



Bahrain condemns attack on UAE tankers



Shura Council Chairman Ali bin Saleh Al Saleh condemned the Iranian attack on two AD-NOC oil tankers while transiting the Strait of Hormuz, describing it as a threat to regional security and maritime navigation and a violation of international law.

In a cable to UAE Federal National Council Speaker Saqr Ghobash, Al Saleh affirmed Bahrain's full solidarity with the UAE and support for measures to protect its sovereignty and security. He stressed that the UAE's security is an integral part of Bahrain's and the GCC's security.

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Youth Are Bahrain's Greatest Asset

His Majesty visits Youth City 2030, highlights 10,000 training opportunities and urges young Bahrainis to lead the Kingdom's development

His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa visited Youth City 2030, where he reviewed programmes aimed at developing Bahraini youth's skills and abilities and preparing them to contribute to the Kingdom's national development.

During the visit, His Majesty was briefed on the 15th edition of Youth City, which features more than 324 training programmes and over 10,000 training opportunities, with 9,635 young men and women participating. The programme also includes 204 local and international partnerships, providing participants with



diverse experiences and expertise.

His Majesty toured the city's main centres, including the Science and Technology Centre, Arts and Culture Centre, Entrepreneurship and Leadership Centre, Media and Digital Innovation Centre and Summer Sports City. He viewed training programmes and practical



activities designed to strengthen young people's capabilities across different fields.

The King also visited the Bahrainouna platform, which promotes national belonging and citizenship values, and viewed projects developed by participants in the Young Trader initiative, learning about their entrepreneurial ideas and

experiences.

Commending their efforts, His Majesty said young people represent the future of Bahrain and are continuing the work of previous generations in serving the Kingdom. He expressed confidence in their abilities, aspirations and readiness to contribute to national development.

Coast Guard arrests three after boat rams patrol



The Coast Guard arrested three people and administratively seized their boat after they violated Bahrain's maritime ban, which is in effect from 6:30pm to 4am. The Ministry of Interior said the incident occurred during routine maritime monitoring and safety operations.

Radar and coastal cameras detected the boat leaving the shore and heading towards northern waters. When Coast Guard patrols ordered it to stop, the boat allegedly ignored repeated warnings, attempted to flee and deliberately collided with a patrol vessel, causing damage and injuring two Coast Guard personnel.

Two people aboard the boat fell into the sea and were rescued safely, while patrols continued pursuing the vessel. The boat eventually reached shallow waters, where the third person attempted to escape.

The Embassy of India in Bahrain marked 80th Independence Day with a vibrant celebration that brought together hundreds of members of the Indian diaspora in a spirit of unity, pride, and patriotism.

Indian Ambassador H.E. Vinod K. Jacob unfurled the Tricolour at the Embassy premises, followed by the national anthem and the reading of President Droupadi Murmu's Independence Day address to the nation.

The event featured several community and cultural activities reflecting India's heritage. To mark 150 years of the iconic national song Vande Mataram, members of the Bah-

rain Keraleeya Samajam Music Club delivered a special performance.

Ambassador Jacob felicitated the top five performers of the Bharat Ko Janiye online quiz and six participants of the Madhubani Virtual Art Workshop, organized in collaboration with the Indian Council for Cultural Relations. The traditional Madhubani artworks were displayed alongside a defense-themed photography exhibition honoring the dedication of the Indian Armed Forces.

Attendees were encouraged to take photos at a dedicated booth as part of the #HarGharTiranga campaign. Additionally, the State Bank of India set up an advisory counter to assist non-resident Indians with digital banking and investment services.

Reflecting on President Murmu's address, Ambassador Jacob outlined India's trajectory toward becoming a developed nation (Viksit Bharat) by 2047, guided by the principle of Antyodaya—ensuring devel-

opment benefits reach every citizen.

The President's message paid tribute to India's freedom fighters and social reformers while highlighting national strides in poverty reduction, financial inclusion, health-

care, and digital infrastructure expansion. Her address also emphasized the role of women and youth in innovation, space exploration, and economic growth, while reaffirming India's commitment to sustainable development and global

peace under the philosophy of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam (the world as one family).

Addressing the gathering, Ambassador Jacob highlighted the deep historic and commercial bonds between India and Bahrain. He commended the resilience of the 317,000-strong Indian community in Bahrain and praised local leadership for their ongoing solidarity and support.

Recent high-level engagements—including discussions between His Majesty King Hamad bin Isa Al Khalifa and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, alongside the official visit of India's External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar—have laid out a roadmap for expanded bilateral ties.

The Ambassador noted key economic milestones, stating that bilateral trade reached approximately \$1.66 billion in FY 2025-26, with two-way investments surpassing \$2 billion. India's economic momentum remains robust, with the International Monetary Fund

projecting real GDP growth at 6.4 to 6.5 percent for 2026.

Consular accessibility has also seen marked progress. Nearly 5,000 Bahraini citizens have utilized the electronic visa system introduced in July 2025, while the Indian Consular Application Centre at Bahrain Mall has completed its first full year of operations.

Concluding his address, Ambassador Jacob expressed appreciation for the Kingdom's continued cooperation and urged the expatriate community to remain active partners in advancing the India-Bahrain relationship.

Freeze Bank Accounts if Phone Is Hacked

Anyone who thinks their phone has been hacked should freeze their bank accounts at once and report any suspicious transfers, Bahrain's Interior Ministry has warned.

The advice came in a public message delivered by Captain

ported to the authorities by calling 992 or through the MyGov app.

Users were also told to factory reset the affected phone, a step meant to clear harmful apps or malware that could still be running on the device.

Passwords should then be changed from a secure phone or trusted computer rather than the hacked handset.

That includes email, banking and other financial apps, as well as social media accounts.

The warning, issued through the General Directorate of Anti-Corruption and Economic and Electronic Security, urged people to stay alert to cyber fraud and move fast to protect their money, accounts and personal data.

Manaf Al Qattan, who urged citizens and residents to act quickly when they suspect a mobile phone has been compromised.

He said the first call should be to the bank, where affected customers should freeze their accounts and report any transaction or transfer they did not make.

Undersecretary for Agriculture and Animal Wealth at the ministry Engineer Asim Abdul Latif Abdullah said the two

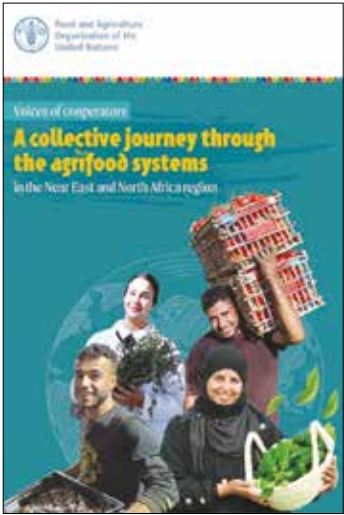

stories were selected following review and evaluation of submissions from countries across the region. The ministry documented the Bahraini experiences through field interviews and visual materials and coordinated with FAO on their review and verification.

The first story, Mirza and His Family: Rooted in the Land, Lifted by Community in Bahrain, features farmer Mirza

Hassan Mansoor of Bilad Al Qadeem. It documents his efforts to transform salt-affected agricultural land into a productive and sustainable farm using modern irrigation techniques and organic fertilisers.

The farm also involves his family, with his son contributing to smart irrigation systems and his daughter handling accounting and digital marketing. It has also become a space for educating students and sharing agricultural knowledge.

The second story, United Farmers: A Farmer's Journey Towards Collective Strength in Bahrain, follows farmer Mohammed Mohsen of Buri and



other Bahraini farmers working with the Bahrain Farmers Association.

The experience focuses on collective purchasing of seeds and fertilisers to reduce production costs, alongside sharing expertise in crop varieties, pest control, disease resistance and greenhouse design.

It also highlights the use of smart farming, hydroponics and shading technologies, as well as farmers' role in supplying fresh produce to local markets during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The selection highlights Bahrain's agricultural experience in sustainability, innovation, cooperation and food security.

MP Proposes Bahrain Perfume Factory and Institute

A proposal to build a national perfume factory and a specialist perfumery institute in Bahrain has been submitted to Parliament, with the aim of turning local scents, plants and heritage into a new export trade.

MP Basema Mubarak has called on the government to study the two projects with private-sector, education and investment partners.

The factory would produce perfumes with a Bahraini identity, drawing on ingredients such as jasmine, Damask rose, mashmoom, local flower oils and palm pollen oil.

Alongside it, an accredited institute would teach perfume-making, formulation and production, offering professional certificates and training for Bahrainis and students from elsewhere in the Gulf.

The proposal says the scheme could create jobs in manufacturing, perfume composition, marketing, research, product development and brand management, while opening another field for small and medium-sized businesses.

It also calls for parts of Bahrain's culture and history to be turned into perfume ranges inspired by pearls, the sea, diving, the Pearling Path, palm trees, mashmoom, jasmine and Damask rose.

Ms Mubarak cited Oman's

Amouage as an example of how a Gulf perfume house rooted in local culture can build an international name.

The longer-term plan goes beyond a factory. It envisages a national luxury perfume house, a research centre for aromatic oils and plants, a start-up incubator and a permanent showroom for Bahraini fragrance products.

Those elements could later grow into a 'Bahrain City for Perfumes and Fragrances', bringing manufacturing, training, research, start-ups and retail together.

The proposal argues that perfume-making could add a new source of non-oil income, draw local and overseas investment, raise exports and create skilled jobs.

It was submitted under Article 68 of the Constitution and Article 128 of Parliament's internal rules, with a request for it to be sent to the relevant committee for study before returning to MPs.

Calories on the menu: MP backs study into restaurant labelling

Al Salloom urges gradual rollout with unified standards for small restaurants

Restaurants in Bahrain could eventually be required to provide calorie information for meals, under a system currently being studied following a directive from His Highness Shaikh Nasser bin Hamad Al Khalifa, Chairman of the Supreme Council for Youth and Sports.

Ahmed Al Salloom, Chairman of the Council of Representatives' Financial and Economic Affairs Committee, welcomed the directive, describing it as an important step towards promoting nutritional awareness and helping consumers make informed choices based on their health needs.

He said studying the regulatory, supervisory and legal aspects of the proposed system would help establish a practical framework

that ensures the accuracy of nutritional information and compliance by food establishments.

Al Salloom said calorie disclosure could benefit people with diabetes, obesity and other chronic conditions, as well as those who



follow specific diets or exercise regularly. He added that greater transparency could encourage healthier eating habits and support national prevention efforts.

The initiative could also encourage restaurants to review their ingredients, portion sizes and menus, while developing healthier options. According to Al Salloom, this could strengthen consumer confidence and create a competitive advantage for establishments that demonstrate transparency and quality.

Al Salloom said he had previously submitted a proposal requiring restaurants to disclose the calorie content of each meal, based on consumers' right to know the nutritional value of the food they purchase.

He suggested that accredited specialist companies could calculate calorie values and verify their accuracy, while relevant government authorities would oversee regulation and compliance.

The latest directive, he said, could provide fresh momentum for developing the proposal into a comprehensive system based on scientific standards and practical oversight.

Modern technology could also play a role, with digital menus, QR codes and food delivery applications offering consumers clear and accessible nutritional information before they place an order.

Youth urged to navigate digital media wisely

BIPD Chairman highlights risks of rumours and misleading content

Dr. Ali bin Mohamed Al Romaihi, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Bahrain Institute for Political Development (BIPD), took part in a session on leadership and awareness in the digital media age at Youth City 2030.

The session was organised by the Ministry of Youth Affairs in cooperation with its strategic partner, the Labour Fund (Tamkeen), in conjunction with International Youth Day.

Dr. Al Romaihi stressed the importance of raising youth awareness and strengthening their ability to distinguish reliable information from misleading content, noting that this is essential to protecting national identity and reinforcing a sense of belonging amid the grow-

ing influence of digital and social media.

He said the digital age presents challenges beyond the sheer volume of information available, including rumours, misleading news,



fake accounts, influence campaigns and algorithmic manipulation.

He emphasised that informed and responsible young people can play an important role in protecting society, strengthening social cohesion and enhancing confidence in national institutions.

Dr. Al Romaihi also highlighted the need for young people to develop skills to verify and analyse information and understand the objectives and messages behind content circulated on social media platforms, which have become an

integral part of their daily lives.

He underlined the importance of strengthening awareness, protecting national identity and maintaining public confidence in state institutions, while distinguishing between political awareness based on rationality and national responsibility and politicisation driven by emotion and selectivity.

The session focused on awareness and national identity as key elements in strengthening the relationship between citizens and state institutions.

Budaiya Highway work begins

BD29.19m project will widen 6.7km stretch to six lanes and replace four roundabouts

After more than two decades of studies, designs, approvals and tender procedures, work on the long-awaited Budaiya Highway development project has begun. Barriers were installed along the route on Friday, with sections of the road reserve fenced off and prepared for widening works. Trees and palm trees within the project area have been relocated, while food trucks operating along both sides of the highway have been cleared from the site. The most visible works are currently taking place between the Sar and Diraz roundabouts, while preparation and removal of encroachments are also under way elsewhere along the route. Utility lines, including electricity, water and underground services, are being relocated or protected in coordination with the relevant authorities.



The Ministry of Works signed the implementation agreement with Haji Hassan Al Aali Group on January 10 after awarding the contract for nearly BD29.19 million. The project is being carried out as part of the development of roads leading to Salman City and is funded by the Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development. The project covers 6.7 kilometres of Budaiya Highway, from its junction with Shaikh Khalifa bin Salman Highway in the east to the Janabiya Highway junction in the west. The highway will be widened

from two lanes in each direction to three, creating six lanes in total. Four existing roundabouts will be replaced with signalised intersections, while the existing traffic signal at the Janabiya Highway junction will also be modified. The upgrades are intended to improve traffic flow at key intersections and reduce waiting times during peak hours.

Calls grow for action over capital's back streets

Complaints over foul smells, rodents and insects in some back streets and alleys of the capital have prompted calls for stronger enforcement, better cleanliness and more public facilities. Second Deputy Speaker of the Council of Representatives Ahmed Qaratah said practices including urinating and spitting in streets, alleys and around buildings, combined with poor cleanliness in some areas, could contribute to the spread of insects and rodents, particularly in densely populated neighbourhoods. Qaratah called for daily patrols and field teams to monitor such practices and take legal action, with cooperation between the Ministry of Interior, health authorities and municipal bodies. He said complaints were particularly concentrated around the capital's old souq, Hoor and nearby residential areas. He warned that continued poor hygiene and such practices could pose public health risks and lead to additional

costs if diseases linked to rodents and insects spread. Lawyer Jasim Al Essa said public urination in a place where others can see it may constitute an offence under Bahrain's Penal Code. He noted that Article 350 provides for imprisonment of up to one year or a fine for acts committed publicly that offend against decency.

Two decades of helping people get home

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After two decades of helping people find their way home, Air India Bahrain's Sales Manager Narayana Menon retired from his official duties, taking with him two decades of memories, friendships and stories of people he helped along the way. During his years in Bahrain, Menon witnessed the aviation industry change dramatically. Technology transformed ticketing, reservations and customer service, while passengers grew accustomed to faster responses and more seamless travel experiences. But for him, one principle remained constant: people value honesty, reliability and genuine care. "The greatest satisfaction came from helping passengers during difficult situations and seeing them travel with peace of mind," he says. Some of those situations extended far beyond the usual demands of his job. Families seeking to reunite, passengers facing medical emergencies and people who had exhausted every other

option often turned to him for assistance. Those encounters, he says, were among the most meaningful parts of his career. "The profession is ultimately about serving people, not just managing travel," Menon says. Among the many chapters of his career, the Vande Bharat Mission during the COVID-19 pandemic remains particularly significant. At a time when thousands of Indians were stranded away from home, Menon worked closely with the Indian Embassy and his colleagues to help facilitate their safe return. It was an intense and challenging period, he recalls, but the appreciation he received from passengers and the wider community made it an experience he will always cherish. Over the years, professional relationships also grew into lasting friendships, particularly through his interaction with Bahrain's Indian community. For Menon, earning that trust remains one of his greatest achievements. As he prepares to step away from his official responsibilities, he has no plans to simply slow down. He intends to remain in

Bahrain for the time being and devote more time to community service - something that has always brought him happiness. His message to young professionals entering aviation is equally rooted in the values that shaped his own career: integrity, empathy, patience and professionalism. From Solar-Powered Boats to Gulf Literary Success

Bahraini students turn recycled materials and creative writing into award-winning achievements

Two Bahraini students are turning their talents into achievements in science, sustainability and literature, earning recognition both at home and across the Gulf. He fitted the boat with solar panels and sensors, creating a system that converts sunlight into motion. The project allows the boat to sail without fuel, helping reduce harmful emissions and reliance on non-renewable energy sources.

Man acquitted in online betting fraud case

The Lower Criminal Court acquitted an Arab man accused of unlawfully obtaining money from another person through an online football betting game. The court found no conclusive evidence linking the defendant to the alleged fraud, noting the absence of technical evidence showing that he hacked an information system, obtained the victim's data or acted with



the person responsible for the incident. The court said the investigation findings were insufficient to establish his guilt and acquitted him of the charge.

Asian man faces money laundering trial



A 26-year-old Asian man is facing trial before the High Criminal Court First Chamber over allegations of laundering more than BD38,000 in proceeds from drug trafficking. The Public Prosecution alleges that BD38,108,701 was deposited into his bank accounts before being transferred to another person to purchase digital currencies through an

international platform. The currencies were then allegedly transferred to the defendant's accounts to conceal the source of the funds and give them a legitimate appearance. Investigations reportedly uncovered suspicious P2P digital currency transactions and links to an international drug trafficking network. The court has scheduled August 18 for pleadings.

Two women jailed five years for trafficking

The High Criminal Court has sentenced two Asian women to five years in prison and fined each BD2,000 for their involvement in a human trafficking case involving a woman who was forced into prostitution and sexual activities. The case began after the victim responded to a Facebook job advertisement offering work in Bahrain. Prosecutors said she was brought to Bahrain, had her passport taken and was later forced to provide prostitution and sexual massage services, with the defendants allegedly collecting and supervising the



proceeds. The court also ordered the defendants to cover the cost of returning the victim to her home country and permanently deported them from Bahrain after serving their sentences.

Madinat Salman central market put out to tender

A central market, super-market and sports hub are to be built in Madinat Salman under a new tender aimed at filling gaps in shops and services as the city grows.

The second phase covers three commercial and service plots, with the central market on Plot 11 forming the main part of the scheme. It will house separate meat, fish and vegetable markets, alongside small shops and restaurants, across 1,478.72 square metres of built space.

The market is meant to bring everyday shopping closer to homes in Madinat Salman and cut the need for residents to travel to nearby districts for basic goods.

A much larger supermarket is planned for Plot 16, with 3,534.66 square metres of built space.

Plot 17 will be used for a sports and community site with two football pitches and two drive-through restaurants. The buildings there will cover 217.34 square metres.



The three sites will together add about 5,230.72 square metres of built space, bringing new retail, food and leisure uses alongside the city's growing stock of homes.

Tender 378/2026/BTB carries a BD5,000 initial bond and a BD100 document fee. The contract will run for 12 months and bids and guarantees must remain valid for 180 days.

Companies registered in GCC countries can bid. Tender documents can be bought until September 19, while bids must be filed by September 27 and will be opened the next day.

The latest scheme comes after two years of heavy building in Madinat Salman, where work has moved from housing alone towards shops, schools, sports grounds and other public

services.

In November 2024, 1,362 flats opened on Island 12 under the new generation of housing apartment blocks. The project cost BD132 million and included car parks and shared facilities.

The Housing and Urban Planning Ministry followed in October 2025 with work on another 432 ownership flats, alongside open spaces and public amenities.

It also put 512 social housing units on Island 12 out to tender during 2025, spread across Plots 15, 18 and 19. Fifteen technical bids were filed, with 10 firms reaching the financial stage. The lowest offer was about BD42.7 million.

Private housing has grown alongside the state schemes. Handover of homes in the 131-villa Hai Al Naseem began in September 2025, while work has since started on another 137 homes split into packages of 69, 44 and 24 units under the Government Land Development Rights Programme.

easyJet strike sees 100 French flights cancelled



British budget carrier easyJet has called off about 100 flights out of French airports on Saturday and Sunday because of a strike by cabin crew furious over repeated changes to their schedules.

Unions said about half of the company's 900 French-based cabin crew would join the strike, which would affect about half of the flights out of two Paris airports, Nice, Bordeaux and Lyon.

The airline's management has called the action "opportunistic" as it falls on a major national holiday weekend when airports are busy.

France is a key market for the low-cost airline, which was recently taken over in a \$7.7 billion deal by US private equity firm Apollo. Its passenger numbers in France are second only to Air France.

Most of the flights were cancelled on Friday, with the company saying it wanted to help passengers find alternative routes.

William Bourdon of the SNPNC-FO union said that cabin crew wanted "stability" in their duties. He said some crew could see their hours and destinations changed 50-60 times a week.

UAE says Iran attacked ADNOC vessel in Hormuz strait

The United Arab Emirates yesterday blamed Iran for attacking a vessel belonging to state-owned oil giant ADNOC in the Hormuz strait, the latest incident in the waterway at the centre of the US-Iran conflict.

Tehran has imposed an effective blockade of the strait, a vital shipping route for global energy supplies, carrying out strikes on commercial ships since the war began in February.

The Islamic republic has said it wants to charge users for passage, which Washington fiercely opposes.

The UAE's foreign ministry condemned what it called a "hostile Iranian attack that targeted a vessel affiliated with ADNOC",

the Abu Dhabi National Oil Company.

It added that "targeting commercial shipping and using the

Strait of Hormuz as a tool of economic coercion or blackmail represents acts of piracy by Iran's Revolutionary Guard Corps", the

most powerful arm of Tehran's military.

ADNOC had earlier "confirmed that one of its vessels was attacked while transiting the Strait of Hormuz on the evening of Friday, August 14", according to the official WAM news agency, but reported no injuries.

In its statement, ADNOC stressed the importance of protecting seafarers and safeguarding freedom of navigation and maritime security.

After the attack, UAE presidential adviser Anwar Gargash said the Gulf state would defend its "rights to freedom of navigation" in the Strait of Hormuz.

"The repeated targeting of ADNOC tankers will not deter the UAE from pursuing a balanced and prudent policy based on the three pillars of deterrence, di-

plomacy, and adherence to international law," he wrote in a post on X.

"We will exert every effort to strengthen a unified Gulf posi-

tion, as it is a fundamental pillar for protecting the security of the region and the interests of its member states in this ongoing crisis."

Oil slicks appear in Iranian waters amid Gulf tanker attacks

Trump says will 'soon' declare Hormuz strait US territory

President Donald Trump said he would "finish defeating" Iran and "soon" declare the Strait of Hormuz part of US territory.

Trump has repeatedly said that the key energy water-

way, which Tehran effective- ly closed at the start of the Middle East war, is under US control.

"After we finish defeating Iran, which is being very badly defeated - pretty soon I'll be declaring the Hormuz Strait a territory of the United States,"

he said with a chuckle during a political rally at a police academy in New York state.

"It's true," he added.

An unnamed White House official later clarified that Trump was joking, the Wall Street Journal reported.

Iran's Deputy Foreign Min-

ister Kazem Gharibabadi fired back yesterday in a post on X, stressing that the "Strait of Hormuz has been Iranian, is Iranian, and will remain Iranian."

"This strait will only be closed and opened under Iran's command," he added.

Lebanon reports 11 dead in strikes that Israel says targeted Hezbollah

Lebanon said Israeli strikes on the south killed 11 people including three children yesterday, the deadliest raids since deals in June eased hostilities between Israel and Hezbollah.

Israel's military said the strikes in the early morning were in retaliation for an attack by the Iran-backed militant group on its troops in south Lebanon.

They came as Israel and Lebanon were set to hold an eighth round of US-sponsored direct negotiations early next month in Rome.

The sides agreed a framework deal at talks in Washington in June, but Lebanese President Joseph Aoun said yesterday's "violations are a clear message on the negotiations process and American efforts aiming to implement this agreement".

Hezbollah said the Israeli

attacks "will be met with an appropriate response", urging Lebanese authorities to abandon "the humiliating path of direct negotiations".

Lebanon's state-run National News Agency (NNA) said that Israel "escalated its attacks on the south" early yesterday, reporting an airstrike on a home in the village of Ansar and a "series of airstrikes targeting the Ali al-Taher ridge", a strategic hill overlooking the Nabatieh area.

It later reported another strike on the southern town of Deir Zahrani.

Lebanon's health ministry said seven people were killed "including three children and two women," in Ansar, where Aoun said "an entire family" had been killed.

The ministry said four other people were killed and 17 others wounded including a child and 11 women in Deir Zahrani, raising an earlier toll of two dead.

Indonesia quake kills 47 as rescuers search rubble

Authorities lift tsunami warning but urge caution as aftershocks continue

- Dozens of buildings damaged on Flores
- About 2,000 people evacuate homes
- Landslides disrupt rescue operations

Rescuers combed through debris for survivors yesterday after a powerful earthquake struck off Indonesia's eastern Flores island, killing at least 47 people, according to disaster officials.

The national disaster management agency (BNPB) raised the death toll from 40 late yesterday, and rescue official Fathur Rahman said 50 people were injured in the 7.7-magnitude quake.

Suharyanto, who leads the BNPB, said earlier that people were trapped in several buildings.

"These will be the initial targets of the disaster response teams," said Suharyanto, who like many Indonesians uses one name.

Nearly 160 houses, dozens of educational and health facilities and other public buildings were damaged when the earthquake struck the popular tourist island in Indonesia's east, the BNPB reported.

The International Federation

underway to bring aid to some 2,000 people in temporary shelters.

The government sent 50,000 aid packages weighing a total of 275 tonnes to the area, and European Union chief Ursula von der Leyen offered help from the bloc's Copernicus Earth observation satellites.

"Europe stands ready to deploy Copernicus, our eyes in the sky, to support search and rescue efforts. Indonesia, we stand with you," she wrote on X.

'Like we were on a trampoline'

"I have never felt an earthquake this big," Yulian Juita

Ekalia, who lives in Ruteng city more than 100 kilometres (60 miles) west of the epicentre, said by telephone hours after the tremor.

"It felt like we were on a trampoline; it was really scary," said the 37-year-old university lecturer, who was jolted awake at around 5:30 am (2130 GMT on Friday).

"As I rushed to get outside, everything in the house fell down: the television, my son's trophies, the dish racks, suitcases on top of the wardrobes. When I got outside, my son and neighbours were already there, screaming in fear."

Modi sets path to developed India

Prime minister calls for faster reforms and self-reliance

- Modi targets developed India by 2047
- Stresses self-reliance and domestic manufacturing
- Highlights surge in defence and electronics
- Aims for 100 gigawatts nuclear power

Prime Minister Narendra Modi yesterday set out an ambitious roadmap to turn India into a developed country by 2047, calling for faster reforms, greater self-reliance and a stronger push into manufacturing, technology, defence and green energy.

Addressing the nation from the Red Fort on India's 80th Independence Day, Modi said the country must pursue larger ambitions and make the most of its economic and technological capabilities. He said the goal of building a "Viksit Bharat" by 2047 would require the combined efforts of India's 1.4 billion people.

Modi highlighted what he described as rapid progress over the past 12 years, saying defence production had nearly quadrupled, electronics manufacturing had increased nearly sevenfold and mobile phone production had risen 35-fold. He also said India had moved from being counted among the "Fragile Five" economies to becoming a major and fast-growing economy.

Push for Self-Reliance

The prime minister placed self-reliance at the centre of his strategy, saying India needed to reduce dependence on foreign supplies and strengthen domestic capabilities.

He said three semiconductor plants had begun production, with exports already under way, and predicted that another five to eight plants could begin operations over the next seven to eight years. He also highlighted plans to secure supplies of critical minerals and expand domestic energy capacity.

India aims to reach 100 gigawatts

of nuclear power capacity by 2047, Modi said, while five new nuclear reactors are targeted for the current decade. He also pointed to rapid growth in solar power, saying capacity had risen from 2 gigawatts before 2014 to 160 gigawatts.

Seven Pillars of Growth

Modi unveiled what he called the "Sapt Dhara", or seven streams of national strength: manufacturing, agriculture and food production, technology and innovation, infrastructure and connectivity, defence, the green and blue economies, and India's soft power.

He called for Indian companies to become global leaders, including by having 50 Indian firms among the Fortune 500 within the next decade. He also said India should aim to place an Indian bank among the world's five largest banks and Indian

pharmaceutical, technology, consulting and other companies among global leaders.

The prime minister urged manufacturers to compete globally on cost, quality and scale, while calling for Indian agricultural products, technology and creative industries to expand their international reach.

He said reforms would remain central to the government's strategy, arguing that India needed policies and regulations suited to future ambitions rather than those of previous decades.

Youth at the Centre

Modi also highlighted the role of young people in achieving the 2047 goal, saying India's youth would be both the main beneficiaries and a driving force behind the country's development.

He said India now had more than 250,000 registered startups and called for greater support for entrepreneurship, innovation and employment.

Modi's address also referred to recent floods and landslides in parts of India, assuring affected families that the government and the wider country stood with them.

The speech came as India marked 80 years since independence, with Modi also commemorating 150 years of the patriotic song "Vande Mataram".

Bahrain Navigates Global Food Inflation

When global food markets shudder, import-dependent nations feel the tremors first. The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) Food Price Index reached 131.1 points in July, driven by a 3.4% monthly surge in cereal prices and a 5.8% jump in wheat, alongside climbing costs for vegetable oil (+2%) and sugar (+5.6%). Exacerbated by wars in Iran and Ukraine alongside severe weather events, this global inflation spike presents a direct challenge to trade-reliant economies.

Beyond short-term price stabilization, Bahrain is actively diversifying its food import channels to avoid over-reliance on single trade routes. Local initiatives in hydroponics, aquaculture, and processing facilities are expanding national self-sufficiency in key categories



For Bahrain, which imports roughly 97% of its food supplies, international market volatility directly threatens local consumer purchasing power. However, where global supply chains face disruption, our government interventions have provided an essential de-

fense.

Under the umbrella of the National Food Security Strategy 2020-2030, the Kingdom has taken decisive steps to insulate domestic markets from global cost surges. The Ministry of Industry and Commerce, collaborating closely with the Bahrain Chamber of Commerce and Industry, maintains a robust strategic reserve of essential commodities covering at least six months of national demand. This buffer ensures that temporary international shortages do not spill over into local stockouts or panic buying. Concurrently, targeted state subsidies on foundational staples like flour and bread remain firmly in place, shielding households from rising wheat costs.

Beyond short-term price stabilization, Bahrain is actively diversifying its food import channels to avoid over-reliance on single trade routes. Local initiatives in hydroponics, aquaculture, and processing facilities are expanding national self-sufficiency in key categories. Meanwhile, rigorous field inspections across storage facilities and retail markets help curb artificial price hikes and enforce compliance.

Though external geopolitical friction and weather anomalies continue to pressure international food prices, Bahrain's multi-layered approach—combining strategic stockpiling, price controls, and supply chain diversification—offers a clear roadmap for economic resilience.

New Zealand overpower Bahrain in Asia Cup

Bahrain suffered their first defeat of the Fiba U18 Asia Cup yesterday after going down 86-42 to New Zealand in their second Group B game in Ahmedabad, India.

The kingdom's youth men's basketball team struggled from the outset at the Veer Savarkar Indoor Stadium, with New Zealand racing into a 25-9 lead at the end of the first quarter before stretching their advantage to 43-15 by half-time.

The Junior Tall Blacks remained firmly in control after the break, outscoring Bahrain 23-13 in the third period before completing the victory with a 20-14 fourth quarter.

Somto Patrick Onoduenyi was Bahrain's standout performer despite the defeat, producing a double-double of 16 points and 17 rebounds while also registering six blocks and a steal.

Cole Hopoi led New Zealand with 16 points, five rebounds

and two assists, while Jackson Ball also played a key role in helping the Kiwis establish control during the opening quarter.

New Zealand never trailed and led for almost the entire contest, with their advantage reaching as many as 46 points late in the fourth quarter.

The result leaves Bahrain with one win and one defeat following their impressive 74-68 victory over Lebanon in Thursday's opener.

The nationals will now look to regroup ahead of their final Group B game against Syria tomorrow at 5pm Bahrain time.

The four group winners advance directly to the quarter-finals, while the second and third-placed teams enter the qualification round for the last eight.

The 16-team championship also serves as a qualifier for the Fiba U19 Basketball World Cup 2027, with the top four finishers earning places at the global tournament.

Seef stay alive in Singapore Challenger

Seef advanced to the quarter-finals of the FIBA 3x3 Singapore Challenger after finishing second in Pool A yesterday.

Seef are competing in Singapore with Bogdan Dragovic, Uros Ilic, Austin Ajukwa and Isa Jasim, having entered the Challenger fresh from winning the overall Bahrain Summer Tour 2026 title last weekend.

The Singapore Challenger also features a \$60,000 prize pool, with prize money awarded to the top five teams.

Should Seef overcome Shanghai, they will advance to the semi-finals at 1.30pm Bahrain time today, with the final scheduled for 3pm.

Seef have competed on the FIBA 3x3 international circuit over the past two campaigns, while Bahrain has also established itself as a regular host of major World Tour events.

The Kingdom staged the Manama Masters in 2023 and 2024 before hosting the FIBA 3x3 World Tour Final for the first time last year.

The Manama Masters is set to return for its third edition on November 20 and 21.

India's Padikkal, Rahul hit half-centuries in Sri Lanka Test
