which is in its first year as a World Tour outfit, after Jonas Abrahamsen succeeded once last year.

The team also held the yellow jersey for two stages this year with Torstein Traaen before he crashed out with a concussion

and broken ribs.

Reigning champion Tadej Pogacar finished safely in the pack to retain his overall lead of more than three and a half minutes to two-time former winner Jonas Vingegaard.

Spain's Porro says 'dream come true' to reach World Cup final
